The Lakers saw their season come to an end in the Western Conference Finals as they fell in Game 4 to the Denver Nuggets, 113-111, on Monday night at Crypto.com Arena. Los Angeles led by as many as 15 points in the first half, but the Nuggets used a 36-16 third quarter burst to take control of the game and ultimately win the series. LeBron James put together a classic performance in his 20th season with 40 points, 10 rebounds, nine assists and two steals as he played all but four seconds of the contest. Anthony Davis notched another postseason double-double with 21 points, 14 rebounds, one assist, one steal and three blocks. Austin Reaves had 17 points, two rebounds and three assists, while Dennis Schröder pitched in 13 points, two rebounds, five assists and two steals, and Rui Hachimura added 10 points and seven rebounds in 42 minutes. Tristan Thompson played 10 minutes off the bench and finished with four points and one rebound. Nikola Jokic recorded a triple-double with 30 points, 14 rebounds, 13 assists, one steal and three blocks. Jamal Murray had 25 points, three rebounds, five assists, two steals and one block.

LAKERS LATEST

40 IN YEAR 20: LeBron James scored a game-high 40 points (15-25 FG, 4-7 3FG, 6-7 FT) to go with 10 rebounds, nine assists and two steals in 48 minutes in Game 4 against the Nuggets. James notched the 29th 40-point game of his postseason career, good for the second-most such games in NBA history (Michael Jordan, 38) and he became the oldest player in NBA history to score 40+ points in a playoff game (38 years, 143 days).

- James scored 31 points (11-13 FG, 4-4 3FG, 5-5 FT) in the first half, good for the most points he has scored in any half throughout his playoff career. It is tied for the most points scored by a Lakers player in a postseason half since Anthony Davis notched 31 points in the second half on August 29, 2020, vs. Portland. Since 1997, Davis and James are the only Lakers players to have 30+ points in a single half of a postseason game.

SERIES DUB: The Lakers notched their 42nd trip to the Western Conference Finals in franchise history as they beat the Golden State Warriors, 4-2, in the second round of the playoffs. Los Angeles became the second seven seed to ever make the Western Conference Finals and the first team to do so since the Seattle SuperSonics in the 1986-87 season. Darvin Ham is the 10th Head Coach in Lakers history to take the team to the Conference Finals in his first season with the franchise.

- LeBron James scored a team-high 30 points (10-14 FG, 2-3 3FG, 8-11 FT) to go with nine rebounds, nine assists, two steals and one block in Game 6. With the victory over the Warriors, James has now won 41 playoff series throughout his career, good for the most by any player in NBA history.
- Anthony Davis tallied 17 points (5-9 FG, 7-10 FT), 20 rebounds, three assists, two steals and two blocks in 40 minutes. Davis joins Ben Wallace as the only players to have 15+ points, 20+ rebounds, 2+ steals, 2+ blocks and zero turnovers in a playoff game.

MR. IV QUARTER: In the Lakers' 104-101 win over the Warriors in Game 4 of the Western Conference Semifinals, Lonnie Walker IV led a fourth quarter comeback, scoring all 15 of his points in the final frame. Walker IV finished the night with 15 points, three rebounds, two assists and two steals in 27 minutes off the bench.

- Walker IV was the first Lakers player to have 15+ points off the bench in the fourth quarter of a playoff game since Kobe Bryant, who scored 17 points vs. Utah on May 8, 1997, exactly 26 years ago, to the day.

PURPLE AND GOLD STANDARD: Anthony Davis finished with 30 points, 23 rebounds, five assists and four blocks in the Lakers' Game 1 win at the Warriors on Tuesday, May 2. Davis became the first Lakers player since Shaquille O'Neal (6/13/04) to tally at least 30 points and 20 rebounds in a playoff game.

- Davis is just the fifth Lakers player to do so in the postseason, joining Kareem Abdul-Jabbar, Elgin Baylor, Wilt Chamberlain and O'Neal. Davis joined Tim Duncan as the only players in NBA history to have a game with 30+ points, 20+ rebounds, 5+ assists and 4+ blocks.
- Davis scored 23 points in the first half, good for the most points he has scored in the first half of a playoff game in his career.

