### Houston vs. Memphis

The Grizzlies outscored the Rockets, 31-16, in the third quarter and cruised to a 113-93 victory at Memphis (12/30/10). **Series Notes:** The Rockets are just 8-13 on the road since the Grizzlies relocation to Memphis ... Houston won 95-93 in OT last year vs. Memphis (2/5/11), extending Houston's home winning streak over the Grizzlies to 10 games ... Houston had 51 boards last year vs. Memphis (2/5/11) and limited the Grizzlies to 1-of-8 3-treys ... the Rockets hit 25-of-42 (.595) shots in a 67-point first half last year at Memphis (1/21/11), but went 13-of-41 (.317) in the second half ... the Grizzlies won 115-110 last season at Memphis (1/21/11), snapping a seven-game losing streak to Houston (last win: 104-93 on 2/4/09) ... the Grizzlies outscored the Rockets, 72-46, in the paint last year at Memphis (1/21/11) ... the Grizzlies made 49-of-92 (.533) shots last year at Memphis (1/21/11), but did not make a 3-pointer (0-4 3FG) ... Houston hit a 2010-11 season-best .595 (44-74 FG) from the field and .696 (16-23 3FG) from downtown in a 127-111 victory last year at Memphis (12/3/10) ... **Kevin Martin** has at least 28 points in 12 of his last 14 games against Memphis (dating back to Sacramento) ... **Martin** averaged 31.3 points and finished 41-of-41 from the line against the Grizzlies in 2010-11 ... **Kyle Lowry** posted 17 points, a career-high 18 assists (10 in first half) and five steals last year vs. Memphis (12/17/10) ... **Zach Randolph** had 29 points (14-25 FG) and 19 rebounds last season at Memphis (1/21/11) ... **Rudy Gay** (four steals) helped the Grizzlies set Houston's 2010-11 opponent season high with 13 steals at Houston (12/17/10).

Memphis hit 45-of-80 (.563) shots, but were held without a 3-pointer (0-5 3FG). **Kevin Martin** notched a team-high 21 points (7-11 FG, 4-4 FT), while **Kyle Lowry** totaled 15 points (5-9 FG), eight assists and four steals. Rookie **Chandler Parsons** had a team-high six rebounds. **Zach Randolph** led the Grizzlies with 23 points (11-14 FG) and nine boards. **Marc Gasol** added 20 points (6-8 FG, 8-9 FT), eight rebounds and five blocks. **Jeremy Pargo**, who got the start for **Mike Conley** (left ankle sprain), had 14 points (6-10 FG) and five assists. Overall, Memphis took the battle in the paint by a 56-36 (+20) margin and scored 20 points off 20 Houston turnovers.

## Next Opponent

### Houston vs. Oklahoma City

The Thunder made 42-of-80 (.525) from the field and scored 54 points in the paint in a 109-94 win over the Rockets at Oklahoma City (1/6/12). The Thunder overcame a 12-point, third-quarter deficit for a 98-95 win at Houston (1/7/12), handing the Rockets their first home loss of the season. **Series Notes:** Houston hit .933 (14-15 FT) from the free throw line vs. Oklahoma City (1/7/12) ... Oklahoma City hit 43-of-86 (.500) on 11/17/10, 41-of-71 (.577) on 12/15/10, 43-of-84 (.512) on 1/12/11 and 42-of-80 (.525) on 1/6/12, giving the Thunder four .500-plus shooting games in the last six meetings ... Houston's 118-112 defeat last year vs. Oklahoma City (1/12/11) snapped an 11-game home winning streak over the Thunder, marking the Oklahoma City franchise's first win in Houston since an 87-85 victory on Feb. 22, 2005 ... Houston's longest winning streak against any single opponent is 13 straight, including 13 in a row over the Oklahoma City franchise (1/3/07-12/19/09) ... **Goran Dragic** started at point guard at Oklahoma City (1/6/12), registering 10 points (4-10 FG) and a career-high-tying 11 assists with no turnovers ... **Luis Scola** finished with 31 points (13-24 FG, 5-8 FT) and 11 rebounds last year vs. Oklahoma City (1/12/11) ... the Thunder went .966 (28-29 FT) from the free throw line and .636 (7-11 3FG) from 3-point range last year at Oklahoma City (12/15/10) ... **Kevin Durant** missed a 20-foot jumper as time expired to give the Rockets a thrilling 99-98 win vs. Oklahoma City (11/28/10).

