Hornets C Marques Bolden played seven games across two seasons (2019-21) with the Cavaliers... Hornets G Seth Curry played one game for the Cavaliers in the 2013-14 campaign... Hornets assistant coach Tyrone Corbin played two seasons for Cleveland (1986-88), and he was teammates with Hornets television analyst Dell Curry for the 1987-88 campaign... Cavaliers head coach J.B. Bickerstaff was an assistant with the Hornets for three seasons (2004-07)... Cavaliers assistant coach Sidney Lowe played one season (1988-89) for the Hornets and was teammates with Hornets television analyst Dell Curry during this time... Lowe won the national championship in 1983 as the starting point guard for NC State... Hornets F Leaky Black and Cavaliers F Pete Nance were teammates at North Carolina for one season (2022-23)... Hornets F Brandon Miller (Antioch, TN) and Cavaliers G Darius Garland (Brentwood, TN) grew up 15 minutes away from each other and workout together in the offseason.

Charlotte - Brandon Miller poured in 31 points and a career-high seven 3s, tying the Hornets single-game rookie record, to lead the Hornets to a 118-111 win over the Cavaliers at Spectrum Center. Charlotte shot a then-season-high 57.9 percent from the field and converted 17-of-22 free throw attempts compared to Cleveland's 8-of-14 mark from the stripe. Vasa Micic (11 points, 12 assists) and Nick Richards (11 points, 10 rebounds) each notched double-doubles, and Miles Bridges and Tre Mann each added 17 points, with Mann contributing eight assists as well. Grant Williams posted 16 points, seven rebounds and five assists off the bench. Jarrett Allen led the Cavaliers with 24 points, and Darius Garland recorded 14 points and 12 assists.

THE BUZZ: HORNETS PLAYER NOTES

Amari Bailey

- Made his NBA debut and scored his first NBA points at New York (Nov. 12).
- Selected in the second round (41st overall) of the 2023 NBA Draft by the Charlotte Hornets and signed a two-way contract with the team on July 14, 2023.
- Averaged 11.2 points, 3.8 rebounds, 2.2 assists and 1.1 steals in 26.9 minutes per game across 30 appearances (28 starts) in his lone collegiate season at UCLA in 2022-23.

LaMelo Ball

- Recorded 18 points and a season-high-tying 13 assists in a win at Minnesota (Jan. 22).
- Posted 28 points on 10-of-13 shooting, including 4-of-6 from 3, eight assists and three steals in a win vs. San Antonio (Jan. 19). His 76.9 FG% is his second-highest in any game of his career (.800, 8-10, vs. Milwaukee, Jan. 30, 2021).
- Netted 29 points, five rebounds and seven assists at New Orleans (Jan. 17).
- Recorded 21 points, a season-high-tying 10 rebounds and five assists at Miami (Jan. 14). It marked his 14th 20-10-5 game of his career, the third-most in franchise history.
- Set new career highs with 15 free throws made and 16 free throws attempted, in addition to swiping a career-best-tying five steals, at San Antonio (Jan. 12), becoming the second player in franchise history to notch 15 free throws made and five steals in a game (Eddie Jones). He finished with 28 points and passed Glen Rice (508 3-pointers) for sixth on Charlotte's all-time list.
- Averaged 33.8 points per game in five contests from Nov. 14-22, his highest scoring average in any five-game span of his career.
- Recorded at least 25 points, five rebounds and five assists in seven straight games from Nov. 10-22, the longest streak in franchise history. The longest previous streak was three (Ball, Larry Johnson, Kemba Walker (2x) and Gerald Wallace). Ball is one of two players in NBA history to record seven straight games with at least 25-5-5, one steal and multiple 3-pointers (James Harden, seven games, Dec. 29, 2018 - Jan. 11, 2019).
- Swiped a steal in each of Charlotte's first 14 games of the season, becoming the third Hornet ever to do so. He joins Gerald Wallace (19) and Brevin Knight (14). Ball's 14-game streak is his longest at any point in his career.
- Scored 25-plus points in nine straight games from Nov. 5-22, the longest streak of his career and the second-longest in franchise history. Only Glen Rice (13, Dec. 30, 1996 - Jan. 24, 1997) has recorded a longer such streak.
- Tallied 30-plus points in four straight games from Nov. 17-22, the longest streak of his career and tied for the third-longest in franchise history behind only Kemba Walker (five, Feb. 2-11, 2019) and Glen Rice (five, Jan. 15-24, 1997).
- Posted 34 points, six 3-pointers and a season-high-tying 13 assists in a win vs. Washington (Nov. 22). It marked his fourth career 30-point, 10-assist game, tying Kemba Walker for the most such games in franchise history.
- Became the second-fastest (175 games) and the third-youngest (22y-090d) player in NBA history to reach 500 career 3-pointers (Nov. 20). - Passed Emeka Okafor (1,105) for the fourth-most points by a rookie in franchise history (vs. Golden State, March 29).
- Erupted for 31 points and a career-high seven 3-pointers, tying D.J. Augustin, LaMelo Ball and P.J. Washington Jr. for the most 3s in a game by a rookie in franchise history, in a win vs. Cleveland (March 27). He became the 20th rookie in NBA history to notch 30 points, seven 3s, 55.0 FG% and 50.0 3P% in a game. Free Points

