## THERE'S A NEW SHERIFF IN TOWN

Another career-high night for **Walker Kessler** is nothing new for the rookie making his mark in this year's team. Kessler has a monumental night against the Kings on 3/25/23 in Sacramento when he led the team with 31 points, 11 rebounds, two assists, and one block. He went 14-of-16 from the field (.875) and 3-of-6 (.500) from the free throw line.

Walker is the first Jazz rookie and one of five Jazzmen to shoot at least .850 from the field with over 30 points and 10 rebounds.

Walker is one of five players in the league to achieve this stat line in their rookie season and the only one to do so in over 25 years.

O'Neal, R. Sampson, H. Olajuwon, A. Mourning, T. Duncan, D. Mutombo, and S. Bowie.

## O.A. IS PAVING HIS OWN WAY

Another rookie is rising in his debut season and showing no signs of slowing down. **Ochai Agbaji** is finding his place as a consistent starter in the last eleven games. Agbaji has played in 57 games (20 starts) and has increased his points per game each month exponentially since making his first appearance on 10/19/22.

## A CLUTCH WIN TO TAKE NOTE OF

Another incredible season win is in the records after the Jazz defeat Boston, coming back from a 19-point deficit with a final score of 118-117. The 19-point comeback is the largest for the Jazz since overcoming a 21-point deficit against Orlando on 12/9/19.

With another clutch win in the books, Utah has now won seven games this season by a single point. This is the most by any team since the Spurs in the 1994-95 season with seven as well.

## MARKKANEN MAKING HISTORY... ONCE AGAIN

For the seven-footer, this season has been anything but typical. **Lauri Markkanen** is currently setting career-highs in several areas of his stats, including field goal percentage, three-point percentage, assists and points per game.

Lauri is averaging 3.0 threes per game, which is not only a career-high, but a league-high mark (as highlighted in 'TALL WITH ALL THE THREES'). Through 62 games (62 starts) of the season, Lauri has amassed 189 made threes. This sets a new league record in threes made by a player over seven feet tall.

### DOUBLE-DOUBLE TIME FROM THE YOUNG VET

Leading the way in the win against Charlotte on 3/11/23 was none other than **Talen Horton-Tucker**. Ending the night with 37 points, 10 assists and eight rebounds, Talen comes the youngest Jazzman to achieve a 35-point, 10-assist game at 22 years and 106 days old. The next youngest was Jim McElroy who also hit 37 points and 10 assists in 1977 when he was 23 years and 174 days old.

Only six other Jazzmen have achieved this mark including Donovan Mitchell (2022), Deron Williams (three times from 2009-10), Rickey Green (once in 1984), Adrian Dantley (three times from 1982-84), Pete Maravich (nine times from 1975-78) and Jim McElroy (once in 1977).

### THE RISING ROOKIE SHINES

The NBA announced on 3/2/23 that Utah Jazz center **Walker Kessler** was named the Kia NBA Western Conference Rookie of the Month for games played in February. It marks the first Rookie of the Month accolade for the 21-year-old center. He becomes the fifth player in franchise history to garner Rookie of the Month honors, joining Karl Malone (Dec. 1985), Trey Burke (Dec. 2013 & Jan. 2014), Rodney Hood (March/April 2015), and Donovan Mitchell (Dec. 2017, Jan. 2018, Feb. 2018, and March/April 2018).

Throughout the month, Kessler averaged 10.6 points on 68.9 percent from the field, along with 11.4 rebounds, and 3.2 blocks in 29.1 minutes per contest during 11 games (all starts) in February. His 3.2 blocks per contest ranked second among all NBA players during February and he was the only rookie to average a double-double for the month.

### AN ALL-STAR POST ALL-STAR WEEKEND

In an overtime thriller against the Thunder that ended with the Jazz victorious with a final score of 120-119 in overtime, **Lauri Markkanen** led the way with 43 points, 10 rebounds, and two assists. The last Jazzmen to have at least 40 points and 10 rebounds games were Al Jefferson in 2013 (40 points, 13 rebounds), Carlos Boozer in 2007 (41 points, 16 rebounds), and Karl Malone in 2000 (41 points, 13 rebounds).

After 55 games into the season, Markkanen owns averages of 25.2 points, 8.6 rebounds, and 1.8 assists per game. Markkanen is the only player this season to average at least 25 points per game while shooting at least .500 from the field and .400 from beyond the arc. The four most recent player to do so include Kyrie Irving, Zach LaVine, Kevin Durant, and Stephen Curry.

### SALT LAKE CITY ALL-STARS

On February 19, Jazz F **Lauri Markkanen** competed in the NBA All-Star game for Team Giannis. He played 26 minutes, finishing the game with 13 points and seven rebounds, going 6-for-13 from the field. Markkanen became the 15<sup>th</sup> Jazzman to be selected to play, making this his first All-Star career appearance.

