GAME HIGHLIGHTS:

- The Thunder may have saved their best for last. In OKC's season finale, the Thunder posted a season-best 126 points en route to their most lopsided victory of the year (41 points).
- When the dust settled, six OKC players recorded double-figures scoring and the Thunder team set season-highs in a number of statistical categories including, made field-goals (48), assists (36) and steals (17).
- Earl Watson came off the bench to record 16 points for the second consecutive game. More importantly, Watson handed out a season-high 14 assists (also represents Thunder season-high) in 29 minutes of action.
- In his seventh game back from injury (missed initial 75 games recovering from jaw surgery), DJ White added 15 points to go along with a game-high 11 rebounds (both career-highs) for his first career double-double.
- The Thunder reserves outscored the Clipper's bench 57-26. In addition, OKC outscored LAC 62-42 in the paint and 19-4 in fast break opportunities.
- The Thunder conclude their inaugural season in Oklahoma City with a win, thereby improving their overall season record to 23-59.

GAME HIGHLIGHTS:

- POR outscored OKC by a two-to-one margin in the first half, 62-31, as the Blazers out-shot the Thunder 55.8% (24-43 FGs) to 31.6% (12-38 FGs) during the first two quarters of play.
- Earl Watson came off the bench to lead OKC in scoring for the first time this season. In 26 minutes, Watson recorded six rebounds and five assists to go along with his team-high 16 points.
- Durant, the NBA's fifth leading scorer, registered 10 points (5-15 FGs), his third lowest scoring output of the season.
- The POR bench outscored OKC's reserves 55-37. Meanwhile, the Blazers controlled the paint, outscoring OKC 54-36 on the interior.
- With the win, the Trail Blazers capture their fifth consecutive victory and clinch the season-series vs. OKC, three games to one.

GAME HIGHLIGHTS:

- After leading by five, 56-51 at halftime, the Bucks erupted for 37 points in the third quarter thanks to 72.2% shooting (13-18 FGs). On the night, MIL shot 52.4% (43-82 FG's) and led by as many as 24 points in the second half.
- In his sixth game of the season with OKC, Shaun Livingston came off the bench to score 14 points on a perfect 7-of-7 shooting from the field in 25 minutes of action.
- Jeff Green failed to record double-figure scoring after doing so in 34 consecutive contests dating back to 1/16 vs. DET.
- Kyle Weaver replaced Thabo Sefolosha (dislocated left index finger) in the Thunder's starting lineup. In 37 minutes, Weaver pulled down a career-high nine rebounds to go along with 12 points (5-12 FGs).
- Richard Jefferson led the Bucks with nine rebounds and a season-high (tying) 35 points on 13-of-21 shooting.

OKLAHOMA CITY THUNDER: 2008-09 NOTES

Race to 3,000: During the Thunders' game in Phoenix on February 20th, Kevin Durant etched his name into the NBA record books by becoming the second youngest player (behind only LeBron James) to record 3,000 points in league history. With his 35 points versus the Suns, Durant reached the 3,000-point plateau in only 134 games.

Durant Dazzles: Through his first two NBA seasons, Kevin Durant has already proven that he is one of the elite scorers in the game. Durant, the NBA's 6th leading scorer this season, averaged 25.3 points in just his second season removed from the University of Texas. He becomes the NBA's 5th second-year player in the last 20 years to average better than 25 points per game.

Not "Two" Shabby: After two seasons in the NBA, Kevin Durant boasts a 22.7 scoring average, the fifth highest career average for any second year player in the modern era (dating back to 1989). Only Shaquille O'Neal (26.4), David Robinson (25.0), LeBron James (24.1), Vince Carter (22.9) posted higher career scoring averages after their first two NBA seasons.

Young Guns: During the 2008-09 season, the Thunder registered a majority of their scoring from either first or second year players. In fact, OKC rookies and second year players combined to score 4,780 of the 7,952 total Thunder points this season. This total represents 60.1% of the OKC points scored, the highest percent of any team in the NBA this season. The last team with a higher percentage of points coming from rookies and second year players occurred during the 1997-98 season when the Boston Celtics received 68.7% of their scoring from a young team which included the likes of Antoine Walker, Ron Mercer, and Walter McCarty.

Sophomore Studs: Second year players Kevin Durant and Jeff Green combined to average 41.8 points per game this season. The last pair of second year teammates to average a higher total was Allen Iverson and Jerry Stackhouse for Philadelphia 76ers who more than a decade ago combined to average 44.2 points per game during the 1996-97 season.

Filling up the Ford: Fans from near and far flocked to Oklahoma City this season to witness Thunder basketball. During the Thunder's inaugural season in OKC, the Ford Center recorded 18 sellouts (19,136) including eight consecutive to end the season. In 41 home games, the Thunder average attendance topped the 18,700 mark (10th best in the NBA), accounting for an average capacity of nearly 98.0%.