POKED THE BEAR: The Lakers beat the Memphis Grizzlies by 40 points on April 28 to advance to the second round of the NBA Playoffs. The Lakers became just the sixth 7-seed in NBA history to beat a 2-seed in round one of the NBA Playoffs and the first to do so since San Antonio defeated Dallas in 2010.

- D'Angelo Russell notched a postseason career-high 31 points (12-17 FG, 5-9 3FG) to go with two rebounds, four assists, one steal and one block in 30 minutes. He scored 10 points (5-8 FG) in the first quarter and 14 points (5-6 FG, 4-5 3FG) in the third quarter, marking the seventh and eighth time he has posted 10+ points in a postseason quarter in his career.
- LeBron James recorded 22 points (9-13 FG, 2-5 3FG), five rebounds, six assists and one steal in 31 minutes. With the win, James has now won 40 playoff series in his career, tying Derek Fisher for most of all time.
- Anthony Davis posted 16 points (6-9 FG, 4-4 FT), 14 rebounds, one assist and five blocks in 28 minutes. Davis joined Kareem Abdul-Jabbar and Shaquille O'Neal as the only Lakers players to have at least 25 blocks in a six-game span in the postseason.

LEBOARDS: In Game 4 against the Grizzlies, LeBron James recorded 22 points, 20 rebounds, seven assists and two blocks in 45 minutes. The performance marked the first time that James has recorded 20 rebounds in any game throughout his NBA career.

- James became the first Lakers player to record 20+ points and 20+ rebounds in a playoff game since Shaquille O'Neal had 36 points and 20 rebounds on June 13, 2004. James also became the fifth Lakers player in the Los Angeles era to tally 20+ points and 20+ rebounds in a playoff game, joining Kareem Abdul-Jabbar, Elgin Baylor, Wilt Chamberlain and Shaquille O'Neal.
- James (38 years, 115 days old) is now the oldest player in NBA history to record 20+ points and 20+ rebounds in a regular season or postseason game, surpassing Wilt Chamberlain (36 years, 262 days old) who previously set the record on May 10, 1973.

LAKERS LATEST

HOME COOKING: The Lakers played in front of a sellout home crowd of 18,997 people for the first time in the playoffs since April 28, 2013, vs. San Antonio as they beat the Memphis Grizzlies, 111-101, in Game 3 of the first round.

- Los Angeles held a 35-9 lead after the first quarter. The 26-point lead is tied for the largest lead at the end of the first quarter in NBA Playoffs history and just the third time it has happened. It is the largest lead through one frame since Milwaukee held a 46-20 lead over Miami on May 24, 2021
- Anthony Davis recorded a team-high 31 points (11-24 FG, 8-10 FT) and 17 rebounds to go with two assists, two steals and three blocks. Davis is the first Lakers player since Pau Gasol (March 20, 2008 vs. DEN) to have 30+ points, 15+ rebounds and 3+ blocks in a playoff game and is the first Lakers player to tally 15 blocks within three playoff games since Shaquille O'Neal in 2004. Davis joined Tim Duncan, Hakeem Olajuwon and Kareem Abdul-Jabbar as the only players since 1973 to have 65+ points, 35+ rebounds and 15+ blocks over their first three playoff games of a postseason.
- Rui Hachimura notched 16 points (6-10 FG, 2-2 3FG, 2-2 FT), five rebounds and one steal in 22 minutes off the bench, becoming the first Lakers player since Luke Walton (2008) to score 15+ points off the bench in three straight playoff games.

ROARING START: The Lakers started the 2023 NBA Playoffs with a statement 16-point victory over the Memphis Grizzlies on the road on April 16. Four Lakers players scored 20+ points in a playoff game for the first time since May 15, 1988 vs. Utah as Los Angeles took an early 1-0 series lead.

- Rui Hachimura scored 29 points (11-14 FG, 5-6 3FG) with six rebounds and one assist in 30 minutes off the bench. Hachimura's 29 points were tied for the most scored by a Lakers player off the bench in a playoff game with Mychal Thompson (5/1/88)
- Anthony Davis had 22 points, 12 rebounds, three assists, three steals and a playoff-career-high seven blocks in the win. Davis is the first player to have at least seven blocks and three steals in a playoff game since Draymond Green on May 9, 2016 and the first player to have 20+ points, 10+ rebounds, 7+ blocks and 3+ steals in a playoff game since Tim Duncan did so on June 6, 2003.
- LeBron James finished with 21 points, 11 rebounds, five assists, two steals and three blocks. The performance marked his 119th playoff game with 20+ points and 10+ rebounds, passing Shaquille O'Neal for the most-such games in NBA playoff history.

