MIGHTY MITCHELL

Donovan Mitchell posted 40-plus points in back-to-back games on 4/10 vs. Sacramento and 4/12 vs. Washington, becoming the third player in Jazz history to score 40-plus in back-to-back games (Dantley, K. Malone, Maravich). He scored 35-or-more points in four consecutive games becoming only the third Jazz player to ever do so (K. Malone and Dantley).

POST ALL-STAR POINTS

In 19 games since the All-Star Break weekend, Donovan Mitchell has posted an average of 29.6 points per game on 49.9 percent shooting and 39.4 percent from beyond the arc. It's the second-best scoring average in the NBA since the All-Star Break (min. 12 gp).

TRIO OF ATL-STARS

Jazz center Rudy Gobert, guard Donovan Mitchell and guard Mike Conley were named NBA All-Stars as three of the seven Western Conference reserves announced by the NBA on Feb. 23 (Mike Conley was later selected to replace Phoenix's injured Devin Booker). Gobert and Mitchell were voted in by NBA coaches for the 70th NBA All-Star Game, which was played at State Farm Arena in Atlanta on March 7. It marked the second-straight All-Star appearance for both the two-time NBA Defensive Player of the Year and 2018 NBA Slam Dunk Champion. Jazz Head Coach Quin Snyder earned coaching duties to Coach Team LeBron in the contest, who led Team LeBron to a 170-150 win. It marked the first time the Jazz had three All-Stars compete in the contest since the 1989 All-Star Game, which featured Mark Eaton, Karl Malone and John Stockton.

Mitchell finished with 15 points, four rebounds and four assists for Team Durant. Conley had three points and two assists and Gobert finished with 10 points and seven boards for Team LeBron.

FIRST TIME MIKE

In his 14th NBA season, Mike Conley became the most experienced player in NBA history to make the All-Star Contest. He was also runner-up in the MTN Dew 3-Point Contest, where he was narrowly defeated by Golden State's Stephen Curry after posting 27 points in the Final Round

BOARD GAME

On 3/14 against Golden State, Rudy Gobert a career-best 28 rebounds, which also marked a franchise record. Gobert also poured in 24 points marking his fifth 20-20 game for his career, which is the fourth most such games for the franchise behind Truck Robinson (16), Karl Malone (12) and Rich Kelley (9). It's a single-game high in the NBA this season for rebounds in a game.

FEBRUARY RECAP

The Jazz finished with a 12-2 (.857) record in February, the best record in the NBA during the month, and the team posed a nine-game win streak from Feb. 2 to Feb. 17. Utah averaged 119.9 points per game, while holding opponents to 106.9 points per game during the month and all 12 of their wins were double-digit victories. Jazz Coach Quin Snyder was named 2021 February Coach of the Month, his second-consecutive honor.

LOTS OF 3'S IN 2

On 2/22, the Utah Jazz knocked down a franchise record 28 threes in a 132-110 win against the Hornets and followed up that performance by knocking down 22 threes in a 114-89 win against the Lakers on 2/24, becoming the first team in NBA history to hit 50 three-point field goals over a two-game span.

CONSISTENC-THREE

On 2/22 vs. CHA the Jazz finished with 28 three-point field goals made, the most in franchise history and just one shy of tying the NBA high. Utah's reserves knocked down 19 of those threes, the most ever by an NBA bench. The Jazz have set their franchise record for threes made three times in 2020-21.

Jazz G Jordan Clarkson was instrumental in Utah's 134-123 win against the Philadelphia 76ers on 2/15, scoring 40 points in just 29 minutes, also knocking down a career-high-tying eight three-point field goals. It marked only the third time since 1983-84 since a player off the bench scored 40-or-more points in 29 minutes or less and also marked the fourth 40-plus point game by a Jazz reserve and third most points all-time by a Jazz player off the bench. 2020-21 COMMUNITY HIGHLIGHTS:

Utah Jazz guard **Donovan Mitchell** has received the Offseason NBA Cares Community Assist Award presented by Kaiser Permanente in recognition of his continued efforts to advance social justice and champion education between the 2019-20 and 2020-21 NBA seasons.

In December, the Mitchell family pledged \$12 million to Greenwich Country Day School, Donovan and his sister Jordan's alma mater and the school where their mother, Nicole, taught for more than a decade. The contribution was the largest single donation in the school's history and will be used to create the Mitchell Family Scholarship Fund to aid students from pre-K-12th grade, the Nicole Mitchell Faculty Support Fund to assist teachers who demonstrate the same passion for teaching as Nicole, as well as the new D.O.N.! The Determination Over Negativity Mitchell Family Athletic Center. This past summer, Mitchell also donated the proceeds of his Adidas D.O.N. Issue #2 sneakers to support the education of Jacob Blake's children, students of color at the University of Louisville and teachers at preschools in Connecticut and the Bronx, totaling more than \$300,000 in scholarships and academic assistance.

