TEAM NOTES

HOME SWEET HOME: The Warriors played their final game of the year at ORACLE Arena on 4/13 vs. San Antonio, and they finished with a winning record at home for the fourth consecutive season and the sixth time in the past seven years (20-21 at home in 2004-05)...This gives Golden State a very impressive winning percentage of .592 at ORACLE over the past seven years (chart to right).

NELLIE IN LEAGUE OF HIS OWN: Wednesday's season finale game at Phoenix was the 3,369th regular season NBA game that Coach Nelson has been involved in as either a player or head coach, which surpassed Lenny Wilkens (3,363) for the most in NBA history...Nelson recorded his 1,309th victory as an NBA head coach on 4/11 against the Jazz...He is just the second coach to reach the 1,300 win mark, trailing only Lenny Wilkens (1,332 wins), the all-time winningest head coach in NBA history...The chart to the right highlights all 3,369 games that Nelson has been involved in:

THE WARRIORS INJURY WOES: The Warriors began this season with a projected starting lineup of Ellis, Jackson, Maggette, Harrington (replaced by Jamal Crawford after trade) and Biedrins (Also includes Brandan Wright from 12/19 on when he became a consistent starter)...Throughout the season, the Warriors had at least two of their projected starters out in 54 games and had at least three out in 26 games (four out 11 times) due to injury or illness...In 2008-09, Warriors players combined to miss 234 games due to injury or illness, an average of 2.9 players out per game...The Warriors did not play a single game with every player healthy...Above is a chart showing the number of games Warriors missed due to injury/illness/personal reasons:

SHOOTING WELL: The Warriors, who shot 46% Wednesday at Phoenix, shot over 45.0% from the field in 36 of their final 52 games, including 17 games of 50%-or-better...During this stretch the Warriors have outshot their opponents 29 times, including a stretch of 11 straight contests...The Warriors field-goal percentage in their final 52 games was a healthy 47.2% (2,082-4,408 FG)...The Warriors also shot at least 35% from three-point range 38 times during this stretch (32 games with .400-plus and 10 with .500-plus)...The Warriors hit at least five 3-pointers in 44 of their final 52 games and have hit nine-or-more 19 times...They are shooting 40.3% (379-940 3FG) from deep in their final 52 games.

WARRIORS 100% FROM FT LINE: The Warriors got to the line on 20 occasions and connected on every single attempt on 3/30 against Memphis...This was the first time that the Warriors had shot 100% from the free throw line since going 10-of-10 on 4/1/03 at Portland...It was the first time the Warriors have shot 100% from the line when attempting 20-or-more free throws since 11/19/74 at Buffalo when they were 22-of-22...Here is a look at the Warriors all-time free throw shooting games:

GETTING TO THE LINE: The Warriors were aggressive all season taking the ball to the hoop this season and averaged 29.2 free-throw attempts per game which ranked second overall in the league...The Warriors attempted 52 free-throws and connected on 47 of them (90.4%) vs. Miami (12/1)...Their 47 made free-throws is the most in the NBA this season and the most the Warriors have made since they made 47 at New Jersey on 3/28/92...Their 52 attempts ties their season-high...The warriors attempted 30-or-more free throws 38 times, 40-or-more 10 times and 50-or-more twice...Here is a look at the top five in free-throw attempts per game:

THE WARRIORS PUT UP THE POINTS: The Warriors picked up where they left off in 2007-08, and continued to put up the points on a nightly basis...The Warriors ranked second overall in the NBA in points per game with 108.5...Golden State scored 100-or-more points 62 times this season and they put up 110-plus on 37 occasions while scoring 120-plus 15 times...Last season the Warriors paced the league in scoring with 111.0 points per game...The Warriors have also finished the season ranked first in fast break points per game with 18.4...They scored 25-plus fast break points in 16 games this season.

