SEASON SERIES NOTES

- The Lakers won the season series in 2019-20, 2-1.
- In three games against the Lakers this season, **Damian Lillard** averaged 36.0 points (50.8% FG, 39.4% 3-PT, 87.9% FT), 6.0 rebounds and 9.0 assists. Lillard scored 48 points (17-30 FG, 7-12 3-PT, 7-8 FT) to go with nine rebounds, 10 assists and two steals in Portland's 127-119 victory in Los Angeles on Jan. 31.
- **CJ McCollum** averaged 17.3 points (41.2% FG, 29.2% 3-PT, 75.0% FT), 3.7 assists and 4.7 rebounds in three games against Los Angeles this season.
- In two games against the Lakers this season, **Carmelo Anthony** averaged 14.0 points (33.3% FG, 40.0% 3-PT, 88.9% FT), 4.0 rebounds and 1.5 assists.
- LeBron James averaged 24.7 points (45.0% FG, 38.1% 3-PT, 63.2% FT), 7.3 rebounds and 11.3 assists in three games against the Trail Blazers this season.
- In three games against Portland this season, Anthony Davis averaged 32.0 points (55.9% FG, 40.0% 3-PT, 82.8% FT), 11.3 rebounds, 4.3 assists and 2.67 blocks. He had 37 points, 16 rebounds, six assists and five blocks against the Trail Blazers on Jan. 31.

PLAYOFF SERIES NOTES

- Portland and Los Angeles have played in the first round on six other occasions. The Trail Blazers beat the Lakers in the first round of the 1992 Playoffs on their way to an NBA Finals meeting with the Chicago Bulls. The Lakers won the other five first round meetings between the teams.
- The Trail Blazers and the Lakers are meeting in the postseason for the 12th time. Portland has advanced twice past the Lakers, while Los Angeles has won the other 10 series. The Trail Blazers other first win over the Lakers came in the 1977 Western Conference Finals, propelling Portland to a NBA Finals victory over the Philadelphia 76ers.
- The Trail Blazers and Lakers last played each other in the postseason in the first round of the 2002 Playoffs. Portland's leading scorer that series was Rasheed Wallace while the Lakers were led by Kobe Bryant and Shaquille O'Neal. Current Lakers forward LeBron James was 14 months away from being drafted by the Cleveland Cavaliers while Trail Blazers guard **Damian Lillard** was 11 years old.
- Portland and Los Angeles played met in the playoffs five times between 1997 and 2002.
- Portland is 6-19 all-time against Los Angeles in the first round.

CONNECTIONS

- Los Angeles forward LeBron James and Portland forward **Carmelo Anthony** were the first and third picks of the 2003 NBA Draft. Along with Kyle Korver of the Milwaukee Bucks, they are the only active players remaining from their draft class.
- Trail Blazers guard **Damian Lillard** (sixth) and Lakers forward Anthony Davis (first) were both lottery picks in the 2012 NBA Draft.
- Trail Blazers forward **Trevor Ariza** won the NBA Championship with the Lakers in 2009.

The Lakers raced out to leads of 15-0 and 30-10 in the first quarter, sustaining a hot start that was too much for the Trail Blazers to overcome in a 135-110 loss Game 4 loss, giving Los Angeles a 3-1 series lead ... Damian Lillard left the game at the 7:15 mark of the third quarter with a right knee sprain ... Before exiting, Lillard recorded 11 points (3-9 FG, 1-2 3-PT, 4-4 FT), one rebound, four assists and one steal ... Jusuf Nurkic had 20 points (7-10 FG, 6-8 FT), 13 rebounds, four assists and one steal ... CJ McCollum had 18 points (5-13 FG, 2-3 3-PT, 6-8 FT), five rebounds, two assists, two steals and one block ... Carmelo Anthony finished with 16 points (6-15 FG, 1-6 3-PT, 3-3 FT), two rebounds and one assist ... Portland had eight players finish in double figures ... LeBron James led the way for the Lakers with 30 points (10-12 FG, 4-5 3-PT, 6-8 FT), six rebounds, 10 assists and one block ... Anthony Davis had 18 points and five rebounds in 18 minutes.

The Lakers took a 2-1 series lead by means of a 116-108 victory over the Trail Blazers in Game 3 ... Portland held a 57-53 lead at halftime, but were outscored in the third period, 40-29 ... The Lakers outrebounded Portland, 55-38, and attempted 43 free throws (made 28) to the Trail Blazers 19 (made 18) ... Damian Lillard led Portland with 34 points (8-20 FG, 5-11 3-PT, 13-14 FT), five rebounds and seven assists ... CJ McCollum recorded 28 points (12-25 FG, 4-12 3-PT), eight rebounds, four assists, two steals and one block ... Carmelo Anthony scored 20 points to go with six rebounds, two assists, four steals and one block ... Anthony had 13 points in the third quarter on 6-of-6 shooting (1-1 3-PT) ... LeBron James led the Lakers with a game-high 38 points (11-18 FG, 4-8 3-PT, 12-17 FT), 12 rebounds, eight assists and two steals ... Anthony Davis had 29 points (11-18 FG, 7-14 FT), 11 rebounds, eight assists, two steals and three blocks.

