Greg Monroe had 27 points and six rebounds, but the Pistons fell to the Wizards, 98-77, at The Palace of Auburn Hills (2/12) to snap their season-high four-game win streak...Detroit fell behind early, going down 8-0 to start the game and trailed 24-18 at the end of the first quarter...The Pistons battled back to tie the game 45-45 at halftime...In the third quarter, Washington went on a 13-2 run behind John Wall, who scored all nine of his points with three minutes remaining in the third, to go up 74-63...Washington continued to build their lead in the fourth, opening with a 13-4 run (91-67), putting the game out of reach for Detroit...**Rodney Stuckey** had 11 points and **Tayshaun Prince** added 10 points and six rebounds for Detroit...The Pistons shot a season-low 32.6% (29-89 FG) and shot just 9.1% (1-11 3PT)...The Wizards had 22 fast-break points and shot 46.8% from the field...JaVale McGee and Nick Young each had 22 points for the Wizards.

Jonas Jerebko scored 20 points off the bench as the Detroit Pistons beat the New Jersey Nets, 109-92, winning their fourth consecutive game for the first time since December, 2009, at The Palace of Auburn Hills (2/10)...Detroit trailed 0-7 to start the game but answered with a 12-0 run with 9:33 remaining in the first quarter and went up 24-15 at the end of the first...The Pistons continued to build on their lead with a 16-5 run with 5:25 remaining, holding the Nets to an opponent season-low 33 points in the first half, 52-33...In the third quarter, Detroit went on a 8-1 run to go up by 30 (78-48) with 3:32 left in the quarter...Detroit scored a season-high 109 points on a season-high 43 field goals...The Pistons shot a season-high 54.4% (43-79) from the field, outrebounded the Nets 47-31 and outscored New Jersey in the paint, 56-32...**Greg Monroe** recorded his 15th double-double with 18 points and 11 rebounds and **Rodney Stuckey** had 19 points and five assists...Johan Petro led the Nets with 16 points and five rebounds.

Greg Monroe recorded his 14th double-double with 20 points and 12 rebounds as the Detroit Pistons beat the New Jersey Nets for their third consecutive win, 99-92, at the Prudential Center (2/8)...With the score knotted 20-20 after the first quarter, Detroit used a 11-2 run with 6:12 remaining in the second quarter to go up 42-30 and ended the quarter up 51-39...The Pistons built their lead up to 18 (57-39) early in the third, but the Nets battled back to cut the lead to seven (74-67) at the end of the third quarter...The Nets continued their comeback cutting the lead to just one (78-77) with 8:28 left in the fourth...Detroit answered with a 9-2 run with 4:27 remaining in the fourth to go up by 10 (95-85) and sealed the victory...**Ben Gordon** returned after missing the last 10 games with a sore left shoulder to score 14 points off the bench and **Brandon Knight** scored 13 points in his first game after breaking his nose vs. New Orleans (2/4)...**Jonas Jerebko** added 16 points and seven rebounds off the bench and **Tayshaun Prince** had 15 points and tied his season-high five assists...Detroit shot a season-high 53.4% (39-73 FG) from the field and also dished out a season-high 29 assists...The Pistons also outscored the Nets 50-24 in the paint...Deron Williams led New Jersey with 34 points and seven assists.

The Detroit Pistons dropped the first game of a three-game trip against Western Conference opponents following a 111-104 loss to the San Antonio Spurs at the AT&T Center on 3/9...The Spurs made their first 14 shots finishing with a season-high 40 points in the first quarter taking a 14-point (40-26) advantage into the second...The Pistons would fall down 19 (67-48) just before halftime, but they cut the lead to six (79-73) late in the third quarter following a 6-0 run...The Spurs would bump it back to 15 (88-73) with a 9-0 run...The Pistons cut the lead to five points (102-97) with 2:27 to play when **Tracy McGrady** found a cutting **Greg Monroe** for the layup, but Manu Ginobili found Tony Parker on the right wing for a wide-open 3-pointer...Parker then made a layup to put the Spurs up 10 with 1:08 left...San Antonio shot 80% the first half and finished shooting 65% for the game...The Pistons pulled down a season-high 20 offensive rebounds fueling 31 second-chance points...**Richard Hamilton** led the Pistons with 20 points off the bench...**Monroe** recorded his 13th double-double with 16 points and 10 rebounds...**McGrady** was re-inserted into the starting line-up finishing with 15 points and a team-high nine assists...**Tayshaun Prince** added 16 and **Ben Gordon** 12 points in the defeat...Tony Parker led San Antonio with 23 points and former Piston Antonio McDyess celebrated his 1,000th career game.

The Pistons fell to 0-3 on the season with a 85-96 loss to the Boston Celtics on 12/30 at TD Garden...Both teams came into the game winless and Paul Pierce, who missed Boston's first three games, returned to action to spark the Celtics to their first win of the season...**Greg Monroe** scored eight points in the first quarter to keep the Pistons within reach at 22-24 after the first quarter...Boston led by as many as 12 twice in the second quarter but Detroit trimmed the lead to 50-43 at halftime...The third quarter was the decisive one when the Celtics shot 71.4% (15-21) from the field and outscored the Pistons 36-21 to take a 86-64 lead into the final quarter...Detroit outscored Boston 21-10 in the fourth but were unable to cut its deficit to single digit...**Monroe** finished with game highs in points (22) and rebounds (9) and **Austin Daye** scored 11 points off the bench...**Jonas Jerebko**, **Brandon Knight** and **Tayshaun Prince** each added 10 points for the Pistons and **Rodney Stuckey** dished out a game-high seven assists...Jermaine O'Neal led the Celtics with 19 points.