ENDING THE SEASON STRONG: Anthony Davis was named NBA Western Conference Player of the Month for games played in March and April, after averaging 26.2 points (.569 FG%), a league-leading 12.5 rebounds, 3.1 assists and 1.9 blocks in 35.5 minutes as the Lakers finished with a league-best 14-6 record.

- Davis scored in double figures in 17 of his 18 appearances, including 11 games with 20+ points, eight games with 30+ points and one 40-point performance. The eight-time NBA All-Star tallied 11 double-doubles in that span, including two games with 20+ rebounds.
- For the 2022-23 season, he recorded a league-leading 20 games with at least 15 rebounds and led all players with seven games of 35+ points and 15+ rebounds. Davis became the first Lakers player since Shaquille O'Neal (2000-01) to average at least 25.0 points, 12.0 rebounds and 2.0 blocks.

ANOTHER DOMINANT WEEK: Anthony Davis was named NBA Western Conference Player of the Week for games played from Monday, March 27 to Sunday, April 2 after averaging 38.7 points (.652 FG%, .806 FT%), 11.7 rebounds, 1.7 assists, 1.0 steals and 2.0 blocks in three games as the Lakers finished the week 3-0 with road victories over Chicago, Minnesota and Houston.

- Davis recorded 38 points (13-20 FG, 11-14 FT), nine rebounds, four assists, two steals and two blocks in a 121-110 win at the Bulls on March 29. In a 123-111 victory over the Timberwolves on March 31 in Minnesota, Davis finished with 38 points (15-26 FG, 8-10 FT), 17 rebounds, one steal and two blocks, good for his league-leading seventh game of the season with 35+ points and 15+ rebounds.
- Davis closed out the week with 40 points (15-20 FG, 10-12 FT), nine rebounds, one assist and two blocks in a 134-109 victory at the Rockets on April 2. In the win, Davis became the first Lakers player since Shaquille O'Neal on March 21, 2003, to score 40+ points while shooting at least 75 percent from the field. Davis joined Gail Goodrich as the only Lakers players to accomplish the feat in 30 minutes or less.

cAREER HIGH: Austin Reaves scored a career-high 35 points (9-14 FG, 16-18 FT) to go with six rebounds and six assists in 31 minutes off the bench against the Magic on March 19. Reaves' 35 points is the most points by a Lakers player off the bench since Kentavious Caldwell-Pope scored 35 points on March 19, 2019 at Milwaukee. Reaves made a career-high 16 free throws on the night (16-18 FT), joining Lou Williams as the only Lakers players to make 16 free throws off the bench. Reaves and Williams are the only two Lakers players to tally 35+ points, 5+ rebound and 5+ assists off the bench, and Reaves is the first undrafted player in Lakers history to score at least 35 points in a game.

MAR-THREE GRAS: In the Lakers' win over the Pelicans in New Orleans on March 14, Los Angeles displayed their 3-point shooting, making 18 triples on the night.

- The Lakers made a franchise-record 15 triples in the first half. Malik Beasley became just the third Lakers player to make at least seven threes in a half, as he connected on 7-10 attempts from deep. Beasley joined Kobe Bryant (8) and Glen Rice (7) as Lakers to hit seven threes in a single half.
- The Lakers led by 35 points at halftime, 75-40, good for their largest halftime lead on the road since at least 1955. The 40 points from New Orleans was also good for the fewest scored by a Lakers opponent in a half this season.

MORE THAN A SCORER: Amid his quest for the all-time scoring title, LeBron James moved into fourth place on the NBA's all-time assists list, passing Mark Jackson and Steve Nash with a 11-assist performance against the Knicks in Madison Square Garden. James is the only player to be in the top five of all-time scoring and assists in NBA history.

CROWNING ACHIEVEMENT: With his 12th field goal of the night against the Oklahoma City Thunder on Feb. 7, LeBron James passed Kareem Abdul-Jabbar to become the NBA's all-time leading scorer. James passed the Lakers Legend with a 14-foot turnaround fadeaway shot with 10.9 seconds remaining in the third quarter to reach the milestone and finished the night with 38 points, seven rebounds, three assists and three steals in 34 minutes. Abdul-Jabbar held the scoring record for 14,187 days (April 5, 1984 – Feb. 7, 2023), equivalent to 38 years, 10 months and two days.

