**ON THORNTON:** One of the greatest players in school history...will earn his degree in sociology before the NBA Draft on June 28...earned All-America Third-Team honors by the Associated Press, was an All-ACC First-Team selection and voted as the ACC Player of the Year runner-up as he enjoyed one of the top senior years in school and ACC history during the 2006-07 season...the first player in school history to earn mention on the first, second or third team All-America teams by the Associated Press and the first Seminole since the 1989 season to earn All-America honors of third-team or better...a unanimous selection to the All-ACC First-Team to become only the third Seminole (also Bob Sura in 1993-94 and Tim Pickett in 2003-04) in history to be named to the All-ACC First-Team...named to the All-ACC Tournament Second-Team and to the 2006 Colonial Classic All-Tournament team...the Most Valuable Player of the 2006 Colonial Classic...a finalist for the Wooden, Naismith and Rupp Awards as the nation's best collegiate player...also earned All-America honors from Sports Illustrated (Second-Team), Rivals.com (Second-Team) and CollegeHoops.net (Third-Team)..."Obviously Al Thornton is a great player. He wasn't going to let them lose. People talk about the great players in the country like Kevin Durant, Greg Oden, whoever. I don't know how you cannot talk about Al Thornton. I mean, he is phenomenal. What he did out there today was ridiculous. He just took the game on and he personally willed them to win," said Miami Hurricane Head Coach Frank Haith during Thornton's senior season...finished his career ranked SEVENTH in school history with 1,521 points, THIRD in school history with a .438 career 3-point field goal percentage, SIXTH in school history with 366 career free throws made, 12<sup>th</sup> in school history with 546 career field goals made, 13<sup>th</sup> in school history with 74 blocked shots, 16<sup>th</sup> in school history with 641 rebounds, tied for 16 in school history with 16 double/doubles, 20<sup>th</sup> in school history with a .528 career field goal shooting percentage, 23<sup>rd</sup> in school history with 103 career steals, 25<sup>th</sup> in school history with 63 career 3-point field goals made and second in school history with 124 games played...the only ACC player during the 2006-07 season to rank in the top-10 in scoring (FIRST, 19.7 ppg), field goal percentage (FIFTH, .530), free throw percentage (SEVENTH, .790), rebounding (EIGHTH, 7.2 rpg), blocked shots (EIGHTH, 1.1 bpg) and steals (TENTH, 1.5 spg)... "He's (Al Thornton) probably as good a basketball player as there is in America. Are you going to tell me that there are five or 10 better players? I'd disagree." said Virginia Head Coach Dave Leitner...one of only eight players in school history to surpass the 1,500 points scored plateau (1,521 total points) and one of only 19 players in school history to earn 600 or more career rebounds...one of only two players in school history with at least 1,500 points and at least 600 rebounds...surpassed the 1,000 point plateau as a senior against Coastal Carolina on Dec. 21, 2006 and went over 1,500 points against Michigan on March 15 in the second round of the NIT in Tallahassee...scored 1,174 points during his junior and senior seasons and averaged 18.1 points in his last 65 games (all starting assignments)...one of only 16 players in school history with at least 1,000 points scored and at least 500 rebounds earned...came within one point of tying the all-time single-game scoring record at Florida State with an amazing 45-point performance in the Seminoles' final game of the 2006-07 regular season...helped the Seminoles win at Miami, 98-90 in overtime, and close out the ACC season with a win for the second consecutive season...had the opportunity in the closing seconds of the overtime period to set the new Seminole record but chose not to because the game was already in hand...named the National Player of the Week by nationally known sportscaster Dick Vitale for his performances in victories over Miami (March 3) and Duke (Feb. 4)...the Seminoles' victory over Blue Devils was the first in school history in Cameron Indoor Stadium...set the Donald L. Tucker record for points in a half with 27 in the second half of the Seminoles' victory over Virginia Tech on Jan. 17, 2007...

