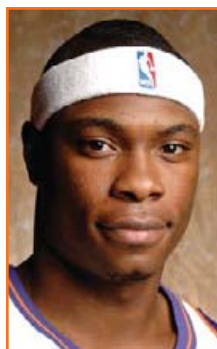

In fourth NBA season and first with Phoenix averaged 4.9 points, 1.3 assists and 11.2 minutes in 45 games (one start)... Scored 10-plus points five times, 20-plus points twice, including a season-high 21 points (9-of-19 FG), two rebounds and three assists at Seattle on Feb. 14, only two games after scoring 20 points on 7-of-9 (.778) shooting vs. Atlanta on Feb. 9... His top three scoring performances came when the Suns played without Steve Nash (21 at Seattle on Feb. 14, 20 vs. Atlanta on Feb. 9, 17 vs. Philadelphia on Nov. 17)... In lone start, responded with eight points and a season-high seven assists vs. Chicago on Feb. 11... Recorded 13 points, two assists and a season-high four steals in 25 minutes vs. Miami on Jan. 5... In the Suns' home opener, had 13 points, four rebounds in 15 minutes vs. L.A. Clippers on Nov. 1... Had 31 DNP (Coach's Decisions)... Inactive six games... Scored league record 42 points in only game played at 2007 NBA Vegas Summer League on July 9, but missed rest of the summer league due to sore left shoulder... Signed as a free agent on July 20, 2006.

Pro Career

Four-year NBA veteran owns career averages of 6.2 points, 1.6 rebounds and 2.3 assists in 265 games (34 starts) with the Boston Celtics, Minnesota Timberwolves and Phoenix Suns... Signed with the Suns as a free agent on July 20, 2006... Originally selected by the Memphis Grizzlies with the 13th overall pick in the 2003 NBA Draft, but his draft rights were traded by the Grizzlies with the draft rights to Kendrick Perkins to the Boston Celtics for the draft rights to Troy Bell and Dahntay Jones on June 26, 2003... Was part of a trade to the L.A. Lakers, along with Chucky Atkins, Chris Mihm and a second-round draft choice, in exchange for Gary Payton, Rick Fox and a first-round draft choice on Aug. 6, 2004, but trade was amended on Aug. 13, 2004 with the Celtics retaining Banks and the second-round draft choice and the Lakers acquiring Jumaime Jones... Showed remarkable

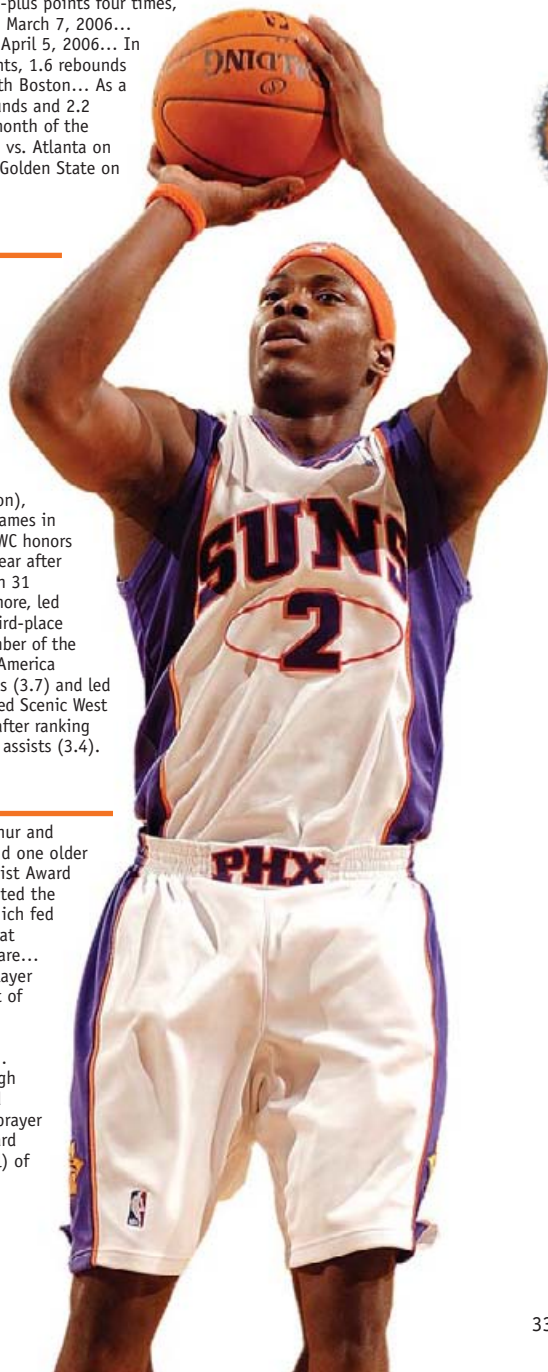
improvement in his third NBA season in 2005-06 after a midseason trade from the Boston Celtics to the Minnesota Timberwolves... Averaged 12.0 points, 4.7 assists and 2.9 rebounds in 30.7 minutes in 40 games for the Wolves and started the club's final 28 games... Acquired from Boston on Jan. 26, 2006 with Mark Blount, Ricky Davis and Justin Reed along with two future second-round draft choices in exchange for Wally Szczerbiak, Michael Olowokandi, Dwayne Jones and a future first-round pick... Prior to the trade, averaged 5.5 points and 1.8 assists in 14.9 minutes in 18 games with the Celtics... Shot 47.9 percent from the field following the trade to Minnesota after shooting 40.1 percent in two-plus seasons with Boston... Led the Wolves in scoring six times and tallied 20-plus points four times, including a season-high 26 points vs. Houston on March 7, 2006... Dished out a career-high 10 assists at Atlanta on April 5, 2006... In second NBA season in 2004-05, averaged 4.6 points, 1.6 rebounds and 1.9 assists in 14.1 minutes in 81 contests with Boston... As a rookie in 2003-04, averaged 5.9 points, 1.6 rebounds and 2.2 assists in 17.1 minutes in 81 outings... In final month of the 2003-04 season, recorded a career-high 28 points vs. Atlanta on April 14, 2004 and a career-high seven steals vs. Golden State on April 2, 2004.