ALL-TIME ALL-STAR: For the seventh consecutive season and the 10th time overall, LeBron James led all players in All-Star voting as he was named an All-Star for the 19th time in his career. His 19th straight selection passes Kobe Bryant for most all-time and his 19th overall selection ties him with Kareem Abdul-Jabbar for most selections in NBA history. A three-time NBA All-Star Game MVP and the contest's all-time leading scorer, James has started an NBA-record 19 straight All-Star games and has been named a captain in every year since the NBA switched to the current format, holding a 5-1 record as the team captain. James tallied 13 points, one rebound and four assists in this year's contest.



LAKERS LATEST

40 FOR 30: LeBron James scored a team-high 46 points (16-29 FG, 9-14 3FG, 5-5 FT) to go with eight rebounds, seven assists, two steals and one block in 33 minutes against the Clippers. With his 14th field goal of the night, James became the first player in NBA history to record a 40-point performance against all 30 NBA franchises. James made a career-high nine 3-pointers on 14 attempts from distance. With his career-high ninth 3-pointer of the night, LeBron James tied Jamal Crawford for ninth place on the NBA's all-time list of triples made (2,221).

BEST WESTERN REWARDS: LeBron James was named NBA Western Conference Player of the Week for the second time this season for games played Jan. 16 to Jan. 22 after averaging 35.0 points (.510 FG%), 9.0 rebounds, 7.0 assists and 1.3 blocks in four games as the Lakers finished the week 3-1 with victories over Houston, Memphis and Portland. The 18-time NBA All-Star owns a league-record 67 career weekly awards, including six weekly honors with Los Angeles. This marks his second weekly award of the season and first since Jan. 9 of 2023.

- To begin the week, James scored a season-high 48 points (16-26 FG, 5-10 3FG, 11-12 FT) with eight rebounds and nine assists in a win over the Rockets on Jan. 16, good for his third 40-point game of the season.
- In a home victory over the Grizzlies on Jan. 20, James recorded 23 points, nine rebounds, six assists, two steals and two blocks as the Lakers snapped the Grizzlies' franchise-best 11-game winning streak. James closed out the week with 37 points (14-24 FG), 11 rebounds, four assists and two blocks in a 121-112 win at the Trail Blazers on Jan. 22, overcoming a 25-point halftime deficit, tied for the second-largest halftime deficit overcome to win a game in Lakers' history. James passed Byron Scott for fourth place on the Lakers' all-time list of 3-pointers made in franchise history.

TWO TO'S: In a 140-132 win over the Houston Rockets on Jan. 16, the Lakers recorded a franchise-low two turnovers and became the eighth team in NBA history to commit two or fewer turnovers in a game. It is the first time a team had two or fewer turnovers since the Hawks on Dec. 31, 2021 and is the fewest turnovers in a game by the Lakers since they had three on March 14, 2011 vs. Orlando.

KING OF THE COAST: LeBron James was named NBA Western Conference Player of the Week for games played Jan. 2 to Jan. 8 after averaging 35.0 points (.548 FG%), 8.7 rebounds and 7.7 assists in three games as the Lakers finished the week 4-0 with victories over Charlotte, Miami, Atlanta and Sacramento.

- To start the week, James recorded 43 points (16-26 FG), 11 rebounds, six assists and one steal in a win at the Hornets on Jan. 2, good for his second 40-point game of the season. James joined Michael Jordan as the only players in NBA history to record consecutive 40-point games at age 35 or older.
- In a home win over the Hawks on Jan. 6, the 38-year-old recorded his 11th double-double of the season with 25 points, seven rebounds and 10 assists. James then recorded 37 points, eight rebounds, seven assists and one steal in a 136-134 road victory over the Kings on Jan. 7, extending the Lakers' current winning streak to five consecutive victories.

GOT FIVE ON IT: The Lakers picked up their first five-game winning streak since the end of the 2020-21 season as they beat the Sacramento Kings, 136-134, on Jan. 7 in Sacramento. Four different players scored 20+ points in the win, the first time that four Lakers players have scored 20+ in the same game since March of 2022, led by 37 points from LeBron James.

