CLIP BOARD

The Clippers' 48 wins this season mark their seventh-most in a single season in franchise history. L.A. is the fourth team in NBA history to win over 45 games without a current or former all star on the roster at any point in the season.

The Clippers overcame a 31-point deficit to win Game 2, the largest comeback in NBA postseason history. Lou Williams scored 36 points, tied for the fourth most of any reserve in the postseason since 1985. His 29 second half points set a franchise playoff record for points scored in any half.

- **ALL-TIME COMEBACK:** The Clippers overcame a 31-point deficit (94-63, 7:31 – 3rd Q) to win Game 2 at Oracle Arena on April 15. L.A. outscored Golden State 72-37 over the game's final 19:31 to complete the largest comeback in NBA postseason history, the largest comeback of any kind in Clippers franchise history and the third-largest comeback in any NBA game since at least 1996. LA scored 44 points in the fourth quarter, a franchise playoff record for points in any quarter and 85 points in the second half, the most by the Clippers in a second half since the team moved from Buffalo to San Diego in 1978 and the second-most of any team in the second half of a playoff game since 1978 (Milwaukee – 87).
- **LOU WILL:** Lou Williams scored 36 points in the Clippers' Game 2 win at Oracle Arena, tied for the fourth-most of any reserve in a playoff game since 1985 and a franchise record for reserves in the postseason. He scored 29 points in the second half, a franchise playoff record for any half, and tied the franchise playoff record for points in a quarter, with 17 in the third. He became the second player in NBA history (Sam Cassell) to log 30+ points and 10+ assists off the bench in a playoff game, and his 36 points and 11 assists each mark his postseason career-high. Williams has logged 9+ assists in both Game 1 & Game 2, becoming the fourth reserve on record to log 9+ assists in consecutive playoff games (Shaun Livingston, Nate McMillan & Ray Williams). He initially logged playoff career-highs in points (25) and assists (9) in Game 1, becoming the third player since 1985 to log 25+ points and 9+ assists off the bench in a postseason game (Sam Cassell - 30/12 on 5/30/95 & Paul Pressey - 25/12 on 4/29/90), and the only player in that span to do so in under 36 minutes played.
- **CAREER-HIGH:** Danilo Gallinari logged a playoff career-high 24 points in the Clippers' Game 2 win.
- **FRANCHISE RECORDS:** The Clippers set franchise playoff records with 34 assists, 20 assists in the second half and 11 assists in the third quarter, in addition to 66.7% shooting from the field in the second half. Montrezl Harrell shot 9-of-9 from the field, marking a franchise postseason record for the most makes without a miss in a single game, tied for the fourth-most of any player in a playoff game since 1985.
- **ONE OF A KIND:** According to the Elias Sports Bureau, in Game 1, Montrezl Harrell (26) and Lou Williams (25) became the first pair of reserve teammates on record to each score 25+ points in a postseason game (bench stats first recorded in 1970-71). LA's reserves tallied 65 points, the ninth-most of any team in a postseason game since 1985.
- **MONSTA-TREZZ:** Montrezl Harrell tallied a playoff career-high 26 points, in addition to five rebounds, two blocks and two steals in Game 1. He's the second player since 1985 to log 25+ points, 5+ rebounds, 2+ blocks and 2+ steals off the bench in a postseason game (Blair Rasmussen, 4/22/86) and the only player to do so in 30 or fewer minutes played.
- **HEY ROOK:** Shai Gilgeous-Alexander's 18 points mark the most by a Clippers rookie in a postseason game since the team moved from Buffalo to San Diego in 1978 and the most by any Clippers rookie in their playoff debut in franchise history. He's the 17th rookie in NBA history to score at least 18 points in under 35 minutes in their playoff debut and the first since Ben Gordon on 4/24/05. He's also the second rookie in NBA history (Charles Barkley, 5/22/85) to make at least three three-pointers and record at least three blocked shots in a postseason game.
- **REGULAR SEASON:** The Clippers finished the 2018-19 regular season at 48-34. Their 48 wins are the seventh-most in a single season in franchise history. L.A. set single-season records in points per game (115.1), total points (9,442), defensive rebounds (2,936), free-throw percentage (79.2%) and three-point percentage (38.8%). The Clippers finished ninth in offensive rating (111.3 pts/100), marking their eighth consecutive top-10 finish, the only team in the NBA to do so in the last eight seasons.
- **PLAYOFF BOUND:** With their win over Minnesota on March 26, the Clippers secured a postseason berth for the seventh time in the last eight seasons and the 14th time in franchise history. L.A. is one of only seven teams in the NBA to appear in at least seven of the last eight NBA postseasons (Boston, Golden State, Houston, Indiana, Oklahoma City, San Antonio).
- **FROM DOWNTOWN:** The Clippers ranked second in the NBA in three-point percentage (38.8%) and fifth in defensive three-point percentage this season, limiting opponents to 34.3% shooting from downtown.
- **45+ WINS:** With their win over Cleveland on March 30, the Clippers became just the fourth team in NBA history to win over 45 games without a current or former All-Star on the roster, according to the Elias Sports Bureau (2003-04 Grizzlies - 50-32; 2015-16 Hornets - 48-34; 2013-14 Suns - 48-34).
- **FRANCHISE STREAK:** The Clippers extended a franchise record, securing a record above .500 for the eighth consecutive season with their win over the Indiana Pacers on March 19.
