GAME HIGHLIGHTS:

- The Thunder jumped-out to a 26-point third quarter lead and held the Hornets to 36.3% shooting on the night as the Thunder claimed a tenth consecutive home victory. Oklahoma City is now tied with San Antonio for the best home record in the NBA (13-1).
- The Thunder took a 22-point halftime lead after shooting 55.8% (24-53 FGs) in the first half while holding the Hornets to just 38 points on 28.6% shooting through the first two periods. After trailing 42-68 at the 8:33 mark of the third quarter, New Orleans battled-back to pull within six points of the Thunder late in the fourth quarter after outscoring Oklahoma City 49-29 during a portion of the third quarter and most of the fourth quarter.
- Kevin Durant (31 points; 10-19 FGs) and Russell Westbrook (31 points; 10-20 FGs) each scored 30+ points for a second consecutive game. Dating back to last season Durant and Westbrook have each scored 30+ points on nine occasions (8-1 record).
- With six blocks shots, Kendrick Perkins came one block shy of matching his career-high. Perkins also matched a season-best with a game-high (tying) 13 rebounds.
- James Harden (left ankle sprain) and Nick Collision (left quad contusion) both missed their first games of the season for the Thunder.

GAME HIGHLIGHTS:

- In one of the most remarkable games in franchise history, the trio of Kevin Durant (51 points; 19-28 FGs), Russell Westbrook (40 points; 16-29 FGs) and Serge Ibaka (14 points, 15 rebounds and 11 blocks) became the first set of teammates in NBA history to record a 50-point effort, a 40-point effort and a triple-double.
- The Thunder forced overtime after trailing 84-93 with less than nine minutes remaining in the fourth quarter. OKC used a 20-11 spurt to tie the game at 104-104 with less than three minutes remaining. Durant sent the game to overtime after his basket with 4.4 seconds left in regulation once again tied the game. In OT, Westbrook and Durant propelled the Thunder to victory by scoring all 13 of the team's points.
- Durant and Westbrook set an all-time franchise record by recording a combined 91 points. The previous-high was 90 points (Dale Ellis and Xavier McDaniel on 11/9/89). Durant and Westbrook are the first set of teammates to score 50 and 40 points, respectively since Kiki Vandeweghe (51 points) and Alex English (47 points) accomplished the feat on 12/13/1983 vs. DET (3OT).
- Serge Ibaka set a franchise record with 11 blocked shots and he also became the first player in franchise history to record a triple-double, which included blocked shots.
- Durant's 51-point scoring effort is the 4th highest scoring output in franchise history (Fred Brown owns the all-time franchise record with 58 points on 3/23/74 at GS). With the win, OKC is now 2-0 in overtime games this season.

GAME HIGHLIGHTS:

- Playing in the first game of a five-game home stand leading up to the NBA All-Star break, the Thunder fell behind by as many as seven points early in the contest before outscoring the Warriors 38-24 in the second period to take a double digit lead into halftime. During the second quarter in which the Thunder scored a season-high (tying) 38 points, James Harden led the way for OKC after going a perfect 6-of-6 from the field en route to 15 points in the period.
- Oklahoma City maintained their double-digit lead throughout the entire second half. On a night in which the Thunder would lead by as many as 28 points, the Warriors trimmed the OKC lead to no less than 21 points in the fourth quarter.
- The Thunder held the Warriors to less than 90 points for the first time since 1/7/12 (GS had scored 90+ in 18 straight games previously). In the second half, the Thunder allowed Golden State to shoot just 30.0% from the field (12-40 FGs). On the season, the Thunder improved to 9-1 when holding the opposition to sub 40.0% shooting. Meanwhile, the Thunder remains a perfect 9-0 when shooting 50.0% or better themselves.