First Round, Game #2 - Los Angeles 111, Portland 88 — August 20, AdventHealth Arena, Orlando, Florida

Los Angeles defeated Portland, 111-88, to even the first round series between the Lakers and the Trail Blazers, 1-1 ... Portland was held to 40.0% shooting from the field and 8-of-29 shooting (27.6%) from the three-point line ... Anthony Davis led the Lakers with a game-high 31 points (13-21 FG, 3-4 3-PT, 2-2 FT) to go with 11 rebounds, three assists, one steal and one block ... Damian Lillard had 18 points (6-14 FG, 1-7 3-PT, 5-5 FT) for the Trail Blazers to go with three rebounds, one assist and one steal ... Lillard left the game in the third quarter with a left index finger dislocation ... CJ McCollum had 13 points, five rebounds and three assists ... Jusuf Nurkic had nine points, seven rebounds and two assists ... Hassan Whiteside recorded six points, nine rebounds and three blocks off the bench ... LeBron James had 10 points, six rebounds and seven assists in 27 minutes for L.A.

First Round, Game #1 - Portland 100, Los Angeles 93 — August 18, AdventHealth Arena, Orlando, Florida

The Trail Blazers jumped out to a 1-0 series lead by defeating the top-seeded Lakers, 100-93 ... Portland closed the game on a 19-6 run over the final 6:38 of the game ... Damian Lillard led Portland with 34 points (9-21 FG, 6-13 3-PT, 10-10 FT), five rebounds, five assists and one block ... CJ McCollum had 21 points (8-20 FG, 3-8 3-PT, 2-4 FT), five rebounds and one steal ... Jusuf Nurkic logged 16 points, 15 rebounds and three assists ... Hassan Whiteside had seven points (3-4 FG), eight rebounds and five blocks in 26 minutes off the bench ... Whiteside became the third player in Trail Blazers history to have five blocks in a game as a reserve ... LeBron James led the Lakers with 23 points, 17 rebounds and 16 assists ... Anthony Davis had 28 points (8-24 FG, 0-5 3-PT, 12-17 FT), 11 rebounds, one assist and two blocks ... Portland had four players finish with five fouls ... The Lakers scored a season-high 77 points in the first half, which proved too much for the Trail Blazers, as Portland fell 136-113, at Moda Center ... Portland recorded 20-plus assists for the 12th consecutive contest ... The Trail Blazers forced the Lakers into 19 turnovers ... Portland had six players score in double-figures ... Damian Lillard finished with 29 points (9-18 FG, 2-8 3-PT, 9-11 FT), seven rebounds and eight assists in a game-high 41 minutes ... Hassan Whiteside had 17 points (8-12 FG, 1-2 FT), 10 rebounds and three steals in 32 minutes ... CJ McCollum had 15 points (5-13 FG, 3-7 3-PT, 2-2 FT), three rebounds, and five assists in 35 minutes ... Carmelo Anthony scored 15 points (4-13 FG, 1-3 3-PT, 6-7 FT) to go with three rebounds and three steals in 35 minutes ... Sacramento was led by Anthony Davis who finished with 39 points (12-21 FG, 2-6 3-PT, 13-15 FT), nine rebounds and three blocks ... LeBron James added 31 points (11-23 FG, 4-9 3-PT, 5-7 FT), seven rebounds and eight assists.

Portland brought the game to within six points with seven minutes left in the final quarter, but the Lakers took down the Trail Blazers in Portland, 128-120 ... Portland shot 15-of-35 (42.9%) from beyond the arc, while Los Angeles was 11-of-32 (34.4%) ... Portland had a 16-13 advantage in second chance points ... Both teams had six players in double-figures ... Damian Lillard led Portland with 31 points (7-17 FG, 4-13 3-PT, 13-14 FT) and nine assists ... Hassan Whiteside recorded his 23rd double-double of the season, scoring 19 points to go with 16 rebounds and four blocks ... CJ McCollum scored 18 points and had four assists ... Carmelo Anthony had 13 points, seven rebounds and one block ... Anfernee Simons had 14 points on 6-of-13 shooting off the bench, as well as six rebounds ... Kyle Kuzma led the Lakers with 24 points (9-17 FG, 3-9 3-PT, 3-3 FT) and four rebounds in 30 minutes ... LeBron James added 21 points, seven rebounds and 16 assists.