- **3PT-BARRAGE:** Landry Shamet made four three-pointers in the first quarter of the team's 4/7 loss at Golden State, marking his fourth quarter with at least four threes this season, the most by any rookie in the past 15+ seasons.
- **MARVELOUS MARCH:** The Clippers (13-2) logged the NBA's best record in March, tied for the team's highest winning percentage in March in franchise history (2013-14). The Clippers led the NBA in offensive rating (116.4 pts/100) and three-point percentage in March, shooting 41.7% from distance. Among qualifying players, Shai Gilgeous-Alexander (59.4%) ranked first, Landry Shamet (45.7%) ranked 12th, and Danilo Gallinari (45.3%) ranked 18th in three-point percentage in March.
- **CAREER-HIGH:** Danilo Gallinari matched his career-high with eight assists on April 5 against the Lakers (three times previously). His effort also marked his first career game with at least five rebounds, five assists and three steals.
- **HEY ROOK:** Guard Shai Gilgeous-Alexander scored 20+ points in four of his last seven regular season games... He scored 10+ points in a career-best 10 straight games (3/11 - 3/30). Over that span, he averaged 15.4 points, 5.4 assists and 3.3 rebounds, while shooting 53.3% from the field and 54.5% from three-point range. He logged his first career double-double on 3/17 vs. Brooklyn, scoring 14 points to go along with a career-high 10 assists.
- **IN THE CLUTCH:** According to NBA.com/stats, the Clippers led the NBA in clutch net rating this season, outscoring opponents by 17.7 points per 100 possessions in the last five minutes of games that are separated by five points or fewer this season. Since the Feb. 7 NBA trade deadline, they hold the league's best record in clutch situations (10-3).
- **SIXTH MAN:** On 3/26 at Minnesota, Lou Williams logged his 182nd career game with 20+ points off the bench, tying Ricky Pierce for the second-most all-time (Jamal Crawford - 187). Williams led the NBA this season, averaging 20.1 points per game as a reserve, the second-most by any bench player in the last 25 seasons, trailing only his effort last season (21.9 ppg). He scored 45 points in the Clippers' loss in Minnesota on Feb. 11, marking his highest scoring output in any career game off the bench and his second-highest overall (50 - 1/10/18 at GSW) in addition to the most points by any reserve in a single game since 2009.
- **20+ STREAK:** Danilo Gallinari scored 20+ points in 10 straight games, from March 3-26, the longest streak of his career. He scored 20+ in 12 of his last 15 regular season games and averaged 23.2 points over that span.
- **PICK-AND-ROLL:** According to Second Spectrum, the pick-and-roll duo of Lou Williams (ballhandler) and Montrezl Harrell (screener) yielded 1.08 points per direct screen, ranking second among all duos that have engaged in at least 1,000 direct screens this season. The pair ran 1,347 pick-and-rolls this season, the fourth-most of any duo in the NBA.
- **ALL-TIME SIXTH MAN:** Lou Williams (20.0 ppg in 26.6 mpg in the regular season) is the only player in NBA history to appear in at least 50 games and average 20+ points in under 27 minutes. Williams passed Dell Curry (11,147) for No. 1 on the career points off the bench leaderboard in the team's 3/11 win over Boston. He passed Jamal Crawford for No. 2 on 3/8 against the Thunder. According to the Elias Sports Bureau, data for reserve scoring dates to the 1970-71 season. His 40-point performance on 3/8 marked his 28th career game with 30+ points off the bench, passing Ricky Pierce for the most in that same time frame. He has logged five career games with 40+ points off the bench, the most on record. Five of the last six 40+ point performances off the bench in the NBA have been Williams'.
- **DISHIN' DIMES:** The Clippers went 24-8 this season when they tally over 25 assists and 10-1 when they tally at least 30 assists.
- **BATTLE ON THE BOARDS:** The Clippers went 36-6 this season when they grab more rebounds than their opponent and 19-4 when they've secured 50+ rebounds. They grabbed at least 50 rebounds in four straight games (3/1 - 3/8), tied for the team's longest streak since moving to Los Angeles prior to the 1984-85 season (3/23 - 3/30/2010). Montrezl Harrell and Ivica Zubac logged career-highs with eight and nine offensive rebounds, respectively, in their 3/12 loss to Portland.
- **DOUBLE TROUBLE:** Montrezl Harrell (16.8 ppg) and Lou Williams (20.1 ppg) logged the highest combined scoring average of any reserve duo in NBA history (36.9 ppg), according to the Elias Sports Bureau. The pair each scored 20+ points in the team's 3/24 win over Brooklyn, marking the NBA-best 11th time this season that they've each scored 20+ points off the bench. Williams and Harrell ranked first and fourth, respectively, in the NBA in bench scoring this season and are the only set of teammates to average at least 15 points off the bench in 2018-19. Clippers reserves scored 20+ points an NBA-leading 64 times this season.
- **EFFICIENCY MATTERS:** From February 9 through the end of the regular season, the Clippers' starting lineup of Shai Gilgeous-Alexander, Patrick Beverley, Landry Shamet, Danilo Gallinari and Ivica Zubac ranked third in the NBA in net efficiency, outscoring opponents by 9.2 points per 100 possessions (200+ minutes played).
- **FINAL FRAME:** The Clippers ranked fifth in the NBA and second in the Western Conference in fourth quarter net rating this season, outscoring opponents by 4.4 points per 100 possessions in the final frame. Media Guide can be found at <http://media.clippers.com>

