### **Parker in the Postseason**

Tony Parker's success in the playoffs at such a young age has put him in elite company ... with 1,361 career playoff points, Parker trails only Kobe Bryant on the all-time list for most playoff points for a player under 25 ... he is also second all-time in postseason wins for a player under 25 with 49 playoff wins and third in assists with 345.

### **Parker Taking a Shot at History**

Tony Parker's hot shooting throughout the 2005-06 season placed him in exclusive company ... Parker shot .548 (623-1136) for the season, placing him third in the NBA ... Parker is the first point guard since Butch Beard during the 1974-75 season to finish in the top three in field goal percentage ... here is a look at top field goal percentages for a point guard in NBA history.

### Good Company

Tony Parker's offensive production during the 2005-06 season put him in elite company... he joined NBA luminaries Magic Johnson and Wilt Chamberlain as the only three players in league history to average at least 18.0 points, 5.5 assists and shoot at least .540 from the field for a season since the NBA went to an 82 game schedule (minimum 70 games played)...Parker joined Johnson and Chamberlain by averaging 18.9 points, 5.8 assists while shooting .548 (623-1136) from the field (third best in the league) in 80 contests...Johnson averaged 18.3 points and 12.6 assists on .561 (504-899) from the field for the Los Angeles Lakers during the 1984-85 season...during the 1967-68 season Chamberlain won the league MVP award, scored 24.3 points per contest, dished out a league high 8.6 assists per game, while leading the league in field goal percentage, shooting .595 (819-1377) from the field for the Philadelphia 76ers.