- Los Angeles shot a season-best 61 percent (50-82 FG) from the field, their best shooting percentage in a game since shooting 62.8 percent in a win over the Warriors on March 15, 2021

HAPPY BRON DAY: On his 38th birthday, LeBron James put together a classic performance, finishing a win over the Hawks on Dec. 30 with 47 points (18-27 FG), 10 rebounds, nine assists and one block, good for the second-most points he has scored in a game on his birthday. James scored 48 points on his 25th birthday in 2005 against Atlanta. It marked the ninth time that James played a game on his birthday, improving to 5-4 on the date. James has now scored more points than any player in NBA history on their birthday, tallying 303 total points.

BEST IN THE WEST: Anthony Davis was named NBA Western Conference Player of the Week for games played Nov. 28 to Dec. 4 after averaging 37.8 points (.652 FG%, .625 3FG%, .857 FT%), 13.0 rebounds, 3.0 assists and 3.3 blocks as the Lakers finished the week 3-1 with victories over Portland, Milwaukee and Washington. It marks the eighth such award of his career and the first since winning it on Dec. 9, 2019.

- Davis tallied 25 points, 13 rebounds, six assists and four blocks against the Indiana Pacers on Nov. 28. In a home victory over the Trail Blazers on Nov. 30, the 29-year-old finished with 27 points, 12 rebounds, one assist, one steal and three blocks. Davis then recorded 44 points (18-27 FG), 10 rebounds, four assists and three blocks in a 133-129 road win over the Bucks on Dec. 2, marking his first 40-point outing of the season.
- To cap off the week, Davis recorded a season-high 55 points (22-30 FG, 9-9 FT), 17 rebounds, one assist and three blocks in a 130-119 road victory over the Wizards on Dec. 4. With the performance, Davis joined Elgin Baylor and Shaquille O'Neal as the only players in Lakers history with 40+ points and 10+ rebounds in back-to-back games. He is the first player since Patrick Ewing in December of 1990 to record 50+ points, 15+ rebounds and 3+ blocks on 70% shooting in a regular season game.

50 BURGER: Anthony Davis continued his dominance in his 11th season, scoring a season-high 55 points with 17 rebounds, one assist and three blocks in a 130-119 win over Washington on Dec. 4.

- Davis became just the fifth player this season to tally 50 points in a game. His 55 points mark his second most scored in a game and his most since joining the Lakers. Davis has now scored 50+ points in five career games.
- Davis became the first Lakers player to tally back-to-back 40-point performances since Kobe Bryant (3/6/13-3/8/13).
- His 40 field goals made over the two-game span are tied with Bryant for the most for any player across two games in the last 20 years.

30/20 VISION: Anthony Davis finished with 37 points (15-16 FT), a season-high 21 rebounds, two assists, five steals and five blocks on Nov. 22 against the Phoenix Suns. Davis is the first player in NBA history to have a game with 35+ points, 20+ rebounds, 5+ steals and 5+ blocks.

- Davis became just the second player in NBA history to have 30+ points, 20+ rebounds, 5+ steals and 5+ blocks in a game, joining Bob McAdoo who accomplished the feat on Jan. 8, 1974.
- The performance marked the seventh 30-20 game of Davis' career and his first such game since tallying 40 points and 20 rebounds on Oct. 29, 2019 vs. Memphis. His 21 rebounds mark his most since joining the Lakers.
- Davis joined Wilt Chamberlain (1963) and Bob McAdoo (1975) as the only players in NBA history to have four consecutive games with 30+ points, 15+ rebounds while shooting above 60 percent from the field.

TAKE A BROW: Anthony Davis averaged 34.0 points (.629 FG%, .889 FT%), 17.0 rebounds, 2.0 assists, 2.0 steals and 2.5 blocks in a two-game span as the Lakers beat the Pistons and the Spurs from Nov. 18-20.

- Davis recorded 30 points (12-19 FG, 6-6 FT), a season-high-tying 18 rebounds, two assists, three steals and one block in a 31-point win over San Antonio on November 20. Davis became the first Lakers player to tally 30+ points and 15+ rebounds in less than 30 minutes since Wilt Chamberlain on Nov. 7, 1969. He joined Elgin Baylor (17 streaks) and O'Neal (2 streaks) as the only players in Lakers history to record 30+ points and 15+ rebounds in three consecutive games.
- Davis finished with a season-high 38 points (10-16 FG, 18-21 FT), 16 rebounds, two assists, one steal and four blocks on November 18 to lead the Lakers to a win over the Pistons. The performance marked his second consecutive game with 35+ points and 15+ rebounds, becoming the first Lakers player to accomplish the feat since Shaquille O'Neal did so in January of 2000.