DOWN TO THE WIRE: The Warriors were involved in numerous close games this season, but had a difficult time closing out many of them...The Warriors lost 14 games this season where they have been leading or tied within the final four minutes of the game...The Warriors also won 11 of their last 19 home games and could have easily had a 17-game home winning streak, but thanks to an overtime loss, a triple overtime loss, two back-to-back buzzer beater defeats and close losses to the Lakers and Bobcats, they were 15-11 in their final 26 at ORACLE...In 2008-09, the Warriors played in 24 games decided by five points or less and were 8-16 in those games...Golden State played in six overtime (2-4) games this season which was the most by the Warriors since playing six in 2005-06 (went 1-5).

BLOCK PARTY: The Warriors finished the season ranked first in the NBA in blocks per game with 6.43...Warriors players Andris Biedrins, Anthony Randolph, Ronny Turiaf and Brandan Wright are all averaging at least 0.90 block per game and Turiaf ranked fourth in the league in blocks per game with 2.13...The Warriors had not led the NBA in blocks per game since the 1988-89 season when they averaged 7.8 per game (this was the only other time in Warriors history finishing number one).

2008-09 GOLDEN STATE WARRIORS SEASON ENDING NOTES

YOUTHFUL WARRIORS: The Warriors tipped off the 2008-09 NBA Season with the youngest roster in the entire league...Of the 15 Warriors on the roster, 12 players were 25-or-younger as of the first day of the regular season, and six were 22-or-younger...The average age of the Warriors roster is only 24-years and 71-days old (as of opening day)...The Warriors are the youngest followed by Portland (24 years and 147 days) and Memphis (24 years and 288 days).

THE BENCH STEPPED UP: The Warriors bench played extremely well over their final 67 games...The bench scored 30-or-more in 48 of the last 67 games, including 23 games of 40-plus and five games of 50-plus...The Warriors had at least one reserve reach double-figures in all but five of the last 67 and had two-or-more players score 10-plus in 28...The bench averaged 25.3 points in the first 15 games, including six games of less than 20 points...In the final 67, they averaged 34.7 and only failed to score 20-or-more five times.

STOP THOSE THIEVES!: The Warriors finished within the top 10 in steals per game...Golden State recorded 10-or-more steals in 20 games and snatched away at least eight in 40 contests this season...The Warriors ranked sixth in the NBA with 7.78 steals per game...Last season the Warriors finished the year ranked second in steals per game with an average of 9.07...Here is a look at the top six in the league:

PLAYER NOTES

MORROW AND AZUBUIKE IN TOP 5 FOR 3P%: Rookie Anthony Morrow ranked first place in the NBA for three-point field goal percentage...Morrow shot 46.7% (86-184 3FG) from beyond the arc for the season...Morrow became the first Warrior player in franchise history to rank first in this category...He also became just the third undrafted player to rank first in 3-point percentage (Tim Legler and Bruce Bowen also did it)...Azubuike also finished in the top five, ranking fourth overall in the league shooting 44.8% from deep...Here is a look at the top five in the league.:

WATSON MAKES WARRIORS' ALL-TIME LIST: A large chunk of Watson's career-high 38 points on 4/11 at Utah came at the free throw line...Watson got to the line 16 times in the game and connected on every attempt...This is tied for third best in franchise history for most free throws made without a single miss (including Philadelphia years)...Only four other players in Warriors history have shot 100% from the line when attempting at least 16 free throws: Mitch Richmond, Purvis Short, Rick Barry and Paul Arizin (17-of-17 three times, all in Philadelphia)...Chart to the right shows all-time best performances since moving to the Bay Area:

UNDRAFTED WONDERS MAKE HISTORY: When C.J. Watson scored a career-high 38 points on 4/11 at Utah, the Golden State Warriors became the first team since the NBA went to the modern draft (not territorial) in 1966 to have three undrafted players score 30-or-more points in a game in the same season...Fellow undrafted players Kelenna Azubuike and Anthony Morrow have also registered 30-point games this season...Azubuike has done it twice, most recently he scored 32 points on 4/10 vs. Houston...Morrow has also done it twice; he scored a career-high 37 points in his first ever NBA start on 11/15 at L.A. Clippers and dropped in 33 on 4/15 at Phoenix.

