MITCHELL MAGIC

Jazz G Donovan Mitchell has now posted two 50-point outings in the First Round of the 2020 NBA Playoffs against Denver. He's only the fifth player in NBA history to log two 50-point contests in a single playoffs, joining Allen Iverson (2001), Michael Jordan (1993, 1988), Wilt Chamberlain (1960) and Jamal Murray (2020). His 38.7 point per game average is the top scoring points per game output in the 2020 NBA Playoffs and marks the most points per game by a Jazzman in the postseason (min. 4 gp) since Adrian Dantley averaged 32.2 points per contest over 11 games in 1984. The third-year pro from Louisville is also currently one of five NBA players to ever average over 35 points, five assists and four rebounds during the postseason (min. 4 gp), joining Russell Westbrook (2017), LeBron James (2009), Michael Jordan (1993, 1990) and Jerry West (1965).

BIG WIN IN THE BUBBLE

The Jazz shot 51.2 percent from the field and 48.6 percent from beyond the arc on 8/21, en route to a 124-87 victory against the Nuggets in Game 3 of the First Round of the 2020 NBA Playoffs. It marked the third largest margin of victory in Utah Jazz playoff history. All 13 Jazz players that saw action in the game tallied points with three players scoring 20-or-more points (Conley, Gobert, Mitchell).

BUBBLIN' MIKE

In three playoff games as a Jazzman, Mike Conley is averaging 22.8 points, 4.8 assists and 1.3 steals in 30.3 minutes per contest. He hit seven threes against Denver on 8/21, marking a playoff career best for the 12-year pro and also tied a then Jazz franchise record for most threes made in a playoff game. He's the first player since Khris Middleton in 2017-18 to average over 20 points on +50 FG%, and +60% 3FG in a playoff series (min. 4 gp).

MITCHELL'S HISTORIC OUTING

Jazz G Donovan Mitchell posted a Utah Jazz franchise record 57 points against Denver (previously, Karl Malone, 50 vs Seattle, 4/22/00) on 8/17, which marked the third highest scoring outing in NBA playoff history. Mitchell is now the youngest player to score 50-or-more in a postseason contest since Michael Jordan vs. Boston on 4/20/86. He's only the second player in NBA Playoff history to score 50-plus points, grab nine boards and hand out seven assists (Russell Westbrook, 4/19/17).

GOING THE DISTANCE

The Jazz knocked down 20 three-pointers on 8/19 against Denver, setting a franchise record for most threes in a post season game. The previous record was 15 three-pointers made against the Houston Rockets on 5/2/18.

CLARKSON CLICKING

Jazz G Jordan Clarkson has been a huge spark off the bench for the squad in five games during the 2020 NBA Playoffs. He set back-to-back career-best postseason scoring outings with 18 at DEN (8/17) and followed up with a 26-point flurry at DEN (8/19). In his second career postseason, the six-year pro ranks third among all reserves (min. 4 gp) in scoring average with 17.8 points per contest. It is the third highest Jazz scoring average during the postseason since Thurl Bailey in 1988 with 23.2 ppg and Paul Millsap in 2019 (18.0 ppg).

FOUR-STRAIGHT PLAYOFFS FOR UTAH

Utah finished the 2019-20 season with a 44-28 record, advancing to the playoffs for the fourth consecutive season. It marks the first time Utah has made the postseason four-straight seasons since 2006-10. Over the past four seasons (2016-20), the Jazz have gone 192-125 (.606), the third best record over that stretch only behind Houston and Golden State.

THE MATCHUP

The Jazz will face off against the Denver Nuggets and it will mark the fifth time the team has taken on Denver in the Playoffs (1984, 1985, 1994 and 2010) and the third time the team has played the Nuggets in the first round, last winning the opening series 4-2 in 2010

NAMES FOR SOCIAL JUSTICE

During the NBA Restart in Orlando, players have the opportunity to replace their last name on the back of their jersey with a statement on social justice. The following chart highlights the Jazz roster and their customized name replacements.

CHICAGO STARS

On February 16, Jazz C Rudy Gobert and Jazz G Donovan Mitchell both competed in the NBA All-Star game for Team Giannis. Gobert played 19 minutes, finishing the game with 21 points and 11 rebounds, going 10-for-11 from the field, while Mitchell played 15 minutes finishing with 7 points, 5 rebounds and 4 assists. Gobert and Mitchell became the 13th and 14th Jazzmen selected to play in the All-Star game and the first since Gordon Hayward was an All-Star in 2017. This is the first-time multiple Jazzmen played in the All-Star game since 2006-07 when Carlos Boozer and Mehmet Okur were selected as NBA All-Stars.

MITCHELL'S MILESTONE

On August 1, against the Oklahoma City Thunder, Donovan Mitchell recorded his 5000th career point. He becomes the third-fastest active NBA player to reach 5000 points, behind LeBron James and Kevin Durant.

CLARKSON RISING

The Utah Jazz acquired guard Jordan Clarkson via trade on Dec. 24, 2019 and during his time with the Jazz he has averaged 15.6 points on 46.2 percent shooting off the bench. In 42 games as a Jazzman, the five-year pro has totaled 13 games with 20-plus points and two games with 30-or-more.

CLUTCH MUCH?

Jazz G Donovan Mitchell was huge for Utah down the stretch in tight games this season, having totaled 152 clutch points (last five minutes of fourth quarter when game is within five points), the fourth most among any player this season. Mitchell also ranks sixth in total fourth quarter points in the NBA this year (438).