Game #49 - Portland 127, L.A. Lakers 119 — January 31, Staples Center, Los Angeles, California

Portland scored a season-high 43 points in the third quarter and the Trail Blazers earned one of their biggest wins of the season as they defeated the Lakers, 127-119, at Staples Center ... Portland shot above 50% from the field for the fourth straight contest ... Both teams scored 60 points in the paint ... Los Angeles recorded 42 transition points ... Damian Lillard led Portland with 48 points (17-30 FG, 7-12 3-PT, 7-8 FT), nine rebounds and 10 assists ... Lillard became the third player with six-plus threes in five consecutive games, and set the NBA record for most threes over a five game span with 40 ... Hassan Whiteside had 30 points (13-14 FG, 4-6 FT), 13 rebounds and five blocks, becoming the first player this season with 30p/10r/5b or better in a game ... CJ McCollum had 19 points, six rebounds and five assists in 40 minutes ... Gary Trent Jr. added 10 points off the bench ... Anthony Davis led the Lakers with 37 points, 15 rebounds, six assists and five blocks in 38 minutes.

PLAYOFF NEWS AND NOTES

SEVEN IN A ROW: With a 126-122 victory over the Memphis Grizzlies on Aug. 15 in the first ever Western Conference Play-in game, the Trail Blazers secured a berth in the 2020 NBA Playoffs. It marks Portland's seventh straight postseason appearance and the 36th trip to the playoffs in franchise history. It is the second-longest postseason streak in franchise history (21, 1983-2003) and is tied for the second-longest active streak in the NBA (Houston - 8, Toronto - 7).

STOTTS LEADING THE WAY: Terry Stotts has led the Trail Blazers to the postseason for the seventh consecutive season, making him the first coach in franchise history to make eight straight playoff appearances. Stotts coached Portland to the Western Conference Finals in 2019 and has helped Portland reach the Western Conference Semifinals three times over the last six postseasons. Stotts won an NBA Championship as an assistant coach with the Dallas Mavericks in 2011.

ON THE BIG STAGE: Jusuf Nurkic had a playoff career-high 20 points (7-10 FG, 6-8 3-PT) to go with 13 rebounds, four assists and one steal in Game 4 against the Lakers on Aug. 24. Nurkic has played in nine playoff games during his career, posting averages of 11.6 points, 9.4 rebounds, 2.2 assists, 0.67 blocks and 0.89 steals in 26.0 minutes per game. He is one of nine active NBA players with career postseason averages of at least 10.0 points, 9.0 rebounds and 2.0 assists.

ELIMINATION GAME: Portland faces three straight elimination games against the Lakers in order to advance to the second round of the playoffs. The Trail Blazers won two straight elimination games against the Denver Nuggets during the 2019 Western Conference Semifinals.

BIG GAME DAME: Damian Lillard led the Trail Blazers with 34 points (8-20 FG, 5-11 3-PT, 13-14 FT) against the Lakers in Game 2 on Aug. 22. Lillard has gone for 30 or more points 17 times during his playoff career, including a postseason career-high 50 points against the Thunder in the series-clinching Game 5 of the first round last year. He is one of 25 players in NBA history to have scored 50 points in a playoff game.

NEW HIGHS: Jusuf Nurkic (20 points), Gary Trent Jr. (13 points), Mario Hezonja (11 points) and Wenyen Gabriel (10 points) all recorded postseason career highs for scoring in Game 4. Anfernee Simons scored 11 points in Game 2, marking his post season career high.

MELO SCORING 20: Carmelo Anthony scored 20 points (9-20 FG, 2-3 3-PT) to go with six rebounds, two assists, four steals and one block in Game 3 against the Lakers. Anthony scored 13 points in the third quarter on 6-of-6 shooting (1-1 3-PT). He has scored 20-plus points 53 times in his playoff career.

AT THE LINE: Portland shot 18-of-19 (94.7%) from the free throw line in Game 3. The Trail Blazers are eighth in the league in free throw percentage during the 2020 playoffs (78.8%) while the Lakers are last (67.5%). The Lakers have attempted 28.5 free throws per game this postseason (fourth in NBA) while the Trail Blazers have attempted 24.8 free throws per game (ninth).

PLAYOFF BEAST: Jusuf Nurkic recorded 16 points (4-11 FG, 1-2 3-PT, 7-9 FT), 15 rebounds and three assists against the Lakers in Game 1 on Aug. 18. He had 10 points and 10 rebounds in the first quarter alone, making him the first player to have a double-double in the first quarter of a playoff game since Shaquille O'Neal in 2001.

MELO DOUBLE-DOUBLE: Carmelo Anthony recorded 11 points (3-11 FG, 2-5 3-PT, 3-4 FT), 10 rebounds and five assists in Game 1 against the Lakers on Aug. 18. It was his 16th career postseason double-double and his first since May 5, 2013.

CLIMBING THE RANKS: Damian Lillard (1,363 points) and CJ McCollum (980 point) rank fourth and fifth on the Trail Blazers all-time postseason scoring list.

McBUCKETS: CJ McCollum had 28 points (12-25 FG, 4-12 3-PT) against the Lakers in Game 3 on Aug. 22 and has scored 20-plus points in five of his last six playoff games. He has topped 20 points 28 times in his postseason career, which is the fifth-most in franchise history.

