PLAYOFF NOTE-A-BULLS



For only the second time in franchise history, three Bulls recorded double doubles in the same playoff game in Game 4 vs. MIL (4/24). ZACH LaVINE (24 points / 13 assists), PATRICK WILLIAMS (20 points / 10 rebounds) and NIKOLA VUČEVIĆ (11 points/10 rebounds) join CLEM HASKINS (29 points / 13 assists), CHET WALKER (39 points / 11 rebounds) and JERRY SLOAN (23 points / 12 rebounds) in Chicago's record book as they achieved the same milestone in Game 4 of the 1970 Western Division Series vs. ATL (4/3/70).



NIKOLA VUČEVIĆ recorded his 8th career playoff double-double, and 3rd of the series, with 11 points and 11 rebounds, while ZACH LaVINE notched his 2nd career playoff double-double with 24 points and 13 assists in Game 4 vs. MIL (4/24).



After failing to make their way to the charity stripe in the opening half, the BULLS finished 16-of-17 (.941) from the line in Game 4 vs. MIL (4/24). The .941 free-throw percentage ties for the sixth best in franchise history in the postseason.



DeMAR DeROZAN became the 5th Bulls player in franchise history to score 40+-points in a playoff game with a career-high 41 in Game 2 at MIL (4/20). Last Bulls player with 40+ points in a playoff game was DERRICK ROSE (44) in Game 3 of the Eastern Conference Semifinals at ATL (5/6/11).



The BULLS have appeared in 348 playoff games, sporting an all-time postseason record of 187-161 (.537). Chicago's 187 victories tie them with the NEW YORK KNICKS (187) for the 7th most in history, trailing the LOS ANGELES LAKERS (456), BOSTON CELTICS (385), PHILADELPHIA 76ERS (238), SAN ANTONIO SPURS (222), GOLDEN STATE WARRIORS (193) and DETROIT PISTONS (188).

SERIES SUMMARY

In **GAME 4** at the United Center, once again Milwaukee's Grayson Allen played a pivotal role off the bench, knocking down 10-of-12 from the floor, including 6-of-7 from behind the arc, to ignite the visiting defending NBA Champs to seize a 3-1 series lead with a 119-95 thrashing of the Chicago Bulls ... Bucks strongman Giannis Antetokounmpo led all scorers and rebounders with 32 points and 17 rebounds, while Jrue Holiday scored 26, as the Bucks made it look easy. Milwaukee led by 22 early in the third quarter and steadied themselves after a push by Chicago to pull within 11 before wrestling control of the game for good throughout the final quarter ...

