Head Coach Tom Thibodeau

Currently in his 11th campaign as an NBA head coach and his 31st overall NBA coaching season, he was formally named the 31st head coach in franchise history on July 30, 2020. Thibodeau earned 2020-21 NBA Coach of the Year honors after leading the orange and blue to their first NBA Playoff berth since 2013, recording a 41-31 (.569) record as the Knicks exhibited the unmatched defensive tenacity and all-for-one, team-oriented mindset that are trademarks of a Thibodeau-coached team.

With a 78-76 (.506) mark in two seasons with the Knicks, he is the 11th winningest coach in NYK franchise history. Thibodeau recorded his 400th career win as an NBA head coach on November 8, 2021, when the Knicks triumphed at Philadelphia, 103-96.

2 New York vs. Miami Heat- Round 2, Game 6

Thibodeau, 64, owns a career 430-322 (.572) regular season record, with 25-36 (.410) in Playoff competition. He has coached his teams to three 50+ win seasons and two divisional titles. Tom is the third-winningest coach in Bulls franchise history (255), trailing only Hall of Famer Phil Jackson (545) and Dick Motta (356). With 97 wins as Timberwolves coach, he is tied for second on the franchise list with Hall of Famer Rick Adelman (97), behind Flip Saunders (427).

Thibodeau's 430 career regular season wins rank 44th on the all-time NBA list, tied with former Knicks mentor Jeff Van Gundy and Hall of Famer Larry Costello. Tom's .572 career winning percentage ranks 24th all-time among NBA coaches who have logged at least 500 games. He entered the 2022-23 season ranked seventh among active head coaches in wins (430).

A two-time honoree as NBA Coach of the Year (2010-11 with Chicago, 2020-21 with New York), Tom is also a seven-time NBA Eastern Conference Coach of the Month (most recently in May 2021 with the Knicks). Thibodeau has coached in three NBA Finals (1999 with the Knicks, 2008 and 2010 with Boston), earning an NBA Championship ring with the 2008 Boston Celtics. He was voted NBA Coach of the Year in 2010-11 after leading the Chicago Bulls to a 62-win season. Tom's teams have advanced to the Playoffs in 20 (of his 30) NBA coaching seasons.

In 2020-21, Thibodeau joined Hall of Famers Red Holzman (1969-70) and Pat Riley (1992-93) as the only Knicks mentors to win the League's Coach of the Year award. Ending a seven-year post-season dry spell, the Knicks recorded their winningest season (41-31) since they won the Atlantic Division title in 2012-13 (54-28). New York led the NBA in fewest points allowed (104.7), lowest opposing field goal pct. (.440) and lowest opposition 3PT pct. (.337). According to Elias, the 2020-21 Knicks joined their fabled 60-win team of 1992-93 as the only teams in NBA history to lead the League in opposing ppg, FG pct. and 3PT pct. (Boston joined that elite group a year later, in 2021-22).

Re-joining the Knicks in Summer 2020, Thibodeau returned to the scene of some of his earliest coaching triumphs. Tom's initial stint in New York spanned seven seasons (1996-97 through 2002-03) as an assistant coach under Jeff Van Gundy and Don Chaney. The Knicks advanced to the NBA Playoffs in each of his first five seasons in New York, including trips to the East Finals in 1999 and 2000 and an Eastern Conference Championship in 1999.

- **Brunson** also shot 54.5% from the field. He is the first Knick to score 38+ points on 54.5% FG% or better in a playoff game since Patrick Ewing in 1990.
- **Jalen Brunson** and **Quentin Grimes** both played the full 48 minutes, becoming the first duo to both play all 48 minutes in regulation in a playoff game since Walt Frazier and Jerry Lucas in 1972.

- **Julius Randle** added 25 points, 12 rebounds, and eight assists, becoming the first Knick to record 25+ points, 12+ rebounds, and eight or more assists in a playoff game.
- **Julius Randle** (19 first half points) and **RJ Barrett** (18 first half points) became the first Knicks duo to score 15+ points each in the first half of a playoff game in the past 25 seasons.

- **Jalen Brunson** scored a team-high 21 points on 55% shooting from the field and dished out six assists. He's the first Knick to score 20+ points on 55% FG% or better and record six assists in a playoff game since John Starks on May 11, 1996, vs. Chicago.

Immanuel Quickley scored a game and career-high 40 points on 82% shooting (14-18 FG) while dishing out nine assists over 30 minutes. He is the first Knick ever to score 40+ points while shooting 80% or better from the field and record five or more assists. He is also the fifth player in NBA history to accomplish the feat in 31 minutes or less.

HOME COOKING: The Knicks defeated the Detroit Pistons 121-112 at MSG on Nov. 11, 2022.

- **RJ Barrett** finished with a team-high and season-high 30 points, including 20 in the first half, marking his 11th career game with 20 or more points in a half. He also recorded his 26th game with 25+ points and five or more rebounds, tying Bill Cartwright for the second most games with 25+ points and five or more rebounds by a player aged 22 or younger in Knicks history, trailing only Kristaps Porzingis with 32.
- **Jalen Brunson** scored 26 points and recorded a team-high seven assists, marking his seventh game this season with 20+ points and five or more assists.
