All-Time Series Notes: Los Angeles has an all-time record of 40-23 versus New Orleans ... Since the Pelicans' move to New Orleans from Charlotte prior to the 2002-03 season, the Lakers have gone 18-12 at Smoothie King Center and were 0-2 at Ford Center in Oklahoma City during the Pelicans' temporary relocation from 2005-07... The Lakers are 22-9 all-time against New Orleans at STAPLES Center in the regular season ... In the first matchup of the 2019-20 season, Anthony Davis scored 41 points to set an NBA record for most points scored against a former team ... In 2006, the Lakers and Pelicans took part in the city of New Orleans' first professional sports game following Hurricane Katrina when they met at the New Orleans Arena on March 8, when the Lakers won, 113-107, behind 40 points from Kobe Bryant ... In 2006-07, Bryant scored a series record 50 points March 23, 2007, becoming just the second player in NBA history to score 50+ points in four consecutive games

Los Angeles lost their third consecutive game as they fell to the New Orleans Pelicans, 128-111, on Tuesday night. The Lakers trailed by as many as 30 points and scored a season-low 32 points in the paint. Montrezl Harrell led the team in scoring for the third straight night with 18 points, six rebounds and two blocks in 34 minutes off the bench. Dennis Schröder made a career-high 10 free throws and finished with 15 points, seven assists, four rebounds and two steals, while Markieff Morris added 16 points and five rebounds. Kyle Kuzma recorded 16 points, 10 rebounds, seven assists and one steal and Devontae Cacok finished with four points, two rebounds, one steal and one block in his first career NBA start. Wesley Matthews had 14 points and Alex Caruso had 10 points to round out the double-digit scorers. Brandon Ingram led all scorers with 36 points and Zion Williamson added 27 points.

LAST TIME OUT:

- The Lakers won four consecutive games for the fifth time this season, the team's first four-game winning streak since March 12-18
- All five Lakers starters scored in double figures for the fifth time this season, improving to 4-1 in such scenarios
- Anthony Davis had 28 points, 10 rebounds, five assists and two steals in 36 minutes, good for his 12th double-double of the season. With his ninth and final made basket of the contest, Davis became the 17th active player to reach 5,000 career field goals

HOLY BROW!: Anthony Davis tallied a season-high 42 points (15-17 FT), 12 rebounds, five assists, three steals and three blocks in 41 minutes against Phoenix on May 9, becoming the first Lakers player to match those totals in a single game.

- Davis is one of six players in NBA history to tally 42+ points, 12+ rebounds, 5+ assists, 3+ steals and 3+ blocks in a single game and joins Hakeem Olajuwon as the only players to do so on two occasions (last: 10/26/16 vs. DEN)
- It was the 30th 40-point double-double of Davis' career, third-most in the NBA since entering the league in 2012-13 (trailing J. Harden, R. Westbrook)
- Davis attempted 17 free throws in the win, his second consecutive game with at least 15 free throw attempts, tying the longest streak of his career

20/20 CLUB: With the signing of two-time NBA All-Star Andre Drummond, the Lakers have added one of the league's perennial rebounders. Since his selection as the ninth overall pick in the 2012 NBA Draft, Drummond has recorded an NBA-leading 44 games with at least 20 points and 20 rebounds, including three such games this season. In NBA history, Drummond is only the 14th player to hit that mark, joining a list that includes 12 Hall of Famers and the active Dwight Howard.

DOUBLE-DOUBLE DUO: Since entering the league as top-10 selections in the 2012 NBA Draft, the Lakers duo of forward Anthony Davis and center Andre Drummond have each been among the top double-double performers in the NBA. In fact, Drummond leads all players over that span, with Davis ranking fourth on the list of double-doubles over the last nine seasons, according to Basketball Reference.

STARSTRUCK: LeBron James and Anthony Davis were each selected as all-stars ahead of the 70th NBA All-Star Game in Atlanta.

- James led all players in all-star voting for the fifth straight season and the eighth time in his career as he prepares for his 17th all-star game (third all-time). A three-time NBA All-Star Game MVP and the contest's all-time leading scorer (389 points), James made his NBA-record 17th all-star start on March 7, finishing with four points and four assists in 13 minutes.
- Lakers forward Anthony Davis was selected to the prestigious event for the eighth time in his career. Davis has previously been named MVP of the 2017 NBA All-Star Game in New Orleans, where he netted a game-record 52 points.
- Last season, the duo was the first pair of Lakers players to start in an all-star game since Kobe Bryant and Dwight Howard in 2013.

