#### GAME HIGHLIGHTS:

- Oklahoma City improved to 3-0 on the second night of a back-to-back and 5-1 on the road after holding Milwaukee to 56 points through three quarters of play and 37.2% shooting on the night. OKC defeated the Bucks after losing the six previous match-ups at the Bradley Center. The Thunder once again played without Kevin Durant and Jeff Green (both out with sprained left ankles).
- After taking an early 5-4 advantage, OKC would lead throughout the remainder of the contest. Milwaukee trimmed the Thunder lead to just a single point on six different occasions during the fourth quarter, but were unable to ever take the lead. Brandon Jennings missed what would have been the game-tying three point field goal with 2.6 seconds left in the fourth quarter.
- James Harden matched a career-best by knocking down six 3-point field goals (6-8 3PT FGs) en route to a team-high 23 points. Thanks to Harden's effort, the Thunder converted a season-high eight three point field goals.
- The Thunder secured the win despite shooting a season-low 37.0% from the field. Additionally, OKC was outscored in the paint by a 42-26 margin after getting outrebounded 43-50.
- Brandon Jennings led MIL with 25 points, but they came on 24 field goal attempts. Drew Gooden also added 16 points and 16 rebounds for the Bucks.

#### GAME HIGHLIGHTS:

- Playing without the services of Kevin Durant and Jeff Green (both out with sprained left ankles), Oklahoma City limited the Celtics to a season-low 84 points and handed Boston their first home loss of the season (5-0 previously). With the win, OKC is now 4-1 on the road and 4-1 versus Eastern Conference opponents. Additionally, the Thunder is now a perfect 4-0 in nationally televised match-ups this season.
- Russell Westbrook recorded a game-high 31 points for Oklahoma City despite being held without a field goal in the fourth quarter. Through three periods, Westbrook converted 9-of-14 shots before going 0-7 in the fourth quarter.
- Oklahoma City prevailed despite missing on their final 13 shot attempts of the game. The Thunder shot just 11.1% in the fourth quarter (2-18 FGs). However, OKC limited BOS to a mere 16.7% (2-12 FGs) in the final period to secure the victory.
- James Harden made the first start of his NBA career (in replace of Kevin Durant) and in 37 minutes he scored 12 points to go along with six rebounds and four assists. Durant failed to appear in the OKC lineup after starting every game this season and all 82 games in 2009-10.
- The Thunder shot a season-best 67.7% from behind the three point line (6-9 FGs), while limiting Boston to 12.5% shooting (1-8 FGs) from three point range.
- Despite getting outscored in the paint 16-44, OKC outrebounded BOS by a 37-31 margin. OKC is now 5-1 this season when they outrebound the opposition.

#### GAME HIGHLIGHTS:

- Oklahoma City scored a season-high 116 points and handed-out a season-best 26 assists as six Thunder players scored in double figures during the 17-point win versus the Rockets (the 17-point win represents the largest margin of victory for OKC this year).
- After Houston trimmed the Thunder lead to four (64-68) at the 7:40 mark of the third quarter, OKC responded by outscoring the Rockets 26-15 to close the period. OKC would go on to lead by as many as 21 points in the fourth quarter.
- Led by DJ White (12 points; 5-7 FGs) and James Harden (10 points; four assists), the Thunder bench chipped-in 40 points on the night.
- The Thunder committed a season-low nine turnovers. Meanwhile, OKC improved to a perfect 3-0 this season when shooting 50.0% or better.
- Russell Westbrook registered his sixth double-double of the season with 21 points and a game-high 12 assists.
- In 24 minutes Thunder forward Serge Ibaka scored 11 points (5-8 FGs), blocked four shots and pulled-down a game-high (tying) eight rebounds. Oklahoma City improves to 4-1 with Ibaka in the starting lineup.
- Kevin Durant led the Thunder with 24 points (11-21 FGs) despite not playing in the fourth quarter.

## OKLAHOMA CITY THUNDER NOTES

**Thunder Going Streaking:** After "sweeping" their recent back-to-back versus the Celtics (11/19) and Bucks (11/20) without the services of Kevin Durant and Jeff Green (both out with sprained left ankles), the Thunder are currently winners of four consecutive contests (tied for second longest streak in the NBA) and six of the last seven. During the Thunder's road wins against Boston and Milwaukee, Oklahoma City held the opposition to 82.5 points on 42.5% shooting. Thanks in large part due to James Harden's 6-of-8 3-point shooting performance versus the Bucks, OKC as a team is shooting 60.9% (14-23 3PT FGs) from long range in the last two games.