The Rockets, who enter this game having not relinquished the lead at home this season, saw that streak come to an end in the first quarter. **Luis Scola** posted a season-high 28 points (12-28 FG) and seven rebounds. **Goran Dragic** recorded his best point total as a member of the Rockets by netting 20 points (7-10 FG, 2-3 3FG) and a game-high eight assists. Center **Samuel Dalembert** and rookie forward **Chandler Parsons** made their first starts with the Rockets, as Parsons had a team-eight eight rebounds and three steals. **Kevin Durant** topped Oklahoma City in scoring with 27 points (10-25 FG), while **Russell Westbrook** finished with 25 points (10-20 FG) and a team-high six assists. **Nazr Mohammed** came off the bench with 17 points (6-10 FG) and six rebounds.

### Houston vs. Golden State

Houston was held to a season-low 31 field goals made (31-75 FG) in a 106-97 loss at Golden State (2/12/12). **Series Notes:** The Rockets hold a six-game home winning streak (last loss: 112-95 on 12/31/07) ... Houston had its nine-game winning streak over the Warriors (1/29/08-2/2/10) snapped in a 132-128 loss last season at Golden State (10/27/10) ... the Rockets had three players with at least a double-double in one game (3/23/11) and put all five starters in double-digit scoring three times last year against the Warriors (11/24/10, 12/20/10 and 3/23/11) ... Houston set 2010-11 season highs in points and assists (35) in a 131-112 win vs. Golden State (3/23/11) ... **Kevin Martin** has averaged 30.7 points (26-51 FG, 12-22 3FG, 28-29 FT) over the last three meetings with the Warriors (92 points: 12/20/10-2/12/12), including a 34-point game (12-21 FG, 4-7 3FG) last year vs. Golden State (3/23/11) ... **Kyle Lowry** had a 14-point, 10-assist outing last season vs. Golden State (11/24/10), as well as a 13-point, 12-assist game vs. the Warriors (3/23/11) ... **Luis Scola** owns four career 20-point, 10-rebound games against the Warriors ... **Dorell Wright** led the Warriors with 24 points (10-19 FG) at Houston (11/24/10) and 34 points (14-21 FG) against the Rockets (3/23/11) ... **Monta Ellis** had 46 points (18-24 FG, 9-12 FT) and 44 points (15-20 FG, 11-14 FT) in the two games last season at Golden State (10/27/10 and 12/20/10).

**Feb. 12, 2012 at ORACLE Arena** – Houston was held to a season-low 31 field goals made (31-75 FG) in a 106-97 loss, which came despite hitting 11-of-29 from downtown. The Rockets also made 24 of a season-high 33 free throw attempts. Houston actually hit 134-of-172 (.779) free throws in the four-game series last season. **Kevin Martin** led the Rockets with 28 points (7-16 FG, 5-11 3FG, 9-10 FT), while **Kyle Lowry** added 10 points (3-5 FT), nine assists and four steals. **Luis Scola** also had 14 points (8-8 FT) and a season-best 13 rebounds. **Monta Ellis** topped the Warriors with 33 points (13-23 FG) and seven assists. **David Lee** chipped in with 15 points (7-12 FG), 13 boards and six assists. **Klay Thompson** had a big night off the bench with 14 points (4-6 3FG), leading Golden State to a 13-of-24 outing from 3-point range. Overall, the Warriors have now reached .500 from the field in three straight games against the Rockets: .512 (43-84 FG) on 12/20/10, .511 (47-92 FG) on 3/23/11 and .506 (40-79 FG) on 2/12/12.

