All-Time Series Notes: Los Angeles has an all-time record of 47-28 versus New Orleans ... Since the Pelicans' move to New Orleans from Charlotte prior to the 2002-03 season, the Lakers have gone 21-15 at Smoothie King Center and were 0-2 at Ford Center in Oklahoma City during the Pelicans' temporary relocation from 2005-07... The Lakers are 25-11 all-time against New Orleans at Crypto.com Arena in the regular season ... In the first matchup of the 2019-20 season, Anthony Davis scored 41 points to set an NBA record for most points scored against a former team ... In 2006, the Lakers and Pelicans took part in the city of New Orleans' first professional sports game following Hurricane Katrina when they met at the New Orleans Arena on March 8, when the Lakers won, 113-107, behind 40 points from Kobe Bryant ... In 2006-07, Bryant scored a series record 50 points March 23, 2007, becoming just the second player in NBA history to score 50+ points in four consecutive games ... The Lakers beat the Pelicans, 133-89, in the Semifinals of the inaugural NBA In-Season Tournament in the 2023-24 season

THE PATH TO VICTORY: The Lakers took home the inaugural NBA Cup in 2023, blazing through their competition with a perfect 7-0 record in tournament play. Los Angeles competed in Western Group A as part of the NBA's first-ever In-Season Tournament, a group that consists of the Memphis Grizzlies, Phoenix Suns, Utah Jazz and Portland Trail Blazers. Each team played four designated Group Play games – one game against each opponent in its group, with two games at home and two on the road.

Game 1: The Lakers squared off against the Phoenix Suns on Friday, Nov. 10, at Footprint Center for Los Angeles' first game of the In-Season Tournament Group Play, and the purple and gold came out victorious, 122-119. LeBron James led the way with a team-high 32 points (11-17 FG, 3-4 3FG, 7-11 FT) to go with 11 rebounds, six assists, one steal and one block in 36 minutes, while Anthony Davis also recorded a double-double, his sixth of the season, with 18 points (5-14 FG, 8-8 FT), 11 rebounds, four assists and one block in 36 minutes. Cam Reddish, starting in place of Austin Reaves, hit five triples and dropped 17 points to give LA the spark they needed and snap their three-game losing streak.

Game 2: The Lakers improved to 2-0 in the In-Season Tournament Group Play stage following a 134-107 victory over the Memphis Grizzlies at Crypto.com Arena on Tuesday, Nov. 14. Los Angeles had their highest-scoring game of the season as seven players scored in double figures. D'Angelo Russell led the way for the Lakers, scoring 24 points (8-12 FG, 6-8 3FG, 2-3 FT) in 27 minutes. Rui Hachimura added 23 points (8-10 FG, 3-3 3FG, 4-4 FT), playing 24 minutes after coming off the bench. Austin Reaves recorded a double-double scoring 16 points (5-9 FG, 4-4 3FG, 2-3 FT) to go along with 12 rebounds. Anthony Davis also recorded a double-double, his eighth of the season, as he dropped 19 points (7-11 FG, 5-6 FT) and grabbed 11 boards. LeBron James made his return after missing a game due to a left calf contusion and scored 16 points (6-11 FG, 3-6 3FG), grabbed nine rebounds and dished out six assists in 23 minutes. Santi Aldama paced the Grizzlies with 24 points (9-15 FG, 3-8 3FG), but it was not enough to keep up with the sharp-shooting Lakers, whose 22 3-pointers tied the franchise record (Feb. 7, 2019 at Boston).

Game 3: In the Lakers' third game of In-Season Tournament Group Play, Los Angeles took down the Trail Blazers, 107-95, in Portland to improve to a perfect 3-0 record. The purple and gold took the lead from the jump and never trailed in the game in large part due to LeBron James' monstrous performance, recording 35 points (13-22 FG, 5-9 3FG, 4-6 FT), five rebounds, nine assists and two steals in 35 minutes. Anthony Davis (16 points, 14 rebounds) and Christian Wood (10 points, 10 rebounds) complimented James' performance with double-doubles, and the Lakers remained undefeated in Group Play. Jerami Grant paced the Blazers with 24 points (8-20 FG, 4-9 3FG, 4-4 FT), four rebounds, three assists and one steal in 40 minutes of play.

Game 4: The Lakers had their biggest win of the season and clinched a spot in the In-Season Tournament Quarterfinals with a perfect 4-0 record thanks to a 131-99 victory over the Utah Jazz. Anthony Davis led the way for L.A., recording his 11th double-double of the season with 26 points (11-14 FG, 4-4 FT) and 16 rebounds. Davis tallied his double-double in the first half (17 PTS, 10 REB), marking the 21st time in his career he has accomplished the feat in the first half. Six other Lakers scored in double figures including D'Angelo Russell (20 PTS), LeBron James (17 PTS), and Austin Reaves (19 PTS). Omer Yurtseven led the way for Utah as he had 18 points (8-11 FG) off the bench. The purple and gold improved to 9-6 on the season and will host the Dallas Mavericks tomorrow night on the second night of a back-to-back.

