# PACERS NOTES

## PACERS NOTES

The Pacers entered the 2003-04 season with a renewed focus on winning. After a busy offseason that included a trade and changes to the coaching staff, the 2003-04 Indiana Pacers exceeded all expectations and had the most successful season in team history. Rick Carlisle was brought in to replace Isiah Thomas as head coach and free agents Kenny Anderson and Anthony Johnson were added to bring veteran experience to the line-up. James Jones was the team's second round draft pick in the 2003 NBA Draft and Scot Pollard was acquired in a three-team trade that sent Brad Miller and Ron Mercer to Sacramento and San Antonio, respectively.

The Pacers finished with a 61-21 record, the best in franchise history, and as Central Division champions. They also had the best record in the NBA and home-court advantage through the NBA Playoffs, including the NBA Finals, the first time in their NBA history they have achieved those feats. The Pacers became just the fifth team in the last six seasons to win 60 or more games and the first Eastern Conference team to win 60 since the 1997-98 Chicago Bulls.

## OCTOBER/NOVEMBER

**OVERALL: 14-3; HOME: 7-2; AWAY: 7-1**

The Pacers started off the season hot, as they won six of their first seven games, including the season-opener at Detroit, marking only the eighth time that the team has won the season-opener when on the road. Following their win at Detroit, the Pacers went on to win the next six road games, before dropping a game at the L.A. Lakers on the last day of the month. That seven-game road-winning streak is the longest the team has ever gone undefeated on the road to start a season, and dating back to last season, the team had won eight straight. The team's 13 overall wins in November are the most wins in a month they have had since January 1996, when they won 14 games; and with a 14-3 record, the team was tied with the Lakers for the best winning percentage in the NBA (.824). Rick Carlisle was named the Eastern Conference Coach of the Month for November and Ron Artest was named the Eastern Conference Player of the Week on Nov. 10.

## DECEMBER

**OVERALL: 9-7; HOME: 5-2; AWAY: 4-5**

Indiana started off the month on the West Coast, going 2-3 on the trip, including wins at Phoenix and Seattle. After that five-game stint on the road, they returned home for five of the next six games, picking up four more wins in those games. Indiana's losses at Milwaukee on Dec. 26 and vs. New Jersey on Dec. 27 marked the first time the team lost consecutive games in the season. At month's end, the Pacers were the only team in the NBA with 23 victories and their .697 winning percentage led the East and ranked third best in the NBA. Jermaine O'Neal was named the Eastern Conference Player of the Month for December and was awarded the NBA's Community Assist Award for the month.

## JANUARY

**OVERALL: 12-3; HOME: 7-1; AWAY: 5-2**

After winning the last two games of December, the Pacers carried on in their winning ways by winning the first five games of January for their second winning streak of seven games or more of the season. The Pacers streak ended with a loss in San Antonio. The team rebounded by winning the next five games, which included games against San Antonio, New Jersey and Detroit. On Jan. 23 and 24, the team lost two consecutive games for only the second time in the season, when they played back-to-back games vs. Houston and at Washington. After those two losses, the team rebounded and won the last two games to end the month on a winning note. Since the loss to New Jersey on Dec. 27, Indiana won 14 of its last 17 games. At the end of the month, Indiana was 35-13 (.729) and had the best record in the NBA. Indiana's 12 wins in January mark the second year in a row that they posted double-digit wins in January.

## FEBRUARY

**OVERALL: 8-3; HOME: 5-1; AWAY: 3-2**

Coming into February, the Pacers had won their last two games and seven out of their last nine before beating the Lakers at Consecro Fieldhouse to start the month. The win against the Lakers made it the eighth straight year that the Pacers started off February with a win. The team won three of the next four games to head into the All-Star break with a 39-14 (.736) record, with 39 wins being the most wins the team has ever had after 53 games. After the All-Star break, the team only lost two more games throughout the month, both coming against New Orleans. With a 43-16 record and a .729 winning percentage, the Pacers were tied with the Timberwolves and the Kings for the most wins in the NBA and trailed Sacramento (.741) for the best winning percentage in the league at month's end.

## MARCH

**OVERALL: 12-4; HOME: 6-1; AWAY: 6-3**

The Pacers started March where they left off in February, winning the first six games of the month, including going 4-0 on an extended west coast trip, marking the first time in team NBA history, and the first time since the 1972-73 ABA season, that the team started off March 6-0. Indiana's 4-0 record on the west coast trip marked the first time in franchise history that the team has gone undefeated on a west coast trip of three games or more. Mid-way through the month, Indiana had its third and final two-game losing streak, dropping consecutive games against Sacramento and at Memphis on March 19 and 20. However, the team rebounded strongly from those losses by winning the next four games, including three straight 100-point outings against Chicago, Dallas and at Orlando. At the end of March, the Pacers had a league-leading 55-20 record and .733 winning percentage, three games ahead of their closest competition. Indiana's 12 wins in March set a team NBA record for the most ever wins in the month of March. Ron Artest was named the Eastern Conference player of the week on Mar. 29.