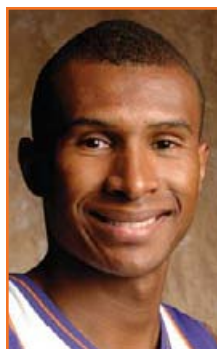

Averaged 18.1 points, 3.3 rebounds and 4.3 assists on 49.5 percent shooting in 63 career games over two seasons at UNLV and was named the Mountain West Defensive Player of the Year in both seasons... As a senior, was named to the First Team All-Mountain West Conference squad and was Co-Defensive Player of the Year (along with BYU's Travis Hansen)... Led conference in assists (5.5) and steals (2.80, seventh in the nation), and ranked second in scoring (20.3, 36th) in 32 games in 2002-03... As a junior, earned Second Team All-MWC honors and was named the MWC Defensive Player of the Year after averaging 15.8 points, 3.0 assists and 2.2 steals in 31 appearances for the Runnin' Rebels... As a sophomore, led Dixie to a 35-2 overall record in 2000-01 and a third-place finish in the NJCAA Tournament, where was a member of the All-Tournament Team... Also participated in the second annual "Take a Player to School" day, sponsored by Arizona Department of Health Services, and surprised 11-year-old Karli Gonzalez, who won an essay contest on why kids shouldn't smoke... Majored in sociology at UNLV... Was a two-sport athlete at Cimarron-Memorial High School in Las Vegas, participating in football and basketball... Was the runaway winner of the 2006-07 NBA Sixth Man of the Year Award after collecting 79.5 percent of the first-place votes (101 of 127) from a panel of sportswriters and broadcasters... Became the fourth player in franchise history to claim the honor, joining Rodney Rogers in 1999-2000, Danny Manning in 1997-98 and Eddie Johnson in 1988-89... Posted career highs in scoring (18.1, 31st in NBA), assists (4.0, T-37th), rebounds (2.7), steals (1.20, T-29th) and minutes played (32.7) and came off the bench in 62 of 80 games played... Ranked fifth in the NBA with a career-high 190 three-point field goals made (prev. 87, 2005-06) and for the second consecutive season ranked among the league's top 10 in three-point field goal percentage (.434, 7th)... Scored 10-plus points 73 times, 20-plus points career-high 33 times and 30-plus points four times... Had scored 20 or more points just 13 times and never more than 28 points in first three NBA seasons... Established career highs of 32 points and seven three-point field goals made vs. Charlotte on March 7... Matched his personal best in scoring five days later with 32 points vs. Houston on March 12... Led Suns reserves in scoring in 58 of 62 games coming off the bench... Recorded first five career double-doubles... Dished out 10 or more assists four times... Notched three consecutive doubles (Nov. 11, 17 and 18) after not recording a single one in his first 196 career games... Scored 16 of his 30 points in the fourth quarter in the season opener at Lakers on Oct. 31... Scored 17 consecutive points, one shy of a club record, in the first half at Sacramento on March 25 and finished with a team-high 27 points... Tied a Suns franchise record for most three-pointers in a half with 6-of-7 shooting from behind the arc vs. Boston on Feb. 21... Hit first career game-winner with a three-pointer with 1.5 seconds left at Chicago on Jan. 2... Had first career double-double with 16 points and a career-high 12 assists vs. Memphis on Nov. 11, followed with 26 points and a career-high 10 rebounds vs. Philadelphia on Nov. 17 and 15 points and 11 assists at Utah on Nov. 18... In first start of the season posted a team-high 22 points, six rebounds and six assists, including 11-of-12 from the charity stripe, both career highs, vs. Utah on Nov. 3... Suffered a sprained left ankle vs. New Orleans/Okla. City on Nov. 22 and missed his only two games (Nov. 24 and 26)... Awarded the

2006-07 Dan Majerle Hustle Award, which was selected based on the results of five voting categories: fans (who cast their ballots online at Suns.com), Suns players, coaches, employees and Majerle himself... Signed a five-year contract extension, the maximum allowed by NBA rules, on August 4, 2006... The contract will begin in the 2007-08 season... Averaged 15.8 points, 3.5 rebounds and 2.2 assists in 31.7 minutes in 11 games in the 2007 NBA Playoffs, including 21.2 points in five first round games vs. L.A. Lakers.

