The Warriors fell 97-75 in their first summer league outing to the San Antonio Spurs on Monday, July 12th at the Pyramid in Long Beach. Golden State got off to a sluggish start and finished the 1st quarter trailing 20-12 on 30.8% (4-13 FG) shooting from the field. The first quarter was slowed with a combined 21 foul calls, which set the tone for the game. Injuries plagued the Warriors in the first quarter with three players, two starters, leave the game in the opening quarter. Second year forward Mickael Pietrus tweaked his left shoulder two minutes from the outset, point guard Brandin Knight sprained his left ankle shortly after and guard Matt Carroll was hit hard on a drive to the basket in the second quarter. All three players sat out the rest of the contest. "It was hard to see what we have, when your players go down early," said summer league Head Coach Keith Smart. "We played well in spurts and Andris (Biedrins) was solid on both ends. He played well tonight." Golden State trailed 40-32 at intermission, but where unable to close the gap in the second half as San Antonio increased their lead to 22 points late in the third quarter. Both teams finished with a combined 70 personal fouls (35 each) including 32 trips to the line respectively. "I started off slow because I had to adjust to the foul calling, but I felt good about my performance," said rookie forward Biedrins "things got easier in the second half." The Warriors were led by Marlon Parmer with 18 points, three rebounds and a team-high five assists. The Warriors 2004 first round draft selection Biedrins finished one rebound shy of a double-double, with 12 points (5-8 FG, 2-5 FT) and a team-high nine rebounds, while adding two assists in 27 minutes. David Jackson led all scores with 19 points for San Antonio, while three other players scored in double figures. The Spurs out rebounded the Warriors 46 to 36.

GOLDEN STATE WARRIORS 91, NBA STARTS 87

JULY 13, 2004 AT THE PYRAMID IN LONG BEACH, CA



Golden State won its first game of the 2004 Southern California Summer Pro League, in a 91-87 decision to NBA Stars. After leading for most of the contest, the Warriors fell behind late in the fourth quarter but were able to regain the lead in the final minute. Both teams got out running early as the Warriors led most of the way behind Matt Carroll's 10 first quarter points but were down by one point (25-24) after the first quarter. Golden State jumped out to an early 13 point lead in the second period, but the NBA starts cut it to within four points with less than four minutes remaining in the half. Golden State closed the quarter strong and took a 51-42 lead into the half. The same scenario held true through out the third quarter, as the Warriors shoot 72.7% (8-11 FG) from the field to take a 72-60 point lead into the last quarter. The NBA Stars led by David West's team-high 19 points and nine rebounds helped cut the Warriors lead to two points (77-75) with just under six and a half minutes left. The Stars took their first lead (83-81) since late in the first quarter with 4:55 remaining in the contest. Marlon Parmer tied the contest twice with in the last two minutes of regulation, once at 83 on a driving lay up and again at 87 with a pair of free throw. The NBA Stars missed on a baseline jumper, which set up the Warriors game winning possession. Tony Bland hit a deep two pointer with the shot clock expiring with 18.2 seconds left to give Golden State the lead and the ensuing victory, after J.R. Smith's three-pointer missed left. "We recovered well tonight after losing some players from last night's game," said summer league head coach Keith Smart "We played well as a group tonight and executed late in the fourth quarter. Both Carroll and (Andris) Biedrins were solid and (Marlon) Parmer played well down the stretch." The Warriors outshot the NBA Stars 49.3% to 42.5% from the field, and outrebounded 50-40. The rebounding disparity allowed Golden State to rack up 18 second-chance points, compared to just 6 for the Stars. Matt Carroll registered a game-high 20 points, seven rebounds and two assists, while Golden State's first round draft pick Biedrins displayed another solid effort finishing with his first double-double, 17 points and game-high's in both rebounds (12) and steals (six) in a team-high 42 minutes. "I felt good physically through out the entire game and just tried to learn from my mistakes from last night's game," said Biedrins "I wanted to stay out of foul trouble and made a conscious effort to hit the boards for second chance points. There were five Warriors who scored in double-figures. Mickael Pietrus didn't practice or play in tonight's contest after suffering a sprained left shoulder in the opening minutes of last night's loss to the San Antonio Spurs. He will be evaluated in the Bay Area tomorrow.

