THE BUZZ: 2020-21 HORNETS PLAYER NOTES

MELO'S RETURN: Hornets guard LaMelo Ball has returned from a 21-game hiatus due to injury as he is averaging 15.8 points, 6.0 rebounds, 6.8 assists and 1.8 steals per game in his first five games back. Ball totaled 27 points, six rebounds and six assists, his 10th game this season with at least 20 points, five rebounds and five assists, which is the third most by a rookie in their teens in NBA history as he passed Carmelo Anthony (8) on May 4 at Detroit and only trails Luka Doncic (17) and LeBron James (17). The first-year guard out of Chino Hills is second in franchise history in games with 20-5-5 by a first-year player, only behind Larry Johnson (16), while totaling 16 20-point performances this season for the fourth most in franchise history by a Hornets rookie with Emeka Okafor (2004-05: 16). Since returning to action, Ball has dished out at least five assists in each of his five games and has posted five-plus assists in 35 games this season, also the second most such games by a Hornets rookie behind Raymond Felton (42). Ball currently ranks sixth in assists (285), fifth in 3s (85) and 11th in points (731) among the Hornets all-time rookie leaders. Ball's currently averaging 15.9 points, 5.9 rebounds and 6.2 assists as he looks to become just the 14th rookie in NBA history to average at least 15.0 points, 5.0 rebounds and 5.0 assists in their debut season.

PJ'S ON A ROLL: Hornets forward PJ Washington has been on a tear lately, scoring 20+ points over his last three outings since May 2 after he totaled 23 points and nine rebounds in a win vs. Orlando on May 7 marking a new career-long streak with 20+ points. Washington's previous 20-point streak was just two games, which he has done three times previously, including most recently from Apr. 23-25 of this season as the second-year forward out of Kentucky is on an eight-game streak with at least 15 points. Washington has scored 20+ points in six of his last 10 games, averaging 19.6 points and 5.6 rebounds per game on .559% shooting from the floor while knocking down .531% of his attempts from behind the arc as he is the only player to average at least 15.0 points and 5.0 rebounds while attempting at least 3.0 3-pointers per game over every player's last 10 contests. Washington has made 34 3s over his last 10 games, which is tied for the eighth most over every player's last 10 games with Duncan Robinson and Reggie Bullock.

LITTLE EXPERIENCE NEEDED: The Charlotte Hornets are currently eighth in the Eastern Conference standings and have a record of 33-34 (.493%), which is the team's best win percentage as well as their most wins through 67 games since the 2015-16 season when the team was 38-29 (.567%) at that point in the season. The 2015-16 season is the last time Charlotte made the playoffs as the Hornets are in position to make this year's Play-In tournament, needing just one more win to secure a spot in the tournament, despite 12 of the team's 17 players playing in their first, second or third year in the NBA as the Hornets are also the 10th youngest team by average age in the NBA this season. This season, 589% of the Hornets minutes this season have been played by first, second or third-year players, which is the second highest percentage in the NBA, only behind the Oklahoma City Thunder, per Elias Sports Bureau, as Charlotte is also second in total minutes played by that group of players, totaling 9,503 minutes this season, again, only trailing OKC (13,272).

ANOTHER 20 FOR TERRY: Hornets guard Terry Rozier scored 28 points going 9-for-20 from the field vs. Orlando on May 7, his 33rd game this season with 20+ points, his 17th game this season with 25 points or more and his seventh outing with 20-5-5. Rozier had 21 points to go with 11 assists and five rebounds vs. Boston on Apr. 25, tying his career-high for assists. Rozier has set a new career-high for 20-point games and double-doubles in a season as he passed his 2019-20 totals of 25 20-point games and two double-doubles and has the most 20-point outings by a Hornets player since Kemba Walker (62) during the 2018-19 season. His 17 games this season with 25 points or more are also a new career-high for a season as he passed his '19-20 season total (14). Rozier scored 20+ points in five straight games for the second time in his career from Mar. 22-30 as the other five-game streak was from Jan. 2 to 10, 2020.

Rozier is averaging a team-high 20.3 points per game and is also the first Hornets player with 25 or more 20-point efforts in consecutive seasons since Walker who had 20 points 50 times during the 2017-18 season and 62 times during the 2018-19 season.

FEARLESS IN THE FOURTH QUARTER: Charlotte Hornets guard Terry Rozier has been stellar in the fourth quarter and in clutch moments for the Hornets as he scored 28 points vs. Orlando on May 7, including 18 second half points and 13 points in the fourth quarter. He has six games this season with 20+ points in the second half as he is one of 19 players with six or more 20-point second halves and one of 26 players with seven or more 20+ point halves this season. Rozier is averaging 3.4 points per game in 23 games played in clutch situations, the 17th best clutch scoring average, and averaging 0.6 3s per game in those instances, which is tied for second in the NBA. Rozier's offensive rating in crunch time situations is 135.2 points per 100 possessions as he is shooting .533% from the field, .500% from beyond the arc and .850% from the free throw line in the clutch as he is one of four players this season averaging at least 3.0 points while going .500% from the field and from 3-point range. Rozier also ranks third in 3-point shooting among players with at least 20 3-point attempts in clutch time. He now has 11 games with 10+ points in the fourth quarter this season as he is one of 16 players on the season with 11 or more games scoring 10 or more points in the final quarter of regulation and just the fifth player with 10+ points in the fourth quarter in 11 or more games for the Hornets since the 1996-97 season, joining Devonte' Graham ('19-20: 14), Glen Rice ('96-97: 21, '97-98: 13), Jason Richardson ('07-8: 12) and Kemba Walker ('18-19: 22, '17-18: 17, '16-17: 12, '15-16: 12, '13-14: 10).

He had his second 20-point fourth quarter with 20 points vs. Golden State on Feb. 20, including seven in the final minute of the fourth. Rozier also had 21 points in the fourth quarter in the season opener at Cleveland on Dec. 23, which is tied for the sixth most in the fourth quarter in the NBA this season as he is one of two players in the NBA this season along with Chicago guard Zach LaVine to have multiple 20-point fourth quarters. Rozier is one of 14 players this season with 15+ points in three games or more in the fourth quarter this season as he is 11th in the NBA this season in total fourth quarter points with 348 and is tied for first in the League in made 3s in the final quarter of regulation with 56. He is averaging 6.3 points per game in the fourth quarter this season, ranking 18th in the NBA.

Rozier is just the second player in franchise history with multiple 20-point fourth quarters in a season along with Kemba Walker (4, 2018-19) as he's one of two players this season with four or more made 3-point field goals in the fourth quarter in three games along with Portland guard forward Carmelo Anthony. Last season, only three players (Trae Young: 4, Bradley Beal: 2, Zach Lavine: 2) had multiple games with a 20-point fourth quarter while just two players (Buddy Hield: 5, Young: 3) had four or more 3-pointers in the fourth quarter in three or more outings.

ROZIER'S EXCELLENCE: Hornets guard Terry Rozier has been tremendous all season long, averaging 20.3 points, 4.3 rebounds and 4.2 assists while shooting .451% from the field and .391% from 3-point range, including a strong performance in February in his second season with the Hornets. Here are a few notes on Rozier's performance this season and how it stacks up in franchise history as well as against other players in the NBA this season.

- Rozier was named Eastern Conference Player of the Week for the for his performance from Mar. 22 to Mar. 28 as he helped lead the Hornets to a 3-1 record and averaged 24.3 points, 5.3 rebounds and 5.5 assists per game. Rozier was the first Hornets player to earn Eastern Conference Player of the Week Honors since Kemba Walker in April 2019 as this marked the first time he has been named Player of the Week.
- Rozier reached 300 made 3-point field goals with the Hornets at the Clippers on Mar. 20, hitting the mark in just 102 games, which makes him the fastest to reach 300 made 3s in franchise history as Devonte' Graham previously held that record earlier this season (127 games).
- Rozier ranks sixth in the NBA this season in total 3-point field goals made with 208 and is averaging 3.3 3-point field goals made per game, which ranks 10th among league leaders as he is just the fifth player in franchise history with 200+ made 3s in a season along with Walker (2015-19), Glen Rice (1996-97), Jason Richardson (2007-08) and Devonte' Graham (2019-20). Rozier totaled 31 points at Minnesota on Mar. 3, including 18 points in the third quarter alone along with five made 3s, tying the franchise record for made 3-pointers in a quarter. Rozier has had three 40-point games, 13 30-point games and 58 20-point games in just under two seasons with the Hornets compared to just two 30-point games and 12 20-point games in his first four NBA seasons.
- He recorded 36 points vs. Golden State on Feb. 20, as he had four straight 30-point games from Feb. 10 to 20, after 33 points vs. SA on Feb. 14, 41 points vs. MIN on Feb. 12 and 34 points at MEM on Feb. 10. This was the first time Rozier's had 30+ points in four consecutive games as he is one of 13 players this season with 30 points or more in four consecutive games.
- He is the first Hornets player with four straight 30-point performances since Walker (5, 2/2-2/11/19) and just the third player in franchise history with a 30-point streak of four games or longer along with Walker and Rice who both completed the feat two times.
- Rozier is one of 22 players this season with multiple 40-point performances as well as one of 24 players with 35+ points in four or more outings this season.
- Over the four-game stretch, Rozier averaged 36.0 points (.600 FG%, .590 3pt%, 1.000 FT%), 5.0 rebounds and 3.5 assists per game as he is one of 13 players this season to average 36.0 points or more over a four-game span, according to Basketball Reference. He is just the third player in franchise history to average at least 36.0 points over a four-game period along with Rice (36.8 from 1/28-2/2/97; 36.3, 4/2-4/7/97) and Walker (36.0, 11/17-11/23/18).
- Rozier totaled 20 points in the fourth quarter alone vs. Golden State and 28 in the second half has scored 25+ points in three halves this season, all in the second half, as he's one of 16 players with three 25-point halves and one of 13 with three 25-point second halves. Rozier is one of 12 players this season with multiple 20-point quarters overall.

