BUCK SHOTS

- The Eastern Conference Finals return to Milwaukee for Game 5 tonight tied at 2-2. The Bucks are 6-1 at Fiserv Forum this postseason, including a win in Game 5 of the Eastern Conference Semifinals.
- Khris Middleton led the Bucks in Game 4, scoring a 2019 playoff-high 30 points on 11-for-15 shooting (.733) with a 4-for-7 mark from beyond the arc. This was Middleton's third 30-point game in his playoff career. He's just the 10th player in franchise history to score 30+ points on 70% or better shooting in a playoff game.
- Giannis Antetokounmpo added 25 points, 10 rebounds and 5 assists in Game 5, marking his 3rd 25/10/5 game of this postseason, and the 4th of his playoff career. Antetokounmpo and Kareem Abdul-Jabbar (14) are the only players in franchise history to have multiple 25/10/5 games in the playoffs, while Antetokounmpo is currently on pace to join Abdul-Jabbar (1972) as the only players in Bucks playoff history to average more than 25.0 points, 10.0 rebounds and 5.0 assists per game in a single postseason.
- Antetokounmpo now has 10 double-doubles in 13 playoff games, which are the third-most double-doubles by a Buck in a postseason. Only Abdul-Jabbar has more double-doubles in a single postseason in Bucks history (1974: 15; 1971: 11).
- After tallying 11 points in Game 5, Nikola Mirotić has now scored in double figures in a playoff-career-high five consecutive games. This is also his longest double-digit scoring streak as a Buck (regular or postseason).
- In the playoffs, Milwaukee still ranks among the team leaders in scoring (2nd, 115.3), rebounds per game (1st, 52.6), blocks per game (1st, 6.7), opponent field goal percentage (1st, .404), points per game differential (1st, 11.1), field goal percentage (4th, .454) and 3-point field goal percentage (4th, .336).

Recent Games...

Round 3, Game 4 at Toronto
L, 102-120 – The Raptors evened up the series at 2-2 with a 120-102 win over the Bucks in Game 4 on Tuesday night in Toronto. After a close first quarter that ended with the Raptors up 32-31, Toronto began the second quarter on a 9-0 run to open up a 10-point lead and led the rest of the quarter before leading by 10, 65-55, at halftime. In the third quarter, the Bucks were able to get within seven points with 4:16 remaining, before the Raptors closed out the quarter up 13 at 94-81. Toronto then began to put the game away in the fourth, using a 10-3 run at the start of the quarter to take its largest lead of the game at 104-84 with 8:35 left. From there, Milwaukee could only get as close at 14 points as the Raptors went on to win by 18 and even the series. Khris Middleton led the Bucks with 30 points while Giannis Antetokounmpo added 25 points, 10 rebounds and five assists. Kyle Lowry scored a team-high 25 points for the Raptors.

Round 3, Game 3 at Toronto
L, 118-112 (2OT) – In a double overtime thriller, the Bucks fell to the Raptors, 118-112, in Game 3 on Sunday. In regulation, Toronto led for all but the first minute of the game, but Milwaukee was able to hang around, never trailing by more than 11. At the end of the fourth quarter, it was a Khris Middleton putback that sent the game into overtime tied at 96. In the first overtime period, the Raptors were able to take a four-point lead with 1:29 remaining, but a Malcolm Brogdon floater and two George Hill free throws tied the game at 103. On Toronto's final possession, Kawhi Leonard missed a fadeaway that sent the game into a second overtime. In the second overtime, the Bucks scored the first two points, but after that, the Raptors led the rest of the way, eventually going up four at 114-110 with 32.4 seconds left. From there, the Bucks couldn't pull any closer as the Raptors picked up the win. Hill led the Bucks with 24 points while Brogdon added 20. Leonard scored a game-high 36 points for the Raptors.

Regular Season Game 4 at Toronto – January 31, 2019 – Scotiabank Arena

W, 105-92 – Milwaukee topped Toronto on Jan. 31 at Scotiabank Arena, 105-92. The first quarter was an even contest as neither team led by more than five points, however, Toronto took a slight 25-22 advantage into the second quarter. Milwaukee quickly responded assuming the lead within the first three minutes of play before going up by as many as 12 points prior to heading into halftime up by nine, 56-47. In the third quarter, the Bucks lengthened their lead to 24, the largest of the night, after a 22-7 run. With the score in favor of the Bucks, 78-59, and 3:56 remaining in the quarter, Toronto went on a 22-9 run of their own to cut the Bucks' lead to single digits heading into the fourth quarter. In the fourth quarter, despite the Raptors cutting the lead to just six points with 1:59 to play, two foul shots and a Malcolm Brogdon three-pointer sealed the deal for the Bucks as they took home the win and clinched a 3-1 season series win. Giannis Antetokounmpo led the Bucks with 19 points, while Pascal Siakam led the Raptors with 28 points.

