SEASON SERIES NOTES

- The Trail Blazers and Warriors split the regular season series in 2018-19, 2-2. Portland won the season series against Golden State in 2017-18, 2-1.
- In four games against the Warriors this season, **Damian Lillard** averaged 28.3 points (47.6% FG, 50.0% 3-PT, 85.0% FT), 2.0 rebounds, 6.5 assists and 1.00 steal. Lillard scored 40 points against Golden State on Dec. 29 and scored 21 points at Golden State on Dec. 27, including a game-winning three-pointer with 6.3 seconds remaining in overtime.
- **CJ McCollum** averaged 18.0 points (36.6% FG, 30.0% 3-PT, 84.6% FT), 3.3 rebounds and 2.8 assists in four games against the Warriors this season. McCollum has made at least three three-pointers in seven of his last nine games against Golden State.
- In four games against the Warriors this season, **Al-Farouq Aminu** averaged 10.0 points (37.1% FG, 35.3% 3-PT, 100% FT), 8.3 rebounds and 2.3 assists.
- Stephen Curry averaged 28.7 points (41.5% FG, 35.1% 3-PT, 79.2% FT), 5.7 rebounds, 5.7 assists and 1.33 steals in three games against Portland this season. Curry has made at least five three-pointers in eight of his last 10 games against Portland.
- In four games against Portland this season, Klay Thompson averaged 21.8 points (41.6% FG, 40.0% 3-PT, 78.6% FT), 5.8 rebounds, 3.0 assists and 1.50 steals. Thompson scored 30-plus points in both of Golden State's victories over Portland this season.
- In four games against the Trail Blazers this season, Kevin Durant averaged 28.8 points (57.5% FG, 41.2% 3-PT, 76.2% FT), 6.3 rebounds, 6.3 assists, 2.00 blocks and 1.00 steal. Durant has scored at least 30 points in seven of his last 10 games against Portland.

PLAYOFF SERIES NOTES

- Portland and Golden State have faced each other twice previously in the postseason, with the Warriors winning both series.
- Golden State leads Portland, 10-1, all-time in the playoffs.
- Both series between the Trail Blazers and the Warriors have occurred in the last three postseasons. Golden State beat Portland in the 2016 Western Conference Semifinals, 4-1, and in the 2017 First Round, 4-0.
- In nine career playoff games against the Warriors, **Damian Lillard** has averaged 30.0 points, 4.3 rebounds and 5.7 assists.
- **CJ McCollum** has scored at least 20 points in six of his nine playoff games against the Warriors. He scored a playoff career-high 41 points at Golden State in Game 1 of the First Round in 2017.

CONNECTIONS

- Portland guard **Damian Lillard** is from Oakland and attended Oakland High School, located five miles away from Oracle Arena.
- Warriors head coach Steve Kerr played for the Trail Blazers during the 2001-02 season, averaging 4.1 points and 1.0 assist in 65 games.
- Trail Blazers guard/forward **Evan Turner** and Golden State forward Andre Iguodala were teammates with the Philadelphia 76ers from 2010-12.
- Trail Blazers guard **Seth Curry** and Warriors guard Stephen Curry are the first pair of brothers in NBA history to face each other in a Conference Finals playoff series.

Western Conference Finals, Game #2 - Golden State 114, Portland 111 — May 16, Oracle Arena, Oakland, California

The Trail Blazers fell to 0-2 in the Western Conference Finals, suffering a 114-111 defeat to Golden State in Oakland ... Portland scored a postseason-high 65 points in the first half, taking a 15-point lead over the Warriors into the intermission ... Golden State outscored Portland by 15 points in the third quarter, evening the score at 89-89 going into the final period ... Damian Lillard led Portland with 23 points (6-16 FG, 5-12 3-PT, 6-7 FT), five rebounds, 10 assists and one steal ... CJ McCollum added 22 points (9-23 FG, 3-7 3-PT, 1-1 FT), three rebounds, five assists and one steal ... Seth Curry scored 16 points off the bench on 5-of-9 shooting (4-7 3-PT, 2-2 FT) to go with one rebound, two assists and four steals ... Curry scored nine points in the fourth quarter, shooting a perfect 3-of-3 from the three-point-line ... Rodney Hood and Maurice Harkless added 12 points each ... Stephen Curry led the Warriors with 37 points (11-22 FG, 4-14 3-PT, 11-11 FT), eight rebounds and eight assists.

Western Conference Finals, Game #1 - Golden State 116, Portland 94 — May 14, Oracle Arena, Oakland, California

Golden State jumped out to a 1-0 lead in the Western Conference Finals, as the Trail Blazers fell to the Warriors in Oakland, 116-94 ... Portland was held to 36.1% shooting from the floor and 25.0% shooting from the three-point-line while being forced into 21 turnovers ... The Trail Blazers made a postseason-high 27 free throws (of 31) ... Portland outrebounded the Warriors, 47-42, and outscored them in the paint, 38-28 ... Damian Lillard led the Trail Blazers with 19 points, four rebounds and six assists ... Maurice Harkless had 17 points (7-12 FG, 1-4 3-PT, 2-2 FT), four rebounds, one assist and three blocks ... CJ McCollum added 17 points, three rebounds and one assist ... Enes Kanter had a double-double of 10 points and 16 rebounds to go with three assists ... Rodney Hood led the Trail Blazers bench with 17 points on 4-of-8 shooting (2-5 3-PT, 7-7 FT) ... Stephen Curry led Golden State with 36 points (12-23 FG, 9-15 3-PT, 3-3 FT), six rebounds and seven assists.

