• Brook Lopez is the only player in the NBA to average at least 18.0 points, 9.0 rebounds and 1.98 blocks. He is the only Net to start in all 50 games while averaging 19.0 points, 9.0 rebounds and 1.96 blocks in 37 minutes.

• Brook Lopez is ranked **second** in free throw shooting among qualified centers in the NBA, firing .821 (252-307) from the charity stripe... He shot .831 (74-89) from the line for the month of January.

• Lopez is ranked **third** among all NBA centers in scoring at 19.0 ppg. He also has 16 (20 point, 10 rebound) double-doubles which is **second** among NBA centers and tied for **fourth** overall.

• Lopez tallied his 21st double-double (t15^h in NBA) with 26 points and 13 rebounds at PHX on 1/20... With the 23 point, 10 rebound performance on 12/16, **Lopez recorded six consecutive double-doubles making him the 13th player this season to record at least six in a row...** After tallying his ninth double-double with 31 and 14 vs. CHA on 12/4, he reached three career 30-and-10 games which ties him with Sam Bowie for the most by a Nets center... Lopez is also **tied for sixth** in the NBA in blocks at 1.96 per game and **second** in scoring among sophomores at 19.0.

• CDR is ranked 11th among all sophomores in scoring at 12.2 ppg while holding the **largest scoring increase** among second year players. His scoring has jumped from 4.9 ppg last season to 12.2 this year. CDR is also **11th** among sophomores in minutes at 31.1.

• Terrence Williams and Omri Casspi are **tied for second** among all rookies with four double-doubles... DeJuan Blair and Taj Gibson lead with five. Williams' most recent double-double came at MIL on 11/18 when he tallied a career-high 20 points on 8-of-15 shooting, 10 rebounds and a career-high four steals in 33 minutes. Tyreke Evans, Tyler Hansbrough and Jonas Jerebko are the next closest with three... T. Will is **9th** in total rebounds among rookies with 178 as well as being **9th** in rebounds per game at 3.8.

The Nets are riding a six-game losing streak and things got worse on Saturday night as two starters, Devin Harris and Jarvis Hayes, collided in the fourth quarter of New Jersey's latest loss. Harris has a sprained left shoulder and Hayes was diagnosed with a bruised lower left leg. The Pistons hit their first seven three pointers, shot 61 percent in the first half, and led most of the night, but an 11-2 Nets run tied the game early in the fourth quarter. The Nets took a brief lead a few minutes later, but went dry down the stretch and Detroit came away with a seven-point win. Detroit shot 52 percent for the game and was led by rookie Jonas Jerebko, who went 9-9 and tallied 20 points. Harris led the Nets with 21 points—including a trio of three pointers and seven assists. Brook Lopez added 20 points, and Kris Humphries finished with 14 points and nine boards on his 25th birthday.

The Nets got off to a great start on Friday night, shooting a high percentage and giving the Celtics a run for their money. New Jersey led by four at the half, 55-51, after shooting 19-of-30 .633 throughout the first 24 minutes. The Nets only scored 18 points in the third quarter but carried a one point lead heading into the final period of play. Eddie House and Ray Allen sparked a 14-4 run in the fourth that secured the nine-point victory for Boston. House was pivotal in the final 12 minutes scoring all 10 of his points in the fourth quarter. Brook Lopez led the Nets with 19 points and six rebounds while Devin Harris tallied 17 including 0-5 from downtown. The Nets are now 1-25 on the road and have lost 16 of their last 17 games.

After losing their 12th straight road contest, the Nets are now 1-24 on the road for the season. New Jersey was strong throughout the first three quarters but Toronto took control in the final 12 minutes. The Nets quickly went down 11 points, but the second unit turned the game around with an 18-3 run that spanned the first and second quarters. It was tight until the end of the third, when some poor execution by the Nets allowed the Raptors to go on a 12-1 run. The Nets couldn't get enough stops after that to make it interesting. Toronto shot 47 percent from the field, 10-16 from 3-point range and got to the line 29 times. The Nets had six guys in double-figures, with Kris Humphries tallying 13 points and 11 rebounds for his first double-double with the team. Devin Harris and Yi Jianlian recorded 15 points apiece.

New Jersey dropped their fourth straight game losing 89-99 in Cleveland on Tuesday night. The Nets held the Cavs under 100 points after giving up 130 to Atlanta last Sunday. The Cavs led from start to finish and by as many as 15 midway through the second quarter, but the Nets hung around and trailed by just two with four minutes to go in the third. The Cavs then went on a 7-0 run and the Nets could never cut the lead to less than seven after that. Brook Lopez tallied 20 points and nine rebounds in the first half and finished with 22 and 15. Devin Harris scored 22 points in 37 minutes before being ejected in the fourth quarter for a flagrant 2 foul on Jamario Moon. Rafer Alston added 20 points off the bench and the Nets shot just 39 percent from the field.