**AS A SENIOR (2007):** Earned All-America Third-Team honors, All-ACC First-Team honors and was named the ACC Player of the Year runner-up following one of the top seasons in school history as a senior in 2007...earned All-District Six First-Team honors from the National Association of Basketball Coaches...averaged a career-high 19.7 points (first on the team), 5.2 rebounds (first), shot .530 from the field (first), shot a career-high .444 from the 3-point line (first), shot a career-high .790 from the free throw line (third), earned a career-high 40 steals (first, 1.1 spg) and blocked a career-high 53 shots (first / 1.5 bpg)...averaged a career-high 19.7 points, a career-high 7.2 rebounds, played in a career-high 35 games (all starting assignments), made a career-high 244 field goals, a career-high 36 3-point field goals, a career-high 166 free throws, shot a career-high .790 from the free throw line, blocked a career-high 40 shots, earned a career-high 53 steals and played in a career-high 1,092 minutes (career-high 31.2 minutes played per game)...he averaged or scored at least 20 points against nine of the Seminoles' 11 opponents as a senior...averaged a double-double of 25.0 points and 11.5 rebounds in two games against NCAA Tournament participant Maryland...recorded double-doubles against Virginia (30 points and career-high 16 rebounds), Virginia Tech (27 points and 13 rebounds) and Wake Forest (25 points and 11 rebounds) - conference teams that the Seminoles played only once during his senior season...averaged 18.5 points and 8.5 rebounds in the 2007 ACC Tournament to earn ACC All-Tournament Second-Team honors in a vote by the media in attendance at the event at the St. Pete Times Forum in Tampa...became only the second player in school history to earn All-ACC Tournament team honors - Charlie Ward earned All-ACC Tournament Second-Team honors in 1992 as he led the Seminoles to the tournament semifinals for the first time in school history...scored a double-double of 25 points and 11 rebounds and hit the game winning free throw with 1.5 second remaining in the Seminoles' victory over Clemson in the first round of the tournament on March 8...he scored 18 first half points and seven second half points in the victory over the Tigers...his 25 points against Clemson is the second-highest single-game scoring total in an ACC Tournament game by a Seminole behind Terrell Baker's 28 points against Clemson on March 4, 1999 in Charlotte...his ability to play big in big games was incredible during his senior season...averaged 23.5 points in 16 ACC games as compared to 16.5 points per

game in 19 non-league regular season games...he scored more total points in 16 ACC regular season games (376 / 23.5 ppg) than in 19 non-ACC regular season games (314 / 16.5 ppg)...also played well away from home as he averaged 21.8 points in 13 road and neutral site games as a senior...scored at least 30 points twice during his senior season – his career-high 45 point performance against Miami (March 3) and a 30-point scoring total on the road at Virginia (Feb. 17)...was one of only five ACC players who scored at least 30 points twice during the season and one of only two league players (also Zabian Dowdell of Virginia Tech) who scored at least 30 points in two games against another ACC team...scored 376 of his 690 points on the season and averaged a league-high 23.5 points in the Seminoles' 16 ACC games. He scored nearly 55 percent of his points for the season in 16 ACC games (376 of 690) as compared to just over 45 percent of his point total in 19 non-ACC regular season games (314 of 690)...was the only player in the league who averaged more than 20 points per game in conference play during the 2006-07 season...pulled down a career-high 7.2 rebounds per game to rank eighth among all conference players in rebounding...ranked tied for ninth in the league with six games of 10 rebounds or more and he had six double-doubles to tie for eighth among all league players...led the league in conference games only rebounding with an 8.8 per game average...pulled down a season-high 15 rebounds against Maryland on Feb. 21...named to the All-Tournament and as the Most Valuable Player of the Colonial Classic during which he helped lead the Seminoles to three victories in three games...he averaged a tournament-best 17.3 points and 6.3 rebounds while shooting .548 from the field and .842 from the free throw line...scored at least 15 points in each of the three games and totaled his season-high of 20 points in the Seminoles' victory over Illinois State...led the Seminoles in blocks with a single-season career-high 40 (1.1 bpg) as a senior...had more blocked shots as a senior