Toronto lost its opening game of the 2002 NBA playoffs 85-63 ... Toronto's 63 points set a playoff franchise low for points in a game ... The Raptors opened the game shooting .182 (4-22) in the first quarter scoring a playoff franchise-low nine points ... Detroit scored 16 points on .316 shooting (6-19) ... Together, they set a NBA playoff record for fewest combined points by two teams in the first quarter ... Toronto improved its shooting in the second quarter to .500 (9-18) but still were outscored in the quarter 26-25 ... Detroit led 42-34 at the half ... Antonio Davis collected 10 of his team-high 14 rebounds in the first half ... The Raptors struggled from the floor in the third quarter shooting 16.7 (3-18) while scoring 11 points ... Toronto was outscored 20-18 in the fourth quarter ... Antonio Davis paced the Raptors with 15 points while Jerry Stackhouse scored 20 for the Pistons ... Ben Wallace set a Raptors playoff opponent high with 20 rebounds including a Raptors opponent playoff record 15 on the defensive end ... Toronto's .299 (23-77) shooting from the field set a new team playoff low as did its 23 field goals ... Toronto's 29 second-half points were also a new playoff low ... The Raptors held Detroit to an opponent playoff-low .211 (4-19) shooting from beyond the arc.

The Raptors trailed the best-of-five series 2-0 after dropping Game Two 96-91 to Detroit ... Alvin Williams missed a potential game-tying three pointer with 7.7 seconds remaining ... Toronto shot .545 (12-22) from the field in the first quarter with Keon Clark scoring eight of his then playoff career-high 12 points in the frame ... The Raptors outrebounded Detroit 15-6 in the first quarter and grabbed a postseason franchise-high 50 rebounds in the game ... The Raptors responded by starting the second quarter on a 9-2 run and led by as much as 10 points ... Corliss Williamson came off the Pistons' bench and netted eight of his 10 points in the quarter to pull Detroit to within three at the half ... Detroit shot only .318 (7-22) in the third quarter but outscored Toronto in the paint 12-4 and led 72-67 heading into the fourth quarter ... Jerry Stackhouse scored 13 of his career-playoff-high 31 points in the frame ... Antonio Davis scored 10 of his 21 points in the fourth as the Raptors shot .545 (12-22) from the field ... Toronto took an 85-83 lead at the 4:49 mark but lost it on a Jon Barry three-pointer and could not erase the deficit ... Detroit went 27-33 from the free throw line compared to 11-16 by Toronto ... Chris Childs scored a team-high 22 points and recorded a franchise playoff-best 14 assists ... Jerome Williams scored a career-playoff-high 13 points ... Ben Wallace grabbed a game-high 15 rebounds for Detroit.

The Raptors trail the best-of-five series 2-1 after winning Game Three in Toronto ... Toronto jumped out to a fast start shooting .619 (13-21) in the first quarter ... Alvin Williams scored eight of his 17 points in the quarter as Toronto took a 26-17 lead ... Chucky Atkins netted 13 of his playoff-career-high 21 points in the first quarter, leading all Pistons scorers in the game ... Detroit shot .588 (10-17) in the second quarter but were outscored 25-23 ... Antonio Davis scored 18 of his playoff-career and team-high 30 points in the first half shooting nine-of-11 from the field (finishing the game 14-of-19) ... He became the only other Raptors player other than Vince Carter to score more than 30 points in a playoff game ... Jerry Stackhouse was held scoreless in the first half ... Toronto outscored Detroit 28-27 in the third quarter despite being outscored on fast break points 11-6 ... Detroit closed to within six points of the Raptors with 6:52 remaining in the game, but could not move any closer as the Raptors went on to win by 10 points ... Chris Childs recorded his second straight double-double with 12 points and 10 assists.