RANDOLPH FINISHES YEAR STRONG: Rookie Anthony Randolph closed out the season playing at a very high level...He averaged 13.5 points, 10.5 rebounds, 1.59 blocks and 32 minutes in his past 12 games...He also grabbed 10-plus boards in six straight games during this stretch, becoming one of only two rookies to accomplish that this year (Kevin Love did it six straight games) and the first Warrior rookie to do it since Larry Smith (had two streaks of eight and one of six in 1981)...In the 24 games that Randolph played at least 20 minutes, he averaged 12.8 points, 9.2 rebounds and 1.88 blocks...During the month of March, Randolph ranked among rookie leaders in blocked shots (1st), rebounding (4th) and scoring (8th).

JACKSON IN ELITE COMPANY: Stephen Jackson went on a tear in February and March, averaging 23.0 points, 7.4 assists and 5.9 rebounds in his final 21 games of the year (2/2-3/25)...Jackson was the Warriors main distributor the entire year, but really stepped up his assist numbers during this stretch...He dished out at least seven assists 12 times and recorded 10-or-more on five occasions in his final 21 games...He also registered the first triple-double of his career 2/4 vs. Phoenix with 30 points, 11 rebounds and 10 assists...Jackson recorded four games with at least 30 points and 10 assists, all within his last 21 games...Jackson became one of just six players to accomplish this feat at least three times this season:

RONNY THE RIM PROTECTOR: Ronny Turiaf ranked fourth in the league in blocks per game with 2.13...He rejected two-or-more shots in 45 games and four-plus in 18...He recorded five blocks seven times this year and swatted away a career-high six at Indiana (12/17)...Turiaf averaged only 21.5 minutes per game, and finished the year ranked second in the league in blocks per minute with an average of one block every 10.1 minutes...Turiaf recorded at least one block in every game of the season but 10.

THE MONTA OF OLD: Fourth year guard Monta Ellis looked like the Monta of old in his final 11 games of the year...He recorded at least 20 points in nine of his final 11 games and shot an extremely efficient percentage from the floor...Ellis averaged 25.5 points, 5.0 rebounds and 4.6 assists while shooting 48% (115-238 FG) from the field in his last 11 games...When not out with an ankle injury, Ellis appeared in 25 games and scored 20-plus in 11 of them...He averaged 19.0 points, 4.3 rebounds and 3.7 assists this season...The Warriors were a much more dangerous team with Ellis in the lineup, posting a 12-13 record with him compared to a 17-40 record without him.

AZUBUIKE REACHING 15: The Warriors experienced a lot of success when Azubuike scores at least 15 points this year...in the 37 games he scored 15-plus, the Warriors were 17-20 and scored at least 100 points in 33 of those games...In 24 of the Warriors victories, Azubuike has scored at least nine points...He surpassed the 10-point mark on 57 occasions and scored 20-or-more 16 times this year (30 times twice)...Last year Azubuike scored 15-plus points 14 times and 20-plus twice (one 30-plus game).

2008-09 GOLDEN STATE WARRIORS SEASON ENDING NOTES

AZUBUIKE AMONG LEAGUE'S MOST IMPROVED: Kelenna Azubuike has seen his point production improve every season he has been in the NBA, and people are beginning to notice just how much better the three-year player has gotten...Azubuike averaged 8.5 points in just his second year in the NBA in 2007-08, and he increased that average by **5.9 points this season**...There were only 14 players in the NBA who averaged at least 8.0 points in 2007-08 who increased their scoring output by at least 5.0 points this year...Kelenna was also one of the most consistent contributors for the Warriors this season, **posting 15-plus points 37 times and 20-plus 16 times (30 points twice)**...He also rebounded well, averaging 5.0 per game, which was the fourth highest on the squad.