• **IL GALLO:** Danilo Gallinari scored a Clippers career-high 34 points on 3/8 vs. Oklahoma City. He logged 39 games with 20+ points this season, his most in any season of his career. He ranked fifth in the NBA in 3PT% (43.3%) and was the only player in the NBA to average 19+ points and 6+ rebs while shooting over 43% from 3PT range this season.

• **MARKSMAN:** Rookie guard Landry Shamet led all qualifying rookies, shooting 42.2% from three-point range this season. Shamet (167) finished his rookie campaign fourth on the all-time rookie three-pointers leaderboard, one behind Luka Doncic (168) for a share of No. 3. Among the Top-20 players on the list, his 42.2% three-point clip ranks second only to Stephen Curry (43.7%). Shamet recently became the first rookie in NBA history to make at least 40% of his 3's in eight straight games with a minimum of 5 3-point attempts (3/1 - 3/17/19). He surpassed 100 made three-pointers in his 55th career game on 2/9 at Boston, becoming the 15th player in league history to make at least 100 threes in their first 55 career games.

• **DEEP SQUAD:** The Clippers led the NBA in bench scoring, averaging 53.2 points per game this season, the highest scoring average by a reserve unit in over 30 seasons. L.A.'s reserves tallied a franchise record 89 points on Feb. 11 at Minnesota, the most since the Kansas City Kings scored 90 points off the bench on Dec. 1, 1982. L.A.'s bench also set the franchise record earlier this season, scoring 85 points in the team's 133-113 win over Houston on 10/26, and scored 80 points in their 2/2 win at Detroit, tied (11/19/97 at Miami) for the third-most by a reserve unit in team history.

• **CLOSER:** Lou Williams ranked third in the NBA with 546 fourth quarter points this season (Harden), and ranked fifth with 7.6 fourth quarter points per game. His 21 points in the final frame on 2/11 at Minnesota were his most in any quarter this season. He led the NBA in fourth quarter scoring (597 points, 7.9 ppg) in 2017-18.

• **DISHIN' DIMES:** Lou Williams' 44 assists over five games from 1/25 - 2/2 were his most over any five-game stretch of his career. Williams' 5.4 assists per game lead all NBA reserves this season. The Clippers are 7-0 this season when he's logged double-digit assists.

• **PB FROM THREE:** Patrick Beverley converted 82 of his 183 attempts (44.8%) from three-point range since December 15, ranking third in the NBA in that span.

• **300 WINS:** The team's 3/17 win over Brooklyn marked Doc Rivers' 300th with the Clippers. He joins Phil Jackson, George Karl, Dick Motta, Don Nelson, Pat Riley and Lenny Wilkens as the only coaches in history to win 300+ games with multiple franchises, according to the Elias Sports Bureau.

