TONIGHT'S OPPONENT



KINGS AT PORTLAND TRAIL BLAZERS (4/10 at Moda Center): In the Kings season finale, the look to beat the Portland Trail Blazers on the road in the third and final meeting between these teams. A win for Sacramento would give Kings the season series win against Portland this season.

In their most recent meeting, Sacramento went down early as they never led in the first quarter and were down, 24-27, heading into the second quarter. The Kings would go on to limit the Blazers to just 17 points in the second quarter while scoring 30 points of their own to take a 10-point halftime lead with the score at 54-44. Sacramento would not give up their lead in the second half as the Kings went up by as many as 16 at 78-62 with 4:18 remaining in the third quarter as they beat the Blazers, 115-107.

Kings guard Buddy Hield scored 19 points to go with seven rebounds while guard De'Aaron Fox posted 16 points, nine assists and two steals. Forward Marvin Bagley III recorded a double-double with 13 points and 11 boards. Trail Blazers guard Damian Lillard totaled a game-high 35 points as he shot 11-of-27 from the field and went 9-for-9 from the free throw line.

2018-19 KINGS NOTES

MORE ASSISTS AND SEASON-LOWS IN THE HOME FINALE: The Sacramento Kings recorded 129 points and 27 assists against the New Orleans Pelicans on Apr. 7 as the Kings have had 19 games this season where they record 120 points and 25 assists or more, the fifth most in franchise history as they are 12-7 on the season in those games. 12 wins with 120-plus points and 25-plus assists is tied for the fifth most in team history with the 1985-86 Sacramento Kings who were 12-3 that season in such instances. The game marked the 50th time this season Sacramento totaled 25 or more assists in a single game. The Kings are tied for the seventh most games in franchise history with 25 or more assists as the Kings had 50 games with 25-plus dimes during the 2003-04 season. 50 games with 25 assists or better is tied for the sixth most by a team this season with the Boston Celtics, Indiana Pacers and Washington Wizards.

The Kings ended the outing with a season-low six turnovers for the first time since Mar. 11, 2018 when Sacramento had a franchise low three turnovers at Denver. The Kings also finished the game with just 13 fouls, which marked a new season-low which had been set just two games earlier against the Cavaliers at home on Apr. 4.

WINNING WAYS IN SAC: The Sacramento Kings beat the Cleveland Cavaliers, 117-104, as Sacramento picked up their 39th win of the season, which is now the most wins by the Kings since the 2005-06 season when the team went 44-38. The Kings recorded 28 assists in the game and had just seven turnovers while forcing 22 Cleveland turnovers. This season, the Kings have dished out 28-plus assists 26 times, which is tied for the eighth most games in franchise history with the 1989-90 Sacramento team. The Kings are 7-4 when they force their opponent to commit 20 or more turnovers as 11 games with 20-plus opponent turnovers is tied for the second most with the Phoenix Suns.

The Kings finished the night with a then season-low 14 fouls as the Cavaliers went just 5-for-9 from the charity stripe setting new season-lows for free throws made and attempted. This is just the 14th game in franchise history where a Kings opponent has knocked down five or less shots from the free throw line as the last time an opponent made five or less free throws was on Mar. 3, 2016 when the Kings held Dallas to just four made free throws on six attempts.

A SWEEP TO KEEP THE STREAK: The Sacramento Kings picked up a third straight victory over the San Antonio Spurs on Mar. 31 as Sacramento beat San Antonio, 113-106, as the Kings were down 105-106 with 2:53 remaining before the Kings finished the game on an 8-0 run for the win. With the win, the Kings swept the season series against the Spurs for the first time in franchise history and tie the fourth longest winning streak against San Antonio in franchise history as they have won three games in a row against the Spurs three other times (2/20-4/1/1986, 4/8-12/22/1987, 2/3-4/14/1997).

The Kings held San Antonio to eight three-pointers on 27 attempts from beyond the arc for .296 percent as Sacramento is now 19-7 this season when their opponent makes .300 percent or less of their three-point attempts. Kings guard Buddy Hield finished with 26 points, his 42nd game with 20 points or more as has totaled 20-plus points in three straight games from Mar. 20 to Mar. 31. Hield became the 22nd player in Kings franchise history with 42 or more games scoring 20 points or greater and the last Kings player to do so since the 2016-17 season when DeMarcus Cousins tallied 45 games with 20 or more points.

DOUBLE-DOUBLES IN HOUSTON: Kings forward Marvin Bagley III received his third career start scoring 20 points on a career-high tying 10 field goals as he added a career-high tying seven offensive rebounds and 12 total boards for his 17th double-double this season, including his third as a starter. In all three of his starts, Bagley III has had 20 points and 10 rebounds or better as he is the first player in NBA history to post 20 points and 10 boards or higher in his first three career starts since the NBA began listing starters during the 1970-71 season per Elias Sport Bureau.

Kings guard De'Aaron Fox added 18 points and 10 assists to go with two blocks and one steal as he notched his 14th double-double this season. Fox also collected a double-double at New Orleans on Mar. 28 as this is the first time in his career where he recorded a double-double in consecutive games.

FRANCHISE LONG STREAK AT DALLAS: The Sacramento Kings snapped their four-game road losing streak as they beat the Dallas Mavericks, 125-121, on Mar. 26 marking their fourth straight win on the Mavericks' home court. Four straight road wins is their longest road winning streak against Dallas in franchise history, which began on Oct. 20, 2017. Sacramento finished with just seven turnovers, matching their season-low previously set on Mar. 9 at New York as Dallas had just one steal for the entire contest, a new season-low for an opponent.

Kings guard De'Aaron Fox finished the game with 23 points, eight assists and five rebounds as he knocked down a career-high 11 free throws, which also ties a season-high by a Kings player this season, on a career-high tying 12 attempts from the charity stripe. Fox became just the 13th player this season with multiple games totaling 20 points, eight assists and five boards or greater while making 10 or more shots from the free throw line as he also did so on Nov. 1 in a win at Atlanta. In Kings franchise history, he is only the 11th player to notch 20 points, eight assists and five rebounds while recording 10 made free throws or more in two or more outings in a single season as Oscar Robertson holds the franchise record with 37 during the 1963-64 season.

Sacramento defeated Dallas in all three meetings this season as this marks the Kings first sweep over the Mavericks since the 1997-98 season when they beat Dallas in all four meetings. This is just the fourth time in team history, also done during the 1980-81 and 1992-93 season, that the Kings have swept the Mavs since the two teams first squared off during the 1980-81 season.

HIELD'S HISTORICAL SHOOTING FROM BEYOND THE ARC: Kings guard Buddy Hield is having a historical season shooting the ball in the Franchise annals. The third-year guard out of Oklahoma went 7-for-14 from three-point range in the Kings win over Phoenix on Mar. 23 to secure the Kings franchise record for three-pointers made eclipsing Kings Assistant General Manager Peja Stojakovic's previous record of 240 made treys during the 2003-04 season. Hield now has 275 three-pointers this season and became is just the fifth player in NBA history with 270 three-pointers or more for a single season; Hield and Stojakovic are the only two Kings player with 240 or more made three-pointers in a single season. Hield also holds the NBA record for the most three-pointers in a single season as he surpassed Warriors guard Klay Thompson's previous mark of 223, which Thompson set during the 2014-15 season as Aaron Brooks is the only other player to make 200-plus three-pointers in a single season in the player's third season in The Association.