In their third game of the 2004 Southern California Summer Pro League, the Golden State Warriors defeated the Los Angeles Lakers in a come from behind 83-81 victory. The Lakers led almost the entire way, holding a sizeable lead for most of the contest. Andris Biedrins continued his solid play, dropping his second straight double-double with a team-high 19 points and 13 rebounds, including two assists, one steal and two blocks in 42 minutes of action. Marlon Parmer was solid again for Golden State registering 16 points, nine points in the first quarter and adding five rebounds, three assists and two steals. The Warriors fell behind early in the first quarter on 27.8% (5/18) shooting from the field. Which allowed the L.A. Lakers to take an early six point lead after the opening period. The Lakers pushed their lead to 13 points in the second quarter, but Golden State rallied to cut the lead to eight (41-33) in the last minute before the break. The Warriors were unable to cut into the Lakers lead as Los Angeles push it back to 13 points (68-55) after three quarters. Golden State started the fourth quarter on a 10-0 run to cut the lead to three (65-68) with just under nine minutes remaining. The game went back and fourth with the Lakers lead growing to as much as eight points with at the five minute mark. With 3:21 remaining, Biedrins cut the lead to five points (77-72) on a three point play baseline dunk. Golden State's defense allowed only four points in the remaining four minutes of action. The Warriors knotted the contest at 81 a piece with only 36.2 seconds left, on Ousmane Cisse's lone blocked shot which turned into a fast break lay-up for Tony Bland, who finished with a baker's dozen. The Lakers Sasha Vujacic, was unable to add to his game-high 20 points as his three point attempt missed the mark on the ensuing possession. Brandin Knight missed a runner in the lane but Cisse converted both free throws after being held going for the rebound, giving the Warriors a 83-81 lead. "Our players continued to stay poised when we got down early," said summer league head coach Keith Smart "They continued to execute and came up big on the defense end in the fourth quarter." The Lakers last possession with only 4.2 seconds was foiled as Biedrins stole the inbound pass to preserve the victory. The Golden State Warriors dropped to 2-2 in summer league play after losing to the New York Knicks 89-86. The Warriors were never in the game from the start, but staged a furious comeback only to come up short. The Knicks jumped out to a quick 14-4 lead providing them the cushion they would need for the entire game. The Warriors entered the fourth quarter down 75-56, but outscored New York 30-14 to make a game out of it. Golden State was plagued by sloppy play and turnovers throughout the contest providing the Knicks with 26 turnovers and 19 second chance points. "Following that start our guys could have easily thrown in the towel," said summer league Head Coach Keith Smart. "I'm really proud of the way they hung in there and battled the whole game." ## SUMMER LEAGUE – GAME #5

**GOLDEN STATE WARRIORS 74, MEMPHIS GRIZZLIES 80**

The Warriors fell to 2-3 in summer league play after losing to the Memphis Grizzlies 80-74 in Long Beach at the Summer Pro League. In a typical summer league display, both teams struggled to maintain their set offenses for much of the game. The two teams combined for 56 turnovers and 18 assists with Golden State handing over 35 of those freebies, while totaling 11 assists. "Both teams struggled offensively today," said summer league head coach Keith Smart. "I think playing our fifth game in seven days is starting to show a little in our guys." The Warriors placed only two players in double figures with Tony Bland leading the way with 14 points, including a perfect 10-for-10 from the line. Matt Carroll returned to the lineup after missing the past two games with a concussion and chipped in 11 points in a starting nod. Rookie Andris Biedrins added nine point and nine rebounds. Golden State held a 35-33 advantage heading to the locker rooms at halftime, but were outscored 21-13 in the 3rd and never held the lead again. Memphis knotted the game at 39 apiece with 7:59 left in the 3rd quarter and went on a 9-2 run to close out the quarter. The Warriors shot 40.3% (25-62 FG) from the floor and held the Grizzlies to 37.8% (28-74 FG), but it was the turnovers and a 27 to 15 points off of turnovers ratio that proved to be the difference in the contest. Memphis was able to convert 18 second chance points, while Golden State managed just seven. Andre Emmett led the way with a game-high 22 points to lead Memphis and Ryan Humphrey added 17 points to go along with his 10 rebounds.