Pro Career

Phoenix acquired his draft rights (28th overall) from San Antonio for a future protected first-round pick (Suns completed the trade conveying the 30th overall pick in the 2005 NBA Draft to San Antonio who sent it to New York) on draft day on June 26, 2003... Along with Suns' first-round selection Zarko Cabarkapa (Serbia & Montenegro), was one of record 21 international players taken in the draft... Enjoyed a breakout season in his third NBA campaign in 2005-06, posting career highs in points per game (13.1), rebounds (2.6), assists (2.8), field goal percentage (.481), three-point field goal percentage (team-high .444, 3rd in NBA), three-pointers made (87) and minutes played (27.9) in 57 games (11 starts)...

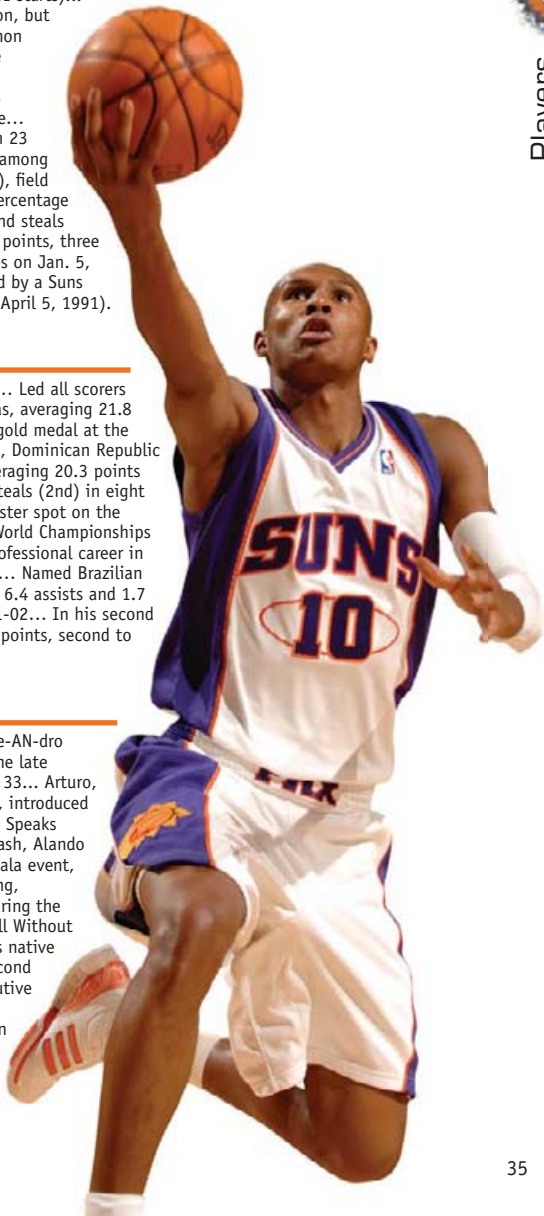
Wasn't expected to see a lot of action in rookie season, but that changed dramatically after Phoenix traded Stephon Marbury to New York on Jan. 5, 2004... Inherited the starting point guard job, a position usually held by a veteran, and averaged 10.0 points, 2.4 rebounds, 3.3 assists and 1.6 steals in 28.0 minutes after the trade... Averaged 3.5 points and 0.6 assists in 8.0 minutes in 23 games prior to Jan. 5, 2004... Ranked in the top 10 among NBA rookies in scoring (7.9, 9th), assists (2.4, T-8th), field goal percentage (.448, 6th), three-point field goal percentage (.395, 1st), three-point field goals made (83, 2nd) and steals (1.33, T-3rd)... In first NBA start, broke loose for 27 points, three rebounds, four assists and one turnover in 39 minutes on Jan. 5, 2004 at Chicago... It was also the most points scored by a Suns rookie in their first start (prev. 22 by Negele Knight, April 5, 1991).

International Career

A member of the Brazilian National Team since 2002... Led all scorers at the 2007 FIBA Americas Championship in Las Vegas, averaging 21.8 points in 10 games (5-5 record)... Led Brazil to the gold medal at the 2005 FIBA Americas Championship in Santo Domingo, Dominican Republic and was named to the All-Tournament Team after averaging 20.3 points (3rd), 4.1 assists (T-3rd), 5.0 rebounds (20th), 2.1 steals (2nd) in eight contests... Was the youngest player (19) to earn a roster spot on the Brazilian National Team that competed at the 2002 World Championships in Indianapolis (his first trip to USA)... Began his professional career in 1999-00 playing for Palmieras in the second division... Named Brazilian League Rookie of the Year after totaling 15.8 points, 6.4 assists and 1.7 steals in his first full season for Baura Tilibra in 2001-02... In his second season with Baura Tilibra in 2002-03, averaged 28.2 points, second to the legendary Oscar Schmidt.

