Established by Rockets Owner Leslie Alexander in 1995, the Clutch City Foundation provides hope, help and inspiration for those who might otherwise be forgotten. The Clutch City Foundation serves as the umbrella organization for all Rockets community initiatives. Through the foundation, Rockets players, coaches and staff participate in a myriad of programs that help to make life better for Houstonians – especially those in need.

Tux & Tennies Charity Gala

Recognized as the premier fundraising event of the Clutch City Foundation, and held on the Rockets court at Toyota Center, more than 400 guests wear their favorite sneakers, spend time with the Rockets team and bid on exclusive and rare autographed memorabilia in the silent auction. Since 1996, the Clutch City Foundation Tux & Tennies Charity Gala has raised nearly \$5 million. Proceeds from last year's Gala benefited the Dikembe Mutombo Foundation. Money raised was utilized to help build the Women & Children's Center of the Biamba Maria Mutombo Hospital, which is located in the Democratic Republic of the Congo.



United Way of Greater Houston

The Rockets are committed to working with the United Way of Greater Houston in its efforts to provide a safety net for thousands of Houstonians who depend on social agencies for support. Over the past several years, Owner Leslie Alexander and Rockets employees have contributed nearly \$450,000 to the United Way Annual Campaign. In addition, the organization participates in the annual Days of Caring, a city-wide, two-day community service initiative dedicated to helping non-profit organizations with projects that enhance their facilities, which includes painting, landscaping, construction and other projects.

A Season of Giving

During the holiday season, Houston Rockets players, coaches and staff host a series of events for members of the community who are less fortunate. Each year, hundreds of children and their families are the recipients of private parties, gifts and surprise visits by players.



Sunshine Kids

Each season, the Houston Rockets and Southwest Airlines host the Sunshine Kids on an exclusive trip to see a Rockets road game. These children, faced with the challenge of battling cancer, are treated to a tip-off party at the airport featuring breakfast and trivia questions from the Rockets Power Dancers. Next, the children board a Southwest Airlines flight to spend some one-on-one time with Rockets players at a special meet-and-greet before seeing the Rockets take on their opponent.

Grassroots Basketball



Research proves that children who play sports are more likely to excel academically and in every other area of their lives. Such a powerful impact on the lives of youth, providing the resources and opportunity for young people to play basketball is important to the Houston Rockets. That's why grassroots basketball programs comprise a large part of Rockets youth initiatives, which make it possible for thousands of children throughout Greater Houston to get involved in the game. Programs include:

Clutch City Shootout

Clutch City Shootout is a 3-point shooting contest for high school students who compete to win a portion of \$25,000 for their school's athletic program. Athletes compete during pre-game and halftime of Rockets games throughout the season. The boys and girls champions each receive a Rockets rally at their school.

Best Shot ... Serving Boys & Girls Clubs of Greater Houston

The Rockets and the Boys & Girls Clubs of Greater Houston have been in partnership for the past thirteen seasons. Students at 13 branches of the Club

participate in the Best Shot Basketball League, a 10-week after-school program that provides students with academic tutoring, cultural awareness workshops and drug prevention education. More than 1,400 students participate.

Houston Rockets Skills Camps

Continuing to expand upon grassroots basketball initiatives, the Rockets host a series of Skills Camps throughout the Season. Each camp offers specialized training in basketball fundamentals, while teaching the importance of teamwork and good sportsmanship. Be Fit Challenge with Memorial Hermann

The Houston Rockets and Memorial Hermann reward children who make nutritious eating and regular exercise a daily habit – and encourage parents to become involved in their children's healthy lifestyles. The Be Fit Challenge is implemented in Houston schools, and provides children with nutritional and activity tips. It also includes a Be Fit game where students can win Rockets prizes. Additionally, one school is rewarded with an exciting Be Fit Rally, starring Rockets entertainment and Memorial Hermann fitness and nutrition experts.

Rockets Read to Achieve with HEB

Rockets Read to Achieve Jam

This season thousands of elementary students throughout Greater Houston will take part in the Rockets Read to Achieve Jam at Toyota Center. The high energy rally will feature local artists and celebrities, as well as Rockets players and entertainers.

Rockets SAT Training Camp

Hosted in partnership with the Princeton Review, SAT Training Camp is a college prep day for local athletes. The SAT Training Camp provides a full menu of information to help guide parents and students through the college application process, including information about admissions, financial aid, SAT/PSAT prep classes, test dates and much more.

Power of Preparation

Through the Power of Preparation program, the Rockets and Administaff encourage elementary and middle school students prepare for a great future, by making wise choices "today." Four Power of Preparation rallies are held across Houston featuring high-energy performances and inspirational messages from Rockets entertainers, which inspire students to succeed.