## APRIL

**OVERALL 6-1; HOME: 4-0; AWAY: 2-1**

For the seventh consecutive year, the Pacers had a winning record in the month of April, winning six of the seven games in the month. They started out the month with a win against Toronto in Consecro Fieldhouse. The team's one loss for the month came early, dropping a game at Detroit on April 4. Following that, the Pacers did not lose for the rest of the regular season, winning the last five game, heading into the playoffs with a five game winning streak. Two of those wins came at home against teams the Pacers could possibly meet in the later rounds of the playoffs, New Jersey and New York. They also won games on the road at Toronto and Philadelphia.

## CARLISLE MAKES TWO

Carlisle continues his success as a coach, becoming only the second head coach in NBA history to register three consecutive division titles and 50 or more wins in his first three seasons on the bench. Pat Riley did it for 12 consecutive seasons from 1981-82 to 1993-94. Riley recorded the first nine with the Los Angeles Lakers and the next three with the New York Knicks. Here is a look at each coach's records through those years.

## O'NEAL CONTINUES TO BE CORNERSTONE OF FRANCHISE

Jermaine O'Neal has established himself as a Most Valuable Player and All-NBA First Team candidate. Since being acquired by the Pacers in the summer of 2000, he was named the NBA's Most Improved Player following the 2001-02 season, been named to the NBA All-Star team three consecutive seasons, twice as a starter, and has been named to the All-NBA Third Team the past two seasons. O'Neal has been recognized by USA Basketball as a member of the 2001 USA Goodwill Team, 2002 USA World Basketball Team, 2003 USA Olympic Qualifying Team and the 2004 USA Olympic Team.

O'Neal continues to be the leader for the Pacers on the court. He led the team in points (1566), rebounds (778) and blocks (199). He has led the team in scoring 42 times, rebounds 50 times and blocks 64 times. He has set the NBA era team record for career double-doubles with 165 and moved into fourth place on the franchise blocked shots list with 771.

He has proven to a consistent scorer and leader by becoming the third fastest to score 5,000 points in 279 games in a Pacers' uniform. The top ten individuals to accomplish this feat are listed below.

## PACERS AND THE POSTSEASON

The Pacers clinched the top seed in the Eastern Conference after beating Milwaukee 111-78 on Mar. 31. The Pacers continued their success and clinched the best record in the NBA after they beat New Jersey 90-80 on April 9. This marked the first time in franchise history that the Pacers have held home court through the NBA Finals and had the NBA's best record. The Pacers have now made the postseason the past seven years and 14 of the last 15. The Pacers are tied with San Antonio for the third longest active streak for postseason appearances. The Los Angeles Lakers (10 years) and Minnesota Timberwolves (8 years) are the only teams with longer active streaks.

## REGGIE CONSUMMATES PROFESSIONAL ATHLETE

Reggie Miller added to his legend status as one of the most lethal shooters in NBA history by making his 2,400th 3-pt FG at San Antonio on Jan. 16. He completed the season with 134 3-pt FGM and a total of 2.464 for his career. Miller shot 88.5 percent from the charity stripe, ranking in the top five in the NBA, but ended a streak of five consecutive years of shooting better than 90.0 percent from the line.

Miller entered the season 15th on the all-time scoring list with 23,505 points, just 253 points behind Charles Barkley. He averaged 10.0 points in 80 games and passed Barkley when he scored his second point at Minnesota on Dec. 20. He finished the 2003-04 campaign with 24,305 points, just 510 behind Patrick Ewing for 13th place.

# PACERS VS. PISTONS

## GAME-BY-GAME RECAPS

### INDIANA 89, DETROIT 87

**OCTOBER 29, 2003 - THE PALACE OF AUBURN HILLS**

The Pacers survived a 13-2 Detroit run that erased Indiana's 10-point lead and gave the Pistons their first lead of the second half with just two minutes left on the clock. Ben Wallace's put-back off a Chauncey Billups miss would be the last points Detroit would score and on the next Pacers' possession, Jermaine O'Neal gave the Pacers back the lead. The jump shot by O'Neal would be the last field goal by either team. Jeff Foster made one of two free throws with 15 seconds left to give the Pacers a two-point lead. Billups missed an 18-foot attempt with five seconds remaining and on the offensive rebound, Mehmet Okur's 3-pt attempt banked off the backboard and bounded off the front of the rim to secure the Pacers victory. In the first half, the Pacers and Pistons traded the lead 10 times with three ties, but the Pacers outscored the Pistons, 14-6, over the final five minutes of the half to rebound from a six-point deficit and snatch a two-point lead at the break. The Pacers were led in scoring by Jermaine O'Neal, who scored 22 points to go with Ron Artest's 21 points. Reggie Miller added 14 points, while Kenny Anderson scored 10. O'Neal also led the Pacers with 15 rebounds and Foster collected 11 off the bench. The Pistons were led by Mehmet Okur, who scored 17 points, and Tayshaun Prince and Wallace each added 16 points. Wallace controlled the glass for the Pistons by grabbing a game-high 17 rebounds.