Following his unwavering commitment to speak out against racial injustice during the 2019-20 NBA season restart, Mitchell continued the conversation during the offseason, joining then vice-presidential candidate Sen. Kamala Harris, Portland's CJ McCollum and Philadelphia's Tobias Harris for a discussion on educational, economic and social inequities. Mitchell was also named to the inaugural board of the National Basketball Social Justice Coalition, which will leverage the game's influence to raise awareness, educate and advocate for meaningful reform, and regularly gives back to those most in need through his SPIDACARES organization.

The Utah Jazz and Mountain America Credit Union announced on Jan. 28 that the Dyslexia Center of Utah is the first recipient of the \$5,000 "Pass It Along" award for the 2020-21 season. The program features fan-nominated opportunities that reward five local charitable organizations with \$5,000 each. Since its inception in 2013, "Pass It Along" has now contributed \$185,000 to 37 local nonprofits.



The Jazz continued an annual tradition with a virtual visit to Primary Children's Hospital this holiday season. **Mike Conley** surprised patients during a virtual slime making session on Dec. 21, taking questions and chatting while participating in the craft. In addition, **Derrick Favors** read "Pete the Cat Saves Christmas" in a recorded video for patients and shared a holiday message of gratitude to doctors, nurses and hospital staff.

Through the Rudy's Kids Foundation, **Rudy Gobert** donated clothes and toys to 120 youth at Utah Community Action's Operation Chimney Drop during the holiday season. Operation Chimney Drop provides clothing and holiday gifts to children 0-18 in Utah.

Jazz forward **Georges Niang** and Jazz Bear teamed up in December during an online fundraiser for the American Heart Association. Niang made a personal donation while Jazz Bear sold a self-portrait made of skittles for \$10,000. The AHA raised \$160,000 during the fundraiser.

QUIN SNYDER



Quin Snyder is currently in his seventh season as head coach of the Utah Jazz, guiding Utah to a **313-225 (.582)** record. He has helped the team to four-straight playoff appearances, advancing to the Western Conference Semifinals in two of the four showings. In 2017-18, Snyder was named the runner-up in NBA Coach of the Year voting. He possesses a diverse coaching background that spans more than two decades in the NBA, Europe, the NBA G League and college, including 10 years of experience as a head coach.

From 2007-10, Snyder served as the first head coach of the San Antonio Spurs-owned/operated Austin Toros of the G League. During this time, he recorded a 94-56 (.627) mark, while leading the club to playoff appearances in all three seasons. As coach of the Toros, Snyder worked closely with the Spurs coaching staff and front office. During his three-year tenure in Austin, he compiled more wins and guided more players to the NBA than any other coach in the G League during this time frame. Snyder was also named the 2008-09 NBA G League Coach of the Year.

His first head coaching position came at the University of Missouri where he was named Rookie Coach of the Year by the Basketball Times after his inaugural season. He led the Tigers to four NCAA Tournaments, including an Elite Eight appearance in 2002.

Snyder has worked with some of the best minds in basketball, beginning at Duke University where he was the associate head coach under Mike Krzyzewski. Following his time in Austin he also made stops as an NBA assistant with the Philadelphia 76ers, Los Angeles Lakers and CSKA Moscow, helping the team to a 2012-13 Russian League Championship. He then returned to the NBA as an assistant coach in Atlanta before joining the Jazz.

Born in Mercer Island, Wash., Snyder was a two-time Washington player of the year and a McDonald's All-American. He played collegiately at Duke (1985-89), reaching three Final Fours. He was elected as a team captain and honored as an Academic All-American. Snyder earned undergraduate degrees in both philosophy and political science from Duke, later earning a Juris Doctor and M.B.A. from Duke as well. Snyder resides in Salt Lake City with his wife Amy and their children Anika, Madeleine, Wyatt and Tristan.

Snyder led the Blue Devils to three Final Fours (1986, 1988, and 1989) and won two ACC Championships (1986, 1988). Academically, Snyder was named to the ACC Honor Roll three times. Snyder attended training camp with the Indiana Pacers after finishing his career at Duke but went on to pursue other coaching endeavors.

A native of Mercer Island, Wash., Snyder earned undergraduate degrees in both philosophy and political science at Duke and later earned a Juris Doctor and M.B.A from there as well.
