ABA YEARS

RETIRED NUMBERS

ROGER BROWN

FORWARD 6'5" 205 LBS DAYTON '67

"Rajah" spent eight seasons in an Indiana Pacers uniform...a first team all-ABA selection in 1971, he was named to the second team in 1968 and 1970...THE original Pacers' player, he was the first player to sign with the fledgling ABA franchise...he is the Pacers' fourth all-time leading scorer with 10.058 points in 559 games...he has the club

ABA record for FG accuracy in a single game as he hit all 14 of his shots vs. Denver, 1/25/69...his 3,495 minutes logged in 1969-70 are the most ever by a Pacers player in an ABA season...he had a career-high 53 points vs. the Los Angeles Stars, 5/19/70, the third highest single-game total in Pacers ABA history.







GEORGE MCGINNIS

FORWARD 6'8" 235 LBS

He played seven seasons with Indiana from 1971-75 and 1979-82...along with Julius Erving, he was named co-MVP of the ABA in 1975...he was a two-time first-team all-ABA selection in 1974 and 1975, and a second-team pick in 1973...he is the fifth leading scorer in Pacers' history and holds the highest career scoring average (19.6)...he holds the Pacers' single-game records in an

ABA game for most points (58 vs. Dallas Chapparals, 11/28/72) and for most rebounds (37 vs. Carolina Cougars, 1/12/74)...he holds the Pacers' record for most points (2,353) in an ABA season in 1974-75...he holds the Pacers' ABA records for free throw attempts in a game (22 vs. Pittsburgh, 11/9/71) and season (778 in 1972-73), as well as most field goals in a season (873 in 1974-75).





MEL DANIELS

CENTER 6'9" 220 LBS NEW MEXICO '67

He was twice named the ABA's MVP (1969 and 1971)...he played six seasons with the Pacers, averaging 19.4 points and 16.0 rebounds per game...a four-time all-ABA selection, he was named to the first team in 1969, 1970 and 1971, and was a second-team pick in 1973...he was also named the ABA All-Star Game MVP in 1971...he was the ABA's

first Rookie of the Year (1968)...he is the Pacers' all-time leading rebounder in the ABA (7,643) and he holds the Pacers' ABA record for rebounds in a single season (1,475 in 1970-71)...on 3/18/69 vs. the New York Nets, he had 37 points and 26 rebounds in the second half, both club and ABA records; ending the game with 56 points and 31 rebounds...in that game he also set the Pacers' ABA records for most 2-pt field goals in a quarter (10), half (16), and game (25).







BOB "SLICK" LEONARD

HEAD COACH 1968-1980 529 WINS 456 LOSSES

He is the Pacers' winningest coach in franchise history...he compiled a won/loss record of 529-456 for a winning percentage of .537...he began his coaching career with the Pacers as an assistant coach during the 1967-68 season, the inaugural ABA season...he took over as head coach nine games into the team's second season, 1968-69...he coached the

team to an unprecedented three ABA titles and to the league finals five times...he compiled an all-time ABA record of 387-270, and is the ABA's all-time winningest coach...in 1976, he added general manager duties to his coaching duties, as the franchise entered the NBA...he led the team for its first four seasons in the NBA...his 142 wins in the NBA are third on the Pacers' NBA career wins list, behind Larry Brown's 190 victories and Larry Bird's 147 victories.
