The Nuggets turned it over eight times in the second quarter, leading to seven Houston points, making up for the Rockets' 8-25 FG (32%) effort in the period ... Both teams frequented the charity stripe in the third as Houston was 7-10 (70%) and Denver 7-12 (58%) FT in the quarter ... Houston was a perfect 4-4 3FG in the fourth (and made their final seven overall) as the Rockets shot 10-19 FG (53%) in the final period to pull away ... CONNECTIONS

Nuggets forward **Al Harrington** was originally drafted by Indiana (25th overall in 1998 NBA Draft) and went on to play seven seasons with the Pacers in two stints (1998-2004; 2006-07), averaging 10.7 ppg and 5.4 rpg in 390 appearances ... Pacers guard **Dahntay Jones** spent the 2008-09 season with the Nuggets, averaging 5.4 ppg and 2.1 rpg in 79 games (71 starts) ... Nuggets guard **Ty Lawson** and Pacers forward **Tyler Hansbrough** won the 2009 NCAA Championship as teammates at the University of North Carolina ... Nuggets guard **Arron Afflalo** was a teammate of Pacers guard **Darren Collison** at UCLA, where the two of them helped lead the Bruins to back-to-back NCAA Final Fours in 2006 and 2007 ... Pacers F **Lou Amundson**, who attended Monarch High School in Louisville, CO, and Nuggets assistant coach **John Welch** both attended UNLV.

SERIES NOTES

Denver has gone 11-3 overall in the regular season against Indiana since 2004-05 ... The Nuggets have won five of the last seven meetings with the Pacers in Indianapolis, claiming four-straight at Indiana from 2004-08 ... Before this recent six-year stretch of going 5-2 in Indiana, Denver had lost 15 of 16 on the road against the Pacers from 1988-2004 ... The Nuggets swept the season series with the Pacers (2-0) in 2009-10 and have done so in four of the last seven years ... The Pacers had one of the all-time great quarters the last time Denver played in Indiana on 11/9/10: The Pacers scored 54 points in the third quarter, going 20-21 (.952 FG) from the field, 8-9 (.889 3FG) from three and connecting on each of their first 20 shots in the quarter (only miss was a three-point attempt that rimmed out at the buzzer) ... Indiana is one of two current NBA franchises to have never had a player score 40+ points against Denver (New Orleans the other) ... The Pacers and Nuggets are two of four original ABA franchises still in existence today (New Jersey and San Antonio the others).