Regular Season Game 3 vs. Toronto – January 5, 2019 – Fiserv Forum

L, 116-123 – The Bucks fell to the Raptors at Fiserv Forum on Jan. 5, 123-116. The Bucks were able to take an early advantage in this one, going up by 10 early in the second quarter after a close first quarter. Milwaukee led again by 10, 47-37, with 5:41 remaining in the quarter before Toronto closed out the first half on a 10-2 run to pull within one at 57-56 entering halftime. In the third quarter, the Raptors were able to regain the lead before going up by 13 with 3:45 left in the quarter, before taking a nine-point, 91-82, lead heading into the fourth quarter. A quick 7-0 run by the Bucks to begin the fourth quarter pulled them within two before they took the lead on a Giannis Antetokounmpo three with 8:12 remaining. But after Antetokounmpo's three, Toronto went on a 15-2 run to regain a 12-point advantage at 110-98. From there, the Bucks could only get as close as seven points as the Raptors picked up a seven-point victory. Antetokounmpo led the Bucks scoring 43 points with 18 rebounds while Kawhi Leonard and Pascal Siakam each scored 30 points for the Raptors.

Regular Season Game 2 at Toronto – December 9, 2018 – Scotiabank Arena

W, 104-99 – Back-to-back threes by Malcolm Brogdon at the end of the game lifted the Bucks past the Raptors on Dec. 9 at Scotiabank Arena, 104-99. After trailing by five points heading into the second quarter, the Bucks went on a 5-0 run to tie the game at 30 early in the second quarter. From that moment on neither team would lead by more than five points until the end of the third quarter when the Bucks took a seven-point lead at 79-72. The Bucks extended their lead early in the fourth using a 6-0 run to do so, leading by as many as 11 points, however, a 3-pointer by Fred VanVleet snapped the Bucks run, and sparked a 23-9 run by the Raptors to give them a 97-94 lead with 3:13 left to play. But back-to-back threes by Brogdon, combined with a layup by Giannis Antetokounmpo off a Toronto turnover, put the Bucks back on top before holding on for the win. Giannis Antetokounmpo and Brook Lopez led the Bucks, scoring 19 points each.

Regular Season Game 1 vs. Toronto – October 29, 2018 – Fiserv Forum

W, 124-109 – The Bucks won their seventh straight game to start the season, knocking off the Raptors, 124-109, at Fiserv Forum on Oct. 29. Despite playing without All-Star Giannis Antetokounmpo, Milwaukee led for the majority of the game, only trailing for a few minutes in the first quarter. After regaining the lead late in the first quarter, the Bucks started the second quarter on a 10-1 run to open up a 40-30 lead. Although Toronto was able to get within three points at 49-46, the Bucks closed out the first half up by nine, 62-53. In the second half, the Bucks led by double figures for most of the final two quarters of play, extending their lead to as many as 24 points midway through the fourth quarter. At this point, the deficit was too much for the Raptors to overcome as the Bucks picked up their sixth straight win by 10+ points. Ersan Ilyasova led the Bucks with 19 points and 10 rebounds while Malcolm Brogdon and Eric Bledsoe each tallied 17 points for Milwaukee. Toronto was led by Serge Ibaka who scored a team-high 30 points.

PLAYOFF NOTES

BUILT TO CONTENT – Following a 4-1 series win over the Boston Celtics in the Eastern Conference Semifinals, the Milwaukee Bucks are in the Eastern Conference Finals for the first time since 2001 and for the eighth time in franchise history (2001, 1986, 1984, 1983, 1974, 1972, 1971). The Bucks are looking to advance to the NBA Finals for just the third time in franchise history.

BIG WINNERS – Not only did the Bucks win eight of their first nine games of the playoffs, but they did so by outscoring the Celtics and Pistons by a combined 138 points over those nine games. Seven of Milwaukee's first eight playoff wins came by double digits, including five of those wins by 20+ points. The Bucks' 138 point differential through the first nine games of the postseason is tied for the third-largest margin all-time. GIANNIS ON THE RISE – With two more 30-point games in the Eastern Conference Semifinals, and another in Game 2 of the Eastern Conference Finals, Giannis Antetokounmpo now has nine career playoff games with 30+ points, which are the second most in Bucks playoff history. Antetokounmpo has also jumped up to third on the Bucks' all-time playoff scoring list after entering the 2019 postseason in fifth.