**Walker Kessler** was also selected as part of the Jordan Rising Stars Game, where he played for Team Deron and was coached by previous Jazzman Deron Williams (2005-11). Kessler was also a part of the Jazz trio who won the skills challenge on Friday, alongside teammates **Collin Sexton** and **Jordan Clarkson**.

### BLOCK PARTY TIME

**Walker Kessler** has reached another career mark in hitting 100 career blocks on 2/1/23. Walker tied his career-high for blocks in a game when he grabbed seven blocks in the win over Atlanta, with a current total of 103 this season through his first 50 games.

Kessler currently sits at fourth overall in the league this season with total blocks while averaging 2.1 blocks per contest.

### ONLY GOING UP FROM HERE

**Lauri Markkanen** has had a standout season and shows no signs of slowing down. Through his 45<sup>th</sup> game of the season, Markkanen is currently achieving several career-highs in various categories including points per game (24.8), field goal percentage (.521) and three-point field goal percentage (.429).

In the month of January, Lauri currently sits at fifth in the western conference in points per game, sitting below strong company.

Lauri is currently one of only three players in the western conference averaging at least 25 points while shooting .475 from the field, .400 from beyond the arc and .900 from the free throw line. His company includes Klay Thompson and Kawhi Leonard.

There are only ten other rookies who have reached these numbers. Not included in the graphic are Jeremy Sochan (SAS) with two and Jalen Williams (OKC), Josh Minott (MIN), and Dominick Barlow (SAS) with one each.

### CLUTCH GAMES AND CLUTCH SITUATIONS

Throughout this season, the Jazz have played in the most clutch games in the league with a record of 14-18 (.438). The next two teams closest include the Heat (30) and the Pacers (29). Three of these games have led to three overtime victories, with the Jazz remaining undefeated in overtime.

### A BREAKTHROUGH NIGHT FOR THE RISING ROOKIE

In a career night for the rookie, **Walker Kessler** is proving why he is continuing to grow into his role in this year's versatile team. In a crowd-thrilling game in Minnesota with a final score of 126-125, Walker ended the night with 20 points, 21 rebounds, four assists and two blocks. With these totals, Walker sets career-highs in rebounds and assists and ties his career-high for points.

After achieving these totals, Kessler also achieved franchise history by becoming the first player to ever have a 20-point/20-rebound game as a rookie. He is also the first rookie in the NBA to reach these numbers since 2014 when Gorgui Dieng was with Minnesota.

To add to it, Kessler is one of only 11 players to reach this milestone with a field goal percentage of .650 or higher. In this night, Walker shot .692 on the night. The last rookie to hit this numbers was in Alonzo Mourning in 1993.

### THE CLARKSON IMPACT

In the last 10 games of the season, beginning against Miami on 12/31/22 and spanning to the most recent in Minnesota on 1/16/23, **Jordan Clarkson** has had a strong second-half impact. In these games, his second-half performance includes an average of 15.7 points while shooting 56% from the field and 43% from beyond the arc.

### MARKKANEN THE REMARKABLE

Throughout his career, **Lauri Markkanen** has proven his name is one to remember. With a total 25 points in the win over Cleveland on 1/10/23, Lauri has officially surpassed 1,000 points in just 41 games with the Jazz. The only Jazzman to reach that mark earlier is Adrian Dantley who achieved it in 34 games in 1979-80.

Markkanen helped lead the Jazz to a 116-114 victory over Cleveland with a total 25 points, 16 rebounds, and one assists. In his last ten games alone, Lauri has averaged 29.8 points, 9.6 rebounds, and 1.0 assist per a game.

### WORTH EVERY VOTE

Another career night by Lauri is continuing to show why he's all-star material. **Lauri Markkanen** set several career highs in a performance of the season against Houston on 1/5/23. In the victory, he led the team with a career-high 49 points and eight rebounds.

Markkanen is one of only four Jazz players who play forward to achieve at least 49 points and eight rebounds in a game. This accolade hasn't been accomplished since 1995. The other three Jazzmen include Karl Malone, Adrian Dantley, and Truck Robinson.

### A CORE CLARKSON MOMENT

**Jordan Clarkson** officially surpassed the 10,000 career points mark with a 24-point performance against Sacramento on 1/3/23. Clarkson shot 9-of-17 (.529) from the field and 5-of-10 (.500) from beyond the arc. In addition to his shooting, Jordan also added three rebounds and two assists on the night.

Since being traded to Utah during the 2019-20 season from Cleveland, Clarkson has amassed 3,975 of his total 10,019 career points while in the Jazz uniform. Clarkson's current season total sits at 803 points.