MOUNTAIN MIKE

Jazz guard Mike Conley has found his groove starting Feb. 1, where during that stretch, he's posted averages of 17.0 points on 45.0 percent shooting, 41.9 percent from three, 4.9 assists and 3.6 rebounds. He's of only five guards to average over 15 points on that shooting efficiency during that stretch (Tatum - BOS, Sexton - CLE, Curry - DAL, Harris - BKN).

JUST KEEP WINNING

With the win over the Miami Heat on 2/12, the Jazz secured their 36th win of the season before the All-Star break. This is the most wins in Jazz history before All-Star weekend, breaking the previous record of 35 wins reached three times by the Jazz in 1994-95, 2016-17 and 2007-08.

JAZZ FROM DEEP

Utah lit it up from beyond the arc this season, connecting on 979-of-2,584 threes (.380), which was the best three-point percentage in the NBA. In the wake of devastating bushfires in Australia, Jazz forward Joe Ingles joined eight other Australian NBA players in partnership with the NBA and National Basketball Players Association (NBPA) Foundation to commit \$750,000 towards relief and recovery efforts. Ingles and his wife, Renae, have also pledged \$500 to Australian firefighters and supporting organizations for every one of Joe’s made three-pointers from the beginning of this season through Feb. 12 vs. Miami, the final Jazz game before the All-Star Break.



Jazz forward **Georges Niang** joined with American Heart Association representatives to host a CPR training for Junior Jazz youth in recognition of American Heart Month. Heart health is a cause that is important to Niang, and his contributions include partnering with the National Basketball Players Association (NBPA) to make a \$10,000 donation for the purchase of 100 CPR training kits. He also met with heart survivors following a Jazz game.

The full Utah Jazz team, along with the Utah Jazz Dancers and Utah Jazz Bear, made their annual visit to Primary Children’s Hospital on Feb. 25. The team has been visiting the hospital for more than 25 years, where players and members of the organization brighten the day for young patients and their families.

The Utah Jazz and dōTERRA hosted 300 female high school students for “Her Time to Lead,” an educational seminar aimed at inspiring and developing the next generation of leaders. The Jazz organization joins the NBA in celebrating women’s history and empowerment throughout the month of March, and the third-annual event was an opportunity to share that message with local students.



Jazz All-Stars **Rudy Gobert** and **Donovan Mitchell** participated in the NBA Cares All-Star Day of Service in Chicago. Mitchell helped sort and repack food donations at the Greater Chicago Food Depository, which works with a network of community organizations, schools, faith-based institutions and service providers to end hunger in low-income neighborhoods across the city of Chicago and Cook County. Gobert participated in Jr. NBA Day, which featured basketball clinics for 1,000 Chicago public school students at Navy Pier.

It will mark the 30th anniversary of the 1993 NBA All-Star Game played in Salt Lake, where Jazz players Karl Malone and John Stockton became the first teammates to share the All-Star MVP award.

✔ The Jazz celebrated their 100th consecutive sellout (including playoffs) on Feb. 21. The team sold out every game in a single season in 2018-19 for the fifth time ever and first time since 1992-93, and has capped season ticket sales at 13,000 for two consecutive years. It marks the second-longest sellout streak in franchise history.

QUIN SNYDER



Quin Snyder is currently in his sixth season as head coach of the Utah Jazz, guiding Utah to a **268-206 (.565)** record. He has helped the team to three-straight playoff appearances, advancing to the Western Conference Semifinals in two of the three showings. In 2017-18, Snyder was named the runner-up in NBA Coach of the Year voting. He possesses a diverse coaching background that spans more than two decades in the NBA, Europe, the NBA G League and college, including 10 years of experience as a head coach.

From 2007-10, Snyder served as the first head coach of the San Antonio Spurs-owned/operated Austin Toros of the G League. During this time, he recorded a 94-56 (.627) mark, while leading the club to playoff appearances in all three seasons. As coach of the Toros, Snyder worked closely with the Spurs coaching staff and front office. During his three-year tenure in Austin, he compiled more wins and guided more players to the NBA than any other coach in the G League during this time frame. Snyder was also named the 2008-09 NBA G League Coach of the Year.

His first head coaching position came at the University of Missouri where he was named Rookie Coach of the Year by the Basketball Times after his inaugural season. He led the Tigers to four NCAA Tournaments, including an Elite Eight appearance in 2002.

Snyder has worked with some of the best minds in basketball, beginning at Duke University where he was the associate head coach under Mike Krzyzewski. Following his time in Austin he also made stops as an NBA assistant with the Philadelphia 76ers, Los Angeles Lakers and CSKA Moscow, helping the team to a 2012-13 Russian League Championship. He then returned to the NBA as an assistant coach in Atlanta before joining the Jazz.

Born in Mercer Island, Wash., Snyder was a two-time Washington player of the year and a McDonald's All-American. He played collegiately at Duke (1985-89), reaching three Final Fours. He was elected as a team captain and honored as an Academic All-American. Snyder earned undergraduate degrees in both philosophy and political science from Duke, later earning a Juris Doctor and M.B.A. from Duke as well. Snyder resides in Salt Lake City with his wife Amy and their children Anika, Madeleine, Wyatt and Tristan.

A native of Mercer Island, Wash., Snyder earned undergraduate degrees in both philosophy and political science at Duke and later earned a Juris Doctor and M.B.A from there as well.