DAME IN THE SPOTLIGHT: Damian Lillard averaged 26.9 points in 16 games during the 2019 NBA Playoffs, marking the fifth-highest scoring average in a postseason in franchise history and the highest for any player that played in multiple series. Lillard averaged 33.0 points in a five game series win over the Thunder in the first round in 2019, which is the highest scoring average for a series in Portland history.

BLOCK PARTY: Hassan Whiteside followed up his five-block performance in Game 1 with three blocks against the Lakers in Game 2 on Aug. 20. He is second in blocks per game this postseason (2.50 blocks).

AS THE EIGHT SEED: The Trail Blazers entered the 2020 Playoffs as the eight seed in the Western Conference. It is just the third time in 36 playoff appearances that the Trail Blazers have entered the postseason as the eight seed. Portland lost to the Golden State Warriors in the first round of the 2017 NBA playoffs as the eight seed and fell to the Los Angeles Lakers in the first round of the 1989 NBA Playoffs as the eight seed.

FIRST YEAR START: Playing in the first playoff game of his career, Wenyen Gabriel started in Game 1 against the Lakers on Aug. 18. He is the first Trail Blazers rookie to start a playoff game since Rudy Fernandez and Nic Batum in the 2009 postseason.

BENCH BOOST: Hassan Whiteside had seven points (3-4 FG, 1-4 FT), eight rebounds and five blocks in 26 minutes off the bench against the Lakers in Game 1. Whiteside is the third player in franchise history to record five blocks in a playoff game while coming off the bench.

GETTING STOPS: The Trail Blazers held the Lakers to 93 points in Game 1 on Aug. 18. It is the second fewest points the Trail Blazers have allowed during the 2019-20 season (regular season and playoffs combined). Portland held the Knicks to 87 points on Dec. 10.

PLAYOFF NEWS AND NOTES

SETTING THE TONE: The Trail Blazers have won each of the last two playoff series in which they won Game 1 (2019 First Round vs. OKC, 2014 First Round vs. Houston).

SHARK ATTACK: CJ McCollum averaged 26.4 points in seven games against the Nuggets in the 2019 Western Conference Semifinals, marking the 10th-highest scoring average for a playoff series in Trail Blazers history. McCollum scored 20-plus points in 12 of 16 games during the 2019 playoffs, including four games with 30-plus points. McCollum's eight career games of 30-plus points in the playoffs are the third-most in franchise history behind **Damian Lillard** (16) and Clyde Drexler (14).

FREQUENT FOE: The Trail Blazers are taking on the Lakers in the playoffs for the 12th time in franchise history. Portland has played Los Angeles in the postseason more than any other opponent, with seven series against Phoenix being the next closest.

LAKESHOW HISTORY: Portland has advanced twice past the Lakers in the postseason, while the Lakers have won the other nine series. This series marks the seventh time the teams have squared off in the first round of the playoffs. The Trail Blazers are 1-5 in first round playoff series against the Lakers, with the series win coming in 1992 when Portland last advanced to the NBA Finals.

NEUTRAL SITE: While there will be designated home teams throughout the postseason, the 2020 NBA Playoffs will be played in their entirety in Orlando, Florida. Portland previously beat the Lakers in an away game in the First Round of the 1992 Playoffs played at the Thomas & Mack Center in Las Vegas on May 3, 1992.

STAY ME70: Carmelo Anthony has averaged 24.5 points per game in his playoff career, which is the 19th-highest scoring average in playoff history. With 1,764 career points in the postseason, Anthony has scored the ninth-most postseason points among active NBA players.

OFFENSE ROLLING: The Trail Blazers had the NBA's highest-scoring offense during the Orlando seeding games, averaging 126.0 points per game. The Lakers had the second-lowest scoring offense in the seeding games, putting up 106.4 points per game. Portland ranked sixth in scoring for the season (115.0 points) while the Lakers ranked 11th (113.4).

BEEN THERE BEFORE: Seven of the 13 Portland players in Orlando for the playoffs had postseason experience entering the 2020 Playoffs, combining for a total of 214 postseason games. **Carmelo Anthony** (72), **Damian Lillard** (51), **CJ McCollum** (46), **Zach Collins** (20) and **Hassan Whiteside** (15) had all played in 15 or more playoff games. Five of Portland's players have game experience in the Western Conference Finals (Anthony, Collins, Lillard, McCollum, Simons).

UPSET BID: The Trail Blazers are seeking to become the sixth eighth seed to defeat a one seed in the postseason. It happened most recently in 2012 when the Philadelphia 76ers beat the Chicago Bulls, 4-2. In 2011 the Memphis Grizzlies beat the San Antonio Spurs, 4-2, and in 2007 the Golden State Warriors beat the Dallas Mavericks, 4-2. The first two instances were five game series, when the New York Knicks beat the Miami Heat, 3-2, in 1999 and the Denver Nuggets eliminated the Seattle SuperSonics, 3-2, in 1994.