Holiday made five 3s while former Bulls forward Bobby Portis added 14 points and 10 rebounds in his second straight start in place of All-Star Khris Middleton sidelined with a sprained left MCL ... the Bucks have now beaten Chicago for the 19th time in the team's last 21 meetings ... Zach LaVine led Chicago with 24 points and 13 assists, DeMar DeRozan scored 23 and Patrick Williams finished with 20 points and 10 rebounds ... in **GAME 3** played at the United Center, the defending NBA Champion Milwaukee Bucks sprinted to a big lead in the opening quarter, making quick work of the Bulls in recording a 30 point blowout victory, 111-81, to take a 2-1 series lead ... Bucks reserve guard, Grayson Allen, connected on five 3-pointers and was the game's leading scorer with 22 points ... Giannis Antetokounmpo added 18 points, and former Bulls forward, Bobby Portis, starting in place of the injured Khris Middleton, finished with 18 points and a game-high 16 rebounds ... the Bucks made it look easy, handing the Bulls their most lopsided home playoff loss in franchise history ... Nikola Vučević led Chicago with 19 points, while Zach LaVine had 15 and DeMar DeRozan finished with just 11 after setting a career playoff high with 41 in Game 2 ... Milwaukee has now won 12 of 13 at the United Center dating to the 2016-17 season ... the Bulls have not won a home playoff game since defeating Cleveland in Game 3 of the 2015 Eastern Conference semifinals ... in **GAME 2**, Chicago's DeMar DeRozan scored a career playoff-high 41 points as Bulls outlasted the Bucks 114-110 to tie their Eastern Conference first-round series ... Nikola Vučević added 24 points and 13 rebounds, while Zach LaVine had 20 points as the Bulls beat the Bucks for just the second time in their last 19 meetings ... the series heads to Chicago for Game 3 ... Giannis Antetokounmpo led the Bucks with 33 points, 18 rebounds and nine assists, putting him one assist from his second career playoff triple-double ... Antetokounmpo increased his career postseason point total to 1,715 to overtake Kareem Abdul-Jabbar (1,692) for the most in Bucks history ... Brook Lopez also chipped in 25 points for the Bucks, while Khris Middleton scored 18 and Jrue Holiday 15 ... Middleton suffered a knee injury late and didn't finish the game ... his availability going forward is not known at this time ... in **GAME 1** of the best-of-seven Opening Round, Giannis Antetokounmpo delivered 27 points and 16 rebounds, as the defending NBA Champion Milwaukee Bucks recovered after blowing a 16-point lead to beat the Bulls 93-86 ... Brook Lopez scored 18 points, while Jrue Holiday had 15, Khris Middleton posted 11 and Bobby Portis added 10 points and 12 rebounds for Milwaukee ... Nikola Vučević led Chicago's attack with 24 points and 17 rebounds, as the Bulls made their first playoff appearance in five years ... Chicago's Zach LaVine also notched a double-double with 18 points and 10 rebounds, while DeMar DeRozan also chipped in 18 points, eight rebounds and six assists ... After the Bucks grabbed an early 32-16 lead and threatened to put this game out of reach early, the Bulls chipped away and eventually pulled ahead by scoring 13 straight points late in the third quarter ... Chicago's Coby White scored the last five points of the run, including a 3-pointer that gave the Bulls their first lead at 67-64 with 3:11 left in the third ... White's subsequent layup made it 69-64 Chicago, but the Bucks ended the third quarter with a 10-2 spurt to pull back ahead by the start of the 4th quarter ... the Bucks have now won 17 of their last 18 meetings with the Bulls, including all five matchups this season ... Chicago's lone victory during this stretch came in the 2020-21 regular-season finale.

CHICAGO BULLS PLAYOFF HISTORY VERSUS MILWAUKEE

The Chicago Bulls and Milwaukee Bucks meet in the 2021-22 NBA Playoffs for the fifth time. The teams last met in the First Round of the 2014-15 Playoffs with Chicago coming out on top in six games.

REGULAR SEASON TEAM NOTE-A-BULLS



The **BULLS** finished 6th in the East with a mark of **46-36 (.561)**, and take on the No. 3 seed, **MILWAUKEE BUCKS** in the opening round of the Playoffs.

The **BULLS** shot **.900+** from the free-throw line **16** times, tying them with **PHOENIX (16)**, and **two** behind league-leader **BROOKLYN (18)**.

The **BULLS** hit **20+** free-throws while shooting **.850+** from the stripe **15** times, ranking **3rd** behind **ATLANTA (16)** and **PHILADELPHIA (18)**.

The **BULLS**, **MILWAUKEE**, and **LA CLIPPERS** each shot **.600+** from the floor **twice**, while **BROOKLYN** and **DENVER** led the way with **three**.

The **BULLS** and **PHILADELPHIA** shot **.500+** from the field **30** times, ranking them **3rd** behind **DENVER (34)** and **PHOENIX (37)**. Chicago was **24-6 (.800)** in those contests.

The **BULLS** shot **.500+** from the field and **.450+** from the 3-point arc in the same game **16** times, as well as **.500** and **.400** 23 times, leading the NBA in both categories.

