GAME HIGHLIGHTS:

- In a game that featured 16 lead changes and seven ties, the Thunder took the defending NBA Champions to overtime before being outscored 11-8 in the extra session.
- Kevin Durant recorded all of his season-high 28 points (10-19 FG's) through the first three quarters before being held scoreless throughout the fourth quarter and overtime (0-5 FG's). With seconds left in regulation and the score tied at 90 apiece, KD missed a 27-foot 3-point jump shot which would have given the Thunder the lead with 2.7 seconds remaining.
- LAL scored nine unanswered points to open the game on 70.6% first quarter shooting. The Thunder trailed by as many as 13 in the first half before using a 24-10 first half run to pull within a single point after two quarters of play.
- Thabo Sefolosha posted a season-high four steals as OKC forced 26 LAL turnovers (23 pts off TO's). Los Angeles had not committed 26+ turnovers since March 25, 2007 (26 TO's vs. GSW). In addition, it was the most TO's forced by the OKC franchise since March 19th of 2008 (27 TO's vs PHX). OKC's bench outscored LAL reserves 22-6.

GAME HIGHLIGHTS:

- Despite holding POR to 36.1% shooting in the second half, OKC suffered their first defeat of the 2009-10 season after recording only 24 made field goals and six assists on the night.
- LaMarcus Aldridge left the game at the end of the first quarter (right knee injury) and did not return.
- Steve Blake recorded a team-high 18 pts for POR including 4-of-5 from behind the 3-point line. His 3-point FG with 1:30 remaining in the fourth quarter gave POR a 77-68 advantage.
- Russell Westbrook scored 18 of his season and game-high 23 points in the second half (6-9 FG's). With two assists vs. POR, Westbrook's 8.3 apg average ranks 8th in the NBA this season.
- OKC is the only team in the NBA to have held their opponent to fewer than 90 points during each of the first three games to start the season. ATL was the lone team to accomplish the feat during 2008-09 season. The last time the OKC franchise held their opponent to fewer than 90 points for three consecutive games occurred more than a decade ago when the 1998-99 team opened the season holding their first four opponents to fewer than 90 points.

GAME HIGHLIGHTS:

- After recording 38 first half points on 39.5% shooting (15-38), OKC responded in the second half by outscoring DET 53-38 in the 3rd and 4th quarters thanks to 47.4% shooting. Kevin Durant's 13-foot jump shot gave the Thunder a 75-65 lead with 7:43 remaining in the contest.
- The Thunder limited DET to 12 assists including three assists in the second half. OKC surrendered 12 or fewer assists in two games during the 2009-09 season.
- Dating back to last season, OKC is now 16-1 in the last 17 games in which they hold their opponent to under 100 points.
- Kevin Durant led the Thunder with 25 points (11 in 4th quarter) and 12 rebounds. It's the third time in Durant's career that he has had double-digit rebounds in back-to-back games.
- OKC has now won it's first two games of the season for the first time since 2003. Last season, it took the Thunder until Nov. 29th to capture their second victory (at MEM).

OKLAHOMA CITY THUNDER NOTES

.500: Despite falling to the Lakers and Trail Blazers in their last two contests, Oklahoma City opened the season with back-to-back victories for the first time since 2003 when the team opened the season with a 3-0 start. In winning two of their first four games played, OKC is holding their opponent to an average of 89.0 points per game (T 3rd fewest in the NBA) on 42.6% field goal shooting (5th best in the NBA). In their two wins vs. SAC and DET, the Thunder has limited their opponent to 13 assists and 12 assists, respectively (OKC allowing NBA-low 15.0 assists per game). During the 2008-09 season, OKC held their opponent to 13 or fewer assists on only three occasions. Through four games, Russell Westbrook is averaging 8.0 assists (Ranks T 6th in NBA). Lastly, it took the Thunder until Nov. 29th of last season before they captured their second victory.

First Impressions: With their 102-89 victory over the Sacramento Kings last Wednesday night, the OKC franchise secured their first opening night victory since 2003 when they defeated the Los Angeles Clippers 109-100 in Saitama, Japan. During the Thunder's wire-to-wire win at the Ford Center, Russell Westbrook set a career-high with 13 assists to go along with 14 points and seven rebounds. With his 13 assists, Westbrook single-handily matched the entire assist total for the entire Kings team. The last time an OKC franchise player matched the entire opposing team's assist total occurred in 2006 when Luke Ridnour handed-out 13 assists in a 110-106 defeat vs. the Portland Trail Blazers.

Youth Movement: The Thunder enter the 2009-10 season as the second youngest team in the NBA with an average age of 25 years and 130 days. They trail only the Memphis Grizzlies who boast an average age of 25 years and 92 days. Additionally, the OKC opening night (10/28) starting lineup (Durant, Green, Krstic, Sefolosa and Westbrook) was the youngest in the league with an average age of 23 years and 179 days. For a matter of comparison, the age of the average NBA roster is 26 years and 329 days and the oldest team in the league entering the 2009-10 season was the San Antonio Spurs with an average age of 29 years and 73 days. There are currently eight players on the Thunder roster age 23 or younger.