### INDIANA 80, DETROIT 75

**DECEMBER 19, 2003 - CONSECO FIELDHOUSE**

The Pacers trailed by 10 points with less than nine minutes remaining, but from that point, the Indiana defense kicked into high gear and limited the Pistons to just four points and two field goals over the next seven-and-a-half minutes. By that time, the Pacers had scored 22 points, erasing the 10-point deficit and taking an eight-point lead. Through three periods, the Pistons' bench had outscored the Indiana reserves, 23-8, but in the fourth quarter, the Pacers' bench scored 19 points to Detroit's two points off the bench. Austin Croshere led the Indiana charge, scoring all 12 of his points in the final period. In the first three quarters, the Pacers took just two free throws (1-2 FTs) and the Pistons attempted 14 (10-14 FTs). In the final period, Indiana outscored the Pistons, 14-7, from the line on 14-17 FTs. While committing just two turnovers in the fourth quarter, the Pacers scored eight points on the Pistons' five fourth-quarter miscues. While making just one shot from the floor in the fourth quarter, Ron Artest scored nine of his game-high 22 points in the period. In addition to Artest's game-high 22 points and Croshere's bench-leading 12 points, Jermaine O'Neal scored 19 points to go with his game-high tying 11 rebounds. The Pistons were led by 13 points from Chauncey Billups and 11 rebounds from Ben Wallace.

### INDIANA 81, DETROIT 69

**JANUARY 20, 2004 - CONSECO FIELDHOUSE**

The Detroit Pistons hit just one of their first 12 shots from the floor, allowing the Pacers to build a 14-2 lead in the opening nine minutes of the game. The Pistons scored just nine points in the opening quarter, tying the fewest ever scored against the Pacers in an NBA first quarter. However, Detroit found the range and made 10 of 13 shots from the floor (.769) in the second quarter, allowing the Pistons to get within four points of the Pacers by halftime. In the third quarter, the Pacers took advantage of six Detroit turnovers for nine points and Reggie Miller led the Pacers with seven points to help the Pacers extend their lead to nine points at the end of the third. Indiana scored nine more points off turnovers in the fourth quarter, as the Pistons committed seven miscues. For the game, the Pistons' starting guard tandem shot 6-26 FGs and totaled 26 points. The Pistons' Elden Campbell and Corliss Williamson came off the bench to shoot a combined 11-15 FGs and totaled 25 points, outscoring the entire Indiana bench. Combining to shoot 16-30 FGs (.533), Jermaine O'Neal and Reggie Miller scored 50 of the team's 81 points. Those two shot 15-15 from the foul line and the Pacers as a team shot a season-best 95.0 percent FTs (19-20). Indiana's win ended Detroit's winning streak at a franchise record tying 13 in a row.

### DETROIT 79, INDIANA 61

**APRIL 4, 2004 - THE PALACE OF AUBURN HILLS**

The Pacers opened the game putting together an eight-point run to take a 10-6 lead and led 18-15 at the end of the first quarter. Detroit's Elden Campbell and Mehmet Okur sparked the Pistons to 20 bench points in the second period as Detroit built a 39-33 lead at the half. Detroit quickly pushed the lead into double-digits early in the third quarter, leading 48-37, when the Pacers made an 11-2 spurt that cut the lead to 50-48. Indiana had three shots in one possession to tie the score, or possibly take the lead, but missed all three and the Pistons quickly countered, as Mike James hit a jumper and Rasheed Wallace nailed a 3-pt FG to push the lead to seven. The score was 56-50 entering the fourth, but the Pacers would hit just one field goal in the first 11 minutes of the period and shot 2-10 FGs for the quarter. That enabled the Pistons to build a game-high 19-point lead and snap the Pacers' three-game winning streak vs. Detroit. Ron Artest was the only Pacers player to score in double figures, hitting for 16 points. Averaging 12.7 ppg in the first three games against the Pacers, Richard Hamilton scored a game-high 24 points to lead the Pistons. The Pacers' leading scorer, Jermaine O'Neal, totaled nine points and was one of two Pacers, along with Jeff Foster, who gathered a team-high nine boards.

### INDIANA 98, MINNESOTA 75

**NOVEMBER 25, 2003 - CONSECO FIELDHOUSE**

Back-to-back 3-pt FGS by Reggie Miller and Ron Artest sparked an 18-6 run that sent the Pacers to a 10-point lead with four-and-a-half minutes remaining in the first period. That lead grew to 23 points in the second quarter as six different Pacers scored at least six points. The Pacers' defense held the Timberwolves to 13-41 FGS in the first half, as Sam Cassell and Kevin Garnett accounted for 22 of the team's 32 points. Those two shot 10-20 FGS, while their teammates combined to shoot 3-21 FGS. For the game, Indiana's defense held Minnesota's Latrell Sprewell scoreless on 0-8 FGS. On offense, the Pacers had six players score 10+ points, including all five starters. Indiana was led by Ron Artest, who scored 20 points. Jermaine O'Neal added 17 points and Reggie Miller scored 13 points. The Pacers outrebounded Minnesota 49-37, and Al Harrington led four players with at least eight boards with 10. Minnesota was led by Sam Cassell and Kevin Garnett as each scored 25 points. Garnett grabbed a game-high 16 rebounds.

