THINGS TO WATCH...

• **TIPOFF:** The Toronto Raptors return to the Las Vegas Summer League presented by EA Sports for the third time in four years. Since 2006 Toronto has compiled a 2-8 record when playing in Las Vegas. The Raptors have sent three first round draft picks to Summer League, including **Andrea Bargnani** (1st overall pick in 2006), and **DeMar DeRozan** (9th overall in 2009). **Joey Graham** (drafted in 2005) is the only Raptor that has participated in the Las Vegas Summer League twice.

• **UNDER THE "INTERNATIONAL" INFLUENCE:** Toronto's Summer League roster will include five players with international competition experience. **Roko Ukic** (Croatia), **Nathan Jawai** (Australia) and **Carl English** (Canada) will join their respective national teams following Summer League. **David Doblbas** played for Spain's Under-20 National Team in 2001, while **Ekene Ibekwe** played for Nigeria in the 2006 FIBA World Championships.

• **MIRROR, MIRROR:** The Raptors have a pair of ninth overall picks and 41st overall picks participating in Summer League. **DeMar DeRozan** (2009) and **Patrick O'Bryant** (2006) were both selected ninth in their respective draft years. **Roko Ukic** (2005) and **Nathan Jawai** (2008) were both taken with the 41st pick.

• **ON THE MEND:** Raptors forward **Kris Humphries** and guard **Marcus Banks** will be in Las Vegas during Summer League for individual workouts with the coaching staff. Humphries missed the final 38 games of the season after fracturing his right fibula during the fourth quarter January 18 vs. Phoenix. Banks underwent surgery to remove a bone spur on his right big toe March 24 and missed the final 12 games of the season.

• **HIGH FLYERS:** As a senior at Compton High School in California, **DeMar DeRozan** earned national recognition for winning the Slam Dunk Contest at the 2008 Mc'Donald's All-American game at the Bradley Center in Milwaukee. **Brent Petway** also earned national fame by winning the 2007 ESPN College Slam Dunk contest in Atlanta. Petway has won the NBA D-League Slam Dunk contest each of the past two seasons.

• **START'EM YOUNG:** **DeMar DeRozan** became the fourth teenager selected by Toronto when he was taken ninth overall in the 2009 NBA Draft. DeRozan was 19 years, nine months and 19 days old when he was drafted on June 26, making him the fourth youngest player taken during the first round in franchise history. Tracy McGrady was the youngest first round draft pick by Toronto in 1997.

Mullens (Oklahoma City) and Toney Douglas (New York), who was originally drafted by the Lakers and later traded to the Knicks ... TEAM NOTES



• **RETURNING TO LAS VEGAS:** Several players on this year's summer league squad have played in Las Vegas before. Nathan Jawai will become the second player to participate in the Las Vegas Summer League twice as a member of the Raptors. Jawai saw limited action last year because of a strained groin. Joey Graham is the only other multi-year participant in 2005 and 2008. Quincy Douby is making his fourth visit to Las Vegas. Douby first played in 2006 with the Sacramento Kings and was limited to two games because of a sore lower back. In 2008 he was third in scoring, averaging 22.3 points. Patrick O'Bryant makes his third trip to summer league, after two stints with the Golden State Warriors. O'Bryant averaged 9.6 points and 4.2 rebound as a rookie in 2006, and followed up the next year by averaging 5.6 points and 5.8 rebounds with the Warriors in 2007. Ekene Ibekwe and Brent Petway are the other returning players from the 2008 Las Vegas Summer League. Ibekwe played in five games for the Phoenix Suns, while Petway was on the Memphis Grizzlies roster but did not play.

• **FIRST ROUNDERS:** Toronto's last four first-round draft selections have all participated in summer league action. Andrea Bargnani was the latest in 2006 when he averaged 13.2 points and 3.8 rebounds during five games in Las Vegas. Joey Graham and Charlie Villanueva both participated in the Minnesota Pro Summer League in 2005. Graham averaged 14.5 points and 5.5 rebounds in four games, while Villanueva averaged 17.3 points and 5.6 rebounds in three games. In 2004 Rafael Arujo averaged 8.0 points and a team-high 8.2 rebounds during five games at the Minnesota Pro Summer League.

finished the season with a 25-40 record. Chris Bosh was named to the All-Star team for the fourth time in his career but did not participate due to a sprained knee. On February 13, the Raptors traded centre Jermaine O'Neal, forward Jamarion Moon and a conditional draft pick to Miami for forward Shawn Marion, guard Marcus Banks and cash considerations. Jose Calderon became the all-time franchise leader in assists with his 1,792nd as a Raptor on March 13 vs. Detroit. Toronto set a franchise-record for points March 29 in defeating the Chicago Bulls 134-129 in overtime. Jose Calderon had a franchise high-tying 19 assists March 29 vs. Chicago. The Raptors had a season-best six-game win streak from March 22 - April 4 and finished the season with nine wins in the final 13 games. In the 27 games following the All-Star break, Toronto compiled a 12-15 (.444) record versus a 21-34 (.382) mark prior to the break. Chris Bosh was one of three players in the NBA to average 20 points and 10 rebounds or assists (Dwight Howard, Chris Paul) in

