## 2006-07 (Senior)

Consensus first-team All-America selection, the first in A&M history...won Bob Cousy Award as the nation's top point guard...also won the Chip Hilton National Player of the Year Award and received the NABC's Career Achievement Award...finalist for the Naismith Trophy and Wooden Award...named Big 12 Player of the Year by The Dallas Morning News...tabbed as Big 12 MVP by the Fort Worth Star-Telegram...consensus first-team All-Big 12 pick...first-team all-district pick by the NABC and the USBWA...second-team academic All-Big 12 selection...team co-captain...led A&M to a school-record 27-7 season...team advanced to the NCAA Sweet Sixteen for the first time since 1980...averaged 18.1 points and 5.1 assists per game while making 50.0 percent from the field, 45.8 percent from three-point range and 77.8 percent from the free throw line...became known as "Mr. Clutch" for his late-game heroics...made game-winning three-pointer with 20 seconds left against Kansas for A&M's first victory against the Jayhawks...made long three over Texas' Kevin Durant with two seconds left to send game into overtime in Austin, then made another three to send game into second overtime period and finished with 33 points...averaged 6.1 points in the final four minutes in conference play.

## 2005-06 (Junior)

Earned first-team All-Big 12 honors by several major newspapers...first-team all-district pick by the USBWA...one of only four players in A&M history to reach 1,000 career points with 300 assists and 100 steals...led team in scoring with a 16.1 average overall and a 17.3 mark in Big 12 play...added 3.4 rebounds and 4.0 assists...scored a career-high 35 points (with a career-best seven steals) at Oklahoma State, an A&M record for Big 12 play...scored 23 points in first-round NCAA Tournament win against Syracuse...team was 10-2 when he had at least five assists...named Big 12 Player of the Week after leading team to 46-43 win against Texas...made game-winning three-pointer at the buzzer to beat Longhorns...led team in scoring in 15 games...scored 28 points at Kansas State, including 22 in the second half...ranked among top 10 players in Big 12 in scoring, assists, steals and field goal percentage...scored 30 points against Mississippi Valley State.

## 2004-05 (Sophomore)

Earned honorable mention All-Big 12 honors after starting in 30 games...made 49.3 percent from field, 38.4 percent of threes (28-73) and 71.6 percent from free throw line...led team and ranked third in Big 12 in assists with 153...had 33 steals...also named to the Big 12 All-Improved Team...scored in double figures in 20 games...had four 20-point games...scored a career-high 25 points with nine assists against Houston...added 24 points with six assists in win against No. 9-ranked Texas...tallied 22 points against Baylor and at Oklahoma State...made 12-of-12 free throws against Houston, one of the best performances from the line in school history...had seven games with at least two three-pointers...posted two double-doubles...scored 11 points with a career-high 14 assists against Missouri, one shy of the school record...made winning free throws with 11 seconds left in 62-60 win at Penn State.

## 2003-04 (Freshman)

Played in all 27 games, starting in 12...started in 10 of the last 11 games...averaged 7.5 points and 2.1 rebounds...added 3.9 assists and 1.3 steals per game...led all Big 12 freshmen in assist-to-turnover ratio at 2.00, ranking fourth overall...ranked eighth in league in assists...made 75.9 percent (41-54) from free throw line...scored a career-high 19 points at Tennessee...added 18 points against Grambling...scored in double figures in 10 games, including five in Big 12 play...scored 15 against Nebraska...handed out 10 assists against Baylor.

## High School

Earned first-team Class 5A all-state honors as a senior, despite missing the first part of the season with a broken wrist...came back to play in 16 games, averaging 16.6 points and 6.5 assists per game...averaged 19.5 points in district play...scored a game-high 35 points in Texas state high school all-star game, leading team to victory...honorable mention prep All-American...averaged 17.8 points and 6.0 assists as a junior, leading Kimball to 29-7 record and state Class 5A championship game...team lost game on half-court shot at buzzer...earned all-state honors...named district's most valuable player and was only junior named to The Dallas Morning News All-Area Team...also named to all-state tournament team...scored a career-high 42 points in one game...played in prestigious ABCD Camp in Las Vegas in 2002, where he was rated among the top 10 guards...also recruited by Oklahoma, Oklahoma State, Connecticut, Texas and Georgia Tech.