What Lazy Days of Summer?: The Thunder was the only NBA team to participate in multiple summer leagues this past off-season. Seven players currently on the Thunder roster saw action in the Orlando Pro Summer League (July 5-10) and the NBA Summer League in Las Vegas (July 10-19). Thunder second-year guard Russell Westbrook and OKC Rookie James Harden were both named to the 2009 Orlando Pro All-Summer League First-Team. In addition, Thunder forward D.J. White received second-team honors for his performance in Orlando. In four Orlando Summer League contests Westbrook posted averages of 22.3 points (.519 FG%), 3.5 rebounds and 7.8 assists in 32.3 minutes per game. Harden, the No. 3 overall selection in this past summer's NBA draft participated in a total of nine summer league contests and recorded averages of 14.7 points (.506 FG%), 3.3 rebounds and 2.4 assists in 27.9 minutes per game.

Country First: The OKC trio of Kevin Durant, Jeff Green and Russell Westbrook were all invited to participate in the 2009 USA Basketball Men's National Team mini-camp held in Las Vegas this past July. In preparation for the 2010 World Championships and the 2012 Olympic Games in London, USA basketball hosted the three-day event which included an intra-squad Blue vs. White scrimmage on the final day. Thunder Head Athletic Trainer, Joe Sharpe was also invited to participate in the Team USA event.

Summer Oversees: Both Nenad Krstic (Serbia) and Thabo Sefolosa (Switzerland) spent the summer months representing their counties as they competed in the 2009 EuroBasket Championships held in Poland. While Sefolosa and Switzerland participated in the Division B bracket, Krstic helped lead the Serbia team to the Championship Game vs. Spain in the upper Division A bracket. In nine EuroBasket contests, Krstic posted averages of 13.4 points, 4.8 rebounds and 1.6 assists in 23.4 minutes per game. Meanwhile, Sefolosa played in four games for the Swiss team and compiled averages of 15.8 points, 6.5 rebounds and 3.3 assists in 37.3 minutes per contest.

Technically Speaking: With no individual technical fouls called through the first four games of the 2009-10 season, the Thunder continue their run of being one of the fewest "T'd-Up" teams in the league. During the 2008-09 season, 11 individual technicals (excludes defensive technicals) were whistled on Thunder players and coaches. This total was the fewest awarded to any NBA team during the season. In addition, the Thunder committed 31 total technical fouls (includes individual and defensive 3-second technicals) which tied for the fewest in the NBA (San Antonio). This total also represents the fewest "T's" committed in the NBA since the 1997-98 season (Golden State; 22).

Filling up the Ford: The Thunder began the 2009-10 season right where they left off... with another sellout. Those that made up the capacity crowd of 18,203 on opening night (10/28) in Oklahoma City were greeted with a new and improved Ford Center. As part of a taxpayer funded initiative passed in March 2008, numerous arena improvements were recently completed. The Ford Center now boasts a state-of-the art scoreboard, new lodge box seating and a courtside club to go along with a new and improved Thunder locker room. Last season, fans from near and far flocked to Oklahoma City to witness Thunder basketball. During the Thunder's inaugural season in OKC, the Ford Center recorded 18 sellouts (19,136) including eight consecutive to end the season. In 41 home games, the Thunder's average attendance topped the 18,700 mark (11th best in the NBA), accounting for an average capacity of nearly 98.0%. This season, the Thunder has sold-out two of their first three home contests.

Brooks at the Helm: On Wednesday April 15th, just prior to OKC's final game of the 2008-09 season versus the Los Angeles Clippers, Thunder General Manager, Sam Presti made the announcement that the organization had decided to retain Head Coach, Scott Brooks, thereby waiving the once interim status attached to his title.

Coach Brooks took the Thunder helm on November 22nd of last year after a disappointing 1-12 start to the season under then head coach, P.J. Carlesimo. After taking the reigns from Carlesimo, the Thunder showed marked improvement in a number of statistical categories including, field-goal percentage (5.1%), assists (4.2) and points per game (9.6).

Last season under Brooks, the Thunder posted a 22-47 (.319%) record, including a 15-17 (.469%) stretch from late December through early March.

Durant Dazzles: Through his first two NBA seasons, Kevin Durant has already proven that he is one of the elite scorers in the game. Durant, the NBA's 6th leading scorer last season, averaged 25.3 points in just his second season removed from the University of Texas. He became the NBA's 5th second-year player in the last 20 years to average better than 25 points per game.