### MINNESOTA 102, INDIANA 80

**DECEMBER 20, 2003 - TARGET CENTER**

The Pacers took a 6-4 lead at Minnesota, but the Timberwolves went on a 13-3 run to snatch an eight-point lead with four minutes remaining in the first quarter. On the Pacers' next possession, Jermaine O'Neal hit a layup to cut the lead to six points, which would be as close as Indiana would get the rest of the game. In the second quarter, Indiana made just 3-13 FGS, while the Timberwolves shot 12-22 FGS and grabbed a 23-point halftime lead. Minnesota's lead grew to a game-high 36 points in the third quarter. Despite shooting just 6-18 FGS, Jermaine O'Neal led the Pacers with 16 points. Scoring 10+ points for the third straight game, Austin Croshere scored 15 points, including 2-2 3-pt FGS. Making the first start of his NBA career, Jamison Brewer scored a career-high 12 points and Al Harrington added 11 points. Ron Artest led the Pacers in both rebounding with seven and in assists with six. The Timberwolves were led by Kevin Garnett, who scored 28 points. Former Pacers' player, Fred Hoiberg, came off the Minnesota bench to score 21 points on 7-10 FGS, 1-3 3-pt FGS and 6-6 FTS. Those two also led all rebounders with nine and eight boards, respectively.

### LA LAKERS 99, INDIANA 77

**NOVEMBER 30, 2003 – STAPLES CENTER**

Limited to just five points and no rebounds in the first half by foul trouble, Shaquille O'Neal led a third quarter charge that sent the Lakers to a 20-point lead late in the period. In the third quarter, O'Neal scored 10 of his game-high 23 points and the Pacers shot just 5-21 FGS (.238) and committed five turnovers. After shooting 14-31 FGS (.452) in the first half, Indiana shot just 13-38 FGS (.342) in the final two periods. On the other hand, the Lakers hit 19-38 FGS (.500) in the second half, including 4-10 from 3-pt range. O'Neal's 23 points led five Lakers' players in double figures and the L.A. bench outscored the Pacers' reserves, 42-38. Al Harrington came off the Pacers' bench to lead Indiana with 18 points. The only other Indiana player to score in double figures was Jermaine O'Neal with 14. Harrington also led the Pacers in rebounds with 10 and Indiana outrebounded the Lakers, 40-35. Karl Malone led the Lakers with 15 rebounds and Kobe Bryant contributed a game-high seven assists.

### INDIANA 85, LA LAKERS 72

**FEBRUARY 2, 2004 – CONSECO FIELDHOUSE**

The Lakers missed their first five shots from the floor and scored just 10 points in the first period, as the Pacers pulled out to a 20-10 lead at the end of the period. A 15-3 run in the latter stages of the second quarter saw Indiana extend its lead to 22 points with just under three minutes remaining in the first half. An 11-0 run that spanned the end of the first half and the first minutes of the second half brought the Lakers to within 11 points. But the Pacers responded with a 13-4 run that pushed the lead back up to 20 points. Fueled by five points from rookie Luke Walton, the Lakers scored eight straight points early in the fourth quarter to trim the Pacers' lead to just nine points with under nine minutes left in the game. That was the first time Indiana's lead had been below single digits since it was 18-10 in the first period. The Pacers outrebounded the Lakers, 47-42, as both teams had nine offensive rebounds. Led by Artest's 24 points, the Pacers had four players score in double figures. Al Harrington scored 16 points and Jamaal Tinsley added 10 points. Hitting 5-5 FGS with two 3-pt FGS, Austin Croshere had a bench-high 12 points and he led the Indiana bench with nine boards. Jeff Foster registered a game-high 11 rebounds. The Lakers, playing without Shaquille O'Neal, were led by Stanislav Medvedenko with 14 points. Payton added a team-high eight rebounds and seven assists.