MOVING ON UP: Hornets guard Terry Rozier has been stellar from beyond the arc this season, totaling 208 made 3-pointers, as he knocked down three 3-pointers vs. Orlando on May 7 to surpass Glen Rice (1996-97: 207) on the Hornets all-time single-season 3-pointers made list. Earlier this season, Rozier became just the fourth player in franchise history with 150+ made 3s in consecutive seasons along with Dell Curry (1993-96), Glen Rice (1996-98) and Kemba Walker (2015-19) as he also continues to climb the franchise's 3-point leaders list and is now eighth all-time in 3-pointers made passing Raymond Felton (375) with two made 3s vs. Chicago on May 6 as he now has 380 made treys.

A CREW OF SHOT BLOCKERS: The Charlotte Hornets finished with 15 blocks vs. Detroit on May 1, the most blocks by any team this season and the most by the Hornets since Feb. 5, 2015 when the team recorded 15 blocks vs. Washington as this was just the fifth time in franchise history with 15 or more blocks in a game. Charlotte had four players with multiple blocks as center Bismack Biyombo led the way with five blocks, forward PJ Washington notched three blocks and guard LaMelo Ball and forward Jalen McDaniels each posted two blocks. This marked the first time the Hornets had four players with multiple blocks in a game since the 2016-17 season as Frank Kaminsky (4), Cody Zeller (3), Michael Kidd-Gilchrist (2) and Marvin Williams (2) all had at least two blocks in a win vs. Denver on Mar. 31, 2017.

A FIRST HALF TO REMEMBER: Hornets guard LaMelo Ball got off to a strong start in the first half of his rookie season, including some honors and historically great accomplishments, especially in the month of February. Below are some notes related to Ball's first half performance.

- For his play during the first half of the season, Ball was named to the 2021 U.S. Team Rising Stars Roster, selected by the other assistant coaches in the NBA. According to Elias Sports Bureau, he is the only player over the last 60 seasons to lead all rookies in total points, rebounds, assists and steals at the All-Star break.
- Also according to ESB, Ball is just the sixth player in NBA history to lead all rookies in total points, rebounds and assists along with Alvan Adams (1975-76), Oscar Robertson (1960-61), Wilt Chamberlain (1959-60), Elgin Baylor (1958-59) and Bob Pettit (1954-55). Each of those five players went on to when Rookie of the Year in their respective rookie season and four of the five went on to be inducted into the Hall of Fame.
- Ball made 13 appearances in February, all starts, and averaged 20.1 points, 6.3 rebounds, 6.7 assists and 1.7 steals per game while shooting .452% from the field, .407% from 3-point range and .864% from the free throw line. For his performance, Ball earned Eastern Conference Rookie of the Month for a second consecutive month to become the second Hornets rookie in franchise history to win back-to-back Rookie of the Month awards in the first two months it was awarded.

THE BUZZ: 2020-21 HORNETS PLAYER NOTES

DEPENDABLE DEVONTE: Hornets guard Devonte' Graham scored 25 points on 7-of-19 shooting, including five 3s while adding five rebounds, seven assists and a career-high tying two blocks at Boston on Apr. 28. Graham scored 17 of his 25 points in the third quarter at Boston as he went 5-for-8 from the field, including three 3-pointers as he tied his career-high for points in a quarter as he also had 17 points in the opening frame at Boston on Dec. 22, 2019.

Graham posted 25 points and five assists in consecutive games for the fourth time in his career and the first time since notching 25+ points and five assists or more from Mar. 9-11 during the 2019-20 season after he totaled 25 points and six assists vs. Milwaukee on Apr. 27. He also posted at least 20+ points and five assists in three straight games as he posted 24 points and nine dimes vs. Boston on Apr. 25 marking the just the second time Graham had 20+ points and five assists or more in his career as he had a four-game streak of 20 points and five assists or better from Mar. 5-11, 2020. He ranks 14th in the NBA this season in games with five-plus made 3s with 12.

ANOTHER COLLECTIVE EFFORT: The Charlotte Hornets beat the Boston Celtics, 125-104, on Apr. 25 for their third straight win at Spectrum Center as the Hornets had four players to score 20+ points while six players also scored in double figures as guards Devonte' Graham (24) and Terry Rozier (21) and forwards PJ Washington (22) and Miles Bridges (20) each had at least 20 points. Charlotte also had three players post double-doubles as Rozier had 11 assists and PJ Washington collected 12 rebounds while forward Cody Martin notched 13 points and 10 assists for the first double-double of his career. Graham chipped in nine assists as Washington and Martin had five assists apiece as Charlotte had four players with five assists in the outing.

This was the first time the Hornets had four players score 20+ points since Mar. 13, 2018 at New Orleans as Kemba Walker (22), Dwight Howard (22), Frank Kaminsky (21) and Nicolas Batum (20) each totaled at least 20+ points in that contest. The game also marked the first time Charlotte had three players with a double-double since a win vs. New York on Jan. 28, 2020 as Rozier (30 points, 10 rebounds), Cody Zeller (10 points, 10 rebounds) and Willy Hernangomez (12 points, 10 rebounds) each posted a double-double in that game.

DEVONTE' FROM DEEP: Hornets guard Devonte' Graham has been solid from 3-point range in his return from injury as he is averaging 3.6 made 3-point field goals on 9.0 3-point attempts per game and shooting .396% from beyond the arc in the games he has played in after the All-Star break. Post All-Star break, Graham is sixth in 3-pointers made per game and has made 93 3-point field goals since returning after the break, which is the 12th most in the NBA

Graham has made 163 3-point field goals this season, tied for 20th in the NBA this season, as he is just the fifth player in franchise history to knock down 150+ 3-point field goals in consecutive seasons after he made six vs. Boston on Apr. 25 along with Terry Rozier (2019-21), Kemba Walker (2015-19), Glen Rice (1995-97) and Dell Curry (1993-96). He has 415 made 3s in his career, doing so in just 159 games, as he is the sixth player for the franchise to amass 400 made 3s vs. Boston on Apr. 25 and became the second fastest player to reach that mark, doing so in 157 games and is only behind Duncan Robinson (125 games).

A TRIO OF SCORERS: The Charlotte Hornets beat the Cleveland Cavaliers, 108-102, on Apr. 23 behind a collective effort from forwards Miles Bridges and PJ Washington and guard Terry Rozier who all scored 25 points in the team's victory. This marked the first time the Hornets had three players score at least 25 points in a game in over 10 seasons as the last time it happened was on Jan. 5, 2010 when Charlotte beat Chicago. In the Hornets win over the Bulls in that game, Gerald Wallace (32), Stephen Jackson (25) and Ronald Murray (25) each had at least 25 points in the contest as this is also just the third time over the past 15 seasons with three 25-point scorers in a game for the Hornets. The other time was on Dec. 12, 2007 when Raymond Felton (26), Emeka Okafor (25) and Wallace (25) all totaled at least 25 points in a win vs. the Clippers.

AN ALL-AROUND PLAYER: Hornets guard Terry Rozier posted 21 points, seven rebounds and eight assists at New York on Apr. 20 as he had four straight games with at least 20 points, five rebounds and five assists, a streak that began on Apr. 14 vs. Cleveland. Rozier's four-game streak with 20-5-5 is tied for the longest streak in franchise history with four other players along with Kemba Walker (11/7-11/17/17), Nicolas Batum (12/20-12/28/16), Jamal Mashburn (12/9-12/16/00) and Bobby Phills (4/14-4/19/99). This was also the longest such streak of Rozier's career as the only other time he had a streak with 20-5-5 was a two-game streak from Oct. 30 to Nov. 2, 2019.

Rozier scored 15 points on 6-of-7 shooting in the second quarter at New York as he is one of three Hornets player since the 1996-97 season with eight or more 15-point quarters in a season along with Walker ('16-17, '18-19) and Glen Rice ('96-97, '97-98). This season, Rozier is one of 16 players in the NBA with eight or more quarters with 15+ points.

This marked the third four-game streak of 20+ points for Rozier this season as he has also had at least five assists in seven straight outings from Apr. 14 to 25, the longest streak of his career.

TERRY'S BACK AT IT: Hornets guard Terry Rozier posted 34 points, 10 assists and eight rebounds on 13-of-24 shooting, including seven made 3s vs. Portland on Apr. 18 to become the first player in franchise history with 30 points, 10 assists, five rebounds and five made 3s in a game and one of seven players in the NBA this season with that stat line along with Luka Doncic, James Harden, Kyrie Irving, Damian Lillard, Kevin Porter Jr. and Russell Westbrook. After totaling 27 points, 10 assists and five rebounds at Brooklyn on Apr. 16, Rozier also became the first player in franchise history to record consecutive games with 25 points and 10 assists and just the 12th player this season as this is the first time a Hornets player had at least 30 points and 10 assists since Kemba Walker had 38 points and 11 assists on Mar. 26, 2019 vs. San Antonio. Rozier is the first player with to record consecutive 20-point double-doubles two times during a single season since Dwight Howard during the 2017-18 season as he also had consecutive 20-point double-doubles from Mar. 26-28.