Game #19 - Golden State 125, Portland 97 — November 23, Oracle Arena, Oakland, California

Portland fell to the Golden State Warriors in Oakland, 125-97 ... The Trail Blazers took a three-point lead into the second quarter, but were outscored in the period, 35-17 ... The Warriors connected on 17-of-32 three-pointers (53.1%), a season high for a Trail Blazers opponent ... Portland was led by Damian Lillard, who finished with 23 points (9-24 FG, 3-7 3-PT, 2-3 FT), eight assists and two rebounds ... Jusuf Nurkic scored 22 points on 8-of-15 shooting (6-10 FT) to go with eight rebounds, one assist and one steal ... CJ McCollum chipped in 19 points and five assists ... Al-Farouq Aminu added 12 points and seven rebounds ... Meyers Leonard contributed eight points and six boards off the bench ... Golden State scored 25 points off of Portland's 13 turnovers ... The Warriors were led by Kevin Durant's 32 points (13-21 FG, 2-5 3-PT, 4-5 FT), eight rebounds, seven assists, two steals and three blocks ... Golden State recorded 11 steals and 11 blocks while Portland had eight steals and two blocks.

Game #35 - Portland 110, Golden State 109 (ot) — December 27, Oracle Arena, Oakland, California

It took overtime, but the Trail Blazers defeated the Warriors, 110-109, capturing their first win in Oakland in over five years ... Golden State overcame a six-point Portland lead with 1:15 remaining in regulation to force overtime ... CJ McCollum scored the Trail Blazers first five points of the extra period before Damian Lillard hit a game-winning three-pointer with 6.3 seconds remaining ... Jusuf Nurkic led the Trail Blazers with a season-high 27 points (10-18 FG, 7-8 FT) to go with 12 rebounds and four assists ... CJ McCollum scored 24 points to go with four rebounds, three assists, one block and one steal ... Damian Lillard had 21 points (7-20 FG, 3-8 3-PT, 4-4 FT), one rebound and five assists ... Seth Curry scored 11 straight points for Portland in the first five minutes of the fourth quarter ... He finished with 11 points and three rebounds ... Kevin Durant had a triple-double of 26 points, 10 rebounds and 11 assists ... Stephen Curry had 29 points and seven assists.

Game #36 - Golden State 115, Portland 105 — December 29, Moda Center, Portland, Oregon

In the second meeting between the Trail Blazers and the Warriors in three days, Golden State came away with the victory at Moda Center, 115-105 ... Damian Lillard scored a game-high 40 points (14-23 FG, 6-13 3-PT, 6-7 FT) to go with two rebounds, five assists and one steal ... Lillard scored 20 points in the third quarter ... Jusuf Nurkic had his 18th double-double of the season, scoring 21 points (8-14 FG, 5-7 FT) to go with 10 rebounds, seven assists, one steal and one block ... CJ McCollum scored 14 points (6-17 FG, 2-2 FT) to go with five rebounds and one assist ... Maurice Harkless had seven points, nine rebounds, three steals and two blocks ... His nine rebounds and three steals were both season highs ... Al-Farouq Aminu had nine points, seven rebounds, two assists, one steal and one block ... Klay Thompson led the Warriors with 32 points (12-21 FG, 4-5 3-PT, 4-4 FT) while adding four rebounds and one assist ... Kevin Durant and Stephen Curry scored 25 points each.

Game #57 - Portland 129, Golden State 107 — February 13, Moda Center, Portland, Oregon

The Trail Blazers outscored the Warriors, 35-12, in the fourth quarter to close out a 129-107 victory in Portland ... With the victory, the Trail Blazers evened the season series against Golden State, 2-2 ... Damian Lillard had 29 points (9-15 FG, 6-8 3-PT, 5-6 FT), three rebounds and eight assists to lead Portland ... Jake Layman scored 17 points on 7-of-9 shooting (3-5 3-PT) to go with two rebounds, one assist and two steals in 26 minutes off the bench ... Jusuf Nurkic recorded his 26th double-double of the season, finishing with 11 points (5-14 FG) and 11 rebounds ... CJ McCollum logged 15 points (5-13 FG, 3-8 3-PT, 2-2 FT), three rebounds and two assists ... Portland improved to 5-0 when all five starters scored in double figures ... Eight Portland players scored in double figures ... The Trail Blazers bench outscored the Warriors reserves, 52-23 ... Stephen Curry scored 32 points (10-24 FG, 5-14 3-PT, 7-7 FT) to go with seven rebounds and two assists for the Warriors ... Kevin Durant had 32 points and four rebounds.

CJ McCollum led the way for the Trail Blazers, finishing with 33 points (12-22 FG, 3-7 3-PT, 6-6 FT), eight rebounds, five assists and one steal ... Damian Lillard added 29 points (10-21 FG, 4-8 3-PT, 5-7 FT), four rebounds, six assists, three steals and two blocks ... Maurice Harkless recorded 14 points (6-9 FG, 1-2 3-PT, 1-2 FT), nine rebounds, one steal and one block ... Seth Curry connected on 3-of-4 three point attempts, finishing with nine points and one assist in 18 minutes off the bench ... Zach Collins chipped in six points, four rebounds and three blocks ... Paul George led the Thunder with 27 points (11-20 FG, 2-7 3-PT, 3-4 FT), eight rebounds, three assists and one steal ... Russell Westbrook added 14 points (5-20 FG, 1-6 3-PT, 3-3 FT), nine rebounds and 11 assists.

First Round, Game #3 - Oklahoma City 120, Portland 108 — April 19, Chesapeake Energy Arena, Oklahoma City, Oklahoma

The Trail Blazers fell to the Thunder in Oklahoma City, 120-108, bringing Portland's record to 2-1 in the best-of-seven series ... The Thunder shot 15-of-29 from the three-point line (51.7%) while the Trail Blazers shot 12-of-31 from the three-point line (38.7%) ... Damian Lillard led Portland with 32 points (10-21 FG, 3-9 3-PT, 9-10 FT), four rebounds, six assists and two steals ... Lillard scored 25 points in the third quarter, marking the highest-scoring quarter in his postseason career ... Lillard's 28 points in the second half set a franchise record for points in a half in a playoff game ... Portland scored 43 points in the third quarter, setting a franchise record for points in a quarter in the playoffs ... CJ McCollum had 21 points (7-16 FG, 5-8 3-PT, 2-4 FT), seven rebounds, seven assists and one steal ... Enes Kanter added 19 points, five rebounds and one assist ... Russell Westbrook led the Thunder with 33 points (11-22 FG, 4-6 3-PT, 7-8 FT), five rebounds, 11 assists and one block.