• **CHARITY STRIPE:** The Clippers led the NBA in free-three throws made (22.6) and attempted (28.5) per game this season. Their 22.6 FTM/G are the most of any team since the 2011-12 season. The Clippers set a team record (San Diego & L.A.) for the most free-throws made without a miss in a single game, shooting 26-of-26 from the charity stripe in the team's win over the Rockets on 10/21. Danilo Gallinari (90.4%) and Lou Williams (87.6%) ranked fourth and 13th in the NBA in free-throw percentage this season, respectively.

• **BUZZER-BEATER:** Lou Williams' 28' game-winning three-pointer on 3/17 vs. Brooklyn was the first walkoff buzzer-beater of Williams' career, according to the Elias Sports Bureau. Per ESPN, it was the longest game-winning buzzer beater of the season. Over the past two seasons, Williams has made three go-ahead baskets in the final five seconds, tied for the most in the NBA in that span. He's made five go-ahead baskets within the final minute of close games, also tied for the league lead. According to NBA.com/Stats, Williams leads the NBA in Clutch Net Rating this season, outscoring opponents by 31.4 points/100 possessions when the game is within five points with under five minutes remaining (20+ opportunities).

• **FORCE DOWN LOW:** Montrezl Harrell logged 29 games with 20+ points in 82 appearances this season after doing so only nine times combined in his first three pro seasons (173 appearances). He ranked fifth in the NBA, shooting 61.5% from the field this season. Harrell scored a career-high 30 points in the Clippers' Oct. 26 win over the Rockets.

• **MAJOR IMPACT:** Patrick Beverley logged a game-high +22 on 3/8 against Oklahoma City, despite scoring zero points on the night.

• **SHAM-WOW:** Landry Shamet set a Clippers rookie record with seven three-pointers in the team's win over the Knicks on 3/3. Shamet tied the franchise records for three-pointers in a quarter (6 - Caron Butler) and in a half (7 - Butler & J.J. Redick). His six first quarter three-pointers are the most by any rookie in any quarter since at least 2002-03 and his seven first half three-pointers are the most by any rookie in any half in that same span. Shamet finished with 21 points, marking his first consecutive 20+ point efforts as a pro.

• **FIRST HALF:** The Clippers scored 82 points in the first half of the team's win over New York on 3/3, their second-most in any first half in franchise history and their most in any half since scoring a franchise record 87 points in the first half on April 14, 1984 against the Utah Jazz. L.A. made a franchise record-tying 14 three-pointers in the first half and set a franchise record for any quarter, with nine in the first.

• **FAST BREAK:** The Clippers logged a season-high 34 fast break points in consecutive games (2/13 vs. Phoenix & 2/22 at Memphis). The mark is their highest over the last five seasons and matches the second-highest total by a Clippers team in the last 15 seasons.

• **COMEBACKER:** The Clippers' 28-point comeback in their 2/9 win at Boston marks their largest comeback in franchise history. L.A. trailed Boston 68-40 at 4:13 in the 2nd Quarter and outscored the Celtics 83-44 en route to a 123-112 win. It marked the largest road comeback in the NBA since 2009 and the Celtics' largest blown lead since 2003. With their 25-point comeback on 2/2 at Detroit and their 20-point comeback on 2/5 at Charlotte, L.A. became the only team in over 20 seasons with three 20+ point comeback wins in a five-game span. The Clippers are also the only team in at least 20 seasons to win multiple games in a single season in which they trailed by 25+ points.

• **ONE AND ONLY:** Lou Williams logged 30 points and 10 assists in 22:03 minutes in the Clippers' 2/13 win over Phoenix. The effort marked the first time in NBA history that a player has logged at least 30 points and 10 assists in under 23 minutes of playing time.

• **DOWNTOWN BARRAGE:** The Clippers shot 75% from three-point range (18-of-24) in their win over Charlotte on Feb. 5, the second-highest percentage in a single game in NBA history (over 20 attempts). L.A. shot 78.3% (18-of-23) from three-point range in their 12/23 loss at Golden State, setting the NBA record for three-point percentage in a single game (over 20 attempts). L.A.'s 18 makes in each contest tied their second-most in a single-game in franchise history and their 13 first half threes on 12/23 set a franchise record. Danilo Gallinari shot 5-of-5 from deep on 12/23, matching his most makes from deep without a miss in any career game.

• **TRIPLE-DOUBLE:** Lou Williams logged his first career triple-double with 31 points, 10 assists and a career-high tying 10 rebounds in Friday's win at Chicago. According to the Elias Sports Bureau, he's the second player in NBA history (Detlef Schrempf in 1992-93) with a 30+ point triple-double off the bench. At 904 career games, only one player in NBA history (Zach Randolph - 974) logged their first career triple-double later in their career.

