OKLAHOMA CITY THUNDER NOTES

A Golden Summer: This past summer Kevin Durant and Russell Westbrook helped lead the USA Men's National Team to a gold medal during the 2010 FIBA World Championships played in Turkey. Durant, the tournament MVP, recorded a game-high 28 points during the United States' gold medal winning, 81-64 victory over host country Turkey. Durant also set the all-time USA single game scoring record by notching 38 points during the USA's semifinal match-up versus Lithuania. Russell Westbrook received player of the game honors during the US win over Lithuania and proved to be integral part of the United States perfect 9-0 mark at the World Championships. Westbrook appeared in all nine games and averaged 9.1 points, 2.8 rebounds and 2.6 assists per contest. OKC Thunder teammate, Nenad Krstic competed in the World Championships for his native country of Serbia. Krstic helped lead the Serbians to the semifinals and in six games, Krstic averaged 13.5 points and 7.5 rebounds per game.

Talking Turnarounds: The Thunder concluded the 2009-10 season by compiling 50 wins a year after posting 23 victories during the team's inaugural season in Oklahoma City. The 27 win improvement is the tied for the EIGHTH largest increase in NBA history. Additionally, the Thunder became just the eleventh team in the last 10 years to double their win total from one season to the next (Most recently: Miami Heat won 43 in 2008-09 after 15 wins in 2007-08). With their win over the Memphis Grizzlies in the team's regular season finale (4/14), Oklahoma City closed the season with a 26-11 record (.703) dating back to January 29th. The .703 winning percentage during this span was tied for 6th best in the NBA. During this 10 week long stretch, the Thunder averaged 105.8 points per game on better than 47.0% shooting.

Youngest Scoring Champ...EVER: With a game-high 31 points during the Thunder's regular season finale (4/14), Kevin Durant (30.1 ppg) locked-up the NBA's scoring title in just his third season removed from the university of Texas. By averaging 36.3 points during the final seven games of the season, KD moved past LeBron James (29.7 ppg) and in doing so he becomes the youngest scoring champion in NBA history (21 years and 197 days). The previous record was held by Max Zaslofsky of the Chicago Stags (22 years and 105 days) in 1947-48, when the scoring champion was determined by total points scored. Durant also becomes the first player in OKC franchise history to capture a regular season scoring title.

Rarified Air: Durant became just the 10th player in NBA history to start every game during the regular season while averaging 30 points or better. Only Michael Jordan (five times) and Wilt Chamberlain (four times) accomplished this feat more than once. Kobe Bryant was the last NBA player to play in every game while scoring at a 30.0 point per game clip (2002-03).

Starters in Tact: Last season, four Oklahoma City players started all 82 games for the Thunder (Durant, Green, Sefolsha and Westbrook). To highlight the rarity of such a feat, only four teams dating back to 1970 have maintained the same four starters in every game played during the regular season {Most Recent: The 2002-03 Golden State Warriors (Arenas, Dampier, Jamison and Richardson)}.

Youth Movement: The Thunder concluded the 2009-10 season as the youngest team in the NBA with an average age of 25 years and 42 days. Additionally, the OKC starting lineup of Durant, Green, Krstic, Sefolsha and Westbrook is the youngest in the league with an average age of 23 years and 346 days. For a matter of comparison, the age of the average NBA roster is 26 years and 329 days and the oldest team in the league entering the 2009-10 season was the San Antonio Spurs with an average age of 29 years and 73 days (as of opening night).

New and Improved: During his second NBA season, Thunder guard Russell Westbrook exhibited an improved all-around game. During his 82 appearances, Westbrook averaged 16.1 points, 8.0 assists and 4.9 rebounds in 34.3 minutes per game. Only a select number of NBA players have maintained such averages throughout the course of an entire season. Below is a list of those second-year players to average 16-plus points, 6-plus assists and 4-plus rebounds during their sophomore NBA seasons.