First Round, Game #4 - Portland 111, Oklahoma City 98 — April 21, Chesapeake Energy Arena, Oklahoma City, Oklahoma

With a 111-98 victory over the the Thunder in Oklahoma City, the Trail Blazers moved within one win of advancing to the Western Conference Semifinals ... The Trail Blazers closed the first half on a 11-0 run to take a 50-46 halftime lead ... Portland never trailed in the second half ... The Trail Blazers outrebounded the Thunder, 49-44, and outscored them in the paint, 36-22 ... CJ McCollum led Portland with 27 points (10-20 FG, 5-9 3-PT, 2-2 FT), four rebounds, three assists, one steal and two blocks ... Damian Lillard added 24 points (7-19 FG, 4-8 3-PT, 6-6 FT), three rebounds, eight assists and one steal ... Al-Farouq Aminu had 19 points, nine rebounds, one steal and one block ... Maurice Harkless recorded 15 points, 10 rebounds, two steals and three blocks ... Enes Kanter added eight points, 10 rebounds, three assists, two steals and one block ... Zach Collins scored 10 points off the bench to go with four rebounds ... Paul George scored a game-high 32 points to go with 10 rebounds and six assists.

First Round, Game #5 - Portland 118, Oklahoma City 115 — April 23, Moda Center, Portland, Oregon

The Trail Blazers won their first round series against the Thunder, 4-1, after defeating Oklahoma City, 118-115, at Moda Center ... Damian Lillard made a series-winning buzzer-beater from 37 feet away as time expired ... Lillard finished with a franchise postseason-record 50 points (17-33 FG, 10-18 3-PT, 6-8 FT) to go with seven rebounds, six assists, three steals and one block ... Lillard scored 34 points in the first half, tying his own record for points in a half in franchise history - regular season or playoffs ... Lillard's 10 three-pointers were the second-most in a game in NBA playoff history ... CJ McCollum scored 17 points (8-19 FG, 1-7 3-PT) to go with two rebounds, two assists and two blocks ... McCollum scored 10 points in the fourth quarter ... Maurice Harkless added 17 points, seven rebounds, one assist and one steal ... Enes Kanter had 13 points, 13 rebounds, four assists and one block ... Paul George led the Thunder with 36 points, seven rebounds, one assist and one steal.

PLAYOFF NEWS AND NOTES

SIX IN A ROW: With a 148-144 victory over the Nets on March 25, the Trail Blazers secured a berth in the 2019 NBA Playoffs. It marks Portland's sixth consecutive postseason appearance and the 35th trip to the playoffs in franchise history. It is the second-longest postseason streak in franchise history (21, 1983-2003).

STOTTS LEADING THE WAY: Terry Stotts has led the Trail Blazers to the postseason for the sixth consecutive season, making him the second coach in franchise history to lead the Trail Blazers to six straight playoff appearances (Rick Adelman). Stotts has coached Portland to the Western Conference Semifinals three times in the last six playoff appearances. Stotts won an NBA Championship as an assistant coach with the Dallas Mavericks in 2011.

CONFERENCE FINALS: The Trail Blazers are playing in the Western Conference Finals for the seventh time in franchise history and the first time since 2000. Portland has advanced from the Western Conference Finals to the NBA Finals three times (last in 1992).

FROM LILLARD RANGE: Damian Lillard made 4-of-7 three-point attempts from 30 feet or further in Game 2 at Golden State on May 16. It was his second game this post season with at least three 30-foot three-pointers. No other player has made more than one 30-footer in a game during the 2019 playoffs. Lillard is shooting 12-of-22 (54.5%) on shots from 30 feet or further during the postseason. It is the most made shots from 30 feet or further in the 2019 Playoffs (Curry/Gordon, three).

THREE AND "D": Seth Curry matched his postseason career high with 16 points (5-9 FG, 4-7 3-PT, 2-2 FT) to go with one rebound, two assists and a postseason career-high four steals in Game 2 at Golden State on May 16. Curry scored nine of his points in the fourth quarter on perfect 3-of-3 shooting from the three-point line.

THREE-POINT BARRAGE: Portland made a franchise postseason-record 18 three-pointers (of 39, 46.2%) against the Warriors in Game 2. Seven different players made at least one shot from deep.

HARK ATTACK: Maurice Harkless matched his postseason-high with 17 points on 7-of-12 shooting (1-4 3-PT, 2-2 FT) to go with four rebounds and three blocks in Game 1 at Golden State on May 14. Harkless is tied for 15th in blocks per game in the 2019 playoffs (1.00).

RODNEY ROLLING: In his last nine games, Rodney Hood has averaged 14.7 points (56.0% FG, 46.9% 3-PT, 82.5% FT) and 3.0 rebounds in 24.1 minutes per game. He has scored in double figures in seven of those contests.

LILLARD'S PLAYOFF SCORING: With 32 points against Denver in Game 6, Damian Lillard topped 30 points in a playoff game for the 15th time in his career, which is the most such games in franchise history (Drexler - 14). Lillard has scored at least 20 points in 34 of his 49 career postseason games and ranks fourth all-time on the Trail Blazers playoff scoring list. Lillard ranks fifth in the 2019 Playoffs in scoring (27.4).

