2006-07: In fourth NBA season and first with Phoenix averaged 4.9 points, 1.3 assists and 11.2 minutes in 45 games (one start)... Scored 10-plus points five times, 20-plus points twice, including a season-high 21 points (9-of-15 FG), two rebounds and three assists at Seattle on Feb. 14, only two games after scoring 20 points on 7-of-9 (.778) shooting vs. Atlanta on Feb. 9... His top three scoring performances came when the Suns played without Steve Nash (21 at Seattle on Feb. 14, 20 vs. Atlanta on Feb. 9, 17 vs. Philadelphia on Nov. 17)... Signed as a free agent on July 20, 2006.

PRO CAREER: Four-year NBA veteran owns career averages of 6.2 points, 1.6 rebounds and 2.3 assists in 265 games (34 starts) with the Boston Celtics, Minnesota Timberwolves and Phoenix Suns... Signed with the Suns as a free agent on July 20, 2006... Originally selected by the Memphis Grizzlies with the 13th overall pick in the 2003 NBA Draft, but his draft rights were traded by the Grizzlies with the draft rights to Kendrick Perkins to the Boston Celtics for the draft rights to Troy Bell and Dahntay Jones on June 26, 2003... Was part of a trade to the L.A. Lakers, along with Chucky Atkins, Chris Mihm and a second-round draft choice, in exchange for Gary Payton, Rick Fox and a first-round draft choice on Aug. 6, 2004, but trade was amended on Aug. 13, 2004 with the Celtics retaining Banks and the second-round draft choice and the Lakers acquiring Jumaine Jones... Showed remarkable improvement in his third NBA season in 2005-06 after a midseason trade from the Boston Celtics to the Minnesota Timberwolves... Averaged 12.0 points, 4.7 assists and 2.9 rebounds in 30.7 minutes in 40 games for the Wolves and started the club's final 28 games... Acquired from Boston on Jan. 26, 2006 with Mark Blount, Ricky Davis and Justin Reed along with two future second-round draft choices in exchange for Wally Szczerbiak, Michael Olowokandi, Dwayne Jones and a future first-round pick... Prior to the trade, averaged 5.5 points and 1.8 assists in 14.9 minutes in 18 games with the Celtics... Shot 47.9 percent from the field following the trade to Minnesota after shooting 40.1 percent in two-plus seasons with Boston... **COLLEGE:** Played final two seasons of collegiate career at Nevada-Las Vegas (2001-03) after two seasons at Dixie College (1999-01) in St. George, Utah... Averaged 18.1 points, 3.3 rebounds and 4.3 assists on 49.5 percent shooting in 63 career games over two seasons at UNLV (2001-03) and was named the Mountain West Defensive Player of the Year in both seasons... As a senior, was named to the First Team All-Mountain West Conference squad and was Co-Defensive Player of the Year (along with BYU's Travis Hansen)... Led conference in assists (5.5) and steals (2.80, seventh in the nation), and ranked second in scoring (20.3, 36th) in 32 games in 2002-03... As a junior, earned Second Team All-MWC honors and was named the MWC Defensive Player of the Year after averaging 15.8 points, 3.0 assists and 2.2 steals in 31 appearances for the Runnin' Rebels. **PERSONAL:** Full name is Arthur LaMarcus Banks... Son of Arthur and Sabrina... Has one younger brother, Langston, and one older sister, Dasha... Majored in sociology at UNLV... Was a two-sport athlete at Cimarron-Memorial High School in Las Vegas, participating in football and basketball.

PRO CAREER: Selected by Phoenix with the 59th overall pick in the second round of the 2007 NBA Draft... Is the first Maryland player to be taken by the Suns since selecting Mark Fothergill and Herman Veal in 1984... Is the first Terrapin drafted in the NBA since Steve Blake was taken in the second round by the Washington Wizards in 2003. **COLLEGE:** Played four seasons at Maryland averaging 10.1 points, 3.3 rebounds, 2.9 assists and 1.82 steals in 111 collegiate games (from 2003-07... Finished his career ranked among Maryland's all-time leaders in points, assists and steals... Scored 1,126 points and ranks 35th all-time in scoring at Maryland.. His 316 career assists rank 15th all-time, while his 202 steals places him fifth in the school annals... Named the Terrapins' Most Valuable Player following his senior season after averaging a team-high 14.9 points... Named second-team All-ACC and earned a spot on the Atlantic Coast Conference All-Defensive Team Started all 34 games as a senior as the Terps finished the year 25-9 and advanced to the second round of the NCAA Tournament... Poured in a career-high 27 points in win vs. No. 5 North Carolina, earning back-to-back ACC Player of the Week honors... Earned ACC All-Defensive Team Honorable Mention honors as a junior in 2005-06.... Led Maryland and ranked seven in ACC in assists (4.0) and sixth in ACC in steals (1.8)... Suffered a season-ending torn right ACL injury in practice on Jan. 17, 2005 and played in only 14 games in 2004-05... Garnered ACC All-Freshman Team Honorable Mention pick as a freshman. **PERSONAL:** Born on June 15, 1985 in New York, N.Y... Full name is D.J. Eugene Strawberry... Son of Lisa Watkins and former Major League Baseball player Darryl Strawberry... Has two brothers, Jordan Strawberry and Jesse Watkins... Also has four sisters, Diamond, Jade and Jewell Strawberry and Faith Watkins... Lists Michael Jordan as his favorite professional basketball player.