OKLAHOMA CITY THUNDER NOTES

So Far, So Good: After Monday night's victory over the New Orleans Hornets, the Thunder claimed a tenth consecutive win at the Chesapeake Energy Arena. The OKC franchise last won ten consecutive home games during the 1997-98 season (12 straight home wins from 2/22/98 through 4/2/98). The Thunder enters this evening's contest against the Boston Celtics tied with the Miami Heat for the best record in the NBA (25-7). Through the first 32 games of the season, Oklahoma City off to its second best start in franchise history. Only the 1993-94 team (27-5) posted a better record through the first 32 games of the season.

One For the Record Books: Sunday night's 124-118 overtime win versus the Denver Nuggets was not your average Thunder victory. It was the first game in NBA history in which a set of teammates recorded a 50-point effort (Kevin Durant; 51 points), a 40-point effort (Russell Westbrook, 40 points) and a triple-double (Serge Ibaka; 14 points, 15 rebounds and 11 blocks). Kevin Durant and Russell Westbrook are the first set of teammates to score 50 and 40 points, respectively since Kiki Vandeweghe (51 points) and Alex English (47 points) accomplished the feat on 12/13/1983 vs. DET (3OT). The 91 combined points by Durant and Westbrook is a franchise record. To put a bit more perspective on such an accomplishment, through February 19th, there had been 323 NBA games this season in which a team as a whole failed to score 91 points. Not to be outdone, Serge Ibaka became the first player in franchise history to record a triple-double which included blocked shots.

Block Party: With nearly half of the season complete, the Thunder leads the NBA in blocks with an average of 8.0 per game. On Sunday night versus the Nuggets, Serge Ibaka set a franchise record by blocking 11 shots en route to his first career triple-double. After recording 10+ blocks in three games this season, Ibaka becomes the first player to accomplish the feat since Shawn Bradley notched five games of 10+ blocks during the 1996-97 season. Ibaka currently leads the NBA with 3.28 blocks per game and on the season, Oklahoma City is 14-2 when Ibaka blocks three or more shots. Through the Thunder's first 17 games this season both Serge Ibaka and Kendrick Perkins recorded a blocked shot in EVERY game (Oklahoma City was the only NBA team to feature two players with a block in every game through 17 games).

Getting Defensive: Including the Thunder's most recent outing versus the New Orleans Hornets, Oklahoma City has held 11 opponents to less than 40.0% shooting this year, while posting a 10-1 record in those games. Last season, the Thunder limited the opponent to sub 40.0% shooting on six occasions (The Thunder went 6-0 in those contests). In 32 games this year the Thunder is limiting their opponent to 96.3 points on 42.3% shooting. Through the first 32 games of last season (in which OKC started 21-11), the Thunder surrendered 101.7 points on 46.7% shooting.

Just Another Back-2-Back: Including tonight's contest versus New Orleans, the Thunder is in the midst of a four game (all at home) in five night stretch leading up to the All-Star break. With 18 sets of back-to-backs scheduled (in addition to the Thunder's back-to-back-to-back) for the Thunder during the 2011-12 season, Oklahoma City has been successful to this point when playing on consecutive nights. So far this season, the Thunder has already registered sweeps in five sets of back-to-back match-ups to go along with a sweep of the team's lone back-to-back-to-back. So far this season, Oklahoma City is 8-2 on the first night and 8-3 on the second or third night of a back-to-back. Last season the Thunder played 17 sets of back-to-backs and the club posted a 13-4 record on the first night followed by a 10-7 mark on the second night. During the 2010-11 season, OKC captured sweeps in seven of their back-to-back pairings.

All-Star Bound: For a second consecutive season, Russell Westbrook and Kevin Durant will represent the Oklahoma City Thunder at the NBA All-Star game. Kevin Durant was named a starter on the 2012 Western Conference All-Star team after receiving 1,345,566 votes, second most in the Western Conference. This will mark Durant's third career All-Star appearance and his second as a starter. During last year's game played at STAPLES Center in Los Angeles, Durant was the game's second leading scorer after recording 34 points to go along with three rebounds and two assists in 30 minutes. Westbrook will make a second straight appearance on the Western Conference squad as a reserve after scoring 12 points to go along with five rebounds during last year's All-Star Game. The 2012 NBA All-Star Game, which will air live at 8 p.m. ET on TNT and ESPN Radio in the U.S., and reach fans in more than 200 countries and territories in more than 40 languages, will be played at Amway Center in Orlando – on Sunday, Feb. 26, 2012.