Hield knocked down five shots from beyond the arc after he had made seven three-pointers in two straight contests on Mar. 21 and Mar. 23 as became the eighth player this season to knock down seven-plus shots from distance in consecutive outings and the first in Kings franchise history since the three-pointer was a recorded statistic in 1983-84. Hield is the first player in team history with two streaks of three games or more with five-plus three-pointers as he previously had four straight games with five-plus makes from three-point range from Dec. 17 to Dec. 23, 2018, which is the longest streak in franchise history. Warriors guard Stephen Curry holds the longest streak with three straight games with seven-plus makes from three-point range as he did so from Jan. 13 to Jan. 16, 2019. Hield's 275 three-pointers are the fourth most made three-pointers this season as Hield has made 599 shots from beyond the arc during his NBA career, which is now tied for the most by a player through his first three seasons as with Trail Blazers guard Damian Lillard (599 3PM) as he surpassed Thompson (545 3PM) earlier this season.

Hield is shooting .458 percent from the field, .426 percent from three-point range and .886 percent from the free throw line as he is one of four players this season along with Bucks guard, Malcolm Brogdon, Curry and Clippers forward Danilo Gallinari to shoot at or higher than .450 percent from the floor, .425 percent from beyond the arc and .850 percent from the charity stripe. Only 22 players in NBA history, including Curry, have finished a season making .450 percent of their overall field goals, .425 percent of their three-point attempts and .850 percent of their free throw attempts while holding the minimum qualifiers, which are 300 field goals made, 82 three-pointers made and 125 free throws made in a single season.

Hield is eighth in the NBA in three-point percentage at .426 percent. Hield could become the fifth player in NBA history to average 7.0 or more attempts from beyond the arc while knocking down .425 percent of those three-point attempts along with Ray Allen (.434, 2001-02), Curry (.453, 2012-13; 2014-15, .443; 2015-16, .454), Dennis Scott (.425, 1995-96) and Klay Thompson (.439, 2014-15; .440, 2017-18). Hield has recorded five or more three-point field goals in 22 games this season, the fourth most behind Curry (43), Thunder forward Paul George (23) and Rockets guard James Harden (42). His 22 games with five or more makes from three-point range are the most in Kings franchise history as he surpassed Kings Assistant General Manager Peja Stojakovic who had 17 games with five-plus makes from beyond the arc during the 2003-04 season.

Hield is currently knocking down 3.4 three-pointers per game this season, which is on track to set the franchise mark for the Kings, currently held by Stojakovic who averaged 3.0 field goals from beyond the arc per game also during the 2003-04 season. Hield one three-pointer away from surpassing Thompson who made 276 three-pointers during the 2015-16 season as Hield would have the fourth most by a single player and the seventh most three-pointers in a single season. Curry currently holds the top slot (402 3PM, 2015-16) while George and Harden have already surpassed Thompson's 2015-16 mark as George currently has 288 makes from three-point distance. Harden has also passed Curry's 295 made three-pointers in 2014-15 and 324 three-pointers in 2016-17 this season as he has made 373 shots from three-point distance as Curry has made 353 shots from beyond the arc during the 2018-19 season.

2018-19 KINGS NOTES

A TOP NOTCH SCORER: Kings guard Buddy Hield is averaging a career-high 20.8 points per game this season, the 27th best scoring average in the NBA this season. Hield recorded 16 points in the Kings win vs. Chicago on Mar. 17 as he had posted 10-plus points in 34 straight games as this is his second 30-game streak with 10-plus points this season as his last streak began on Dec. 30, 2018 and ended on Mar. 19, 2019. Hield has tallied 10 or more points in 78 of the Kings 81 games this season after scoring 12 points in the Kings game vs. New Orleans on Apr. 7.

Amongst the rest of The Association, Hield is currently tied for the third most games with 10 points or better with Magic center Nikola Vucevic who has also totaled 78 double-digit scoring games during the 2018-19 season.

A FOXY SEASON: Sacramento Kings guard De'Aaron Fox has been having a stellar season so far as the second-year guard out of Kentucky is averaging 17.3 points, 3.8 rebounds, 7.3 assists and 1.66 steals per game. Fox is one of three players averaging 17.0 points, 3.5 rebounds, 7.0 assists and 1.65 steals per game this season as the short list includes Rockets guard James Harden and Thunder guard Russell Westbrook as Fox ranks ninth in the NBA in assists per contest and ninth in steals per game. Fox could become just the eighth player in NBA history in his first or second season to average 17.0 points, 7.0 assists, 3.5 rebounds, and 1.65 steals as Allen Iverson (1996-97) and Magic Johnson (1979-80) both did it in their rookie season. Johnson (1980-81), Penny Hardaway (1994-95), Tim Hardaway (1990-91), LeBron James (2004-05), Kevin Johnson (1988-89) and Isiah Thomas (1982-83) all finished their respective sophomore seasons with these averages or better. He would be the first Kings player in franchise history since 1973-74, the first season the steal was a recorded statistic, to post 17.0 points, 7.0 assists, 3.5 rebounds and 1.65 steals or higher for a single season.

In the Kings win over Orlando on Dec. 7, Fox recorded 20 points and a career-high tying five steals in just 22 and a half minutes as he is just one of 12 players in NBA history to total 20-plus points and five or more steals in 23 minutes played or less. The last player to accomplish 20 points and five steals in 23 minutes or under was Manu Ginobili who had 20 points and five steals in 19 minutes for San Antonio on Jan. 22, 2016.

Fox has dished out five or more assists in 65 games this season, the fifth most league-wide Fox has recorded eight or more assists in 40 games this season, the fourth most by a player this season as the Kings have won 22 games when Fox dished out eight or more assists. 22 wins in games where Fox has dished out eight-plus assists is the seventh most by a player this season. Fox recorded 11 assists against New Orleans on Apr. 7 for his 17th game with 10 or more assists as he has the sixth most games with 10-plus assists by a Kings player in franchise history in their first or second season as Oscar Robertson has the franchise record with 50 games during his sophomore season. Fox had tallied 581 assists this season, which is the sixth most by a Kings player during the Sacramento Era as he trails Jason Williams who is in fifth place with 589 assists during the 1999-00 season while Rajon Rondo holds the Sac Era record with 839 dimes during the 2015-16 season.

With 13 assists against Oklahoma City on Nov. 19 and 13 against Utah on Nov. 21, Fox is one of seven players this season to have consecutive games with 13 assists. At 20 years old, Fox is the first player to dish out 12 or more assists in consecutive outings before his 21st birthday since John Wall when the Wizards guard completed the feat on Feb. 23 and Feb. 25, 2011.

BIG NIGHT IN THE BIG EASY FOR DE'AARON: Kings guard De'Aaron Fox totaled 12 assists to go with 25 points, five rebounds, three steals and one block as he is just the eighth player in NBA history since 1983-84 to post 25 points, 12 assists, five boards, three steals and one block or more in a single game before their 22nd birthday. He is the fourth player this season to record 25-5-12-3-1 joining Wizards guards Bradley Beal (1/13/19) and John Wall (12/16/18) and Lakers forward LeBron James (2/12/19, 2/23/19). Fox has recorded 25-plus points and 12 or more assists in four games this season, which is tied with Hawks guard Trae Young for the third most by any player this season only behind Rockets guard James Harden (10) and Lakers forward LeBron James (8). Fox has had eight games this season with 12 or more assists, the sixth most games with 12-plus assists. The game marked Fox's fourth 25-point and 10-assist performance as he has the most outings in a single season with 25 points and 10 assists by a Kings player at 21 years of age or younger surpassing Tyreke Evans who had three during his rookie since in 2009-10 at the age of 20.