STATISTICAL NUGGETS

TEAM

- The Nuggets have currently lost five straight home games and five straight overall. It is the first time losing five consecutive home games since 2/6/03 – 3/2/03 and their first five-game losing streak since 12/29/06 – 1/6/07. It is just the third time losing three+ at home under George Karl.
- Denver dished out 28 assists in the loss vs. GSW on 2/9, their 11th game this year with 25+ assists (8-3 in those games).
- The Nuggets were outshot (.519 to .435) in the loss vs. GSW on 2/9, the ninth time they have been outshot by an opponent this year (2-7 in those games).
- The Nuggets were outrebounded (41-39) in the game vs. GSW, the 13th time this year their opponent has won the rebounding battle (3-10 in those games).
- Denver registered 21 fast break points in the loss vs. GSW on 2/9, and are now 9-6 this season when posting 20+ points on the break. They were 13-3 in 2010-11 when accomplishing this.
- Denver scored 95 points in the loss vs. DAL on 2/8. It was the 12th time they have been held under 100 points this season, going 4-8 in those games. Additionally, they have now been held under 100 points in three straight home games for the first time since 4/3/10 – 4/10/10.
- The Mavericks outscored the Nuggets 38-36 in the paint on 2/6. Denver is now 1-5 on the year when scoring fewer points in the paint than their opponents.
- The Nuggets had six players score 10+ in the loss vs. DAL on 2/8. It was their 10th time accomplishing this, going 7-3 in those games.
- The Nuggets outshot (.436 to .432) and outrebounded (47-40) the Rockets in their loss on 2/6. **The Nuggets are 8-1 on the year and were 28-1 in 2010-11 when outrebounding and outshooting the opposition in the same game.** Additionally, they are now 5-1 this year and were 21-1 last season at the Pepsi Center when simply outrebounding their opponents.
- The Nuggets committed 20 turnovers in the loss vs. HOU on 2/6, their fourth game this season turning the ball over 20+ times. Surprisingly, they are 2-2 when doing so.
- The Nuggets completed their second set of two back-to-back-to-back sets at POR on 2/4, going 1-2 in the three straight games. Their first set resulted in a 2-1 record, giving them a combined 3-3 record in their two back-to-back-to-backs of the year.
- The Nuggets scored 112 points in the win over LAC on 2/2. They are now 8-1 on the year when scoring 110+ and are 67-2 since the start of the 2008-09 season when scoring 110-or-more points at home. Additionally, **The Nuggets are 82-5 (.943) since the 1997-98 season when scoring 120+ in the regular season.**
- The Nuggets connected on 12 three-pointers in the win at LAC on 2/2. It was the sixth time this year they've hit 10+ threes and they are 6-0 in those games.
- Denver held the Clippers to 91 points on 2/2, the 11th time they have held an opponent under the century mark. They are 9-2 when accomplishing this.
- With the win vs. TOR on 1/27, Denver is now 8-0 against Eastern Conference opponents this year (4-0 at home). Last season Denver went 20-10 against Eastern Conference foes, including 14-1 at home. **Over the past four-plus seasons, Denver is 55-9 (.859) in home games against Eastern Conference teams** – the best record in the NBA in inter-conference home games over this stretch.
- Denver attempted 32 free throws in the win vs. TOR on 1/27. It was the ninth time this year they've attempted 30-or-more free throws (7-2 in those games).
- The Nuggets win over TOR on 1/27 represented their first wire-to-wire victory of the season. They had nine wire-to-wire wins in 2010-11.
- By winning on 1/17 at MIL, 1/18 at PHI, 1/20 at WAS, 1/21 at NY and 1/25 at SAC, the Nuggets completed their first sweep of a 5-game road trip in team history and won four road games in five nights for the first time in franchise history.
- Denver registered 92 points in the paint in the win at SAC on 1/25, setting a new all-time NBA-high for points in the paint since the stat began being tracked in 2000-01. They have scored 50-plus in the paint 12 times this year and are 9-3 in those games.
- Denver had all five starters score in double-figures for the second consecutive game at SAC on 1/25 (also did at NY on 1/21). They are now 2-0 on the year when this happens and were 5-0 in 2010-11 when accomplishing this.
- Denver's 119-114 double OT win at New York on 1/21 was their second OT game of the year (2-0) and their first double OT win since 4/6/08 at Seattle (151-147).
- The Nuggets had four players (Gallinari, Harrington, Nene, Miller) register double-doubles in the win at New York on 1/21. It was the first time they've had four players post double-doubles in the same game since 12/26/06 vs. Boston.