than he did during the first three years of his career...blocked his career-high of four shots against Miami (March 3) and against High Point (Dec. 18)...blocked at least one shot in 22 of the Seminoles' 35 games during his senior season...led the Seminoles in steals with a career-high 53 steals for a 1.5 steals per game average...earned a single-game career-high four steals in three different games including four against North Carolina in the quarterfinal round of the ACC Tournament (March 9)...shot a career-high .790 from the free throw line as a senior...made 166 free throws as a senior and 288 in his junior and senior seasons combined...he improved on his career percentage entering the 2006-07 season by nearly 15 percentage points (.790 as compared to .641 during the first three seasons of his career)...Thornton made a single-season career-high 174 free throws as a senior – the most free throws made in a single-season by a Seminoles since Gary Schull during the 1965-66 season...first Seminole to have consecutive 400+ points and 200+ rebounds in consecutive seasons since Bob Sura 1992-93 and 1993-94 (Thornton - 484 and 208 in 2005-06, 690 and 251 in 2006-07), (Sura - 573 and 213 in 1992-93, 573 and 213 in 1993-94)...earned ACC Player of the Week honors once as a senior to bring his career total to three...established a Seminole record for points scored in an ACC game (45 at Miami, March 3) and tied Florida State's records in an ACC game for free throw percentage (1.000 vs. Miami, 11-11 and Boston College, nine-of-nine)...the first player in school history to lead the Seminoles in blocked shots and steals in the same season...led the Seminoles in scoring in 24 of the 35 games during the season (.686 percent), in rebounding 23 of 35 games (.657 percent), in steals 12 of 35 games (.343 percent) and in blocked shots 18 of 35 games (.514 percent)...named the ACC Player of the Week for the third time in his career following his 45-point performance in the Seminoles' victory at Miami...**(vs. Boston College):** averaged 20.5 points and 8.5 rebounds in two games against NCAA Tournament participant Boston College...scored 22 points and added eight rebounds as the Seminoles played at Chestnut Hill (Jan. 23)...totaled eight first half points and 14 in the second half as Florida State nearly took the ACC win on the road before falling at the buzzer, 85-82, on a 3-point shot by Sean Marshall...scored eight points in the last five minutes of the game as the Seminoles scratched back from as much as a seven-point deficit in the second half to lead by as many as five with the clock winding down...made two free throws with 59 seconds left in the game to put Florida State up 80-79...Marshall beat the buzzer from the left elbow to snatch the win from the visiting Seminoles..."He's (Al Thornton) probably one of the hardest guys I've had to guard. The guy's basically an animal; a 6-8 freak athlete who can handle the rock and is as fast as a guard. He got me on the drop-step fade away, he jumped over me on another one," said Jared Dudley of Boston College after the game...scored 19 points and pulled down nine rebounds in a near double-double as Florida State played host to Boston College in Tallahassee (Feb. 11)...totaled nine first half points to stake the Seminoles to a 37-33 lead at the intermission...his late game heroics nearly led the Seminoles to the ACC victory at home...two free throws with 5:04 left in the game put Florida State up 60-56 while a second 3-point shot of the game put the Seminoles up 67-64 with 1:50 left on the clock...blocked a shot by Boston College's Shamari Spears with nine seconds left on the clock and the Seminoles up by one at 68-67...the rebound of the blocked shot went to the Eagles as a team rebound and they won the game, 68-67, on a jumper by Tyrelle Blair with five second left to play...**(vs. Clemson):** averaged 21.7 points and 7.3 rebounds in three games against NIT finalist Clemson...scored 19, 21 and 25 points in three games against the Tigers...25 points but none more important than the final free throw of the game in the first round of the ACC Tournament to give Florida State a 67-66 win at the St. Pete Times Forum (March 8)...Thornton was fouled by Clemson's K.C. Rivers with one second remaining in regulation and went to the line for two shots and a chance to win the game...after missing the first shot, he was pure on his second attempt to put the Seminoles ahead 67-66...Clemson was unable to get a shot off and the Seminoles moved onto the second round...he was incredible in the first half as he led all scorers with 18 points on six of eight shooting from the field and four-of-five shooting from the line...scored