Game 5 (Quarterfinals): The Lakers took down the Phoenix Suns, 106-103, to advance to the In-Season Tournament Semifinals in Las Vegas. L.A. led by as many 15 points in the first half, but Phoenix came storming back; there were 14 lead changes in game with it all coming down to the final seconds, but the purple and gold squeaked out the victory to remain undefeated in the IST with a perfect 5-0 record. LeBron James recorded a double-double, his sixth of the season, with 31 points (12-25 FG, 2-4 3FG, 5-6 FT) to go along with 11 assists. Anthony Davis tallied his 18th double-double with 27 points (10-26 FG, 7-8 FT) and 15 boards. Austin Reaves added 20 points (7-16 FG, 3-8 3FG), including a clutch 3-pointer with 15.3 seconds remaining to put the Lakers up by four. Kevin Durant led the Suns with 31 points (12-17 FG, 4-7 3FG), but it was not enough for Phoenix as they were knocked out of the IST.

Game 6 (Semifinals): In a highly anticipated semifinals matchup of the NBA's first-ever In-Season Tournament in Las Vegas, the Lakers took down the New Orleans Pelicans, 133-89. The 44-point differential is the largest win of the season for the purple and gold and led by none other than LeBron James, who posted 30 points (9-12 FG, 4-4 3FG, 8-8 FT) to go with five rebounds and eight assists in 23 minutes. Anthony Davis recorded his 19th double-double of the season with 16 points and 15 rebounds and was one of six Lakers players who scored in double figures, including Taurean Prince who recorded 15 points with five 3-pointers made on eight attempts. L.A. outscored New Orleans 43-17 in the third quarter, the most scored and least allowed in the third frame all season by the Lakers, and the Lakers advanced to the In-Season Tournament Championship game.



Game 7 (Finals): The Lakers became the first-ever NBA In-Season Tournament Champions as they took down the Indiana Pacers, 123-109, on Saturday, Dec. 9, at T-Mobile Arena in Las Vegas. Anthony Davis led the way for the purple and gold with a dominant double-double performance of 41 points (16-24 FG, 9-13 FT) and 20 rebounds in 41 minutes. LeBron James, voted after the game as the In-Season Tournament's Most Valuable Player, put up 24 points (10-21 FG, 4-5 FT), grabbed 11 boards and added four assists and two steals in 35 minutes as he and Davis were both named to the NBA's All-Tournament Team after the game. Austin Reaves led the bench unit with a season-high 28 points (9-15 FG, 10-12 FT), and the Lakers took home the In-Season Tournament trophy with a perfect 7-0 record in tournament play. Stats recorded in this game did not count towards regular season or postseason stats.

RIDING GREATNESS: The Lakers head into the Play-In Tournament riding the greatness of LeBron James. James ended his 21st regular season campaign with a dominant triple-double, tallying 28 points, 11 rebounds, a season-high 17 assists, five steals and one block in 38 minutes to help the purple and gold take down New Orleans, 124-108. James became the fifth player in NBA history to post 25+ points, 10+ rebounds, 15+ assists and 5+ steals in a game. With his eighth assist of the night, James reached the 11,000 career assist mark; he is now the first player in NBA history to have career totals of at least 40,000 points, 11,000 rebounds and 11,000 assists. James and the Lakers will look to repeat their strong performance again on Tuesday night in their rematch against the Pelicans.

DEFENSIVE ANCHOR: Anthony Davis has made a strong case for himself this season for Defensive Player of the Year. As of April 4, Davis tallied 695 total defensive rebounds and averaged 9.7 defensive rebounds per game, placing him 2nd in the NBA in both categories. He had swatted 170 blocks for an average of 2.4 rejections per game as of April 4, ranking fourth in both categories in the NBA. The defensive anchor has used his length to disrupt shots all season long, contesting 805 total shots as of April 4 as well (ranked 3rd in the NBA). Davis still averages over a steal a game as well at 1.2 as opposing teams continue to gameplan their offenses around Davis' size and athleticism. Davis would be no stranger to a defensive honor as he has been named to the All-Defensive First Team twice (2018, 2020), All-Defensive Second Team twice (2015, 2017) and has led the league in blocks for a season three times (2014, 2015, 2018).