INDIVIDUAL

- **Arron Afflalo** scored a season-high 26 points vs. GSW on 2/9. It was the second most points scored in his career (31 vs. PHO on 1/11/11) and the third time in his career scoring 25+.
- **Arron Afflalo** went 8-of-8 from the free throw line in the win at LAC on 2/2. His eight makes ties his career-high (has had eight on two other occasions).
- **Arron Afflalo** connected on five three-pointers in the loss vs. GSW on 2/9, his third game of the year with 3+ threes and the 35th time doing so in his career (fourth time with 5+).
- **Chris Andersen** registered 12 points and nine rebounds off the bench vs. LA Lakers on 1/1, his 76th career game with 10+ points. It was his 50th game doing so as a Nugget, with Denver going 37-13 in those games.
- **Chris Andersen** blocked a season-high four shots vs. Utah on 1/15. The Nuggets went 5-0 in 2010-11 when the Birdmann registered three-or-more blocks in a game.
- **Corey Brewer** posted 14 points off the bench at POR on 2/4. It was his sixth game with 10+ this season (one with 20+). In the 11 games in which he has played 15+ minutes, he is averaging 10.7 points, 3.1 rebounds and 1.09 steals.
- **Corey Brewer** came off the bench to lead the Nuggets with 22 points in the win over MIL on 1/17. It was his 18th career 20+ point game.
- **Rudy Fernandez** posted a season-high 23 points on 9-11 FG shooting and 5-7 3FG shooting vs. TOR on 1/27. It was the eighth 20-point game of his career and the sixth time he has hit five-or-more threes.
- **Rudy Fernandez** had a solid all-around game with 15 points, eight assists, five rebounds and four steals vs. New Jersey on 1/11. It was the first time in his career he's posted 15+ points, 8+ assists and 5+ rebounds in the same game.
- **Danilo Gallinari** went 18-of-20 from the line at NY on 1/21, with both his makes and attempts being career-highs. He also went 12-of-12 from the free throw line vs. Utah on 1/15. It was the fourth time in his career that he has been perfect at the line with at least 12 attempts. He has attempted 10+ free throws nine times in his 31 games played as a Nugget.
- **Danilo Gallinari** scored 20 points at POR on 2/4, two weeks after posting a career-high 37 points to go with 11 rebounds at NY on 1/21. He has now scored 20+ 11 times this year (30+ twice). He now has 49 career 20-point games (14 as a Nugget) and six with 30+.
- **Danilo Gallinari** posted 37 points and 11 rebounds in the win at NY on 1/21. It was his first career 30/10 game, his fourth 20/10 game and ninth double-double.
- **Al Harrington** posted 12 points and a season-high 15 rebounds vs. HOU on 2/6. It was the seventh time in his career he has had 15+ boards and was his 98th career double-double.
- **Al Harrington** scored 17 points (6-10 FG) off the bench in the loss vs. DAL on 2/8. He has scored 15+ points 14 times this year (20+ five times) and led Denver in scoring on six occasions.
- **Al Harrington** posted 23 points and 10 rebounds in the loss at MEM on 1/31. It was his 33rd career 20-point/10-rebound game and his 97th career double-double (his fifth with the Nuggets).
- **Al Harrington** drained five three-pointers in the win over the Wizards on 1/20. It was a new season-high for made threes, and was the 31st time in his career he has hit 5+.
- **Kosta Koufos** blocked three shots vs. DAL on 2/8. It was his second straight game with three blocks and the sixth of his career.
- **Kosta Koufos** recorded 16 points and 12 rebounds at POR on 2/4. Kosta has played 17+ minutes 32 times in his career, averaging 9.0 ppg, 6.4 rpg and 1.22 bpg when doing so.
- **Kosta Koufos's** 16 points and career-high 12 rebounds in the loss at POR on 2/4 was his second career double-double (first came on 1/4/12 vs. SAC), his 13th game with 10+ points and his fifth double-digit rebounding game.
- **Ty Lawson** registered 11 points and 10 assists in the loss vs. GSW on 2/9. It was his eighth career double-double (5-3) and 10th career game with 10+ assists (7-3).
- **Ty Lawson** posted 21 points to go with a career-high nine rebounds and six assists in the win at Washington on 1/20. It was his 21st career 20-point game, with Denver going 14-7 in those games. His previous high in rebounds was seven (three times).
- **Ty Lawson** tallied 20 points and 10 assists in the loss at San Antonio on 1/7. It was his third career 20-pt/10-ast game (2-1).
- **Ty Lawson** dropped in 24 points on 9-11 FG (.818) vs. Miami on 1/13. It was the second time in his career he has posted 20+ points while shooting above 80% from the field (other time came on 11/4/09 at New Jersey). He now has 20 career 20-point games, with Denver going 13-7 in those games.