30 Never Looked so Good: By recording a game-high 30 points during the Thunder's season finale versus Memphis, Kevin Durant registered his 47th 30-plus scoring game of the season. The 47 games of 30+ points were the MOST in the NBA last year and an OKC franchise record. Most importantly, the Thunder went 31-16 when Durant scored 30+. Earlier in the year, Durant set an all-time franchise record by scoring 30+ points in SEVEN consecutive contests (12/22 - 1/2). During this two-week long run, Durant posted averages of 33.6 points on 56.8% shooting (84-148 FG's) including 45.8% shooting from behind the 3-point arc (11-24). LeBron James was the last NBA player to piece together a seven-game string of 30+ (Nov. 2007).

Feasting on the East: With their 109-104 victory over the Boston Celtics on 3/31, OKC concluded their schedule vs. Eastern Conference opponents by finishing with a 22-8 record. On the season, the Thunder “swept” EIGHT Eastern Conference opponents (Miami, Detroit, Washington, Atlanta, New York, New Jersey, Toronto and Philadelphia) while defeating 14-of-15 teams in the conference (0-2 vs. Cleveland). The 22 wins against “The East” are more than twice the Thunder road win total for all of last season. Last season, the Thunder failed to “sweep” a single Eastern Conference foe as OKC concluded the year with an 8-22 mark against “The East”.

Boards are the Barometer: The Thunder finished the regular season ranked 3rd in the NBA in rebounding. To dig a bit deeper, the Thunder outrebounded their opponent in 55 of 82 games. In those contests, OKC posted a 40-15 record. Meanwhile, the Thunder went just 10-17 when they failed to outrebound their opposition. During a three-game stretch to close-out calendar year 2009 (12/23 at PHX – 12/28 at NJ), OKC outrebounded their opponent by 10 or more in each of the three contests. It had been four years since the OKC franchise last outrebounded their opponent by 10+ in three consecutive games (12/23/05 – 12/29/05). On the season, the Thunder went 16-2 when outrebounding their opponent by 10 or more.

Making them Look Free: Kevin Durant finished the season ranked 6th in the NBA by shooting an even 90.0% from the charity stripe. Durant’s 756 free throw makes are an all-time OKC Thunder franchise record and the most in a single-season since Michael Jordan recorded 833 free throw makes during the 1986-87 season. With his five made free throws during the Thunder’s regular season finale, KD passed Rick Barry and moved into 6th place all-time for free throws made in a season. KD is the ONLY player in NBA history to convert 700+ free throws while shooting 90.0% or better. Durant’s 10.2 free throw attempts per game this past season led the NBA.

Road Warriors: With their victory over the Minnesota Timberwolves (2/21), the Thunder won five consecutive roads games for the first time since February of 2005. Last season, the Thunder pieced together three separate three-game road winning streaks. As a point of reference, the OKC franchise failed to win three straight road contests in each of the two seasons prior. Despite their loss to the Blazers at the Rose Garden (4/13), OKC finished the 2009-10 season with a 23-18 record away from the Ford Center. The 23 road wins exceeds the combined road win total for the past two seasons (15). The Thunder was one of ELEVEN teams in the NBA to boast a winning road record last season and only FIVE teams registered more road victories than OKC (BOS, CLE, ORL, DAL & POR).

Chart Topper: With his 36th point during OKC’s win over Minnesota on 4/4, KD passed Dale Ellis for the all-time single-season scoring title with his 2,254th point of the year. At the end of March, Durant reached the 2,000 point plateau with his three-point field goal at the 3:39 mark of the third quarter during the Thunder’s loss to the Indiana Pacers on 3/21. KD reached the 2,000 point threshold in just his 68th game of the season and in doing so he becomes one of only two NBA players to accomplish the feat at age 21 or younger. LeBron James reached the 2,000-point scored plateau in his 65th game during the 2005-06 season at the age of 21.