PLENTY OF TWENTY: LeBron James achieved yet another milestone in his 20th season as became the NBA's all-time leader in games with 20+ points. James recorded the 1,135th 20-point performance of his career on 10/28 at Minnesota, passing Karl Malone for the most such games in NBA history. James tallied a 37-game streak of 20-point games (11/6/22-2/15/23), good for the third longest streak of his career and longest since he had 38 straight 20-point games from April 15, 2012 through Jan. 8, 2013.

OH 3-0 MY: In addition to climbing the ranks of 20-point games, LeBron James is also approaching the all-time leaders in 30-point games. James passed Wilt Chamberlain for the second-most 30-point games in NBA history with a 33-point performance on 12/13 vs. Boston. Michael Jordan is now the only player in league history to have more 30-point outings than James.

DAILY DOUBLE DIGITS: LeBron James opened his 20th season in the NBA with a 31-point performance, ensuring that his double-digit scoring streak would continue.

- With a 26-point performance on his 36th birthday on Dec. 30, 2020, James extended his double-digit scoring streak to 1,000 consecutive games, becoming the first player in league history to reach that mark.
- James's double-digit scoring streak – which began on Jan. 6, 2007 – has far eclipsed Michael Jordan's previous NBA record of 866 consecutive 10-point performances from 1986-2001.
- James has finished with 10+ points in all but eight regular season contests in his career.
- In league history, there have only been seven streaks in which a player has finished in double figures in 500+ consecutive contests (see chart).

LEBRON IN THE NBA'S TOP-10 REGULAR SEASON WINS LIST: With a 133-129 in Milwaukee on Dec. 2, Lakers forward LeBron James tallied his 900th career regular season win, ranking seventh on the NBA's all-time victories list. James passed Dirk Nowitzki on Feb. 23, 2023 for sixth place on the list. The Akron, OH, native sits 29 wins away from moving past NBA legend Karl Malone for fifth all-time. The active leader in wins, James is one of seven players in NBA history to achieve the 900 career wins milestone.

THAT'S OFFENSIVE: Anthony Davis recorded a season-high 37 points (15-25 FG, 7-7 FT), a season-best 18 rebounds, including a career-high 10 offensive rebounds, and two assists in 34 minutes on 11/13 vs. Brooklyn. Davis' 10 offensive rebound were his most in a game since Oct. 28, 2014 when he collected nine such-rebounds vs. Orlando.

- Davis joined Patrick Ewing as the only players in NBA history to record at least 35 points and 10 offensive rebounds in a game in 35 minutes or less.
- Davis became the third active player to record 35+ points and 10+ offensive rebounds in a game, joining John Collins and Rudy Gobert.

CALL IT A COMEBACK: Los Angeles has won 12 games this season after trailing by 10 or more points, highlighted by a season-best 27-point comeback on Feb. 26 to defeat the Dallas Mavericks, 111-108, on the road. The comeback in Dallas was good for the best comeback win for the Lakers since they overcame a 30-point deficit on Dec. 6, 2002 versus the Mavs and was the largest comeback in the NBA this season at the time.

- The Lakers trailed by 25 points at halftime in Portland on January 22, 71-46, before outscoring the Blazers by 34 points in the second half to pick up a nine-point win. The 25-point halftime deficit was tied for the second largest halftime deficit overcome to win in Lakers franchise history.
- Los Angeles has won six games this season in which they were trailing through three quarters, including victories over Dallas, Memphis and Washington.

A NEW LEADER: The Lakers found themselves a new leader this summer, hiring former player and recent Milwaukee Bucks assistant coach Darvin Ham to be the 28th head coach in franchise history and the 24th of the Los Angeles era. Ham enjoyed an eight-year NBA playing career (1996-98, 1999-2005), suiting up for Detroit (2004 NBA Champion), Atlanta, Milwaukee, Washington, Indiana and Denver before transitioning over to coaching in 2008 as an assistant coach with the New Mexico Thunderbirds of the NBA Developmental League. In 2011, Ham joined the Lakers as an assistant coach, spending two seasons with Los Angeles. He would then spend five seasons as an assistant with the Atlanta Hawks (2013-18) and joined the Milwaukee Bucks as an assistant coach in 2018, helping the Bucks to the 2021 NBA Championship.