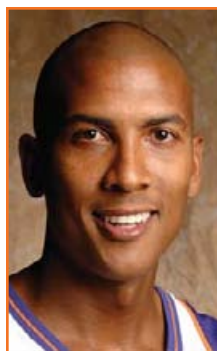

Arturo, who is a member of the elite Brazilian Special Forces, introduced Leandro to the sport of basketball when he was five.. Speaks Portuguese and English... Joined teammates Steve Nash, Alando Tucker and D.J. Strawberry at the Yao/Nash Charity Gala event, a charity basketball game on Sept. 14, 2007 in Beijing, China... Has a 6-10 wingspan and grew a half inch during the 2006 offseason... Participated in the NBA's Basketball Without Borders Americas community outreach program in his native country Brazil in 2004, 2006 and 2007... Was the second Brazilian player selected in the first round in consecutive drafts (Nene Hilario, 7th pick in 2002 by New York, later traded to Denver)... Became the fourth Brazilian to play in the NBA following Rolando Ferreira (Portland, 1988-89), Joao Jose Vianna (Dallas, 1991-92) and Nene (Denver, 2002-07).

In seventh NBA season and second with Phoenix averaged double figures in scoring (career-high tying 14.7 ppg) for the fourth consecutive year after averaging 3.2 points in first three NBA seasons... Named to the 2006-07 NBA All-Defensive First Team for the first time in his career and is only the fourth player in franchise history to be named to the first squad (Jason Kidd, Dennis Johnson, Don Buse)... Continued to emerge as one of the league's top three-point shooters... Shared NBA lead in three pointers made (career-high 205) with Gilbert Arenas to become only the second player in franchise history to make over 200 in a single season (226 by Quentin Richardson in 2004-05)... Scored 10-plus points 62 times, 20-plus points 16 times, including a season-high 30 points, one shy of a career high, at Portland on Nov. 26... Grabbed a career-high 13 rebounds and added 11 points for lone double-double at San Antonio on April 5... Connected on a season-high seven three-point field goals three times (at Portland on Nov. 26, at Memphis on Jan. 15 and at Milwaukee on Jan. 26)... Became just the sixth player in NBA history to make at least four three-pointers in six consecutive games from Nov. 20 - Dec. 1 and the first since Ray Allen did it in January 2002 with Milwaukee (others, Allen, John Starks, George McCloud, Dennis Scott, Mitch Ritchmond)... Tied Wesley Person and Stephon Marbury's franchise single-game record for most three-point attempts without a miss (6) at L.A. Lakers on April 8... Inactive three games: left rib contusion vs. Dallas on Nov. 9 and vs. Memphis on Nov. 11, inflamed left knee vs.