Coaching in Orlando: After defeating the Utah Jazz last Friday (2/10), the Thunder assured themselves of the best record in the NBA for those games played through February 15th. As a result, Scott Brooks and the Thunder coaching staff will lead the Western Conference All-Stars later in the month in Orlando. Brooks, the NBA's Western Conference Coach of the Month for December/January notched his 150th career win on Friday night after defeating the Golden State Warriors.

Tracking the Perk Effect: Since Kendrick Perkins made his Oklahoma City debut last season on 3/14/11 at Washington, the Thunder has posted a 38-11 record. With Perkins in the lineup for the final 17 games of the 2010-11 regular season, the Thunder held its opponents to an average of 97.9 points on 43.8% shooting. Prior to Perkins joining the team mid-season, the Thunder had been allowing 101.8 points on 46.3% shooting.

Russell Rules: Including a career-long seven game streak (1/10 at MEM – 1/23 vs. DET), Russell Westbrook has scored 20-plus points in 18 of the Thunder's last 22 outings. Westbrook, who was recently named to his second consecutive Western Conference All-Star team, received NBA Player of the Week honors for a second time this season after leading the Thunder to a 3-1 mark for the week ending, February 12th (last season, Westbrook was named Player of the Week on five occasions). After starting the 2011-12 season scoring 17.3 points on 41.1% shooting through the first 10 games of the season, Westbrook has proceeded to average 26.2 points on 49.8% shooting in the last 22 games. During Westbrook's first three full seasons in the NBA, he became one of only five players in NBA history to record 4,000 points, 1,500 assists and 1,000 rebounds through three NBA seasons (Chris Paul, LeBron James, Anfernee Hardaway and Oscar Robertson). By averaging better than 21+ points and 8+ assists last season, Westbrook became just the FIFTH player in the last 15 years to average 21+ points and 8+ assists (Gary Payton (4x), Stephon Marbury (4x), Chris Paul (2x) and LeBron James). During the season, 61.0% of Westbrook's field goal attempts were taken from inside the paint (tops among all NBA guards; min. 500 FG attempts).

Road Warriors: Through the first two months of the 2011-12 season, the Thunder has once again found success playing on the road. In 18 games played away from the Chesapeake Energy Arena the Thunder has registered a conference-best 12-6 mark on the road. The Thunder is currently one of five Western Conference teams to boast a winning road record. Last year, the Thunder recorded a mark of 25-16 on the road. Only four other teams tallied more road victories than the Thunder (CHI, MIA, DAL and LAL).

Double-Double Man: Including his career-long (tying) streak of five straight games with a double-double (1/27 at GS - 2/4 at SA), Kevin Durant has recorded a double-double in 12 games this season. Last year, Durant recorded 14 double-doubles including a stretch of five consecutive double-doubles from 1/30/11 vs. Miami – 2/8/11 vs. Memphis. This season, Durant has increased his rebounding average by a full 1.4 rebounds per game (averaging a team-high 8.2 rebounds this season) and with 12 double-doubles entering tonight's game vs. Boston, he is only two double-doubles shy of reaching last year's total for the entire season.

5,000 for Russell: Late in the second quarter of last Tuesday's game versus Utah (2/14), Russell Westbrook scored his 5,000th point to become one of just four players in franchise history to record 5,000 points through 274 or fewer games {Spencer Hayward (190 games), Kevin Durant (205 games), Bob Rule (228 games) and Xavier McDaniel (244 games)}. After reaching the 5,000 point plateau, Westbrook joined Magic Johnson and Oscar Robertson as the only players in NBA history to record 5,000 points, 1,900 assists and 1,300 rebounds through 274 career games (Elias Sports Bureau).