FOX'S THIEVERY: Sacramento Kings guard De'Aaron Fox had 19 straight contests with a steal as Fox's streak began on Dec. 19 vs Oklahoma City. Fox is averaging 1.65 steals per game for the ninth highest steals per game average league-wide as he is one of six players this season to record a steal in 19 consecutive outings along with Celtics guard Marcus Smart (25 games from 11/17/18 to 1/9/19), Thunder guard Russell Westbrook (23 games from 10/28 to 12/25/18), Rockets forward P.J. Tucker (20 games from 1/13 to 2/27/19), Suns forward Mikal Bridges (20 games from 1/19 to 3/6/19) and Lakers guard Rajon Rondo (19 games from 2/27 to 4/4/19). Fox recorded a career-high six steals on Mar. 24 as he was the 16th player this season with six steals or more in a single outing as he has had three games with five-plus steals this season making him just the 11th player in the NBA this season with three or more games tallying five or more steals. Fox is also just the 15th player in franchise history with three games where he recorded five or more steals in each of those three contests during a single season.

Fox is the first Kings player to have 19 or more straight games with a steal since Tyreke Evans had 23 games in a row with a steal from Jan. 1 to Feb. 11, 2012. Fox is also just one of eight players in franchise history to swipe a steal in 19 consecutive outings as he tied Spud Webb and Chris Webber for the 12th longest streak in the franchise's history.

ANOTHER DOUBLE-DOUBLE IN THE BAG: Kings first-year forward Marvin Bagley III tallied 19 points and 14 rebounds against the New Orleans Pelicans on Apr. 7 for his 19th double-double this season as well as his 15th double-double as a reserve. 15 double-doubles off the bench are the third most with as he trails Pacers forward Domantas Sabonis (27) and Clippers forward Montrezl Harrell (17). Bagley III has had seven outings with 20 points and 10 rebounds as five of them have come off the bench as he is the third rookie in league history with three or more games where he recorded 20 points and 10 rebounds as a reserve. The five 20-10 games off the bench by a rookie is the second most surpassing Charlie Villanueva who had four during the 2005-06 season as Jeff Ruland holds the top spot with 14 during his rookie year for the Washington Bullets during the 1981-82 season. Bagley III eclipses the Kings rookie franchise mark off the bench as he passes DeMarcus Cousins who recorded 20 points and 10 rebounds as a reserve in three games for Sacramento during the 2010-11 season.

Bagley III tallied his 13th double-double this season with 25 points and 11 boards on Feb. 25 at Minnesota as well as his fourth game with 22 points and 11 rebounds or more. Bagley III surpasses Lakers forward LeBron James, Mavericks forward Luka Doncic and Carmelo Anthony for the most games by a teenage rookie with 22-plus points and 11-plus boards as all three recorded three games with 22 points and 11 rebounds or better. Bagley III is also just the sixth rookie in his teens with five or more games totaling 20 points and 10 rebounds, tied for the fourth most with Pelicans forward Anthony Davis and Pelicans center Jahliil Okafor as he is behind Wizards center Dwight Howard (8), Doncic (7), James (6). In NBA history, Bagley III is also just the fourth teenage rookie to tally 13-plus double-doubles as he only trails Howard (32), Davis (14) and Doncic (15) for the most double-doubles by a rookie in his teens during his first year in The Association.

Bagley III had another career night on Feb. 21 at Golden State as he recorded his 11th double-double of the season with 28 points and 14 rebounds while tying his career-high with 11 makes from the charity stripe and setting a new career-best with 14 attempts from the line. Bagley III is one of three rookies in his teens to record 28 points and 14 rebounds or better as only James (11/29/03, MEM vs. CLE) and Timberwolves center Karl-Anthony Towns (10/30/15, MIN vs. DEN) tallied 28-plus points and 14-plus rebounds in a single game in their teens during their first NBA season. Bagley III is one of nine Kings rookies to post 28 points or more to go with 14 boards or more and is the last Kings rookie to do so since Lionel Simmons totaled 33 points and 14 rebounds on Feb. 12, 1991 in a win versus the LA Clippers; he is only the third Kings rookie in the Sacramento Era to score 28 or more points and collect 14 or more rebounds in a single game.

Bagley III has recorded three straight games with a double-double for the third time this season from Mar. 21 to Mar. 24, as this is the third time this season he has totaled three consecutive games with a double-double. Bagley III had a three-game double-doubles streak from Feb. 21 to Feb. 25 as he also recorded four straight double-doubles from Jan. 30 to Feb. 6. Amongst his fellow first-year players, Bagley III is tied for the second longest double-doubles streak this season with Doncic and Hawks guard Trae Young as only Phoenix Suns center DeAndre Ayton has had a longer streak when he recorded five straight games with a double-double from Dec. 15 to Dec. 23, 2018. His three streaks of three games or longer with a double-double is the second most behind Ayton who has had four double-double streaks of three games or more. Bagley III has 19 double-doubles over the course of the 2018-19 season, the fourth most as he is behind Ayton (39), Young (29) and Doncic (23). Bagley III has the most double-doubles by a Kings rookie since DeMarcus Cousins tallied 26 double-doubles as a rookie during the 2010-11 season as his double-doubles streak earlier this season tied the fourth longest by a Sacramento rookie with Tyreke Evans who had four consecutive double-doubles from Mar. 10 to Mar. 16, 2019. DeMarcus Cousins is the most recent Kings rookie with four or more straight double-doubles as Cousins tallied five double-doubles in a row from Feb. 7 to Feb. 16, 2011.

2018-19 KINGS NOTES

MARVIN'S MAGNIFICENT RETURN: Kings rookie forward Marvin Bagley III had another historic outing in Sacramento's victory over the Dallas Mavericks on Mar. 21 as he posted 22 points, 12 rebounds and four blocks while going 8-for-16 from the floor to go with new career-highs as he went 3-of-5 from three-point distance. Bagley III is the first rookie this season with 20+ points, 10+ rebounds and four-plus blocks and second rookie in Kings franchise history along with Brian Grant who did so three times on Jan. 5, Jan. 28 and Mar. 14, 1995. Bagley III is the seventh rookie reserve in NBA history with 20 points, 10 rebounds and four blocks or better as well as just the second rookie to come off the bench and total 22 points, 12 rebounds and four blocks along with Greg Kelsey who had 24 points, 12 boards and four blocks on Mar. 20, 1980 for the Detroit Pistons.

Bagley III is averaging 17.9 points (.490 FG%, .414 3pt%, .661 FT%), 8.9 rebounds, 1.1 assists, 0.4 steals and 0.9 blocks over his last 14 games since returning from his injury and has scored in double-figures in all 14 games, which includes three straight double-doubles from Mar. 21 to Mar. 24 and as he has six total double-doubles since his return.

RANKS AROUND THE LEAGUE: The Sacramento Kings are currently in the top 10 in these statistical categories: 10th in points (114.0) per game, ninth in steals (8.32) and offensive rebounds (11.04) per game, seventh in turnovers (13.4) per game and sixth in assist to turnover ratio (1.90) as the Kings are also shooting the fourth best three-point field goal percentage (.377), while holding their opponents to the 10th lowest percentage from beyond the arc at .346 percent. The Kings are second in points off of opponents turnovers as Sacramento is averaging 19.2 points per game off their opponents turnovers as Sacramento is currently forcing 15.9 opponents' turnovers per game this season, the second most league-wide.

Individually, Kings guard De'Aaron Fox is ninth in assists per game average at 7.3 as well as ninth in steals per game averaging 1.66 steals per outing. Kings guard Buddy Hield is eighth in three-point field goal shooting percentage in the NBA at .426 percent. Hield is also seventh in the NBA in free throw percentage as he is making .886 percent of his shots from the charity stripe. Kings forward Marvin Bagley III is currently fifth in points per game at 14.8 points per outing and third in rebounding as he is collecting 7.6 boards per contest.