- Feb. 7, 2023: With his 12th field goal of the night against the Oklahoma City Thunder, LeBron James passed Kareem Abdul-Jabbar to become the NBA's all-time leading scorer.
- Jan. 31, 2023: LeBron James moved into fourth place on the NBA's all-time assists list, passing Mark Jackson and Steve Nash with a 11-assist performance against the Knicks in Madison Square Garden.
- Jan. 16, 2023: In a 140-132 win over the Houston Rockets, the Lakers recorded a franchise-low two turnovers and became the eighth team in NBA history to commit two or fewer turnovers in a game.
- Jan. 15, 2023: LeBron James became the second player in NBA history to score 38,000 career points.
- Dec. 19, 2022: Scotty Pippen Jr. was named NBA G League Player of the Week for games played Dec. 12 to Dec. 17 after averaging 26.3 points, 2.7 rebounds, 4.7 assists and 2.3 steals as South Bay finished the week 3-0 and secured the top seed in the Winter Showcase.
- Dec. 16, 2022: With his second steal of the night, LeBron James passed Hakeem Olajuwon for ninth place on the NBA's all-time steals list.
- Dec. 5, 2022: Anthony Davis was named Western Conference Player of the Week for games played Nov. 28 to Dec. 4 after averaging 37.8 points (.652 FG%, .625 3FG%, .857 FT%), 13.0 rebounds, 3.0 assists and 3.3 blocks as the Lakers finished the week 3-1 with victories over Portland, Milwaukee and Washington. It marks the eighth such award of his career and the first since winning it on Dec. 9, 2019.
- Dec. 4, 2022: Anthony Davis recorded a season-high 55 points with 17 rebounds, one assist and three blocks in a 130-119 win over Washington. Davis became just the fifth player this season to tally 50 points in a game. His 55 points mark his second most scored in a game and his most since joining the Lakers. Davis has now scored 50+ points in five career games.
- Dec. 2, 2022: With his ninth assist of the night, LeBron James passed Magic Johnson for sixth place on the NBA's all-time assists list. The Lakers picked up a 133-129 win in Milwaukee, and James became the seventh player in NBA history to tally 900 career victories.
- Nov. 22, 2022: Anthony Davis became the first player in NBA history to have a game with 35+ points, 20+ rebounds, 5+ steals and 5+ blocks as he tallied 37 points, 21 rebounds, two assists, five steals and five blocks against the Suns.
- Nov. 13, 2022: Anthony Davis joined Patrick Ewing as the only players in NBA history to record at least 35 points and 10 offensive rebounds in 35 minutes or less.
- Oct. 30, 2022: Darvin Ham picked up the first win of his head coaching career with a 121-110 victory over the Denver Nuggets.
- Oct. 28, 2022: LeBron James recorded the 1,135th 20-point performance of his career, passing Karl Malone for the most such games in NBA history.

LEBRON'S QUEST TO THE ALL-TIME SCORING TITLE

CROWNING ACHIEVEMENT: With his 12th field goal of the night against the Oklahoma City Thunder on Feb. 7, LeBron James passed Kareem Abdul-Jabbar to become the NBA's all-time leading scorer. James passed the Lakers Legend with a 14-foot turnaround fadeaway shot with 10.9 seconds remaining in the third quarter to reach the milestone and finished the night with 38 points, seven rebounds, three assists and three steals in 34 minutes. Abdul-Jabbar held the scoring record for 14,187 days (April 5, 1984 – Feb. 7, 2023), equivalent to 38 years, 10 months and two days.

DAILY DOUBLE DIGITS: James has climbed the scoring ladder thanks in large part to his NBA-record double-digit scoring streak. James has scored at least 10 points in 1,151 consecutive regular season games, a streak that began on Jan. 6, 2007 and has far eclipsed Michael Jordan's previous NBA record of 866 consecutive 10-point performances from 1986-2001.