AZUBUIKE AMONG LEAGUE'S MOST IMPROVED, PART II: He has also been extremely efficient with his scoring, shooting 46.6% (384-824 FG) from the field and 44.8% (94-210 3FG) from beyond the arc...In fact, Azubuike has improved his three-point shooting by .084 from 2007-08, which is the third best percentage increase in the NBA since last season...Here is a look at the top five players and their 3-point shooting improvement (minimum 0.7 three-pointers made per scheduled game in both seasons):

JACKSON DOMINATED IN FEBRUARY: Over the 10 games spanning the month of February, Stephen Jackson averaged 27.3 points, 8.1 assists, 5.7 rebounds and 2.10 steals in 44.0 minutes...Jackson became the first Warrior to average 25 points, 8 assists and 5 rebounds for an entire month since Guy Rodgers averaged 25.8 points, 10.9 assists and 6.5 rebounds in November of 1965...He shot 47.3% (95-201 FG) from the field and 46.4% (26-56 3FG) from three-point range during this stretch...He recorded one triple-double and three double-doubles in the month and recorded at least 30 points and 10-assists in three of those contests...He is one of only two players in the league to record back-to-back games with 30-plus points and 10-plus assists (Chris Paul is other)...Jackson is also the first Warrior record three games with 30 points/10 assists in a five game stretch since Tim Hardaway did it three times from 1/16-1/25/91.

BIEDRINS' BREAK OUT: The 22-year-old Latvian had the best year of his young career this season with averages of 11.9 points, 11.2 rebounds, 2.0 assists, 1.02 steals, 1.55 blocks and 30.0 minutes per game...Every single one of these categories was a career-high average for Andris...He has also collected 28 double-doubles which was sixth most in the league among centers...In addition, Biedrins registered six games with at least 15 points and 15 rebounds...Here is a list of where he ranks among the rest of the league in many different categories (does not qualify in rebounds and blocks due to not enough games played, but ranks 4th and 18th respectively with no qualifiers):

JACKSON 2ND AMONG FORWARDS: Forward Stephen Jackson dished out assists all season long for the Warriors...He averaged 6.5 dimes per game and handed out at least seven assists 27 times and 10-plus seven times...In fact, if he qualified, Jackson would rank second among all forwards in assists per game:

LOGGING THE MINUTES: Stephen Jackson ranked second in the league in minutes played per game...Jackson averaged 39.6 minutes and played 40-or-more minutes in 36 games this season...Jamal Crawford averaged 38.1 minutes (10th in NBA), Corey Maggette averaged 31.1 minutes per game, Andris Biedrins averaged 30.0 minutes per contest and Monta Ellis averaged 35.7 minutes...Here is how the top five in the league look in minutes played per game:

THE 50 POINT MAN: Jamal Crawford erupted for 50 points 12/20 at Charlotte to register his third career game of 50-or-more points...This was Crawford's second time scoring 40-or-more points as a Warrior...No Warrior has scored 40-plus points at least twice in one season since Jason Richardson did it three times in 2005-06...Crawford's 50 points was also the first time a Warrior has reached the half-century mark since 12/6/00 when Antawn Jamison scored 51 against the L.A. Lakers...This performance is even more significant because it puts Jamal Crawford in some very elite company...Crawford is now one of only seven active players to have scored 50-or-more points at least three times in their career...He is also one of only four players in NBA history to have scored 50-plus points for three different teams throughout their careers...Here is a look at the prestigious groups Crawford has joined thanks to his game at Charlotte:

CRAWFORD IS KING OF FOUR-POINT PLAY: Jamal Crawford not only converted another four-point play on 3/28 vs. Denver, he converted two, on back-to-back possessions...It was the first time a player has converted two four-point plays in the same game since Mike Miller did for Memphis on 12/14/07 against the Clippers...The Elias Sports Bureau was unable to find any other time in NBA history that a player converted four-point plays on two straight possessions...This was his eighth on the year (seven with Warriors)...He was also fouled shooting a three 22 times since joining the Warriors...According to Elias, Crawford has converted 18 four-point plays in his career, and in the past five years no player has converted on more four-point plays than Jamal Crawford:

Don Nelson, the second-winningest coach in NBA history, is currently in the third year of his second stint with the Warriors, having been named head coach on August 30, 2006.