A BACKCOURT DUO LIKE NO OTHER: Sacramento Kings guards De'Aaron Fox and Buddy Hield have been a tremendous starting backcourt as the two have combined for 55+ points in a single game four times this season after Fox scored 28 points and Hield totaled a career-high 37 points for 65 points in their win vs. Oklahoma City on Dec. 19. Since the NBA began listing positions in their lineups in the 1970-71 season, the last Kings backcourt to total 55 or more points in a single game multiple times was during the 2006-07 season when Mike Bibby and Kevin Martin notched 55-plus points together in four games that season. In franchise history, two starting backcourt duos have done this in 10 games during a single season, which includes guards Tom Van Arsdale and Nate Archibald in 1971-97 and Phil Ford and Otis Birdsong in 1970-1980 per Elias Sports Bureau.

The pair of Fox and Hield is averaging 17.3 and 20.8 points per game respectively. Fox is grabbing 3.8 rebounds and dishing out 7.3 assists per game and Hield is collecting 5.0 boards while tallying 2.5 assists per contest as they are one of three starting backcourt duos (Trail Blazers guards Damian Lillard and CJ McCollum and Wizards guards Bradley Beal and John Wall) to total 17.0 points, 3.5 rebounds and 2.5 assists per game or more this season with a minimum of 15 starts together.

SETTING THE PACE AND ATTACKING: The Kings have been pushing the pace all throughout the season as they have the second highest pace this season along at 103.95, which has helped them average 21.1 fastbreak points per game, the highest average this season; .185 percent of Sacramento's points per game are currently coming from fast break points, the highest in the NBA as they are 8-4 when scoring 30-plus fast break points, including winning their last four games when they totaled 30 or more points on the fast break. Sacramento's ability to get down the court has also helped them become one of the better teams in the NBA in points in the paint per game as the Kings are averaging 51.8 points in the paint per game, the sixth highest average this season.

RESERVES CAME TO PLAY: In the Kings 135-113 win over the Atlanta Hawks, Sacramento's bench totaled a new season-high as the reserves scored 80 points collectively as four of the team's eight reserves posted double-figures in scoring, including Kings center-forward Harry Giles III who notched a career-high 20 points as he made a career-best 10 field goals on 12 tries. Kings forward Marvin Bagley III chipped in 17 points and 12 rebounds, which at the time was his seventh double-double of the season and sixth double-double when coming off the bench.

The Kings bench is currently averaging 42.3 points per contest most points per game, the seventh most points by a team's bench this season.

TAKING CARE OF THE ROCK: For a second straight game, the Sacramento Kings had less than eight turnovers as they had a season-low tying seven turnovers in their win at Dallas on Mar. 26 after having only eight turnovers in their game at the Los Angeles Lakers on Mar. 24. Sacramento is one of two teams this season with three streaks of two games with eight or less turnovers as the Charlotte Hornets (2/2-2/5/19, 2/11-2/14/19, 3/24-3/26/19, 4/5-4/7/19) have also notched back-to-back games with eight or less turnovers three or more different times this season. Only the Portland Trail Blazers (1/16-1/21/19) and Detroit Pistons (3/23-3/26) have had a longer streak with eight or less turnovers with each having three consecutive games with eight or fewer turnovers.

CAPPING OFF THE HOMESTAND WITH A WIN: The Sacramento Kings defeated the Phoenix Suns, 112-103, as the Kings went 39-for-92 from the field (.424) as well as 17-of-38 from beyond the arc. This is the fifth time in franchise history the Kings have knocked 17-plus shots from three-point range as well as the third time this season, previously done on Jan. 5, 2019 with 20 three-pointers versus Golden State, the franchise record, and Dec. 12, 2018 with 19 versus Minnesota.

The Kings limited Phoenix to nine three-pointers on 34 attempts as the Suns finished the game making .265 percent of their shots from three-point range, marking the 23rd game where an opponent has shot below .300 from beyond arc.

MAKING THE MOST OF THE CHARITY STRIPE: Sacramento Kings guard Buddy Hield recorded 28 points, six rebounds and a career-high tying seven assists in the Kings win versus the New York Knicks on Mar. 4 as he had posted 20 or more points while making seven or more shots from the free throw line in three straight games from Feb. 27 to Mar. 4. Hield became just the 18th player this season with three or more consecutive games with 20-plus points to go with seven-plus makes from the charity stripe as he averaged 27.7 points per game over the three games. Over the three-game stretch, Hield averaged eight made free throws on eight free throw attempts as his free throws made average was the fifth highest league-wide over that span of games.

Hield is the first Kings player with a three-game streak with 20 points or greater while knocking down seven or more shots from the line since DeMarcus Cousins had four straight games where he scored 20 or more points and had seven makes from the charity stripe or more.

THE SHARPSHOOTING KINGS: The Kings have made 10 or more three-pointers in 58 games this season after making 15 vs. New Orleans on Apr. 7. The 58 games with 10-plus makes from three-point range is also the team's new franchise record after the previous mark was 34, set during the 2016-17 season while Sacramento has also made 909 three-pointers this season, which is a new franchise record for a single season as well. The Kings made nine three-pointers during their game against Washington on Mar. 11 which gave them 740 total three-pointers for the season, surpassing the previous record set during 2017-18 when they had 738 makes from beyond the arc that season.

With 15 three-pointers against the Phoenix Suns on Jan. 8, the Kings had a 12-game streak with 10 or more three-pointers in a game, the longest streak in franchise history with 10 or more three-pointers, which started on Dec. 17 with 18 three-pointers at Minnesota.

AN ALL-AROUND WIN ON ST. PATTY'S DAY: The Sacramento Kings snapped a three-game losing streak as they defeated the Chicago Bulls, 129-102, on Mar. 17 for their largest margin of victory at home this season. Sacramento held Chicago to just 40 points in the first half, tied for the lowest points in the first half by a Kings opponent this season with the Phoenix Suns who had 40 points through the first 24 minutes on Jan. 8. The Kings totaled 32 points in the second frame as they went on to outscore the Bulls, 43 to 31, in the third quarter as Sacramento has now had nine 40-point quarters this season. The game marked the third game this season where the Kings have had two quarters with a 12-point scoring differential or more, which includes their first meeting with Chicago on Dec. 10 as well as their win at home against Orlando on Jan. 7. The Kings went up in the contest by as many as 37 points, which ties the largest lead in a game for Sacramento this season and the largest lead they have held in an outing at Golden 1 Center as they totaled 99 points through the first three frames for the fifth time this season. The Kings are now 4-1 this season when scoring 99 points or more through the first three quarters of play.

Sacramento finished the game going 54-of-103 from the field as they finished the game with 80 points in the paint, marking a new season-high as the Kings are 4-1 when posting 70 or more points in the paint in a game. Sacramento also tallied 23 second chance points, which ties a season-high for the Kings in second chance points previously done on Nov. 17 at Houston. The Kings reserves ended the game with 64 points as Sacramento's reserves have scored 60-plus points in 10 games this season.

2018-19 KINGS NOTES

A WEEKEND WELL SPENT IN CHARLOTTE: The Sacramento Kings sent four players to Charlotte, North Carolina for 2019 All-Star Weekend which included Kings guards Bogdan Bogdanovic, De'Aaron Fox, Buddy Hield and forward Marvin Bagley III. With four players attending All-Star weekend, Sacramento was tied for the most representatives with the Brooklyn Nets and Toronto Raptors. Bagley III, Bogdanovic and Fox all participated in the 2019 MTN Dew Ice Rising Stars challenge as Bagley III and Fox represented Team USA while Bogdanovic competed for Team World as Team USA defeated Team World, 161-144.

Fox would also go on to represent the Kings in the 2019 Taco Bell Skills Challenge as he was edged out by Hawks guard Trae Young in the first round. Hield was also a competitor for the Kings during Saturday night of All-Star weekend as he went on to score a 26 in the first round of the 2019 MTN Dew 3-Point Contest to move on to the final round with Brooklyn Nets guard Joe Harris and Golden State Warriors guard Stephen Curry. Hield would post 19 points in the championship round for a third place finish as he placed behind Curry (24) and the winner Harris (26).