The **BULLS** were **37-8 (.822)** when outshooting an opponent; **23-7 (.767)** when they hit more 3s; **28-7 (.800)** when they hand out more assists; and **45-21 (.682)** when two or more players score 20+ points.

The **BULLS** dished 30+ assists **17** times, ranking **8th** in the league.

The **BULLS** scored 130+ points **9** times this season, tying them with **PHOENIX** for the **9th-most** in the league. It was also the **3rd-most times** in franchise history. The 1969-70 Bulls had 11 games while the inaugural squad from 1966-67 recorded 10 games of 130+ points.

REGULAR SEASON PLAYER NOTE-A-BULLS



LONZO BALL became the first player in NBA History to record a triple-double for three different teams before turning 24 years old after he recorded 17 points, 10 rebounds and 10 assists vs. New Orleans (10/22). It was also Ball's Chicago home debut. Ball previously recorded three triple-doubles with the Los Angeles Lakers (2017-19) and four with the New Orleans Pelicans (2019-21).



DeMAR DeROZAN became the first player in NBA history to hit game-winning buzzer-beaters on back-to-back days with clutch 3-pointers at Indiana (12/31) and at Washington (1/1). Only one other player in NBA history, Boston Hall of Famer **LARRY BIRD**, hit back-to-back game-winning buzzer-beaters before, but Bird's occurred over a three-day span (Jan. 27 and Jan. 29, 1985) while DeRozan's were on consecutive days. (*Basketball-Reference*)



DeROZAN surpassed the 19,000-career point milestone at Indiana (2/4), becoming the 10th active NBA player to reach that mark (*ESPN Stats & Info*). DeRozan finished the 2021-22 season with **19,869** points, **195** points behind **GOLDEN STATE'S STEPH CURRY** (20,064) for 9th. DeRozan's point tally places him 45th All-Time among active and retired players.



DeROZAN recorded **10** straight 30+ point games, establishing a new personal best and tying franchise icon **MICHAEL JORDAN** for the second-longest mark in Bulls' history. Jordan still holds the franchise record of 11 straight 30+ point games set during the 1986-87 season. He also recorded eight consecutive games with 35+ points while shooting over .500 from the floor during that same stretch, which broke **WILT CHAMBERLAIN**'s previous record of six straight games in 1960-61 to become the longest such streak in NBA history.



DeROZAN recorded a team and season-high 50 points vs. LA Clippers (3/31). The last Bulls player to score 50 points in a game was **ZACH LaVINE** last year at Atlanta (4/9/21). DeRozan is now the **6th** player in franchise history to record a 50-point game.



DeROZAN was also the only Bulls player to record a 40+-point (**5x**) game this season. DeRozan's **5th** 40-point game came late in the year vs. Milwaukee (4/5). Throughout the league, an NBA player scored 40+-points **119** times. However, only **six** occurred without a 3-point shot being made – **four** by DeRozan, one by Philadelphia's **JOEL EMBIID** and one by Toronto's **PASCAL SIAKAM**.



DeROZAN finished **2nd** in the NBA in points scored with **2,118** (career-high). His total, as impressive as it is, ranks 12th in franchise history, as **MICHAEL JORDAN** recorded 2,000+ points 11 times, the least of which was 2,313 in 1984-85 (Jordan's rookie season). Jordan also owns the franchise record of 3,041 points set in 1986-87.



DeROZAN surpassed the 19,000-career point milestone at Indiana (2/4), becoming the 10th active player to reach that historic mark (*ESPN Stats & Info*). DeRozan finished the 2021-22 season with **19,869** points scored, **195** behind **GOLDEN STATE'S STEPH CURRY** (20,064) for 9th. Overall, DeRozan's point tally places him 45th All-Time among all players (active and retired).



DeROZAN (6,202) moved in front of **PAUL ARIZIN** (6,189) and **KEVIN GARNETT** (6,190) for 40th on the NBA's All-Time free throw attempts list.



