Series Notes: The HEAT and Thunder meet for the second and final matchup this regular season. Earlier this season, Oklahoma City recorded a, 128-120, win on 1/10, but Miami has won six of the last seven overall, including a franchise-best five consecutive games in OKC. Last season, Miami swept the series, 2-0, and has swept the past three-straight season series'. The HEAT are 30-41 all-time versus the Thunder during the regular season, including 16-20 in home games and 14-21 in road games.

HOT TAKES:

- Blocked a season-high 11 shots on 2/23 at NO, with eight different players registering at least one block.
- Miami has 18 road wins so far this season, third-most in the Eastern Conference.
- The HEAT are a perfect 9-0 when holding opponents to under 100 points this season.
- Miami is allowing just 109.9 points per game this season, the sixth-least in the NBA, and have held opponents to under their season scoring averages by an average of -12.1 points per game over their last 14 contests.

LONG TIME NO SEE: Tonight marks as the first matchup of the season against Dallas, it is the final team Miami has yet to play against. It is the second-latest in the season either team has faced each other for the first time, only the lockout 1999 season was later when the teams first faced off on 4/7/99. Additionally, the HEAT have already completed season series' against eight Western Conference opponents (L.A. Clippers, L.A. Lakers, Memphis, Minnesota, Phoenix, Sacramento, San Antonio and Utah) and five Eastern Conference opponents (Boston, Brooklyn, Charlotte, Milwaukee and Orlando).

BACK-TO-BACK: Tonight is the first of two consecutive on the road with another game tomorrow night in Oklahoma City. The HEAT have 13 back-to-backs this season, one fewer than last season, and play at least one back-to-back in each month. Miami is 6-3 on the first night of a back-to-back this season and 5-4 on the second night.

JIMMY ON BOTH ENDS: Jimmy Butler has currently recorded at least one steal and connected on at least one three-point field goal in 14-straight games, the second-longest streak in team history, and according to the Associated Press, it is also currently the longest active streak in the NBA. Below are the longest streaks of at least one steal and one made three-point field goal in HEAT history.

WE HAVE ENOUGH: Miami started their 31st different line-up this season on 2/27 at POR, tying the most during a single-season in team history. Additionally, 17 different players have started at least one game this season, tying the third-most during a single-season in franchise history, only Dru Smith (out for the season) and two-way players Cole Swider & Alondes Williams have yet to start a game this season. TRIPLE-DOUBLES: Bam Adebayo posted a 16-point, 12-rebound, 11-assist triple-double at MIL on 2/13, his seventh as a member of the HEAT, the third-most in team history, and his second this season after posting a 22-point, 19-rebound, 10-assist triple-double vs. LAL on 11/6, marking as just the third triple-double in team history with at least 15 boards, joining Lamar Odom (30 points, 19 rebounds, 11 assists) on 3/6/04 vs. SAC and Butler (20 points, 18 rebounds, 10 assists) on 12/10/19 vs. ATL. TYLER FROM DEEP: Tyler Herro has currently connected on a three-point field goal in 28-straight games, tying the second-longest streak of his career. Additionally, he hit multiple three-point field goals in 15-straight games from 1/14 – 2/13, the second-longest streak of his career. Below are both of Herro's longest three-point made streaks.

700: Tyler Herro has currently made 718 three-point field goals, just the fifth player in franchise history to connect on at least 700 treys, and now has the third-most made in team history. He previously connected on his 700th three-point field goal on 2/2 at WAS, becoming the second-fastest player in HEAT history to reach his 700th from downtown (272 games), only Duncan Robinson has achieved the feat faster at an NBA-record 216 games. COACH SPO: Erik Spoelstra has recorded 848 career wins (739 regular season & 109 postseason) with the HEAT, the fourth-most by a head coach with a single franchise in NBA history. Next on the list is Red Auerbach (Celtics) with 885, followed by Jerry Sloan (Jazz) and Gregg Popovich (Spurs). Additionally, Spoelstra has coached over 1,000 career regular season games, becoming just the third coach in NBA history to coach 1,000+ games with only one franchise for his entire career, joining Gregg Popovich (Spurs) and Al Attles (Warriors).

1,500: The HEAT recorded their franchise's 1,500th regular season victory on 1/31 vs. SAC, becoming the 10th-fastest team in NBA history to reach their 1,500th win, doing so in their 2,851st game. They surpassed Chicago who claimed their 1,500th victory in game 2,875. Additionally, the Seattle SuperSonics are ninth, having accomplished the feat in 2,786 games.

FRANCHISE FIRST: Bam Adebayo recorded 15 points, 15 rebounds, six assists and a career-high six blocks on 1/24 vs. MEM, becoming the first player in franchise history to reach at least each of those totals. Additionally, he also became just the fourth HEAT player with at least 15 rebounds and six blocks, joining Hassan Whiteside, Alonzo Mourning and Rony Seikaly.