PRO CAREER: Selected by Phoenix with the 29th overall pick in the first round of the 2007 NBA Draft... Is the second Wisconsin player chosen by the Suns in the first round (Michael Finley, 21st overall in the 1995 NBA Draft). **COLLEGE:** Played five seasons at Wisconsin after receiving a medical redshirt in 2003-04, and averaged 16.5 points, 5.7 rebounds and 1.6 assists in 134 collegiate games from 2002-07... Finished as the Badgers all-time leading scorer (2,217), surpassing former Suns draft pick Michael Finley and ranks ninth in Big Ten history... Also holds seven other school records, including offensive rebounds (314), field goals (798), free throws (520), free throw attempts (817), minutes played (4,297), games played (134) and games started (126)... Played in 99 victories at Wisconsin, most in school history, and was part of the Badgers four winningest teams... Named Big Ten Player of the Year and was a consensus All-American as a senior after averaging 19.9 points (2nd in Big Ten), 5.4 rebounds and 2.0 assists in 36 games... One of four finalists for the Naismith Trophy given to the national player of the year, along with eventual winner Texas forward Kevin Durant (2nd overall in 2007 NBA Draft to Seattle), Texas A&M guard Acie Law IV (11th overall in 2007 NBA Draft to Atlanta) and North Carolina forward Tyler Hansbrough... Led Wisconsin to heights unparalleled in school history as a senior... The Badgers won 17 consecutive games, the longest single-season streak in school history, earned a No. 1 ranking in *The Associated Press* poll for the first time, and garnered their highest seed ever in the 2007 NCAA Tournament (No. 2)... His 716 points were a school single-season record in 2006-07... As a junior, led team in scoring (19.0) and ranked among the school's single-season top 10 in points, field goals and field goal attempts in 2005-06... Scored a career-high and Paradise Jam Tournament-record 38 points (fourth-most in school history) in win over Eastern Kentucky on Nov. 19, 2005... Suffered a nasal injury against Wake Forest and wore a custom-made protective mask in 13 games as a junior... As a sophomore, led Badgers in scoring (15.2) and averaged a career-best 6.1 rebounds in 2004-05... Missed all but four games due to a right foot injury in 2003-04 and received a medical redshirt... As a freshman, started at power forward and finished third on the team (and third among Big Ten freshmen) averaging 12.0 points... Led the Big Ten and set a school record for offensive rebounds (2.69 per game, 86 total). **PERSONAL:** Born on February 11, 1984 in Lockport, Ill... Parents are Lisa Tucker and Forrest Harris... Majored in life sciences communications at Wisconsin... Nickname is Doe... Averaged 22.2 points, 7.7 rebounds and 5.7 assists to earn first-team all-state honors as a senior at Township High School in Lockport, Ill.

Originally selected by the Raptors with the 17th overall pick in the first round of the 2001 NBA Draft... Most recently, played for Spanish club Bruesa-Guipuzcoa BC and averaged 13.1 rebounds and 8.4 rebounds in 32 games in 2006-07, his first professional season overseas... Spent first three NBA seasons with the Raptors before being waived on March 12, 2004... Posted career highs of 5.0 points, 6.1 rebounds and 19.6 minutes in 67 games (11 starts) with the Raptors in 2002-03... Established career highs of 16 points at Detroit on April 2, 2003 and 15 rebound at Golden State on Dec. 27, 2002... Owns the second-best career field goal percentage in NCAA history (.667), behind Steve Johnson (Oregon State, .668)... In junior season, led Villanova in scoring (20.8), rebounding (9.8) and field-goal percentage (.692)... Ranked first in the nation in field-goal percentage, 16th in rebounding and 20th in scoring... His Division I-leading field goal percentage (.667) broke the Villanova single-season school record (.640) set by former NBA forward Ed Pinckney... 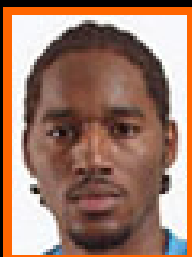