DeROZAN shot **10+** free throws **23** times, connecting **10+** times in **17** times, ranking **5th** in each category.



DeROZAN (64) trailed only Denver's **NIKOLA JOKIĆ (66)** for most 20+-point games this season, while **ZACH LaVINE** finished **9th** with **56**. The Chicago duo were **two** of only **nine** (and the only teammates) to score 20+ points at least **56** times, and in the same game an NBA-best **43**. They also scored at least **25** points apiece in the same game an NBA-best **25** times, which is also the most in Bulls' history. Lastly, **DeROZAN (28x)** and **LaVINE (17x)**, along with **BOSTON's JAYSON TATUM (29x)** and **JALEN BROWN (17x)** were the only teammates to score 30+ points at least 17 times this season.



When it came to scoring down the stretch, Chicago's 1-2 punch proved to be two of the best in the business. **DeROZAN** finished **1st** in 4th-quarter scoring with **612** points (**5th** best all-time) while **ZACH LaVINE** finished **13th** with **359** points.



AYO DOSUNMU became the first rookie in NBA history to record 20+ points and 10 assists while shooting 90% (9-of-10, including 3-of-3 from beyond the arc) from the floor at Boston (1/15). At the time it was Dosunmu's third career start, and he finished the night with 21 points, 10 assists and four rebounds.



DOSUNMU backed up his historic night in Boston (1/15) with a second consecutive double-double at Memphis (1/17), posting 15 points and 10 rebounds, while also bagging four steals, becoming the first Bulls rookie to record back-to-back double-doubles since **ELTON BRAND** in April 2000.



DOSUNMU shot **.500+ FG%** and **.400+ 3FG%** in the same game **28** times this season, ranking **1st** among all rookies.



DOSUNMU was one of only **five** rookies to post over **600** points, **200** rebounds and **200** assists this season.



DOSUNMU (256) passed Hall of Famer **TONI KUKOČ** (252) for the 10th-most assists by a Bulls rookie.



ZACH LaVINE (1,194) dished a team-high seven assists vs. Charlotte (4/8) to move ahead of **BEN GORDON** (1,192) for **18th** on the Bulls' All-Time assists list.



LaVINE also knocked down two more 3s vs. Charlotte (4/8) to run his total to **731** as a Chicago Bull (and **1,031** lifetime), further solidifying his No. 3 ranking in Bulls history.



NIKOLA VUČEVIĆ knocked down his **556th** career 3-pointer this season, placing him **No. 2** All-Time among centers behind Milwaukee's **BROOK LOPEZ (652)**.



For the 5th time in his career, **VUČEVIĆ** also snared 600+ defensive rebounds this season. The last Bulls player before him to grab 600+ defensive rebounds was **PAU GASOL (638)** in 2015-16. Vučević continued to move up the franchise leader board, passing both Gasol and Hall of Famer **NATE THURMOND (645, 1974-75)**. The 6'11 center finished the season with **662** defensive boards, good for the **7th-most** in Bulls history.



VUČEVIĆ also led the Bulls with **44** double-doubles this season, finishing tied with Dallas' **LUKA DONČIĆ** for **7th-most** in the league.



COBY WHITE, for the fourth time this season, knocked down six 3s in scoring 19 points vs. Charlotte (4/8), passing **STEVE KERR (430)** and tying **NIKOLA MIROTIĆ (432)** for 7th on the Bulls' All-Time 3-pointers list. White is the only player to crack Chicago's Top 10 playing less than 200 games.