SHOOTERS SHOOT: Kentavious Caldwell-Pope and Kyle Kuzma have each climbed up the Lakers' franchise leaderboard for all-time three-pointers made during the 2020-21 season, with both recently moving into the top ten.

- Caldwell-Pope most recently passed Eddie Jones for fifth all-time in April and Kuzma passed Jones for sixth place in the Lakers win over the Magic on April 26

35K FOR THE 36YO: LeBron James added to his list of career accomplishments in the Lakers' matchup against Brooklyn on February 18, most notably becoming the third player in NBA history to log 35,000 career points.

- James logged his 35,000th career point with his third free throw of the night, joining Kareem Abdul-Jabbar and Karl Malone as the only players in the club
- He became the youngest player in NBA history to reach the milestone (36 years, 50 days), also achieving the milestone in the fewest amount of games in NBA history (1,295)
- In that game, James also tallied his 30th consecutive game with 15+ points, 5+ rebounds and 5+ assists, tied for the longest such streak in NBA history

THREE FOR FREE: With a 114-113 overtime win against the Oklahoma City Thunder on February 10, the Lakers became the seventh team in NBA history to win three consecutive games that all went to overtime, a feat last accomplished in January 2007.

- The other teams to match that accomplishment include Houston (November 1976), Milwaukee (February 1978), Phoenix (April 1987), Boston (March 1994), Atlanta (January 1997) and Minnesota (January 2007)
- L.A.'s streak included wins 2/6 vs. DET (135-129, 2OT), 2/8 vs. OKC (119-112) and 2/10 vs. OKC (114-113)
- It was the first time the Lakers had appeared in three consecutive overtime games since Nov. 1-5, 1991

LAKERS LATEST

COMEBACK KINGS: Los Angeles has won 12 games this season after trailing by 10+ points, highlighted by back-to-back 20-point comebacks Feb. 10-12 over the Thunder and Grizzlies

- With back-to-back 20-point comebacks in February, the Lakers became just the third team over the last 20 seasons, to win consecutive games after trailing by 20+ points in each
- L.A. overcame a 10-point fourth quarter deficit on 5/11 vs. NYK, the latest they have trailed by 10+ and won (time shown to right is latest moment in which team has trailed by widest margin)
- The Lakers pulled off 13 double-digit comebacks in 2019-20, including a season-high 19-point come-from-behind victory in Chicago's United Center in November of last season

MEGABRON: LeBron James added to his list of career accomplishments in the Lakers' win over the Nuggets on February 4, finishing with 27 points, 10 rebounds, 10 assists and one block, good for the 96th triple-double of his career.

- With his third field goal of the night, LeBron James surpassed Wilt Chamberlain for third on the NBA's all-time field goals made list. Only Kareem Abdul-Jabbar (15,837) and Karl Malone (13,528) have more career field goals than James.
- The contest was the 800th 25-point game of his career, as he became the first player in NBA history to hit that mark.
- James tallied his 23rd consecutive game with at least 15 points, five rebounds and five assists to open the season, an NBA record for most such games to start any season, surpassing his previous record of 22 games that he set in 2011-12.

10 IN A ROW-D: The Lakers' franchise-record streak of 10 consecutive road wins to begin a season was snapped January 27 at Philadelphia, bringing a close to one of the best starts in NBA history away from a team's home arena.

- L.A.'s 10-0 road record to begin the 2020-21 season was the sixth such streak in league history and tied for the fourth-longest road win streak to start a season in NBA history
- It was the best road start by any team since the San Antonio Spurs began the 2016-17 season with 13 consecutive road wins
- Prior to this season, the franchise's best road start was 6-0 (1985-86)

HOMECOMING KING: LeBron James delivered his best performance of the season in the Lakers' win over his hometown Cleveland Cavaliers on January 25, pouring in a season-best 46 points with eight rebounds, six assists, two steals and two blocks.