## Previous Game

### Houston vs. Phoenix

The Rockets racked up a 99-81 win vs. the Suns (2/3/12) and a 96-89 victory at Phoenix (2/9/12). The Rockets have won just one of the last eight season series (since 2003-04). **Series Notes:** Houston has won three straight games against Phoenix (3/14/11-2/9/12), a stretch which follows a seven-game Suns victory run (4/1/09-3/8/11), which tied for Phoenix's longest win streak in the history of this series (10/16/69-3/22/70) ... its stands as Houston's first three-game winning streak over Phoenix since a three-game run from 4/11/08-3/6/09 ... the Rockets have held the Suns to 93, 81 and 89 points in the last three meetings ... the Suns had scored 110 or more points in the eight prior games ... Houston has placed seven players in double-figure scoring in both meetings this season (2/3/12 and 2/9/12) ... both teams actually placed seven players in double-digit scoring last season vs. Phoenix (11/22/10) ... the Rockets went 17-of-17 from the free throw line and outrebounded the Suns (+10, 49-39) at Houston (2/3/12) ... Houston went just 4-of-6 from the stripe at Phoenix (2/9/12), but still took the battle of the boards (+13, 44-31) ... **Kyle Lowry**, who had a career-high six steals last season vs. Phoenix (11/22/10), had 32 points (11-18 FG) and a career-high seven treys (7-11 3FG) last year at Phoenix (3/8/11) ... **Jordan Hill** posted his first career double-double with 14 points (7-8 FG) and 10 boards last season vs. Phoenix (11/22/10) ... **Steve Nash** has twice dished 16 assists at Houston (11/17/09 and 1/31/10).

It was only the second time since the Rockets began calling Houston home that five bench players scored 10-plus points in a game. The Rockets also held the Suns to an opponent season-low 13 fourth-quarter points to help secure the victory. **Goran Dragic** posted an 11-point, 11-assist double-double to tie his career high in assists, while **Patrick Patterson** netted a season-high-tying 14 points (6-8 FG) to lead the bench. **Luis Scola** actually topped seven Rockets in double-digit scoring with 16 points (8-17 FG). All five Suns starters scored 10-plus points, led by **Channing Frye's** 21 points (8-17 FG, 4-9 3FG) and 10 boards. **Steve Nash** went a perfect 7-of-7 from the field for 14 points, adding a game-high 13 assists.

## Rockets Team Notes

- Houston has outrebounded its opponent by double digits in each of the last three games: 39-29 (+10) at Portland (2/8/12), 44-31 (+13) at Phoenix (2/9/12) and 47-35 at Golden State (2/12/12). It stands as Houston's longest such streak since a three-game run last season (12/17/10-12/20/10).
- All five Houston reserves to enter the game scored in double digits at Phoenix (2/9/12), leading the Rockets to a 96-89 win over the Suns. It was only the second time since the Rockets began calling Houston home in 1971-72 that five bench players scored 10-plus points in a game. The only other occurrence was back in a 149-111 victory vs. Philadelphia (2/16/93).

