Kevin Garnett was again the leader of the NBA's 20-20 club in 2005-06 in posting 20 or more points and rebounds in the same game. He did it three times as he did in 2004-05. Other high totals: Chris Kaman, Dwight Howard, Marcus Camby 2 each; Antawn Jamison, Chris Webber, Chris Wilcox, Elton Brand, Shawn Marion, Tim Duncan and Yao Ming once each. Past winners were Garnett 3 times in 2004-05 and 2005-06 and 5 times in 2003-04, Tim Duncan did it 6 times in 2002-03, Dirk Nowitzki 4 times in 2001-02, Tim Duncan 5 times in 2000-01, Shaquille O'Neal 4 times in 1999-00; Chris Webber twice in 1998-99, Arvidis Sabonis, twice in 1997-98; Dikembe Mutombo, Shaquille O'Neal, Jayson Williams and Chris Webber 2 each in 1996-97; Karl Malone, David Robinson and Joe Smith 2 each in 1995-96, Vlade Divac 3 in 1994-95, Shaquille O'Neal 6 in 1993-94 and 7 in 1992-93; Kevin Willis 12 in 1991-92; Hakeem Olajuwon 6 in 1990-91 and 8 in 1989-90; Robert Parish 5 in 1988-89, Olajuwon 6 in 1987-88, Charles Barkley 11 in 1986-87. ARIZIN & PHILLIP TOP NBA STATS SAME SEASON

Paul Arizin and Andy Phillips, then with the Philadelphia Warriors, are the only teammates to win scoring and assist titles in the same season (1951-52). Arizin led in scoring (25.4) and Phillip in assists (8.2). Others to win 2 major titles in same season. Wilt Chamberlain led in points (24.3), Rebounds (23.8) and assists (8.6) in 1967-68). Wilt led in points and rebounds in 1959-60, 1960-61 and 1961-62 with the Philadelphia Warriors; 1962-63 with San Francisco; 1965-66 with 76ers. Nate Archibald led in points (34.0) and assists (11.4) in 1972-73. Steve Nash led in Assists (105) and FT% (92.1) in 2005-06.

FRED ROBERTS IS TRIVIA ANSWER

A trivia question making the rounds is this: What player performed with both Magic Johnson and Larry Bird during regular NBA seasons? The answer is Fred Roberts who played with Bird in Boston in 1986-87 and 1987-88 and with Magic in Los Angeles in 1995-96.

RILEY MISSES FIRST PLAYOFFS

Pat Riley, as a coach, and playoffs are synonymous. Pat did it nine years with the LA Lakers; four with New York and six with Miami before failing in 2001-02 and 2002-03. In 2005-06, he returned to win the title at Miami. He also played in four playoffs once with San Diego, four with the Lakers and once with Phoenix.

WALTON HOLDS MISLEADING STATISTIC

Bill Walton claims to be the first player to lead the league in rebounds and blocked shots in 1976-77. But Bill Russell and Wilt Chamberlain never had the opportunity since blocked shots didn't become an official NBA statistic until the 1973-74 season, five years after Russell retired and one year after Wilt retired.

HORRY AND SALLEY CHAMPIONS IN THREE CITIES

John Salley is the first player to win the championship rings with three different franchises- with Detroit in 1989 and 1990, Chicago in 1996 and the LA Lakers in 2000. Salley thus was also a member in three different decades. Robert Horry tied Salley with San Antonio's title in 2005. He previously had won in 1994 and 1995 in Houston and 2000, 2001 and 2002 with the LA Lakers.



WILT'S DOUBLE FIGURE GAMES

Here is an analysis of Wilt Chamberlain's career and his strings of scoring double figures in games.

Began on Oct. 24, 1959 and went through Feb. 9, 1960 (56 straight games). Missed on Feb. 10, 1960. He had 2 1-2 5. Philadelphia lost to New York 125-116. Did not play in next two games. SEE NOTE 1 BELOW.

Began new string on Feb. 14, 1960 and went through Jan. 19, 1963 (220 straight games). Missed on Jan. 20, 1963. He had 3 0-1 6. San Francisco lost to St. Louis 116-115. SEE NOTE 2 BELOW.