Fox is the second Sacramento player in as many seasons to be featured as a participant in the Skills Competition as Hield joined the field in 2018. DeMarcus Cousins is the only other player to represent the Kings in the Skills Contest after competing in back-to-back years in 2016 and 2017. Hield marks the fifth player to represent Sacramento at the All-Star Saturday in the 3-point contest and first since current Kings Assistant General Manager Peja Stojakovic was a competitor in 2004 after winning the event in consecutive years in 2002 and 2003. Other Kings players to compete in the 3-Point Contest include Danny Ainge (1991), Jim Les (1992) and Mitch Richmond (1992, 1994).

KEYS TO SUCCESS IN THE BIG APPLE: The Sacramento Kings picked up a 102-94 victory on the road against the New York Knicks on Mar. 9 as they swept the 2018-19 season series versus New York. The Kings held New York to under 100 points as they are now 10-0 this season when giving up 100 points or fewer to their opponents and are only one of five teams this season to be undefeated when holding their opponent to fewer than 100 points (Los Angeles Lakers, Oklahoma City Thunder, Philadelphia 76ers, Washington Wizards). Sacramento also limited the Knicks to 10 three-pointers on 35 attempts for a .286 three-point percentage as the Kings move to 16-6 this season when their opponents shoot below the .300 percent threshold from beyond the arc as they also finished with a new season-low in turnovers just seven in the contest.

The Kings finished the game shooting .379 percent from the floor as they are only one of three teams this season, including the New York Knicks and Houston Rockets, to win two games while shooting under .380 percent from the field. Despite Sacramento's shooting from the field, the Kings went 7-for-14 from three-point range in the third quarter, tying the franchise mark for the most three-pointers in a quarter, which had been done three times previously in franchise history before the 2018-19 season. The Kings have made seven treys in a single quarter four other times this season as they last made seven three-pointers in the first quarter on Feb. 4 at home against the San Antonio Spurs.

Kings guard De'Aaron Fox recorded 30 points, eight assists and five rebounds and at 21 years and 79 days old he becomes the youngest player in franchise history to score 30 or more points in a game at Madison Square Garden. Oscar Robertson previously held the record with 32 points on Feb. 12, 1961 at MSG as he was 22 years and 80 days old.

STRONG START IN BEAN TOWN: The Sacramento Kings lost, 120-126, to the Boston Celtics on Mar. 14, but got off to a strong start as Sacramento scored 38 first quarter points going 14-for-20 from the floor for a new season-high shooting percentage for a quarter at .700 percent. The 38 points in the first quarter are tied for the most by the Kings in a first quarter against the Celtics on the road as Sacramento has now scored 38-plus points in the first quarter just seven times when taking on Boston.

Kings guard Buddy Hield made a career-high 14 shots from the field as he recorded a game-high 34 points to go with a career-high tying seven assists as he has had seven games with 30-plus points, the most by a Kings player since DeMarcus Cousins had 22 games with 30 or more points during the 2016-17 season.

TAKING DOWN THE THUNDER: The Sacramento Kings defeated the Oklahoma City Thunder, 119-116, at Chesapeake Energy Arena on Feb. 23 as the Kings took the season series, winning three out of the four game against the Thunder this season. Since the Thunder's relocation to Oklahoma City from Seattle after the 2007-08 season this is the first time Sacramento has won three games against Oklahoma City in a single season as the Kings last beat the Sonics three times during the 2007-08 season.

MARVIN'S CASE FOR ROOKIE OF THE MONTH: Sacramento Kings rookie forward Marvin Bagley III recorded 25 points and 11 rebounds on Feb. 25 at Minnesota as he recorded three straight double-doubles from Feb. 21 to Feb. 25 as his performance against the Timberwolves game marked his sixth double-double for the month of February. Six double-doubles in February was tied for the most by any rookie with Mavericks guard Luka Doncic and Hawks guard Trae Young as Bagley III averaged 17.5 points, 9.4 rebounds, 1.4 assists, 0.9 steals and 1.2 blocks per game in 10 games during February. He was tied for 18th in rebounds per game during the month of February amongst the entire NBA and was fourth in points per game amongst rookies while he ranked second in rebounds and blocks per game amongst other first-year players during February.

His six double-doubles during February are tied for the fifth most by a Kings rookie during the second month of the year as DeMarcus Cousins tallied five double-doubles in February during the 2010-11 season.

A STRONG FINISH TO THE HOMESTAND AT GOLDEN 1 CENTER: The Sacramento Kings defeated the Phoenix Suns in their third wire-to-wire win of the season, 117-104, on Feb. 10 to grab their fifth victory during their six-game homestand that began with a win against Atlanta on Jan. 30. The Kings lost just once over their six-game stretch at home against Houston on Feb. 6 as this is the first time Sacramento has won five home games during a homestand since the team went 5-3 from Mar. 7 to Mar. 20, 2012 over an eight-game stretch at home.

Sacramento set new season-highs for free throws made and attempts from the charity stripe as the Kings went 32-for-44 for the game. The game marks the first time Sacramento has knocked down 30-plus shots from the free throw line and attempted 40 or more shots from the free throw line since the team went 39-for-50 in a win vs. Denver on Nov. 11, 2014. The Kings also limited the Suns to a season-low tying six three-pointers on 27 tries from beyond the arc (.222).

Kings guard Buddy Hield scored 34 points in the game, marking his fifth game this season where he recorded 30 or more points, the most by a Kings player since DeMarcus Cousins posted 30-plus points in 26 games for Sacramento during the 2016-17 season.

RAINING THREES IN DOWNTOWN SACRAMENTO: The Sacramento Kings and Golden State Warriors combined for 41 three-pointers, which was the NBA record at the time, as the Kings set their franchise record for three-pointers made for the second time this season with 20 makes from beyond the three-point line on Jan. 5 while the Warriors totaled 21 treys. The Kings were 20-for-36 from three-point range (.556) as both Buddy Hield and Justin Jackson had career nights from long distance. Hield went 8-for-13 from three-point range in the game as he fell one three-pointer shy of tying the Kings franchise record for most three-pointers in a game (Mike Bibby, 9 3FGM on 3/25/07; Omri Casspi, 9 3FGM on 12/28/15).

Despite Golden State (24) and New Orleans (19) setting the new three-pointers made record with 43 on Jan. 16, the Kings and Warriors meeting on Jan. 5 is still the only game in NBA history where two teams have each made 20 or more three-pointers.

2018-19 KINGS NOTES

BAGLEY III'S 30-POINT PERFORMANCE: The Sacramento Kings 117-104 win versus the Phoenix Suns was in big part to their ability to get to the free throw line as the Kings went 32-of-44 from the charity stripe as Kings forward Marvin Bagley III went 11-for-13 from the free throw line, setting new career-highs for free throws made and attempted. His 11 makes on 13 attempts from the line are new season-highs for a Kings player as he finished the game going 10-for-15 from the field, tying his career-high in field goals made while setting a new career-high with 32 points.

Bagley III is the first Kings rookie since Buddy Hield to score 30 points in a game as Hield had 30 points on Apr. 11, 2017 vs. Phoenix. Bagley III is just the fourth Kings rookie during the Sacramento-Era to come off the bench and record 30-plus points as the last Kings rookie reserve with 30 points was Skal Labissiere who had 32 points in a win vs. Phoenix on Mar. 15, 2017.

In regular season games, Bagley III is just the third rookie in his teens to score 30 or more points as a reserve along with Ricky Davis (32, CHH vs. BOS on May 5, 1999) and Myles Turner (31, IND vs. GSW on Jan. 22, 2016).

