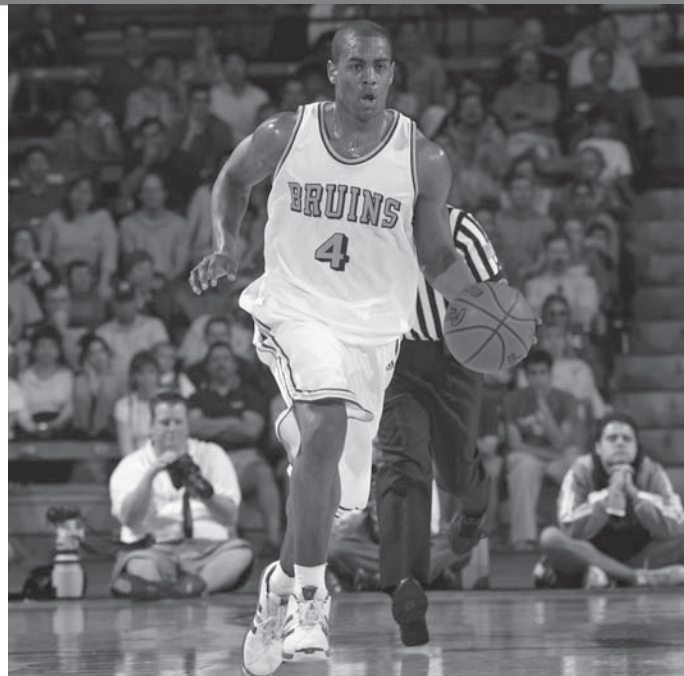

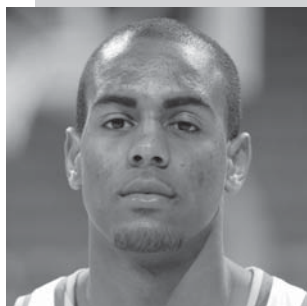
## 2005-06

Played in all 39 games, starting 38 ... averaged 15.8 ppg and 4.2 rpg ... registered double-digit points in 34 of 39 contests, including 10 games with 20 or more points ... scored a 23 points in UCLA's season-opener against New Mexico State ... led the Bruins with 18 points against Temple and added five rebounds and two steals ... against Drexel, he made two of three free throws to tie the game at 56 and led the team with 18 points, in 37 minutes ... was named to the NIT Season Tip-Off All-Tournament team ... versus Albany in 35 minutes, led the Bruins with 22 points, seven rebounds, one assist and two steals ... in 32 minutes versus Coppin State, led UCLA with 20 points, one rebound and one assist ... against Nevada, he played 37 minutes and had 18 points, eight rebounds, three assists, two blocks and one steal ... in 37 minutes at Michigan, he contributed 20 points, two assists and one steal ... he made a career-best six three-point field goals and kept UCLA in the game in the first half, scoring 17 of the team's 32 points ... in 36 minutes against Wagner, he had a team-high 13 points and four rebounds ... in 31 minutes vs. Sacramento State, Afflalo had a game-high 22 points, seven rebounds and a season-high four assists ... in 28 minutes against Stanford, he had a game-high 23 points, four rebounds, two assists and one steal ... in a career-high tying 39 minutes vs. California, he led the Bruins with 19 points and added a team high-tying five rebounds and one assist ... in 32 minutes at Arizona, he led the Bruins with 22 points, making nine of 12 shots from the field and one of two free throws ...



he added three rebounds and two assists ... at Arizona State, he finished with 21 points, including a career-best 12 of 12 from the free throw line; he also grabbed seven rebounds ... he scored 15 points in the second half, including seven straight points (and nine of 11) during a Bruin run; missed the final 1:58 with a bruised left hip after being fouled hard on a basket ... in 38 minutes against Washington State, he had a team-high 18 points (seventh consecutive game leading the Bruins in scoring) and added seven rebounds, a season-high tying four assists and one block ... in 32 minutes at Oregon State, he had his first career double-double with 11 points and a career-high and game-high 10 rebounds ... he also had one assist and one steal ... against Arizona State, he had 17 points (15 in the second half), six rebounds, two assists and a season-high tying two steals in 33 minutes ... seven of the points

