# 2007-08 PHILADELPHIA 76ERS GENERAL INFORMATION

Welcome.

The Philadelphia 76ers would like to welcome all members of the media to the 2007-08 season, our 12th season in the Wachovia Center and our 45th in the City of Brotherly Love. We ask you to please read this section carefully and thank you in advance for your anticipated cooperation.

**CREDENTIALS:** Appropriate credentials are required for access to the Wachovia Center and should be kept visible at all times. In accordance with NBA regulations, the Sixers will limit the number of season credentials. In order to be considered for a season credential, an individual media member must cover a minimum of 30 Sixers home games, while others will be allotted on a game-by-game basis. A single-game credential allows the same access and privileges as a season pass. In accordance with NBA rules, all season passes must include a photo headshot of the approved individual. Media members wishing to cover a single game must contact the Philadelphia 76ers Public Relations staff at least 24 hours prior to the intended game. Passes are issued on a space-available basis for all single-game requests. First-time requests must be in written form on company letterhead and received by mail, or by fax at (215) 339-7632. Credentials will be left at the Press Entrance (located on the North side of the Main Concourse Level) and can be picked up two hours prior to tip-off on game nights.

**ENTRANCE:** Media members attending a Sixers game at the Wachovia Center should enter the building through the Press Entrance, located on the North side of the Main Concourse Level.

**PARKING:** Parking passes are issued prior to the season to those media members who regularly cover the team. Media members wishing to cover a single game, and require parking, must contact the Philadelphia 76ers Public Relations staff at least 48 hours prior to game day. Media members attending Sixers games should park in Lot F, located between the Wachovia Center and the Wachovia Spectrum, along the 11th Street side.

**MEDIA ROOM:** The media room is located at the Northeast corner of the Event Floor Level. Appropriate credentials are required for media room access. The media room consists of a dining facility, working stations and complimentary wireless internet access. Food, game notes, media kits, storage space and working space are available to the media during the course of an event. Food and beverages are served two hours before tip-off time. Refreshments are available during the game. A nominal fee of \$6 is charged for a pre-game meal.

**SEATING:** Home and visiting television will be seated courtside at the scorers table. Home and visiting radio will be seated in section 112 seating location. All other media will be assigned seats on the baseline (section 118) on a space-available basis.

**STILL & VIDEO PHOTOGRAPHERS:** Photo work space is limited and your cooperation is appreciated. Still and video photographers are limited to the baselines at each end of the court. In accordance with the NBA policy, no hard-back chairs are permitted courtside and all photographers must keep clear of the escape lanes on both sides of the basket stanchions. Rubber lens shades are required for all still photographers who are credentialed to shoot a 76ers game.

**LOCKER ROOM ACCESS:** The locker rooms are located on the west side (Broad Street) of the Event Level. In accordance with NBA policy, the 76ers locker room will be open 90 minutes prior and close 45 minutes prior to tip-off. Following a ten-minute cooling off period, the locker room will open after the game has been completed. Only credentialed media are allowed in the locker room and no autographs are permitted. Cell phones are not permitted in the locker rooms, per NBA policy. All media members are asked to have their passes visible at all times while in the Wachovia Center.

**GAME NOTES & STATS:** Game notes for both teams will be available in the press room two hours prior to tip-off. For visiting media, game notes, credentials, programs and recent news clips will be delivered to their hotel as early as possible upon arrival in Philadelphia. Play-by-play, quarterly boxes, halftime boxes, final notes and quotes will be delivered to all media locations as quickly as possible. Stat monitors are available to all in media the press room.

**PRACTICE HOTLINE:** Media members can access practice times on the 76ers 24 hours a day through a special automated hotline. Please contact the 76ers Public Relations office for the hotline number.

**PRACTICES & SHOOTAROUNDS:** Sixers practices and gameday shootarounds are held at Philadelphia College of Osteopathic Medicine (PCOM) located at 4190 City Ave. in Philadelphia. Parking is available in the garage across from the practice facility and in the parking lot across the street behind the facility. Please call the Sixers Media Hotline for practice and shootaround times.