17 of Rozier's 34 points vs. Portland came in the first quarter where he went 7-of-8 from the field and 3-for-3 from beyond the arc, marking the seventh time this season he has had 15+ points in a quarter this season. Rozier also had eight made 3s vs. Detroit on May 1, his 13th game this season with five-plus makes from beyond the arc as he is tied for the sixth most games with five or more 3-pointers by a player this season.

A HOT START FOR PJ: Hornets forward PJ Washington came off the bench at New York on Apr. 20 and opened up the first quarter with 17 points on 6-of-7 shooting, including 5-for-5 from beyond the arc, tying the franchise record for made 3s. Washington is just the second reserve in franchise history along with Ben Gordon with five 3-pointers in a quarter as Gordon had five made treys in the fourth quarter at Atlanta on Nov. 28, 2012. Washington is one of 14 players this season to go perfect from 3-point range in a quarter while making at least five 3-pointers and one of four reserves to do so. Washington is one of five players this season to make at least 5 3s without a miss in the first quarter and just the second player to do so off the bench since the 1996-97 season along with Wayne Ellington who went 5-for-5 from beyond the arc in the first quarter vs. Portland on Dec. 13, 2017.

Washington's 17 points are the most points by a Hornets reserve in the first quarter since the '96-97 season passing Jeremy Lamb who had 13 first quarter points off the bench on Mar. 3, 2019 vs. Portland. He ended the first half with 21 points to become just the sixth Hornets player to score at least 20 points in a half since the '96-97 season as Washington finished the game with 26 points.

TERRY CALLED GAME: Hornets guard Terry Rozier scored 36 points for Charlotte vs. Golden State on Feb. 20 totaled 20 points in the fourth quarter alone vs. Golden State, which included seven straight points for the Hornets over the final minute of regulation, including a game-winning jump shot at the buzzer to seal the victory for Charlotte after they were down by as many as five points with under 55 seconds remaining in the contest. Rozier and forward Gordon Hayward are the only Hornets players with 35+ points in a game along with a game-winner since the 1997-98 season, according to Elias Sports Bureau, as he is the first player in the NBA with 20+ points in the fourth quarter to hit a game-winning shot (less than 10 seconds remaining) since Zach LaVine on Nov. 23, 2019 at Charlotte per ESB. Since tracking began during the 1996-97 season, Rozier's game-winner is the second in regulation by a Hornets player (less than 10 seconds remaining) after the team was down by as many as five points with a minute or less to go in the game as David Wesley made a game-winning 3-pointer with 5.9 seconds in an 86-85 win on Feb. 24, 2001 as the Hornets were losing 85-80 in the final minute of that ball game.

This marked the second game-winner of Rozier's career and the first with the Hornets as he also made had a game-winning dunk for the Celtics in a win at Indiana with one second left in that contest.

TERRY'S SCARY SCORING: Hornets guard Terry Rozier is averaging 20.3 points per game as he has four games this season with at least 35 points. Rozier scored a career-high 42 points at Cleveland on Dec. 23 in the team's season opener as he set a new franchise record for points in an opener surpassing the previous high of 41 points scored by Kemba Walker on Oct. 17, 2018. Rozier knocked down a career-high 10 3-point field goals, which tied the franchise record set by Walker (3/22/18 vs. Memphis) and guard Devonte' Graham (12/4/19 vs. Golden State); Rozier's 10 makes from beyond the arc is now a new NBA record for 3-pointers made in a team's first game of the season as eight other players held the previous record of seven and tied for the sixth most by a player in any game this season. Rozier poured in 36 points in the second half alone, which is tied for the most points in a half by any player this season and the second most in any half by a Hornets player since tracking began during the 1996-97 season, only trailing Walker who had 38 points in the second half at Utah on Apr. 1, 2019. Rozier also scored 21 points in the fourth quarter alone as he is just the fourth Hornets player since the 1996-97 season with 21+ points in a quarter (Walker, six times; Baron Davis, Q4: 21 points, 10/31/01 vs. CLE; David Wesley, Q1: 21 points, 12/29/97 at HOU). Rozier is one of 16 players this season with 20+ points in the fourth quarter.

Rozier followed up his 42-point game with 35 points at Philadelphia on Jan. 2 and had 41 points on Feb. 12 vs. Minnesota. He is one of 24 players with four or more games with 35+ points after scoring 36 vs. Golden State on Feb. 20. He's one of 17 players in franchise history with at least two games with 35+ points, reaching that mark in just six games as Rozier entered the season with seven 30-point games over his first five NBA seasons.

BRIDGING THE GAP: Hornets forward Miles Bridges scored a career-high 33 points on a career-best 13 made field goals, including a career-high tying six made 3s as he also set a new career-high for points in a half with 20 points in the first half at Brooklyn on Apr. 16. He posted at least 10 points and five rebounds in 11 straight games as well as a new career-best streak of three games with 20+ points after totaling 21 points, 10 rebounds and six assists vs. Milwaukee on Apr. 27. Bridges had 20 points and 10 rebounds vs. Boston on Apr. 25 and recorded 25 points vs. Cleveland on Apr. 23. Bridges has now scored 20+ points in eight of his last 16 games, all starts, after he posted 27 points and seven rebounds setting a new career-high for 25-point games in a season with four after posting 25+ points in three or more games last season. He has 11 double-doubles this season, including three over his last eight contests.

Over his last 16 games, Bridges is averaging 19.7 points and 6.9 rebounds per game and shooting .518% from the field and .448% from 3-point range. Bridges is also averaging 2.9 made 3-point field goals per game over the 16-game stretch and increased his scoring average by nearly two and a half points, going from 10.0 points to 12.4 points per game since starting for the Hornets. In 18 starts this season, Bridges is averaging 18.7 points and 6.9 rebounds on .521% shooting from the floor while knocking down .434% of his 3-point field goal tries and .848% of his free throw attempts.

THE BUZZ: 2020-21 HORNETS PLAYER NOTES

A MULTITUDE OF SCORERS: The Charlotte Hornets have seven players this season to score 30+ points in at least one game, including guard Terry Rozier (7), forward Gordon Hayward (4), guard LaMelo Ball (2), Malik Monk (2), Miles Bridges (1) Devonte' Graham (1) and PJ Washington (1). The Hornets are the one of two teams this season to have seven players currently on the roster to score 30+ points for their respective team as Toronto has seven players as well while Atlanta, Brooklyn, Utah and Philadelphia have five players with a 30-point performance. This also marked the first time in franchise history the Hornets have seven players with 30+ points in a game in a season as the previous high was five players with a 30-point game during the 1993-94 season, which included Alonzo Mourning, Hersey Hawkins, Eddie Johnson, Dell Curry and Larry Johnson.

PROTECTING THE RIM: Charlotte Hornets forward PJ Washington recorded 23 points, eight rebounds and four blocks vs. Portland on Apr. 18 as he had three blocks in the third quarter and four blocks in the second half alone, which ties the most blocks by a Hornets player this season in a half and a quarter. Washington ranks 15th in blocks per game in the NBA this season, averaging 1.25 blocks per contest, while center Bismack Biyombo is 19th in the Association at 1.15 block per outing. Washington and Biyombo both have 19 games this season with multiple blocks, tied for the 18th most by a player in the league as this is the most games with multiple blocks in a season by a Hornets player since Dwight Howard (32) during the 2017-18 season.

DOUBLE-DOUBLES OFF THE BENCH: Hornets forward Miles Bridges had four straight double-doubles from Feb. 7 to 12, which is a career long streak. Bridges four-game double-double streak is the longest by a bench player this season. Bridges posted 23 points and 10 rebounds to go with two steals in a win at Indiana setting a season-high for points as this marked the most points he has scored in a double-double with this being just his third career 20-point double-double, including his second of the season. He has now totaled eight double-doubles off the bench on the season, which is tied for the third most by a reserve this season. In franchise history, Bridges passed Nazr Mohammed (3 games, 1/9-1/12/08) for the longest streak by a reserve and also eclipsed Jamaal Magloire (6, 2001-01) for the most double-doubles by a player off the bench in a single season. His seventh double-double gave him sole possession of the second most double-doubles for a reserve in combined seasons in franchise history, passing Magloire, Muggsy Bogues (6) and Tyrus Thomas (6) as he is now tied with Willy Hernangomez (8) for the most by a reserve in franchise history.

COLLECTING ON THE OFFENSIVE END: The Charlotte Hornets were victorious over the Cavaliers on Apr. 23 behind 15 offensive rebounds and 18 second chance points. Center Bismack Biyombo was a huge part of that, grabbing 11 rebounds, including nine offensive boards off the bench as he is just the 13th player in franchise history to record nine or more offensive rebounds and the first since Dwight Howard had 11 offensive rebounds on Mar. 21, 2018. Biyombo's nine offensive rebounds are the most in a game in franchise history by a reserve passing Nazr Mohammed (4/12/08 at IND), Jamaal Magloire (1/19/02 vs. TOR), Vlade Divac (3/27/98 at IND) and Matt Geiger (4/5/97 vs. PHI) who all had eight offensive rebounds in their respective games.