Bouncing Back: Dating back to the start of last season, Oklahoma City has demonstrated a high level of resiliency in those games played immediately after a loss. Including the Thunder's recent win over the Golden State Warriors (2/17), OKC improved to 6-1 this season in games played after a loss. This comes on the heels of the 2010-11 season in which Oklahoma City posted a record of 20-6 in games played immediately after a loss. The Thunder's .769 winning percentage in those games played after a defeat was trumped by only the Chicago Bulls last season (Chicago 16-4 following a loss).

Boards are the Barometer: As one might expect, Oklahoma City has traditionally found their greatest success when outrebounding the opposition. After outrebounding the Hornets two nights ago by a slight 48-47 margin, the Thunder improved to 14-2 this season when outrebounding the opposition (6-0 when outrebounding the opponent by 10 or more). Last season, OKC registered a 37-11 mark when outrebounding their opponent. During the 2009-10 season, the Thunder finished the regular season ranked 3rd in the NBA in rebounding. When digging deeper, the Thunder outrebounded their opponent in 55 of 82 games. In those contests, OKC posted a 40-15 record. Meanwhile, the Thunder went just 10-17 when they failed to rebound their opposition.

Team USA: On January 16th Kevin Durant and Russell Westbrook were among the 20 finalists named for the 2012 U.S. Olympic men's basketball team. Durant was named World Championship MVP during the 2010 USA World Championships after helping lead team USA to a perfect 9-0 record and a gold medal in Istanbul, Turkey. His involvement in USA basketball began in 2006 when he was named a member of the U.S. team at the Nike Hoop Summit. Westbrook, was also a member of the 2010 USA World Championship team and his involvement with USA Basketball dates back to 2008 when he was named to the USA Basketball Select team. The official 12-man U.S. Olympic team roster will be announced later this year.

30 Never Looked so Good: Picking up right where he left off last season, Kevin Durant hit the 30-point scoring mark in each of the Thunder's first four games this season. Durant is one of only four players in the last 30 years to open the season with four straight 30-point scoring efforts (Most recent: Kobe Bryant in 2005-06). In the last four-plus seasons, Durant has scored 30+ points in 117 games (most in the NBA). Most importantly for Oklahoma City, the Thunder has found a great deal of success on Durant's biggest nights. Dating back to the start of the 2010-11 season the Thunder has posted a 34-8 record when Durant hits the 30-point plateau. During the 2009-10 season, Durant set a franchise record by scoring 30+ points on 47 occasions.

Dynamic Duo: In the Thunder's recent outing against the Denver Nuggets on 2/19, the Thunder prevailed after receiving a combined 91 points from Kevin Durant (51 points) and Russell Westbrook (40 points). The 91 combined points for the two players is an all-time franchise record. On nine occasions dating back to the start of last season Durant and Westbrook have combined to score 30+ points (8-1 record). Durant and Westbrook currently combine to average 51.1 points per game (highest scoring teammates in the NBA). By combining for 49.6 points per game last season, the Durant-Westbrook tandem finished second to only LeBron James and Dwayne Wade (combined for 52.2 ppg) of the Miami Heat in the race for the NBA's highest scoring duo. During the 2010-11 season, Russell Westbrook assisted on 279 of Durant's made field goals (tops in the NBA from one teammate to another). In fact, Westbrook assisted on 24.0% more assists to Durant than the next highest NBA duo (Chris Paul registered 212 assists to David West).

Awfully Good in OT: After defeating the Denver Nuggets on 2/19 the Thunder remains perfect at 2-0 in overtime games this season. Last season, the Thunder became just the FIFTH team in NBA history to win eight overtime games in a single season (8-2). OKC set an all-time franchise record by winning five straight overtime games to start the season and the club's eight OT wins are the most in the NBA since 2002, when the Detroit Pistons went 8-0 in their overtime contests. During the 2010-11 season, OKC captured the franchises' first-ever triple-overtime victory (12/1/10) against New Jersey (OKC franchise was previously 0-4 all-time in triple overtime games).