Began new string on Jan. 22, 1963 and went through Dec. 4, 1964 (133 straight games). Missed on Dec. 5, 1964. He had 4 0-1 8. San Francisco lost to Boston 105-81 and Wilt did not play in the next game. SEE NOTE 3 BELOW.

Began new string on Dec. 11, 1964 and went through Nov. 1, 1967 (219 straight games). Missed on Nov. 4, 1967. He was 0-0 1-2 1. Philadelphia beat San Francisco 117-110. Wilt had no shots but posted 13 assists.

Began new string on Nov. 7, 1967 and went through Nov. 17, 1967 (7 straight games). Missed on Nov. 18, 1967. He had 3 2-7 8. Philadelphia lost to Boston 116-111 but Wilt out-rebounded Bill Russell, 33-19 before Spectrum record crowd of 15,239.

Began new string on Nov. 22, 1967 and went through Nov. 22, 1968 (83 straight games). Missed on Nov. 24, 1968. He had 1 4-14 6. Los Angeles beat Chicago 103-100. Wilt missed 9 foul shots within 58 seconds of first quarter.

After the miss on Nov. 24, 1968, Wilt had only short strings of double figure games. The longest of those strings was 22 games.

Wilt was shut out only once on Mar. 27, 1973 as Los Angeles lost to Milwaukee 85-84.

Wilt was a bad foul shooter but his first four missed double figure games could not have been saved by better free throw shooting.

NOTE 1: Wilt had been hit in the mouth by an elbow from Clyde Lovelette of St. Louis in the previous game which loosened 2 teeth and messed up his lip. In this game he got hit in the mouth again by Willie Naulls after only 9 minutes of the first quarter. He was done for the night and missed the next two games.

NOTE 2: Wilt was ejected by Ref Red Oates, in the first quarter, after only 4 minutes of the game had been played, for protesting a foul call against his teammate Wayne Hightower.

NOTE 3: Wilt was injured during game and left prematurely with broken nose.

Wilt scored double figures in 628 of his first 631 games — was injured in two and tossed in another.

He scored double figures in his first 84 playoff games but missed a number of times after that in the playoffs.

Derek Fisher then hit a three-pointer and missed the foul shot but teammate Carlos Boozer grabbed the offensive rebound and scored. That whole sequence took just 27 seconds from 10:34 to 10:07 of the 4th period.



FOURTEEN FREE THROWS – NO BASKETS

What turned out to be an awful night for the Detroit Pistons turned out to be a record setting night for Richard "Rip" Hamilton of the Pistons. Hamilton did not come off any curl routes and make a three or mid-range jump shot. He did not score a dunk shot or lay up. He did not, in fact, make a single basket. What he did do was make 14 out of 14 free throws, which was significant for two reasons. First, the fact of 14 free throws with no baskets is the most ever free throws made without scoring a basket in an NBA game, as researched by Dick Pfander of Beulah, Michigan. Second, this is the highest scoring total in league history where a player was his team's leading scorer without making a basket. The Pistons were outscored by Memphis in every quarter but the 4th, and shot only 31% for one of their poorest games of the season at home. The box score follows:

NEW RULES UNDER THE NEW CBA

The minimum age for draft eligibility increases under the new CBA agreement. U.S. players must be at least one year removed from their high school's class graduation to be draft eligible. International players must turn 19 during the calendar year of the draft. The players will receive no less than 57 percent of basketball-related income, a percentage that could increase if revenue increases. The maximum length of any contract drops from seven years to six. Free agents changing teams can sign for five years, down from six. The maximum annual salary increase drops from 12.5 percent to 10.5 percent. Teams may assign players to the NBA Development League during their first two seasons. Veterans are subject to four random drug tests. The old rules called for one test during training camp. Rookie rules are different. Players can now appeal suspensions longer than 12 games for on-court misconduct.

FOUR LEFTIES IN TORONTO STARTING LINEUP

This feat may have been duplicated in the past, but it's the first time I've been notified of it. In Toronto's game at Chicago on April 9, 2005, the Raptors had four left handed players in their starting lineup. The four lefties were Chris Bosh, Jalen Rose, Morris Peterson and Aaron Williams. Only the other starter, Rafer Alston is right handed.