LA梅LO'S RECORD SETTING PERFORMANCE: Hornets guard LaMelo Ball had a historical performance in Charlotte's win over Atlanta on Jan. 9 as the first-year player totaled 22 points, 12 rebounds and 11 assists for the first triple-double of his career. At 19 years and 140 days old on Jan. 9, Ball becomes the youngest player in NBA history with a triple-double as Markelle Fultz held the previous record with a triple-double on Apr. 11, 2018 at 19 years and 317 days old. Below are historical stats regarding Ball's triple-double provided by Stathead:

- Ball is just the third player under 20 years old with a triple-double along with Fultz and Luka Doncic who had four triple-doubles (1/21, 1/27, 2/6, 2/25/19) before he turned 20 years old.
- The game was just the 10th in Ball's career, making him one of nine players in NBA history to accumulate a triple-double in 10 career games or fewer and just the third over the last decade along with John Wall (11/10/10) and Ben Simmons (10/23, 11/3/17). His stat line from the game gave him 128 points, 63 rebounds and 59 assists through his first 10 career games as he's just one of seven NBA players with totals of at least 25 points, 60 rebounds and 50 assists and one of four players since the NBA/ABA merger.
- With Ball coming off the bench and posting a triple-double, he's one of five rookies in NBA history with a triple-double and one of three rookie reserves with a 20-point triple-double (Fultz, 4/11/18; Terrence Williams, 4/9/10; Mark Eaton, 2/5/1983; Alvan Adams, 1/18/76). Ball is the first player to record a triple-double off the bench since Evan Turner recorded one off the bench for Portland on Apr. 3, 2019.
- Ball's triple-double is the 28th in franchise history as he is the 10th player in team history with a triple-double and the only Hornets player to do so off the bench. Ball's just the second rookie in franchise history along with Kemba Walker (20 points, 10 rebounds, 11 assists vs. WAS on Jan. 28, 2012) to tally a triple-double. Ball's triple-double is tied for the earliest done in a season by a Hornets player, doing so in just the 10th game of the team's season along with Kendall Gill (11/18/95). Ball now holds the franchise record for fewest number of career games needed to notch a triple-double, surpassing Walker's previous record with a triple-double in his 21st career game. This marked the first triple-double for a Hornets player since Mar. 15, 2018 when Nicolas Batum had 10, points, 10 rebounds and 16 assists at Atlanta.
- Ball is one of 28 players this season with a triple-double and the only rookie.

LA梅LO DOES IT AGAIN: Hornets first-year guard LaMelo Ball continues to impress as he recorded 30 points, eight assists, six rebounds and a career-high tying four steals at Portland on Mar. 1 for his first game with 30 points, five rebounds and five assists. Ball is the third youngest player in NBA history with 30-5-5 at 19 years and 191 days old, only behind LeBron James (Six times, youngest: 18 years, 334 days) and Kevin Durant (19 years, 190 days). Ball is the youngest player with 30-5-5 along with four steals and just the sixth rookie over the last 20 seasons with that stat line as well as just the third rookie since the 2009-10 season along with Luka Doncic (3/6/19) and Stephen Curry (3/13, 3/24/10).

In franchise history, Ball is just the third rookie with 30 points, five rebounds and five assists along with Raymond Felton (3/22/06 at CLE) and Larry Johnson (1/22/92 vs. CHI, 3/19/92 @ PHI) as only Ball and Felton also tallied four-plus steals. The last Hornets player to total 30-5-5 was Malik Monk on Jan. 24, 2020 with 31 points, five rebounds and five dimes as Kemba Walker is the last player with such a performance along with four or more steals on Nov. 15, 2016; Walker had 30 points, five rebounds six assists and five steals at Minnesota. He is just one of four rookies in franchise history with multiple 30-point games (Alonzo Mourning, 8; Johnson, 3; Felton, 2).

ANOTHER NIGHT, ANOTHER HISTORICAL PERFORMANCE: Hornets rookie guard scored 24 points on 7-of-18 shooting, going 7-for-12 from beyond the arc on Feb. 8 vs. Houston, accompanied by 10 assists and seven rebounds. Ball is the youngest player (19 years, 170 days) to post 20 points, five rebounds and 10 assists with five made 3-point field goals and the only person below the age of 20 to do so. Ball's also just the ninth rookie in NBA history with 20-5-10 to go with five made 3-pointers and one of three along with Stephen Curry and Jason Kidd with that stat line and seven made treys; here's a few more notes on yet another impressive outing from Ball.

- The last rookie with 20-5-10 with five 3s was Trae Young (3/1/19 vs. CHI) and the previous youngest player was Dennis Smith Jr. (20 years, 34 days; 12/29/17 at NOP).
- Ball was the fourth player this season with 20-5-10 and five-plus made 3s and one of 13 players overall this season.
- Ball's the youngest player with seven made 3-point field goals (previous: Coby White, 19 years, 269 days, Nov. 12, 2019) and the first rookie with seven-plus makes from beyond the arc since White on Feb. 22, 2020.
- Ball tied the franchise rookie single-game 3-point field goal record along with D.J. Augustin at Atlanta (11/21/08) and PJ Washington vs. Chicago (10/23/19). Ball also tied Raymond Felton for the most 20-point, 10-assist games by a Hornets rookie in a season with two.

LA梅LO'S CAREER NIGHT: Hornets guard LaMelo Ball once again had a career night and record setting performance with his 34 points, eight assists, four rebounds while having no turnovers vs. Utah on Feb. 5. At 19 years and 167 days, Ball is the youngest player in NBA history to total 30+ points and five-plus assists with zero turnovers and just the second teenager with a 30-point, zero turnover outing along with Stephon Marbury (11/29/96, MIN at DEN). Here's a few more notes from a franchise and historical standpoint on Ball's stellar night.

- Ball's one of 14 rookies with 30 points, five assists and no turnovers and the first since Damian Lillard on Mar. 8, 2013 (POR at SAS). Ball's just the fifth player in franchise history with 30 points, five assists and no turnovers and the most recent since Kemba Walker vs. the Clippers on Feb. 5, 2019. He's one of 22 players this season with 30-5 and zero turnovers.
- Ball is the third youngest player in NBA history behind LeBron James (8 times, youngest: 18 years, 334 days) and Devin Booker (2 times, youngest: 19 years, 132 days) with 30 points and five assists in a game. Ball's just the third rookie in franchise history (Larry Johnson, 1/22 and 3/19/92; Raymond Felton, 3/22/06) with 30 points and five assists while only he and Johnson have had zero turnovers as well in a 30-5 game as a first-year player.
- Ball's the 10th rookie in franchise history with a 30-point game as it ranks tied for fifth most by a Hornets rookie. The last Charlotte rookie with 30 points was Walter Herrmann on Apr. 14, 2007 when he had 30 points at Milwaukee.
- Ball had 15 points in the fourth quarter vs. Utah as he's just the fourth Hornets rookie with 15+ points in a quarter since the turn of the century along with Adam Morrison, D.J. Augustin and Malik Monk. Most recently, Monk had 16 points in the fourth quarter at Chicago on Apr. 3, 2018.

BALLIN' IN BUZZ CITY: Hornets guard LaMelo Ball is averaging 15.9 points, 5.9 rebounds and 6.2 assists per game to go along with 1.61 steals per contest, ranking second in points and rebounds and first in assists and steals per game amongst rookie league leaders. Here's a few notes on his performance this season:

- Ball had a streak of 11 games with five-plus assists, all off the bench, from Dec. 27 to Jan. 14, surpassing Raymond Felton's franchise rookie record of eight straight games with five assists, which occurred from Apr. 4 to Apr. 19, 2006). Ball's streak was the second longest by a rookie reserve behind only Muggsy Bogues (14, 12/30/87-1/30/88) as he was the first reserve with an 11-game streak of five or more assists in the NBA since Jrue Holiday (11, 2/8-3/5/08).
- Ball grabbed a career-high 14 rebounds in a win vs. New York on Jan. 11 as he had 10+ boards in three straight games. It was the longest streak by a rookie since Luka Doncic had a three-game streak with 10+ rebounds from Mar. 21 to Mar. 26, 2019 as Ball is the first guard in franchise history with such a streak. He is the first Hornets rookie with three or more games in a row with 10+ boards since Emeka Okafor's 10-game streak (3/28-4/13/05). Ball is tied for the third most rebounds in a single-game by any rookie this season and the most by a Hornets rookie since Michael Kidd-Gilchrist on Apr. 5, 2013.
- Ball's performance on Dec. 30 at Dallas made him the youngest player in franchise history to record at least 20 points, five rebounds, and five assists in a single game (fourth youngest in NBA history behind LeBron James, Tracy McGrady and Kevin Durant). Ball is only the second Hornets rookie to post 20 points, five rebounds and five assists or better off the bench along with Kendall Gill who notched 21 points, six boards and five assists on Jan. 29, 1991 at Cleveland.

SOMETHING ABOUT THE HEAT: Hornets guard Malik Monk made a career-high 12 field goals and finished with 32 points vs. Miami on Mar. 26. Monk scored 30+ points in two games this season making him the first player in franchise history with multiple 30-point performances in the same season off the bench. He is one of four players this season to score 30+ points off the bench in two contests along with Jazz guard Jordan Clarkson, Mavs guard Tim Hardaway Jr. and Magic forward-guard Terrence Ross. His other 30-point game was 36 points at Miami on Feb. 1 as he is just the second reserve to score 30+ points in consecutive games against the Heat along with Ricky Pierce (2, 2/25-3/25/90). The last player with straight 30-point games against the Heat was James Harden who scored 30+ in three straight games against Miami from Feb. 7, 2018 to Feb. 28, 2019. According to Elias Sports Bureau, the last player in the NBA to score 30 points off the bench in two straight games against one opponent was Ross against Minnesota (32 on 2/7/19, 33 on 2/28/20) while the last player to do it in the same season was Gordon Hayward during the 2018-19 season against Minnesota with 32 points on Feb. 7 and 33 points on Feb. 28 for the Celtics.