- The Houston reserves netted a season-high 66 bench points at Portland (2/8/12), topping a 61-point outing vs. New York (1/28/12). The Rockets also totaled 57 bench points at Phoenix (2/9/12). Overall, Houston is 5-0 this season when the Rockets reserves scored at least 50 combined points.
- The Rockets went on to a 96-89 victory at Phoenix (2/9/12) despite trailing 76-74 entering the fourth quarter. It marked Houston's first win this season when trailing after third quarters. The Rockets were 0-9 entering the game with the Suns.
- Houston has recorded 22 consecutive victories when holding an opponent under 90 points (last loss: 81-84 on 3/3/10 vs. Sacramento), which ranks as the third longest active streak in the NBA through Feb. 12: 27 by Oklahoma City, 26 by Chicago and 19 by Utah. The Rockets are 10-0 this season when keeping their opponent below 90 points after going 11-0 in such games in 2010-11.
- With a 99-91 loss at San Antonio (2/1/12), Houston moved to 3-3 in the Southwest Division in 2011-12. Last season, the Rockets finished 5-11 within the division, going 3-1 against the playoff-bound Memphis Grizzlies.
- The Rockets had seven players in double-figure scoring vs. the Suns (2/3/12) and again at Phoenix (2/9/12). Houston had seven players with 10 or more points in five games in 2010-11.
- Houston recorded its largest margin of victory this season with a 103-76 (+27) triumph vs. Washington (1/27/12). The Rockets, who had four 20-point victories in 2010-11, have won by 20-plus points twice this season: 105-85 (+20) vs. San Antonio (12/29/11).
- The Rockets hit 41-of-78 (.526) from the field at Portland (2/8/12). Houston, which was a perfect 13-0 last season when shooting .500 or better, has begun 3-0 in such games this season. The Rockets finished a season-best .557 (44-79 FG) from the floor vs. San Antonio (1/21/12).
- Kyle Lowry** still stands as the only player in the NBA this season who is currently averaging at least 14.5 points (14.5), 5.5 rebounds (5.6), 7.5 assists (7.7) and 1.75 steals (2.04). Lowry, who is second among all NBA guards in rebounds per game this season (Kobe Bryant 5.8), ranks eighth in the NBA in assist per game and sixth in steals through Feb. 12.
- Kyle Lowry** has handed out at least eight assists in 15 games this season (Rockets record: 9-6). He dished out at least eight dimes in 26 outings last season (Rockets record: 18-8).

- Kyle Lowry** matched his career high with 18 assists vs. Atlanta (12/31/11). He originally totaled a career-best 18 assists (10 in first half) last season vs. Memphis (12/17/10). Lowry's 18-assist game currently stands as the most distributed in a single game by an NBA player this season.
- Kevin Martin**, who ranks fifth in the NBA in free throw percentage through Feb. 12, is currently 100-of-111 (.901) from the free throw line this season. Martin tied for first in the NBA in free throws made (career-high 594) and was eighth in free throw percentage (career-high .888) in 2010-11.
- Luis Scola** (4,998) needs just two points to reach 5,000 for his career.
- Luis Scola** posted 14 points (8-8 FT) and a season-high 13 rebounds at Golden State (2/12/12). His 13 boards against the Warriors also helped him surpass **Rodney McCray** (2,718) into 10<sup>th</sup> on the Rockets all-time list for most career rebounds.
- Samuel Dalembert**, who stands eighth in the NBA in blocks per game (2.04) through Feb. 12, has finished seven of the last nine seasons ranked in the NBA's top-10 in blocked shots.
- Samuel Dalembert** posted multiple-blocks in seven consecutive outings (1/19/12-1/30/12). It stands as the longest such streak for the Rockets since an eight-game run of two or more blocks by **Yao Ming** back in 2008-09 (3/4/09-3/18/09).
- Chandler Parsons** led the Rockets with eight rebounds at Portland (2/8/12). Overall, Parsons ranks tied for fifth in rebounding average (4.7) among all NBA rookies and stands third in steals per game (1.26) through Feb. 12.
- Courtney Lee** has reached double-figure scoring in a season-best four consecutive games (2/6/12-2/12/12). He actually netted 16 points (6-9 FG) off a season-best 4-of-5 outing from beyond the arc at Portland (2/8/12).