- The Nuggets trailed by at least 10 points in each of their wins on 1/18 at PHI, 1/20 at WAS and 1/21 at NY. It was the first time trailing by double-digits in three straight games and coming back to win each one since 4/6/07 - 4/9/07 (trailed by 12,15,15).
- The Nuggets collected 12 steals at New York on 1/21, the eighth time this season they have recorded 10+ steals in a game (6-2).
- Denver made 32 field goals at Milwaukee on 1/17, with 84.4% of them coming off an assists (27). It was the second time in the last four games that the Nuggets have assisted on 84%-or-more of the made field goals (also did vs. the Nets on 1/11, with 37 assists on 44 field goals). Prior to these two games, the last time Denver assisted on 84%-or-more of their field goals came on 11/1/08 vs. L.A. Lakers (88.2%).
- Denver dished out an NBA season-high 37 assists in the win vs. New Jersey on 1/11, their most assists in a game since they had 37 on 3/28/09 vs. Golden State. It was the second time this season they have recorded 30+ assists (2-0). They were 9-0 in 2010-11 when accomplishing this.
- Denver held the Hornets to 88 points in their win on 1/6, the fifth straight game keeping their opponent under 100 points (5-1) and the third straight game holding an opponent under 90. **It was the first time since 2/10/09-2/18/09 they have held teams to under 90 in three straight and first since 1/6/07-1/19/07 they have kept opponents under 100 points in five straight.**
- The Nuggets had 12 players score at least six points in the victory over SAC on 1/4. **It was just the second time in franchise history this has been accomplished (only other time was 3/22/05 vs. Washington).**
- The Nuggets recorded 16 steals in the loss at Portland on 12/29. **They registered at least 15 steals in each of their first three contests, and it is the first time since joining the NBA in 1976-77 that they have had 15+ steals in three consecutive games.**
- Denver won 115-93 at Dallas in their season opener on 12/26. **The 22-point victory was the largest road opening win in franchise history, including the ABA years** (previous best was a 14-point win at Golden State on 10/25/85).
- **Ty Lawson** recorded a career-high eight steals at Portland on 12/29. His previous high was six vs. Memphis on 2/22/11. The eight steals falls just two shy of Fat Lever's all-time Nuggets record of 10 (vs. Indiana, 3/9/85).
- **Timofey Mozgov** blocked two shots at LAC on 2/2. It was the 12th time in his career rejecting multiple shots (five games this season with three-or-more blocks). He is averaging 1.80 blocks in his past six games.
- **Timofey Mozgov** had his best game of the year vs. MIA on 1/13, posting a season-high 12 points to go with eight boards and three blocks in 24 minutes. It was the second time in his career he has had 12+ points and 8+ boards (last was 1.20.11 vs. Detroit). Additionally, it was the fifth time in his career he has blocked 3+ shots.
- **Andre Miller** is averaging 6.7 assist this season (13th in NBA) and has dished out 10+ eight times. He recently moved into 4th place on the Nuggets all-time assists list, passing Nick Van Exel (2,047) on 1/18 at PHI and Dan Issel (2,005) on 1/6 at SAS.
- **Andre Miller** registered 16 points and 10 assists vs. LAC on 1/29. It was his fourth straight double-double and he has dished out 10+ assists six times in his last 10 games. It was his first stretch of four straight double-doubles since he had seven in a row from 2/5/02-2/21/02. It was his 135th career double-double and his 71st game with 10+ assists as a Denver Nugget (238th time in career).
- **Andre Miller** posted 28 points and dished out 10 assists at Philadelphia on 1/18. It marks his 51st career 20-pt/10-ast game. He has scored 20+ twice this season.
- **Nene** recorded 16 points and 10 rebounds vs. DAL on 2/6. It was the 93rd double-double of his career and his fifth of the season (4-1).
- **Nene** posted 20 points and 10 rebounds vs. TOR on 1/27. It was his 22nd career 20-point/10-rebound game and was his fourth double-double of the year.
- **Nene** poured in 25 points in efficient fashion (10-13 FG, .769) vs. Utah on 12/28. It was his 13th career 25+ point game, and the eighth time in his career he has scored 25+ on 75%-or-better shooting (Denver is 6-2 in those games).

NUGGETS NOTES

HE IS IRON MAN

Nuggets guard Andre Miller played in his 1,000th career NBA game on 2/2 at L.A. Clippers. He became one of just 101 players in NBA history to accomplish this. What makes this feat even more incredible is the fact that he has only missed four games his entire career (three to injury, one to suspension).

Miller is tied for second all-time when it comes to fewest games missed by the time a player plays in his 1,000th game. Laker A.C. Green only missed three games when he reached his 1,000th and Dre is tied with John Stockton, Karl Malone and Bill Laimbeer who also missed four. Gary Payton (missed five) and Elvin Hayes (missed six) round out the list.

SOLID START

Denver has gotten off to a good start this season at 15-12. In fact, their start through 22 games (15-7) rivaled their best starts in Nuggets' franchise history (NBA only). The Nuggets had accomplished this on only four other occasions: 16-6 in 2009-10, 15-7 in 2008-09, 1984-85 and 1976-77.

Additionally, the Nuggets 8-4 road record start through 12 games tied their best road start in franchise history (also were 8-4 in 2008-09 and did it twice in the ABA: 1974-75 and '75-76). Denver also recently came off a five-game road trip in which they swept the trip (5-0), something that had never been done in team history.

GET BUCKETS

The Nuggets have been getting excellent production from their bench all season long, but one reserve in particular has stood out this season: Al "Buckets" Harrington. Harrington has been the leader coming off the bench, scoring 15+ points 14 times (20+ five times) and averaging 14.9 points, 5.9 rebounds, 1.3 assists and 1.07 steals per game.