Sophomore Studs: At the end of last season, second year players Kevin Durant and Jeff Green combined to average 41.8 points per game. The last pair of second year teammates to average a higher total was Allen Iverson and Jerry Stackhouse for the Philadelphia 76ers who more than a decade ago combined to average 44.2 points per game during the 1996-97 season.

Not "Two" Shabby: After two seasons in the NBA, Kevin Durant boasts a 22.7 scoring average, the fifth highest career average for any second year player in the modern era (dating back to 1989). Only Shaquille O'Neal (26.4), David Robinson (25.0), LeBron James (24.1) and Vince Carter (22.9) posted higher career scoring averages after their first two NBA seasons.

Young Guns: During the 2008-09 season, the Thunder registered a majority of their scoring from either first or second year players. In fact, OKC rookies and second year players combined to score 4,780 of the 7,952 total Thunder points. This total represents 60.1% of the OKC points scored, the highest percent of any team in the NBA during the 2008-09 season. The last team with a higher percentage of points coming from rookies and second year players occurred during the 1997-98 season when the Boston Celtics received 68.7% of their scoring from a young team which included the likes of Antoine Walker, Ron Mercer, and Walter McCarty.

Race to 3,000... and Beyond: During the Thunder game in Phoenix on February 20th, Kevin Durant etched his name into the NBA record books by becoming the second youngest player (behind only LeBron James) to record 3,000 points in league history. With his 35 points versus the Suns, Durant reached the 3,000-point plateau in only 134 games. Durant will look to surpass the 5,000 point mark during the 2009-10 NBA as he currently sits with 3,589 career points scored.

New Year's Resolution: Last season, the Thunder held true to one of their New Year's resolutions... free-throw shooting. In the 33 games played during calendar year 2008 the Thunder ranked 26th in the NBA from the free-throw line, shooting 74.5%. In 2009 however, the Thunder displayed material improvement from the charity stripe. In the 49 games played during 2009, the Thunder shot 81.1% from the line, representing a 6.6% improvement. In games played after January 1st the Thunder ranked 5th in the NBA in free-throw shooting percentage.

Russell Rules: During his rookie season, Russell Westbrook burst onto the NBA landscape and immediately made his presence known. Westbrook, the T-Mobile Rookie of the month in both December and February was one of just three rookies (O.J. Mayo, Marc Gasol) to rank in the top-10 in points, rebounds and assists. Westbrook went onto recorded 10 double-doubles last season, which was tops among the rookie class. His accomplishments were recognized by the league after the season when Westbrook joined Derrick Rose, O.J. Mayo, Brook Lopez and Michael Beasley in being named to the NBA's All-Rookie First-Team.

More Westbrook: Last season, Russell was one of just 15 players and the lone rookie to average at least 15 points, four rebounds and four assists. On March 2nd versus Dallas, he became the first rookie to record a triple double since Chris Paul accomplished the feat during the 2005-06 season. Lastly, by converting 20 made free-throws February 1st at Sacramento, Westbrook became just the 3rd rookie in NBA history to score 20 FT's in a single game.

Stripe Happy: On January 23rd versus the Los Angeles Clippers, Kevin Durant received plenty of charity from the free throw stripe. On the night, Durant calmly converted 24 made free throws (on 26 attempts) en route to a 46-point performance at STAPLES Center. Durant's 24 made free throws set a Thunder franchise record. In addition, Durant set an NBA season-high for most FT's made in a game this year. KD becomes one of only four players over the last 20 years to make 24+ FT's in a single game (MR; LeBron James: 24-of-28 on 3/12/06).

Lots of Big Nights: During his second NBA season, Kevin Durant filled-up the scoring column with regularity. At the end of the 2008-09 NBA season, Durant recorded 20 or more points 57 times including 30 or more points on 21 occasions. These totals place KD among some elite NBA company.

KD En Fuego: Last year, prior to his injury 2/27 at Dallas, Kevin Durant found himself on a red-hot scoring tear seldom witnessed by a second year NBA player. In the 17 games prior to his injury (1/16 vs. DET through 2/24 vs. LAL), Durant posted a scoring average of 32.3 points per game. During this five-week long span, Durant led the NBA in scoring by a 2.4 point per game margin (LeBron James; 29.9 ppg). To highlight the rarity of such a blistering stretch, it has been 35 years since a second year player last averaged 32+ points across a 17-game span (Bob McAdoo; 34.7 ppg during the 1974 season).

Worth Noting: In Kevin Durant's rookie season, he became the youngest player to record 18 made field goals in a single game. During the 2008-09 season, Durant set a career-high with 47 points on February 17th vs. New Orleans. Durant is the youngest player to score 47+ points since LeBron James recorded 56 points during the 2004-05 season.

- In the last 15 games in which the Thunder held their opponent to fewer than 100 points, OKC boasted a 14-1 record.
- In 19 of the Thunder 23 wins last season, OKC outrebounded their opponent.