### Golden State (2/12/12)

- The Rockets made 24 of a season-high 33 free throw attempts at Golden State (2/12/12). Houston actually hit 134-of-172 (.779) free throws in the four-game series last year with the Warriors, including a 2010-11 season-high 42-of-52 at Golden State (10/27/10). Oddly enough, the Rockets matched the second fewest attempts from the free throw line in team history with a 4-of-6 night in the prior game at Phoenix (2/9/12).
- Kevin Martin** dropped in 28 points (7-16 FG) at Golden State (2/12/12), which included hitting 5-of-11 from beyond the arc and 9-of-10 from the free throw line. It was his team-best 12<sup>th</sup> 20-point outing of the season. Martin has now averaged 30.7 points (26-51 FG, 12-22 3FG, 28-29 FT) over the last three meetings with the Warriors (92 points: 12/20/10-2/12/12).

### Phoenix (2/9/12)

- The Rockets bench has scored a total of 107 points (50 on 2/3/12 and 57 on 2/9/12) in the two games against the Suns this season.
- Goran Dragic** posted an 11-point, 11-assist double-double at Phoenix (2/9/12) to tie his career high in assists. He also had 11 dimes last year at Minnesota (4/13/11) and 11 assists earlier this season at Oklahoma City (1/6/12).
- Patrick Patterson** netted a season-high-tying 14 points (6-8 FG) at Phoenix (2/9/12). He originally set his season best with 14 points (7-12 FG) at Minnesota (2/4/12).

### Portland (2/8/12)

- The Rockets registered their first 60-point half of the season at Portland (2/8/12), notching 30 points in each the first and second quarters.



- **Chase Budinger** led Houston with a season-high 22 points (7-14 FG, 4-8 3FG, 4-4 FT) at Portland (2/8/12), marking his second 20-point game of the season. He also netted 21 points (8-14 FG, 4-6 3FG) vs. Washington (1/27/12).
- **Goran Dragic** matched his career high in steals with four (fifth time: last on 4/11/11 vs. Dallas) at Portland (2/8/12).

#### Denver (2/6/12)

- **Luis Scola** led the Rockets with 25 points (10-20 FG), eight rebounds and two steals at Denver (2/6/12). Scola, who now has seven 20-point outings this season, also picked up 24 points (10-18 FG), eight boards and two blocks at Minnesota (2/4/12).
- **Kyle Lowry** finished with 20 points (7-11 FG) at Denver (2/6/12), which included a season-best 5-of-6 performance from beyond the arc. It marked Lowry's seventh 20-point performance of the season. **Chase Budinger** also hit 4-of-7 treys to give the Rockets a season-high .526 (10-19 3FG) night from downtown.

#### 2011-12 Season Notes

Houston recorded a season-long, seven-game winning streak (1/13/12-1/23/12). The last time the Rockets captured seven straight games was the 22-game run back in 2007-08 (1/29/08-3/16/08). Below is a breakdown of Houston's seven victories in a row in 2011-12:

- The Rockets rang up double-digit leads in 13 consecutive games (1/7/12-1/28/12), which was Houston's longest run since a 20-game streak back in 2007-08 (2/2/08-3/16/08).
- Houston placed all five starters in double-figure scoring vs. Sacramento (1/13/12), which marked their first time to accomplish that since last season vs. Atlanta (4/3/11).
- The Rockets dropped 99-91 game at San Antonio (2/1/12), which moved Houston's record to 14-9 all-time when wearing their alternate uniforms featuring the "ketchup-and-mustard" color scheme (11-4 in 2009-10, 2-4 in 2010-11 and 1-1 in 2011-12).
- Houston notched season bests of five consecutive home victories (1/13/12-1/21/12) and three road wins in a row (2/6/12-2/9/12).
- Minnesota hit 15-of-24 (.625) from the field for a franchise-best 42 third-quarter points at Houston (1/30/12). It stands as the most points scored in any quarter by a Houston opponent this season (prev. best: 41 in 1<sup>st</sup> Q by Clippers at Los Angeles on 1/4/12).
- Houston won 90-88 in OT vs. New Orleans (1/19/12) despite tying the franchise record for fewest points in a quarter with seven in the fourth (7 in 4<sup>th</sup> on 11/15/91 at L.A. Lakers and 7 in 3<sup>rd</sup> on 12/29/02 vs. New Orleans). Oddly enough, the last time an NBA team won despite scoring seven or fewer points in the fourth quarter was a 101-92 win by the Hornets (6 pts. in 4<sup>th</sup>) vs. Seattle (4/4/07). The last time the Rockets scored fewer than 10 points in quarter was a nine-point fourth vs. San Antonio (11/14/06).
- The Rockets dropped a 108-99 at the L.A. Lakers (1/3/12). Houston has now lost its first game of the new calendar year in each of the past five seasons. The last win was a 103-96 decision over Seattle on Jan. 3, 2007.
- Houston took an 82-70 decision at Charlotte (1/10/12), snapping a five-game road losing streak to open the season. The last time the Rockets started out 0-5 on the road was 1982-83. Houston began that campaign 0-7 on the road before a 109-98 win at Indiana (11/19/82).