Even more impressive than his early season averages is the fact that Big Al ranks 31st in the NBA in field goal percentage at .490 (154-314 FG) and 5th in the NBA in two-point field goal percentage at .589 (112-190 2FG). Furthermore, his 14.9 points is 3rd in the NBA among all players who have come off the bench in 20+ games this season.

Big Al recently went off for a season-high 29 points (10-16 FG, 5-8 3FG) and seven rebounds off the bench in a win over Washington on 1/20. It was his 31st career game with five-plus threes and it was the first time he's had those numbers since he posted 37 points and seven boards on Feb. 2, 2010 at Washington. **In fact, Harrington has been lights out when playing in the Nation's capital, shooting .667 (16-24 3FG) from deep in his last three and .490 (25-51 3FG) from long range in 17 career games at Washington.** Just one night later Al chipped in with 24 points and 11 rebounds in the double OT win at New York on 1/21.

STRONG ACROSS THE BOARD

The Nuggets registered an all-time NBA-high (since the stat was tracked in 2000-01) 92 points in the paint, 26 fast break points and 25 points off turnovers in the win at Sacramento on 1/25. They have dominated these areas each game so far and are near the top of the league in each category: **1st in Points in Paint (50.9 per game), 1st in Fast Break Points (21.0 per game) and 4th in Points off Turnovers (19.0 per game).**

STRUGGLING FROM LONG RANGE

The Nuggets started the season a little rusty in terms of shooting the three-ball, shooting .258 (41-159 3FG) from long range in their first eight games and making 10+ on one occasion.

The Nuggets got hot in the next eight games, shooting .457 (74-162 3FG), but have recently gone a little cold again. In their past five games, Denver has gone 31-117 (.265) from the three-point line. Denver is now shooting .332 (187-564 3FG) from three on the season.

SHARING THE ROCK

George Karl has preached to his team that sharing the ball and playing unselfish is one of the most important aspects of winning basketball. His team has been paying attention and it has been paying off.

The Nuggets currently lead the NBA in assists per game at 23.6. They have dished out 25+ assists on 11 occasions this season (30+ twice), and are 8-3 in those games. Their 37 assists vs. New Jersey on 1/11 is an NBA season-high.

Additionally, the Nuggets are also near the tops in the league in terms of assists per made field goals. **They currently rank 2nd in the NBA with 62.4% of their field goals coming off an assist, trailing only the Boston Celtics at 65.3%.** The Nuggets have had two extremely impressive games in this category, assisting on 84.4% (27 assists to 32 field goals) at Milwaukee on 1/17 and assisting on 84.1% (37 assists to 44 field goals) vs. New Jersey on 1/11.

THE ROOSTER ATTACKS

Before suffering a sprained left ankle on 2/3 vs. LAL, Danilo Gallinari, had been on fire of late, scoring 20+ in six of his last 10 games and averaging 18.8 ppg, 5.7 rpg, and 2.4 apg during the stretch. He shot the ball well, going .444 (56-126 FG) from the field, .318 (14-44 3FG) from deep and .899 (62-69 FT) from the charity stripe in his past 10 games.

Il Gallo, "The Rooster", is in the midst of a career year, averaging career-highs in points (17.0), rebounds (5.2), assists (2.6), steals (1.20), field goal percentage (.444) and minutes (32.9). Gallo has scored 20+ points 11 times this season, including a career-high 37 points (18-20 FT) to go with 11 rebounds at New York on 1/21.

MILLER TIME

Andre Miller exploded for 28 points, 10 assists, eight rebounds and two steals in 39 minutes off the bench in an overtime win at Philadelphia on 1/18. It was the 993rd game of Andre Miller's career, and just the fifth time he has posted 28+ points, 10+ assists and 8+ rebounds in the same game. The last time he posted those numbers came on November 14, 2006 as a member of the Nuggets at Miami (29 points, 10 assists, eight rebounds). The four other times he accomplished this feat he did so as a starter.

In fact, his performance was so rare that he became just the second player in Nuggets team history to post those numbers when coming off the bench. The only other player to do so was Alex English on December 18, 1983 vs. New Jersey when he posted 31 points, 10 assists and eight rebounds as a reserve.

TEAM OF NATIONS

With the re-signing of free agent big man Nene and the trade that brought Rudy Fernandez to Denver this December, the Nuggets now have five international players on their roster -- the second most of any team in the NBA (Toronto).

