

3 • Marcus Williams F, 6-7, 205, So., Seattle, Wash. (Roosevelt)

General: Enjoyed a stellar two seasons in Tucson, amassing nearly 1,000 points and earning all-Pac-10 and numerous all-region accolades Displayed an impressive mid-range game ... Finished in double figures in 49 of 63 career games played ... A tireless worker and the best-conditioned Wildcat ... One of the best wing players to come out of the west in 2005 ... A strong outside shooter with the ability to beat defenders off the dribble ... Joins Michael Dickerson (1994-98) and Jason Terry (1995-99) as Seattle natives to play for Lute Olson.

2006-07 (Sophomore): Named Arizona's co-Most Valuable Player by vote of his teammates ... A first team all-Pac-10 pick ... A USBWA all-District 9 selection ... A first team NABC all-District 15 selection ... Finished the season ranked among the Pac-10 leaders in scoring (4th/16.6 ppg), rebounding (8th/6.7 rpg) and defensive rebounds (8th/4.57 drpg) ... Averaging 30.8 minutes played per game, a figure that ranks eighth in school history during his 63-game career ... Named to the John R. Wooden Award Midseason All-America team on Jan. 30 ... Tallied 11 points and two assists vs. Purdue on 3/16 ... Scored 13 points to go with three boards and a steal on 3/8 vs. Oregon ... Tallied 15 points three assists and equaled a career high with three blocks on 3/3 at Stanford ... Led all scorers with 21 points at California on 3/1 to go with nine rebounds and four assists ... Scored 12 of his 19 points in the first half at Arizona State on 2/25 to go with two assists, two blocks and two steals ... Posted 17 points, nine rebounds and three assists in 39 minutes vs. UCLA on 2/17 ... Collected 10 points, a game-high eight boards and five assists on 2/15 vs. USC ... Tallied 16 points (13 in second half), nine boards and five assists on 2/10 at Oregon ... Hit 8-of-12 FGs and 3-of-3 treys and finished with 23 points on 2/8 at Oregon State, his first 20-point game since Jan. 14 ... Collected 11 points, three rebounds and a career-high six assists against no turnovers in 30 minutes vs. Washington on 2/3 ... Tallied 12 points, seven boards and equaled a season high with four assists on 2/1 vs. Washington State ... Scored four points and grabbed three rebounds on 1/27 vs. North Carolina after suffering a sprained ankle in the first half (he did return) ... Sat out the Arizona State game on 1/24 for unspecified violations of team policy ... Shooting 55.7 percent (68-of-122) from the floor in Pac-10 play ... Averaging 8.3 rebounds per game over his last 12 ... Ranks among the Pac-10 leaders in scoring (2nd/17.3 ppg), rebounding (9th/7.4 rpg), blocked shots (10th/0.79 bpg) and defensive rebounds (5th/5.21 drpg) ... Had a team-leading 11 20-point games this season ... A preseason John R. Wooden Award Preseason All-America team member ... Included on the Naismith Trophy preseason watch list ... Named the national Player of the Week by ESPN.com Jan. 2 after averaging 22.0 points and 5.5 rebounds, while shooting 81.8 percent from the field in wins over California and Stanford ... Collected his fourth double-double (11 pts./11 reb.) on 1/20 at UCLA, playing a season-best 40 minutes ... Posted 19 points, eight rebounds and three steals on 1/18 at USC ... Set a new career high for the second straight game with 34 points and 12 rebounds (third double-double this year) in 39 minutes vs. Oregon on 1/14 ... Poured in a career-high 27 points (10-of-18 FGs) to go with eight boards, four assists, three steals a block and zero turnovers in 38 minutes on 1/11 vs. Oregon State ... Took a career-high 19 shots to net 18 points, nine rebounds and two blocks on 1/6 at Washington State ... Scored 22 points and set a season high with four assists on 1/4 at Washington ... Tallied a game-high 23 points (10-of-14 FG), but the key rebound with 1:39 to go may have been his best play of the day on 12/30 vs. Stanford ... Connected on all eight FG attempts en route to 21 points on 12/28 vs. California ... Passed out a season-high three assists to go with six rebounds and a block on 12/20 vs. Memphis ... Collected his second straight double-double with 15 points and 12 rebounds to go with a season-high three assists on 12/17 vs. Houston ... Posted his first career double-double with 21 points and a career-high 16 rebounds on 12/9 at San Diego State to go with two blocks and two steals to earn San Diego Slam Player-of-the-Game honors ... Collected five points, three rebounds and one block on 12/5 vs. Louisville ... Notched his second straight 20-point game with 20 points and three boards to go with career-best number of three blocks and four steals on 12/2 vs. Illinois ... Set new season highs with 24 points and nine rebounds on 11/28 vs. UNLV, while his 10 field goal (in 15 atts.) and 4-of-4 three-point shooting were career highs ... Collected 14 points, eight boards and a steal on 11/22 vs. Samford ... Equaled career highs of nine FGs and two blocked shots as he tallied 20 points and seven rebounds in 39 minutes vs. New Mexico State on 11/19 ... Tallied six points, three boards and an assist in limited action vs. Northern Arizona on 11/15 ... Registered 18 points and eight rebounds on 11/12 at Virginia.