MARVIN'S MAKING HISTORY: Sacramento Kings rookie forward Marvin Bagley III started his first career game against the Toronto Raptors on Jan. 22, as he totaled a career-high 22 points while setting new career-highs going 10-for-20 from the field to go with 11 rebounds. Bagley III is the first Kings player to record 20 or more points in his first career start since Omri Casspi had 22 points on Dec. 16, 2009 vs. Washington. Bagley III is also the first Kings player to notch 20 points and 10 rebounds or better in their first career start since Mike Ratliff collected 20 points and 19 rebounds for a double-double on Nov. 29, 1972 vs. Portland per Elias Sports Bureau.

The game marked the second time this season where Bagley III recorded a double-double with 20 points and 10 boards or more as he is just the 13th player in NBA history to record two or more 20 and 10 games as a teenager during his rookie season. Dwight Howard holds the most 20-point and 10-rebound performances as a rookie teen with eight during the 2004-05 season.

DE'AARON DOES IT AGAIN: During Sacramento's 129-110 win over the Cleveland Cavaliers, Kings guard De'Aaron Fox made a career-high 12 field goals on 16 attempts to go for 30 points while also dishing out 12 assists. Fox is just the 23rd player in NBA history to record 30 points and 12 assists or more in two games through the first 24 games of the season and only the third player in franchise history with two or more games with 30 points and 12 assists as only Oscar Robertson (1960-69) and Tiny Archibald (1972-73) have also completed the task; Fox notched 31 points and 15 assists on Nov. 1 at Atlanta. Fox is the first player to have two or more 30 point and 12 assist performances through 24 games in the Sacramento Era and only the second player in the Sacramento Era to have multiples games with 30 points and 12 assists as Reggie Theus was the only other player to have two games with 30-12 in a Sacramento Kings uniform during the 1985-86 season.

Fox is one of eight players to have two or more games with 30 points and 12 assists or more and is the first to do so in a Kings uniform since Mike Bibby had three 30 and 10 outings during the 2005-06 season.

FOX JOINS THE HISTORY BOOKS: Sacramento Kings guard De'Aaron Fox played a pivotal role in the Kings 146-115 win over the Atlanta Hawks on Nov. 1, as Fox collected 31 points, 15 assists and 10 rebounds for his first career triple-double. At 20 years and 316 days old, Fox checked in as the youngest player in NBA history to record a triple-double with 30 points, 15 assists and 10 rebounds. Magic Johnson was the previous record holder as he recorded a triple-double on Mar. 29, 1981 at 21 years and 227 days old with 33 points, 17 assists and 15 boards.

He is the last Kings player with a 30-point triple-double since Mitch Richmond on Jan. 22, 1997 when he tallied 38 points, 10 rebounds and 10 assists. Fox also joins Lakers forward LeBron James as the only two players in the league's history to notch a 30-point triple-double before their 21st birthday.

STREAKING AT HOME: The Sacramento Kings defeated the San Antonio Spurs, 127-112, on Feb. 4 as they picked up their seventh consecutive victory on their home court. The last time the Kings won seven in a row at home was during the 2005-06 season when Sacramento had 14 straight home wins from Jan. 15 to Mar. 16, 2006; Sacramento's streak began on Jan. 7 in their win over Orlando. Sacramento seven-game home winning streak was snapped on Feb. 6 versus Houston.

KEYS TO SUCCESS: The Sacramento Kings won their game at home against the San Antonio Spurs on Feb. 4, 127-112, as they took the lead into the fourth quarter as they move to 20-2 this season when they are ahead of their opponent through the first three quarters of play. The Kings have won three straight games and have been leading their opponents after three quarters in all three of those wins.

Sacramento also outrebounded the Spurs, 48 to 46 as the Kings were 16-3 in games where they have more boards than their opponent. The Kings scored 35 fast break points, totaling 30 or more fast break points for the first time since totaling 32 vs. Golden State on Jan. 5 and are 8-4 this season when scoring 30-plus on the fast break. Sacramento had 20 fast break points in the first quarter as they were just the second team this season with 20 or more fast break points for a quarter as Philadelphia had 21 fast break points in the first quarter at the Los Angeles Lakers on Jan. 29, 2019.

STREAKING AT HOME: The Sacramento Kings defeated the San Antonio Spurs, 127-112, on Feb. 4 as they picked up their seventh consecutive victory on their home court. The last time the Kings won seven in a row at home was during the 2005-06 season when Sacramento had 14 straight home wins from Jan. 15 to Mar. 16, 2006; Sacramento's streak began on Jan. 7 in their win over Orlando. Sacramento seven-game home winning streak was snapped on Feb. 6 versus Houston.

KINGS OF THE COMEBACK: The Sacramento Kings picked up another home victory as they beat the Miami Heat, 102-96, despite falling behind by as many as 17 with 4:24 to go in the third quarter. The Kings would go on to outscore the Heat, 40 to 17 from the 4:24 mark as well as scoring 27 points in the fourth quarter while limiting Miami to just 13 points over the last 12 minutes of the game. This is just the 16th time this season where a team has held their opponent to 13 or fewer points in the fourth quarter. The Kings are just the ninth team to outscore their opponent by 14 or more points in the final quarter of the game while holding their opposition to 13 points or less for the fourth quarter.

Over the last six minutes and 29 seconds of the game, the Kings forced five turnovers as Miami was 1-for-12 from the field and 1-for-9 from three-point range as they ended the game with 22 points off of 20 Heat turnovers. Sacramento has had nine games this season where they forced 20 or more turnovers and are 7-2 when doing so.

Sacramento swept the season series against Miami for a second straight as the four straight wins ties longest winning streak against the Heat in team history previously set from Jan. 11, 1994 to Dec. 10, 1995. The Kings move to 8-1 (.889) at home this season against Eastern Conference foes, tied for the highest winning percentage in the entire NBA with the Milwaukee Bucks who are 16-2 (.889) at home against the Eastern Conference. After holding Miami to under 100 points, the Kings remain undefeated when their opponents score less than 100 points as they are 9-0 in those instances.

BUDDY DRILLS THE GAME-WINNER: The Sacramento Kings defeated the Detroit Pistons, 103-101, after being down by one with 3.4 seconds to go in the fourth quarter as Kings guard Buddy Hield made a game-winning three-pointer at the buzzer. Hield finished with 35 points as he made a career-high 13 field goals on 22 tries as well as 7-for-9 from beyond the arc as the last second shot marks the first game-winning shot of his career. Hield recorded 15 points in the final 12 minutes of the contest as he went 5-for-10 from the field and 4-of-4 from long distance in the fourth quarter. He is the first player this season to score 35 points while making seven three-pointers on nine or less attempts from three-point range.

This is the Kings second sweep of the Pistons over the last three seasons as the victory snapped their season-long five-game road losing streak.

2018-19 KINGS NOTES

BACK IN THE WIN COLUMN IN KING LIKE FASHION: The Sacramento Kings snapped a four-game losing streak after defeating the Orlando Magic, 111-95, on Dec. 7 while also ending their three-game home skid. For just the sixth time this season, the Kings limited their opponent to under 100 points as their are undefeated this season when holding their opponent to 100 points or less. The Kings held Orlando to just 32 made field goals and 15 assists, marking new season-lows by a Kings opponent this season. Orlando finished the game shooting .368 percent, the lowest field goal percentage by a Sacramento opponent this season as the Kings are 6-0 in games this year when their opponent shoots below .400 percent from the field.

Sacramento once again took care of the ball as they ended the night with just nine turnovers against Orlando as the Kings had three straight contests with nine or less turnovers from Jan. 3 to Jan. 7. Three games in a row with nine or fewer turnovers is the longest streak this season, tied with the Cleveland Cavaliers and Portland Trail Blazers. Only three teams last season (Brooklyn Nets, Oklahoma City Thunder, Dallas Mavericks) had a streak of three or more games with nine turnovers or less as Dallas had the longest streak with four games from Jan. 7 to Jan.13, 2018.