**Winning by a Hair:** On the season, OKC is currently 6-0 in games decided by six points or less. After the team's 82-81 victory against the Bucks on Saturday night, OKC improves to 3-0 in games decided by just a single point.

**Dynamic Duo:** The Durant-Westbrook tandem is currently the highest scoring duo in the league, averaging 51.5 points per game (Bryant and Gasol of the L.A. Lakers rank second with a 48.5 point per game average). During the Thunder's win versus Portland (11/12), Russell Westbrook and Kevin Durant scored 36 points and 34 points respectively just one game after the pair each scored 30+ points during the Thunder's win over the 76ers (11/10). Such a feat has not occurred for the OKC franchise since 1989 when Dale Ellis and Xavier McDaniel each scored 30-plus points in consecutive contests (4/18/89 - 4/20/89).

**Making them Look Free:** Through the first few weeks of the NBA season, the Thunder is finding a great deal of success from the charity stripe. In thirteen games, OKC is shooting a league-best 87.1% from the free throw line. As a point of reference, the best all-time free throw shooting percentage for an entire season in NBA history is 83.2% (Boston Celtics; 1989-90). Additionally, OKC leads the NBA in free throw makes (27.1) and attempts (31.1) per game. OKC has converted 30+ FTs on five occasions this season (4-1 record) after doing so six times all of last year (4-2 record).

**Inserting Ibaka:** After Saturday's one-point win in Milwaukee, Oklahoma City is now 6-1 with Serge Ibaka in the starting lineup (Ibaka has replaced Jeff Green who is currently sidelined with a sprained left ankle). Including his career-best 22-point (9-13 FGs), 11 rebound effort in Utah vs. the Jazz on 11/15, Ibaka is averaging 11.7 points, 8.1 rebounds and 2.4 blocks in 32.4 minutes as a starter. Ibaka currently ranks 8<sup>th</sup> in the NBA with 2.3 blocks per game.

**Road Warriors:** After defeating the Bucks in Milwaukee on 11/20, OKC moved to 5-1 on the road this season. Last year, Oklahoma City registered a 23-18 record away from their home arena. The 23 road wins exceeded the combined road win total for the prior two seasons (15). The Thunder was one of ELEVEN teams in the NBA to boast a winning road record and only FIVE teams registered more road victories than Oklahoma City (BOS, CLE, ORL, DAL & POR). The Thunder actually claimed five straight road victories during the 2009-10 season for the first time since February of 2005.

**Just Another Back-2-Back:** Playing without Kevin Durant and Jeff Green (both out with sprained left ankles) Oklahoma City "swept" their first back-to-back of the season after securing road wins against Boston (11/19) and Milwaukee (11/20). This year, OKC is scheduled play 16 back-to-backs over the course of the season. Currently, OKC is 1-2 on the first night and 3-0 on the second night. Last year, the Thunder posted a 17-19 record during their 18 back-to-back pairings as the team went 9-9 on the first night and 8-10 on the second night. During the 2009-10 season, OKC "swept" five of their back-to-backs (after failing to sweep a single B-2-B during the 2008-09 season) while also securing a "split" on seven other occasions. With wins over the 76ers (3/30/10), Celtics (3/31/10), Mavericks (4/3/10) and Timberwolves (4/4/10) the OKC franchise swept consecutive back-to-backs for the first since March of 2001.

**Russell Rules:** Once again this season, Russell Westbrook has continued to develop in many facets of the game. Westbrook registered a career-best 36 points (12-22 FGs) last Friday night vs. Portland (11/12) and through the first thirteen games this season, Westbrook has recorded six double-doubles and increased his scoring average by 7.4 points. He is currently one of only three players (Kobe Bryant and LeBron James) in the NBA to average 20+ points, 5+rebounds and 5+ assists per game. Last year Westbrook tallied 28 double-figure assist games (24 double-doubles on the season) and the Thunder went 23-5 in those contests. During a two week span from 2/20-3/3, Westbrook recorded double-doubles in six of seven Thunder Contests. Included in that stretch, Westbrook registered his second career triple-double on 2/21 at Minnesota.