2005-06 (Freshman): His 430 points scored are the seventh-most by a freshman in Arizona history ... A collegeinsider.com freshman All-American selection Second team all-Rookie selection by collegehoops.net ... Named to the Pac-10 all-Freshman team ... His mid-range game continues to improve as he becomes more assertive ... Led all Pac-10 freshmen with a 13.0 ppg average (15th in the league), has five or more rebounds in 14 of his last 18 games, and averaged 13.7 points and 5.6 rebounds in Pac-10 play ... Closed the season with six consecutive games with double-figure points, which equaled a season-best ... Olson compared Williams to Sean Elliott (1985-89), UA's career scoring leader, at similar points of their freshman seasons ... Averaged a team-leading 16.4 points, 5.2 rebounds and 1.8 assists per game, while shooting 40.6 percent (54-of-133) from the field, over his last 10 games ... Named national Freshman of the Week by rivals.com on Jan. 2 after his performance on the Washington road trip, where he averaged 15.5 points, 7.0 rebounds and shot 56.5 percent (13-of-23) from the floor in the two wins ... Named Dick Vitale's "Diaper Dandy of the Week" on Dec. 24 for his Fiesta Bowl Classic performance where he averaged 16.0 points, 2.5 rebounds and shot 82.4 percent (14-of-17) from the field in wins over Sam Houston State and Western Kentucky ... Averaged 17.0 points, 7.5 rebounds and 3.0 assists in two NCAA Tournament games ... Hit a UA season-high 12-of-15 free throws en route to 24 points, eight rebounds and four assists vs. Villanova on 3/19 in NCAA Minneapolis Region second round game ... Made his NCAA Tournament debut with 10 points, a game-high seven boards, two blocks and three steals vs. Wisconsin on 3/17 ... Averaged 18.0 points and 5.0 rebounds in two Pac-10 Tournament games ... Scored a career-high 25 points (fourth 20-point game) on 3-of-3 3-point shooting to go with seven boards and a

Registered his third 20-point game of the season with 20 points vs. Washington on 3/4, but missed a pair of free throws with 20 seconds left that could have given Arizona the lead ... Posted game-high totals of 17 points and six rebounds on 3/2 vs. Washington State on 3/2, including a key bucket and three FTs down the stretch ... Finished with nine points, four rebounds and three assists on 2/25 vs. Arizona State ... Scored nine of his 11 points in the second half at Stanford on 2/19 to go with five boards and two assists ... Topped 20 points for the second time in his career with 21 points and five rebounds at California on 2/16 ... Posted 16 points, five rebounds and a season-best four steals on 2/11 vs. Oregon State ... Tallied nine points, six rebounds and two steals vs. Oregon on 2/9 ... Hit just 4-of-12 FG, but finished with 11 points, five rebounds and equaled a season best with five assists on 2/4 at UCLA ... High School: Ranked as the No. 6 small forward prospect in the country by rivals.com ... Signed with Arizona during the November Early Signing Period ... Averaged better than 27.0 points per game in each of his last two prep seasons ... A four-year letterman at Roosevelt High School ... Led Rough Riders to a 21-6 record and first state tournament appearance in 17 seasons under head coach Bart Brandenburg ... Averaged 28.6 points, 13.0 rebounds, 4.0 assists and 3.0 steals as a senior ... Earned first-team all-state kudos as a junior and senior ... A three-time all-league selection and the 2005 King County 4A Conference Most Valuable Player ... An adidas All-American ... Played in the 2005 Global Games on the same team with current Wildcats Fendi Onobun and J.P. Prince, July 23-30, in Dallas, Texas, where he averaged 18.8 points and 7.3 rebounds and 2.2 steals per game, while shooting 48.3 percent (43-of-89) from the floor in six games ... Averaged a state-leading 27.2 points per game and added 8.0 rebounds per game as a junior.