The Toronto Raptors finished with a 33-49 record, missing the postseason for the first time since the 2005-06 season. The Raptors were 18-23 at home and 15-26 on the road. Toronto set a franchise record with an .824 free throw percentage (1534-for-1861, first in the NBA). The .824 mark is the third-best team free throw percentage in NBA history. Toronto finished fifth in the NBA in averaging 23.0 assists. Toronto's NBA record consecutive game streak with at least one three-point field goal made continued and is now at 860. Toronto acquired forward Jermaine O'Neal and the draft rights to centre Nathan Jawai in exchange for guard T.J. Ford, forward Rasho Nesterovic, forward Maceo Baston and the draft rights to centre Roy Hibbert on July 9. Chris Bosh received his fifth NBA Player of the Week for the week of Oct. 28 – Nov. 2. Bosh scored 40 points and grabbed 18 rebounds November 18 at Orlando. Sam Mitchell was relieved of head coaching duties and assistant coach Jay Triano was named head coach on an interim basis on December 3. Triano

scoring a career-high 22.7 points (first on the team, ninth in the NBA) and averaging 10.0 rebounds (sixth in the NBA). Bosh also topped his personal and franchise record for double-doubles with 43 (previously 42). Bosh also set the franchise marks for free throws made 504 and attempts 617. Jose Calderon led the team with 8.9 assists per game (fourth in the NBA) and finished the season with the NBA single-season record for free throw percentage (.981). Calderon also led the NBA with a 4.24 assist per turnover ratio.

JAY TRIANO

TORONTO RAPTORS HEAD COACH

Jay Triano was promoted to head coach and signed to a three-year contract May 11, 2009. He is the seventh head coach in franchise history.

The 2009-10 campaign marks Triano's eighth as a member of the Raptors' coaching staff. He served as an assistant to three coaches before being named interim head coach. He became the first Canadian born and Canadian trained coach in the NBA when he joined Lenny Wilkens' staff for the 2002-03 season.

Triano took over the head coaching duties on an interim basis December 3, 2008 following the dismissal of Sam Mitchell. Triano guided the club to a 9-4 mark in its final 13 outings in the 2008-09 season, and a 12-15 record after the all-star break. He finished 25-40 overall.

A native of Niagara Falls, Triano was the head coach of the Canadian men's national team from 1998-2004 posting a 52-42 (.553) record. He led Canada to a semifinal berth in the 2003 FIBA Americas Olympic Qualifying Tournament in Puerto Rico and to a 5-2 record, second best to the United States, in the 2000 Olympics. He has also served as an assistant coach of the USAB Select Team (2007 and 2008), the head coach of the NIKE Skills Academy in Vancouver (2006) and Toronto (2007), and for the past six years as a coach at the prestigious EURO CAMP in Treviso, Italy.

Prior to becoming a NBA assistant coach, Triano worked in the league from 1995-2001 as a radio and television analyst and director of community relations for the Vancouver Grizzlies. He moved to Toronto from Vancouver in 2001 to work as a basketball analyst for TSN.

Triano began his coaching career in 1985 as an assistant at his alma mater Simon Fraser University in Burnaby, British Columbia. He took over the school's head coaching duties in 1988 and served in that capacity until 1995. In 1992-93, he also worked as an assistant coach on the Canadian men's national team and in 1993-94 he was the head coach of the Canadian men's junior national team.

During his collegiate playing career at Simon Fraser, Triano led the Clansmen in scoring all four seasons and set 11 school records, including the career scoring mark of 2,616 points. He was also a member of the football team during his senior season. In 1981, he was drafted by the Los Angeles Lakers in the eighth round of the NBA Draft and by the Calgary Stampeders in the sixth round in the CFL Draft.

Following graduation, Triano played for the Canadian national team for 11 years (1978-88) and was team captain from 1981-88. He represented Canada as a player on three Olympic teams (1980, 1984 and 1988), serving as captain for the last two.

Triano also wore his country's colours internationally in the World University Games in 1979, 1981 and 1983 where he led the tournament in scoring and Canada to the gold medal, and in 1985 in Kobe, Japan where he carried the Canadian flag at the opening ceremonies.

Triano is a member of the Canadian Basketball, Canadian Olympic, Basketball British Columbia, Basketball Ontario, Simon Fraser Athletic and Niagara Falls Halls of Fame.

In April 2005, Triano was honoured by the Raptors with the Coach Mac Award, given annually to a member of the Canadian basketball community who through exemplary character and effort, has made a major contribution to the sport of basketball while upholding the principles for which Coach Mac stood – honesty, integrity, competitiveness and a love of the game.

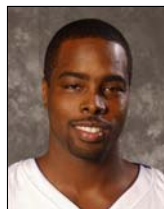