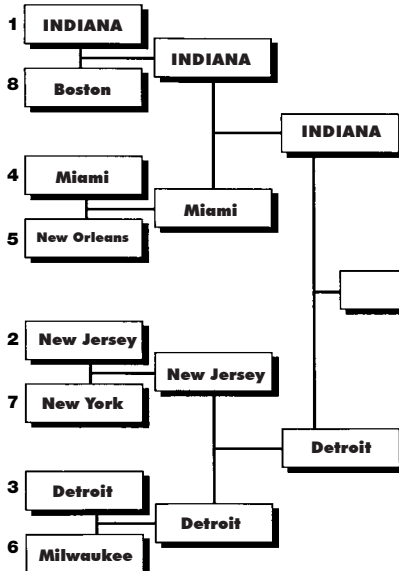

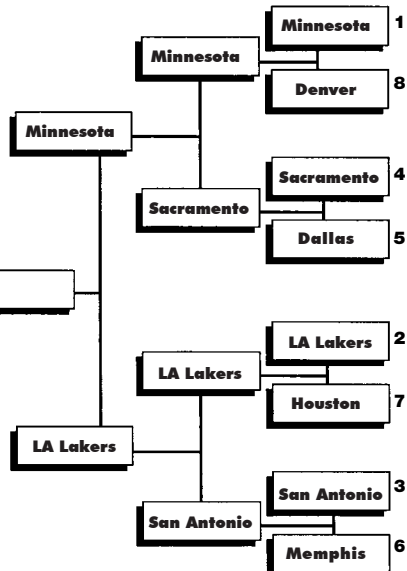

# EASTERN CONFERENCE SEMIFINALS RECAP

## GAME-BY-GAME RECAPS

### INDIANA 94, MIAMI 81

**MAY 6, 2004 - CONSECO FIELDHOUSE**

The Heat scored the first five points and led 7-2 with just over two minutes elapsed in the game, but Miami would score just eight points the rest of the period leading to a 23-15 lead for the Pacers at the end of the quarter. While limiting the Pacers to 11 points in the first eight-plus minutes of the second quarter, Miami sliced Indiana's lead to just two points at 34-32. The Pacers closed out the first half with a 12-point run and scored 14 of the first 15 points of the second half to expand the lead to a game-high 23 points. The Heat did not fade away, as they outscored the Pacers, 11-3, over the last five minutes of the third period to trim the lead to 12 points heading into the fourth quarter. Though the Heat missed their first four shots from the floor in the fourth, they reduced the lead to eight points with just under three-and-a-half minutes left in the game. Reggie Miller ended that rally with one of the team's nine 3-pt FGS in the game. Including 10 in the first period, Ron Artest led the Pacers with 25 points. Tinsley added 17 points and Jermaine O'Neal tallied 13 points. To go with his game-high 10 boards, Jeff Foster had seven points. Scoring 20+ points for the fourth time in eight playoff games, Dwyane Wade led the Heat with 22 points. Rafer Alston led the Miami bench with a career-high 17 points.

### INDIANA 91, MIAMI 80

**MAY 8, 2004 - CONSECO FIELDHOUSE**

With Reggie Miller scoring 19 points in 18 minutes, the Pacers beat the Heat 91-80. The Pacers set an NBA record with their sixth consecutive double-digit playoff victory. Miami stayed with the Pacers throughout the first half by outscoring the Pacers, 7-0, in points off turnovers. Miller made a huge basket at the buzzer to end the first half, by taking an inbounds pass with 1.2 seconds left, and Eddie Jones in his face, Miller tossed in a 3-pt FG to give the Pacers a 44-36 lead at the break. Miller then scored eight points early in the third quarter, including a 3-pt FG in the middle of an 8-0 run that gave the home team its first double-digit lead, 57-46. The Heat never got closer than seven thereafter. Leading the Pacers in scoring for the fourth time in his five appearances, Ron Artest scored 20 points. Jermaine O'Neal contributed 17 points and a team-high tying nine boards. To go with his eight points, Al Harrington also had a team-high tying nine rebounds. Lamar Odom and Dwyane Wade led the Heat, each scoring 19 points. Odom also registered a game-high 12 rebounds.

### MIAMI 94, INDIANA 87

**MAY 10, 2004 - AMERICAN AIRLINES ARENA**

Fighting uphill most of the game, the Pacers scored seven points in a row, all from the free-throw line, to take their first lead of the second half, 69-68, with less than seven minutes remaining. The score was tied at 72-72 with less than six minutes to go when the Indiana offense went cold. The Pacers missed 11 of their first 12 shots of the fourth quarter and went nearly five minutes without a basket while Miami put together a 13-3 run to take a 10-point lead with under two minutes left in the game. Indiana then hit four 3-pt FGS in the span of just 70 seconds to slice the lead to just four with 24.3 seconds left. Miami would miss three of four free throws over the next five seconds, leaving the door open for the Pacers to rally. But Indiana could not take advantage, failing to grab the rebound on one of their misses and missing their final three attempts from the floor. For the game, Malik Allen scored 13 points and the Miami bench outscored the Indiana reserves, 23-21. Miami outrebounded the Pacers for the third straight game, 43-35, as Brian Grant collected 16 boards and Lamar Odom snared nine. Jermaine O'Neal led the Pacers with nine rebounds, while Jeff Foster added eight boards. O'Neal also led the Pacers on the offensive end, scoring 29 points. Jamaal Tinsley had 16 points and Ron Artest added 14 points.

### MIAMI, 100, INDIANA 88

**MAY 12, 2004 - AMERICAN AIRLINES ARENA**

Indiana's duo of Jermaine O'Neal and Ron Artest dominated the first half, scoring a combined 42 points to lead the Pacers to a 56-53 halftime lead. The Heat stayed close with a more balanced attack, having all five starters score at least eight points, led by Dwyane Wade's 10 points. The Pacers started the second half by missing their first six shots and going more than four minutes without a point. That opened the door for Miami to grab a five-point lead. Late in the period, the Pacers' offense kicked up its heels and the two teams traded the lead four times in less than a minute, but two Lamar Odom free throws gave the Heat the lead for good with four minutes to go in the third period. Those two free throws sent Miami on a 10-0 run that put the Heat ahead by nine with less than two minutes left in the period. The Pacers scored seven straight points in the fourth to slice the lead to just four with just over four minutes left in the game, but the Heat put out the Pacers' flame with eight straight points in less than two minutes. For the game, O'Neal and Artest scored a combined 65 points as no other Pacers' player had more than seven. Meanwhile, Miami's starting five all scored in double figures and Rafer Alston led the Heat bench with 11 points. Lamar Odom led the Heat with 22 points, Caron Butler had 21 points and Dwyane Wade scored 20 points.