came in a two-minute stretch to give the Bruins a 10-point lead with 2:40 remaining ... against Arizona, he scored a career-high 27 points and added a season-high tying four assists, two rebounds and one steal in 35 minutes ... at Washington State, he had 12 points, four rebounds, three assists and one steal in 32 minutes while holding Josh Akogon to four points ... in 35 minutes at USC, he had 19 points, four rebounds and one assist ... against Oregon State, he had 20 points, two rebounds, two assists, one steal and one block in 32 minutes ... it was the 10th time this year he scored at least 20 points ... in 30 minutes off the bench (Senior Day) against Oregon, he had 14 points to tie for the team lead and added three rebounds and two assists ... twelve of his points came in the final 11:14 of the game, including all seven Bruin points in a 2:27 stretch late in

the game ... in the overtime win at California, he played a career-high 43 minutes and finished with a game-high 25 points, a team-high seven rebounds and one steal ... he scored 21 of his points after halftime, including a three-pointer with 2:26 left in overtime to give UCLA the lead for good ... in the win at Stanford, he led the Bruins with 16 points and added three assists, one rebound and one steal in 35 minutes ... he was named the Pac-10 Player of the Week for his efforts in the Bay Area ... in the Pac-10 Tourney win over Oregon State, he had 16 points, two rebounds, two assists and one steal in 23 minutes ... in the win over Arizona, he had 12 points, three rebounds, one assist and one steal in 32 minutes ... in the Pac-10 Tourney title win over California, he had nine points, three rebounds, a career-high seven assists, one steal and one block in 35 minutes ... he was named to the All-Tournament team ... in 27 minutes vs. Belmont in the NCAA first round, he had seven points, seven rebounds and three steals ... in the win over Alabama, he had 13 points – all in the second half – two rebounds and one assist in 36 minutes ... his three-point field goal with 35 seconds remaining gave UCLA a four-point lead (60-56) ... in 28 minutes against Gonzaga, he tied for the team lead with 15 points and added two rebounds and one assist while helping to defend Adam Morrison ... in the win over Memphis, he led the team with 15 points and added three rebounds in 35 minutes while holding Rodney Carney to five points ... he earned All-Tournament honors in the Oakland Region ... in the Final Four win over LSU, he had nine points, six rebounds and one assist in 25 minutes ... in 32 minutes against Florida, he had 10 points, two rebounds, one assist and one steal.

### 2004-05

As a true freshman, Afflalo was one of two players, joining Jordan Farmar, to start every game (29). Named UCLA's Outstanding Defensive Player, Afflalo averaged 10.8 points (third on the team and ninth on the all-time Bruin

freshman list) and led UCLA in three-point shooting (.386, 39-for-101) ... scored a season-high 22 points, with a season-high tying nine rebounds, versus USC in Pauley Pavilion ... Pac-10 All-Freshman Team selection, Afflalo shared the Seymour Armond Memorial Award as the team's Most Valuable Freshman with Farmar and Josh Shipp ... in 29 starts, Afflalo averaged 31.3 minutes (third on the team), 10.8 points (third on the team, ninth on the all-time Bruin freshman chart), 3.3 rebounds and 2.17 assists (third on the team) and shot .442 (106-for-240) from the field, .386 (tops on the team, 39-for-101) from three-point range and .708 (63-for-89) from the foul line ... scored in double figures in five of the last six games and 18 overall and led the Bruins in scoring four times, including two of the final six contests ... in the last five games before the NCAA Tournament, he scored 72 points (14.4 ppg) and added 34 rebounds (6.8 rpg) and 11 assists (2.2 apg) while making 23 of 41 (.561) shots from the floor, 10 of 19 (.526) from three-point range and 16 of 21 (.762) from the free throw line ... led the Bruins in scoring against both USC and Notre Dame

