Guard José Barea: Returned Feb. 1 vs. Indiana, after missing the previous seven contests (and 10 of 11) due to a sprained left ankle suffered Jan. 10 vs. Chicago.

Forward Michael Beasley: Returned Jan. 27 vs. San Antonio, having been sidelined for 11 games due to a right midfoot sprain suffered Jan. 6 vs. Cleveland.

Guard Malcolm Lee: Underwent surgery on Dec. 30 to repair a torn meniscus in his left knee. He missed the first 24 games, and was assigned to Sioux Falls (D-League) on Feb. 6.

Last Game: Monday, Feb. 13 – Orlando 102, Minnesota 89

Jason Richardson's 17 points led six double-figure scorers and Orlando handed the Timberwolves their fourth consecutive loss with a 102-89 decision on Monday night at the Amway Center. Dwight Howard capped a 15-6 start for the Magic, but Minnesota rallied to within 29-26 by quarter's end on Ricky Rubio's last-second 3-pointer. Orlando outscored the Wolves 12-4 to open the second period, with Earl Clark providing six points, and took a 55-44 lead into halftime as Minnesota committed turnovers on four of its final eight possessions. The margin ballooned to 20 early in the third on a Chris Duhon 3-pointer, and Richardson had 13 points in the quarter to help the Magic maintain a 79-66 advantage into the fourth. The Wolves pulled to within eight on a pair of Derrick Williams free throws with 5:47 to play, but came up empty on their next trip and Orlando responded with back-to-back treys from J.J. Redick and Jameer Nelson to thwart the comeback. Hedo Turkoglu chipped in 14 points and six assists for the Magic, while Kevin Love paced Minnesota with 19 points and 15 rebounds, and Nikola Pekovic tallied 16 points and 13 boards.

Previous Game: Saturday, Feb. 11 – New York 100, Minnesota 98

Jeremy Lin totaled 20 points and eight assists, and sank the tie-breaking free throw with 4.9 seconds left, as New York extended its winning streak to five games with a 100-98 victory over the Timberwolves on Saturday night at Target Center. Minnesota bolted to a 22-11 lead by hitting nine of its first 11 shots, but Lin tallied the game's next six points and the Knicks went ahead early in the second on back-to-back treys from Mike Bibby and Iman Shumpert. Derrick Williams capped a 10-0 surge that helped the Wolves rebuild a 62-54 lead by halftime, but New York pulled even at 73-73 on Landry Fields' basket with 3:53 left in the third. Minnesota rode Nikola Pekovic's 12-point quarter to reclaim an 87-82 edge entering the fourth, and went up 98-95 with 39.9 seconds remaining when Ricky Rubio ended the Wolves' nine-minute drought without a field goal. However, Steve Novak drilled a 3-pointer to knot the score and New York took advantage of two Minnesota turnovers to eke out the victory. Shumpert had 20 points for the Knicks, while Kevin Love topped the Wolves with 32 points and 21 rebounds, and Pekovic added 21 points and 13 boards.

WOLF TRACKS: Orlando extended the Wolves' losing streak to four with Monday's 102-89 decision, the Magic's seventh straight win vs. Minnesota dating to April 2008... The loss dropped Minnesota to 13-16 and 2.5 games out of 8th place in the Western Conference playoff race; still, it's their best 29-game start since opening 2006-07 at 14-15. New York overcame an early 11-point deficit to hand the Wolves a 100-98 setback on Saturday... Dallas averted a sweep of the three-game season series with last Friday's 104-97 decision at Target Center; Minnesota had won the first two meetings (99-82 on Jan. 1 at home, 105-90 on Jan. 25 in Dallas)... Memphis halted the Wolves' second three-game winning streak of the season with last Wednesday's 85-80 verdict... At 6-6, the Wolves are one of five Western teams with a .500+ road record; they finished 5-36 away from Target Center in both 2009-10 and 2010-11... Minnesota completed a 2-0 homestand by edging Sacramento, 86-84, on Feb. 7, its second win over the Kings this year (also 99-86 on Jan. 16)... The Wolves beat Houston for the second time in six nights with the 100-91 triumph on Feb. 4; they notched a 120-108 victory on Jan. 30... Indiana handed the Wolves a 109-99 defeat on Feb. 1; Minnesota is 3-9 vs. Eastern opponents, including 1-5 at Target Center. L.A. dealt Minnesota a 106-101 setback on Jan. 29; two nights earlier, Minnesota posted an 87-79 home triumph vs. San Antonio, and they claimed a 105-90 win at Dallas on Jan. 25... Utah ended Minnesota's three-game winning streak with the 108-98 decision on Jan. 21; it's their longest run since putting together four in a row from Jan. 29-Feb. 6, 2010... Minnesota began its Western swing by overcoming a 15-point deficit to beat the Clippers at the buzzer on Jan. 20... The 93-72 win at Washington on Jan. 8 ended the Wolves' 12-game road losing streak, while the New Year's Day victory over Dallas snapped their franchise-record 18-game skid.