Nelson, 68, guided the Warriors to a 48-34 record in 2007-08, marking the team's best record since 1993-94 and just the ninth time in franchise history (since 1946) and the third time since 1975-76 that the team has amassed 48 victories in a single season. Additionally, Golden State's 48-34 (.585) record in 2007-08 marks the best record for a non-playoff team since the NBA adopted its current 16-team postseason format prior to the 1984 NBA Playoffs.

After starting the 2007-08 season 0-6, the Warriors posted a 48-28 record through the remainder of the season. Nelson's squad was successful both at home and on the road, posting a 27-14 mark at ORACLE Arena, and a 21-20 record on the road – which marked just the seventh time in franchise history (since 1946) and just the third time since 1975-76 that the Warriors won at least 21 games on the road. Golden State led the NBA in scoring (111.0 ppg) while putting together a string of 37-consecutive games of at least 100 points, which was the longest such streak in the NBA since 1992-93.

In his most recent two-season stint with Golden State, Nelson has posted a combined 90-74 record (.549), leading the Warriors to their first consecutive winning seasons since 1990-91 (44-38) and 1991-92 (55-27). Nelson returned to Golden State prior to the 2006-07 season, leading the Warriors to a 42-40 record and their first trip to the NBA Playoffs in 13 years. Additionally, he guided Golden State to a First Round triumph over the top-seeded Dallas Mavericks, marking the first time that a #8 seed had defeated a #1 seed in a seven-game series in NBA history.

Currently in his 30th season as an NBA head coach, Nelson is the second-winningest coach in NBA history (1,309), trailing only Lenny Wilkens (1,332). Overall, he has compiled a 1,309-1,007 (.565) record in 2,316 regular-season games over a span of 29 years. Only Wilkens has coached more NBA games (2,487). In fact, Nelson, who is in his 45th year in the NBA as a player, coach, general manager or consultant, passed Lenny Wilkens on April 5, 2009 for most combined games in history as a player and head coach with 3,369 career games.

In his first stint with Golden State, Nelson spent six-plus years as the team's head coach and general manager from 1988-89 through the first 45 games of the 1994-95 campaign, amassing an overall record of 277-260 (.516) in 537 regular-season contests. The Warriors qualified for the playoffs in four of his six complete seasons with the team (1989, 1991, 1992, 1994), highlighted by a pair of 50-win seasons in 1991-92 (55-27) and 1993-94 (50-32). In addition to earning NBA Coach of the Year honors with the Warriors in 1991-92, Nelson also served as head coach of the Western Conference All-Star team in 1992.

During his previous tenure with the club, the Warriors ranked among the top four scoring teams in the NBA in each of his six complete seasons, including the 1989-90 (116.3) and 1991-92 (118.7) campaigns, when Golden State led the NBA in points per game. He originally joined the Warriors as executive vice president on July 1, 1987 and was named general manager on December 30, 1987 before taking over as head coach the following season. He resigned his position with the club on February 13, 1995. His overall record in eight-plus seasons as head coach with Golden State entering 2008-09 is 367-334 (.524).

One of only two coaches in league history (joining Pat Riley) to earn NBA Coach of the Year honors on three different occasions (1983 and 1985 with Milwaukee, 1992 with Golden State), Nelson has enjoyed coaching stints in four NBA cities, including Milwaukee (1976-1987), Golden State (1988-1995, 2006-08), New York (1995-96) and Dallas (1997-2005). He is one of only two coaches in league annals (joining Wilkens) to register 250-plus victories with three different teams, having accomplished the feat in Milwaukee (540), Golden State (367) and Dallas (339). Nelson's teams have registered 50-or-more wins in 13 of his 29 seasons as a head coach, placing him third on the all-time list of 50-win campaigns trailing only Pat Riley (17) and Phil Jackson (14). He has led his teams to 18 playoff appearances and ranks 10th on the NBA's all-time play-off winning list with 75 post-season victories.

Born on May 15, 1940, in Muskegon, Michigan, Don Arvid Nelson was a two-time All-American at Iowa, where he graduated in 1962. Don married Joy Wolfgram on June 19, 1991, in a ceremony that was held on the Warriors' court inside the Oakland Coliseum. Nelson has five grown children, Julie, Donn, Christie, Katie and Lee.
