- Completed his career with 2,071 career points; he ranks fifth on BC's career scoring list.
- Also finished among BC's career leaders in field goals made (seventh with 689), free throws made (fourth with 573), free throws attempted (fourth with 784), rebounding (seventh with 936) and steals (eighth with 176).
- Played in and started 130 games; ranks second on BC's list for career games started and tied for third for career games played.
- Played 4727 career minutes; logged more than 1,000 minutes in each of his four seasons.
- Sank a school-record 18 free throws (on 21 attempts) in the Eagles' NCAA Tournament contest against Wisconsin-Milwaukee on March 19, 2005.
- Scored 25 first-half points in a career-high 36-point effort against Villanova on Jan. 19, 2005.
- Participated in the USA Basketball Men's Under-21 National Team Trials in Dallas, Texas, in July 2005.

- Played in and started 30 games.
- Averaged 19.0 points, 8.3 rebounds, 3.0 assists and 1.4 steals per game.
- Averaged 19.5 points and 8.4 rebounds per game in ACC action; played a league-high 622 minutes (38.88 per game).
- Played 1152 minutes, an average of 38.40 minutes per game.
- Earned All-America second-team honors from Associated Press, Sporting News, NABC and USBWA.
- Earned Atlantic Coast Conference Player of the Year honors; earned 45 votes to outdistance Al Thornton (30), Tyler Hansbrough (19) and Sean Singletary (12).
- Was a unanimous selection to the All-Atlantic Coast Conference first team.
- Captured USBWA Division I District 1 Player of the Year honors.
- Gained Division I All-District 1 honors from the National Association of Basketball Coaches.
- Earned ACC Co-Player of the Week honors three times – on Dec 11, Feb. 5 and Feb. 12; gained ESPN.com National Player of the Week accolades on Feb. 12.
- Ranked among ACC leaders (conference games only) in six categories: rebounding (third, 8.4), scoring (fifth, 19.5), field-goal percentage (second, .566), defensive rebounding (second, 5.75), offensive rebounding (sixth, 2.69) and minutes played (first, 38.88).
- Scored in double figures in all 30 games, including 14 games with 20 or more points and two games with 30 points.
- Recorded 10 point-rebound double-doubles.
- Led or tied for the team lead in scoring 14 times, in rebounding 21 times, in steals 14 times and in assists eight times.
- Scored 30 points on 10-for-13 shooting from the field in the Eagles' ACC-Big Ten Challenge victory over Michigan State (11/29); grabbed 10 rebounds in the game.
- Totaled 30 points and 13 rebounds in 33 minutes of action against Virginia Tech (2/3); made a season-best 11 field goals, including a career-high four three-point field goals.
- Registered 26 points and nine rebounds in a win at Miami (2/7); shot 10-for-13 from the field.
- Recorded 23 points and 10 rebounds in a one-point win at Florida State (2/11); converted a game-tying four-point play with 2:48 to play in the game.
- Scored 22 points in 33 minutes against North Carolina (2/17).
- Notched 22 points and 11 rebounds in his final game in Conte Forum, a home win over Clemson (2/24).
- Equaled his career high with seven assists at Massachusetts (12/2).
- Averaged 19.0 points and 7.5 rebounds per game in the team's two NCAA Tournament contests; netted 19 points in each of the games – against Texas Tech (3/15) and Georgetown (3/17).

AS A JUNIOR

- Played in and started all 36 games.

- Averaged 16.5 points and 6.6 rebounds per game in ACC action; played a league-high 610 minutes (38.12 per game).
- Played 1340 minutes, an average of 37.22 minutes per game.
- Earned All-Atlantic Coast Conference second team honors.
- Gained Division I All-District 1 honors from the National Association of Basketball Coaches.
- Earned All-Tournament honors at the Atlantic Coast Conference Tournament; averaged 17.7 points and 6.0 rebounds per game in the team's three contests; shot 8-for-11 from the floor (3-for-5 treys) in a 21-point outing against North Carolina (3/11) in the semifinal round.
- Earned ACC Co-Player of the Week honors on Feb. 6.
- Ranked among ACC leaders (conference games only) in six categories: rebounding (tied-11th, 6.6), scoring (12th, 16.5), field-goal percentage (10th, .475), assist-turnover ratio (fourth, 1.82), offensive rebounding (fourth, 3.13) and minutes played (first, 38.12).
- Scored in double figures in 33 games, including 12 games with 20 or more points.
- Grabbed double-digit rebounds in four games.
- Recorded four point-rebound double-doubles.
- Led or tied for the team lead in scoring 14 times, in rebounding 11 times, in steals 12 times and in assists four times.
- Shot 71.0 percent from the foul line; made a team-high 171 free throws on a team-high 241 attempts.
- Captured MVP honors at the Las Vegas Invitational; averaged 21.3 points per game in the team's four victories; capped the tournament with a 24-point, eight-rebound effort against Oklahoma State (11/26).
- Tallied 23 points and six rebounds against Michigan State in the Jimmy V Classic in Madison Square Garden (12/6).
- Recorded 25 points and 10 rebounds in a home win over Texas Southern (12/18); shot 10-for-17 from the field.
- Totaled 25 points in the Eagles' first-ever ACC victory, a 90-87 home win over Florida State (1/14).
- Registered 17 points and eight rebounds – both team highs – in a win at North Carolina (1/25).
- Shot 10-for-14 from the floor in a season-high 28-point effort against Duke (2/1).
- Scored a game-high 26 points, including two decisive free throws with 5.2 seconds remaining, in a 74-73 win at Virginia Tech (2/4); scored 20 points in the first half.
- Notched 12 points and 11 rebounds in a career-high 49 minutes of action in a double-overtime win at NC State (2/25).
- Totaled 22 points in the Eagles' win at Wake Forest (2/28); shot 2-for-2 from three-point range and 10-for-10 from the foul line.