NEWS AND NOTES

LEADING THE WAY: Terry Stotts was hired as the franchise's 14th head coach on August 7, 2012. Stotts led the Trail Blazers to a 53-29 record in 2018-19 and has compiled a 360-288 record in eight seasons with Portland. Stotts is the second-winningest coach in franchise history, and the first Trail Blazers head coach to lead the franchise to seven straight postseason appearances.

PLAYED-IN: The Trail Blazers earned the eight seed by beating the Memphis Grizzlies, 126-122, in the Western Conference Play-in game on Aug. 15. Portland got big performances from **Damian Lillard** (31 points, 10 rebounds, two assists), **CJ McCollum** (29 points, three rebounds one assist, two steals), **Jusuf Nurkic** (22 points, 21 rebounds, six assists, two steals and two blocks) and **Carmelo Anthony** (21 points, three rebounds, one assist and one block).

BOSNIAN BEAST: Jusuf Nurkic had 22 points (8-14 FG, 2-3 3-PT, 4-9 FT), 21 rebounds, six assists, two steals and two blocks in the Western Conference Play-in game against Memphis on Aug. 15. Nurkic is one of nine players that has recorded multiple games of at least 20 points, 20 rebounds, six assists, two steals and two blocks since blocks and steals have been recorded (Abdul-Jabbar/Bird/Cousins/Divac/Drummond/Lanier/Nurkic/Olajuwon/Webber).

STRETCH RUN: With 42 points (13-22 FG, 8-14 3-PT, 8-9 FT) against the Nets on August 13, **Damian Lillard** brought his scoring total over the final three seeding games to 154 points. It marks the ninth-highest-scoring three game stretch since the 1976-77 season.

CJ SCORING 20: With a scoring average of 22.2 ppg this season, **CJ McCollum** joined LaMarcus Aldridge, Clyde Drexler and Damian Lillard as the only players in Trail Blazers history to average at least 20 points per game in five different seasons. McCollum scored 20-plus points 47 times this season, the 13th-most in the NBA.

MELO SCORING 20: With 26 (10-17 FG, 3-5 3-PT, 3-4 FT) points against the Mavericks on August 11, **Carmelo Anthony** notched his third straight game with 20-plus points and his 18th game with at least 20 points this season. It was his 771st career game with 20-plus points, matching Wilt Chamberlain for the eighth-most in NBA history. Portland was 12-6 when Anthony scores 20-plus points.

OFFENSE ROLLING: The Trail Blazers scored at least 110 points in 14 straight games dating back to Feb. 29 to close out the season. It was the longest active streak in the NBA and the longest single season streak in team history. After July 30, Portland led the NBA in points per game (126.0) and ranked third in three-point percentage (41.4%), second in three-pointers made (123) and first in offensive rating (122.5).

LEAGUE LEADERS: **Damian Lillard** finished the season ranked third in the NBA in scoring (30.0) and fifth in the league in assists (8.0). **CJ McCollum** ranked 18th in the league in scoring (22.2). **Hassan Whiteside** ranked third in the league in rebounds (13.5), first in blocks (2.93) and is fifth in field goal percentage (62.1%). **Gary Trent Jr.** ranked ninth in the league in three-point percentage (41.8%).

DAME FROM DOWNTOWN: **Damian Lillard** tied his franchise record for three-pointers in a game with 11 threes (18) against Denver on Aug. 6. It brought his total for the season to 247 triples, breaking his own franchise record of 237 (2018-19). Lillard has the top six seasons for threes made in franchise history. His 270 three-pointers were tied for the third-most in the NBA this season.

SUPER SUB: With 22 points on 7-of-13 shooting (6-10 3-PT) against the Clippers on Aug. 8, **Gary Trent Jr.** became the fourth player in NBA history to come off the bench and make at least four three-pointers in five consecutive games. Trent's four career games with at least six three-pointers are tied for the eighth-most in league history for a player 21 or younger.

DOUBLE-DOUBLE DAME: With 42 points and 12 assists against Brooklyn on Aug. 13, **Damian Lillard** logged his 19th double-double of the season. Lillard had five games with 40-plus points and 10-plus assists this season, which tied for the second-most in the NBA.

BEST OF THE BUBBLE: During the seeding games, **Damian Lillard** led the league in points (301) and three-pointers (44) and was second in assists (77), **Jusuf Nurkic** leads the league in blocked shots (16), and **Gary Trent Jr.** ranks second in three-pointers made (34). Lillard was unanimously named NBA Player of the Seeding Games on Aug. 15 after averaging 37.6 points (49.7% FG, 43.6% 3-PT, 88.8% FT), 4.3 rebounds, 9.6 assists and 1.38 steals in the eight games.

JUST BE GREAT: In the eight seeding games, **Gary Trent Jr.** averaged 16.9 points off the bench while shooting 34-of-67 (50.7%) from the three-point line. Trent had 27 points (10-15 FG, 7-10 3-PT), three rebounds, four assists and two steals against Denver on Aug. 6, matching his career high with seven threes for the second time in three games.