- As of April 14, the Hornets have shot 100 percent from the free-throw line in seven games this season (min. five free throws attempted), the most in a single season by any team in NBA history.

Road Dogs

- Charlotte's win at Atlanta (April 10) marked the fifth time in franchise history and the second time this season the Hornets have won a road game after trailing by 15-plus points entering the fourth quarter. The Hornets also trailed by 15 in their win at Minnesota (Jan. 22)

Sharing the Wealth

- Eight Hornets scored at least 10 points vs. Oklahoma City (April 7), their first game with eight double-figure scorers since Jan. 19, 2019.

Wire-to-Wire

- The Hornets never trailed in their 124-115 win vs. Orlando (April 5), their first wire-to-wire win of the season. Charlotte shot a season-high 59.7 percent from the field, 50.0 percent from 3 and 100 percent from the free-throw line, marking the first time in franchise history with 55/50/100 shooting splits in a game. The Hornets went 23-for-23 from the charity stripe, tying for the second-most makes without a miss in franchise history (24-for-24, Jan. 19, 1994). Charlotte also shot 23-for-23 in a 125-124 win at Indiana on Nov. 4.

Bombs Away

- The Hornets matched their season best with 23 3-pointers made and set a new season high with 52 3-pointers attempted vs. LA (March 31). Miles Bridges (career-high seven 3s), Brandon Miller (five 3s) and Davis Bertans (season-high five 3s) became the third trio of Hornets to make at least five triples in the same game, joining Devonte' Graham, P.J. Washington Jr. and Marvin Williams in 2019 and LaMelo Ball, Terry Rozier and Washington Jr. in 2023.

Efficiency at Both Ends

- The Hornets shot a season-high 57.9 percent (44-of-76) from the field in a win vs. Cleveland (March 27). They limited the Cavaliers to 15 points in the fourth quarter, matching a season low by a Charlotte foe in any quarter this season (15, 4Q vs. Phoenix, March 15). For the game, Charlotte allowed 32 total rebounds and 23 defensive rebounds, both of which tie season lows.

Peterson to Lead Basketball Operations

- The Hornets hired Jeff Peterson as the organization's Executive Vice President of Basketball Operations on March 5. Peterson joins the team after four seasons as assistant general manager for the Brooklyn Nets. He also spent seven years with the Atlanta Hawks and served as an assistant general manager for the final three seasons.

Trending Up

- From Feb. 10-26, the Hornets were tied for second in the NBA in W% (.833), sixth in net rating (7.4), first in defensive rating (100.3), third in SPG (9.3), second in opponent FG% (.429), second in opponent turnovers (16.0), second in opponent 3-pointers (9.7), first in opponent 3-point percentage (.258), fourth in opponent free throw attempts (16.2) and first in opponent points (98.5).

Defensive Domination

- In their 93-80 win at Portland (Feb. 25), the Hornets limited the Blazers to 80 points, 34.7 FG%, 33 field goals, 9.6 3P%, three 3-pointers and 14 assists, all of which represent season lows for a Charlotte foe. It marked the Hornets' largest road win of the year (13 points).