NBA'S HOTTEST TICKET: Chicago's strong season made them the hottest ticket in the league. The Bulls led the NBA in home attendance, averaging **20,882 (41 dates)**. The **Philadelphia 76ers** was second at **20,655 (41 dates)**. The Bulls were also the NBA's best draw on the road with a league-leading mark of **18,199 (40 dates)**. The **Los Angeles Lakers** were next in line at **18,180 (41 dates)**. (*Elias Stats*)

SWEET HOME CHICAGO: The Bulls proved tough to beat at home this season, finishing **27-14 (659)** at the United Center, tying **MILWAUKEE** and **ATLANTA** for the 3rd best home record in the East. Last season Chicago was 15-21 (.417) at home, and the year before, 14-20 (.412). The last time the Bulls were .500 or better at the United Center was 2016-17 when they went 25-16 (.610) and finished 41-41 (.500) overall.

DEEBO & FLIGHT 8 = ALL-NBA: The pairing of DeMAR DeROZAN and ZACH LaVINE has seamlessly formed into one of the most dynamic offensive duos in the league, with each making strong cases for All-NBA recognition. DeRozan, who was named a starter for the third time for the NBA All-Star Game in February (his 5th ASG), was a 2018 All-NBA Second Team player and a 2017 All-NBA Third Team member. LaVine, who was named to his second consecutive All-Star team this season, has continued to develop his overall game, proving night in and night out to be one of the league's most efficient and versatile scorers, as well as a pretty formidable defender. Below are some of the highlights each player has delivered this season in bringing the Chicago Bulls back to prominence.

DeRozan

- o Was named Eastern Conference Player of the Month for February, and the Eastern Conference Player of the Week **three** times this season.
- o Scored in double figures in every appearance (**76**) and ranked 2nd overall in 20+ point games with **64**.
- o Was the **only** player to average over 25.0 ppg while making less than 1.0 3-pointer per game.
- o His **612** 4th quarter points led the NBA, while ranking 2nd with **157** points scored in the "clutch." He also shot **.535** from the field, **.500** from 3 and **.887** from the free throw line in the clutch.
- o DeRozan also converted an NBA-best **4.6** shots from mid-range on **9.8** attempts per game, both of which were the highest in the NBA. No other player is averaged more than 4.1 made field goals or more than 7.4 attempts from that area.

LaVine

- o Posted **56** 20+ point games, good for **9th** in the NBA. He's also recorded **17** 30+ point games.
- o Recorded **9** games of 10+ field goals and 5+ treys while shooting at least **.500** from the floor, tying him for **4th-best** in the NBA.
- o His **93** clutch points ranks **14th** in the league.
- o Scored in double figures in 140 consecutive games prior to exiting early with a knee injury (1/22). That was also the second-longest streak in the league over that stretch. In **28** appearances upon returning to the floor, LaVine continued to post double figure scoring nights on a regular basis, running his personal streak to **168** out of his last **170** games.
- o Ranked **No. 1** in the league in field goal percentage in catch-and-shoot situations at **.477** (min: 60 games played, 30 min/game).

WHAT ROOKIE WALL? One of the other keys to the Bulls' success in 2021-22 was the development of rookie guard AYO DOSUNMU, whose play put him in contention for the NBA All-Rookie Team. He led the team in games played with **77**, and in **40** starts, Dosunmu averaged **34.8** mpg, **10.9** points, **3.6** rebounds, **5.4** assists with only **1.9** turnovers while shooting **.523** from the field, **.355** from three and **.786** from the free throw line.

- o Shot **.500** or better from the field and **.400** or better from deep in the same game **28** times, ranking him **No. 1** among all rookies.
- o Ranked **No. 2** among all rookies in 40+ minute games with **8**.
- o Finished the season with a **.585** effective field goal percentage (eFG%), ranking **No. 1** in the league among all rookies (min: 60 games played).