**Youth Movement:** The Oklahoma City Thunder debuted last month as third youngest team in the NBA with an average age of 24 years and 268 days (per opening night on 10/27). Only the Memphis Grizzlies (24 years, 224 days) and the Minnesota Timberwolves (24 years, 83 days) boast a younger roster. As far as starting lineups are concerned, the Thunder starters (Green, Durant, Krstic, Sefolosa and Westbrook) trail only Minnesota with an average age of 24 years and 142 days. The Thunder concluded the 2009-10 season as the youngest team in the NBA with an average age of 25 years and 42 days.

**Feasting on the East:** With their 82-81 victory vs. Milwaukee on Saturday night (11/20), OKC continued their streak of solid play versus Eastern Conference opponents. The Thunder is currently 5-1 versus "The East" with wins over MIL, BOS, PHI, DET and CHI. Last season, the Thunder posted a 22-8 record against the East. On the year, the Thunder "swept" EIGHT Eastern Conference opponents (Miami, Detroit, Washington, Atlanta, New York, New Jersey, Toronto and Philadelphia) while defeating 14-of-15 teams in the conference (0-2 vs. Cleveland). To illustrate how the team has grown, the Thunder failed to "sweep" a single Eastern Conference foe during the 2008-09 season and concluded the year with an 8-22 mark against the East.

**30 Never Looked so Good:** After posting back-to-back 30 point efforts to open the 2010-11 season, the Thunder has once again found success on Durant's biggest nights. Including Monday's 30 point performance vs. Utah (11/15), OKC is 5-1 when Durant hits the 30-point mark. Last season, Durant set a franchise record by scoring 30+ points on 47 occasions (his 47 games of 30+ points led the NBA). Most importantly, the Thunder went 31-16 when Durant scored 30+. Earlier in the year, Durant set an all-time franchise record by scoring 30+ points in SEVEN consecutive contests (12/22 - 1/2). During this two-week long run, Durant posted averages of 33.6 points on 56.8% shooting (84-148 FG's) including 45.8% shooting from behind the 3-point arc (11-24). LeBron James was the last NBA player to piece together a seven-game string of 30+ (Nov. 2007).

**Speeding past 6,000:** With his 30 points last month versus Detroit (10/29), Kevin Durant crossed the 6,000 point plateau in his 238<sup>th</sup> career game. Durant becomes just the third active NBA player to record 6,000 points in 238 games or fewer. LeBron James accomplished the feat in 230 games and Shaquille O'Neal hit the 6,000 point scored milestone in just 221 games played.

**A Golden Summer:** This past summer Kevin Durant and Russell Westbrook helped lead the USA Men's National Team to a gold medal during the 2010 FIBA World Championships played in Turkey. Durant, the tournament MVP, recorded a game-high 28 points during the United States' gold medal winning, 81-64 victory over host country Turkey. Durant also set the all-time USA single game scoring record by notching 38 points during the USA's semifinal match-up versus Lithuania. Russell Westbrook received player of the game honors during the US win over Lithuania and proved to be integral part of the United States perfect 9-0 mark at the World Championships. Westbrook appeared in all nine games and averaged 9.1 points, 2.8 rebounds and 2.6 assists per contest. OKC Thunder teammate, Nenad Krstic competed in the World Championships for his native country of Serbia. Krstic helped lead the Serbians to the semifinals and in six games, Krstic averaged 13.5 points and 7.5 rebounds.

**Talking Turnarounds:** The Thunder concluded the 2009-10 season by compiling 50 wins a year after posting 23 victories during the team's inaugural season in Oklahoma City. The 27 win improvement is the tied for the EIGHTH largest increase in NBA history. Additionally, the Thunder became just the eleventh team in the last 10 years to double their win total from one season to the next (Most recently: Miami Heat won 43 in 2008-09 after 15 wins in 2007-08). With their win over the Memphis Grizzlies in the team's regular season finale (4/14), Oklahoma City closed the season with a 26-11 record (.703) dating back to January 29<sup>th</sup>. The .703 winning percentage during this span was tied for 6<sup>th</sup> best in the NBA. During this 10 week long stretch, the Thunder averaged 105.8 points per game on better than 47.0% shooting.

**Starters in Tact:** Last season, four Oklahoma City players started all 82 games for the Thunder (Durant, Green, Sefolosha and Westbrook). To highlight the rarity of such a feat, only four teams dating back to 1970 have maintained the same four starters in every game played during the regular season {Most Recent: The 2002-03 Golden State Warriors (Arenas, Dampier, Jamison and Richardson)}. So far this season, Jeff Green has missed seven games (sprained left ankle) and Kevin Durant has missed two (sprained left ankle).