• **COACH OF THE MONTH:** Head coach Doc Rivers was named Western Conference Coach of the Month for October and November, his 11th career Coach of the Month honor. He last won the award in April 2017. Rivers led the Clippers to a Western Conference-best 15-6 record over the first two months of the season, tied for the NBA's second-best record in that span. L.A.'s 15-6 start was tied for the team's fourth-best through 21 games in franchise history.

• **BALL SECURITY:** The Clippers set a franchise record, committing only four turnovers in their win over Portland on 11/25, their fewest ever in a regular season contest.

• **EVERYBODY EATS:** The Clippers saw a franchise record nine players reach double-digit scoring in the team's 10/28 win over Washington. All 13 players to enter the game for L.A. scored at least one point, helping the Clippers become one of just four teams this season to have 13 players score in a single game this season.

• **CONTINUING TO BUILD:** The Clippers 403-237 (.629) are tied for the NBA's fourth-best regular season record since the start of the 2011-12 season.

• **COACHING WINS:** Doc Rivers passed Mike Dunleavy (215) for the most regular season coaching victories in Clippers' franchise history with the team's win over the Rockets on April 10, 2017. Rivers is the also winningest coach in team history, by winning percentage (.307-185, .624). He ranks second among active coaches in regular season wins. Rivers passed Jack Ramsay (864) for No. 13 on the NBA's all-time coaching wins leaderboard with the team's 12/22 win over Denver. He sits 41 wins behind Dick Motta (935) for No. 12 on the list.

• **WINNING RIVERS:** Head coach Doc Rivers recorded his 800th career victory with the Clippers' 115-105 win over the L.A. Lakers on April 1, 2017. Rivers is just the 15th coach all-time to win at least 800 games and joins Gregg Popovich as the only active head coaches to do so. He is also the second-winningest active coach and 9th winningest coach all-time among 28 coaches that have coached at least 1,000 games.

Williams scored the Clippers' final 10 points in overtime after they blew a 14-point lead in the fourth quarter, and they hung on Monday night to beat the Golden State Warriors at home for the first time in nearly four years, 121-116. Williams recovered after shooting 3 of 16 in regulation, when the Clippers were scoreless over the final 5:15 while the Warriors ran off 11 straight points to force overtime tied at 106-all. Montrezl Harrell added 23 points off the bench and rookie Shai Gilgeous-Alexander had 18. The Clippers snapped a seven-game skid against the Warriors at Staples Center, where they last won on Dec. 25, 2014. Kevin Durant had 33 points, 11 rebounds and 10 assists for the Warriors before fouling out with 3:46 left in the extra session. Thompson added 31 points, but was just 5 of 16 on 3-pointers on a night without injured fellow Splash Brother Stephen Curry. Golden State lost for just the third time in 14 games. The starless Clippers improved to 6-1 at home. Thompson's 3-pointer tied it 116-all in overtime, interrupting Williams' run of 10 straight points for the Clippers. The Clippers crashed the boards — every player grabbed at least one — and they dominated in the paint, 62-36. Williams' 3-pointer gave Los Angeles its largest lead of 101-87 after they didn't go up by double digits until Harrell's basket to open the fourth. The Warriors were held to 20 points in the third when they were outscored by six. The Clippers shot 60 percent and led 64-61 at halftime.

On the next possession, Curry had Montrezl Harrell on him at the top of the key, drove down the middle of the lane and converted the layup off the glass for the winner. Tobias Harris missed a shot as time expired, giving the Warriors their eighth victory in 10 games. Kevin Durant added 35 points for Golden State to help offset the Clippers' 78-percent (18 of 23) 3-point shooting. Harris led Los Angeles with 32 points, and Lou Williams added 25. The Clippers' shot 81.2 percent from 3-point range in the first half (13 for 16), setting an NBA record for highest 3-point percentage in a half (minimum 13 made). Those 13 first-half 3s also set a franchise record for most in a half. Harris was 5 for 5 from long distance in the first half and had 19 points as Los Angeles led 71-67 at the break. Curry had 22 points in the half, but Golden State was 5 of 16 from 3-point range. However, they outscored Los Angeles 24-10 from the free throw line in the first two quarters and that kept it close. Montrezl Harrell scored 26 points and fellow reserve Lou Williams contributed 25 points and nine assists as Los Angeles returned to the playoffs after missing last season following six straight appearances. Beverley wound up with three points on 1-for-7 shooting, seven assists and seven rebounds. Danilo Gallinari's technical in the final minute of the second only further fueled the home crowd, and Curry capitalized as the Warriors ran to a 69-56 halftime advantage.