Monk scored 24 points in the first half marking the second time this season he has had 20+ points in a half as he previously had 22 points in the first half at Phoenix on Feb. 24. Since the 1996-97 season, Monk is just the second reserve along with Ben Gordon in franchise history to have multiple 20 point halves. This season, he is one of five players off the bench with 20+ points in two or more halves along with Clarkson, Hardaway Jr., Hawks forward Danilo Gallinari and Knicks guard Immanuel Quickley, and one of three reserves with Clarkson and Hardaway Jr. to score 20 or more points in the first half in two or more games. He scored the most points by a reserve in a half for the Hornets since Adam Morrison who had 26 points in the second half at Minnesota on Feb. 21, 2007.

THE BUZZ: 2020-21 HORNETS PLAYER NOTES

A SPARK OFF THE BENCH: Hornets guard Malik Monk is averaging 12.6 points per game off the bench for Charlotte this season as he had 20+ points in four straight games from Feb. 22 to 28, for the first time in his career and scored 25 points in back-to-back games for the second time in his career from Feb. 24 to 26 (25-point streak: 2 games, 2/12-20/16; 20-point streak: 3 games, 4/3-4/8/18). Monk is one of eight players with consecutive 25-point games off the bench and one of two players to score 20+ points in four consecutive games as a reserve along with Raptors center-forward Chris Boucher. Monk has four 25-point games this season, three in February, as he is one of eight players off the bench with four or more 25-point games. This marks the third time in franchise history a Hornets reserve has 25+ points in straight games as he also did so last season from Feb. 12 to Feb. 20 along with Dell Curry (2 games, 12/19-12/22/92). Monk and Curry are also the only Hornets players to have 20+ points in at least three games in a row as a reserve in multiple seasons as Curry was the last Hornets reserve with four straight 20-point games from Mar. 3 to 11, 1995.

Monk is also one of five reserves this season with six or more games with five made 3s or more and also one of seven reserves this season with consecutive games with five or more 3-point field goals. At Phoenix on Feb. 25, Monk had 20 points in the second quarter alone and 22 points in the first half, setting new career-highs for a quarter. Monk was just the second bench player this season with at least 20 points in a single quarter and is one of four on the season (Immanuel Quickley, 1/24; Goran Dragic, 3/12; Evan Fournier 4/2) as well as just the second reserve with 20 points in a quarter for the Hornets along with Ben Gordon (11/28/12, 20, Q4 at ATL) since the 1996-97 season.

WELCOME TO THE LEAGUE, ROOK: Hornets center Vernon Carey Jr. received his first career start at Brooklyn on Apr. 16 and did not disappoint, totaling 21 points, six rebounds and one block on 9-of-14 shooting as the Duke product also knocked down one 3-point field goal. Carey Jr. is the first Hornets player to score 20+ points in their first career start in the NBA since PJ Washington who had 27 points on Oct. 23, 2019 vs. Chicago. He is also one of four rookies this season along with Sixers guard Mason Jones, Bucks forward Jordan Nwora and Knicks guard Immanuel Quickley to score 20+ points in their first career start.

40-POINT SCORERS: Hornets forward PJ Washington scored a career-high 42 points as he is the third Hornets player this season with 40+ points along with guard Terry Rozier (42, 12/23 at CLE; 41, 2/12 vs. MIN) and forward Gordon Hayward (44, 1/6 at ATL). Charlotte is one of four teams along with the Nets (Kevin Durant, James Harden, Kyrie Irving), Jazz (Bojan Bogdanovic, Jordan Clarkson, Donovan Mitchell) and Warriors (Stephen Curry, Kelly Oubre Jr., Andrew Wiggins) to have three players on the current roster with a 40-point game for their respective team this season as this marks the first time in franchise history where the Hornets have had three players with at least one 40-point game in a season.

PJ'S CAREER NIGHT: Hornets forward PJ Washington had a career night and was monumental in the Hornets 127-126 comeback victory over Sacramento on Feb. 28 as he poured in 42 points on 15-of-23 shooting, which set new career-highs. Washington also made a season-best five 3-point field goals as he had 22 points in the first half and 20 points in the second half, setting a new career-high for points in a half after his previous best for a half was 17 points. He is the youngest player in franchise history with a 40-point effort at 22 years and 189 days old as the previous youngest player was Gerald Wallace (23 years, 248 days). Washington is the first Hornets player with two 20-point halves in the same game since Kemba Walker on Apr. 10, 2019 when Walker had a 22-point first half and 21-point second half.

A DYNAMIC DUO: With 44 points from forward Gordon Hayward on Jan. 6 at Atlanta and 42 points from guard Terry Rozier on Dec. 23 and 41 points from Rozier on Feb. 12, the Hornets are just one of 10 teams with two players who have had 40+ points in a single game. With two 40-point performances from Hayward and Rozier, this is the earliest in a season that two Hornets players have reached the 40-point mark in franchise history. Hayward and Rozier have also each scored 35+ points in multiple games this season as they are one of seven sets of teammates with multiple 35-point outings.

Rozier had 26 points in the second half against Minnesota on Feb. 12 as he and Hayward have both had multiple halves with 25+ points this season. Hayward and Rozier are one of 20 players with multiple games with 25+ points in a single half as well as they are one of three pairs of teammates along with Boston (Jaylen Brown, Jayson Tatum) Denver (Nikola Jokic, Jamal Murray) to have multiple 25-point halves.

SCORING IN THE FOURTH: Hornets guard Terry Rozier, forward Gordon Hayward and guard Malik Monk have each scored 14+ points in the fourth quarter in at least two games. Rozier has had 15+ points in three fourth quarters this season as he is tied for the most games with 14+ points in the fourth quarter with six; Rozier is one of 14 players with 15+ in three fourth quarters or more. Hornets forward Miles Bridges also had 14 points in the fourth quarter on Dec. 26 vs. Oklahoma City and guard Malik Monk scored 14 points in the final frame on Feb. 1 at Miami. Guard LaMelo Ball had 15 points in the fourth quarter vs. Utah on Feb. 5 while Monk recently totaled 16 fourth quarter points at Denver on Mar. 17. The Hornets are one of seven teams to have at least five players with 14+ points in the fourth quarter while Charlotte is second behind Brooklyn (12) for the most games where a player has had 14+ points in the fourth quarter.

20-POINT QUARTERS: Hornets guard Malik Monk had 20 points in the second quarter at Phoenix on Feb. 24 while guard Terry Rozier has had two 20-point quarters this season, both in the fourth quarter (21, 12/23 at CLE; 20, 2/20 vs. GSW). Charlotte is one of eighth teams this season with two players to have a 20-point quarter along with the Celtics (Jaylen Brown, Evan Fournier, Jayson Tatum), Clippers (Paul George, Kawhi Leonard), Knicks (Julius Randle, Immanuel Quickley), Nuggets (Nikola Jokic, Jamal Murray), Raptors (Paul Watson, Gary Trent Jr.) and Trail Blazers (Damian Lillard, CJ McCollum). The Hornets are also one of seven teams with Boston, Chicago, Denver, Golden State, Portland and Washington with at least three 20-point quarters from a player or players.

HAYWARD'S FIRST HALF HEROICS: On Jan. 16 at Toronto, Hornets forward Gordon Hayward scored 25 points going 7-for-13 from the field and 10-of-10 from the free throw line. Hayward totaled 21 points in the first half alone, which marked the third time this season Hayward had 20+ points in the first half.

The Charlotte Hornets beat the New York Knicks on Jan. 11, 109-88, behind a strong performance from Hayward who scored 34 points going 11-for-17 from the field and 10-for-10 from the free throw line. Hayward scored 28 of his 34 points in the first half, setting a new career-high for points in any half as this was the second time this season he's scored 25+ points in the first half. Since the 1996-97 season, Hayward's 28 first half points are tied for the second most by a Hornets player with Glen Rice (28, 2/19/97 vs. PHO) and behind Kemba Walker who scored 35 points in the first half vs. Memphis on Mar. 22, 2018. Hayward also joins Rice (3 times, 1996-97) and Walker (2 times, 2018-19) as the only two players since the 1996-97 season with multiple games scoring 25+ points in the first half of that respective game.

Hayward is one of 10 players this season along with Bucks forward Giannis Antetokounmpo, Warriors guard Stephen Curry, Sixers center Joel Embiid, Nets guard James Harden, Nuggets center Nikola Jokic, Bulls guard Zach LaVine, Blazers guard Damian Lillard, Celtics forward Jayson Tatum and Hawks guard Trae Young to score 25+ points in the first half in two games and one of 20 players with 25+ points in two games in any half.

MAKING THE MOST OF CHARITY: At Toronto on Jan. 16, Hornets forward Gordon Hayward scored 25 points as he went 10-for-10 from the free throw line, marking the second time this season he's gone perfect from the line in a game with at least 10 attempts. Hayward is one of 15 players in the NBA this season to shoot 1.000% from the line while taking 10 or more attempts in multiple games. Hayward is the first Hornets player with two games or more where the player took at least 10 attempts from the charity stripe and did not miss since Kemba Walker (4, 2017-18). Hayward has made at least 10 free throws in three games this season as he is one of 28 players in the NBA this season to do so. On Jan. 11 vs. New York, Hayward went 10-of-10 from the free throw line, all in the first half, as he is one of 13 players to shoot 1.000% on 10 or more attempts in a single half.