The Raptors evened their best-of-five series at 2-2 with an 89-83 win at Air Canada Centre ... The Raptors scored the first basket of the game but the Pistons followed with an 8-0 run ... The Raptors scored 16 fast break points in the quarter compared to three by the Pistons ... The teams were tied 21-21 heading into the second stanza ... The Raptors went on an 11-0 run between the first and second quarter to open a nine-point lead ... Detroit shot .211 (4-19) from the field in the quarter with Corliss Williamson accounting for 12 of Detroit's 15 points ... He finished the game with a bench-high 14 points ... Toronto finished the first half leading 46-36 ... Keon Clark recorded a double-double by halftime with 15 points and 13 rebounds ... He finished the night with a career-playoff-high 19 points and a postseason-franchise-best 16 rebounds ... Detroit responded in the third quarter outscoring Toronto 25-20 on .500 (8-16) shooting from the field ... Chucky Atkins scored nine of his team-high 20 points in the frame ... The Raptors lost the fifth and deciding game to the Pistons 85-82, marking the end to their 2001-02 season ... Toronto shot .529 from the field in the first quarter, led by Keon Clark who netted nine points ... Corliss Williamson scored nine of his game-high 23 points in the second stanza as he and Jon Barry combined for 17 of Detroit's 25 second-quarter points ... The Raptors led 48-46 at halftime ... Toronto shot only .267 (4-15) from the field in the third frame and managed just 11 points ... Dell Curry scored 14 of his team-high 17 points in the fourth quarter ... Toronto tied the game three times in the last six minutes and led by four with 3:37 remaining but could not hold on to the lead ... Jerry Stackhouse made his only field goal of the game at the 1:42 mark of the fourth quarter which gave the Pistons a lead they would never relinquish ... Corliss Williamson made a lay-up from an in-bounds pass with two seconds remaining on the shot clock to give Detroit a four-point cushion with 26.8 seconds remaining to seal the victory.

The Toronto Raptors opened the 2001 NBA Playoffs with a 92-85 loss to the New York Knicks at Madison Square Garden ... Charles Oakley and Antonio Davis combined for 14 of Toronto's 18 first-quarter points, however, six different Knicks found the scoreboard early as New York took a 22-18 lead after the opening frame ... The Raptors tied a then playoff high with 26 points in the second stanza led by Chris Childs' seven points ... Toronto took a 44-41 halftime lead ... Alvin Williams carried the Raptors on his back in the third quarter scoring 10 points on .555 shooting from the field (5-9) ... The Knicks made a 9-0 run early in the second half to erase a six-point deficit and took a slim 66-65 lead into the final frame ... The Raptors shot 25 from the field in the fourth quarter (5-20) while the Knicks countered with .450 shooting (9-20) ... Antonio Davis scored 11 points in the fourth frame including Toronto's final seven points on seven-of-eight shooting from the charity stripe ... New York answered by scoring the game's last five points to extend its margin of victory to seven points, 92-85 ... Allan Houston scored a game-high 23 points while former Raptor Marcus Camby grabbed a game-high 18 rebounds ... The Raptors were outbounded 45-37 and dropped their fourth straight postseason game against the Knicks.

The Toronto Raptors captured their first postseason win in franchise history and evened the best-of-five series at 1-1 with a 94-74 victory over the New York Knicks ... Alvin Williams tallied 23 points to lead all scorers ... The Raptors led 20-16 at the end of one quarter as Antonio Davis scored six of his 15 points in the opening frame ... Toronto led by as much as seven points in the second quarter but the Knicks clawed back to even the score at 35-35 and trailed by four heading into the half ... Kurt Thomas netted 11 of his team-high 23 points in the second stanza on three-of-three shooting from the field and five-of-six shooting from the charity stripe ... Toronto built a 14-point lead on .625 shooting from the field through three quarters ... The Knicks did not make a three-point field goal through the first 36 minutes while Toronto countered with four-of-11 (.364) from downtown ... The Raptors took a 66-52 lead into the final frame ... Toronto set a then franchise playoff-high with 28 points in the fourth quarter due in large part to its 16-5 rebounding edge ... The Raptors finished the game with a 48-36 rebounding advantage and a twenty-point margin of victory ... Charles Oakley (12 points, 10 rebounds) and Antonio Davis (15 points, 12 rebounds) both finished the night with a double-double for Toronto and Kurt Thomas accomplished the same feat with 23 points and 12 rebounds for the Knicks.