CJ SCORCHING: CJ McCollum scored 37 points (17-29 FG, 1-3 3-PT, 2-2 FT) to go with nine rebounds, one assist and one block in Game 7 at Denver on May 12. It was the most points a Portland player has scored in a Game 7 of a playoff series in franchise history. McCollum has scored at least 20 points in 13 of his last 16 postseason games. He ranks sixth on the all-time Trail Blazers postseason scoring list and is ninth in the 2019 Playoffs in scoring (24.7).

TURNER TIME: Evan Turner recorded 14 points (3-7 FG, 8-9 FT), seven rebounds, two assists and one block in Game 7 at Denver on May 12. Turner scored 10 of his points in the fourth quarter while shooting 6-of-7 from the free-throw-line.

IN TANDEM: Damian Lillard (27.4 points) and CJ McCollum (24.7 points) are the second-highest-scoring duo in team history for a single postseason run. Lillard averaged 33.0 points against the Thunder in the first round, marking the highest scoring average in a series in franchise history, while McCollum scored 185 points in the Western Conference Semifinals, marking the most points in a playoff series in franchise history.

THE TRIPLE OPTION: Against Denver in Game 6, Damian Lillard (32 points), CJ McCollum (30 points) and Rodney Hood (25) points became the first set of three Portland players to score 25-plus points in a playoff game since Danny Ainge, Clyde Drexler and Terry Porter did so on May 11, 1992. It was the third time that Lillard and McCollum have scored 30-plus points in the same playoff game.

GAME 7 COMEBACK: Denver led the Trail Blazers by as many as 17 points in the second quarter before Portland came back to win, 100-96, in Game 7 at Denver on May 12. Portland is now 2-2 all-time in Game 7 matchups.

KAN'T STOP HIM: Enes Kanter averaged a double-double of 13.2 points and 10.2 rebounds in the first round series against Oklahoma City. He ranks fourth in the playoffs in rebounding (10.5) and 16th in field goal percentage (51.1%).

FORT COLLINS: After scoring a postseason career-high 14 points in Game 5 at Denver on May 7, Zach Collins again scored 14 points in Game 6 on May 9 to go with four rebounds, one assist, one steal and a postseason career-high five blocks. He was the first Portland player to have five blocks in a playoff game since the 2010 playoffs (Aldridge). Collins is ranks ninth in the 2019 Playoffs in blocks (1.36).

MOUNT HOOD: Rodney Hood scored a postseason career-high 25 points (8-12 FG, 3-4 3-PT, 6-9 FT) to go with four rebounds against Denver in Game 6 on May 9. He scored 10 points in the fourth quarter on 3-of-5 shooting (2-3 3-PT, 2-2 FT). In the Western Conference Semifinals, Hood averaged 14.7 points (57.6% FG, 50.0% 3-PT, 77.4% FT) and 3.1 rebounds.

CURRY IN A HURRY: Seth Curry scored 16 points (6-9 FG, 4-6 3-PT) off the bench against the Nuggets in Game 4 on May 5. All 16 of Curry's points came in the first half (14 in the second quarter). Curry made three straight three-pointers in the span of one minute in the second quarter.

RODNEY'S NEIGHBOR-HOOD: Rodney Hood scored 19 points (6-8 FG, 2-3 3-PT, 5-7 FT) to go with two rebounds and one assist in 24 minutes against Denver in Game 3. Hood played the final 1:45 of the fourth overtime period, scoring seven of Portland's final nine points (3-3 FG, 1-1 3-PT). His three-pointer with 18.6 seconds remaining gave Portland a 138-136 lead.

RIISING TO THE OCCASION: Al-Farouq Aminu scored 19 points (6-10 FG, 1-4 3-PT, 6-7 FT) to go with eight rebounds and two blocks against Denver in Game 4 on May 5. In 36 career playoff games across four postseasons, Aminu holds playoff career averages of 11.8 points, 7.5 rebounds, 1.4 assists, 0.90 steals and 0.90 blocks while shooting 43.6% from the field and 39.5% from the three-point line. His postseason averages in each category are higher than his career regular season averages.

PLAYOFF NEWS AND NOTES

MARATHON MEN: Portland and Denver played the second quadruple-overtime game in NBA Playoffs history on May 3. **CJ McCollum** (60 minutes), **Damian Lillard** (58 minutes) and **Enes Kanter** (56 minutes) each played more minutes than any other player in franchise postseason history.

MODA-MENTUM: The Trail Blazers won 12 straight home games between the regular season and the playoffs from March 9 to May 3. Portland had a record of 32-9 at home this season and was one of two teams to have two separate home winning streaks of at least eight games this season (Denver).

ELEVATED DEFENSE: The Trail Blazers held Denver to 12 points in the second quarter and 35 points in the first half of Game 2 in Denver on May 1. It matched the lowest-scoring second quarter in franchise postseason history and marked the first time the Trail Blazers had held an opponent to 35 points or fewer in the first half of a playoff game since May 9, 2000.

LIGHTNING ROD: **Rodney Hood** scored 19 points against Denver in Game 3 on May 3. It was his third straight game with at least 15 points. It is the first time in his career that Hood has scored in double figures in three straight playoff games.

STARTING STRONG: **Enes Kanter** scored 26 points on 11-of-14 shooting (4-4 FT) in Game 1 against Denver on April 29. It was the second-highest-scoring game of his postseason career, and the fourth time he has scored 20-plus points in a playoff game. Kanter had 20 points in Game 1 of Portland's first round series against the Thunder.

DIVISIONAL FOES: Portland's Western Conference Semifinals series against Denver was Portland's second playoff matchup against a divisional opponent since facing the Lakers in 2002 as members of the Pacific Division. Entering this postseason against divisional rivals Oklahoma City and Denver, the Trail Blazers had never faced a Northwest Division opponent since the division was formed in 2004-05.