### GAME-BY-GAME RECAPS

#### 5/15 – INDIANA 94, MIAMI 83

**MAY 15 - CONSECO FIELDHOUSE**

With six of his career-high 20 points, Jeff Foster sparked a 20-6 run that turned a three-point game into a 17-point margin for the Pacers with just under five minutes remaining in the third quarter. Including a Ron Artest 3-pt FG, the Pacers scored the first five points of the fourth quarter to extend their lead to a game-high 23 points. A 10-2 run by the Heat in the last three minutes of the game cut the margin to just 11, which was the closest it had been since midway through the third period. Trailing by four points early in the second quarter, the Pacers held Miami to just two points for more than six-and-a-half minutes and took the lead for good on a Jamaal Tinsley layup with three minutes to play in the first half. Outrebounding the Heat for the first time in the series, Indiana collected 47 rebounds to Miami's 30 boards. Foster snared a team-leading 16 of those rebounds, his most ever in an NBA game (reg. season or playoffs). Jermaine O'Neal led all scorers with 22 points, Ron Artest had 14 points and Reggie Miller added 13 points. Indiana's bench outscored Miami's reserves, 18-17, and had no player score more than seven points. All five starters for Miami scored in double figures and Dwyane Wade scored a team-high 16 points to go with a game-high 10 assists.

#### 5/18 – INDIANA 73, MIAMI 70

**MAY 18 - AMERICAN AIRLINES ARENA**

The Pacers couldn't have started much worse offensively, committing eight turnovers in the first nine minutes and falling into an early 19-11 hole. But, the defense took over from there and the second unit brought an offensive spark in the form of Al Harrington, who scored the final five points of a 13-3 run that put the Pacers ahead 24-23 midway through the second quarter. Indiana led 36-33 at the break despite 12 turnovers and just two points from its leading scorer, Jermaine O'Neal. The Pacers twice tried to assume command in the third quarter, opening a 50-41 lead after a 10-2 run, then making it 57-47 late in the period. But the offense went cold, missing eight shots in a row and 12 of 13 in a stretch of nearly six minutes as the Heat fought back into the game with a 15-4 run. Dwyane Wade scored the final eight points of the run, including a driving bucket to give Miami a 62-61 lead with eight-plus minutes remaining. O'Neal contributed two more plays that turned out to be huge, drawing fouls against Wade on successive possessions to send Miami's star player to the bench with five fouls with seven minutes remaining. Miami struggled offensively without Wade and the Pacers scored four in a row to take the lead, 65-62. Wade returned and Miami briefly regained the lead, 66-65, but then would score just one point over the next three minutes. That drought ended with a layup by Wade that cut the Pacers' lead to two with 47 seconds left in the game. After Lamar Odom made one of two free throws to draw the Heat to within three, 73-70, Ron Artest missed two free throws in a row, opening the door for the Heat to tie the game, but Rafer Alston's 3-pt FG with 1.9 seconds left missed badly. For the game, the Pacers held Miami to a club playoff opponent record-low 30.5 percent FGS and outrebounded the Heat, 53-42. All eight Pacers' players that played at least 10 minutes grabbed at least four rebounds and the starting five each had at least six boards, led by Jermaine O'Neal's 13. The Pacers had three players score in double figures, led by Ron Artest's game-high 27 points. Reggie Miller added 15 points and Jamaal Tinsley scored 10 points. Tinsley had a team-high three steals as he and Miller had all of the Pacers' four steals. The Heat were led by Wade's 24 points and Brian Grant's 10 rebounds.

The Western Conference has been represented by four teams (Houston, L.A. Lakers, San Antonio, Utah) three or more times in that span. ### SCORING BIG

The Pacers set an NBA record vs. Miami, 5/15, by beating them by 11 points, marking their sixth consecutive victory in the playoffs by a margin of 10 points or more. The record was five games held by the L.A. Lakers (1985) and the Philadelphia Warriors (1947). The Pacers also became just the second team in NBA playoff history to sweep four games of a best-of-seven series with a margin of victory by at least 10 points in each game. The Boston Celtics swept the Houston Rockets in the 1980 Eastern Conference Semifinals and won each game by double-digits.

### ENDING IT AT TWO

The Pacers lost consecutive games for just the fourth time this season with the second loss at Miami, 5/12. The two losses to Miami in the Eastern Conference Semifinals were the first of those four losing streaks that did not occur on a back-to-back. Minnesota and Indiana were the only teams during the regular season that did not lose more than two consecutive games the entire season.