HORNETS THIEVERY: Hornets guard LaMelo Ball had multiple steals in six straight games from Feb. 10 to 24, marking the longest streak by a rookie in franchise history (previous: Kemba Walker, 2/17-3/12; Jeffrey Taylor (11/21-11/28/12) and is one of seven players to have a six-game streak with multiple steals this season and the first Hornets player since Chris Douglas-Roberts during the 2013-14 season (3/5-3/14/14). Ball had at least three steals in three games from Feb. 10 to 14 as he is one of 12 players this season with three steals in three straight games along with Hornets guard Terry Rozier (Mar. 1 to 11) and the only player with such a streak of that length in February. Rozier had a 12-game streak with a steal from Jan. 6 to Jan. 29 for the longest steal streak of his career passing his previous of 11 (1/6-2/2/18) and is one of 16 players with a steal in 12 or more straight games this season. Ball is currently on an 11-game streak with at least one steal while Hayward had a 10-game streak from Dec. 23 to Jan. 9 as the Hornets are one of three teams with three players with at least a 10-game streak along with Minnesota and Memphis.

PJ'S BLOCK PARTY: Hornets forward PJ Washington notched 22 points, seven rebounds and six blocks in Charlotte's win over Atlanta on Jan. 9. Washington is the first Hornets player with 20 points and six blocks since Dwight Howard on Dec. 8, 2017 vs. Chicago and just the seventh player with at least 20 points and six blocks in franchise history. Washington is the first Hornets player to block six-plus shots in a single game since Michael Kidd-Gilchrist on Oct. 20, 2018 at Miami. Washington currently ranks 15th in the NBA in blocks per game this season as he is one of 12 players with six blocks in a game single-game.

THE BUZZ: 2020-21 HORNETS TEAM NOTES

DEFENSIVE PRIDE: The Charlotte Hornets have stepped up defensively in 32 games played after the All-Star break, ranking ninth in opponent points per game at 108.9 and 12th in opponent field goal percentage at .460% and the fourth lowest 3-point shooting percentage over that time at .350%. Since Mar. 24, the Hornets are holding their opponents to 107.8 points per game, which is the eighth fewest in the NBA over that time, while also ranking 12th in defensive rating over that time at 111.4 points per 100 possessions. Over that same period, Charlotte is holding their opponents to .452% from the field, the fourth lowest opponent field goal percentage and are 11th in opponent 3-point shooting percentage at .354%. The Hornets are contesting 53.1 shots per game over their last 25 contests since Mar. 24 as they are also contesting 24.0 3-point field goals per game over that time, ranking 11th and third in the Association respectively.

The Hornets beat Detroit, 102-99, on May 4 as Charlotte is now 10-0 this season when holding their opponent to less than 100 points as they are one of eight teams this season with 10 or more wins and no losses when the opposition scores below the 100-point threshold. In their win over Detroit on May 1, Charlotte limited the Pistons to 35 field goals on 91 tries for .385% shooting and just 94 points, including just 42 first half points. Charlotte is 10-1 this season when holding their opponent below .400% from the field and 8-2 when their opponent makes 35 field goals or less. Charlotte is 10-4 when their opponent scores 45 points or fewer in a half, including 4-0 in the first half after the Hornets held the Pistons to 42 points in the first half. Charlotte's 11 games where they have held their opponent to less than .400% from the floor is tied for the sixth most in the NBA this season.

STRONG ON THE GLASS: The Charlotte Hornets beat the Orlando Magic, 122-112, on May 7 after totaling 51 rebounds, including 11 offensive rebounds for 23 points second chance points. Charlotte also had 27 second-chance points on May 4 vs. Detroit, the most second chance points Charlotte has scored in a game since totaling 27 points off second chance opportunities on Mar. 13, 2015 in a win vs. Chicago. This season, Charlotte is 12-2 when grabbing 50+ rebounds in a game as this was the 20th time this season where the Hornets have scored 15+ points off second chance opportunities. The Hornets are 12-8 in those instances as well as 3-1 when notching at least 20 second chance points and have won their last five games when collecting at least 50 boards and have also been victorious in their last four outings where they scored 15+ second chance points.

THE HORNETS ARTISTRY: The Charlotte Hornets score a season-high 68 points in the paint in a 122-112 win over the Orlando Magic on May 7, their sixth game of the season with 60+ points in the paint as the Hornets are 4-2 in those games. This marked the most points in the paint in a game for Charlotte since Nov. 30, 2018 when the Hornets scored 70 points in the paint vs. Utah as this is just the 14th time in franchise history the team has had 65+ points in the paint while Hornets are 12-13 this season when scoring 50 or more points in the paint.

THE BUZZ: 2020-21 HORNETS TEAM NOTES

DISHING OUT TO SHOOTERS: The Hornets defeated the Boston Celtics, 125-104, on Apr. 25 as they recorded season-highs with 39 assists and 21 made 3s for the fourth game this season with 20 3s and 30 assists or more as Charlotte is 4-0 in those instances and tied for the fourth most such games with Brooklyn and Phoenix. This marked the most assists in a game by the Hornets since Feb. 11, 2014 vs. Dallas when the team set the franchise record for assists in a game with 42 assists as this was just the fifth time over the last 25 seasons where the Hornets had 39 assists or more in a game.

The Hornets are also now 5-0 when making 20+ 3s and have as many games with 20 or more 3s this season as they did in franchise history prior to the 2020-21 season. Charlotte has 30+ assists and 15+ 3s in 11 games this season and have a record of 10-1 in those instances, which is the fourth most such wins in the Association this season. The team is tied for third in the NBA for the most games totaling 30 or more assists and 15 or more treys with Phoenix (11) while only trailing Brooklyn (18), Golden State (18) and Milwaukee (13). Charlotte passed the 2018-19 Hornets squad for the most games with 15 makes and 30 assists in a season in franchise history as the Hornets have made 15+ 3-pointers in 27 games, tied for the eighth most this season, and are 17-10 in those instances.

SOLID IN THE CLUTCH: The Charlotte Hornets are one of the better teams this season in the clutch category, which is when the point-differential in the last five minutes of a game is five points or less as they are 18-9 (.667) in qualified games, ranking tied for third in clutch win percentage and tied for the sixth in the most wins in crunch time. In those games that Charlotte has qualified for the clutch statistic, the Hornets are 10th in points (9.2) per game, first in the NBA in offensive rating at 133.2 points per 100 possessions and fourth in defensive rating at 100.0 points per 100 possessions. Charlotte's 33.2 clutch net rating leads the NBA as the Hornets are have the second best +/- at 2.7. Charlotte is first in field goal percentage (.513%), second in 3-point shooting percentage (.442%), tied for fourth in assists (1.7) per game and fourth in assist percentage (.595%) in crunch time. Last season, the Hornets were second in clutch offensive rating (120.8), 16th in defensive rating (110.1) and fifth in net rating (10.7); the Thunder led the NBA in 2019-20 in offensive rating at 121.9 and net rating at 24.4 with Milwaukee leading in defensive rating at 94.5.

Charlotte is first in the NBA in opponent points per game in clutch situations, allowing just 6.5 points per game as the Hornets, Utah (6.7) LA Clippers (6.8) are the only teams allowing less than 7.0 points per game in crunch time. The Hornets are also holding their opposition to the third lowest field goal percentage in those situations at .392%.

ON THE CATCH-AND-SHOOT: The Charlotte Hornets have been solid this season on catch-and-shoot plays, averaging 31.6 points per game off catch-and-shoot opportunities, which is the ninth most points per game in the league while shooting .394% from the floor, ranking 11th. Charlotte is tied for sixth in the NBA this season in 3-point field goals made off catch-and-shoot tries, averaging 10.1 catch-and-shoot 3s per outing and knocking down .396% of their catch-and-shoot 3-point attempts, the eighth best percentage among league leaders this year. In games played after the All-Star break, the Hornets are sixth in points per game off catch-and-shoot opportunities at 32.3 points per contest and are tied for the third most catch-and-shoot 3s per game at 10.4 per outing.

QUICK STARTS LEADING TO VICTORY: The Charlotte Hornets have been able to pull out wins when getting off to a strong start in the first half as they are 11-0 this season when outscoring their opponent by 10 or more points this season after scoring 56 points in the first half vs. Detroit while the Pistons scored just 42 points. The Hornets are also 9-2 this season when outscoring their opponent by 10 or more points in the second half after totaling 62 points compared to the Celtics 52 points in the second half of their game on Apr. 25 and are 19-2 overall this season when notching 10 or more points than their opponent in a half.

Charlotte is also 23-11 overall this season when scoring 60+ points in a half after their game vs. Orlando on May 7, including 18-6 when doing so in the first half and 10-5 when scoring 60 or more points in the second half after posting 60 first half points and 62 second half points against the Magic. The Hornets had 100 points through three quarters vs. the Celtics, their third game of the season with 100+ points in three quarters, which is the most games since the 2018-19 season when Charlotte also had three games where they had 100 or more points in three quarters. Charlotte has won its last 13 games overall when scoring 100+ points in just three quarters.

CARING FOR THE BALL: The Charlotte Hornets beat the Cleveland Cavaliers, 108-102, on Apr. 23 and had just five turnovers in the contest, marking the first time the Hornets had five turnovers or fewer since having just three turnovers at Atlanta on Mar. 9, 2020. The Hornets also had just eight turnovers at Detroit on May 4 marking the ninth time this season where the Hornets had 10 or fewer turnovers as Charlotte is now 8-1 on the year when recording 10 turnovers or less in a game.

COACH BORREGO PICKS UP CAREER WIN NO. 100: Charlotte Hornets Head Coach James Borrego nabbed the 100th victory of his career vs. Portland on Apr. 18 and now has 90 wins as the Head Coach of the Hornets. Borrego is fifth in franchise history in wins as a head coach after he picked up his 89th victory on Apr. 9 at Milwaukee with the Hornets to pass Larry Brown (88) as he is the 143rd head coach in NBA history to achieve 100+ career wins.