- With a 26-point performance on his 36th birthday on Dec. 30, 2020, James extended his double-digit scoring streak to 1,000 consecutive games, becoming the first player in league history to reach that mark.
- James has finished with 10+ points in all but eight regular season contests in his career.

40 FOR 30: LeBron James scored a team-high 46 points (16-29 FG, 9-14 3FG, 5-5 FT) to go with eight rebounds, seven assists, two steals and one block in 33 minutes against the Clippers on Jan. 24, 2023. With his 14th field goal of the night, James became the first player in NBA history to record a 40-point performance against all 30 NBA franchises. James made a career-high nine 3-pointers on 14 attempts from distance.

PLENTY OF TWENTY: LeBron James achieved yet another milestone in his 20th season as became the NBA's all-time leader in games with 20+ points. James recorded the 1,135th 20-point performance of his career on 10/28 at Minnesota, passing Karl Malone for the most such games in NBA history. James tallied a 37-game streak of 20-point games (11/6/22-2/15/23), good for the third longest streak of his career and longest since he had 38 straight 20-point games from April 15, 2012 through Jan. 8, 2013.

THIRD'S THE WORD: With a driving layup in the third quarter on Jan. 25, 2020 at Philadelphia, James took sole possession of third place on the NBA's all-time points list as he passed Lakers Legend Kobe Bryant. James finished the game with 29 points, seven rebounds, eight assists and one steal.

PASSING JORDAN: On March 6, 2019 against the Denver Nuggets, James finished with 31 points, seven rebounds and seven assists. With his 13th point in the contest, James passed Michael Jordan for fourth place on the NBA's all-time scoring list.

TOP FIVE: James moved into the top five on the all-time scoring list on Nov. 14, 2018 vs. Portland. He scored 44 points with 10 rebounds, nine assists and three blocks as he passed Wilt Chamberlain for fifth place on the prestigious list.

30,000 POINTS: James became the youngest player in NBA history to score 30,000 points (33 years, 24 days) on Jan. 23, 2018 at San Antonio, ending his night with 28 points, nine rebounds, seven assists and one block.

CAREER-HIGH NIGHT: In his fourth season with the Miami Heat, James secured the best scoring performance of his career, notching a career-high 61 points (22-33 FG), seven rebounds and four assists in a 124-107 win over the Charlotte Bobcats on March 3, 2014. James is one of 34 players in NBA history to tally a 60-point performance.

20,000 POINTS: James became the youngest player in league history to score 20,000 career points (28 years, 17 days) on Jan. 16, 2013 at Golden State with 25 points, seven rebounds, 10 assists and one steal.

10,000 POINTS: James became the youngest player to reach 10,000 career points (23 years, 59 days) on Feb. 27, 2008 against the Boston Celtics, finishing with 26 points, eight rebounds and four assists.

25 A YEAR: James has averaged at least 25.0 points per game in an NBA-record 19 consecutive seasons (2004-2023). James averaged a career-high 31.4 points per game in the 2005-06 season and has averaged at least 30 points per game in three seasons (2005-06, 2007-08, 2021-22). The only season James did not average over 25 points per game was when he averaged 20.9 points per game as a rookie in 2003-04.

POSTSEASON PERFORMER: In addition to dominating the regular season, James is also the league's all-time leading scorer for postseason games. James has scored 8,023 career points in 282 playoff games, over 2,000 more points than Michael Jordan, who ranks second on the list. James became the league's all-time playoff scoring leader on May 25, 2017 in a series-clinching win over the Celtics. James has scored in double figures in an NBA play-off-record 280 games, including an NBA play-off-record 252 games with 20+ points, an NBA play-off-record 120 games with 30+ points, 29 games with 40+ and one 50-point game.

THE CHAMP IS HERE: In the fifth year of his career, James averaged 30.0 points, 7.9 rebounds, 7.2 assists, 1.8 steals and 1.1 blocks in 40.4 minutes per game. James' 30 points per game led the league in scoring and marks the only time that James led the league in scoring, capturing the 2007-08 scoring title. Throughout his career, James has ranked in the top five of points per game 13 different times.

KING'S DEBUT: James made his long-anticipated NBA debut on Oct. 29, 2003 against the Sacramento Kings. The 18-year-old ended the night with 25 points, six rebounds, nine assists and four steals, good for his first of many 25-point games in his career. James has gone on to score 25+ points in 895 career games, good for the most in NBA history.