SCHEDULE NOTES: Saturday's loss to New York wrapped up the 10th of 20 sets of back-to-back games for Minnesota this year; it also concluded a four-games-in-five-nights run... The Feb. 7 win over Sacramento was the Wolves' 10th vs. Western rivals, surpassing their victory totals from both last season (7-45) and 2009-10 (8-44); they finished 13-39 in 2008-09... The Feb. 1 loss to Indiana ended a stretch in which the Wolves played eight straight .500+ opponents; after tonight, Minnesota's next will be against teams with .500+ records... The Jan. 10 loss to Chicago capped off the first of two three-games-in-three-nights scenarios; the other is slated for Feb. 28-29-Mar. 1... Minnesota began the 2011-12 season with a 104-100 loss to Oklahoma City on Dec. 26 at Target Center, the 11th straight year they've started at home... The Wolves drew a standing-room-only crowd of 19,406 vs. Oklahoma City, their eighth sellout in 23 home openers and the first since an SRO 19,443 turned up for the Nov. 2, 2007 loss to Denver... Minnesota drew an SRO 20,232 for Saturday's game vs. New York, its largest home crowd since the 2003-04 season and the 4th-largest crowd all-time at Target Center... The five sellouts in 2011-12 eclipses the total from the Wolves' prior three seasons (one last year, two in 2009-10, zero in 2008-09)...

MARGINAL INFORMATION: Minnesota spotted Dallas a 14-point lead before rallying to win on Jan. 25... The Wolves have fallen behind by 14+ points in 10 of their past 16 starts, but are 8-8 in that stretch (also making up deficits Jan. 18 vs. Detroit and Jan. 20 at the Clippers)... The 15-point loss to Houston on Jan. 23 is Minnesota's largest of the season; seven of the Wolves' last 12 losses have been by double-figure margins... With Saturday's 100-98 loss to New York, Minnesota tumbles to 3-6 thus far in games decided by four points or less; only Portland (1-8) has more losses in that category... Conversely, six of the Wolves' 13 victories have been by double-digit spreads (99-82 vs. Dallas; 106-96 vs. San Antonio; 93-72 at Washington; 99-86 vs. Sacramento; 105-90 at Dallas; 120-108 at Houston)... Last year, Minnesota was 11-32 in games decided by 10+ points and 4-20 in two-possession games... They suffered 10 defeats by 20+ points, including a club-record 128-86 setback in Orlando on Nov. 3, 2010... Minnesota's biggest winning margins in 2010-11 were 34 points (129-95 vs. Cleveland, Dec. 4, 2010) and 26 points (101-75 vs. Indiana, Mar. 9, 2011)... The Nov. 24, 2010 defeat vs. San Antonio represented the 10th time in franchise history that Minnesota had lost after building a lead of 20+ points...

THE IRON RANGE: The Wolves tallied a season-high 120 points in the Jan. 30 victory at Houston, including a franchise-record 42 in the 3rd quarter... On the flipside, the Feb. 8 loss at Memphis produced a season-low 80 points, Minnesota's second straight sub-90 scoring night (one of eight overall)... Minnesota also shot a season-high 58.1% at Houston, its second 50%+ night this season (57.7% vs. San Antonio, Jan. 2) and its best figure in a road game since hitting 58.1% at Seattle on Jan. 21, 2005... Minnesota was held to 34.3% Jan. 13 at New Orleans, its lowest percentage ever in a win and one of six sub-40% outings this year... At the other end, the Wolves have kept 19 of their first 29 opponents below 45% from the floor; Washington's 34.5% effort on Jan. 8 is their best defensive showing to date... Chicago shot 53.1% and scored 111 points on Jan. 10 at Target Center; both figures are season highs vs. Minnesota... The Wolves are 16th in scoring defense (allowing 95.6 ppg) and 12th in defensive FG percentage (43.7%), posting eight sub-90 point defensive efforts in 29 starts this year; they held only six of 82 opponents below 90 a season ago, and just four of 82 in 2009-10... Minnesota finished last in scoring defense (107.7 ppg) and 23rd in defensive FG percentage (46.8%) last season...

TURNOVER TROUBLE: Minnesota coughed up 28 TOs in Friday's loss to Dallas, one shy of the club single-game record, and followed up with a 23-TO night vs. New York... Since tying the franchise record low by committing only four miscues vs. the Lakers on Jan. 29, the Wolves have seen their TOs climb to 18.7 per game in the ensuing nine starts... Minnesota committed 26 miscues in the Dec. 27 loss at Milwaukee and followed with a 25-TO showing vs. Miami on Dec. 30 (with the Heat capitalizing for 31 points)... The Wolves rank 28th in TOs (16.4 per game) and 29th in steals allowed (8.86 per game)... Meanwhile, they're 16th in TOs forced (14.8 per game) and 15th in steals (7.79 per game)... Those figures have contributed to a 5.2 ppg deficit in fast-break scoring for Minnesota, which ranks 25th in points scored in transition (10.4 per game) and 29th in points allowed (15.6 per game)... Atlanta outscored the Wolves 26-6 in fast-break points on Jan. 14, Dallas racked up a 24-4 margin on Jan. 1, and Miami enjoyed a 27-8 advantage on Dec. 30... A year ago, the Wolves ranked 24th in the NBA in fast-break scoring (11.9 ppg) and 28th in fast-break points allowed (17.1 per game)...