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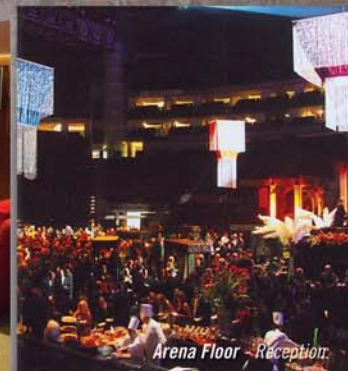
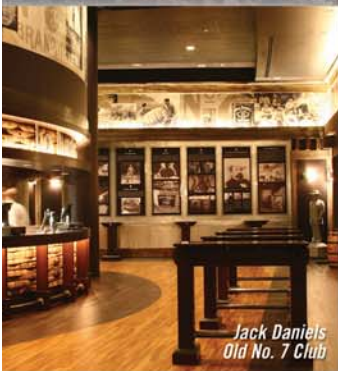

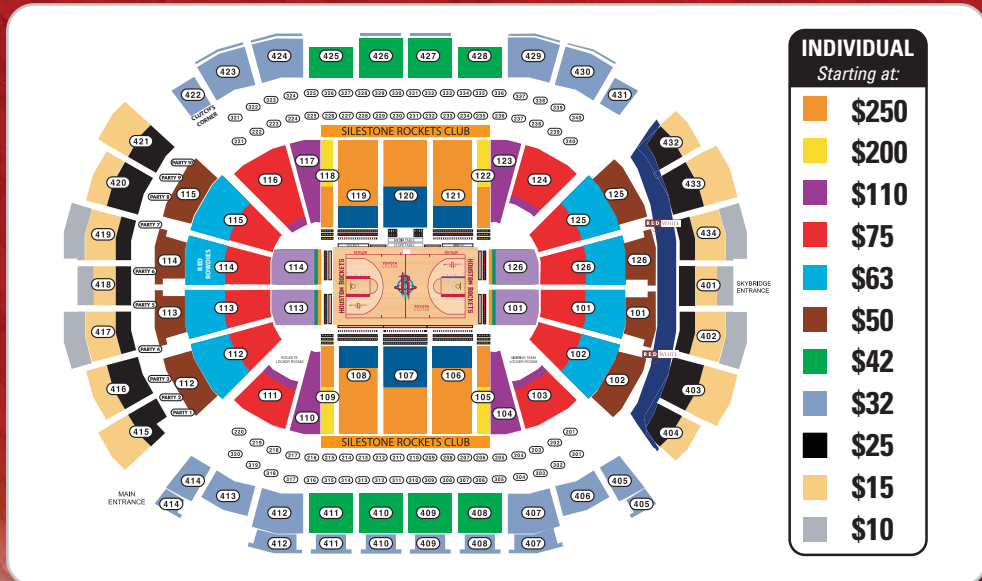

TOYOTA CENTER SEATING MAP



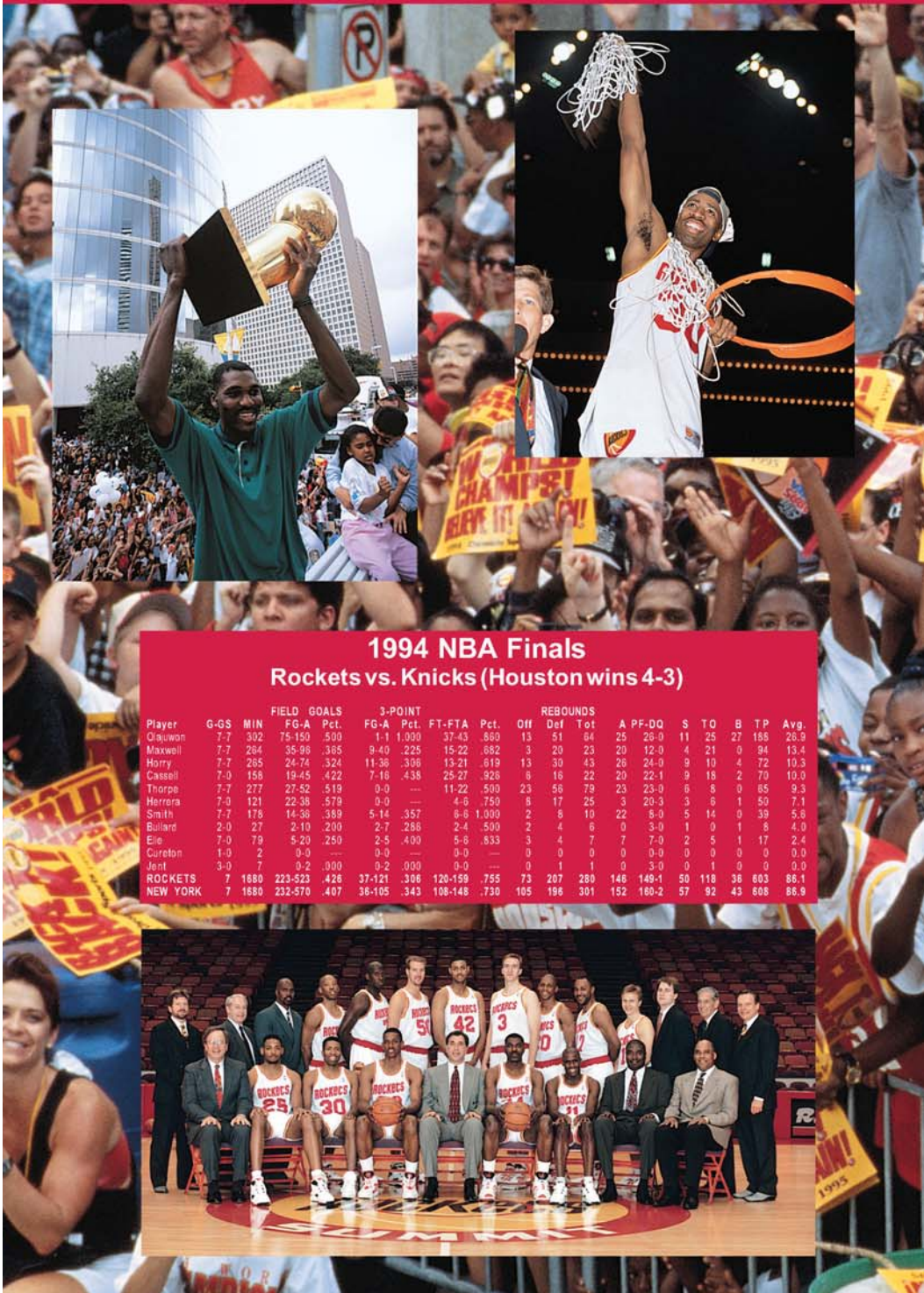

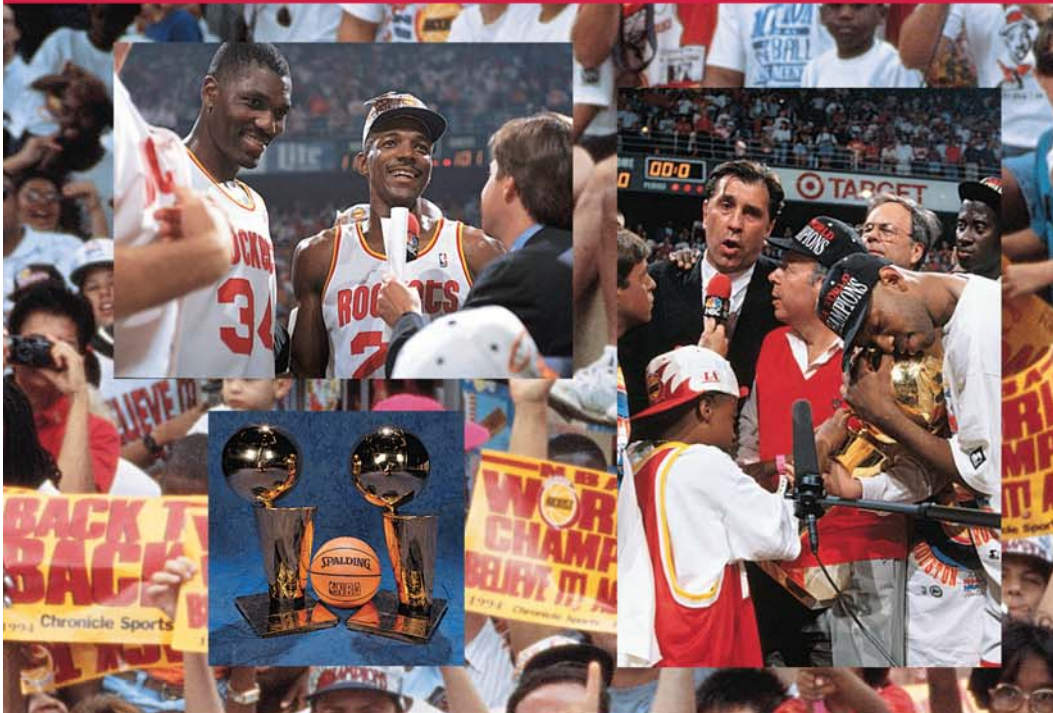