The list of overseas players on the Denver Nuggets include: Danilo Gallinari (Italy), Rudy Fernandez (Spain), Timofey Mozgov (Russia), Chukwudiebere Maduabum (Nigeria) and Nene (Brazil).

Denver received Chu Chu Maduabum immediately after he was selected in the second round of the 2011 NBA Draft by the L.A. Lakers in exchange for a future second round pick. The Nuggets will hold his rights and he will play for the Bakersfield Jam of the NBA D-League.

Additionally, this list doesn't include center Kosta Koufos who is of Greek decent but was born in Ohio.

A HOMECOURT HAVEN

Nuggets coach George Karl says it again and again to his team: WE MUST WIN OUR HOME GAMES. **With one of the best homecourt advantages in the entire NBA, the Nuggets own the second best home record in the NBA since the start of the 2007-08 season** (see chart at right). Under Karl's watch, Denver has gone an impressive 208-72 (.748) at the Pepsi Center.

Denver wrapped up the 2010-11 season with a 33-8 record at home, which was the second-best home record in the Western Conference and their fourth straight season with at least 30 wins at home. The Nuggets rattled off streaks of 10 straight home wins on two separate occasions (from 2/10-3/30 and from 11/5-12/14), representing their third and fourth home winning streaks of at least 10 consecutive games since George Karl took over the helm midseason in 2004-05.

The best opportunity for the Nuggets to pick up home wins is when their opponents are on the second leg of a back-to-back. Playing in Denver the night after a game has proven rough on teams in the past, with the famed Mile High elevation and the fact that Denver International Airport is a mere 24.6 miles away from the *nearest* team hotel. Denver is 3-1 at home in 2011-12 when facing a team in the second game of a back-to-back set. Fifteen of the Nuggets 41 home games in 2010-11 came against teams on a back-to-back set, with Denver having gone 14-1 in those games. In 2009-10, the Nuggets went 15-3 (.833) at the Pepsi Center against opponents playing under those circumstances.

A MODEL OF CONSISTENCY

Over the last five seasons, the Nuggets have been tough to beat...especially tough to beat in consecutive games. With the Lakers' four-game losing streak in 2010-11, Denver was the only team in the NBA to have not suffered a losing streak of 4+ games since the 2006-07 season until their current five-game skid. Since 2/26/07 to be exact, the Nuggets played 392 regular season games without losing four in a row until dropping five straight from 2/3 - 2/9. During this stretch, Denver had dropped three straight games - on 13 separate occasions - but never four straight. As a comparison, the Nuggets had registered 23 winning streaks of 4+ games during this 392-game stretch, including three streaks of eight wins in a row.

Suffering consecutive defeats has also been rare for the Nuggets at the Pepsi Center in recent years. Since the start of the 2007-08 season, only three times has Denver dropped back-to-back home games - most recently against Golden State, Dallas, Houston, L.A. Clippers and L.A. Lakers in 2011-12 (1/27 - 2/9, 5 straight). Their recent five-game home losing streak is their first since 2/6/03 - 3/2/03. No team in the league had gone a longer period of time without losing four in a row at home during that stretch.

The other instances of consecutive losses at home since 2007-08 are Dallas and Philadelphia in 2009-10 (12/27-1/3) and Utah and Houston in 2010-11 (2/4-2/7). That's a total of 178 regular season home games with only three sets of two-or-more losses among them.

Individual teams haven't had much luck beating the Nuggets in consecutive games lately either. The longest active losing streaks for the Nuggets against a single NBA opponent is three games against Portland and Houston (Oklahoma City is second with two straight losses).

HEAD COACH GEORGE KARL

Record with Denver: 343-216 (8th season)

Overall Record: 1051-715 (23rd season)

NBA coaching legend George Karl, who signed a contract extension with Denver on March 8, 2011, was introduced as the 19th head coach in Nuggets history on Jan. 27, 2005 and has since overseen one of the most successful eras in team history. In just five-plus seasons, Karl's 343 wins are already the second-most by a coach in Denver's NBA history, while his .614 winning percentage is unmatched. His run of seven-straight postseason appearances is the second-longest in Nuggets history to Doug Moe's nine-consecutive (1982-90). Denver joins Dallas and San Antonio as the only NBA teams to have made eight-straight playoff appearances.