THE MAN IN THE MIDDLE: **Jusuf Nurkic** is the fifth player in NBA history to average at least 22.0 points, 11.0 rebounds, 4.0 assists and 3.00 blocks through his first four games of a season (Cousins/Olajuwon/Davis/Webber). Nurkic recorded 22 points (9-20 FG, 4-5 FT), seven rebounds, four assists, one steal and two blocks against Denver on Aug. 6.

DAME BUCKETS

DAME 3-60: With a franchise record-tying 61 points (17-32 FG, 9-17 3-PT, 18-18 FT) against the Mavericks on Aug. 11, **Damian Lillard** joined Wilt Chamberlain as the only two players in NBA history to score 60 or more points at least three times in a season. Lillard had 61 points (17-37 FG, 11-30 3-PT, 16-16 FT), 10 rebounds and seven assists against Golden State on Jan. 20 and 60 points (19-33 FG, 7-16 3-PT, 15-15 FT), four rebounds and five assists against Brooklyn on Nov. 8. Lillard is one of six players in league history with three or more games of 60-plus points (Chamberlain/Bryant/Harden/Jordan/Baylor).

DAME FOR 50: **Damian Lillard** led the NBA with six games of 50-plus points this season. The only other players with six or more games of 50-plus points in a season in the last 40 years are Kobe Bryant, James Harden and Michael Jordan. Lillard is tied for the fifth-most career games of 50-plus points in league history (11).

DAME DROPPING 40: **Damian Lillard's** 42 points against Brooklyn on Aug. 13 marked his 11th game of 40-plus points this season. It is the most 40-point games in a season in franchise history and tied for the second-most in the NBA this season.

DAME 30 FOR 30: **Damian Lillard** scored 30-plus points 30 times this season, good for the fifth-most in the NBA. It was the most 30-point games in a season in franchise history, eclipsing Lillard's previous high of 27 (twice - 2016-17, 1018-19).

NEWS AND NOTES

PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Damian Lillard (twice) and **Carmelo Anthony** both won Western Conference Player of the Week awards this season, marking the second straight season that two Portland players have won the award.

DECEMBER 3: **Carmelo Anthony** was named the NBA Western Conference Player of the Week for the week ending Dec. 1 after averaging 22.3 points (57.4% FG, 45.5% 3-PT, 88.9% FT), 7.7 rebounds and 2.7 assists while helping Portland to a 3-0 record on the week.

January 26: **Damian Lillard** was named Western Conference Player of the Week for the week ending Jan. 26 after averaging 52.7 points (53.4% FG, 57.4% 3-PT, 94.9% FT), 7.3 rebounds and 9.3 assists in three games. He became the first player in Trail Blazers history to score 40-plus points in three straight games.

BACK-TO-BACK: **Damian Lillard** earned his second consecutive Western Conference Player of the Week award on Feb. 3 after averaging 45.0 points (56.3% FG, 56.4% 3-PT, 88.5% FT), 7.0 rebounds and 11.0 assists in wins over the Rockets, Lakers and Jazz. It was the ninth Western Conference Player of the Week honor of his career.

THATS THE TICKET: In limited action, Jusuf Nurkic became the second player in the last 20 years to average at least 17.0 points, 10.0 rebounds, 4.0 assists and 2.00 blocks. Kevin Garnett was the last player to do so during his 2003-04 MVP season.

TAKING CARE OF THE ROCK: Of all NBA players to play 1,200 or more minutes this season, Gary Trent Jr. recorded the fewest turnovers (21). The last player to play at least 1,200 minutes and have 21 or fewer turnovers was Shane Battier during the 2013-14 season.

ALL-TIME GREAT: With 20 points against the 76ers on Aug. 9, **Carmelo Anthony** (26,437 career points) passed John Havlicek and Paul Pierce to reach 15th on the NBA all-time scoring list. Tim Duncan ranks 14th with 26,496 career points.

LOGO LILLARD: **Damian Lillard** shot 3-of-5 from 30 feet or further against at the Nuggets on August 6. For the season, Lillard shot 41.5% on those shots (54-of-130). His 54 three-pointers from 30 feet or further lead the NBA. Prior to this season, the record for three-pointers made from 30 feet or further in a season was 25 (Young, 2018-19).

MAKING HISTORY: With 905 rebounds this season, **Hassan Whiteside** finished the 2019-20 campaign with the sixth-most rebounds in a season in Trail Blazers history. Whiteside's 196 blocks were the third-most in a season in franchise history (Walton - 211, 1976-77).

THREE-FOR-ALL: Portland shot 23-of-39 (59.0%) from the three-point line against Denver on Aug. 6, setting a franchise record for three-pointers in a game. **Damian Lillard** (11-of-18) and **Gary Trent Jr.** (7-of-10) became the 11th pair of teammates in NBA history to make at least seven triples each in the same game.