DRIVING TO THE HOOP: The Charlotte Hornets are tied for ninth in the NBA this season in drives per game, averaging 51.1 drives per contest and scoring 25.8 points per game off drives. Charlotte is seventh in passes per game off drives at 21.1 passes per outing while ranking sixth in pass percentage at .414%.

Charlotte is also one of the top teams in the NBA in paint touches, recording 23.6 paint touches (8th) per game and dishing out 1.3 assists (2nd) on 6.9 passes made (T-2nd) per contest, passing on .294% of their paint touches, which ranks first in the league. The Hornets also are tied for first in assist percentage off paint touches, assisting on .056% of their field goals off touches in the paint.

DISHING IT OUT: The Charlotte Hornets beat the Miami Heat on Mar. 26, 110-105, recording 30 assists as they had a streak of 13 straight games with 25 or more assists. This marked the fourth longest streak with 25+ assists by a team this season as the Hornets streak began on Feb. 26 with Charlotte averaging 27.8 assists per game over that span. In franchise history, this also marks the second longest single season streak with 25 assists as the franchise record is 19 straight 25-assist games, which took place from Mar. 17 to Apr. 23, 1989.

Charlotte has 18 games with 30 or more assists, tied for the fourth most this season as Charlotte is 13-5 in those games, which is tied for the fifth most in franchise history with the 1994-95 Hornets who also had 18 games that season with 30+ assists. The Hornets have totaled 25 or more assists in 48 games this season, tied for the third most games with 25+ assists this season, and the sixth most in franchise history, eclipsing the '94-95 team who had 25+ assists in 46 games that season.

SUCCESS ON THE ROAD: The Charlotte Hornets beat the Milwaukee Bucks, 127-119, on Apr. 9 as the Hornets went 4-2 on the six-game road trip marking the first time the team has had won four games on a single road trip since the 2015-16 season when Charlotte went 4-2 on a road trip from Feb. 10-28, 2016. The Hornets finished the night with 19 made 3s and season-highs of 35 assists and 10 blocks, the third time this season Charlotte recorded 35 assists in a game as the team averaged 107.2 points, 45.0 rebounds, 26.3 assists and 8.7 steals per game during their six-game trip.

RANKING HIGH OFFENSIVELY: The Charlotte Hornets are among the top 10 in many offensive categories this season, including third in the League in assists (26.9) per game as the team has dished out at least 30 assists in 18 games this season. The Hornets are second in assist percentage at .673%, fourth in assist ratio at 19.3 and second in assists points created (70.2) while first in passes made (317.3), tied for fourth in potential assists (48.9) and sixth in secondary assists (3.7) per game. Charlotte's also eighth in 3s per game (13.8), eighth in total 3-pointers made (925) and ninth in 3-point field goal percentage (.376%).

The Charlotte Hornets are one of the best teams this season in regard to scoring in transition and playing up-tempo as the Hornets have totaled 1,579 transition points, averaging 23.6 transition points per game and 1.14 points per possession. Charlotte ranks fifth in total points, third in points per game while ranking tied for fifth in points per possession in transition in the NBA. The Hornets are sixth in field goal percentage (.553%) and second in effective field goal percentage (.638%) in transition. Charlotte is 10th in total fast-break points with 924 and 10th in fast-break points per game at 13.8, which is .126% of the Hornets total points, ranking fourth in the Association in percentage of their total points coming off the fast-break.

Hornets guard Terry Rozier has been an integral part of the team's success in transition and on the fast-break as Rozier is fourth in total points in transition with 338 and sixth in the Association in transition points per game at 5.3. Rozier is averaging 3.5 fast-break points per game, ranking tied for fourth in the NBA, and has totaled 221 fast-break points this season, the second most by a player this season.

GETTING IT DONE ON THE DEFENSIVE END: During the 2020-21 season, the Hornets have been one of the better defensive teams in the NBA as the Hornets are 12th in opponent points (111.1) per game and contesting 23.8 opponent 3-point field goal attempts per game, sixth in the NBA, and 10th in deflections at 15.2 per contest. Charlotte's forcing 14.7 turnovers, which ranks 10th this season, and averaging 17.9 points per game off opponent turnovers, which ranks tied for ninth in the NBA this season as the Hornets also rank sixth in percentage of total points off turnovers at .163%.

Charlotte is only averaging 18.1 fouls per game, which is fourth in the NBA this season as opponents are only averaging 14.3 free throws made and 19.2 free throws attempts per game, ranking first and fourth in the NBA respectively. The Hornets are working hard and running around on the defensive end as Charlotte is third in the league in distance traveled of miles traveled on defense per game at 8.52 and 11th in steals per game, averaging 7.9 steals per contest.

MARCHING ALONG: The Charlotte Hornets were victorious over the Washington Wizards, 114-104, marking their fourth win in five games as well as a third straight road win, a season-long streak. The Hornets also beat the Miami Heat, 110-105, in their second wire-to-wire win of the season as Charlotte had won three straight games from Mar. 22 to 26, including five wins in a row at home. This marked the longest home win-streak by the Hornets since the 2018-19 season when Charlotte won five straight games from Jan. 17 to Feb. 2, 2019.

In March, the Hornets were 8-5 (.615), as they averaged 110.5 points, 44.8 rebounds, 26.5 assists, 8.0 steals and 14.5 3s per game, which ranked sixth in assists, tied for eighth in steals, eighth in 3-pointers made and third in 3-point shooting percentage (.392%) in March. During their three-game win-streak, the Hornets averaged 110.7 points, 28.0 assists and 16.0 3-pointers made per game, ranking second in assists and sixth in 3s per game and shooting .475% from the field (9th) and .425% from 3-point range (3rd). Charlotte was third in opponent points per game over that time, holding opponents to 99.7 points per game while holding opposing teams to .434% from the field (6th) and .339% from beyond the arc (6th).

THE BUZZ: 2020-21 HORNETS TEAM NOTES

SEASON'S BEST STREAK: The Charlotte Hornets beat the Sacramento Kings, 122-116, on Mar. 15 at home despite being down for the entire game up until an and-one dunk by forward Gordon Hayward with 1:33 remaining in regulation that put the score at 112-111 as the Hornets held on for the victory. Charlotte went on a season-long tying four game win-streak from Mar. 3 to Mar. 15 and are still on a season-long home winning streak of four games that began on Feb. 20. This marked the longest home winning streak for the Hornets the 2018-19 season when Charlotte won four straight home game from Mar. 21 to Apr. 5, 2019.

WELCOMING FANS BACK WITH A BANG: The Charlotte Hornets welcomed back fans to Spectrum Center with a strong start vs. Toronto on Mar. 13, scoring 44 points in the first quarter, which included 11 makes from beyond the arc, tying the NBA record for 3s in a quarter as they were the third team to do that this season and one of four overall on the year along with Houston, Utah and Atlanta as 44 points was a season-best for a quarter. Charlotte also set the franchise record for 3-pointers in a half with 16 in the first half as the Hornets beat Toronto, 114-104, in their first wire-to-wire win of the season.

Charlotte finished with 30 assists and 21 3-point field goals marking the fourth time this season the team has had 20+ 3s. According to Elias Sports Bureau, the last team with 16 made 3s in a half was Indiana on Feb. 5 of this season vs. New Orleans.

TOP TEAM PERFORMANCE OF THE SEASON: The Charlotte Hornets beat the Minnesota Timberwolves, 135-102, on Mar. 3 to sweep the season series while setting some season-highs along the way. Charlotte set a season-high with 135 points as they shot 51-for-98 from the field, also setting a season-high in field goals made. The Hornets also scored 73 points in the second half at Minnesota, setting a season-high for points scored in a half and led by as many as 38 points in the game, also a season-best for largest lead in a contest.

The last time Charlotte scored 135 points or more was on Mar. 9, 2020 in double overtime at Atlanta as the previous time the Hornets scored 135+ points in regulation was on Jan. 19 2019 in a win vs. Phoenix. This was the first time the Hornets had won by 33+ points since Apr. 6, 2018 when Charlotte defeated Orlando by 37, 137-100.

KNOCKING IT DOWN FROM DISTANCE: The Charlotte Hornets made 21 3-point field goals for the fourth time on Mar. 13 this season as the Hornets also had 13 3s at Brooklyn on Apr. 1 and had 10 or more makes from beyond the arc in 32 straight games from Jan. 24 to Apr. 1, which is the longest streak in franchise history (previous: 14, 1/8-2/15/2019). The Hornets are just the sixth franchise in NBA history with a 30-game streak or better with 10+ made 3s and one of three teams this season with 30 consecutive games with 10 makes from 3-point range as this marks the seventh longest streak in NBA history.

DON'T COUNT EM' OUT: The Charlotte Hornets pulled off yet another come from behind victory, after being down by five, 123-118, with 52.4 seconds left in the game at Sacramento on Feb. 28, the Hornets ended on a 9-3 run for 127-126 win. Guard Malik Monk made a layup with 1.4 ticks on the clock and was fouled and converted his free throw, which gave the Hornets the win. According to Elias Sports Bureau, this marks the third win this season for the Hornets when trailing by five or more points with a minute or less to play in regulation or overtime as all of those wins have been in February (Feb. 1 at MIA, Feb. 20 vs. GSW, Feb. 28 at SAC). The last team with three such wins in a season was the Portland Trail Blazers during the 2014-15 season. Since the 1997-98 season, only the 2000-01 Hornets saw two such wins in the same season, on Jan. 9 vs. Chicago and Feb. 24 vs. Philadelphia.