REPEAT PERFORMANCE: **Damian Lillard** followed up his 50-point effort in Game 5 against Oklahoma City on April 23 with 39 points (12-21 FG, 4-12 3-PT, 11-13 FT) in Game 1 at Denver on April 29. Lillard is the second player in franchise history to score at least 39 points in consecutive playoff games (Aldridge, April 20-23, 2014).

DAME TIME: **Damian Lillard** scored a postseason franchise-record 50 points (17-33 FG, 10-18 3-PT, 6-8 FT), including a series-winning three-pointer from 37 feet as time expired, to go with seven rebounds, six assists, three steals and one block in Game 5 against Oklahoma City on April 23. He is the first player in NBA history to score 50-plus points and make a game-winning buzzer-beater in the same playoff game. His 10 three-pointers mark the second-most threes in a playoff game in league history (11, Klay Thompson, 5/28/16 - GSW at OKC).

CLOSEOUT GAME: After splitting Game 3 and Game 4 in Oklahoma City, the Trail Blazers closed out their First Round series against the Thunder with a 118-115 victory in Game 5 at Moda Center. The Trail Blazers are 22-17 (.564) all-time in potential closeout games.

WINNING BIG: Portland's 20-point win against the Thunder in Game 2 marked the team's largest margin of victory in the playoffs since beating Dallas, 125-103, on May 2, 2003.

PLAYOFF DEBUT: Through the first 13 playoff games of his career, **Seth Curry** is shooting 20-of-47 from the three-point line (42.6%). After finishing the regular season third in the NBA in three-point percentage (45.0%), Curry has been the 18th-most-accurate player from the three-point line in the playoffs.

FIRST IN THREES: With his sixth three-pointer against the Thunder in Game 5 on April 23, **Damian Lillard** (144 three-pointers) moved into first place on the all-time franchise list for three-pointers in the playoffs (Porter, 113). His six three-pointers in the first half of that game matched the franchise record for three-pointers in a half in a playoff game (McCollum, 4/19/15 at Mem.).

DOING IT ALL: **Damian Lillard** had 29 points (10-21 FG, 4-8 3-PT, 5-7 FT), four rebounds, six assists, three steals and two blocks against the Thunder in Game 2. He is the only player in franchise history to have at least 29 points, four rebounds, six assists, three steals and two blocks in a playoff game.

AS THE THREE SEED: The Trail Blazers enter the 2019 Playoffs as the three seed in the Western Conference. It is the second season in a row that Portland has earned the three seed and the seventh time in franchise history. The Trail Blazers have advanced to the Western Conference Finals three times as the three seed (1977, 1990 and 2000) and made the NBA Finals twice (1977, 1990) with Portland's one NBA Championship coming as the three seed (1977). The Trail Blazers all-time playoffs record as the three seed is 47-35 (.573).

THREE-POINT THREATS: **Damian Lillard** (first, 144), **CJ McCollum** (third, 92) and **Al-Farouq Aminu** (fourth, 63) each rank in the top-five in franchise history for three-pointers made in the playoffs. McCollum is shooting 39.8% from the three-point line this postseason (39-of-98) while Aminu has shot 15-of-49 (30.6%). Lillard has made at least four three-pointers in 18 of his 48 career postseason games.

RULE OF THIRDS: Portland scored a franchise playoff-record 43 points in the third quarter of Game 3 at Oklahoma City. **Damian Lillard** accounted for 25 points (8-11 FG, 3-4 3-PT, 6-6 FT) in the quarter, marking the highest-scoring quarter in the NBA Playoffs since Allen Iverson had 26 points on June 1, 2001. Lillard is averaging 8.6 points in the third quarter for the 2019 Playoffs.

HOME COURT ADVANTAGE: Portland entered the 2019 Playoffs with home court advantage in the First Round for the second year in a row and the 14th time in franchise history. Portland went 6-7 in the previous 13 series. The Trail Blazers are 85-43 (.664) all-time at home in the Playoffs (43-27 at home in the First Round).

HAVE A HALF: **Damian Lillard** scored 34 points in the first half of Game 5 against the Thunder on April 23, breaking his own postseason franchise-record of 28 points in a half, set in the second half of Game 3 against the Thunder on April 19. His 34 points were the most points scored in a half in a playoff game since Steve Nash scored 35 at Dallas on May 15, 2005.

ENES THE MENACE: **Enes Kanter** recorded 20 points (8-15 FG, 4-6 FT) and a postseason career-high 18 rebounds (seven offensive) against the Thunder in Game 1. Kanter is the third player in franchise history (Walton - three times, Aldridge - once) to have at least 20 points and 18 rebounds in a postseason game.

PLAYOFF NEWS AND NOTES

STARTING STRONG: The Trail Blazers shot 12-of-20 from the field (7-10 3-PT, 8-10 FT) in the first quarter of Game 1 against the Thunder while jumping out to a 39-25 lead. Portland's 104-99 win marked the first time the Trail Blazers have won Game 1 of a playoff series since 2014. The Trail Blazers have won four of the last five playoff series in which they won Game 1.

UP 2-0: Portland's 114-94 victory over the Thunder in Game 2 gave the Trail Blazers a 2-0 lead in the best-of-seven First Round series. The Trail Blazers have gone up 2-0 in a playoff series 14 times previously. Portland won all 14 of those playoff series.

BEEN THERE BEFORE: Ten of Portland's 15 players had previous playoff experience entering the 2019 Playoffs, combining for a total of 234 postseason games. **Evan Turner** (47 games), **Damian Lillard** (35 games), **CJ McCollum** (30 games), **Rodney Hood** (28 games), **Enes Kanter** (27 games) and **Al-Farouq Aminu** (24 games) all had over 20 games of postseason experience entering this postseason.

THE BIG 5-0: Portland's 116-89 victory over the Grizzlies on April 3 was the team's 50th win of the season. It is the 14th 50-win season in franchise history and the first since the 2014-15 season. It is the third time the Trail Blazers have won at least 50 games under head coach **Terry Stotts**, which is the second-most in team history (Rick Adelman, four). Portland's 53-29 record is the team's best finish since the 2013-14 season (54-28).