TERRY FROM THE LINE: Terry Rozier III has shot 94.6 percent (35-of-37) from the foul line since joining Miami, including a streak of 21-straight, the sixth-longest streak of his career. Additionally, he shot a perfect 11-of-11 from the free throw line on 2/2 at WAS, the second-most made without a miss during a game in his career. Below are his longest free throws made streaks and the most made without a miss during a game in his career.

TRIPLE TRIO: Three different HEAT players each connected on at least five three-point field goals on 2/13 at MIL, including Duncan Robinson (six), Nikola Jović (five) and Kevin Love (five), becoming just the third trio in franchise history to each connect on at least five from downtown. Additionally, Duncan Robinson has been a part of all three instances with two of those now coming at Milwaukee. The previous two occurred on 3/2/22 at MIL (Tyler Herro-6, Duncan Robinson-5 & Gabe Vincent-5) and on 2/9/20 at POR (Duncan Robinson-6, Jae Crowder-5 & Goran Dragić-5).

TEAM EFFORT: The HEAT dished out 38 assists vs. SAC on 1/31, tying the third-most assists in franchise history. Miami made 42 field goals in the game, resulting in a 90.5 percent assist-to-field goals made percentage, the highest in team history. Below are the highest assist-to-field goals made percentages in HEAT history.

18+: Five different HEAT players scored at least 18 points on 12/11 at CHA, marking just the third time in team history at least five players have done so. Duncan Robinson (24), Jimmy Butler (23), Caleb Martin (20), Kevin Love (19) and Jaime Jaquez Jr. (18) all accomplished the feat. The only other games in which at least five HEAT players scored at least 18 points each were 4/28/21 vs. SA and 3/22/96 at MIL.

OT: The HEAT recorded a, 96-95, overtime win on 1/15 at BKN after being down five in the extra quarter with only 1:28 to play. It marks as the first time Miami has come back from down by at least five points in an overtime game on the road since play-by-plays started to be tracked in 1997.

PERFECTION: Miami shot a perfect 25-of-25 from the free throw line on 1/29 vs. PHO, marking the fourth-most makes without a miss in team history. Below are the most free throws made without a miss during a single game in franchise history.

GAME WINNERS: Jimmy Butler hit the game-winning buzzer-beater vs. CHI on 12/16 to give Miami the, 118-116, win. He now has two game-winning baskets with under a second to play as a member of the HEAT, tying the second-most in team history (since play-by-plays were tracked in 1996). ROOKIE OF THE MONTH: Jaime Jaquez Jr. earned NBA Eastern Conference Rookie of the Month for December, his second consecutive honor after also winning for the combined Oct/Nov. He is the fifth HEAT rookie to win the award, joining Caron Butler, Michael Beasley, Josh Richardson and Kendrick Nunn and the third to do so multiple times (Butler – 4 & Nunn – 3).

THE ROOK: Jaime Jaquez Jr. scored in double-figures in 13-straight games from 11/20 – 12/16. The last HEAT rookie to score in double-figures in at least 13 consecutive games is Dwyane Wade at 15 from 11/28/03 – 12/29/03. During that stretch, Jaquez Jr. scored 22 points, all off the bench, on 12/14 vs. CHI, his third 20-point game off the bench this season (now six total with three as a starter). His three such games already tie for the fifth-most by a HEAT rookie in franchise history. Below are the most 20-point games by a rookie reserve in HEAT history.

JAIME ON CHRISTMAS: Jaime Jaquez Jr. posted a 31-point, 10-rebound double-double on 12/25 vs. PHI, becoming just the fifth rookie in NBA history to record a 30-point, 10-rebound double-double in a Christmas Day game, joining only Patrick Ewing (1985), Walt Bellamy (1961), Oscar Robertson (1960) and Wilt Chamberlain (1959). His 31 points are tied for the seventh-most by a rookie on Christmas in league history and also tie for the third-most by any HEAT player. It marked as the ninth time in team history at least eight different players scored in double-digits and the second time this season after also doing so on 11/22 at CLE, tying the most for a single season in franchise history (3/10/18 vs. WAS & 4/11/18 vs. TOR).

DUNCAN IN THE FOURTH: Duncan Robinson scored 21 points in the fourth quarter on 12/22 vs. ATL. According to the AP, Robinson has become just the fourth HEAT player to score at least 21 points in the fourth (since play-by-plays were kept in 1996), joining Dwyane Wade, Jimmy Butler and Kyle Lowry. It was the highest scoring fourth quarter of Robinson's career and tied for the most in any quarter (21 in second on 11/20/19 vs. CLE).