SCORING OFF MISTAKES: The Charlotte Hornets have been great at forcing turnovers all season and turning it into points as the Hornets forced 15 or more turnovers in 12 of 14 games from Jan. 14 to Feb. 10, while scoring 15 or more points off those turnovers in 12 straight games from Jan. 12 to Feb. 7 and in 13 of 14 games from Jan. 14 to Feb. 10. The 15 points off turnovers streak is tied for the third longest streak this season with Toronto as the Hornets also scored 20+ points off turnovers in four straight games from Jan. 30 to Feb. 5. Four games in a row with 20+ points off turnovers is tied for the seventh best streak this season with multiple teams. The Hornets are tied for fourth in the NBA in games where opposing players have turned the ball over 15+ times as the Hornets have done so in 32 games. Charlotte ranks tied for ninth in the NBA in points off turnovers at 17.9 per game and 10th in opponent turnovers per game at 14.7.

Charlotte also tied their season-high against Milwaukee on Jan. 30 with 27 points off turnovers, their third game with 27+ points scored off opponent turnovers. The Hornets also scored 30 points off 25 turnovers at Golden State, marking the most turnovers for an opponent this season, and 27 points off of Minnesota's turnovers on Mar. 3 as the Hornets have 10 games with 25+ points off opponent turnovers, which is tied for third most by a team this season with Indiana, Los Angeles and Washington and only behind Memphis (12), Toronto (12) and Philadelphia (11).

A STRONG SHOWING AT HOME: The Charlotte Hornets beat the Minnesota Timberwolves on Feb. 12, 120-114 as Charlotte had scored 110 points in nine straight games since Jan. 30 to Feb. 14, which is a new franchise long streak and tied for the 10th longest in the NBA this season.

Charlotte beat the Houston Rockets, 119-94, on Feb. 8 as the 25-point win marks their largest of the season as Charlotte also won by 22 points over Washington on Feb. 7. The last time Charlotte won consecutive games in a row by 20+ points was during the 2016-17 season when they beat Portland by 22 on Jan. 18 and Toronto by 35 on Jan. 20, 2017. The Hornets held opponents to less than 100 points in straight games for the first time this season and the first time since 2019-20 when they held their Toronto to 96 points on Feb. 28 and Milwaukee to 93 points on Mar. 1, 2020. Charlotte held the Rockets to seven points, two field goals and one assist on .105% shooting in the fourth quarter, which are all season lows by an opponent in a quarter this season. This was the fifth time in franchise history the Hornets have held an opponent to seven points or fewer in a quarter and the first time since Nov. 25, 2015 when they held Washington to six points in the fourth quarter. Charlotte's tied with New Orleans for the fewest points given up in a quarter, which the Pelicans also did in the fourth quarter at Oklahoma City. The 29-point lead the Hornets held vs. Washington ties their largest lead at any point in a game this season while the Hornets scored 100+ points in three quarters for the first time this season and first time since Feb. 9, 2019 at Atlanta. Charlotte had 59 rebounds vs. Washington and 51 vs. Houston as the last time Charlotte had more rebounds in a single-game was on Dec. 13, 2019 at Chicago when the Hornets recorded 60 rebounds.

SEASON-HIGHS ON THE WAY TO A WINNING STREAK: The Charlotte Hornets picked up three straight wins, including consecutive wins at home, which marked the second time this season the team had won three games in a row and two straight at home from Jan. 29 to Feb. 1 with wins over Miami (2/1), Milwaukee (1/30) and Indiana (1/29). The Hornets scored a season-high, 129 points at Miami and a then season-high 126 points, including a season-best 62 bench points vs. Milwaukee. This was the fourth time in franchise history the team has had 125+ points in consecutive games as the last time the Hornets had 125 or more points in straight games was from Dec. 29 to Dec. 31, 2018. The Hornets had a season-high 21 3-point field goals in consecutive games against the Heat and Bucks to go along with 31 assists and 32 assists in those games respectively. Charlotte is one of eight teams in NBA history to make 20 3-point field goals and record 30 assists in consecutive games along with Phoenix (2/19-2/20), Milwaukee (2/1-2/3/21), Houston (1/30-2/1/21), Dallas (1/20-11/22/19), Atlanta (3/1-3/3/19), Golden State (1/15-1/16/19) and Cleveland (1/23-1/25/16) as this is the first time franchise history the Hornets made 20 3s in straight games with this being the seventh game in franchise history with 20+ 3-pointers.

In their victory over Indiana, Charlotte tied their season-high with 35 assists and tied their then season-high 3-point field goals made with 16 as the Hornets are the only team this season with 30 assists and 15 3s in three straight games; this was the first time the Hornets accomplished the feat in franchise history. This was the seventh time in NBA history a team has had 30 assists and 15 3-point field goals made in three straight games. The Warriors have completed the feat twice this year (3, 1/30-2/4; 2/15-2/19) for the eighth and ninth time and as the seventh team while the Memphis Grizzlies are the eighth team (3, 4/4-4/7; 4/16-4/19), and have also done it twice this season, marking the 10th and 11th times it's been done in NBA history. Minnesota has also completed the feat this season (3: 4/29-5/5). The most recent team prior to this season was Toronto (1/12-1/17/20) as the Raptors have done it twice while Houston, Brooklyn, Utah and Phoenix are also among the list. The Hornets had five games with 30 assists and 15 3-pointers through their first 20 games this season, which tied for the third most through a team's first 20 games in NBA history with four others teams and only trails Golden State (7, 2015-16) and Phoenix (6, 2019-20).

This is the second time in franchise history the team has had three consecutive games with 15 made 3s as the only other time was from Feb. 23 to Feb. 27, 2018. Charlotte is tied for the fifth most 30-assist games (16) this season and were the second team this season along with Philadelphia with 30+ assists in at least three games in a row with nine teams overall to do it this season along with the Sixers, Golden State, Memphis, Miami, Chicago, Minnesota and the LA Clippers. This was the ninth time in franchise history the team had a three-game 30-assist streak and the first time since a four-game streak from Feb. 12 to Feb. 19, 1997.

ANOTHER COMEBACK WIN: The Charlotte Hornets beat the Miami Heat, 129-121, on Feb. 2 despite being down by 10 points with 3:11 left in the quarter. Since tracking began during the 1996-97 season, this is the first time the Hornets have been able to overcome a 10-point deficit with three minutes and 15 seconds or less left in the fourth quarter. The Hornets are one of four teams to come from behind when down by 10 points or less in 3:15 or less this season along with Orlando (1/20 @ MIN) and Oklahoma City (1/15 vs. CHI). Charlotte outscored Miami 28-10 over the final three minutes of regulation as well as the five-minute overtime period.

The Hornets received a huge boost from guard Malik Monk who set career-highs with 36 points, 11 made field goals and nine made 3-point field goals, including a game-tying shot from beyond the arc with 16.6 seconds in the game. Monk has the third most points scored by a player off the bench this season. Monk passed the previous record of most points scored by a Hornets bench player set by Devonte' Graham (35) on Nov. 5, 2019 as he also now holds the record for most 3s made by a reserve in team history passing Troy Daniels (8, 1/25/16) and Ben Gordon (8, 12/3/12). Monk is just the fifth player in franchise history with nine or more made 3s in a game.

SNAPPED THE LOSING STREAK IN STYLE: The Charlotte Hornets snapped a four-game losing streak with a come from behind victory over the Orlando Magic, 107-104, on Jan. 24. The Hornets trailed Orlando by 12 going into the final quarter of regulation before opening the fourth on a 28-7 run to lead by nine with 2:20 left in the game. Orlando would go on to hit a late 3-pointer to tie the game at 104 before Gordon Hayward made a game-winning layup with 0.7 seconds left on the clock to put the Hornets ahead and secure the win.

This marked the 11th time in franchise history the Hornets won a game after trailing by 12 or more points going into the final quarter. It was the first time in regulation since Mar. 21, 2018 at Brooklyn when Charlotte was down by 12 going into the fourth and won, 111-105. Only nine other teams have come back to win this season when down by 12+ points through three quarters, including Minnesota (down 15 vs. HOU, 3/26), San Antonio (down 13 at CHI, 2/17), Portland (down 13 vs. NOP, 3/16), Atlanta (down 12 at ORL, 3/3; down 14 vs. DET, 1/20) New Orleans (down 13 vs. BOS, 2/21), Brooklyn (down 12 at PHX, 2/16), Philadelphia (down 13 at IND, 1/31), Orlando (down 17 at WAS, 12/27) and Boston (down 13 vs. SAS, 4/30).

DEFENDING THE BASKET EARLY: In the Hornets win at Atlanta on Jan. 6, Charlotte scored 112 points and allowed just 94 points to the Hawks. Charlotte was stingy on the defensive end in the first quarter, giving up only 11 points on 5-of-22 shooting to the Hawks in the first 12 minutes of the game. With the Hornets allowing the Hawks to score only 11 first quarter points, this is tied for the lowest points allowed in a first quarter by any team all season. In franchise history, this is just the ninth time where the Hornets held their opponent to 11 points or less in the opening quarter of a game with the last time being on Feb. 10, 2020 at Detroit. Against Atlanta, 11 points is the fewest the Hornets have given up in any quarter in all games played against one another in team history with the previous low being 13 points; all those games came on Atlanta's home court as well (Apr. 14, 2014, Oct. 31, 2000, Mar. 25, 2000).

"The last pillar we've always talked about are winning habits and that really comes back to consistency. Being more professional on a day-to-day basis, not taking a day off, not expecting the coach to have the answer for you, you go figure it out. This is what I'm talking about, building a culture of that where guys take ownership of this team, they lead this team and I expect that to continue this season.