Russell Rules: After recording double-figure assist totals nine times during his rookie season (2008-09), Russell Westbrook tallied 28 double-figure assist games (24 double-doubles on the season) in 2009-10. During a two week span from 2/20-3/3, Westbrook recorded double-doubles in six of seven Thunder Contests. Included in that stretch, Westbrook registered his second career triple-double on 2/21 at Minnesota where he finished the night with 22 points to go along with 10 rebounds and 14 assists. Westbrook, finished the season tied for 7th in the NBA with 8.0 assists per game. Earlier in the season, Westbrook recorded double-figure assist totals in four straight contests (12/28 – 1/2). The last OKC franchise player to record such a feat was Gary Payton who handed-out 10-plus assists in four consecutive games during the 2001-02 season (1/3/02 – 1/10/02). Oklahoma City went 23-5 this past season when Westbrook recorded 10+ assists.

A Run for the Record-Books: In a streak that spanned 64 days, Kevin Durant became the ONLY active NBA player to score 25 or more points in 29 consecutive games. The streak which began 12/22 at LAL came to an end on 2/24 when Durant recorded a team-high 21 points in the Thunder’s loss to San Antonio. During the 29-game run, the Thunder posted a record of 20-9 as KD averaged 32.4 points on 50.8% shooting including 50.0% (51-102) from behind the three-point arc. Ray Allen held the previous franchise mark by recording 25-plus in ten straight games during the 2006-07 season. Michael Jordan was the last player to exceed KD’s streak when he recorded 25+ points in 40 straight games during the 1986-87 season.

Close, but... The Oklahoma City Thunder lost four games played between 1/13 – 1/23 (CLE, MEM, DAL and SA) by a combined FIVE points. The aggregate five point deficit is the smallest combined margin of defeat for four consecutive losses in franchise history. It has been more than a decade since another NBA team last experienced four straight losses by a total of just five points (Indiana Pacers; 3/30/99 – 4/10/99).

March Madness: The 11 wins by the Thunder in March of last year are the most wins in a month since the OKC franchise won 11 games in March of 2005.

Friendly February: With seven straight wins to open the month of February, the Oklahoma City Thunder extended their longest winning streak (nine games) since 2004. By defeating the Toronto Raptors 119-99 on 2/28, OKC finished the month of February with a 9-2 mark (.818). The 81.8% winning percentage is the highest in a given month (minimum 10 games) for the franchise since January 1997 (.846). The 9-2 record proved enough to win Thunder head coach Scott Brooks NBA Coach of the Month honors. In his first full-season as Thunder head-coach, Brooks wins the award for the first time in his career.

All Good Things Must Come to an End: With their loss to the Phoenix Suns on 2/23, the Thunder fell victim to a loss for the first time in nearly a month (1/27 vs. Chicago). The Thunder loss snapped a run of nine straight Oklahoma City victories. The nine consecutive wins is the longest streak for the OKC franchise since the team won nine games in a row after losing its season opener to begin the 2004-05 season (11/5/04 – 11/19/04). Additionally, the nine-game streak at the time was the longest win streak in the NBA at the time. During the nine game undefeated stretch, the Thunder shot 47.5% from the floor while outscoring the opposition by a 104.9 to 96.6 margin.

Worth Noting: During the Thunder's 113-107 victory over the Sacramento Kings on 3/2, Kevin Durant (39 points/10 rebounds) and Russell Westbrook (30 points/13 assists) finished with their 19th and 17th double-doubles of the year, respectively. This marks the first time in NBA history that two teammates, each age 21 or younger, each had a 30/10 game.

Century Mark: On December 2nd versus the Philadelphia 76ers, Thunder guard Russell Westbrook notched his 100th career game in memorable fashion. In 34 minutes played vs. Philly, Westbrook recorded a season-high 15 assists, marking the 14th time in his career in which he has reached double-figure assist totals. By posting 11 double-doubles (points and assists) through his first 100 career contests, Westbrook becomes one-of-twelve active players to have accomplished the feat. He joins the likes of Jason Kidd, Chris Paul, Allen Iverson and Deron Williams by posting 11-plus double-doubles comprised of points and assists through his first 100 career games played.