Snapping Streaks

- The Hornets defeated the Jazz, 115-107, at Delta Center on Feb. 22 to claim their first win in Salt Lake City since March 1, 2006.
- Charlotte earned a 93-80 road win against the Blazers on Feb. 25 for its first win in Portland since March 29, 2008.

Building Momentum

- The Hornets won four games in a row from Feb. 10-22, their longest win streak of the season. Charlotte earned its three largest margins of victory of the season during this stretch (nine, nine, 23), and its largest margin of victory on the road (eight).
- In that span, the Hornets ranked fifth in the NBA in net rating (11.3). Offensively, the Hornets ranked third in 3-pointers made (15.3), fourth in 3P% (.424), fifth in eFG% (.596) and fifth in TS% (.620). Defensively, Charlotte ranked fifth in defensive rating (105.3), tied for fourth in defensive rebounds per game (35.8) and tied for fifth in opponent fastbreak points (10.5).

Controlling the Boards

- The Hornets snared a season-high 41 defensive rebounds while allowing a season-low-tying 32 total rebounds (matching their mark from the previous game vs. Memphis), a season-low two offensive rebounds and a season-low-tying two second chance points in their win vs. Indiana (Feb. 12). It is the second time in franchise history the Hornets have grabbed 40-plus defensive rebounds while allowing two or fewer offensive rebounds (44 DREB, 2 OREB vs. Orlando, March 16, 2016).
- The Hornets shot 65.0 percent (26-of-40) from the field in the second half, their highest percentage in any half this season. The Hornets shot 85.2 percent (23-of-27) on 2-pointers in the second half, their best 2-point percentage in any half since at least 1997-98 (Elias).

New Look Hornets

- The Hornets shot a season-high 57.3 percent (47-of-82) from the field, including 51.6 percent (16-of-31) from 3-point range, in a win vs. Memphis (Feb. 10), their first game with a retooled roster following the trade deadline. Charlotte also set season bests in fouls committed (nine), free throw attempts allowed (eight), total rebounds allowed (32) and defensive rebounds allowed (23).

Trade Deadline Activity

- The Hornets acquired Davis Bertans, Tre Mann, Vasa Micic, a 2024 second-round pick via Houston and a 2025 second-round pick via Philadelphia from the Oklahoma City Thunder in exchange for Gordon Hayward (Feb. 8).
- Charlotte acquired Seth Curry, Grant Williams and a 2027 first-round pick (top-two protected) from the Dallas Mavericks in exchange for P.J. Washington Jr., a 2024 second-round pick via Boston and a 2028 second-round pick (least favorable between Charlotte and L.A. Clippers) (Feb. 8).
- The Hornets waived James Bouknight, Frank Ntilikina and Ish Smith (Feb. 8).

End of an Era

- The Hornets traded guard Terry Rozier to the Miami Heat in exchange for Kyle Lowry and a 2027 first-round pick (Jan. 23).

History in Minnesota

- The Hornets defeated the West-leading Timberwolves in Minnesota on Jan. 22 despite 62 points from Karl-Anthony Towns, which tied Carmelo Anthony for the most ever scored against Charlotte. The Hornets overcame an 18-point deficit entering the fourth quarter, marking their largest come-from-behind road win this season. Charlotte shot a season-high 56.8 percent from the field and made a season-high-tying 50 field goals, and it allowed just 18 points and six field goals in the fourth quarter, both of which equaled its season best.

Fearsome Foursome

- LaMelo Ball (28 points), Brandon Miller (24), Miles Bridges (23) and P.J. Washington Jr. (20) all recorded 20-point games in Charlotte's win vs. San Antonio (Jan. 19), marking the second time this season four Hornets have scored 20-plus points in the same game. Gordon Hayward (24), Bridges (22), Terry Rozier (21) and Miller (20) did so in a win vs. Toronto (Dec. 8). The Hornets became the second team this season with four players recording 20 points, two 3s, 50 FG% and 50 3P% in the same game (Boston - Jrue Holiday, Kristaps Porzingis, Payton Pritchard and Derrick White). Hum Diddly Dee

- Bally Sports play-by-play announcer Eric Collins was named the 2023 North Carolina Sportscaster of the Year by the National Sports Media Association, his first NSMA award, on Jan. 17.