### HOME COURT ADVANTAGE

The home court advantage has been significant through the conference semifinals and in particular for the four remaining teams. Detroit, Indiana, the L.A. Lakers and Minnesota have a combined home court record of 22-3 (.880) through the first two rounds of the playoffs. Including all playoff teams, the home court record through the first two rounds was 47-18 (.723). Below is chart showing each teams record at home through the first two rounds

# EASTERN CONFERENCE SEMIFINALS RECAP

## PACERS NOTES

### PUTTING IT ON THICK AND THIN

In Game 6 at Miami, 5/18, the Pacers held Miami to an opponent record low seven assists, but Indiana managed to hand out just 10 dimes, tying a team playoff record low. The combined 17 assists for the two teams marked the fewest in a playoff game in 36 years. The Chicago Bulls and L.A. Lakers combined for 16 assists on 3/29/68. In Game 5 vs. Miami, 5/15, the Pacers set a 2004 playoff-high with 27 assists, with at least five players registering three or more assists.

### WINNING WITH DEFENSE

On the road for Game 6 in Miami, 5/18, the Pacers registered their best defensive effort in their playoff history holding Miami to a record 30.5 (25-82 FGS) percent from the field. Through the first two rounds, the Pacers opponents have shot a combined 41.1 percent (299-727 FGS) from the floor and 32.3 percent (41-127 3-pt FGS) from beyond the arc. The Pacers are holding their opponents to an average of 84.6 points per game. During the regular season, opponents shot 43.3 percent from the field and averaged 85.6 ppg.

### PLUS-MINUS

With a team average through the playoffs at 8.8 ppg, Jermaine O'Neal leads the team with an average of 8.8 ppg. Ron Artest is the only other player averaging more than eight points at 8.2 ppg. The Pacers team average during the regular season was 5.8 ppg.

### BENCH MOB

The Pacers bench has been a major contributing factor for the success of the team all year and in the playoffs. They have averaged 28.1 ppg compared to their opponents who have averaged 20.4 ppg during the postseason. The Pacers bench has been outscored three times during the postseason, two of them losses. The Pacers bench averaged 40.3 ppg compared to the Celtics bench averaging 23.3 ppg, which coincidentally, the Pacers average margin of victory against Boston was 16.8 ppg. That margin decreased significantly in the Eastern Conference Semifinals where the Indiana bench averaged 21.1 ppg compared to Miami's bench that averaged 18.6 ppg.

# FIRST ROUND RECAP

## GAME-BY-GAME RECAPS

### INDIANA 104, BOSTON 88

APRIL 17, 2004 - CONSECO FIELDHOUSE

After a first quarter that was played at Boston's pace, the Pacers seized control in the second. The game was tied 35-35 early in the period when Fred Jones got things started with a five-point possession by making a driving basket and drawing a foul, but he missed the free throw. Al Harrington pulled down the rebound and kicked the ball out to Jones for a 3-pt FG that made it 41-35. Then came an altercation that seemed to fuel the Pacers when Brandon Hunter threw Jermaine O'Neal to the floor after the two got locked up battling for rebound position on Jones' 3-pt FG. O'Neal responded angrily and drew a technical foul. After the free throw, the Celtics would make just one basket the rest of the half, while the Pacers stretched their lead to 65-43 at the break. The Pacers set a franchise NBA playoff record with 35 points in the second quarter and tied their NBA playoff era mark of 65 points in the first half. Boston was unable to get closer than 16 the rest of the contest. Getting double-digit rebounds from Harrington (10), Jeff Foster (10) and O'Neal (11), the Pacers outrebounded the Celtics, 46-38, and limited Boston to just 13 second chance points on its 12 offensive rebounds. The Indiana defense held the Celtics' leading scorer, Paul Pierce, to just seven points and one field goal in the second half. Ron Artest and O'Neal each scored a game-high 24 points, while Harrington had 14 points and Reggie Miller scored 11 points.

### INDIANA 103, BOSTON 90

APRIL 20, 2004 - CONSECO FIELDHOUSE

Taking full advantage of their depth in the absence of suspended NBA Defensive Player of the Year Ron Artest, the Pacers rode strong performances from reserves Austin Croshere, Jonathan Bender and Fred Jones - who combined for 38 points - to turn around the game with a dominant fourth quarter and pull away for a 103-90 victory. Boston controlled most of the first 35 minutes, leading 69-61 heading into the final minute of the third quarter, but Croshere hit a 3-pt FG to close the period, then Al Harrington had a rebound dunk to start the fourth that served to fuel the Pacers. Croshere scored on a fastbreak, then Bender converted a three-point play to put the Pacers ahead for good, 72-71. When Bender and Jones finished the run with consecutive 3-pt FGS, a lineup featuring four reserves and Harrington, who started in Artest's absence, had put together a 24-4 run that opened an 85-73 lead with less than seven minutes remaining. In the second half, the Pacers limited the Celtics' leading scorer, Paul Pierce, to just 2-8 FGS, and both of those second-half field goals for Pierce came in the last five minutes of the game with the Pacers ahead by double digits. For the second straight game, the Pacers got double-doubles from both Jermaine O'Neal and Harrington. O'Neal led the Pacers with 22 points to go with his 11 boards and Harrington topped all rebounders with a playoff career-high 13 to accompany his 12 points. In just his second playoff appearance ever, Jones led the Pacers' bench with 17 points, just one short of his regular season career-high. To go with his playoff career-high seven boards, Bender scored 11 points.