nine points in the final five minutes of the first half to help Florida State parlay a 30-30 tie with 4:47 left on the clock to a 38-36 halftime lead...Thornton tied the game at 30 with a 3-pointer, and added three free throws and another 3-point shot to give the Seminoles the all-important half-time lead...his second 3-point shot of the span came with five seconds remaining and gave the Seminoles the momentum heading into the second half...scored a game-high 19 points and added two blocked shots and three steals as Florida State played host to Clemson in the conference schedule opener for both teams (Jan. 3)...his 19 points were tied for game-high honors...scored 10 of his 19 points in the second half as the Seminoles nearly recovered from a 41-36 deficit after the first 20 minutes to win the game...his 10 second half points were critical as Florida State played catch-up through the final 20 minutes of the game...a lay-up with 36 seconds remaining brought the Seminoles to within two at 64-66...Clemson won the game on a bang-bang fast break lay-up by Cliff Hammonds, 68-66...was stellar in a 21-point performance at Clemson as he made 12 of 15 attempts from the free throw line (Feb. 7)...was seven of nine from the line in the second half including making his first six attempts of the second half as he worked to put Florida State on his back and get the Seminoles back into the game...**(vs. Duke):** scored 21 points and added eight rebounds as the Seminoles defeated NCAA Tournament participant Duke in the only meeting of the 2006-07 season between Florida State and Duke (Feb. 4)...third consecutive game of 20 points or more against Duke in leading Florida State to the first win in program history at Cameron Indoor Stadium, 68-67...was on in both halves as he scored 11 first half points and totaled 10 second half points as the Seminoles outscored the Blue Devils, 35-31, in the final 20 minutes to gain the monumental victory...in the see-saw game that saw the Blue Devils lead by as many as 17 in the first half, Thornton was calm, cool and collected in leading the Seminoles back from the depths and to the victory...scored five of Florida State's first 10 points – but the Seminoles were down 27-10 with 9:47 left in the first half at that point...scored 16 of the Seminoles next 58 points as the Seminoles outscored the Blue Devils, 58-47, over the final three-quarters of the game to gain the win...he scored five points the rest of the way in the first half as the Seminoles outscored the Blue Devils 23-9 to close the half...the Thornton-led spurt allowed the Seminoles to trail by only three – 36-33 – at the end of the first half...scored four of the Seminoles first seven points of the second half to push Florida State ahead, 40-38, with less than two minutes elapsed in the half...scored six points and was a perfect four-of-four from the free throw line during the final 10 minutes of the second half to led the Seminoles to the victory...totaled eight rebounds in the win with his most important coming at the buzzer after Duke had missed three point blank shots at the basket...**(vs. Georgia Tech):** averaged 18.0 points and 6.0 rebounds in two games against NCAA Tournament participant Georgia Tech...totaled 20 points and pulled down six rebounds in 37 minutes of play as the Seminoles traveled to play at Georgia Tech (Jan. 13)...was a perfect five-of-five from the free throw line and made seven of 13 shots from the field...was especially accurate in the second half with 12 points as the Seminoles mounted a comeback only to fall short on the road...scored 16 points and added six rebounds and two steals as the Seminoles played host to the Yellow Jackets in Tallahassee (Feb. 13)...played only 11 minutes in the second half because of foul trouble...scored all of his 11 second half points in the final 5:22 of the half as the Seminoles worked their way back into the game after being down by as many as eight points after halftime...scored five points in the final 29 seconds of the game...**(vs. Maryland):** averaged a double-double of 25.0 points and 11.5 rebounds in two games against NCAA Tournament participant Maryland...led Florida State to one of the most important ACC victories of the season with 27 points and eight rebounds in the Seminoles' 96-79 victory over Maryland in Tallahassee (Jan. 30)...enjoyed a monster game as he made 12 of 17 shots from the field (he was two-of-two from the 3-point line) and was a perfect two-of-two from the free throw line...totaled 12 first half points including the basket that put the Seminoles up for good in the first half...a Thornton jumper with 10:06 left before intermission put Florida State up 26-25 and was a lead it did not relinquish for the