ROAD WARRIORS: On the Lakers six-game road trip to close out March and start April, the purple and gold grabbed five wins out of six contests before heading back to Los Angeles. The Lakers started the trip in Milwaukee where they grabbed a 128-124 2OT victory. Three Lakers achieved new career highs in minutes as Anthony Davis totaled 52, D'Angelo Russell tallied 50 and Austin Reaves recorded 48. Davis dropped 34 points (12-31 FG, 3-8 3FG, 7-7 FT) to go along with 23 rebounds, four blocks, two assists and two steals. The next night, L.A. traveled to Memphis as they took down the Grizzlies, 136-124. Rui Hachimura totaled 32 points (11-14 FG, 7-8 3FG, 3-4 FT), 10 rebounds, two blocks and one assist in 38 minutes to lead the charge. The next win of the trip came on Easter Sunday in Brooklyn as they took down the Nets, 116-104. LeBron James led the Lakers with 40 points (13-17 FG, 9-10 3FG, 5-6 FT), seven rebounds and five assists in 37 minutes. James' nine 3-pointers tied the most in his career and his .900 3FG percentage set a new

franchise high with a minimum of 10 attempts, overtaking Jordan Farmar, Jordan Clarkson and Glen Rice who held the record at .800. The purple and gold took the show north of the border on April 2, defeating the Toronto Raptors, 128-111. Russell led the Lakers with 25 points (9-17 FG, 7-14 3FG), seven assists and two rebounds in 33 minutes. To finish the trip, the Lakers traveled to the nation's capital where they beat the Washington Wizards, 125-120. All five starters recorded 15+ points, highlighted by Davis with 35 (10-17 FG, 15-15 FT), 18 rebounds, three blocks, two steals and one assist in 38 minutes. L.A.'s 5-1 record set a new best among road trips of four or more games for the season.

DLOADING...: D'Angelo Russell scored his 10,000th career point on March 31 in the Lakers' 116-104 win over the Brooklyn Nets. Russell became the 397th player in NBA history to achieve the mark. This season, Russell has set a new franchise high in 3FG, overtaking Nick Van Exel's record of 183 3FG that was set in 1994-95. He is currently on pace to become the third player in NBA history to make 200+ 3-pointers, dish 400+ assists and shoot 40 percent or better from beyond the arc, joining Stephen Curry and Damian Lillard. As of March 3, Russell has 212 3PM, 448 assists and is shooting 42.1 percent from three.

A BUCK FIFTY: On Sunday, March 24, the Lakers scored 150 points for the first time since Jan. 2, 1987, in a 150-145 victory over the Indiana Pacers. Four Lakers scored 25+ points, a feat that had not been accomplished in the NBA since Feb. 12, 2021, by four members of the Utah Jazz (Jordan Clarkson, Rudy Gobert, Joe Ingles and Donovan Mitchell). Anthony Davis led the purple and gold with 36 points (15-21 FG, 1-2 3FG, 5-5 FT) followed by LeBron James, who dropped 26 points (8-19 FG, 2-4 3FG, 8-8 FT). Spencer Dinwiddie tallied a Lakers season-high 26 points (8-11 FG, 2-3 3FG, 8-9 FT) and Austin Reaves capped off the quartet with 25 points (6-13 FG, 2-5 3FG, 11-12 FT). Those four became the first Lakers quartet to each score 25+ points since Wilt Chamberlain, Keith Erickson, Happy Hairston and Jerry West did so on Jan. 24, 1971. The Lakers' starting five totaled 122 points, the most by any Lakers starting unit this season.

3'LO: D'Angelo Russell became the Lakers' all-time franchise leader for most 3-point field goals in a season on March 22 at Crypto.com Arena. Russell passed Nick Van Exel, whose record of 183 3-pointers had stood strong since the 1994-95 season. Russell tied Van Exel's record with his sixth 3-pointer of the night on March 18 against the Hawks, leading to 27 points (8-14 FG, 6-10 3FG) as the purple and gold secured a 136-105 victory. Russell then sank his 184th 3-pointer of the season the very next game at home against the 76ers, firmly putting his name atop Lakers history. Russell also holds the record for the most made 3-pointers in a season in Brooklyn Nets history when he made 234 3-pointers in the 2018-19 season.