Swarming Defense

- The Hornets forced Kings C Domantas Sabonis to commit 11 turnovers in their meeting on Jan. 2, Sabonis' career high and the most in a game by any player this season. It is the second most ever committed by a Hornets opponent, behind only Paul Pierce (12, Nov. 8, 2006, OT), and represents the most committed against Charlotte in a regulation game.
- Five Hornets players (Miles Bridges, Nathan Mensah, Nick Richards, Terry Rozier and Nick Smith Jr.) recorded at least two blocks in the game, tying the franchise record for most players with multiple blocks in the same game, which had been done four times previously and most recently on Dec. 26, 2015 (Nicolas Batum, Al Jefferson, Frank Kaminsky, Marvin Williams and Cody Zeller).

Prolific 3-Point Shooting

- The Hornets shot 23-of-46 (50.0 percent) from 3-point range at Phoenix (Dec. 29), tied for the third most 3s in a game in franchise history. Terry Rozier tied his season high with eight 3-pointers, and Brandon Miller canned a career-high six triples. It marked the seventh time in franchise history two players have made at least six 3s in the same game.

Lighting It Up

- The Hornets shot 40.0 percent or better from 3-point range in seven of 10 games from Nov. 22 - Dec. 15. They led the NBA in 3-point percentage (42.0) in that span.

Hot Shooting Continues

- The Hornets shot 55.7 percent (44-of-79) from the field, 52.0 percent (13-of-25) from 3 and 90.0 percent (18-of-20) from the free-throw line in their win vs. Toronto (Dec. 8), the second time in franchise history recording 55/50/90 shooting splits (min. 10 3P, 10 FT). The Hornets shot 55.8 percent (48-of-86) from the field, 54.8 percent (17-of-31) from 3 and 92.3 percent (24-of-26) from the free-throw line at Orlando on April 6, 2018.
- Charlotte's 55.7 percent clip from the field marked a season high, and its 61.5 percent (8-of-13) mark from 3-point range in the first half represented a season high for a half.

Converting at the Charity Stripe

- The Hornets shot 94.0 percent (63-of-67) from the free-throw line in a four-game stretch from Nov. 30 - Dec. 8, their highest percentage from the free-throw line in any four-game span in franchise history and the eighth-best mark in the NBA since at least 1959-60 (min. 40 FTA), per Stathead. The Hornets have shot 100 percent from the free-throw line in three games this season, their most in any season in franchise history (min. 10 FTA) (h/t Bill Magrath).

Heating Up From Deep

- The Hornets shot 45.1 percent from 3-point range in a seven-game stretch from Nov. 18-Dec. 2, the best seven-game span by any team this season (h/t Bill Magrath).

Offensive Eruption

- The Hornets shot 50.5 percent (46-of-91) from the field, 58.3 percent (21-of-36) from 3 and 100 percent (16-of-16) from the free-throw line in their win at Brooklyn (Nov. 30).
- Charlotte became the first team in NBA history to record 50/50/100 shooting splits while making 20 3s and 15 free throws in a game.
- The Hornets' 58.3 percent clip from 3 is the highest in franchise history (min. 20 3PM).
- It is the second time in franchise history recording shooting splits of 50/50/100 (April 10, 1990 vs. Hou; 50.5 FG%, 54.5 3P%, 100 FT%) and the first time with 50/55/100 splits.
- The Hornets recorded season highs in points (129), 3-pointers (21) and 3-point percentage (.583).

Comeback Kids

- The Hornets rallied from double-digit deficits in all four of their wins from Nov. 10-30. The Hornets trailed by 10 at Brooklyn (Nov. 30), 19 vs. Washington (Nov. 22), 18 vs. Boston (Nov. 20) and 16 at Washington (Nov. 10).

History at The Hive

- LaMelo Ball (34 points, 13 assists) and Miles Bridges (33 points, 10 rebounds) became the first pair of teammates in Hornets history to record 30-point double-doubles in the same game when they did so in Charlotte's win vs. Washington (Nov. 22).