The seventh-winningest coach in NBA annals, Karl has amassed 1,051 career wins in his 23-plus seasons in the NBA, including a streak of 19-straight non-losing seasons – tied for second all-time with Pat Riley (19, 1981-82 to 2001-02) and trailing only Phil Jackson (21, 1989-90-present) in NBA history. In fact, of the six other men to have won 1,000+ career games, only three: Jackson, Riley and Jerry Sloan have a better winning percentage. He has also notched 75 career playoff victories, good for 12th all-time. He has earned 10 Coach of the Month honors, which is tied for the fourth-most in NBA history.

The 2009-10 season was one of highs and lows for Karl. He helped lead Denver to an overall record of 53-29, earning the Nuggets their second-straight Northwest Division title and their third-straight 50-win campaign. In the process, Karl became the first coach in the team's NBA history to post consecutive 50-win seasons. He also recorded his 18th straight non-losing season, third only to Riley (19, 1981-02) and Jackson (19, 1989-present) in NBA history. He also earned NBA Coach of the Month honors for the month of January and was the head coach of the Western Conference at the 2010 NBA All-Star Game in Dallas.

Unfortunately, Karl's 2009-10 season was cut short because of throat and neck cancer. He made the diagnosis public two days after the All-Star Game but coached the Nuggets for three weeks while going through radiation and chemotherapy treatment. Karl did not return to the bench after a March 16 victory over Washington, and Denver went 7-7 in its final 14 regular-season games and lost to the Utah Jazz in six games during the first round of the playoffs.

Karl has had great success ever since taking the helm of the Nuggets back in 2005. In his first season in Denver, 2004-05, Karl engineered one of the greatest turnarounds in NBA history. When assuming head coaching duties in January, the Nuggets were 17-25 and stood in 11th place in the Western Conference – a full six games out of the playoffs. Karl led the Nuggets to a 32-8 (.800) record and a seventh seed in the postseason, while that winning percentage remains the best in NBA history for a midseason coaching replacement that coached at least 20 games. He was named Western Conference Coach of the Month for February and March and finished fifth in voting for NBA Coach of the Year during the 2004-05 season. In 2005-06, Karl guided an injury-riddled Nuggets team to 44 wins and a Northwest Division title – the club's first division crown since 1987-88. He became the fifth coach in NBA history to lead at least three different teams to division titles (also Milwaukee and Seattle). In 2006-07, Karl led the Nuggets to a 45-37 mark, including a franchise-record 22 road wins. The Nuggets finished with the sixth-best record in the Western Conference - their highest finish since 1988-89 (sixth). In 2007-08, Karl led the Nuggets to the third-highest win total in team history with 50 wins. During the 2008-09 season, Karl guided the Nuggets to arguably the best season in team history. With an overall record of 54-28, Denver claimed the Northwest Division title and tied the team record for most wins in a season. In the 2009 NBA Playoffs, Karl coached the No. 2 seeded Nuggets to their first Western Conference Finals appearance since the 1984-85 season before falling to the eventual NBA Champion Los Angeles Lakers in six games.

Prior to joining the Nuggets, Karl served as head coach for the Milwaukee Bucks (1998-03), the Seattle SuperSonics (1991-98), the Golden State Warriors (1986-88) and the Cleveland Cavaliers (1984-86). During his coaching career, Karl's players have made 27 All-Star appearances, earned 16 All-NBA recognitions, made 11 All-Defensive teams and have won two Defensive Player of the Year awards.

KARL JOINS NBA'S PRESTIGIOUS "1000 CLUB"

With the 123-116 win at Toronto on 12/10, Nuggets head coach George Karl earned his 1,000th career regular season win. With an overall coaching record of 1051-715, Karl is only the seventh coach in NBA history to win 1,000 career games. In 22-plus NBA seasons, he currently ranks seventh on the all-time NBA wins list, while his .596 career winning percentage ranks as the fourth-best among his fellow 1,000-game winners. With the resignations of both Larry Brown (Charlotte) and Jerry Sloan (Utah) earlier this season, Karl now stands as the second-winningest head coach still active in the NBA today, trailing only the Lakers' Phil Jackson.

Compared to the first six members of the 1000 Club, Karl required the fourth fewest total games to reach 1,000 wins. Additionally, he also became the third youngest coach in NBA history to win his 1,000th career game. The lists below were compiled with the help of the Elias Sports Bureau.