WHOLE DIFFERENT BALL GAME: In his first season with the Bulls, LONZO BALL made a noticeable impact on both ends of the floor. Ball averaged 13.0 ppg over 35 games played, finishing with career-highs in minutes per game (34.6), field goal percentage (.423), three-point field goal percentage (.423), steals per game (1.8) and blocks per game (0.9) before suffering a meniscus injury in January that would ultimately sideline him for the remainder of the season. Below is a look at how the Bulls have missed Ball's presence, showing some of their pertinent team stats and respective league rankings leading up to and following his injury:

DIALING LONG DISTANCE: Both ZACH LaVINE and COBY WHITE are quickly rising to the top of the Bulls' All-Time 3-point list. In the fourth game of the season (and his 209th as a Bull), LaVine knocked down three treys at Toronto (10/25/21) to pass franchise icon MICHAEL JORDAN (555) for the No. 4 spot in franchise history. He later moved ahead of another Bulls' Hall of Famer, SCOTTIE PIPPEN (664), for No. 3 after hitting three more long shots vs. Portland (1/30/22). As for White, he jumped ahead of LUOL DENG for 10th after going 6-for-11 from downtown vs. Sacramento (2/16). The third-year guard, who missed the first 14 games of the season recovering from offseason shoulder surgery, started the year with 296 3-balls, good for 18th on the all-time list.

HONOR ROLL: **BILLY DONOVAN** was named the **EASTERN CONFERENCE COACH OF THE MONTH** for October/November in recognition for steering the Bulls to a 14-8 record in the first two months of the season. It was the second time the league recognized Donovan with the award, the first of which came while he was heading the Oklahoma City Thunder in December 2019. He is the 5th Bulls Head Coach to be honored, following **TOM THIBODEAU** (6X), Hall of Famer **PHIL JACKSON** (4X), **SCOTT SKILES** (2X) and **DOUG COLLINS** (1). Donovan later picked up his 300th career win in his 508th game (300-208 .591) with Chicago's 130-122 victory over Washington (1/7).

For the fourth time in his career, but first as a Chicago Bull, **DeMAR DeROZAN**, was named the **NBA's EASTERN CONFERENCE PLAYER OF THE MONTH** for **FEBRUARY**. In 13 games, he led Chicago to an 8-5 record while averaging 34.2 points (1st in the East), 6.2 rebounds and 5.2 assists while shooting .553 FG%, .400 3FG%, .877 FT%. The wingman in his 13th season scored 35 or more points on 50.0% or better shooting in eight consecutive games (the longest such streak in NBA history) and 30 or more points in 10-straight, which is a personal-best and one game shy of tying **MICHAEL JORDAN'S** franchise mark of 11 set in 1986-87. DeRozan is now the 5th Bulls player to be awarded Eastern Conference Player of the Month, joining the aforementioned Michael Jordan (16x), **SCOTTIE PIPPEN** (2X), **DERRICK ROSE** (2X) and **JIMMY BUTLER** (1).

DeROZAN has also been named **EASTERN CONFERENCE PLAYER OF THE WEEK** **three** times this season. The first was for games played between Nov. 29 and Dec. 5, 2021, when the Bulls went 3-0, posting victories over the Charlotte Hornets, New York Knicks, and the Brooklyn Nets. He averaged 30.3 points, 5.7 rebounds and shot 58.7 percent from the field during this stretch. DeRozan then won the award a second time after averaging 27.8 points, 7.3 assists and 5.3 rebounds in leading Chicago to a perfect 4-0 record from Dec. 27 through Jan. 1, 2022. Included in the four victories were two game-winning, buzzer-beating treys to defeat the Pacers in Indiana (108-106) on New Year's Eve, followed by another the next night to knock-off the Washington Wizards (120-119) in DC. He most recently won the award after averaging 36.8 points, 5.5 rebounds and 4.8 assists, plus shooting percentages of 59.8% from the field and 42.9% from 3-point in leading the Bulls to a 3-1 record from Feb. 7 through Feb. 12, 2022. He has now been named the NBA's Player of the Week **14** times in his career (10 with Toronto, **three** with Chicago and once with San Antonio).