Sellout Streak

- The Hornets sold out Spectrum Center in three straight games (vs. Milwaukee, Nov. 17; vs. New York, Nov. 18 and vs. Boston, Nov. 20). Hornets fans sold out Spectrum Center 16 times last season, the most in any campaign since the team returned to Charlotte in 2004-05.

Dynamic Duo

- Mark Williams collected 16 rebounds and Miles Bridges snared 15 boards vs. Boston (Nov. 20) to become the fifth pair of Hornets teammates to grab 15-plus rebounds in the same game. The other duos to do so are Matt Geiger and Larry Johnson, Vlade Divac and Anthony Mason, Todd Fuller and Anthony Mason, and P.J. Brown and Elden Cambell.

Owning the Glass

- The Hornets outrebounded the Wizards, 67-36, in their In-Season Tournament win on Nov. 10, and their +31 margin on the glass is their largest in a game in franchise history. Charlotte pulled down 28 offensive rebounds, the second-most in a game in franchise history, and 67 total rebounds, the third-most in a game in franchise history.

Free For a Reason

- The Hornets shot 23-of-23 from the free-throw line in their 125-124 win at Indiana (Nov. 4), the second-most free throws without a miss in franchise history (24-of-24 at Philadelphia, Jan. 19, 1994).

Stay With It

- The Hornets became the 10th team in NBA history to allow 50 points in a quarter and still win the game in their 125-124 triumph at Indiana (Nov. 4). The Pacers poured in 50 points in the third quarter, the most surrendered by the Hornets in any quarter in franchise history. Charlotte is just the second team ever to allow 50 points in a quarter on the road and win (Houston at San Diego, 50 points in 4Q, Feb. 9, 1982).
- The Hornets made eight 3-pointers to the Pacers' 22. The 3-point deficit of 14 is tied for the third-largest in NBA history by a winning team and is the largest in any win in franchise history.
- Tyrese Haliburton erupted in the third quarter, recording 25 points, six 3s and six assists. He is the only player in Stathead's database (since 1996-97) to record 25 points, five 3s and five assists in a quarter.

Clifford enters season two of his second stint with the Hornets, having previously served as head coach from 2013-2018, leading the franchise to two playoff appearances and accruing a 196-214 (.478) record. He was named Eastern Conference Coach of the Month three times (April 2014, March 2016, March 2019).
- Clifford's 243 victories as Charlotte's head coach are the most in franchise history. He is the longest-tenured coach in franchise history.
- He became the 75th head coach in NBA history with 300 career wins with his victory at Sacramento (Dec. 19, 2022).
- Coached the 800th game of his career at Boston (April 12, 2024), becoming the 49th coach in NBA history to reach the milestone.
- Clifford served as head coach of the Orlando Magic for three seasons (2018-21), guiding the team to two playoff berths and compiling a 96-131 (.423) record. In his five seasons as an assistant in Orlando, Clifford helped the Magic reach the playoffs in all five seasons, including an appearance in the 2009 NBA Finals.
- Prior to his head coaching stints, Clifford was an assistant coach for 13 seasons in the NBA with the New York Knicks (2000-03), Houston Rockets (2003-07), Orlando Magic (2007-12) and Los Angeles Lakers (2012-13).
- Clifford began his coaching career in the high school and college ranks, with his stops including Woodland High School (Maine), Saint Anselm College (D-II), Fairfield, Boston University, Siena, Adelphi (D-II) and East Carolina. In all, Clifford holds 39 years of coaching experience.
- Clifford guided the Charlotte Bobcats to the playoffs in his first season at the helm (2013-14), transforming the team into a top-five defense and securing the franchise's first winning season since 2009-10.
- In 2015-16, Clifford's Hornets finished 48-34, the team's highest win total since 1999-00 (49).

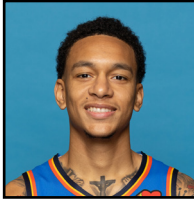

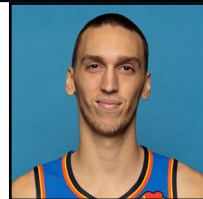