SACRAMENTO'S SHOOTING LEADS TO FRANCHISE NIGHT: The Sacramento Kings beat the Minnesota Timberwolves, 141-130, for their second straight home victory overall and second consecutive home win over the Timberwolves. Sacramento shot a season-best .581 percent while also knocking down .500 percent of their shots from beyond the arc, marking the first time this season the team has shot .500 or better from three-point range. The Kings notched 19 makes from beyond the arc as the team set a then franchise record for made three-pointers (previous was 18 which was done twice; 1/28/18 at San Antonio, 2/10/17 vs. Atlanta) while tying their franchise record of 38 three-point attempts, set earlier this season at Oklahoma City on Oct. 19. The 141 points in the contest marks the second time this season that the Kings have scored 140 or more points in a single outing, the most games with 140 points in a single season since the 1988-89 Sacramento Kings team that had three games with 140-plus points. Through 27 games, only two other teams in franchise history managed to score 140 points in two games, which includes the 1982-83 Kansas City Kings and the 1960-61 Cincinnati Royals.

With the victory over Minnesota, the Kings moved to 9-1 when leading at the halftime break and 11-0 when holding the scoring edge headed into the fourth quarter. The 11-point win marks the seventh time this season the Kings have defeated an opponent by double-digits as Sacramento has beaten their opponents by double figures in each of their last four wins.

THE COMEBACK KIDS: The Sacramento Kings beat the New Orleans Pelicans 122-117 on Dec. 23 as the Kings notched their second straight win when being down by 19 points after being down by 19 with 2:08 to go in the first quarter. Sacramento would have to mount their second consecutive fourth quarter comeback as well as the Kings led in the opening minute, 3-0, and would not retake the lead until 5:29 in the fourth quarter.

The Kings are the first team to record consecutive victories after being in at least a 19-point hole since the Indiana Pacers won two straight games after being down by 19 or more points on Jan. 11 and 13, 2010. Sacramento has trailed by 11-plus points at halftime and pulled out the win in three games this season (12/12 vs. Memphis, 12/10 at Chicago). Sacramento was also down 10 points going into the fourth quarter marking just the 10th time since the 2007-08 season that the Kings have had a comeback win when trailing by 10-plus points after three quarters.

Sacramento got help in their comeback from guard Buddy Hield who totaled 28 points, including 19 in the second half as he went 7-for-9 from the field and 5-of-5 from three-point range in the third and fourth quarters. Center Willie Cauley-Stein finished the game with 22 points and 17 rebounds, career-high for boards, as he grabbed nine rebounds in the fourth quarter alone, a new season-high for a Kings player for a single quarter.

THE KINGS KEEP FLYING HIGH AT THE AMERICA AIRLINES CENTER: On Dec. 16, the Sacramento Kings defeated the Dallas Mavericks 120-113 to pick up their third consecutive win at the American Airlines Center, tying the longest winning streak at Dallas in team history. Three straight wins at Dallas has occurred two other times in franchise history, from Mar. 20, 1992 to Apr. 16, 1993 and Oct. 17, 1980 to Feb. 3, 1981. Kings guard Buddy Hield scored 28 points on career-highs as he went 12-for-23 from the field and guard De'Aaron Fox also added 28 points. Kings forward Nemanja Bjelica recorded his third double-double this season with 15 points and 10 rebounds while also recording a career-high four blocks.

The game marks just the eighth time in team history the Kings have won a game in Dallas while scoring 120 or more points with the last time coming on Dec. 7, 2016. During the 2018-19 season, this was the 11th game where Sacramento has totaled 120 or more points in a single contest. 11 games with 120 points or greater is the most in a single season by a Kings team since 1992-93, when that Kings team tallied 13 120-point performances. The Kings had won eight of the 11 games games where they notched 120-plus points, which is the most by a team since the same 1992-93 squad had eight wins with 120 points or more over the entire season.

A TALE OF TWO HALVES IN A COME FROM BEHIND WIN: The Sacramento Kings defeated the Memphis Grizzlies, 102-99, at Golden 1 Center on Dec. 21 as the Kings found themselves down by as many as 19 points in the ball game. The 19-point deficit is the largest the Kings have overcome in a victory so far this season. Sacramento struggled in first half with just 14 made field goals while shooting .292 percent for 40 points, which are all new season-lows for the Kings for a half. Sacramento would get huge help from Buddy Hield in the fourth quarter as he totaled 16 fourth quarter points while making four three-pointers in the quarter while Memphis had three total makes from range as a team in the closing quarter.

MARVELOUS NIGHT FOR MARVIN: Sacramento Kings rookie forward Marvin Bagley III had another great night on Nov. 19 at home against the Oklahoma City Thunder as he collected his first career double-double with 15 points, 13 rebounds and three blocks. Bagley III's 13 rebounds were a then career-high as he was well as a then pulled new career-high with six offensive boards. Only 15 other played this season have totaled 15 points, 13 rebounds and three blocks or greater grabbing six or more rebounds on the offensive end.

Amongst his first-year peers, only Suns center DeAndre Ayton, Knicks center Mitchell Robinson and Bulls center Wendell Carter Jr. have notched 15 points and 13 rebounds and three blocks or more in a single game.

BOGI COMES UP BIG IN YET ANOTHER COMEBACK: The Sacramento Kings pulled off another come from behind win as they defeated the Los Angeles Lakers, 117-116, on Dec. 27 after Kings guard Bogdan Bogdanovic hit a three-pointer at the buzzer to secure the victory. The Kings have now won three straight home games and trailed by at least 15 or more in each of those outings. The Kings are the last team to win three consecutive home games when trailing by 15-plus points in each game since the San Antonio Spurs had three home wins in a row from Mar 4. to Mar. 8, 2017.

Sacramento trailed by 11 to start the fourth quarter and were down by as many as 15 with 6:29 left in the game before ending the contest on a 28-12 run. The 11-point deficit through three quarters is the most that Sacramento has overcome to pull off a win when facing off against the Lakers. In franchise history, the Kings have only mounted one larger fourth quarter comeback against the Los Angeles Lakers as the Cincinnati Royals were down 79-92 (-13) headed into the fourth quarter and collected the victory with a final score of 112-106 on Feb. 19, 1961 vs. the Los Angeles Lakers.

A ROYAL ROAD DEBUT: Sacramento Kings forward Marvin Bagley III had one of the franchise's better career road debuts as the rookie notched 19 points, eight rebounds, three assists, three steals and one block in his first career road game. Amongst the franchise's players who made their road debuts within their first or second career games, Bagley III's 19-point performance is the seventh highest scoring total while ranking sixth with DeMarcus Cousins in rebounds collected.

2018-19 KINGS NOTES

BUDDY BUCKETS CAREER NIGHT: Sacramento Kings guard Buddy Hield recorded a career-high 37 points as he went 11-for-25, marking a career-high in attempts while tying his career-high with seven three-pointers while setting a career-best on 14 attempts from range. Hield also knocked down a career-high eight free throws on a career-high eight attempts as he's just the seventh player this season to score 37 points and make seven three-pointers in a single game. Hield is just the sixth Kings player since 1989 to have multiple games with seven three-pointers while wearing a Kings uniform as Marcus Thornton was the last Kings player with seven or more makes from beyond the arc in two games as he went 7-for-15 on Jan. 24, 2014 and 8-for-12 on Feb. 26, 2013 on shots from three-point range.