NEWS AND NOTES

LEADING THE WAY: Terry Stotts was hired as the franchise's 14th head coach on August 7, 2012. Stotts led the Trail Blazers to a 53-29 record in 2018-19 and has compiled a 325-249 record in seven seasons with Portland. Stotts is the second-winningest coach in franchise history, and the second Trail Blazers head coach to lead the franchise to six straight postseason appearances (Rick Adelman, 1989-1994).

WINNING WAYS: The Trail Blazers ended the regular season with a record of 53-29, marking the team's best finish since the 2013-14 season (54-28). It was Portland's sixth consecutive season with a record of .500 or better, marking the first time the team has accomplished that feat since having 15 straight seasons with a record of .500 or better from 1989-90 to 2003-04.

HOME COOKING: Portland won 18 of its final 20 games at Moda Center and finished the season with a 32-9 record at home. It was Portland's best record at home since the 2014-15 season (32-9).

BESTING HIMSELF: Damian Lillard finished the season with 2,067 points (5th in the NBA), setting a new career high for points in a season. It is the fourth-most points in a season in franchise history. Lillard also set career highs in a season for assists (551), field goals (681), three-pointers (237), blocks (34) and offensive rebounds (68).

POINT OF ATTACK: Damian Lillard recorded 2,067 points and 551 assists in 2018-19, becoming the first player in franchise history to have 2,000 points and 500 assists in the same season. James Harden was the only other player to accomplish the feat this season.

TWO OF A KIND: Damian Lillard and CJ McCollum were two of the 14 NBA players to average at least 21.0 points, 4.0 rebounds and 3.0 assists while shooting at least 35.0% from the three-point line this season. The Trail Blazers are one of two teams that had two such players (GSW - Curry/Durant).

ONE OF THREE: Damian Lillard, Oscar Robertson and LeBron James are the only players in NBA history to record at least 1,500 points and 400 assists in each of their first seven seasons.

THREE-POINT MILESTONES: With five three-pointers against Denver on April 7, Damian Lillard set a new franchise record for three-pointers in a season (237), breaking his own record from 2015-16 (229). His second three was the 1,500th three-pointer of his career. He is the 33rd player in league history to reach 1,500 threes and was third-fastest to reach the milestone, doing so in 548 games (Curry - 477 games, Thompson - 517 games).

FROM DOWNTOWN: With 904 three-pointers on the season, the Trail Blazers set a franchise record for three-pointers in a season (864, 2015-16). Portland finished ninth in the NBA in three-point percentage.

BEASTS ON THE BOARDS: The Trail Blazers recorded at least 50 rebounds in 35 games this season, the second-most in the league (Milwaukee, 45). Portland ranked third in rebounds per game (48.0) and led the NBA in rebound percentage (52.6%).

GIVE ME MOE: Maurice Harkless had a season-high 26 points against the Lakers on April 9, including a game-winning three-pointer as time expired. He scored Portland's final 12 points of the game. Harkless shot 9-of-14 from the floor (1-4 3-PT, 7-8 FT) while adding eight rebounds and a career-high-tying four blocks.

AGAINST THE EAST: Portland finished the season with a 24-6 record against the Eastern Conference, which was the best record of any NBA team against the East in the 2018-19 season. The 24 wins are tied for the third-most the Trail Blazers have had against the Eastern Conference in a season in franchise history (28, twice). Portland's .800 winning percentage against the East matches the second-best by the franchise in an 82-game season.

2,000 POINTS TWICE: With 2,067 points on the season, Damian Lillard reached 2,000 points for the second time in his career and the seventh time in franchise history. He joins Clyde Drexler as the only two players in franchise history with two 2,000-point seasons (1987-88, 1988-89).

WINNING BIG: Portland's 116-89 win against Memphis on April 3 was the team's 29th win by 10-plus points in 2018-19. The Trail Blazers were one of six teams with at least 29 wins by double digits this season.

SIX STRAIGHT: The Trail Blazers won six consecutive games from March 18 to March 29, marking the team's longest winning streak of the season.

CURRY COOKING: Seth Curry had 19 points (7-13 FG, 5-8 3-PT), two rebounds, one assist and three steals at the Lakers on April 9, including a steal to set up Maurice Harkless' game-winning shot. In his last 12 games of the regular season, Curry averaged 14.2 points (48.8% FG, 47.1% 3-PT, 87.5% FT), 2.8 rebounds and 1.0 assists.

BOSNIAN BEAST: Jusuf Nurkic averaged 15.6 points (50.8% FG, 77.3% FT), 10.4 rebounds, 3.2 assists, 1.43 blocks and 1.00 steals in 72 games (all starts) this season. He was one of four players in the NBA to average at least 15.0 points, 10.0 rebounds, 3.0 assists and 1.40 blocks this season (Antetokounmpo/Davis/Towns).

PLAYER OF THE WEEK

CJ McCollum and Damian Lillard became the first set of Trail Blazers teammates to each win Western Conference Player of the Week honors in the same season since Lillard and LaMarcus Aldridge did so during the 2014-15 season.

NOVEMBER 12: CJ McCollum was named NBA Western Conference Player of the Week for games played from Nov. 5 to Nov. 11. His week was highlighted by 40 points, four rebounds, six assists and four steals against the Bucks on Nov. 6 and 23 points and seven rebounds against the Clippers on Nov. 8. It is the first time McCollum has received the award.

MARCH 31: Damian Lillard was named the Western Conference Player of the Week for the week spanning March 25 to March 30. Lillard led Portland to a 3-1 record on the week while averaging 25.3 points, 7.3 assists and 5.8 rebounds. It is the seventh time he has won the award during his career and the first time this season.