**TELEPHONES:** The Sixers have a limited number of telephones available to working media members in the media section (section 118). Additional requests for telephone lines should be directed to the Wachovia Center Operations Department at (215) 339-9490.

## TELEVISION COVERAGE

First-year analyst **Bob Salmi** joins Emmy-Award winning play-by-play announcer **Marc Zumoff** on the 76ers broadcast team for the 2007-08 season. Salmi and Zumoff, who is returning for his 14th season, will provide Sixers fans with top-notch local coverage of the Sixers this season. Comcast SportsNet, CN8, The Comcast Network, and The CW Philly-57 (WPSG-TV) will combine to telecast all 82 Sixers regular-season contests in the Philadelphia area.

This season, Comcast SportsNet will broadcast 72 Sixers games, with all home games airing in high definition. Comcast SportsNet currently operates 11 sports networks that cover more than 2,400 live sporting events annually and deliver comprehensive sports news and analysis to 38 million cable and satellite homes. This season, Comcast SportsNet Philadelphia will broadcast over 300 live professional and amateur sports events including Flyers, Phillies and Phantoms games in addition to the Sixers. Comcast SportsNet combines action packed coverage along with insightful sports news and talk programming to form the best regional sports network in the country.

For the 11th-consecutive season, the Sixers have teamed up with The CW-57 (WPSG). This year, CW-57 will air a five-game slate. The Sixers have formed an outstanding partnership with the flagship station of the Paramount Stations Group, which began broadcasting Sixers games in 1996-97 after a five-year hiatus.

CN8, The Comcast Network, will broadcast five road games in its first season as a local broadcast outlet. CN8, The Comcast Network, provides more than nine million Comcast cable viewers with a unique brand of live, interactive television delivered over its own fiber-optic network to 12 states and 20 television markets stretching from Maine to Virginia and Washington, D.C.

In addition to the outstanding on-air personalities, the Sixers broadcast team also has exceptional behind the scenes talent led by Executive Producer Shawn Oleksiak and J.R. ## TELEVISION COVERAGE



### MARC ZUMOFF Television Play-by-Play Announcer

Emmy-Award winner Marc Zumoff enters his 14th season as the Sixers television play-by-play announcer and his 26th as a part of the 76ers broadcast team. Zumoff, a Philadelphia native, was officially named play-by-play announcer on Aug. 17, 1994. He has been honored with an Emmy for best sports play-by-play broadcaster 10 times.

Zumoff's various freelance assignments include hosting the news and public affairs show Radio Times with Marty Moss-Coane on the local National Public Radio affiliate WHYY-FM. During the summer, he co-hosts several stops on the Sixers Summer Hoops Tour. He also appears regularly at community functions on behalf of the team and spearheads two annual charitable endeavors: the Tee off with Zumoff golf outing in September to benefit the Pathway School for learning disabled students and the Points for Peace 3-on-3 basketball tournament at the Palestra in March. He also runs a workshop on How to Break into Broadcasting, and he is co-authoring a book on the same topic.

Zumoff has done play-by-play for NBA-TV and for Turner Sports' coverage of the NBA, including both regular season and playoff games, the network's coverage of the Goodwill Games, as well as play-by-play for CN8's coverage of college football.

Prior to joining the Sixers broadcast team full time, Zumoff was a part of the now-defunct PRISM Sports Network and has done play-by-play for a variety of events and teams in the region, including the Philadelphia Flyers, the Philadelphia Big Five and the Philadelphia Fever of the Major Indoor Soccer League.

Zumoff broke into television as the play-by-play talent for the Fever which helped lead to his position with PRISM. During his days at Temple, Zumoff announced Owl football and basketball games. Following his graduation from Temple University, he had stints at WBUD and WTTM Radio in Trenton, N.J. and WHWH Radio in Princeton, N.J.

Zumoff lives in suburban Philadelphia with his wife Debbie and their two sons Jake (18) and Pace (14).