MAX IMPACT: The Pistons have a 4-2 record since Jason Maxiell was inserted into the starting line-up on February 1 at New Jersey. His scoring, rebounding, minutes and field goal percentage numbers have all improved and the Pistons have gotten off to better starts. BEN WALLACE'S GREAT "BODY" OF WORK: Ben Wallace recorded his 10,000th career rebound at Orlando (11/30/10) becoming the 34th, and only undrafted*, player in NBA history to reach this plateau. Wallace also became the ninth player in NBA history to record 10,000 rebounds and 2,000 blocks. Only three active players (Tim Duncan, Kevin Garnett, Wallace) have recorded 10,000 rebounds and two (Duncan, Wallace) have recorded 10,000-plus rebounds and 2,000-plus blocks. Duncan (1997) was the first pick in the NBA Draft while Garnett (1995) was a fifth selection in his draft. Lawrence Frank was named the 28th coach in Detroit Pistons history on August 3, 2011. He joins the Pistons after spending last season as the lead assistant coach with the Boston Celtics. Under his defensive guidance, the Celtics led the NBA in fewest points allowed (91.1 ppg) and ranked third in opponent field goal percentage (.434). Offensively, the 2010-11 Celtics led the league in field goal percentage (.486) and finished tied for fourth in the NBA in assists per game (23.4).

Prior to his time in Boston, Frank served the better part of seven seasons as head coach of the New Jersey Nets (2003-04 to 2009-10). Overall, he amassed a regular season mark of 225-241 (.483) with New Jersey. He also led the Nets to four consecutive postseason appearances (2004-07) and holds an 18-20 (.474) record in the playoffs. Frank departed New Jersey as the franchise's all-time leader in NBA coaching victories.

Frank's career accolades include two Atlantic Division titles (2003-04 and 2005-06) and four NBA Eastern Conference Coach of the Month selections (Feb. 2004, Apr. 2005, Mar. 2006 and Apr. 2007). Under Frank's direction, New Jersey advanced to the Eastern Conference Semifinals in 2004, 2006 and 2007. His Nets teams also finished in the NBA's top-10 in scoring defense on three occasions (fourth in 2003-04 at 87.8 ppg, sixth in 2004-05 at 92.9 ppg and sixth in 2005-06 at 92.4 ppg) and ranked among the league-leaders in assists twice (second in 2003-04 at 2,009 and fourth in 2005-06 at 1,884).

He began his NBA head coaching career in record-setting style by going 13-0 (1/27/04-2/24/04), setting the NBA mark for the most consecutive wins by a head coach to begin a career. At that time, the 13-game winning streak set the longest run of any coach in any of the four major professional sports to begin a career. During this streak, the Nets captured six consecutive road games to give Frank the mark for most wins by a head coach on the road at the outset of a coaching career.

Frank became the all-time leader in NBA coaching victories for the Nets in 2006-07 and closed that season with a 7-2 mark, earning him NBA Eastern Conference Coach of the Month recognition for April 2007. During the 2005-06 campaign, the Nets tied a franchise record by winning 14 straight games (3/12/06-4/6/06). Frank was once again voted Coach of the Month for March 2006.

Officially appointed head coach on June 21, 2004, Frank's 2004-05 Nets squad finished the season winning 14 of its last 18 games to secure New Jersey's fourth consecutive playoff appearance. The team's season-ending performance included an 8-2 mark during the month of Apr. 2005, which garnered Frank his second career Eastern Conference Coach of the Month honor.

Frank was named interim head coach of New Jersey on Jan. 26, 2004. He went on to lead the Nets to an 11-2 record during the first full month of his coaching regime, earning him Eastern Conference Coach of the Month for Feb. 2004. The 11-2 (.846) mark also established a Nets franchise record for winning percentage in a month. Frank had spent three-and-a-half seasons as an assistant coach for the Nets before taking over for Byron Scott midway through the 2003-04 season.

Prior to joining New Jersey, Frank spent three seasons as an assistant coach for the Vancouver Grizzlies under current Pistons assistant coach Brian Hill. Before moving into the NBA, Frank served as an assistant coach at the University of Tennessee for three seasons under Kevin O'Neill, a former Pistons assistant. Frank first worked with O'Neill as a staff assistant at Marquette University in 1992, helping lead the Warriors to two NCAA Tournament berths and a Sweet 16 appearance in 1994.

Frank earned his bachelor's degree in education from Indiana University in 1992, where he spent four seasons as a student manager for the Hoosier basketball team led by Bob Knight. In addition, Frank holds a master's degree in education administration from Marquette University.

Born in New York, New York and raised in Teaneck, New Jersey, Frank and his wife, Susan, have two daughters, Dillon Grace and Caitlin Elizabeth.