MELO DOUBLE-DOUBLES: **Carmelo Anthony** recorded 15 points, 11 rebounds, one assist, two steals and one block against Houston on Aug. 4, including a three-pointer with 54.6 seconds left that put the Trail Blazers up by five points. It was his fifth double-double of the season.

DAME TIME: **Damian Lillard** scored 18 of his 51 points in the fourth quarter against the 76ers on Aug. 9 and 22 of his 61 points in the fourth quarter against the Mavericks on Aug. 11. He led the league in second half scoring with 16.2 second half points per game this season.

3J McCOLLUM: With his third three-pointer against the Grizzlies on July 31, **CJ McCollum** reached 1,000 three-pointers for his career. He is the second player in Trail Blazers history to reach 1,000 three-pointers (Lillard). McCollum made at least three three-pointers in 39 games this season, tied for the seventh-most in the league.

DOUBLE-DOUBLE STREAK: **Hassan Whiteside** logged 16 points (8-12 FG), 14 rebounds and two blocks against Phoenix on March 10, marking his 14th straight double-double and his 51st of the season. His 51 double-doubles were the second-most in the NBA this season and the fourth-most in a season in Trail Blazers history (54, Thompson, 1981-82). His 14 double-doubles in a row tied the third-longest streak in franchise history (34, Walton, 1976-77). Whiteside had 15 straight double-doubles from Nov. 19 to Dec. 23.

TWENTY STREAK: **Damian Lillard** scored at least 20 points in 23 straight games from Jan. 3 - March 6, representing the longest streak of his career and the fourth-longest streak in franchise history. Lillard scored at least 20 points 58 times this season, which was the second-most in the NBA.

HORSEPLAY: **Hassan Whiteside** joined Bill Walton as the only players in Trail Blazers history to average at least 15.0 points, 13.0 rebounds and 2.50 blocks in a season. He was the second player in league history to achieve those averages while shooting above 60.0% from the field (Howard).

WHITESIDE 2020: **Hassan Whiteside** recorded 23 points (11-14 FG, 1-1 3-PT), 20 rebounds and four blocks at Phoenix on March 6. It was his second game of 20-plus points and 20-plus rebounds this season, making him one of four players in the NBA with multiple 20-20 games this season.

MELO'S SEASON HIGH: **Carmelo Anthony** scored a season-high 32 points (11-16 FG, 5-9 3-PT, 5-6 FT) to go with four rebounds and one assist against Detroit on Feb. 23. It was his first 30-point game since Feb. 25, 2017 and the 272nd game of 30-plus points in his career.

CJ McBUCKETS: **CJ McCollum** matched his season high with 41 points (14-24 FG, 6-12 3-PT, 7-7 FT) to go with five rebounds, five assists and one steal at Orlando on March 2. It was his second game of 40-plus points this season and the seventh of his career (fourth in Trail Blazers history).

REBOUND MACHINE: **Hassan Whiteside** had 20 rebounds against the Suns on March 6, marking his eighth game this season with at least 20 boards. It is the most games of 20-plus rebounds that Whiteside has had in a season in his career (seven, 2016-17) and the most games of 20-plus rebounds that a Portland player has had in a season (seven, Walton, 1975-76).

SIMONS SAYS: **Anfernee Simons** scored 20-plus points twice this season, giving him three games of 20-plus points for his career. He is the third player in Trail Blazers history with three or more games of 20-plus points before turning 21 years old.

NEWS AND NOTES

CLOSE TO HOME: **Anfernee Simons** attended Edgewater High School, while **Nassir Little** attended Orlando Christian Prep. Both schools are located 20 miles away from the ESPN Wide World of Sports Complex.

350 WINS: With a 115-109 victory over Miami on Feb. 9, **Terry Stotts** recorded his 350th win as head coach of the Trail Blazers. He joined Gregg Popovich, Erik Spoelstra and Rick Carlisle as the only head coaches in the NBA with 350 wins with their current team. Doc Rivers has since reached 350 wins with the Clippers.

CRAZY EIGHT: With 42 points and six assists at Utah on Feb. 7, **Damian Lillard** passed 1,500 points and 400 assists for the season. He joins LeBron James and Oscar Robertson as the only players in NBA history with at least 1,500 points and 400 assists in each of their first eight seasons. He also joins James Harden as the only two players to have scored at least 1,500 points in every season since 2012-13.

SUPER SIX: **Damian Lillard** averaged 48.8 points (54.8% FG, 57.0% 3-PT, 92.3% FT), 7.2 rebounds and 10.2 assists over the six games from Jan. 20 to Feb. 1. He totalled 293 points in that six-game span, which is tied for the third-most points in a six-game span since the NBA/ABA merger ahead of the 1976-77 season. Lillard is the first player in NBA history to average at least 45 points and 10 assists over a six-game span.

MELO MOMENT: **Carmelo Anthony** led the Trail Blazers with 28 points (10-17 FG, 5-8 3-PT, 3-3 FT) against the Raptors on Jan. 7, including a game-winning jumpshot with 3.3 seconds remaining to deliver the Trail Blazers the victory. It was the 17th time in his career that Anthony made a go-ahead shot with five seconds or less remaining in the game, which is four more than any other player since he entered the league in 2003.