BOARD REPORT: Memphis outrebounded the Wolves 59-47 last Wednesday, ending a run of eight straight games in which Minnesota had enjoyed the advantage; the Grizzlies' 59 boards are the most by a Wolves opponent since Dallas totaled 60 on Nov. 29, 2003... The Wolves enjoyed a +7.0 rpg margin (47.8-40.8) in those eight, after being outboarded by -5.1 rpg (39.3-44.4) in their previous nine starts... Minnesota pulled down 24 offensive boards Jan. 29 vs. the Lakers, scoring a club-record 32 second-chance points... Chicago outrebounded the Wolves 47-30 on Jan. 10, Minnesota's largest deficit of the year... The Wolves piled up a 54-35 spread vs. Dallas on New Year's Day; they're 5th in the NBA in second-chance scoring (14.5 per game)... Minnesota has climbed to 6th in total rebounding pct. (.512), 13th in offensive rebound pct. (.278) and 12th in defensive rebound pct. (.745)... Last year, the Wolves ended the season 3rd in total rebound pct. (.517) and 2nd in offensive rebound pct. (.296), holding the edge 49 times in 82 games and enjoying 20+ board margins on six occasions (14 double-figure advantages)... Minnesota also led the NBA in second-chance points, netting 16.2 ppg...

THREE-POINT PLAN: Minnesota went 9-for-21 from beyond the arc in its Jan. 25 victory at Dallas, but has plummeted to 28.1% (55-for-196) in 11 ensuing contests... The Wolves are 4-1 this season when hitting 10+ three-pointers; they drilled a season-high 12 treys in the Jan. 2 win vs. San Antonio... Minnesota currently ranks 21st in three-point accuracy (32.5%) as well as 15th in treys made (6.52 per game)... The Wolves climbed to 5th in the NBA in three-point accuracy (37.6%) last season, after ending 23rd in 2009-10 (34.1%); they set a new franchise single-season record with 589 treys made (543 in 2008-09)... Minnesota sank 10+ three-pointers on 17 occasions a year ago, including a franchise-record 18 treys (in 26 attempts) in the Dec. 4 victory over Cleveland... Meanwhile, Anthony Morrow sank eight three-pointers on Feb. 3 at New Jersey, the eighth time an opponent has made 8+ vs. Minnesota... To date, the Wolves rank 20th in the NBA in three-point percentage defense (35.5%) but are 14th in fewest treys allowed (6.28 per game)... Minnesota finished 27th in defensive three-point percentage (37.4%) and 29th in treys allowed (7.79 per game) in 2010-11...

GOING TO EXTREMES: The Wolves scored a club-record 42 points in the 3rd period of their Jan. 30 victory at Houston, and finished the night shooting 58.1% from the floor -- their best percentage in a road game in seven years. Meanwhile, Michael Beasley pumped in a game- and season-high 34 points at Houston, tying the franchise single-game bench scoring record:

RUBIO EARNS ROOKIE HONOR: On Feb. 1, Timberwolves guard Ricky Rubio was named the NBA's Western Conference Rookie of the Month for games played from the start of the season (Dec. 25) through January. Rubio, the 5th overall pick in the 2009 NBA Draft, led all rookies in assists (8.9 apg), steals (2.24 spg) and minutes played (34.4 mpg), while ranking 4th in scoring (11.4 ppg), 5th in rebounding (4.7 rpg) and 3rd in FT accuracy (81.7%). He notched a league-best nine point/assist double-doubles in 21 games (11 starts), highlighted by a season-high 14-assist performance Jan. 8 at Washington and capped by an 18-point, 11-assist, eight-rebound effort in the Jan. 30 victory at Houston. He swiped 3+ steals on 11 occasions, topped by a six-steal outing on Jan. 18 vs. Detroit, and logged a season-high 46:27 in the Jan. 25 win at Dallas. He becomes the fourth rookie in franchise history to earn the monthly award, joining Stephon Marbury (January 1997), Randy Foye (December 2006) and Kevin Love (March 2009).

EL LADRÓN: Ricky Rubio swiped six steals in the Feb. 3 win at New Jersey, equaling the highest total by a Wolves player since Kevin Garnett picked off seven at the Clippers on Jan. 27, 2007. Rubio drew one offensive foul Saturday vs. New York (raising his season total to 23) and has assisted on 77 three-pointers this season, including six in the Jan. 25 victory at Dallas.