Harden Heats Up: James Harden has once again continued to impact games for the Thunder in a reserve capacity early in the 2011-12 season. Harden has come off the bench in 29 of his 31 games this season for Oklahoma City and in all but two instances he has proceeded to score in double figures (including nine 20-point efforts in which the team is 8-1). Harden's 16.8 point per game average is currently tops in the NBA among reserves (min. 22 games). Including his career-best 18 game streak (2/15-3/25) James Harden came off the Thunder bench to score in double figures in 27 of the final 29 games of the 2010-11 regular season. After the All-Star break, Harden averaged 15.8 points per game while shooting 46.5% from the field. From February 22nd to the end of the 2010-11 season, Harden led the NBA in bench scoring (15.8 ppg).

Making them Look Free: For the second season in a row, the Thunder currently leads the NBA in free throw shooting accuracy (79.7%). Last season, OKC shot a league-best 82.3% from the free throw line (5th highest percentage in NBA history). As a point of reference, the best all-time free throw shooting percentage for an entire season in NBA history is 83.2% (Boston Celtics; 1989-90). Additionally, OKC led the NBA in free throw makes (24.1) and ranked second in free throw attempts (29.3) per game. On the year, OKC converted 30+ FTs on eighteen occasions (16-2 record) after doing so six times during all of the 2009-10 season (4-2 record). During the 2009-10 season Durant recorded 756 free throw makes, an all-time OKC Thunder franchise record and the 6th most in NBA history for a single season. Durant's 756 free throws made were the most for a single-season since Michael Jordan recorded 833 free throw makes during the 1986-87 season. KD is the ONLY player in NBA history to convert 700+ free throws while shooting 90.0% or better.

Sweep Success: After defeating the San Antonio Spurs earlier this season (1/8), the Thunder claimed a "sweep" in the team's lone back-to-back of the season. Oklahoma City defeated the Houston Rockets on consecutive nights before knocking-off the Spurs to become the first team to sweep a back-to-back-to-back in the NBA this season (OKC was the sixth team to play three games in three nights this season). During the 1998-99 season there were 64 back-to-back-to-backs played and of those, there were only eight sweeps.

Feasting on the East: Picking up right where they left-off last season, the Thunder has once again found a high-level of success when taking-on Eastern Conference opponents. Oklahoma City improved to 5-1 against teams from "The East" after defeating the Detroit Pistons by 20 points on January 23rd. Last season, the Thunder found a high degree of success when facing opponents from the "East." Oklahoma City concluded the season with a record of 22-8 when facing Eastern Conference foes. The Thunder's .733 winning percentage vs. the Eastern Conference ranked tied with Dallas for second best (San Antonio; 23-7) among all Western Conference teams. After defeating the Bobcats by 17 points on 2/18/11, OKC completed "sweeps" against eight Eastern Conference teams last season (CHA, WAS, DET, PHI, IND, NJ, ATL and CLE).

OKC is Fan Friendly: The Thunder opened the 2011-12 season right where they left off a year ago...with another sellout. So far this season the Thunder has recorded sellouts in all 14 of their home games. This occurs on the heels of the 2010-11 season in which the Thunder sold out 14 consecutive games to close the regular season and 35 games overall. Those in attendance this year will once again enjoy the improvements made to the Chesapeake Energy Arena as part of a taxpayer funded initiative passed in March 2008. Thanks to the publically funded initiative, the team's arena boasts a state-of-the art scoreboard, new terrace suites, an updated main concourse with new concession stands to go with a high-end courtside club.

Five-In-Seven: After defeating the Phoenix Suns at the end of 2011 (12/31), Oklahoma City claimed their fifth victory of the season in the first seven days of the 2011-12 season. The Thunder became just the second team in NBA history to capture five wins in the first seven days of the season (Houston Rockets accomplished the feat to start the 1996-97 season). The 5-0 start for the Thunder this year was the best start for the OKC franchise since the 1998-99 season.