NEWS AND NOTES

AFTER THE BREAK: The Trail Blazers had a record of 19-6 after the All-Star break, good for the second-best record in the league post All-Star. It is the third consecutive season that Portland has had one of the five best records in the league after the All-Star Break.

POINTS ON THE BOARD: The Trail Blazers averaged 114.7 points during the 2018-19 regular season, good for the sixth-most in the NBA and the team's highest scoring average since the 1990-91 season (114.7). Portland's 9,402 total points for the season are the seventh-most the team has scored in franchise history.

PROLIFIC OUTPUT: Portland scored at least 120 points in 28 games this season (8th in the NBA). It is the most games of 120-plus points the Trail Blazers have had in a season since the 190-91 season (28).

SHARING THE ROCK: The Trail Blazers dished out at least 25 assists in 32 games this season, compiling a 27-5 record in those contests. Portland had a season-high 35 assists against Brooklyn on March 25.

COACH'S CORNER

A MILESTONE WIN: With a 110-109 overtime victory over the Warriors on Dec. 27, **Terry Stotts** moved past Rick Adelman for second place on the all-time franchise wins list. He is the third coach in franchise history to coach 500-plus games. In his seventh season with Portland, Stotts is the fourth-longest tenured head coach in the NBA.

COACH OF THE MONTH: **Terry Stotts** was named the Western Conference Coach of the Month for February and again for games played in March and April. Stotts has won a coach of the month award in each of the last six seasons, making him the only coach to win the award in six straight seasons since its inception in the 1982-83 season.

STOTTS WINS 400: Portland's 115-112 victory over the Magic on Nov. 28 marked the 400th career victory for **Terry Stotts**. Stotts was the 47th coach in NBA history to reach the 400-win mark.

CLUB 300: With the Trail Blazer's win over the Pelicans on Jan. 18, **Terry Stotts** joined Jack Ramsay (453 wins) as the second coach in franchise history to reach 300 wins. He is one of five active coaches that have won 300 games with their current team (Popovich/Spiegelstra/Carlisle/Kerr).

TRIPLE-DOUBLES

Entering the 2018-19 season, Portland's most recent triple-double belonged to Nicolas Batum on Jan. 8, 2014. After more than a five-year drought, **Evan Turner** (2), **CJ McCollum** and **Jusuf Nurkic** each recorded triple-doubles this season. They are the first trio of Trail Blazers teammates to record triple-doubles in the same season since the 1988-89 season (Drexler/Kersey/Porter).

NURK TRIPLE-DOUBLE: **Jusuf Nurkic** recorded his first career triple-double on Jan. 16 against Cleveland, finishing with 10 points, 10 rebounds, 10 assists and five blocks in 28 minutes. He joined Bill Walton as the second player in team history to record a points/rebounds/assists triple-double while blocking at least five shots. Nurkic was the first player in NBA history to have at least 10 points, 10 rebounds, 10 assists and five blocks while playing 28 minutes or less.

McTRIPLE-DOUBLE: With 28 points (10-23 FG, 2-8 3-PT, 6-7 FT), 10 rebounds and 10 assists against the Hawks on Jan. 26, **CJ McCollum** recorded the first triple-double of his career. It was the fourth time in his career that he corralled double digit rebounds and his 10 assists matched his career high.

EVAN ALMIGHTY: **Evan Turner** recorded his first triple-double with the Trail Blazers (fourth career) at Minnesota on April 1, finishing with 13 points (5-5 FG, 1-1 3-PT, 2-2 FT), 11 rebounds and 10 assists in 25 minutes. He is the first player in NBA history to come off the bench and shoot perfect from the floor while posting a triple-double. It came four years to the day after his last triple-double.

RUN IT BACK: With 13 points (6-7 FG, 1-1 3-PT) and season highs of 12 rebounds and 11 assists against the Grizzlies on April 3, **Evan Turner** recorded his second triple-double in as many games. He is the second player in franchise history to record a triple-double in consecutive games (Drexler) and the first player in NBA history to record consecutive triple-doubles off the bench since starts were first recorded in 1970-71.

CJ SCORING 30: With 35 points (12-20 FG, 7-11 3-PT, 4-4 FT) against the Clippers on March 12, **CJ McCollum** scored 30-plus points for the 14th time this season. It is the second-most games of 30-plus points he has had in a season in his career (15, 2016-17). His scoring average of 21.0 points was good for 26th in the NBA.

SETH CURRY WITH THE SHOT: **Seth Curry** finished the regular season ranked third in the NBA in three-point percentage (113-of-251, 45.0%) and shot the second-highest percentage from deep for a player with at least 100 attempts in a season in franchise history (Tracy Murray, 45.9%, 1993-94). Portland was 23-1 when Curry scored in double figures.

DAME IN DOUBLE DIGITS: **Damian Lillard** has scored in double figures in 219 consecutive games dating back to 2016, which is the fourth-longest active streak in the NBA. With 35 points against the Kings on Jan. 14, Lillard passed Clyde Drexler for the franchise record for consecutive games with double-digit scoring (183, 1987-90).

THE BENCH BOUNCE: Portland's reserves combined to score 60 points at Minnesota on April 1. The Trail Blazers bench has scored at least 50 points in 12 games this season. Portland is 12-0 in those contests.

NEWS AND NOTES

DAME DROPPING 30: **Damian Lillard** scored 36 points (13-25 FG, 4-10 3-PT, 6-6 FT) at Atlanta on March 29, marking his 26th game of 30-plus points this season (t-5th in the NBA). The most games of 30-plus points that Lillard has had in a season in his career is 27 (2016-17). Lillard is 10th in the league in scoring (26.0).

IN LAYMANS TERMS: **Jake Layman** scored in double figures in 19 games from Jan. 4 to the end of the season, including five straight from Jan. 13 to Jan. 21. He had reached double figures just five times previously in his career.