OKC is Fan Friendly: The Thunder began the 2009-10 season right where they left off... with another sellout. Those that made up the capacity crowd of 18,203 on opening night (10/28/09) in Oklahoma City were greeted with a new and improved arena. As part of a taxpayer funded initiative passed in March 2008, numerous arena improvements completed last summer. The team's arena now boasts a state-of-the art scoreboard, new terrace suites and a courtside club to go along with a new and improved Thunder locker room. Last season, the Thunder recorded 28 sellouts while drawing an average crowd of 18,004 representing 98.9% capacity. To close the season, OKC sold-out eleven straight contests and 17 of the last 20 games. During the Thunder's inaugural season in OKC (2008-09), the team recorded 18 sellouts (19,136) including eight consecutive to end the season. In 41 home games, the Thunder's average attendance topped the 18,700 mark, accounting for an average capacity of nearly 98.0%.

Efficient 45: In the Thunder's outing versus Golden State (1/31), Kevin Durant posted his 14th double-double of the year by recording a season-high 45 points to go along with 11 rebounds. By converting 16-of-21 field goals, KD becomes just the second player in franchise history to record 45+ points on better than 75.0% shooting (Spencer Haywood on 1/7/72; 48 pts on 21-28 FGs). Shaquille O'Neal was the last NBA player to accomplish such a feat {2/27/09 TOR @ PHX (48 pts on 21-28 FGs)}.

All-Star Recap: Kevin Durant made his inaugural NBA All-Star debut last season (2/14) at Cowboy Stadium in front of a record crowd of 108,713 on hand to witness a 141-139 Eastern Conference victory. Durant came off the "West" bench to see 20 minutes of action during which time he knocked-down half of his 14 shots en route to 15 points and five rebounds. On Saturday night (2/13), Durant captured his second H-O-R-S-E victory as he eliminated Boston's Rajon Rondo and Sacramento's Omri Casspi. Meanwhile, Thunder rookie James Harden and second-year guard Russell Westbrook competed in the T-Mobile Rookie-Sophomore Challenge and Youth Jam held at the American Airlines Center on Friday night (2/12). Westbrook led all scorers with 40 points on 18-29 shooting in 32 minutes of action. James Harden helped lead the rookies to victory as he posted 22 points (9-14 FGs) in just 23 minutes of action. Westbrook was also added as a last-minute replacement for Derrick Rose in the NBA Skills Competition.

Select Company: After becoming the league's youngest scoring champion, Kevin Durant is being mentioned amongst some elite NBA company. To the right is a list of other notable scoring totals for players age 21 or younger.

Perfection from the Stripe: During OKC's loss to the Sacramento Kings (11/10), Kevin Durant recorded a game-high 37 points in large part due to his efficiency from the charity stripe. Durant set a franchise record by converting 18 made free throws without a miss (also a NBA season-high). Setting all-time franchise records from the free throw line is not unfamiliar to Durant. Last season versus the Los Angeles Clippers (1/23/09), KD converted 24 made free throws (on 26 attempts) en route to a 46-point performance at STAPLES Center. Durant's 24 made free throws set a Thunder franchise record. In addition, Durant set a NBA season-high for most FT's made during the 2008-09 season. In doing so, Durant became one of only four players over the last 20 years to convert 24+ FT's in a single game (MR; LeBron James: 24-of-28 on 3/12/06).

Talking Turnovers: During OKC's game at Milwaukee (1/2), Thunder guard Russell Westbrook handed-out 13 assists without committing a single turnover. With ZERO turnovers against the Bucks, he recorded the most assists (13) without a turnover (in franchise history) since April 8, 2001 (Gary Payton; 15 assists, 0 TO's). Additionally, it is the most assists without a turnover in the NBA in nearly a year (Chris Paul 15 assists, zero turnovers; 1/6/09). With his zero-turnover performance in the Thunder's win vs. NY (1/11), Westbrook failed to commit a single turnover in six games this season (5-1 OKC record). As a team, the Oklahoma City Thunder committed 14 or fewer turnovers in EIGHT consecutive games to close 2009 (12/16 – 12/29). On the year, OKC is 33-14 when committing 15 or fewer turnovers.