- James shot 73.1 percent (19-26 FG) from the field in the win, the best shooting percentage in any game in which he attempted at least 25 field goals
- His 46 points mark the most points he has ever scored against the Cavaliers, surpassing his previous best of 43 points on March 18, 2014, and the most points he has scored in any game since Nov. 18, 2018 at Miami (51)
- James scored 21 points in the fourth quarter, the most points scored by a Lakers player in any quarter this season, and the most points he has scored in a single frame since Nov. 22, 2017 vs. Brooklyn (23, 4th Qtr.). His fourth quarter performance marked the 24th time he has scored 20+ points in any quarter

KCP FOR THREE: Lakers guard Kentavious Caldwell-Pope continued his ascent up the franchise's all-time three-pointers leaderboard, most recently surpassing Michael Cooper for eighth on the Lakers' list after a season-high 7-10 3FG performance on Jan. 21, 2021 at Milwaukee.

- In that outing, KCP converted seven three-pointers for only the sixth time in his career, doing so in the fewest minutes played when reaching that milestone (previously 34 minutes, 3/19/19 at MIL)
- Caldwell-Pope became only the second Lakers player (since at least 1983-84) to make 7+ three-pointers in 27 minutes or less, joining Jodie Meeks (11/30/12 vs. DEN), according to Stathead Basketball

DAILY DOUBLE DIGITS: With a 26-point performance on his 36th birthday on Dec. 30, 2020, LeBron James extended his double-digit scoring streak to 1,000 consecutive games, becoming the first player in league history to reach that mark.

- James's double-digit scoring streak – which began on Jan. 6, 2007 – has far eclipsed Michael Jordan's previous NBA record of 866 consecutive 10-point performances from 1986-2001.
- James has finished with 10+ points in all but eight regular season contests in his career.
- In league history, there have only been seven streaks in which a player has finished in double figures in 500+ consecutive contests (see chart).

WINNER WONDERLAND: The Lakers appeared in a Christmas Day matchup for the 22nd consecutive year and 47th occasion overall in 2020, knocking off the Mavericks, 138-115.

- L.A. improved to 24-23 on the holiday, the most wins by any franchise on Christmas, including a 14-12 record at home
- The Lakers outscored the Mavericks 35-0 in second-chance points in the win, becoming the first team to score 35+ second-chance points and hold their opponent to zero since at least 1996-97 ... It was the most second-chance points scored by the Lakers since Nov. 12, 1996 (35 at HOU)
- The team's 138 points were its most since Dec. 8, 2019 (142 vs. MIN) and its most on Christmas since 1961 (141 at CIN)
- LeBron James played in his 15th Christmas Day game (second all-time, K. Bryant, 16), tallying 22 points, 10 assists and seven rebounds ... He improved to 10-5 on the holiday, moving into a tie with Dwyane Wade and Udonis Haslem for most victories on the holiday

The Akron, OH, native sits 25 wins away from moving past NBA legend Tony Parker for seventh all-time. The active leader in wins, James is one of 18 current or former NBA players to achieve the 800 career wins milestone

QUICK TURNAROUND: When the 2020-21 NBA season officially kicked off on December 22, the defending champion Los Angeles Lakers had gone a mere 71 days between the team's most recent appearance in the 2020 NBA Finals and playing in their season-opener against the LA Clippers at STAPLES Center. The limited hiatus marked the shortest offseason in the history of the four major men's professional sports in the United States (NBA, NFL, MLB, NHL), according to research from Elias Sports Bureau.

BACK AT HOME: When the Lakers opened the regular season at STAPLES Center on December 22, they played on their home court in a regular season game for the first time since a closely-contested loss to the Brooklyn Nets on March 10 – 287 days from the season-opener.

COVID-19 ARENA RULES AND REGULATIONS: While hosting games during this COVID-19 pandemic, media and broadcast personnel have been directed by the NBA to be designated as Group 3 personnel in Zone B, the Yellow Zone. For the health and safety of all involved, Group 3 personnel will be permitted to enter areas within the Yellow Zone only, and apart from special circumstances (e.g. medical emergency, time-sensitive maintenance or repairs) may not enter the Red Zone during basketball activity. Group 3 individuals must also wear facemasks at all times in the arena and must maintain physical distance (i.e. at least six feet) from any Group 1 or Group 2 Individuals.