AAA RATINGS: What a difference a year makes! Last season, the Bulls finished 11th in the East with a record of 31-41 (.431). They were also the 11th ranked defense (112.0), and offensively Chicago sat near the bottom at No. 21 (110.4) and sported a negative Net Rating of -1.1 (20th). This season, the Bulls' **46-36** record placed them **6th** in the Eastern Conference. Offensively, Chicago finished 13th (112.7), while defensively they ended up 23rd, (113.2). Combined, Chicago finished 20th with a Net Rating of **-0.5**. (*NBA.com/stats*)

HEAD COACH BILLY DONOVAN



In his second season as head coach of the Chicago Bulls ... previously spent five years as head coach for the Oklahoma City Thunder ... was named the 2020 recipient of the Michael H. Goldberg NBA Coach of the Year Award, along with Mike Budenholzer ... while in OKC, his teams amassed a record of 243-157 (.608) and made five consecutive trips to the playoffs ... his winning percentage at the conclusion of the 2019-20 season ranked 16th (min. 100 games) in NBA history, and trailed only Nick Nurse (.721), Steve Kerr (.709) and Gregg Popovich (.675) among active coaches ... he is also one of only four active first-time head coaches in the league (along with Rick Carlisle, Kerr and Erik Spoelstra) to lead their teams to the playoffs in each of their first five seasons as a head coach ... in 2015-16, his first season with the Thunder, he guided the team to a record of 55-27 (.671), as it claimed the Northwest Division title and advanced to the Western Conference Finals ... Donovan's 55 wins that season put him in select company, as he became just the third first-year head coach over the previous 15 seasons to win 55 or more games in his first season ... on April 5, 2017, at Memphis, the Thunder defeated the Grizzlies 103-100 for Donovan's 100th career victory in the NBA, and with the win, he became the first NBA head coach to win 100 or more games in his first two seasons after coming straight from the collegiate level ... he claimed his 200th career coaching win on Oct. 27, 2019, versus Golden State ... prior to his arrival in Oklahoma City, Donovan held a 19-year stint as the head coach at the University of Florida ... he coached his teams to an overall record of 467-186 (.715), and his time was highlighted by back-to-back National Championships in 2006 and 2007 ... the consecutive titles marked the first time a men's program won two straight basketball championships since Duke in 1991 and 1992 ... he also led the Gators to the Final Four in 2000 (losing in the NCAA Championship Game) and 2014, while making 14 trips to the NCAA Tournament and two appearances in the NIT ... his Gator teams posted 16 straight seasons with 20 or more wins, three campaigns with 30 or more wins, 17 consecutive trips to the postseason and six SEC Championships ... in 2014-15, at the age of 49 years old, he became the second-youngest coach in NCAA history (Bobby Knight, 48-years old) to post 500 wins ... he has been the recipient of numerous collegiate coaching awards including ESPN.com's National Coach of the Year (2001), the Wooden Award's "Legends of Coaching" Honor (2010) and SEC Coach of the Year (2011, 2013, 2014) ... Donovan's first experience as a head coach came in 1994 at Marshall University after serving as a graduate assistant at Kentucky from 1989-1994 ... in two seasons with the Thundering Herd, he posted a record of 35-20 (.636) ... he served as the head coach of USAB's U18 and U19 National Teams from 2012-14 ... over that time, his squads compiled a record of 19-0 and claimed three gold medals during national team competition ... played four seasons at Providence (1983-87) and averaged 20.6 ppg his senior year, helping lead the Friars to the 1987 Final Four ... that season he earned Southeast Regional Most Outstanding Player honors, and also was named to the 1987 All-Big East first team, the 1987 Big East All-Tournament team and was an honorable mention All-American ... drafted by the Utah Jazz in the third round (68th overall) of the 1987 NBA Draft and played a total of 44 games with the New York Knicks in 1987-88 ... in 1999, he was inducted into the Providence College Hall of Fame ... 56 years old ... he and his wife, Christine, have four children: Billy, Hasbrouck, Bryan, and Connor.