The New York Knicks took a 2-1 series lead with a 97-89 win over the Toronto Raptors in front of a then record crowd of 20,217 at Air Canada Centre ... Toronto turned the ball over four times in the first five minutes of the game and six times through one quarter as New York built an early 11-3 lead ... The Raptors replied with a 7-0 run of their own and pulled within four points by the end of the first frame ... The Knicks shot .500 (9-18) from the floor in the first quarter and .529 for the game ... Glen Rice came off the Knicks bench in the second quarter and scored 10 of his 18 points on four-of-five shooting from the field and two-of-two from the charity stripe ... New York held a four-point lead, 45-41, going into halftime ... Trailing by as much as seven in the third frame, the Raptors tied the game at 54-54 midway through the quarter as Vince Carter and Charles Oakley each contributed eight points ... The Knicks led 68-67 going into the fourth stanza ... The Raptors took a short-lived lead early in the quarter at 72-70 but a three-pointer by Charlie Ward erased Toronto's only lead of the game ... The Knicks shot .643 (9-14) from the floor and went to the charity stripe six times while Toronto never made a trip to the line in the first quarter ... Vince Carter scored nine points in the opening frame to lead the Raptors to a 26-22 first-quarter advantage ... The Knicks continued to shoot well from the floor in the second stanza (9-16) and outscored Toronto 19-18 in the quarter as the Raptors held a 44-41 halftime lead ... Three New York players had scored in double figures by halftime (Sprewell, Houston and Rice) while Toronto's Vince Carter (17) and Chris Childs (10) also scored 10+ points before the break ... Toronto outrebounded the Knicks 16-14 in the first half as New York only grabbed one offensive rebound during the first 24 minutes ... The Raptors closed the night outrebounding New York 38-31 ... The Toronto Raptors won their first playoff series in franchise history with a 93-89 win in the decisive Game Five at Madison Square Garden ... Both teams shot better than .500 in the opening quarter as the Knicks outscored Toronto in the paint 12-4 ... The Raptors took a slim 25-24 lead after 12 minutes ... Latrell Sprewell scored nine points in the opening frame to lead all scorers ... Toronto came out with a 16-3 run to open the second stanza and collected nine second-chance points while the Knicks scored none ... Vince Carter scored nine of his 27 points in the second frame ... Despite shooting .563 in the first half (18-32) the Knicks trailed 49-43 going into the locker room at halftime... The Raptors led by as much as 13 points in the third quarter as Antonio Davis collected eight points in the frame ... New York turned the ball over six times in the quarter and Toronto took a 70-59 lead into the last stanza ... The Knicks responded with a 15-5 run early in the fourth quarter to pull within two points at 76-74 ... The Toronto Raptors captured their third straight postseason win and took a 1-0 lead in the Eastern Conference Semifinal with a 96-93 triumph over the conference-leading 76ers ... Allen Iverson scored 11 of his game-high 36 points in the first quarter but received only six points from his teammates ... Toronto led 21-17 after 12 minutes despite shooting .364 (8-22) from the floor ... The Raptors opened the second stanza with a 13-3 run and led by as much as 17 points ... Toronto shot .500 from the floor (11-22 ) compared to .200 by Philadelphia (4-20) ... Dell Curry came off the Toronto bench scoring eight of his 20 points to help the Raptors take a 47-37 lead into the half ... The 76ers did not score a three-pointer in the first half (0-3) while the Raptors connected on four-of-12 from downtown ... Both teams came out of the locker room with a hot hand shooting .500 apiece from the floor for the quarter ... Philadelphia outscored Toronto 10-0 in the paint during the third frame but the Raptors took a 73-61 lead into the