THE SUN WAS SHINING EARLY FOR THE KINGS: The Sacramento Kings picked up their 12th win of the season and their first wire-to-wire victory of the year. The Kings allowed 33 second half points for the first time since giving up just 33 second half points to the New York Knicks in an 88-80 win at New York as the team has limited teams to 33 second half points or less just four other times over the last 10 seasons. The 30-point differential in the second half is the sixth highest in team history in a second half. Following this game, Sacramento went to 10-0 in games when leading after the third quarter as they defeated the Phoenix Suns, 122-105. Despite only winning by 17 at the final horn, the Kings led by as many as 35 in the game as they got off to a hot start scoring 36 points and holding the Suns to just nine first quarter points. The Kings limited Phoenix to just three field goals on 17 tries as the Suns also went 0-for-9 from three-point range. The three made field goals is a season-low for a Kings opponent while nine points also marks a season-low. Nine points for a quarter is the lowest points by a Kings opponent since Feb. 16, 2001 when the Denver Nuggets totaled just seven points in the second quarter.

The Kings limiting Phoenix to just nine points in the first quarter is the lowest since at least 1954 with the previous low being 10 when the Rochester Royals allowed just 10 points to the Philadelphia Warriors on Feb. 17, 1955. The 27-point differential in a quarter is the Kings' largest in the Sacramento era (since 1985). The Cincinnati Royals are also the only other team to have a +27 point differential in a quarter as the 1964-65 Royals outscored the New York Knicks, 50-21, in a win at New York on Dec. 19, 1964.

THE KINGS WENT STREAKING: The Sacramento Kings recorded five consecutive victories after defeating the Atlanta Hawks, 146-115, in Atlanta for the first time since Mar. 3, 2006 as they snapped an 11-game losing streak on the Hawks home court. The 31-point victory was a point shy of the Kings biggest victory over Atlanta as the Kings used a 46-point third quarter to break the contest open after being up, 69-64, at halftime. The 46 points in a quarter is tied for most points in the Sacramento-Era having been done several times with the most recent time coming against the Houston Rockets on Mar. 20, 2001 when the team notched 46 points in the first quarter. The huge quarter would lead the Kings to their 13th highest scoring game in franchise history and the most recent 145-point game by the team since Jan. 2, 1993 when Sacramento defeated Philadelphia, 154-98.

As a team, the Kings dished out 38 assists, which is the most by a Kings squad since Mar. 11, 2004 when the team recorded 39 assists in a win vs. Dallas. It is only the 30th time in team history where the Kings totaled 38 or more assists in a single outing as the team record currently sits at 42 assists, which has been done three times in team history.

During the five-game span, the Kings averaged 117.8 points, 50.6 rebounds, 26.4 assists, which ranks sixth, third and fifth respectively in the NBA over that time. Sacramento forced 18.6 opponents turnovers per game over the five-game stretch and averaged 22.4 points per game off of those turnovers, and scored 23.2 fast-break points per contest. League-wide, the Kings ranked second in opponents turnovers, points off turnovers and fast break points per game during their win-streak.

THE KINGS FINISH THE ROAD TRIP STRONG IN CHI-TOWN: The Sacramento Kings wrapped up their four-game road trip from Dec. 4 to Dec. 10 winning three out of the four contests, including a come from behind win over the Chicago Bulls. Sacramento would go on to defeat the Bulls, 108-89, despite giving up 56 points in the first half to Chicago and being down by 11 at halftime. The Kings would go on to outscore the Bulls, 36-18, in the third quarter as Sacramento made seven three-pointers, the most in a single quarter by the Kings this season. Guard De'Aaron Fox scored 15 points while the team also forced seven steals, another season-high for a quarter. The third quarter spark would help Sacramento score 63 second half points to Chicago's 33, an opponent season-low for a half as the Bulls made just 12 field goals on 34 attempts, also season-lows by an opponent for a half. Sacramento finished with a season-best 16 steals as they forced 27 turnovers marking just the sixth times in the last 10 years that the Kings have collected 16-plus steals as well as just the fourth time in regulation.

NOT YOUR TYPICAL ROOKIE: Sacramento Kings rookie forward Marvin Bagley III recorded his second career double-double with a career-high tying 20 points and a new career-high 17 rebounds at Golden State on Nov. 24, 2018. At 19 years old, Bagley III is the only rookie under 20 years old to total a double-double with 20 points and 17 rebounds through their first 20 career contests. Wizards center Dwight Howard is the only other player to total 15 points and 17 rebounds in a single game as a teenage rookie in his first 20 career games. Bagley III is just the fourth Kings rookie to collect 20 points and 17 rebounds in a single game through his first 20 career games with the last player being Joe Kleine who totaled 20 points and 19 rebounds in a win for the Kansas City-Omaha Kings versus the Portland Trail Blazers on Nov. 29, 1972. Only two other players in NBA history have scored 20 points and grabbed 17 or more boards while under the age of 20, including Pelicans forward Anthony Davis on Mar. 9, 2013 and Bill Willoughby on Apr. 10, 1976 while playing for the Atlanta Hawks.

Bagley III is now the 20th rookie over the last 20 seasons, including this season, to notch 20 points and 17 rebounds or greater in a game and the third rookie to do so while coming off the bench. Only five other players have totaled 20 points and 17 boards or better in a game as a reserve over the last 10 seasons, including Knicks center Enes Kanter who has done it twice this season.

SACRAMENTO'S FLORIDA MAGIC MAGIC CONTINUES: The Kings beat the Miami Heat, 123-113 on Oct. 29, and the Orlando Magic, 107-99, on Oct. 30 to notch four wins in-a-row in Florida, continuing their best start since the 2014-15 season when the team went 5-3 in their first eight games as well. The four-game winning streak is the longest stretch of wins for the Kings since the 2016-17 season when the team won four straight games from Feb. 8 to Feb. 14, 2017. The Kings have won both road games in Florida in consecutive seasons for the first time in team history while tying their longest winning-streak against the Magic with four straight wins. Sacramento picked up just their fifth victory ever in South Beach, marking the first season in the Sacramento-Era where they defeated the Heat on the road in consecutive seasons.

FILLING UP THE BOXSCORE: Kings forward-center Harry Giles III had himself a career night versus the Utah Jazz on Nov. 25, collecting 10 points and career-highs with eight rebounds, six assists and four steals. Giles III is just the fourth Kings rookie to total 10 points, eight rebounds, six assists and four steals or more in a single contest.

ANOTHER BIG NIGHT IN THE BAG FOR BAGLEY III: Kings rookie forward Marvin Bagley III had another huge night as he notched a career-high 20 points, nine rebounds and five blocks at the Denver Nuggets on Oct. 23, 2018. Bagley III is one of three Kings rookies since the 1983-84 season to post 20 points, nine boards and five blocks as Brian Grant achieved the feat twice (1/5/95, 3/14/95) and Duane Causwell recorded the numbers in a single game himself on Jan. 3, 1991. Bagley III is the first Kings rookie with five blocks in a game since Francisco Garcia recorded five blocks on Jan. 5, 2006.

Bagley III is just the 10th rookie since the 1999-00 season to tally 20 points, nine rebounds and five blocks or greater and only the third rookie in NBA history to do so while coming off the bench for his team with the other two being John Salley in 1987 and Stanley Roberts in 1992.

IT'S BEEN A WHILE: The Kings defeated the San Antonio Spurs, 104-99, at Golden 1 Center on Nov. 12, which snaps a 14-game overall losing streak to San Antonio. The last time the Kings defeated the Spurs was on Nov. 15, 2014, which is also the last time Sacramento had eight or more wins through their first 14 contests as their current record is 8-6. The Kings were 9-5 through their first 14 games to kick off the 2014-15 season. It is just the fourth time the Kings have defeated the Spurs over the last 10 seasons, including the second win in front of their home crowd and the first against San Antonio at Golden 1 Center.