FAST 14K: With 34 points at Dallas on Jan. 17, **Damian Lillard** reached 14,014 points for his career. Lillard joined Kevin Durant, LeBron James and Carmelo Anthony as the only active NBA players to reach 14,000 points in their first eight seasons. He is the 26th player in league history to accomplish the feat.

VOLUME AND ACCURACY: **Damian Lillard** made 460 free throw this season, the fourth-most in the NBA, while shooting 88.8% from the stripe, the 10th-best mark in the league. An 88.9% career free throw shooter, Lillard ranks fifth in NBA history for free throw accuracy among players that have made at least 3,000 free throws (3,309-of-3,723).

HOT START: **Damian Lillard** scored 35 points (12-20 FG, 3-7 3-PT, 8-8 FT) to go with five rebounds, five assists and three steals at Sacramento on Oct. 25. He scored 13 of his points in the third quarter, when he did not miss a shot (4-4 FG, 3-3 3-PT, 2-2 FT). Lillard joins Kiki Vandeweghe as the only Portland players to score 30-plus points in each of Portland's first two games to start a season.

PERFECT 10: The Trail Blazers started 10-of-10 from the field against Oklahoma City on Nov. 27, on their way to 42 first quarter points. It was the highest-scoring quarter of the season for Portland.

MORE TIME: Portland's 124-113 victory over Atlanta on Nov. 10 marked the team's first overtime game of the season. The 11-point margin of victory tied the second-biggest overtime win in team history.

COMING UP BIG: **Nassir Little** recorded career highs of 12 points, 11 rebounds and two blocks at New Orleans on Nov. 19, marking the first double-double of his career. It was the first double-double by a Trail Blazers rookie since Tim Frazier had one on April 15, 2015.

EFFICIENT PRODUCTION: **Hassan Whiteside** recorded 21 points (8-13 FG, 5-5 FT), 16 rebounds and one assist in 22 minutes and 27 seconds of action against Oklahoma City on Nov. 27. He became the fourth player in NBA history to record at least 21 points and 16 rebounds in fewer than 23 minutes of playing time.

WHITESIDE CAREER HIGH: **Hassan Whiteside** scored a career-high 33 points on a career-high 15 field goals (15-21 FG, 1-1 3-PT, 2-2 FT) to go with 11 rebounds, two assists and four blocks at Denver on Dec. 12. It was his fifth career game with 30-plus points.

A LEAGUE OF HIS OWN: **Damian Lillard** scored 330 points through Portland's first 10 games, marking the highest total through 10 games in team history. Lillard also ranks second (306, 2016-17) and fourth (281, 2018-19) on that list. Lillard is the 13th player in NBA history to score 330 points through his team's first 10 games.

CJ SHINES: **CJ McCollum** finished with 37 points (15-29 FG, 5-10 3-PT, 2-2 FT), 10 assists and three blocks to go with six rebounds at Milwaukee on Nov. 21. He is the first player in Trail Blazers history to have at least 37 points, 10 assists and three blocks in a game and is the 10th player in NBA history to reach those thresholds in a game.

DANGEROUS DUO: **Damian Lillard** and **CJ McCollum** each scored 30-plus points on Dec. 18 against the Warriors and Dec. 20 against the Magic, marking just the third time a Trail Blazers duo has scored at least 30 points a piece in consecutive games (Petrie/Wicks, Jan. 1973; Lillard/McCollum, Feb. 2016).

HOT ROD: **Rodney Hood** shot a career-best 49.3% from the three-point line this season. At the time of his season-ending Achilles injury, Hood ranked third in the NBA in three-point percentage.

TREVOR ATHREEZA: **Trevor Ariza** scored a season-high 22 points (7-12 FG, 5-8 3-PT, 3-4 FT) to go with six rebounds, one steal and one block against Phoenix on March 10. It was the third time in four games that he scored at least 15 points.

ZACH RETURNS: **Zach Collins** logged seven points (3-9 FG, 1-3 3-PT), nine rebounds, three assists and one steal against Memphis on July 31, his first game back since separating his left shoulder on Oct. 27, 2019.

ANT MAN: **Anfernee Simons** had 22 points (7-12 FG, 6-7 3-PT, 2-2 FT), seven rebounds and one assist at Memphis on Feb. 12. It was the second-highest-scoring game of his career while his six three-pointers were the second-most he has made in a game in his career.

TWO OF A KIND: **Damian Lillard** and **CJ McCollum** were two of 13 NBA guards to average at least 20.0 points, 4.0 rebounds and 4.0 assists this season. The Trail Blazers were one of two teams to have two players on that list (Houston).

FRANCHISE FIRST: **Damian Lillard** is the first player in franchise history to average 30.0 points per game and is the first Trail Blazers player to rank in the top three in the NBA in scoring for a season.