- The Rockets had no blocked shots in the two games in Los Angeles (1/3/12 at Lakers and 1/4/12 at Clippers). It marked the first time since 1997 that Houston went consecutive games without a blocked shot (12/25/97 and 12/27/97).
- Houston scored the first bucket of the night and went wire-to-wire for a 95-84 win vs. Atlanta (12/31/11). The Rockets also never gave up the lead in a 105-85 victory vs. San Antonio (12/29/11). The Rockets completed six outings last season where they did not trail in a game.
- Houston had three 20-point scorers vs. Sacramento (1/13/12): **Kyle Lowry** (25), **Samuel Dalembert** (21) and **Luis Scola** (21). It was the first time the Rockets had three players with 20-plus in the same game since last year at Minnesota (4/13/11): **Chase Budinger** (35), **Kevin Martin** (25) and **Courtney Lee** (22).
- Houston's opening night roster featured an average NBA experience level of less than three seasons (2.87 seasons). The list of fewest average years of experience by NBA teams to open this season is listed below:

#### Hot in Houston

With a 120-108 loss vs. Minnesota (1/30/12), Houston stands at 123-26 (.826) all-time in games when they hit the century mark at Toyota Center.

- Including this season, the Rockets have gone a remarkable 22-2 (.917) at home during the month of Dec. since 2008.
- The Rockets finished the 2010-11 home slate with a 25-16 record. Houston has now won at least 25 home games in six of its eight campaigns since moving into Toyota Center in 2003-04.
- In 2010-11, Houston captured eight in a row at Toyota Center (11/24/10-12/27/10). The Rockets have put together a home winning streak of at least eight games in each of the past four seasons. It stands as Houston's best run since accomplishing a similar feat from 1995-96 through 1998-99.

#### Board Busters

The Rockets, who rank fourth in the NBA in rebounds per game (43.9) through Feb. 12, pulled down 55 boards vs. Washington (1/27/12). Overall, Houston owns six 50-plus rebounding games this season (Rockets record: 5-1).

- Houston outrebounded the Warriors by +12 (47-35) at Golden State (2/12/12), marking the seventh time this season the Rockets have recorded a double-digit rebounding differential over their opponent: +13 (57-44) at Charlotte (1/10/12), +19 (55-36) vs. Sacramento (1/13/12), +11 (55-44) vs. Washington (1/27/12), +10 (49-39) vs. Phoenix (2/3/12), +10 (39-29) at Portland (2/8/12) and +13 (44-31) at Phoenix (2/9/12).
- The Rockets have lost the battle of the boards by double-digits three times this season: -15 (38-53) at L.A. Lakers (1/3/12), -11, 43-32 vs. San Antonio (1/21/12) and -11 (37-48) at Minnesota (2/4/12).
- **Jordan Hill** (12), **Kyle Lowry** (11) and **Samuel Dalembert** (10) each had 10-plus rebounds at Charlotte (1/10/12). It marked the first time three Rockets have reached double-figure rebounding totals in the same game since 2009-10 (David Andersen-11, Luis Scola-11 and Shane Battier-10 on 2/20/10 vs. Indiana).