remainder of the game in improving its ACC record to 4-4 after an 0-3 conference start...began the Seminoles' second half run with four quick points to put the Seminoles up 55-48 with 17:48 left in the game...five straight points put Florida State up with a 16 point bulge (70-54 with 13:59 left) and a lay-up with 2:10 left put Florida State up by 16 at 90-74...said Maryland Head Coach Gary Williams after the game: "There is no question Al Thornton is a special player. When you are that big and you can go on the perimeter and make some of the dribble moves he made - pulling up for the jump shots in addition to his inside play...he certainly is a special player. He's to be congratulated for how hard he has worked over his four years. You look at his four years and he has gotten better each year..."...a terrific double-double of 23 points and 15 rebounds as Florida State traveled to play at Maryland (Feb. 21)...was without-a doubt the best player on the floor as the Seminoles went in search of their sixth ACC win of the season...was unstoppable in the first half with a near double-double of 16 points and nine rebounds in the first 20 minutes of the game...helped the Seminoles recover from as much as an eight-point deficit in the final eight minutes of the first half with eight of the Seminoles' final 10 points of the half...helped stymie the Terps on defense as Florida State outscored Maryland, 10-2, to pull the game into a 31-31 tie at the intermission...totaled seven second half points as Maryland took the win in their home building...**(vs. Miami):** averaged 30.0 points and 6.0 rebounds in two games against Miami...one of the greatest single-game performances in school history against Miami (March 3) to close out his regular season with a near school-record 45 points, eight rebounds, two assists, two steals and four blocked shots as he rallied Florida State to a 98-90 victory over the Hurricanes in overtime...he was not going to be denied in his quest for a victory as he made 16 of 24 field goal attempts, two of three shots from the 3-point line and tied a school record for perfection as he was 11-of-11 from the free throw line...scored 18 points in the first half, 19 in the second half and eight in the overtime to come within one of tying the all-time Florida State record for points scored in a single-game...he scored 45 and the all-time record is 46 by Ron King against Georgia Southern on Feb. 11, 1971...had the chance to break the scoring record after receiving a pass from Toney Douglas and choosing not to go in for the uncontested lay-up saying afterwards: "The game was over and I didn't want to embarrass Miami. I did not know about the record, but it wouldn't have mattered; the win was the most important thing for me..."...largely on the strength of Thornton's play, Florida State tied the game late in regulation and won the game in overtime...with the Seminoles trailing by six (78-72) with 1:21 left in regulation, Thornton went on a mission, as he did many times during his Florida State career...he made a short jumper and completed the three-point play after being fouled by Jimmy Graham to close the gap to two (74-78, 1:10 left), grabbed a defensive rebound and raced to length of the court a made another jumper to close the Seminoles' deficit to one (77-78, 1:00 left) and committed a foul to stop the clock with 13 seconds left in the game and the Seminoles still down by one...after Miami's Keaton Copeland made two free throw shots to up the Hurricanes' margin to three, the game was sent into overtime on a spectacular 3-point shot by Florida State's Toney Douglas with the score tied a 82-82...Thornton set a ball screen to help free up Douglas for the game-tying shot...Thornton scored 13 of the Seminoles' final 18 points of the game as Florida State outscored Miami, 26-14, in the last 6:21 of actual playing to in the leading his team to the victory...scored 15 points and was one of four Seminoles' in double figure scoring as the Seminoles defeated Miami, 86-78, in Tallahassee for their second ACC win of the season (Jan. 20)...reached double figures with 10 points in the first half as the Seminoles bolted out to a 47-28 halftime lead and never looked back in gaining the victory...he was a perfect three-of-three from the free throw line in the victory...