final quarter ... Allen Iverson scored a Sixers franchise postseason-high 54 points to carry Philadelphia to a 97-92 win ... Iverson's 54 points were the most scored against the Raptors in franchise history ... Toronto led 31-21 after the first quarter on .619 (13-21) shooting from the floor ... Vince Carter scored 10 of his 28 points in the opening frame including six points from downtown to lead the Raptors ... The 76ers bounced back in the second stanza on .579 shooting (11-19) from the floor and 20 points from Iverson, including a 22-foot jump shot at the buzzer to give Philadelphia a 49-47 lead at halftime ... The teams exchanged points in the third quarter (24-24) ... Iverson scored 19 straight points for the 76ers in the final frame ... Antonio Davis collected his sixth double-double of the postseason (19 points, 10 rebounds) ... Dell Curry scored in double figures off the bench for the second straight game including three-of-six from beyond the arc ... Vince Carter tied an NBA postseason record with nine three-pointers, including a record eight treys in the first half as part of a 50-point night to boost the Raptors to a 102-78 win over the 76ers ... Both teams came out shooting well as the Raptors shot .500 (10-20) from the field and the Sixers replied with .526 (10-19) shooting ... Carter scored 15 points in the opening frame including three from downtown ... Allen Iverson netted 11 of his 23 points in the first quarter as the teams tied 23-23 after 12 minutes ... The Raptors set a postseason mark for points in a quarter with 35 in the second stanza, including 19 from Carter ... Antonio Davis and Chris Childs scored eight points apiece and were the only Raptors other than Carter to score in the quarter ... Carter's five three-pointers in the frame tied an NBA postseason record ... Philadelphia shot .167 from the field in the second quarter compared to .524 for the Raptors ... Toronto built a 17-point lead on runs of 12-1 and 13-3 to end the half with a 58-41 lead ... Carter's 34 points in the first half set a franchise playoff record ... The Philadelphia 76ers tied the Eastern Conference Semifinal series at 2-2 with an 84-79 win at Air Canada Centre ... Toronto scored the first basket of the game but never led for the remainder of the afternoon ... Allen Iverson scored 13 of his game-high 30 points in the first quarter, including two shots from downtown to boost the Sixers to a 26-18 lead after 12 minutes ... Toronto shot .260 from the field (13-50) in the first half while Philadelphia responded with .462 (18-39) ... The Sixers scored 23 fast-break points in the opening half and led 49-36 going into the break ... Aaron McKie scored 10 of his 18 points in the third quarter as the Sixers took a 70-61 lead into the final stanza ... Charles Oakley scored all of his 11 points in the third frame ... The Raptors tied the score at 78-78 with 2:46 to play on a Chris Childs' three-pointer, however, Iverson returned the favour from downtown and the Toronto turnover that followed put the game out of reach ... The Raptors set two franchise postseason lows with 79 points and a .333 field goal percentage (27-81) ... Toronto also set franchise playoff highs with 11 blocks and an .875 free-throw percentage (21-24) ... All five Raptor starters reached double-digit scoring ... Allen Iverson netted 52 points to become only the second player in NBA history to record two 50+ point games in a playoff series (Michael Jordan, 1988 vs. Cleveland) as the Sixers defeated the Raptors 121-88 ... Philadelphia started the game on an 11-0 run and never looked back ... The Sixers shot better than .600 from the floor in the first three quarters and finished the night with a .603 shooting percentage (47-78) ... The Sixers led 33-12 after 12 minutes, scoring 17 points on 10 Toronto turnovers ... Allen Iverson scored 29 of his 52 points in the first half, including four of his eight three-pointers ... Philadelphia increased its lead to 22 points (62-40) by halftime ...