Happy New Year: The Thunder closed-out 2011 with a 10-point victory over the Phoenix Suns in front of their home crowd at the Chesapeake Energy Arena. In each of the last four seasons, Oklahoma City has played a home affair on New Year's Eve and in each instance, the Thunder has prevailed (OKC defeated Phoenix, Atlanta, Utah and Golden State in each of the last four seasons on New Year's Eve).

A Merry Christmas for OKC Indeed: In the season opener for the Thunder, Oklahoma City provided its fans with a gift in the form of a 97-89 victory over the Orlando Magic on Christmas Night. The Thunder secured a Christmas win for a second consecutive season thanks in large part to a defensive effort that limited Orlando to 37.0% shooting {OKC limited ORL to 30.5% shooting (22-72 FGs) after the Magic made eight of their first nine field goals to start the game). OKC held the Magic to sub 40.0% shooting on the night – a feat they only achieved six times during the 2010-11 season (OKC was a perfect 6-0 in those game last season and is currently 2-0 this season). The OKC franchise now maintains a two-game Christmas win streak after going winless in their first 11 Christmas appearances.

Western Conference Finals: Last season, the Oklahoma City Thunder appeared in the Western Conference Finals just two years after finishing the 2008-09 season with a record of 23-59 (started season 3-29). Since the NBA went to a conference format in 1970-71, only one other team has reached the conference finals within two years after winning 23 or fewer games {San Antonio; 1998-99 season (won 20 games in 1996-97)}. The Thunder concluded the 2009-10 season by compiling 50 wins after posting just 23 victories during the team's inaugural season in Oklahoma City. The 27 win improvement was tied for the EIGHTH largest increase in NBA history.

Northwest Division Champions: After knocking-off the Los Angeles Clippers on April 6th of last season, the Thunder became the 2010-11 Northwest Division Champs. Oklahoma City concluded the 2010-11 regular season by winning sixteen of their final twenty games of the year. Dating back to March 9th, only the Chicago Bulls (18-2) and Miami (15-3) posted a better record than the Thunder. During the five-week long run, OKC averaged 105.3 points on 47.4% shooting while limiting the opposition to an average of 97.0 points on 43.4% field goal shooting.

National Spotlight: Oklahoma City is currently slated to appear on ESPN, ABC or TNT 17 times throughout the course of the 2011-12 season. Additionally, the Thunder is set to be featured on NBATV eight times this upcoming season (excluding Fan Night). When the dust settled on the NBA's 2011-12 broadcasting schedule, the Thunder was set to make the 6th most national TV dates this year. OKC is currently 11-2 on national television this year (OKC started the 2010-11 season by going a perfect 7-0 on national before finishing the season with a 9-6 record during their 15 nationally television appearances).

Back-to-Back Scoring Champ: With his 27.7 point per game scoring clip last season Kevin Durant became just the 11th player in NBA history to win back-to-back scoring titles. Durant is the most recent player to accomplish the feat since Kobe Bryant won consecutive scoring titles in 2005-06 and 2006-07. By capturing back-to-back scoring crowns, Durant has joined a hall-of-fame list of current and former NBA players who have won consecutive scoring titles (Kobe Bryant, Tracy McGrady, Allen Iverson, Michael Jordan, George Gervin, Bob McAdoo, Kareem Abdul-Jabbar, Wilt Chamberlain, Neil Johnston and George Mikan). Should Durant capture a scoring title this season, he would become the first player to claim three straight scoring crowns since Michael Jordan (1995-1998). During the 2009-10 season, Durant became the youngest scoring champion in NBA history (21 years and 197 days).

Inserting Ibaka: When the dust settled on the 2010-11 season, Serge Ibaka registered the most blocks in the NBA (198). Ibaka's 2.4 blocks per game average ranked 3rd in the league and earlier in the 2010-11 season, he posted a blocked shot in 26 consecutive games (longest streak at that time in NBA). On the season, Ibaka blocked four or more shots on 18 occasions and the Thunder posted a 16-2 record in those games. Dating back to the start of last season, Ibaka has started 70 games for the Thunder and the team has posted a 57-18 record in those contests.