Despite career-nights from CDR and Terrence Williams, the Nets dropped the second half of their back to back and fell to 0-12 on the season. As is the theme this season, New Jersey kept things close in the first half scoring 48 points and carried a seven point lead after 24 minutes of play. It was the start of the third quarter that spelled disaster for the Nets. The Bucks scored the first 15 points of the third, and the Nets went from a seven-point halftime lead to an eight-point deficit, and were never able to recover after that. They trailed by nine after three and a 10-1 Milwaukee run early in the fourth put the game away. After scoring 41 points in the first half, the Bucks scored 58 after the break, shooting 48 percent from the field for the game. CDR and Terrence Williams each recorded double-doubles with CDR recording a career-high 31 points and 10 boards while the rookie netted a career-high 20 points and 10 rebounds for his team-leading fourth double-double.

NETS NOTES

ENERGY BOOST: Kris Humphries tallied a career-high 25 points on a career-high 10-of-14 field goals and eight rebounds in 30 minutes vs. LAC on 1/27. He is averaging 11.8 points and 7.2 rebounds in 11 games with the Nets after averaging 5.2 points and 3.8 rebounds in 25 games with Dallas. In his first three games with New Jersey, Humphries averaged 15.0 points and 7.7 rebounds in 14 minutes off the bench. He holds career averages of 4.5 points and 3.2 rebounds in 321 games. The former first round pick recorded 21 points at LAC on 1/18 where he shot 9-of-14 from the field and grabbed seven rebounds in 28 minutes. In his previous game, he recorded 15 points on 5-of-7 field goals and eight rebounds vs. IND on 1/15.

STEPPING UP: Chris Douglas-Roberts has taken full advantage of his increased role this season. The second-year swingman has now started in 35 games, averaging 32 minutes per contest after playing 13 minutes per game in a reserve role in his rookie season. CDR holds the largest scoring increase from last season to this season when ranked among second year players (minimum 41 games played in 2008-09 and 20 in 2009-10). His teammate Brook Lopez is second in scoring increase among sophomores.

TRADE WIN(D)S: After acquiring Kris Humphries and Shawne Williams in exchange for Eduardo Najera on 1/11/10 and Chris Quinn in exchange for a 2010 second round draft pick on 1/5/10, *the Nets have now made two in-season trades which marks the third time New Jersey has made multiple in-season trades since 2000.* The first set of in-season trades came during the 2004-05 campaign when on 12/17/2004 the Nets traded Alonzo Mourning, Aaron Williams, Eric Williams and two first round draft picks to Toronto for Vince Carter. Later that season on 2/14/2005 the Nets traded two second round draft picks to Golden State for Clifford Robinson. The second set of in-season trades came during the 2007-08 campaign when on 10/29/2007 the Nets acquired David Wesley from New Orleans in exchange for Bernard Robinson, Mile Ilic and cash considerations. New Jersey also made a move on 2/4/2008 acquiring Stromile Swift from Memphis in exchange for Jason Collins and cash considerations. The final move of the 2007-08 season came on 2/19/2008 with the eight player deal including Devin Harris and Jason Kidd. **New Jersey's first trade this season, acquiring Chris Quinn, marked the first time in franchise history that the Nets have completed a trade with Miami... Miami was the only team in the NBA who New Jersey had never made a trade with.**

COMMUNITY RELATIONS

The New Jersey Nets players, coaching staff and organization are committed to various community relations initiatives throughout the year. Community initiatives include, the Nets Student Rewards program which rewards over 80,000 students for their school achievement, Nets Athlete Assist Program, Season of Giving, Passport to Fitness, Black History Month, Read to Achieve and the Nets Basketball Academy which was created to foster relationships between youth athletics, schools, and community centers to establish a greater awareness of Nets Basketball while promoting teamwork, sportsmanship, good health, and a greater understanding of the game of basketball. The Nets also support the community through the Nets Foundation which is dedicated to positively impacting the lives of youth in the metropolitan area through educational programs, athletic programs and outreach initiatives.

INTERIM HEAD COACH KIKI VANDEWEGHE

- Kiki Vandeweghe was named interim head coach of the Nets on December 1, 2009.
- Vandeweghe has held a front office position in the NBA since 1999. He worked as director of player development in Dallas for the 1999-00 and 2000-01 seasons before becoming the general manager of the Denver Nuggets from 2001-2006.
- Vandeweghe was brought to the Nets by Rod Thorn in 2007 as an assistant and was promoted to general manager on May 8, 2008.
- He has been a featured instructor at Pete Newell's Big Man camp for more than 20 years and has run numerous skills camps of his own. In addition, he has previously worked with some of Europe's brightest up-and-coming stars at the Reebok Euro Big Man Camp in Italy.
- Vandeweghe began his 13-year playing career with Denver in 1980. Originally selected with the 11th overall pick of the 1980 NBA Draft by Dallas, he was acquired on Dec. 3, 1980 and played the following four seasons for the Nuggets. A two-time All-Star while with Denver, Vandeweghe continued his playing career in Portland for four and a half seasons, followed by three and a half seasons in New York, before concluding his career with the L.A. Clippers in 1993. Over his 13-year NBA career, Vandeweghe's teams qualified for the postseason in 12 seasons. In 810 games, Vandeweghe posted NBA averages of 19.7 points on 52.5 percent shooting, 3.4 rebounds and 2.1 assists per game.

KIKI VANDEWEGHE'S NBA COACHING RECORD