**(vs. North Carolina):** averaged 20.5 points and 9.0 rebounds in two games against NCAA Tournament regional finalist North Carolina...totaled one of the best road games of his career with a double-double of 29 points and 12 rebounds as the Seminoles traveled to play at the Dean Smith Center in Chapel Hill (Jan. 7)...earned game-high scoring honors as he out-dueled North Carolina's All-America Tyler Hansbrough on the offensive end as the Tar Heel center totaled 25 points...was a stellar 11 of 19 from the field and made four of five free throw attempts...scored 12 points and pulled down six rebounds as the Seminoles faced the Tar Heels in the quarterfinal round of the ACC Tournament at the St. Pete Times Forum in Tampa (March 9)...was saddled with fouls as he played only 15 minutes in the first half (nine points and five rebounds) and only 11 in the second half (three points and one rebound)...**(vs. NC State):** scored 17 points and pulled down five rebounds in the Seminoles' victory over NIT participant NC State...Florida State's leading scorer with 17 points and five rebounds as he made his Senior Day a success with a 78-52 Seminole victory over NC State in the only meeting between the two teams during the season in a game played in Tallahassee (Feb. 24)...fans knew it would be a good day as he scored on the Seminoles' opening possession with a resounding dunk to send the team on its way...scored six first half points and 11 second half points to total 17 in the win...closed out the game with a 3-pointer to up the score to 74-49 with 1:26 left in the game...left the game after the shot to a thunderous approval from the Seminole faithful in the Donald L. Tucker Center...**(vs. Virginia):** totaled a double-double of 30 points and 16 rebounds in the Seminoles' only game against NCAA Tournament participant Virginia...earned his first 30-point game of his senior season with 30 points and a career-high 16 rebounds in his first career game in the John Paul Jones Arena at the University of Virginia (Feb. 17)...once again, he nearly willed the Seminoles to the victory as 23 of his 30 points came in the second half as Florida State outscored Virginia 42-39 but were unable to completely make up its six-point deficit from the first half...Thornton outscored his Seminole teammates, 23-19, in the second half on an array of acrobatic and sensational shots that nearly led Florida State to the win... After scoring only seven points in the first half, he scored 23 points on nine of 14 shooting in the second half...Thornton scored the Seminoles' final 15 points of the game (and 17 of their final 19) and represented Florida State's offense as they closed a 12-point second half deficit to a little as one in their attempt of a conference road victory...in the final 7:53 of the game, Thornton scored four two-point baskets, two 3-point baskets and three free throws...he was five of seven from the field and pulled down two rebounds as the Seminoles closed to within one late in the second half...**(vs. Virginia Tech):** totaled a double-double of 27 points and 13 rebounds in one game against NCAA Tournament participant...he scored 27 points and pulled down 11 rebounds in the second half of the Seminoles' victory over No. 23 Virginia Tech in Tallahassee (Jan. 17)...he finished the game with 27 points, 13 rebounds, one assist and two blocked shots in 37 minutes...with his performance, he earned his 12<sup>th</sup> career double-double and his 17<sup>th</sup> career scoring game of 20 or more points...after taking only one shot in the first half, Thornton was eight of 13 (.615) from the field in the second half in leading the Seminoles' to the victory...he also made 11 of 11 free throws (including his last six) as the Seminoles defeated their second ranked team of the year...among the shots in Thornton's arsenal against Virginia Tech was a 3-pointer from nearly 40 feet as the shot clock ran down to zero -- the shot to give Florida State a 68-57 lead with 4:09 remaining in the game...Thornton scored 62.7 percent of the Seminoles' points (27 of 43) in the second half as Florida State earned the victory...**(vs. Wake Forest):** scored a double-double of 25 points and 11 rebounds in one game against Wake Forest...earned game-high scoring honors with 25 points and game high rebounding honors with 11 as the Seminoles defeated the Deacons in Tallahassee (Jan. 27) for their third ACC victory in four games...his 11 first half points helped the Seminoles stay in a tight game and trail by only two at the intermission...scored six of Florida State's final 12 points of the first half as the Seminoles closed as much as an eight point deficit to two (30-32) at the intermission...scored 14 second half points as Florida State outscored Wake Forest 44-34 after intermission to gain the win over the Demon Deacons...he scored eight of his 14 points on eight of nine shooting from the free throw line...his free throws tied the game once and extended the Seminoles lead three times in the second half as Florida State won the game by eight...