**Durant at the Line:** During the Thunder's recent outing vs. Utah (11/15), Kevin Durant went a perfect 16-of-16 from the free throw line (for the second time this season) and he is currently shooting a team-best 92.6% from the charity stripe. Last season, Durant finished the year ranked 6<sup>th</sup> in the NBA by shooting an even 90.0% from the free throw line. His 756 free throw makes on the year were an all-time OKC Thunder franchise record (6<sup>th</sup> most in NBA history for a single season) and the most in a single-season since Michael Jordan recorded 833 free throw makes during the 1986-87 season. KD is the ONLY player in NBA history to convert 700+ free throws while shooting 90.0% or better.

**The Krstic Effect:** With Nenad Krstic's 11 points on 11/17 vs. Houston, the Thunder once again experienced unparalleled success when Krstic scores in double figures. Last season, the Thunder went an incredible 27-3 when the team's 7' foot center recorded 10-plus points. This year, OKC is 3-1 when Krstic scores in double figures.

**Boards are the Barometer:** The Thunder knocked-off Boston on 11/19 after outrebounding the Celtics by a 37-31 margin. OKC is now 5-1 this season when they outrebound their opponent. Last year the Thunder finished the regular season ranked 3rd in the NBA in rebounding. When digging deeper, the Thunder outrebounded their opponent in 55 of 82 games. In those contests, OKC posted a 40-15 record. Meanwhile, the Thunder went just 10-17 when they failed to outrebound their opposition. During a three-game stretch to close-out calendar year 2009 (12/23 at PHX – 12/28 at NJ), OKC outrebounded their opponent by 10 or more in each of the three contests. It had been four years since the OKC franchise last outrebounded their opponent by 10+ in three consecutive games (12/23/05 – 12/29/05). On the season, the Thunder went 16-2 when outrebounding their opponent by 10 or more.

**Youngest Scoring Champ...EVER:** With a game-high 31 points during the Thunder's regular season finale last season (4/14), Kevin Durant (30.1 ppg) locked-up the NBA's scoring title in just his third season removed from the university of Texas. By averaging 36.3 points during the final seven games of the season, KD moved past LeBron James (29.7 ppg) and in doing so he becomes the youngest scoring champion in NBA history (21 years and 197 days). The previous record was held by Max Zaslofsky of the Chicago Stags (22 years and 105 days) in 1947-48, when the scoring champion was determined by total points scored. Durant also becomes the first player in OKC franchise history to capture a regular season scoring title.

**Rarified Air:** During the 2009-10 season, Durant became just the 10<sup>th</sup> player in NBA history to start every game during the regular season while averaging 30 points or better. Only Michael Jordan (five times) and Wilt Chamberlain (four times) accomplished this feat more than once. Kobe Bryant was the last NBA player to play in every game while scoring at a 30.0 point per game clip (2002-03).

**Chart Topper:** With his 36<sup>th</sup> point during OKC's win over Minnesota last season on 4/4, KD passed Dale Ellis for the all-time single-season scoring title with his 2,254<sup>th</sup> point of the year. At the end of March, Durant reached the 2,000 point plateau with his three-point field goal at the 3:39 mark of the third quarter during the Thunder's loss to the Indiana Pacers on 3/21. KD reached the 2,000 point threshold in just his 68<sup>th</sup> game of the season and in doing so he becomes one of only two NBA players to accomplish the feat at age 21 or younger. LeBron James reached the 2,000-point scored plateau in his 65<sup>th</sup> game during the 2005-06 season at the age of 21.

**OKC is Fan Friendly:** The Thunder began the 2010-11 season right where they left off...with another sellout. In fact, the Thunder has sold out six of their seven home games this season. Fans this season will once again enjoy the improvements made to the Oklahoma City Arena as part of a taxpayer funded initiative passed in March 2008. Thanks to the publically funded initiative, the team's arena boasts a state-of-the art scoreboard, new terrace suites and a courtside club to go along with a new and improved Thunder locker room. During the 2009-10 season, the Thunder recorded 28 sellouts while drawing an average crowd of 18,004 representing 98.9% capacity. To close the season, OKC sold-out eleven straight contests and 17 of the last 20 games.