## Red Rocking the Stripe

Houston ranks **fourth** in the NBA in free throw percentage (.786) through Feb. 12. The Rockets ranked fourth in the league in that category in 2010-11, shooting for the third highest percentage (.801) in team history.

- Houston went a **season-best 17-of-17 from the free throw line vs. Phoenix** (2/3/12), going perfect from the stripe for the first time since an 11-of-11 outing at Atlanta (1/15/11).
- The Rockets went **25-of-26 (.962) from the free throw line at Washington** (1/16/12), just missing the team record for most attempts without a miss (23-23 FT on 4/12/10).

## The Comebacks

The Spurs erased Houston's 19-point advantage en route to a 99-91 victory at San Antonio (2/1/12), which included an 18-point, third-quarter deficit. It **marked the fourth time this season Houston's opponent has returned from a double-figure deficit to defeat the Rockets**. Houston overcame a double-digit deficit to win 10 times in 2010-11. The following is a breakdown of the largest deficits overcome in a win and the biggest leads lost in a defeat in 2011-12:

## The K-Low Show

**Kyle Lowry** notched a season-high 33 points (13-26 FG, 3-5 3FG), nine assists and eight rebounds vs. Portland (1/14/12), which **marked his third career 30-point performance**. Lowry also had 22 points (8-19 FG, 3-6 3FG) at San Antonio (1/11/12) and 25 points (7-15 FG, 3-6 3FG, 8-8 FT) vs. Sacramento (1/13/12). It **stands as the first time in Lowry's career to string together three consecutive 20-point games**.

- Lowry** recorded 24 points (8-16 FG, 7-8 FT) and 11 assists at Minnesota (2/4/12). It **marked the eighth time in his career (second this season) to record at least 20 points and 10 assists in a game**. Lowry also had 20 points (9-10 FT) and 12 assists at Orlando (12/26/11).
- Lowry** posted his **second career triple-double** with 16 points (7-8 FT), 10 rebounds and 10 assists at Minnesota (1/23/12). He followed that with another 10 assists vs. Milwaukee (1/25/12). **Lowry has now dished out 10 or more assists in two consecutive games four times in his career** (3 in 2010-11 and 1 in 2011-12).
- Lowry** equaled his career high of 11 rebounds (11 on 3/20/11 vs. Utah) at Charlotte (1/10/12). Overall, **Lowry has a career-best three 10-plus rebounding games on the season**: 10 at L.A. Lakers (1/3/12), 11 at Charlotte (1/10/12) and 10 at Minnesota (1/23/12). **It ranks tied for the most in the NBA by a guard this season (three by Kobe Bryant and three by Tyreke Evans)**.

## Martin's Magic

**Kevin Martin** racked up 31 points (10-21 FG, 4-10 3FG, 7-8 FT) at Minnesota (1/23/12), **marking his second 30-point performance of 2011-12**. Martin also had a season-high 32 points (12-27 FG, 5-12 3FG) vs. New Orleans (1/19/12), **recording 27 points (10-14 FG, 5-8 3FG, 2-2 FT) over the opening two quarters**. It marked the most points in a half by a Rockets player since Martin netted 28 second-half points last year vs. Portland (1/5/11).

- Martin** notched **20-plus points in six consecutive games he played** (1/19/12-2/1/12), averaging 29.2 points (175 TP) on 63-of-127 (.496) shooting and going 26-of-57 (.456) from 3-point range over that timeframe.

With 13 boards at Golden State (2/12/12), **Luis Scola** surpassed **Rodney McCray** (2,718) into 10<sup>th</sup> on the Rockets all-time list for most career rebounds:

- Scola** posted 14 points (8-8 FT) and a season-high 13 rebounds at Golden State (2/12/12), **marking his second double-double of 2011-12**. He also recorded 21 points (9-23 FG), 11 rebounds and five assists vs. Sacramento (1/13/12).