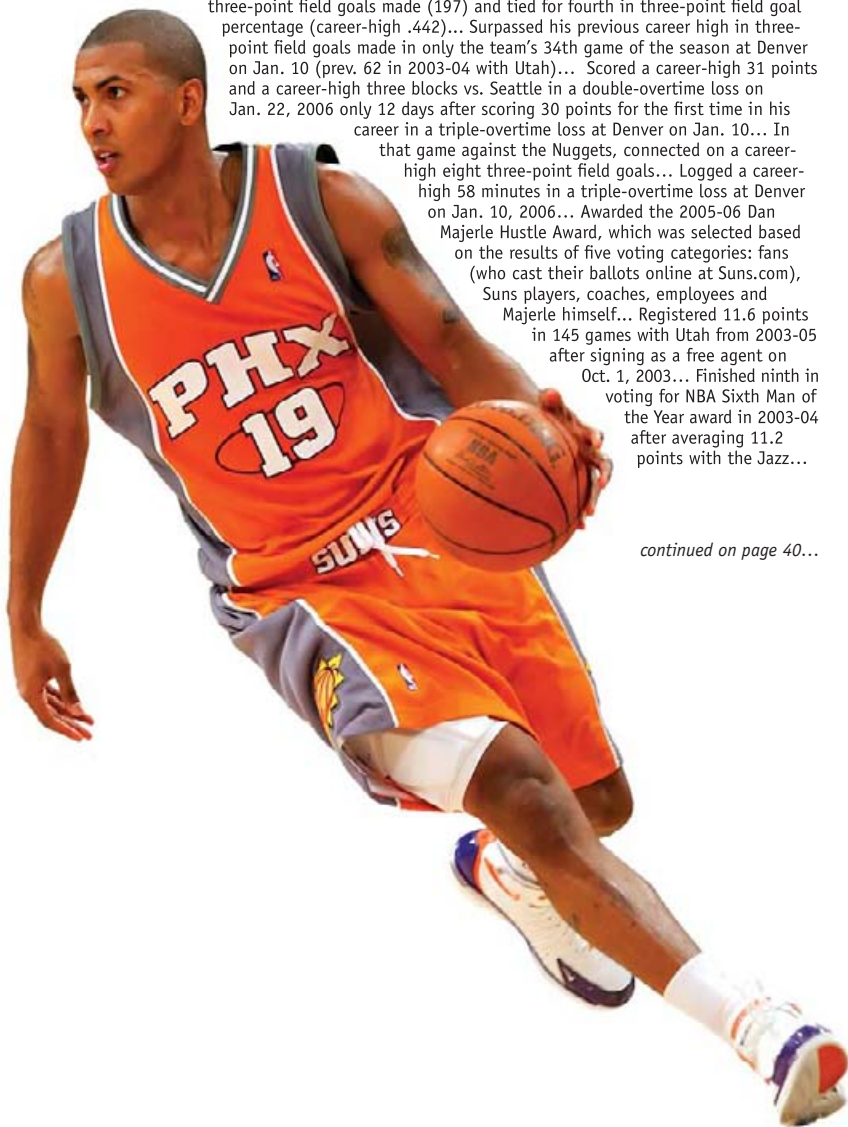

Utah on Feb. 3... Drew a one-game NBA suspension vs. Miami on Jan. 5 for kicking Toronto's Andrea Bargnani on Jan. 3... Averaged 10.2 points, 3.0 rebounds and 1.8 assists in 39.8 minutes and made a team-high 20 three-point field goals in 11 games in the 2007 NBA Playoffs.

Pro Career

The undrafted seven-year NBA veteran owns career averages of 9.8 points, and 2.6 rebounds in 25.8 minutes in 456 career games... Since being reunited with former teammate Steve Nash (2002-03 with Dallas), Bell has developed into one of the league's top three-point shooters... In two seasons with Phoenix has a 14.7 scoring average and totaled 402 three-pointers made, including a .427 three-point field goal percentage... Prior to signing with the Suns as an unrestricted free agent on August 3, 2005, averaged 7.3 points and 2.3 rebounds in 19.7 minutes in 299 career games (79 with Philadelphia, 75 with Dallas and 145 with Utah)... Has shot 40 percent or better from three-point range in four of the last five seasons... Ranks 11th all-time and fifth among active NBA players in three-point field goal percentage (.412, minimum 250 made)... Has equaled or increased his scoring average in four consecutive seasons after averaging 3.2 points in his first three NBA seasons... In his sixth NBA season and first with Phoenix in 2005-06, averaged 14.7 points, 3.2 rebounds, 2.6 assists in 37.5 minutes (30th in the NBA), all career highs, in 79 games played (all starts)... 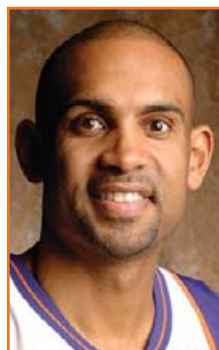

Nearly captured his third consecutive NBA MVP award, finishing second in voting behind winner Dirk Nowitzki... Was the lone unanimous selection to the 2006-07 All-NBA First Team, his third consecutive First Team honor, and teamed with Amaré Stoudemire to become the first duo in franchise history to be chosen to the First Team.... In 11th NBA season posted career highs in assists (NBA-best 11.6), field goal percentage (.532, T-14th) and tied personal bests with a .455 three-point field goal percentage (2nd) and 156 three-point field goals made (also with Dallas in 2001-02)... 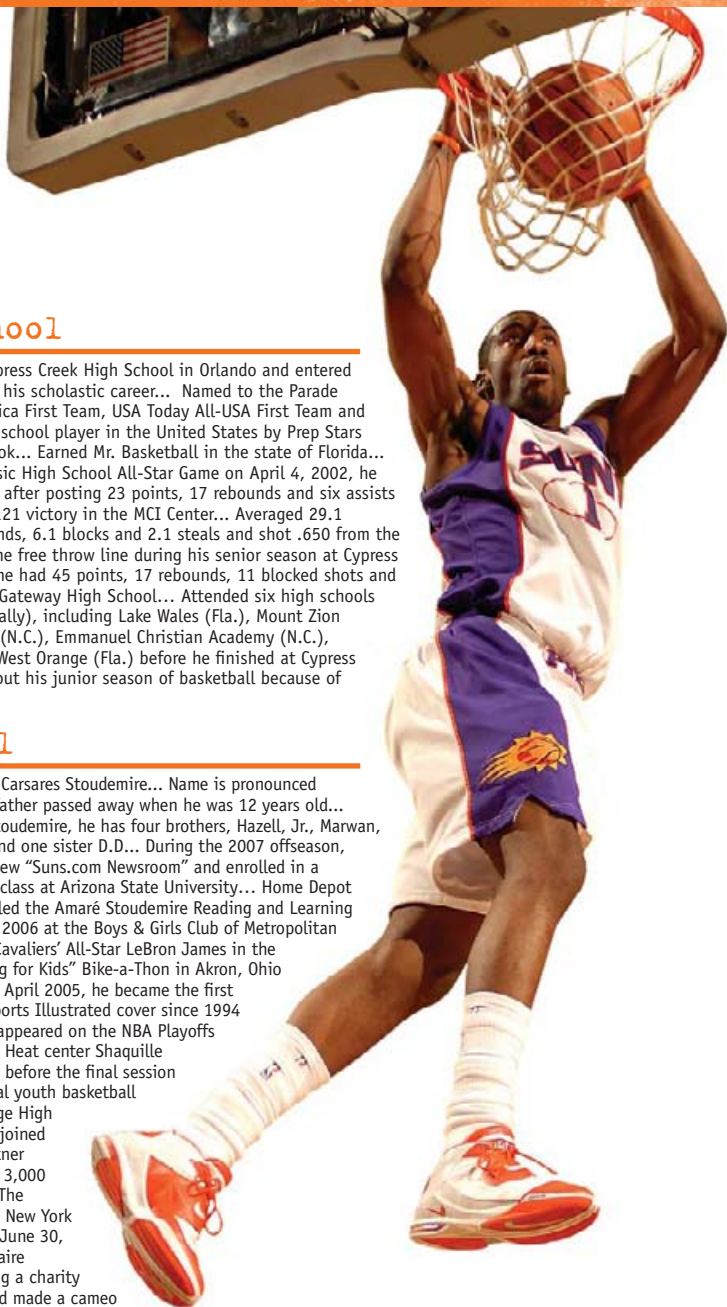