### INDIANA 108, BOSTON 85

APRIL 23, 2004 - FLEETCENTER

The Pacers capitalized on 16 Celtics' turnovers for 20 points and utilized a 14-10 edge on the offensive glass for a 21-8 margin in second chance points, as the Pacers handed Boston its largest playoff home loss ever. The Celtics took an early lead at 10-5 with less than eight minutes left in the first period. Indiana then embarked on a 13-2 run that gave them a six-point lead. The Celtics came back with eight straight points to take a two-point advantage, which was the Celtics' last lead of the game, as the Pacers scored the last five points of the period. The Pacers started the second period by hitting 13 of their first 18 shots from the floor and snaring a 20-point lead with just under three minutes remaining in the half. Over the last two-and-a-half minutes of the half, the Celtics scored seven straight points, aided by four straight missed shots by Indiana, that sliced the Pacers' halftime lead to 53-40. Boston further trimmed the Pacers' lead, scoring the first six points of the second half. Fueled by 3-pt FGS by Reggie Miller and Jamaal Tinsley, the Pacers scored nine of the next 11 points to lift Indiana back to a double-digit lead at 62-48. The lead would never dip below nine points the rest of the contest and would grow to as large as 25 points in the fourth quarter. In the final period, the Celtics got to within 79-67, but the Pacers then scored 11 straight points, all by the duo of Fred Jones and Jonathan Bender. Those two combined for 16 of the Pacers' 29 points in the fourth quarter, all from its bench, as the Pacers' reserves outscored Boston's bench, 58-31, for the game. The Celtics had five players score in double figures, but its leading scorer, Paul Pierce, was held to a playoff career-low nine points on 4-17 FGS and 1-1 FT. The Pacers had four players in double figures, led by Al Harrington and Bender, who each had 19 points off the bench. Ron Artest and Jermaine O'Neal had 15 and 14 points, respectively.

### INDIANA 90, BOSTON 75

APRIL 25, 2004 - FLEETCENTER

Outscored 25-21 in the first period, the Pacers held the Celtics to just 5-19 FGS and shot 9-16 from the floor in the second period, as they ran out to an eight-point halftime lead. Indiana set a team playoff record with 19 thefts, and all nine players to see action had at least one steal and four players had three or more thefts with Reggie Miller leading the Pacers with a playoff career-best five steals. After Indiana scored 13 of the first 17 points of the third period, Boston scored five straight points to cut the Pacers' lead to 59-47 with four-and-a-half minutes left in the quarter, but the Pacers responded with an 11-2 run spurred by six points from Al Harrington that gave the Pacers a game-high 21-point lead with a minute to play in the third period. A 3-pt FG by Paul Pierce in the final minute of the third quarter started the Celtics on a 12-3 run that again cut the Indiana margin to 73-61. Despite hitting 8-12 FGS and 3-6 3-pt FGS in the fourth quarter, Boston would never get closer than 12 points the rest of the way. Indiana's balanced attack was led by 22 points from Ron Artest, with Jermaine O'Neal adding 18 points and Reggie Miller adding 14 for his best game of the series. Harrington led the bench with 13 points. For the first time in the four-game series, the Celtics had two players score 20+ points, as Pierce scored a game-high 27 points and Mark Blount had playoff career-highs of 21 points and 13 rebounds.

## PACERS NOTES

### POSTSEASON SUCCESS

Against the Celtics, the Pacers swept an opponent in a seven game series for just the second time in their NBA playoff history (Philadelphia, 1999 Eastern Conference Semifinals). The Pacers beat the Celtics for the first time in four postseason tries. The Pacers record against the Celtics improved to 8-10 with the sweep. The Pacers' overall postseason record improved to 67-63 (.515).

Indiana's win in Game 1 against Boston was the 14th time that the Pacers won the opening game of a playoff series. In those 14 series, Indiana is 12-2. Below is list of those series.

### PEAK PERFORMANCE

In each of their four victories against Boston, the Pacers displayed a huge and critical offensive explosion. In Game 1, 4/17, the Pacers went on a 30-8 run breaking a 35-35 tie in the second quarter to give them a 22-point halftime lead. The Pacers would lead by at least 16 points the rest of the way. In Game 2, 4/20, a 24-4 run spanned the third and fourth quarters helping the Pacers recover from an eight-point deficit. Indiana would go on to win by 13 points. At Boston in Game 3, 4/23, the Pacers broke open the game with a 32-10 run over the last two minutes of the first quarter and most of the second. The Pacers established a 20-point lead with about four minutes left in the half. Boston would not get closer than nine points the rest of the contest. After trailing for most of the first half of Game 4 at Boston, 4/25, Indiana went on a 33-9 run lifting them from a seven-point deficit in the second quarter to a 17-point lead in the third. The Pacers lead did not dip below 12 points for remainder of the game.

### RIP VAN PACERS

The Pacers had 10 days off between games from the First Round to the Eastern Conference Semifinals. That stretch ties the longest break since 1983-84 when the NBA expanded to 16 teams in the playoffs. The break ties for the second longest amount of days off between games in NBA history. The Los Angeles Lakers had 11 days off between games in 1981-82. Below is a breakdown of the five longest breaks between playoff games for a team and where they finished.