## Big Sam I Am

**Samuel Dalembert** posted a season-high 21 points (9-11 FG), 16 rebounds (7 offensive) and four blocks vs. Sacramento (1/13/12). Overall, **Dalembert has registered a team-high nine double-digit rebounding games and four double-doubles on the season**.

- Dalembert**, who had 12 boards in the first half alone, recorded 13 points (5-6 FT), a season-high-tying 17 rebounds and two blocks vs. Milwaukee (1/25/12).
- Dalembert** had a season-high six blocked shots to go with 12 points (4-6 FG) vs. San Antonio (1/21/12). It was the **most blocks in a game by a Rockets player since Shane Battier had seven back in 2009-10 vs. Sacramento (3/3/10)**.



- **Dalembert** notched 15 points (7-14 FG) and 17 rebounds vs. New Orleans (1/19/12), including a season-high nine offensive boards. Dalembert actually registered 31 offensive rebounds over a five-game stretch (1/13/12-1/19/12), which led the NBA over that timeframe (next closest: 23 by Portland's LaMarcus Aldridge).

### Chandler Parsons Project

Rookie **Chandler Parsons** topped the Rockets in scoring with the first 20-point game of his career in an 82-70 win at Charlotte (1/10/12), finishing with 20 points (9-16 FG, 2-4 3FG) and seven rebounds.

- **Parsons** made his first start with the Rockets vs. Oklahoma City (1/7/12), notching a team-best eight rebounds and three steals.

### Rockets Reserves

The Houston reserves registered another big outing vs. New York (1/28/12), notching 61 bench points, 18 total rebounds and 10 combined assists. The Rockets bench also totaled 52 points, 34 boards and nine assists vs. Washington (1/27/12).

- **Chase Budinger** posted 12 points (5-5 FT) and a season-high 10 rebounds vs. Phoenix (2/3/12), giving his three career double-doubles.
- **Goran Dragic** topped the Rockets in assists for a third straight game with nine dimes off the bench vs. Minnesota (1/30/12). Dragic also registered 16 points (6-8 FG) and a team-high five assists vs. New York (1/28/12), as well as a game-high seven assists vs. Washington (1/27/12).
- **Goran Dragic** recorded his best point total as a member of the Rockets by scoring 20 points (7-10 FG, 2-3 3FG) in a start vs. Oklahoma City (1/7/12). He originally netted his most points with Houston by scoring 16 (6-9 FG, 4-5 3FG) off the bench at New Orleans (4/6/11).
- **Goran Dragic** started at point guard at Oklahoma City (1/6/12), registering 10 points (4-10 FG), a career-high-tying 11 assists and two steals with no turnovers. In his three starts last season with Houston, Dragic averaged 13.3 points, 10.3 rebounds, 8.3 assists and 1.67 steals.
- **Courtney Lee** netted a season-high 17 points (7-12 FG, 2-4 3FG) with three steals off the bench vs. New Orleans (1/19/12). Lee was actually the only Rockets reserve to score against the Hornets.
- **Jordan Hill** reached double-figure rebounding totals in three of four games, pulling down 10 rebounds at San Antonio (2/1/12). Hill, who notched 10 points (4-11 FG) and 10 rebounds vs. Washington (1/27/12), posted his second consecutive double-double with 14 points (6-7 FG) and 11 boards vs. New York (1/28/12). It marked his fourth double-double of 2011-12, which doubles the two he had over his first two seasons combined (2009-11).
- **Jordan Hill** posted 12 points (5-9 FG), 12 rebounds (7 offensive) and matched his career high of five blocked shots (5 on 3/19/10 vs. Boston) at Charlotte (1/10/12).
- **Jordan Hill** finished with 11 points (5-8 FG) and a career-high 15 boards vs. Atlanta (12/31/11). Hill, who scored a career-best 16 points (8-12 FG) last season at Atlanta (1/15/11), set his previous career high with a pair of 10-rebound games in 2010-11 (last: 1/17/11 vs. Milwaukee).