SIMONS SAYS: **Anfernee Simons** had 37 points (13-21 FG, 7-11 3-PT, 4-6 3-PT), six rebounds and nine assists in 48 minutes against the Kings on April 10. With the effort, Simons matched the most points scored by an NBA player in his first career start going back to the 1985-86 season.

SKAL'S NIGHT: **Skal Labissiere** had 29 points (12-17 FG, 2-2 3-PT, 3-4 FT), 15 rebounds, one assist, two steals and one block against the Kings on April 10. His 15 rebounds tied his career high in rebounds and his 29 points were a season high in scoring.

RARE COMPANY: **Damian Lillard** scored a season-high 51 points (15-28 FG, 3-10 3-PT, 18-20 FT) to go with five rebounds, nine assists, one steal and two blocks against the Thunder on March 7. It was the fifth time in his career that Lillard scored 50-plus points. He is the sixth active player and the 20th player in NBA history with at least five 50-point games.

THIRD QUARTER THREES: Of his 237 three-pointers this season (8th in the NBA), **Damian Lillard** made 99 in the third period (t-2nd in NBA). Lillard was third in the league in second-half scoring (14.4 ppg).

LOGO LILLARD: **Damian Lillard** made 44 three-pointers from over 28 feet this season, which was the third-most in the NBA (Curry, 62). Lillard has made 115 three-pointers from that distance over the last three seasons, which is the second-most in the league in that span (Curry, 117).

BALANCED ATTACK: Portland had five players score at least 15 points against the Kings on April 10, marking the sixth time this season that it occurred (all since Jan. 9). The last time the Trail Blazers had five or more players score 15-plus points in five games was the 1993-94 season.

NURK MAKES HISTORY: **Jusuf Nurkic** recorded 24 points (5-10 FG, 14-16 FT), 23 rebounds, seven assists, five steals and five blocks at Sacramento on Jan. 1. He is the first player in NBA history to have a game with 20-plus points and 20-plus rebounds while adding at least five assists, five steals and five blocks. Nurkic joins Nic Batum as the only Portland players to record a five-by-five. His 23 rebounds and 14 free throws were both career highs.

STARTING STRONG: All five of Portland's starters scored in double figures against the Raptors on March 1, marking the fourth time in six games that all five starters reached double figures. Portland was 8-1 on the season when that occurred.

LILLARD AT THE LINE: **Damian Lillard** made at least eight free throws in 28 games this season, the fourth-most in the NBA. He is shot 91.2% from the free throw line this season (468-of-513), which was the third-best mark in the league. Lillard was fourth in the league in free throws made (Harden, 754) and seventh in attempts (Harden, 858).

OFFENSIVE OUTPUT: Portland's 148 points against Brooklyn on March 25 matched the sixth-highest scoring total in franchise history and the most points the Trail Blazers have scored since March 15, 1992 (148).

SPECIAL RESERVE: **Evan Turner** is the second player in NBA history to average at least 6.8 points, 4.5 rebounds and 3.9 assists for a season in a reserve role since starts were first recorded in the 1970-71 season, joining John Williams (1988-89).

DEEP TROUBLE: With one three-pointer against the Lakers on April 9, **CJ McCollum** (823 threes) moved within four triples from passing Wesley Matthews (826 threes) for second place on the Trail Blazers all-time three-pointers list. **Damian Lillard** is the franchise leader with 1,506 three-pointers.

ZACH ATTACK: **Zach Collins** scored a career-high 18 points (7-10 FG, 2-2 3-PT, 2-4 FT), including 11 in the fourth quarter, to go with six rebounds and one block against Memphis on April 3. Collins averaged 8.7 points (56.3% FG, 47.6% 3-PT) and 4.4 rebounds over the last 11 games of the regular season.

SECOND FROM THE TOP: With a three-pointer at the 3:54 mark of the second quarter at New Orleans on March 15, **Damian Lillard** (12,909 points) passed LaMarcus Aldridge (12,562 points) for second place on the Trail Blazers all-time scoring list. Aldridge set his mark in 648 games, while it took Lillard 536 games to pass him.

CHIEF IN CHARGE: **Al-Farouq Aminu** recorded consecutive double doubles for the first time this season on March 27 and March 29. Aminu had 17 points and 11 rebounds at Atlanta on March 29 after posting 12 points and 11 boards at Chicago on March 27.

ONE OF TWO: **Damian Lillard** had 30 points and 15 assists against Indiana on March 18, joining Clyde Drexler (3/14/86 at Dal.) as the only two players in franchise history to have a game with at least 30 points and 15 assists.

1,500 POINTS: With his 13th point against Philadelphia on Feb. 23, **Damian Lillard** reached 1,500 points for the season. He is the 4th active player (C. Anthony, K. Durant, L. James) and 12th player in NBA history to score 1,500 points in each of his first seven seasons. His seven seasons with 1,500 points are the most in team history (Drexler, six).

BACKCOURT BLOCKS: **Damian Lillard** finished the season ranked third in blocks among players under 6'4" (34) while CJ McCollum ranked 10th among that group (28).

MY-OH-MYERS: **Meyers Leonard** shot a career-high 45.0% from the three-point-line this season. Leonard scored a season-high 19 points (8-13 FG, 1-2 3-PT, 2-2 FT) to go with 11 rebounds and three assists against Sacramento on April 10. It was his second double-double of the season.

TRENT ON FIRE: **Gary Trent Jr.** scored a career high 19 points (8-19 FG, 1-5 3-PT, 2-3 FT) to go with two rebounds and three assists against Sacramento on April 10. In January, Trent averaged 33.3 points (50.7% FG, 50.0% 3-PT, 88.9% FT), 5.5 rebounds and 1.8 assists in six games with the Texas Legends of the NBA G League. His 200 total points are the second-most points scored by a player in their first six career G League games in league history.
