**2005-06 SEASON:** Averaged 7.5 points, 3.6 rebounds and 21.9 minutes in 78 games, six as a starter ... Scored in double figures in 30 contests ... Tied for 12<sup>th</sup> in the NBA with a .420 (102-243) three-point field goal percentage ... Missed first game of career (160 games) with a sprained left ankle April 12 at Orlando ... The injury forced him out of the lineup for the final four games of the season (Apr. 12-19) ... Scored in double figures in five of his six outings in April, averaging 12.2 points and 6.5 rebounds in 30.2 minutes ... Had a season-high 16 points and a career-best 13 boards for his second career double-double Apr. 4 vs. Boston ... Averaged 9.2 points and shot .491 (27-for-55) from beyond the arc and .933 (14-for-15) from the line in March ... Registered first career double-double with 10 points and 12 rebounds, including career-best six offensive boards Mar. 24 vs. Minnesota ... Tied a career high Mar. 5 vs. Boston with five three-pointers to lead the bench in scoring with 15 points ... Totaled double figures in points in six of seven games from Jan. 11-27, averaging 12.5 points on .483 (29-60) percent shooting from the field and .441 (15-34) from three-point range ... Recorded career highs in free throws (six) and free throw attempts (six) en route to registering 10 points to go with eight rebounds Jan. 8 vs. New Jersey ... Tied career high with four steals Nov. 18 at Boston ... Made first career start Nov. 16 vs. Philadelphia, recording 10 points and two steals ... Posted 15 points, (6-10 FG), eight rebounds and a career-best four steals Nov. 11 vs. Utah.

**PROFESSIONAL CAREER:** Has averaged 7.3 points, 3.6 rebounds and 20.4 minutes in 160 games ... Has shot .490 (456-930) from the field and .421 (141-335) from three-point range ... Spent the 2003-04 season playing for Sicilia in the Italian A1 League, where he averaged 19.2 points (seventh in the 18-team league) and 9.3 rebounds (seventh in the league) ... **2004-05:** Averaged 7.2 points, 3.5 rebounds and 18.9 minutes ... One of two Raptors (Peterson) to play in all 82 games ... Joined Omar Cook as the only two players to not start a game ... Ranked first among rookies with a .424 (39-92) three-point field goal percentage and second with a .533 (247-463) field goal percentage ... Netted 10 or more points on 25 occasions ... Led the bench in scoring 18 times, including a career-best 21 points on eight-for-nine shooting from the field and a career-high five triples Mar. 11 vs. Atlanta ... Recorded 18 points, including four-for-four from beyond the arc, to go along with seven rebounds in a career-best 38 minutes Mar. 6 at New Orleans ... Shot .500 or better from the field in 12 consecutive games (Nov. 9-28) ... Netted his first career-triple Nov. 7 vs. Portland.

**COLLEGE CAREER:** Named Honorable Mention All-America by the Associated Press as a junior and senior ... As a senior, earned All-Southeastern Conference First Team honors from the Associated Press and coaches and was runner-up for SEC Player of the Year ... Earned second-team All-SEC honors as a junior and third team as a sophomore ... Left Florida ranked eighth all-time in scoring and sixth in three-pointers made ... Is the only Gator to record 1,500 points, 750 rebounds and 150 triples ... Was a three-time All-SEC Academic pick and earned Verizon Academic All-American of the Year honors for basketball in final two seasons, the first Gator hoopster to win the award ... As a senior, led the conference in three-point shooting percentage (.474) ... Averaged a team-best 15.2 points, with 6.1 rebounds (second on team) in 33 games ... Topped team in scoring 16 times and rebounding on 12 occasions ... As a junior, ranked second on the team in several categories including scoring (15.6), rebounding (7.2), three-point percentage (.371) and free throw percentage (.796) ... Ranked 10<sup>th</sup> in the conference in scoring, seventh in rebounding and fifth in field goal percentage ... Scored a career-high 31 points against South Florida ... Started 17 of his team's final 20 games as a sophomore ... Averaged 13.3 points and a team-high 7.6 rebounds, fifth in the league, in 31 games ... Topped team in rebounds 16 times ... Recorded team-best 10 double-doubles, third-best in SEC ... Averaged team-best 16.5 points in SEC Tournament on .632 shooting from the field ... Averaged 4.8 points and 3.2 rebounds in 36 games in his freshman campaign ... Shot .591 from the field in NCAA Tournament, second-best mark on the team, helping the Gators' run to NCAA title game.