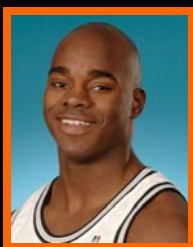

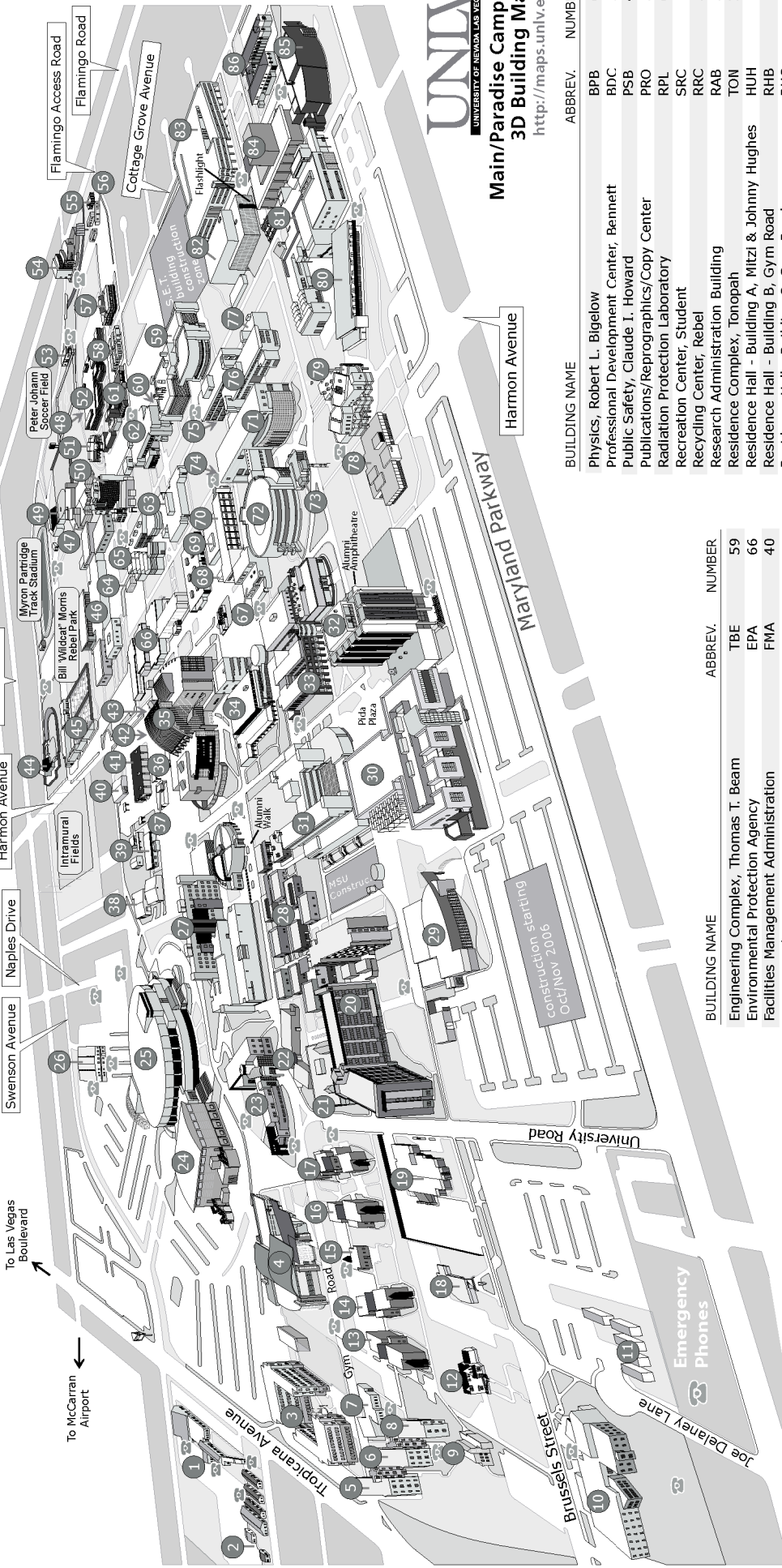