### TALL WITH ALL THE THREES

**Lauri Markkanen** has not only shown his ability to shoot beyond the arc this season but is showing this is a career thing. With this year's average of 3.0 three's per a game, Lauri is the first in league history to average 3.0 in one season for players with a height of seven feet and taller.

**Kessler** is making his name known throughout the franchise and NBA, hitting marks most associate with veterans and all-stars. Throughout his last three games against the Clippers, Pacers, and Trail Blazers, Walker's averaging 12.7 points, 10.3 rebounds and 3.3 blocks while only averaging 22 minutes per game. He's currently shooting 94% from the floor and 75% from the free throw line.

Throughout his last nine games, Walker has shot 29-of-31 from the field. With his first career start occurring on 12/7/22 in the last second victory over Golden State, only grand numbers will be in sight for the rookie.

### KESSLER'S DONE IT AGAIN

After a career performance across the board, **Walker Kessler** now sits among the few top rookies who achieved a game total of at least 20 points while shooting 1.00 from the field and recording a minimum of 10 rebounds. In the win over Indiana on 12/2/22, Walker hit this mark scoring 22 points and hitting the boards 11 times.

### THE REMARKABLE ROOKIE: COACH EDITION

With an 8-3 record (.727) after two more road wins against the Lakers and Clippers, on 11/4/22 and 11/6/22 respectively, **Will Hardy** has the best winning record in first 11 games coached of any other coach in franchise history in their first season as head coach.

### THE FINNISHER

Prior to his start with the Jazz **Lauri Markkannen** owned 5 double-doubles overall from two seasons of play. However, after the Jazz beat the Lakers on 11/4, in just the first ten games of the 2022-23 season with the Jazz the Marksman totals 5 double-doubles, far surpassing his previous career numbers.

Markkannen is also the first Jazzman since Adrian Dantley (1979-80) with 100+ points and 40+ rebounds in their first five games with a team.

### CLARKSON RACKING UP THE THREES

In the loss to New York on 11/15/22, **Jordan Clarkson** added three more three's to his overall total, officially tying him with Bryon Russell in sixth place.

With an added two made-three's on 11/18/22, Clarkson officially passes Bryon Russell with 542 three-point field goals.

### Utah Hosting NBA All-Star 2023

The Utah Jazz will be celebrating basketball in this state as the host for NBA All-Star 2023 on Feb. 17-19. The primary venues are Vivint Arena, University of Utah’s Jon M. Huntsman Center and the Salt Palace Convention Center. The main events include the NBA All-Star Celebrity Game, HBCU Classic, G League Next Gem Game, Rising Stars, All-Star Saturday Night, NBA Crossover, NBA Cares All-Star Day of Service, and the 72nd NBA All-Star Game. The game is broadcast on TNT and worldwide in 215 countries/territories and in 47 languages. NBA All-Star 2023 is the 30th anniversary of the 1993 game in Salt Lake City when Karl Malone and John Stockton were the co- MVPs.

For NBA All-Star 2022 in Cleveland, there was \$141.4 million in direct spending as part of \$248.9 million in total economic impact. Nearly 121,600 attendees from 45 states and 24 countries attended NBA All-Star 2022 on Feb. 18-20 as the event received 11.9 billion in total media reach and more than \$50 million in earned media value. The Grambling State University and Southern University men’s basketball programs have been selected to play in the NBA HBCU Classic 2023. The Southwestern Athletic Conference matchup will take place on Feb. 18 at the Huntsman Center as part of NBA All-Star 2023. NBA legends Bob Love (Southern alum) and Willis Reed (Grambling State alum) have been named honorary captains.

## Will Hardy, Utah Jazz Head Coach

Will Hardy enters his first season as head coach of the Utah Jazz. Hardy joins the Jazz after one season as assistant coach with the Boston Celtics where he helped lead the team to their first NBA Finals appearance since 2010. Prior to his time in Boston, Hardy spent a total of 11 seasons with the Spurs, five as an assistant coach. He served as the team's video coordinator from 2013-15 and as the head coach of the Spurs summer league team in Utah from 2015-18 and in Vegas in 2017 and 2018.

The Williams College graduate began his career in San Antonio as a basketball operations intern in 2010 before being promoted to assistant video coordinator in 2011. He was an assistant coach for Team USA's gold medal victory over France at the 2020 Summer Olympics and served on the coaching staff for Team USA at the 2019 FIBA World Cup. While at Williams College, Hardy was a member of the Ephs basketball squad that finished 30-2 and second nationally in 2010. Hardy is originally from Richmond, Va. He and his wife, Spencer, have two daughters, Elliott and Pierce.