and was named the Rivals.com Freshman of the Week for his efforts ... in his first collegiate start (against Chicago State), Afflalo played 34 minutes and had five points, three rebounds and assists and one steal while limiting opposing guard Terren Wilson to just two points ... versus UC Irvine, Afflalo played 31 minutes, with a team-high tying 14 points, four rebounds, two assists and one steal (with freshman backcourt teammate Jordan Farmar, for the week of Nov. 29, named a Dick Vitale Co-Diaper Dandy of the Week) ... in 36 minutes vs. Long Beach State, Afflalo missed only one shot and scored 21 points, with five rebounds, a season-high six assists and one steal ... against Boston College, Afflalo played 30 minutes, with 11 points, three rebounds, three assists and two steals ... versus Michigan State, in 38 minutes, he scored 16 points, with five rebounds, two assists and one steal ... At Oregon State, Afflalo tallied season-highs in assists (six) and blocked shots (one) ... in 30 minutes at Oregon, Afflalo scored 12 points, with four rebounds, three assists and one steal ... in 30 minutes vs. Washington, he contributed 10 points, two

assists and one rebound ... at Arizona State, he had 17 points and four assists in 30 minutes ... at Arizona, he contributed 13 points, two rebounds and two assists in 31 minutes; his three-pointer with 18 seconds remaining tied the game at 73-73 ... against California, he had 10 points (he hit three straight three-pointers to end the game), one rebound and one steal in 29 minutes ... he hit three three-pointers in a 1:34-span to give UCLA a 62-57 lead with 7:18 remaining ... in 30 minutes against Arizona State, he had eight points, three assists and one rebound ... in 26 minutes vs. Arizona, he had 13 points, one rebound, one assist and one steal ... at California, he had 14 points, five rebounds, one assist and one steal in 33 minutes ... in the win over USC, he had career highs of 22 points and nine rebounds and added two assists and one steal in 23 minutes ... in the win at Notre Dame, he led the Bruins with 17 points and added four rebounds, three assists, three steals and one block, while hounding Chris Thomas into a 4-17 shooting day ... versus Oregon State in the

Pac-10 Tournament, he had 10 points, eight rebounds, two assists and one block in 33 minutes ... Against Texas Tech in the NCAA Tournament, he had seven points and one assist in 31 minutes.

In 2004 under coach Rod Palmer, a UCLA letterman from 1986-87 who ended his college career at UC Irvine, Afflalo led the Apaches to the school's first-ever Div. III CA State title, scoring 24 points, with five rebounds, in a 60-36 win over Oakland Bishop

O'Dowd ... averaged 23.0 points, 5.4 rebounds and 5.4 assists as a senior, leading Compton Centennial to a 32-3 record ... a starter in the 2004 McDonald's All-American game (as a starter, he played 17 minutes, with three points, four rebounds and one assist and steal), selected to the EA Sports Roundball Classic ... third-team Parade Magazine All-American and USA Today Super 25 selection ... named CalHi Sports All-State, CIF SS Div. III-A co-Player of the Year ... Los Angeles Times All-Star Boys Basketball Team ... entering his senior season, summer honors included PrepWestHoops No. 1 shooting guard in the West and No. 7 Player in the nation, Basketball News No. 4 shooting guard in the U. S. and No. 23 Player in the U. S. and HoopScoop No. 5 second guard in the country.

2003 — During the summer, competed at the 6<sup>th</sup> annual USA Basketball Youth Development Festival at the U. S. Olympic Training Center in Colorado Springs, CO (Afflalo started two of five games and helped lead

the West to a bronze medal, he averaged 15.4 points, 3.8 rebounds and 3.6 assists) ... as a junior, Afflalo averaged 26.2 points (he scored 30 or more points on seven occasions, including 42 points vs. Carson at the one-day Pangos Dream Tournament in Pauley Pavilion in January), 5.4 rebounds and 5.0 assists ... led Centennial to a 19-11 overall record, to the CIF SS Div. III-A title game, the Div. III regional semifinals and a share of the Bay League title ... Wooden Award Div. III Player of the Year, All-State Cal-Hi Sports, the CIF-SS Div. III-A co-Player of the Year and the Long Beach Press-Telegram Dream Team Player of the Year.