- Played a team-high 1079 minutes, an average of 36.0 minutes per game.
- Earned Big East All-Conference first team honors; shared the league's Most Improved Player award with Connecticut's Marcus Williams.
- Gained Division I All-District 1 honors from both the National Association of Basketball Coaches and the United States Basketball Writers Association; also captured All-Northeast Region honors from Basketball Times.
- Captured "All-East" second-team honors from Eastern Basketball; the two teams consisted of seven ACC players and three Big East players; Dudley and Wake Forest's Chris Paul were the only sophomore honorees.

AS A SOPHOMORE (continued)

- Earned National Player of the Week honors from The Sporting News (Jan. 23; was named Big East Player of the Week on Jan. 17; shared the same honor – with Syracuse’s Hakim Warrick – the following week.
- Ranked among Big East leaders (conference games only) in nine categories: rebounding (third, 8.0), scoring (fourth, 17.9), steals (fifth, 1.88), field-goal percentage (eighth, .475), assist-turnover ratio (eighth, 1.81), free-throw percentage (10th, .760), assists (tied-14th, 3.06), offensive rebounding (second, 3.25) and defensive rebounding (fifth, 4.75).
- Scored in double figures in 26 games, including nine games with 20 or more points and one game with more than 30 points.
- Grabbed double-digit rebounds in eight games.
- Recorded seven point-rebound double-doubles; registered three consecutive double-doubles in February (at Seton Hall, at Notre Dame and against Rutgers).
- Led or tied for the team lead in scoring 14 times, in rebounding 14 times, in steals 11 times and in assists five times.
- Shot 75.4 percent from the foul line; made a team-high 135 free throws on 179 attempts.
- Scored a career-high 36 points in a 67-66 home win over Villanova (1/19); shot 12-for-18 from the field (1-for-2 on three-pointers) and 11-for-13 from the foul line; sank four free throws in the game’s final 30 seconds to lift BC to the victory.
- Posted 21 points and 12 rebounds in a 78-75 win at Providence (1/26); hit a three-point field goal with 1:20 remaining that erased a two-point deficit.
- Registered 20 points and a career-high 14 rebounds at Seton Hall (2/5).
- Netted a game-high 21 points in a home win over ninth-ranked Syracuse (2/19); the game marked the first-ever meeting of Top 10 teams in Conte Forum history.
- Concluded the regular season with a 21-point, 11-rebound effort at Rutgers (3/5).
- Averaged 20.0 points and 6.0 rebounds in two NCAA Tournament contests; scored 18 points in a first-round win over Pennsylvania (3/17) in Cleveland, Ohio; totaled 22 points – including a school-record 18 free throws (on 21 attempts) – in 40 minutes of work against Wisconsin-Milwaukee (3/19).

AS A FRESHMAN

- Played in and started all 34 games.
- Averaged 11.9 points, 6.6 rebounds, 2.8 assists and 1.3 steals per game; ranked second on the team in each of these categories.
- Averaged 12.6 points and 6.4 rebounds per game in Big East action.
- Played a team-high 1156 minutes, the highest minute total by a BC freshman since minutes were recorded in 1980-81.
- Earned Big East All-Rookie Team honors; was one of only two unanimous selections to the team.
- Captured Freshman All-America third team honors from College Basketball News.
- Was honored as the New England Division I Rookie of the Year (as selected by the New England Basketball Coaches Association).
- Twice earned Big East Rookie of the Week honors – for the weeks ending Dec. 1 and Feb. 15.
- Ranked among Big East leaders (conference games only) in six categories: rebounding (17th, 6.4), assists (tied-10th, 3.56), free-throw percentage (11th, .768), steals (tied-ninth, 1.62), assist-turnover ratio (10th, 1.73) and offensive rebounds (tied-11th, 2.56).
- Led or tied for the team lead in scoring eight times, in rebounding 12 times, in assists six times and in steals seven times.
- Grabbed 101 offensive rebounds, the highest single-season total by a BC player since Bill Curley registered 110 offensive rebounds in his senior season (1993-94).
- Scored in double figures in 22 games, including two games with 20 or more points.
- Grabbed double-digit rebounds in five games.
- Recorded three point-rebound double-doubles.
- Shot 72.3 percent from the foul line; made a team-high 125 free throws on 173 attempts.
- Scored a season-high 24 points and grabbed a team-high eight rebounds in an overtime win at Miami (2/11); scored nine of the Eagles’ 10 points in the extra session.
- Tallied 20 points, eight rebounds, five assists and a career-high five steals against Rutgers (2/22).
- Recorded 12 rebounds in an overtime victory over Massachusetts (12/6).
- Registered nine points and 11 rebounds in his Big East debut – at Georgetown (1/6).
- Tallied 13 points and nine rebounds – both team highs – against Georgia Tech in the second round of the NCAA Tournament in Milwaukee, Wis.