### BOB SALMI Television Analyst

Bob Salmi joins the 76ers broadcast team as the full-time analyst, providing insight to the game while working court-side with Sixers play-by-play announcer Marc Zumoff. Salmi has an extensive television and basketball background, including his work as an analyst on Comcast SportsNet's Sixers Post Game Live and more than 500 NBA telecasts during his career.

A graduate of Florida Southern College where he played for three seasons, Salmi continued his career in basketball as an assistant coach at Kings College (Pa.) and Muhlenberg College before joining the NBA ranks. Salmi spent two seasons with the Philadelphia 76ers (1987-89) as the team's video coordinator and shooting coach, working under head coaches Matt Guokas and Jim Lynam. Salmi went on to work with the coaching staffs of the New York Knicks for five seasons (1989-95) working with Stu Jackson, John MacLeod, Pat Riley, Don Nelson and Jeff Van Gundy. He also had a stint as an assistant coach with the Dallas Mavericks during the 1996-97 season, as head coach of the CBA's Rockford Lightning (2001-02) and as an advanced scout with the Washington Wizards (2001-03).

Salmi continued his career as an analyst for NBA game broadcasts and has been awarded two Emmys for his work as NBC's "Coach in the Truck." This ground-breaking program utilized Salmi's coaching background in the production of the game to bring that unique experience to the viewer. He has served as an analyst for Comcast SportsNet, ESPN and NBC, working alongside personalities such as Bob Costas, Marv Albert, Doug Collins, Mike Breen, Al Michaels and Bill Walton. Salmi's broadcast experience has given the opportunity to work as part of the production team for every NBA Finals since 1997.

Salmi currently resides in Bryn Mawr, Pa., with his wife Erin and two children: Bradley and Alexandra.

### TOM MCGINNIS Radio Play-by-Play Announcer

Tom McGinnis enters his 13th season as the voice of the Sixers Radio Network. McGinnis has become one of the most recognizable radio personalities in sports today. While handling all the play-by-play on-air, he also serves as the 76ers Director of Radio Broadcasting. McGinnis co-hosts numerous stops on the Sixers Summer Hoops Tour in the off-season, as well as serving as a team spokesman at various events and other community relations efforts.

McGinnis, who grew up in Spring Valley, Ill., received a degree in Broadcast Journalism from Northern Illinois University in 1984. He played point guard his first two years in college at Benedictine University in Lisle, Ill. Before joining the Sixers prior to the 1995-96 season, McGinnis recorded 13 years of broadcasting experience, including seven years at local television stations, four years of play-by-play in the CBA with the Cedar Rapids Silver Bullets (1989-90) and LaCrosse Catbirds (1990-93) and two years calling minor league hockey games with the Cleveland Lumberjacks and the South Carolina Stingrays.

McGinnis lives in New Jersey with his wife, KYW-TV's Robin Rieger, and their two children, Kenna and Luke.



### TODD MacCULLOCH Radio Analyst

Todd MacCulloch enters his fourth complete season as the Sixers radio color commentator. MacCulloch joined the Sixers broadcast team following his retirement from the NBA as a player in September of 2004. During the 2003-04 seasons, he handled the broadcasting position part time, while being sidelined by an eventually career ending ailment.

MacCulloch played for five seasons in the NBA as a member of both the 76ers and the New Jersey Nets. He played in the NBA Finals in both 2001 (with the 76ers) and in 2002 (with the Nets). MacCulloch also played for the Canadian National Team that competed in Sydney for the 2000 Olympic Games. He had been sidelined since February 2002 with foot neuropathy.

A native of Winnipeg, Manitoba, MacCulloch attended the University of Washington before being selected by the 76ers in the second round (47th overall) in the 1999 NBA draft. While in college MacCulloch majored in speech and hearing sciences. The avid movie buff's previous broadcast experience was doing movie reviews for a local radio station in Philadelphia.

MacCulloch currently resides in suburban Philadelphia with his wife Jana and their two dogs, Makena and Piper.