Named to the Parade magazine All-America First Team, USA Today All-USA First Team and rated the top high school player in the United States by Prep Stars Recruiter's Handbook... Earned Mr. Basketball in the state of Florida... At the Capital Classic High School All-Star Game on April 4, 2002, he shared MVP honors after posting 23 points, 17 rebounds and six assists in his team's 167-121 victory in the MCI Center... Averaged 29.1 points, 15.0 rebounds, 6.1 blocks and 2.1 steals and shot .650 from the field and .780 at the free throw line during his senior season at Cypress Creek... In one game had 45 points, 17 rebounds, 11 blocked shots and six assists against Gateway High School... Attended six high schools (listed chronologically), including Lake Wales (Fla.), Mount Zion Christian Academy (N.C.), Emmanuel Christian Academy (N.C.), Dr. Phillips (Fla.), West Orange (Fla.) before he finished at Cypress Creek (Fla.)... Sat out his junior season of basketball because of transfer rules.

The son of Carrie Stoudemire, he has four brothers, Hazell, Jr., Marwan, Calvin and Jerrell and one sister D.D... During the 2007 offseason, helped unveil the new "Suns.com Newsroom" and enrolled in a history and pilates class at Arizona State University... Home Depot and the Suns unveiled the Amaré Stoudemire Reading and Learning Center on June 30, 2006 at the Boys & Girls Club of Metropolitan Phoenix... Joined Cavaliers' All-Star LeBron James in the second annual "King for Kids" Bike-a-Thon in Akron, Ohio in June 2006... In April 2005, he became the first Suns player on a Sports Illustrated cover since 1994 (Barkley) when he appeared on the NBA Playoffs preview with Miami Heat center Shaquille O'Neal... Just hours before the final session of his second annual youth basketball camp at Desert Ridge High School in Mesa, he joined Suns Managing Partner Robert Sarver some 3,000 miles away to ring The Opening Bell at the New York Stock Exchange on June 30, 2005... Met millionaire Donald Trump during a charity basketball game and made a cameo appearance on the season finale of Trump's NBC hit reality series *The Apprentice*, which aired on December 2004... Nicknamed STAT (Standing Tall and Talented) and has that name tattooed on his right arm... Did not start playing basketball until he was 14 years old... Also played football and baseball in high school... Had LASIK surgery at the Schwartz Laser Eye Center in Scottsdale to correct a vision problem in May 2003... Was the winner on Wheel of Fortune's NBA Week in 2003 and donated money to the Boys and Girls Club... Has twice been featured as the cover athlete for Sony's video game NBA '06 and NBA '08... A fan of G.I. Joe as a kid, Stoudemire was immortalized with his own action figure by McFarlane's Sports Pick... Wears size 16 shoe and recently released his new line of Nike Force sneakers.

Pro Career

Selected by Phoenix with the 59th overall pick in the second round of the 2007 NBA Draft... Signed a two-year contract on August 28... At the 2007 Orlando pre-draft camp, he scored the best of all 80 prospects in the agility tests... Is the first Maryland player to be taken by the Suns since selecting Mark Fothergill and Herman Veal in 1984... Is the first Terrapin drafted in the NBA since Steve Blake was taken in the second round by the Washington Wizards in 2003... Led the 22-team 2007 NBA Vegas Summer League in assists (6.4), while averaging 15.6 points, 3.0 rebounds and 1.4 steals in 32.0 minutes in five games for the Suns... Contributed a team-high 27 points and eight assists vs. Portland on July 14.