A GREEK ODYSSEY – Bucks All-Star forward Giannis Antetokounmpo had the best season of his career in 2018-19. Antetokounmpo set new career-highs in points (27.7, 3rd in NBA), rebounds (12.5, 6th in NBA) and assists (5.9) per game while shooting a career-best, and franchise record, 57.8% from the field (11th in NBA). IN GOOD COMPANY – By averaging more than 25.0 points, 10.0 rebounds and 5.0 assists per game this season, Antetokounmpo became just the ninth player in NBA history to average 25/10/5 over the course of a season (done a total of 14 times). Among the 14 times a 25/10/5 season has been achieved, Antetokounmpo by far has the highest field goal percentage of the group. KHASHING IT IN – Bucks forward Khris Middleton, who made his first All-Star Game this season, averaged career-highs in both rebounds (6.1), assists (4.3) and 3s (2.3) per game in addition to 18.2 points per contest this season. Despite posting impressive enough numbers to make the All-Star Game prior to the All-Star break, Middleton turned things up another notch after the All-Star break, averaging more than 21.0 points, 6.0 rebounds and 4.0 assists per game.

REGULAR SEASON NOTES

SPLASH MOUNTAIN – Splash Mountain was open all season in Milwaukee, as Bucks center Brook Lopez became the first player in NBA history to make more than 150 threes and block 150 shots in a season. He finished the season 17th in the NBA in threes made with 187, setting a new NBA record for threes made by a 7-footer, and ended the season ranked fourth in the NBA in blocks per game. His 187 threes were the third-most in Bucks history while his 179 blocks were the sixth-most.

THE PRESIDENT – Malcolm Brogdon, the 2016-17 NBA Rookie of the Year, had a career year in his third NBA season. Brogdon averaged a career-high 15.6 points per game while shooting career-bests in field goal percentage (.505), 3-point percentage (.426) and free-throw percentage (.928, NBA-high). He became just the eighth player in NBA history to shoot better than 50% from the field, 40% from three and 90% from the free-throw line, joining the likes of Stephen Curry, Steve Nash, Larry Bird and Dirk Nowitzki.

HAUL IT IN – No team crashed the boards like the Bucks did this season as they averaged an NBA-high 49.7 rebounds per game. That number's not only good for sixth-best in Bucks history, and the best since the 1972-73 season, but it's the best the NBA has seen since the Washington Bullets averaged 49.7 boards way back in 1978-79.

MILWAUKEE BUCKS HEAD COACH MIKE BUDENHOLZER

In his first season as head coach of the Milwaukee Bucks, Mike Budenholzer led the Bucks to the best record in the NBA, and tied for the third-best record in franchise history, at 60-22. In 2018-19, the Bucks saw a 16-win improvement from last season while leading the NBA in points per game, defensive rating, and net rating, in addition to ranking second in 3-pointers made and third in offensive rating. Milwaukee also outscored its opponents by a league-best 8.9 points per game this season and held opposing offenses to an NBA-low 43.3 field goal percentage.

Budenholzer was named the Eastern Conference Coach of the Month in both January and February of the 2018-19 season and coached Team Giannis in the 2019 NBA All-Star Game in Charlotte. He was also selected by his fellow NBA head coaches as the 2019 Michael H. Goldberg NBA Coach of the Year.

Budenholzer, 49, became the 16th head coach in franchise history on May 17, 2018, bringing over 20 years of NBA coaching experience to Milwaukee, having been part of coaching staffs that won four NBA Championships. He came to the Bucks from Atlanta where he compiled a 213-197 (.520) record in five seasons as head coach of the Hawks from 2013-18. Budenholzer was named NBA Coach of the Year following the 2014-15 season after he led the Hawks to a franchise-high 60 wins and an appearance in the Eastern Conference Finals. Atlanta made the playoffs in four of Budenholzer's five seasons with the team.

Prior to joining the Hawks, Budenholzer spent the previous 19 seasons with the San Antonio Spurs, including the final 17 seasons as an assistant coach, where he was part of one of the most successful eras in NBA history. As an assistant coach with the Spurs from 1996-2013, Budenholzer helped lead San Antonio to a league-best 908-438 (.675) record and NBA Championships in 1999, 2003, 2005 and 2007. Budenholzer spent his first two seasons with the Spurs as a video coordinator before becoming an assistant coach in 1996. He also served as the team's Summer League head coach on numerous occasions and was an advance scout for Team USA for the 2004 Olympics.

A native of Holbrook, Arizona, Budenholzer is a 1993 graduate of Pomona College where he received a bachelor's degree in politics, philosophy and economics and was a four-year letterman in both basketball and golf. Following college, Budenholzer played professionally in Denmark for the Vejle Basketball Klub, averaging a team-high 27.5 points per game during the 1993-94 season, while getting his start in coaching, serving as the head coach for two different teams in the Vejle system.