**(vs. Florida):** scored 28 points and pulled down nine rebounds as the Seminoles defeated then No. 4 ranked Florida in Tallahassee...scored 28 points against the national champion ranked Gators...was masterful in dissecting the Gators as he scored 18 second-half points to lead Florida State to the 70-66 victory over their SEC in-state rivals...hit two free throws with four seconds remaining to give the Seminoles an insurmountable 70-66 lead...was nearly perfect from the field in the second half (six of seven -- .857) and was nearly as strong from the free throw line (five-of-seven -- .714)...made four of his final five free throws in the final seven minutes of the game as the Gators closed to within as few as two points before Florida State took the win...Thornton scored 10 of the Seminoles final 12 points in the final 7:35 of the game as the Seminoles gained their biggest win of the season...**(vs. Toledo, Michigan and Mississippi State in the NIT):** averaged 17.0 points and 5.7 rebounds in three games against Toledo, Michigan and Mississippi State in helping the Seminoles advance to the quarterfinal round of the 2007 NIT...totaled his NIT career-high of 24 points and pulled down six rebounds to go along with two steals and two blocked shots in the Seminoles' NIT opening victory over Toledo in Tallahassee (March 13)...was very proficient in shooting the basketball as he was 11 of 17 from the field (.647), one of two from the 3-point line (.500) and a perfect one of one from the free throw line (1.000)...totaled 15 points in the first half as the Seminoles ran to a 39-23 lead at the intermission...scored nine points in 13 minutes played in the second half as the Seminoles earned the first round national tournament win...scored 11 points in the Seminoles' victory over Michigan in the second round of the NIT in Tallahassee (March 15)...11 points in a balanced attack for the Seminoles that saw a season-high six players score in double figures in the victory over the Big Ten Wolverines...scored 10 points in the first half as the Seminoles took an early lead and held as 41-30 advantage at halftime...scored only three points in the nine minutes as Florida State trailed by as much as eight...started the Seminoles' comeback with a dunk

and a free throw shot to get the Seminoles jump-started and on their way to the second round victory...scored seven points in the second half of the first half to stake the Seminoles to their insurmountable lead...closed his career with a 16-point, six rebound, three steal and two blocked shot performance against Mississippi State in the third round of the NIT (March 20) in a game played in Starkville...scored 14 of his 16 points in the second half as he attempted to rally the Seminoles to the victory and the birth in the NIT semifinals at Madison Square Garden...his overall game was hurt by foul trouble as he picked up his second foul of the game with only 4:12 elapsed in the first half...that foul sent him to the bench and he scored only two points in four minutes played...he unfortunately picked up his third foul on 52 seconds into the second half and was saddled with his fourth foul with 15:51 left in the game...earned four awards at the Seminoles' honors banquet – the awards for best field goal and 3-point field goal percentage, the Bob Sura Outstanding Offensive Player and the Dave Cowens Chairman of the Boards awards.

Redick with six seconds remaining in the game...he was fouled by Duke's Patrick Johnson and made his two shots with one second remaining...in between the foul and Thornton's two free throws, Redick made two free throws after a technical had been assessed to the Florida State bench for too many players on the court...**(vs. Georgia Tech):** scored 10 points and pulled down four rebounds in the Seminoles' only game against Georgia Tech...one of five Seminoles to score in double figures as Florida State earned the come-from-behind win to beat the Yellow Jackets in Tallahassee (Feb. 9)...was a perfect three-of-three from the field and made three free throws in the victory...seven of his points came in the first half as Florida State fought furiously to stay with the hot Jackets...Thornton's seven first half points allowed the Seminoles to pull within four (43-39) at halftime after trailing by as many as eight in the first half...**(vs. Maryland):** totaled a double-double of 27 points and 12 rebounds in 39 of 40 minutes played in Florida State's only game of the season against NIT participant Maryland...his 27 points against the Terps was his fourth highest scoring total of the season...had a near-double-double of 10 points and eight rebounds by halftime...scored in