College

Played four seasons at Maryland averaging 10.1 points, 3.3 rebounds, 2.9 assists and 1.82 steals in 111 collegiate games (from 2003-07)... Finished his career ranked among Maryland's all-time leaders in points, assists and steals... Scored 1,126 points and ranks 35th all-time in scoring at Maryland.. His 316 career assists rank 15th all-time, while his 202 steals places him fifth in the school annals... Named the Terrapins' Most Valuable Player following his senior season after averaging a team-high 14.9 points... Named second-team All-ACC and earned a spot on the Atlantic Coast Conference All-Defensive Team... Started all 34 games as a senior as the Terps finished the year 25-9 and advanced to the second round of the NCAA Tournament... Pro Career

Selected by Phoenix with the 29th overall pick in the first round of the 2007 NBA Draft... Is the second Wisconsin player chosen by the Suns in the first round (Michael Finley, 21st overall in the 1995 NBA Draft)... Averaged 17.4 points, 2.4 rebounds, 2.4 assists and a team-high 32.4 minutes in five games for the Suns at the 2007 NBA Vegas Summer League... Tallied 29 points (10-19 FG, 8-10 FT) and six assists vs. Philadelphia on July 11.

College

Played five seasons at Wisconsin after receiving a medical redshirt in 2003-04, and averaged 16.5 points, 5.7 rebounds and 1.6 assists in 134 collegiate games from 2002-07... Finished as the Badgers all-time leading scorer (2,217), surpassing former Suns draft pick Michael Finley and ranks ninth in Big Ten history... Also holds seven other school records, including offensive rebounds (314), field goals (798), free throws (520), free throw attempts (817), minutes played (4,297), games played (134) and games started (126)... Played in 99 victories at Wisconsin, most in school history, and was part of the Badgers four winningest teams... Named Big Ten Player of the Year and was a consensus All-American as a senior after averaging 19.9 points (2nd in Big Ten), 5.4 rebounds and 2.0 assists in 36 games... One of four finalists for the Naismith Trophy given to the national player of the year, along with eventual winner Texas forward Kevin Durant (2nd overall in 2007 NBA Draft to Seattle), Texas A&M guard Acie Law IV (11th overall in 2007 NBA Draft to Atlanta) and North Carolina forward Tyler Hansbrough... Led Wisconsin to heights unparalleled in school history as a senior... The Badgers won 17 consecutive games, the longest single-season streak in school history, earned a No. 1 ranking in The Associated Press poll for the first time, and garnered their highest seed ever in the 2007 NCAA Tournament (No. 2)... His 716 points were a school single-season record in 2006-07... As a junior, led team in scoring (19.0) and ranked among the school's single-season top 10 in points, field goals and field goal attempts in 2005-06... Scored a career-high and Paradise Jam Tournament-record 38 points (fourth-most in school history) in win over Eastern Kentucky on Nov. 19, 2005... Suffered a nasal injury against Wake Forest and wore a custom-made protective mask in 13 games as a junior... Suns In The Rafters... Ring of Honor



Alvan Adams Nicknames "Oklahoma Kid" or "Double A"... Spent entire 13-year career as a Sun (1975-88)... Selected by Suns with fourth overall pick in 1975 Draft... NBA Rookie of the Year after helping Suns to first-ever appearance in NBA Finals... Phoenix's career leader in games played (988), minutes played (27,203), rebounds (6,937) and steals (1,289)... Ranks second in assists (4,102) behind Kevin Johnson... Suns jersey, 33, retired Nov. 9, 1988.



Charles Barkley Nicknames "Sir Charles" and "Round Mound of Rebound"... One of only four NBA players with more than 23,000 points, 12,000 rebounds and 4,000 assists (includes Kareem Abdul-Jabbar, Wilt Chamberlain and Karl Malone)... Selected as one of the 50 Greatest players in NBA History in 1996 and is only Sun to appear on that list... Was the first Sun to be named NBA MVP after averaging 25.6 points and 12.2 rebounds in 1992-93 as Suns finished franchise-best 62-20... Has highest scoring average (23.4) of anyone in the Ring of Honor and trails only Charlie Scott (24.8) in team history... Eleven-time All-Star, including all four seasons in Phoenix (1993-96)... Ranks as the Suns all-time playoff leader in scoring average (26.5) and rebounds (644)... Set franchise record with 56 points, tied for the third most in NBA postseason history, at Golden State on May 4, 1994... Won two Olympic gold medals and led the Dream Team in scoring in 1992 and 1996... Placed in Ring of Honor on March 20, 2004... Inducted into the Hall of Fame on Sept. 9, 2006.



Tom Chambers Signed with Phoenix on July 8, 1988 as first unrestricted free agent in NBA history... Played five seasons for Suns and averaged 20.6 points, fifth on team's all-time list... Named ALL-NBA Second Team in his first two seasons when he averaged 27.2 and 25.7 points, the two highest season scoring averages in Suns history... Also holds club record with 60 points on March 24, 1990 against Seattle... Three-time All-Star with the Suns... Placed in Ring of Honor on April 18, 1999.