900: Duncan Robinson made the 900th three-point field goal of his career on 12/16 vs. CHI, doing so in his 305th career game, the fastest to 900 makes in NBA history. 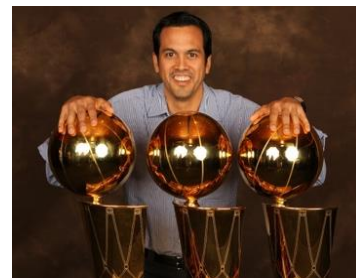

Recognized as one of the game's best coaches, Spoelstra was selected as one of the NBA's 15 Greatest Coaches in NBA History and has earned Coach of the Month honors 10 times, tying the sixth-most in NBA history.



In his previous 15 seasons at the helm, Spoelstra has made his mark on the HEAT record book as the winningest coach in franchise history. Entering this season, he holds team records in wins, winning percentage and games coached. He has also been honored as the NBA's Eastern Conference Coach of the Month a franchise-record nine times. His 12 postseason appearances in his previous 15 seasons tie the second-most over that span in the NBA as Spoelstra has never missed the playoffs in consecutive seasons since becoming head coach.

When Spoelstra first took over the head coaching duties in 2008, he was given the task of improving a young team that had been ravaged by injuries the previous season and had won just 15 games. He then recorded 43 wins in his first season, the most by a first year HEAT coach in team history, while on his way to a postseason berth. Miami became just the second team in NBA history to make the playoffs after winning 15-or-fewer games the previous season. The only other team to do so was the 1968-69 San Diego Rockets, in which HEAT President Pat Riley was a member of.

From 2010-14, Spoelstra took one of the most scrutinized teams and guided them to consecutive NBA Championships, four-straight Conference Championships and four consecutive NBA Finals appearances, becoming just the third franchise in NBA history to make four consecutive NBA Finals appearances, joining the Celtics and Lakers. It also made them just one of 10 franchises in the four major North American sports leagues to make four consecutive trips to the league championship. Individually, Spoelstra became just the fourth head coach in NBA history to lead his team to four-straight Finals appearances joining Red Auerbach, K.C. Jones and Pat Riley. Spoelstra also joined a very elite fraternity when he led the HEAT to a seven-game series win over the San Antonio Spurs in the 2013 NBA Finals. Upon capturing the 2013 NBA Championship he became one of just 13 head coaches in NBA history to have won multiple championships and only the eighth to win a championship in consecutive seasons.

The 2012 championship culminated a compressed 2011-12 season in which Miami went 46-20 and captured its second consecutive Southeast Division title. The regular season was highlighted by a nine-game win streak (Feb. 10-Mar. 1) with each victory a double-digit win. During that streak the HEAT became the first team to win road games on three consecutive nights (Feb. 12-14) since December of 1979 and the first to win each of those contests by double-digits since the 1970-71 season.

Before taking over as the sixth head coach in HEAT history, Spoelstra had served Miami in a number of roles in his first 13 years. He was originally hired as video coordinator and over the years was promoted to assistant coach/video coordinator, assistant coach/advance scout and assistant coach/director of scouting, a title he held during Miami's 2006 NBA Championship, before ascending to head coach. He made a name for himself around the league with his game preparation and superb attention to detail. In his seven seasons as the HEAT's assistant coach/director of scouting, he had the primary role of developing game plans for upcoming opponents. To that end, he coordinated the video staff and advance scouts while overseeing the development of scouting reports and videos.

In 1992, he graduated from the University of Portland with a degree in communications. While attending Portland, Spoelstra was the starting point guard for four years and was named the West Coast Conference Freshman of the Year in 1989. Upon graduating he spent two years as a player/coach for Tus Herten, a team in the professional sports league of Germany.

He has returned to his native Philippines to host clinics and promote education, health and wellness to thousands of at-risk youth through grassroots programs and events. The 9-day program in Manila in the summer of 2011 was the largest NBA FIT event ever hosted in Southeast Asia under the NBA Cares umbrella. In the summer of 2012, Coach Spoelstra expanded his reach into other Southeast Asia nations by conducting coaches clinics and other FIT activities in Singapore.

Raised in Portland, OR, Spoelstra, who was inducted into the Jesuit High School Athletic Hall of Fame in September 2009, is the first Asian/Filipino-American head coach in any of the major North American sports leagues. Spoelstra is the son of Jon Spoelstra, a long-time NBA executive who has guided the Portland Trail Blazers, Denver Nuggets, Buffalo Braves and New Jersey Nets. His grandfather, Watson, was a Detroit Tigers beat writer for many years. In his free time, Spoelstra enjoys spending time with his sons Santiago and Dante and daughter, Ruby, and their dog Rosie.