Russell Rules: Rookie guard, Russell Westbrook burst onto the NBA landscape this season and immediately made his presence known. Westbrook, the T-Mobile Rookie of the month in both December and February was one of just three rookies (O.J. Mayo, Marc Gasol) to rank in the top-10 in points, rebounds and assists. Additionally, Westbrook recorded 10 double-doubles this season, which is tops among this year's rookie class.

Westbrook²: This season, Russell is one of just 15 players and the lone rookie to average at least 15 points, four rebounds and four assists. On March 2nd versus Dallas, he became the first rookie to record a triple double since Chris Paul accomplished the feat during the 2005-06 season. Lastly, by converting 20 made free-throws February 1st as Sacramento, Westbrook became just the 3rd rookie in NBA history to score 20 FT's in a single game.

New Year's Resolution: This past season, they Thunder held true to one of their New Year's resolutions... free-throw shooting. In the 33 games this season played during calendar year 2008 the Thunder ranked 26th in the NBA from the free-throw line, shooting 74.5%. In 2009 however, the Thunder displayed material improvement from the charity stripe. In the 49 games played during 2009, the Thunder shot 81.1% from the line, representing a 6.6% improvement. Since January 1st the Thunder rank 5th in the NBA in free-throw shooting percentage.

Lots of Big Nights: In his second NBA season, Kevin Durant filled-up the scoring column with regularity. At the end of the 2008-09 NBA season, Durant recorded 20 or more points 57 times including 30 or more points on 21 occasions. These totals place KD among some elite NBA company

Stripe Happy: On January 23rd versus the Los Angeles Clippers, Kevin Durant received plenty of charity from the free throw stripe. On the night, Durant calmly converted 24 made free throws (on 26 attempts) en route to a 46-point performance at Staples Center. Durant's 24 made free throws set a Thunder franchise record. In addition, Durant set an NBA season-high for most FT's made in a game this year. KD becomes one of only four players over the last 20 years to make 24+ FT's in a single game (MR; LeBron James: 24-of-28 on 3/12/06).

KD En Fuego: Prior to his injury 2/27 at Dallas, Kevin Durant found himself on a red-hot scoring tear seldom witnessed by a second year NBA player. In the 17 games prior to his injury (1/16 vs. DET through 2/24 vs. LAL), Durant posted a scoring average of 32.3 points per game. During this 5-week long span, Durant led the NBA in scoring by a 2.4 point per game margin (LeBron James; 29.9 ppg). To highlight the rarity of such a blistering stretch, it has been 35 years since a second year player last averaged 32+ points across a 17-game span (Bob McAdoo; 34.7 ppg during the 1974 season).

Worth Noting: In Kevin Durant's rookie season, he became the youngest player to record 18 made field goals in a single game. This season, Durant set a career-high with 47 points on February 17th vs. New Orleans. Durant is the youngest player to score 47+ points since LeBron James recorded 56 points during the 2004-05 season.

Not Going Anywhere: On Wednesday April 15th, just prior to OKC's final game of the season versus the Los Angeles Clippers, Thunder General Manager, Sam Presti made the announcement that the organization had decided to retain Head Coach, Scott Brooks, thereby waiving the once interim status attached to his title.

Coach Brooks took the Thunder helm on November 22nd after a disappointing 1-12 start to the season under then head coach, P.J. Carlesimo. Since taking the reigns from Carlesimo, the Thunder has shown marked improvement in a number of statistical categories including, field-goal percentage (5.1%), rebounding (3.1) and points per game (9.6).

Under Brooks, the Thunder posted a 22-47 (.319%) record, including a 15-17 (.469%) stretch from late December through early March.

Thunder Quick Facts

- In the last 15 games in which the Thunder hold their opponent to fewer than 100 points, OKC boasts a 14-1 record.
- In 19 of the Thunder 23 wins this season, OKC outrebounded their opponent.
- In the 23 Thunder wins, OKC averages 53.7 rebounds per contest. If the Thunder were to maintain such a clip throughout the entire course of the season, they would lead the NBA in rebounding.
- The Thunder conclude the year ranked 6th in the NBA in rebounding, 8th in fast break points and 7th for points in the paint.
- At the outset of the 2008-09 NBA season, the Thunder were the fourth youngest team in the NBA with an average age of 25 years and 70 days (OKC trailed only Golden State, Portland and Memphis).
- The Thunder conclude their season with a 126-85 victory versus the Los Angeles Clippers in the season finale. The 41-point margin of victory is the largest OKC lead at any point during the season.