DAVIS



Walter Davis Nicknames “Sweet D,” “Man with the Velvet Touch” or “The Greyhound”... Regarded as best pure shooter in Suns history... Played 11 seasons with Phoenix (1977-88) after being selected by Phoenix with fifth overall pick in 1977 Draft... 1977-78 NBA Rookie of the Year... Phoenix’s all-time leading scorer (15,666)... Ranks among top five in eight other categories... Played in All-Star Game six times (1978, ’79, ’80, ’81, ’84, ’87)... Suns jersey, 6, retired April 3, 1994.

COTTON



Cotton Fitzsimmons Nicknames “Cotton” and “Whitey”... Twenty-year NBA coaching career included three stints as Suns head coach with a 341-208 record (.621)... Since 1970, served the Suns as head coach, director of player personnel, color analyst and finally as senior executive vice president... Retired from coaching sixth on the NBA’s all-time victory list with an overall record of 832-775 (.518)... Two-time NBA Coach of the Year (1989 with Phoenix and 1979 with Kansas City)... In 1988-89, orchestrated what was at the time the third-biggest turnaround in NBA history guiding the club to a 55-27 record... Only one year earlier, pulled off a controversial trade with Cleveland on Feb. 25, 1988 that netted the Suns eventual All-Stars Kevin Johnson and Dan Majerle (via the draft)... Inducted into the Missouri Basketball Hall of Fame, the National Junior College Hall of Fame and Missouri Sports Hall of Fame... Placed posthumously in the Ring of Honor on March 18, 2005.

HAWKINS



Connie Hawkins Nickname “The Hawk”... New York City’s greatest playground legend... In 1962, at age 19, ABL’s MVP with Pittsburgh Rens... Harlem Globetrotter (1964-66)... Led Pittsburgh Pipers to first-ever ABA title (1967)... Averaged 20.5 points, 9.0 rebounds in five seasons with Phoenix... Joined Suns after coin flip with Seattle in 1969... All-Star each full season in Phoenix (1970, ’71, ’72, ’73)... Listed as one of the top 15 players by Kareem Abdul-Jabbar... Elected to Hall of Fame May 11, 1992... Suns jersey, 42, retired November 19, 1976.

JOHNSON



Kevin Johnson Nickname “KJ”... 6-1 point guard played in 683 of his 735 career games in a Suns uniform... Ranks sixth in NBA history with 9.1 assists per game and 10th with 6,711 assists... Suns career leader in assists and had club record 25 on April 6, 1994 against San Antonio... Is one of five players in NBA history to average 20 points, 10 assists in three-straight seasons... Three-time All-Star (1990, ’91, ’94) and five-time All-NBA pick... Won 1989 Most Improved Player and gold medal at 1994 World Championships... Suns jersey, 7, retired March 7, 2001.



Ring of Honor

MAJERLE



Dan Majerle Nickname "Thunder Dan"... 6-6 swingman was selected with 14th overall pick in the 1988 Draft and soon emerged as a fan favorite because of his tremendous work ethic... Played first seven seasons in Phoenix, averaging 14.6 points, 5.9 rebounds and 3.3 assists, before concluding his career as a Sun in 2001-02... Phoenix's all-time leader in three-point field goals (800)... Won gold medal at the 1994 World Championships and a bronze medal at the 1988 Olympics... Became the first reserve to be voted to start on an All-Star team in 1995 and made three All-Star appearances (1992, '93, '95)... Only Sun to wear all three uniform styles... Placed in Ring of Honor on March 9, 2003.

PROSKI



Joe Proski Nicknames "Prosk" and "Magic Fingers"... Was the team's original athletic trainer and held the post for the first 32 years of the franchise... Named NBA Athletic Trainer of the Year in 1987-88... Earned the first 30-year award ever issued by the National Basketball Trainers Association... Served as athletic trainer at four All-Star Games and represented Western Conference on NBTA Executive Committee for 10 years... Placed in Ring of Honor on April 1, 2001.

VAN ARSDALE



Dick Van Arsdale Nicknames "Flying Dutchman" and "The Original Sun"... 6-5 swingman spent nine of 12 NBA seasons in Phoenix (1968-77)... Was club's first pick in 1968 Expansion Draft after three seasons in New York... Scored first point in franchise history on Oct. 18, 1968... Is fourth on club's all-time scoring list (12,060), averaging 17.6... Three-time All-Star (1969, '70, '71)... 1974 All-Defensive Second Team... Scored 15,079 career points (16.4 ppg)... Suns jersey, 5, retired Nov. 13, 1977.

WESTPHAL



Paul Westphal Nickname "Westy"... 6-4 guard from Southern Cal... Acquired by Phoenix from Boston on May 23, 1975 for Charlie Scott... Won 1974 NBA title with Boston... Helped lift Phoenix to 1976 Finals against Boston... Phoenix's sixth all-time leading scorer (9,564), averaging 20.6 points (1975-80, 1983-84)... Was four-time All-Star (1977, '78, '79, '80) and three-time All-NBA First Team selection as a Sun... Phoenix's top scorer each season played... Suns jersey, 44, retired April 15, 1989.