BIRTHDAY EVE PRESENT: On the eve of his 31st birthday, Anthony Davis had a career night to lead the Lakers to a 120-109 victory over the Minnesota Timberwolves on March 10, 2024. Davis recorded 27 points (9-17 FG, 9-13 FT), 25 rebounds, five assists, seven steals and three blocks in 39 minutes. Davis became the first player in NBA history to record 25+ points, 25+ rebounds, 5+ assists, 5+ steals and 3+ blocks in a game. His 25 boards were good for a season high, and his seven steals marked a new career high. Davis had a big night on the offensive glass as well as his 10 offensive rebounds tied a career high and marked a new season high. The 31-year-old grabbed the most boards by a Laker since Dwight Howard recorded 26 rebounds on Jan. 6, 2013, vs. Denver. Lou Williams was the last Laker to record seven steals on Dec. 2, 2015, until Davis did so against the Timberwolves. This was the first game that Davis has scored 25+ points and grabbed 25+ rebounds in his career.



CROSS-HALL RIVALRY FINALE: The Lakers took on the Clippers for the last time in the regular season as co-tenants of Crypto.com Arena on Feb. 28, 2024, giving one of the most memorable matchups in the series' history. The Lakers erased a 21-point fourth quarter deficit that saw LeBron James outscore the Clippers in the final frame, 19-16. James finished with 34 points (13-21 FG, 7-12 3FG, 1-1 FT), eight assists, six rebounds and two blocks in 37 minutes. The Lakers and Clippers have shared an arena in DTLA since 1999, when it was previously known as Staples Center. The Clippers hold an all-time 50-47 record against the Lakers at Crypto.com Arena. These 97 contests were filled with some stellar performances by Laker greats. On Mar. 6, 2000, Shaquille O'Neal celebrated his 28th birthday with a monster performance, dropping 61 points (24-35 FG), grabbing 23 rebounds and dishing out three assists in 45 minutes to lead the Lakers to a 123-103 victory. Kobe Bryant's best game against the Clippers came on Jan. 7, 2006, as he totaled 50 points (17-41 FG, 7-15 3FG, 9-10 FT), eight rebounds, eight assists and one steal in 45 minutes. Bryant's left-handed runner in the paint with 11.4 seconds remaining in the fourth quarter propelled the Lakers to a 112-109 victory. In the 24 seasons that the two teams have played in the same arena, the Lakers have hung six championship banners.

CLICKING ON ALL CYLINDERS: In the 16-game stretch from Jan. 14 through Feb. 14, the Lakers shot up the NBA ranks in several categories with a strong 11-5 record to show for it. The purple and gold led all teams in assists per game with 30.4 and fast break points per game with 20.6. The Lakers ranked second in points per game (123.3), field goal percentage (.509 FG%), steals per game (8.3) and points in the paint per game (58.0). L.A. also ranked fifth in the league in offensive rating at 119.1, sixth in 3-point percentage at .395 3FG% and sixth in blocks per game with 6.0.

LAKERS LATEST



SUPER (ALL) STARS: LeBron James and Anthony Davis were both selected to the 2024 NBA All-Star Game in Indianapolis after stellar starts to the season. James set a new NBA record for most All-Star Game appearances with 20 as he was voted captain for the Western Conference and received the most votes out of any player in the West. Through his first 49 games this season, James averaged 24.8 points, 7.8 assists, 7.2 rebounds and 1.3 steals in 34.9 minutes. Davis earned his ninth All-Star honors as he averaged 24.9 points, 12.2 rebounds, 3.8 assists, 2.5 blocks and 1.1 steals in 35.7 minutes in his first 52 games this season. On Sunday, Feb. 18, James totaled eight points (4-10 FG), four rebounds and three assists in 14 All-Star Game minutes and Davis tallied six points (3-5 FG), eight rebounds, eight assists and one block in 22 minutes.

A NEW FACE COMING HOME: The Lakers signed free agent guard and California native Spencer Dinwiddie on Saturday, Feb. 10 to serve as a key playmaker in the second unit. In 514 career NBA games (311 starts) prior to LA across nine-plus seasons with Brooklyn (2022-24, 2016-21), Dallas (2022-23), Washington (2021-22) and Detroit (2014-16), the 30-year-old owned career averages of 13.6 points, 3.1 rebounds and 5.3 assists in 28.0 minutes. An attendee of Los Angeles' William Howard Taft High School, Dinwiddie was named the John R. Wooden California High School Player of the Year in 2011.

HISTORIC NIGHT: The Lakers took down the New Orleans Pelicans, 139-122, on Friday, Feb. 9, and made history along the way. All five Lakers starters scored at least 20 points for the third time in franchise history, with the last time occurring on Nov. 11, 1984, vs. Portland. The Lakers also became the first team to have all five starters score at least 20 points since 1993, per StatMuse. Los Angeles came out running with one of the best performances in a half in franchise history as they dropped 87 points, the second-most points in any half by the Lakers all-time (franchise record is 91). The purple and gold reached the mark thanks to 51 points in the second quarter, which tied the most points in any quarter in franchise history (also occurred on Mar. 25, 2014, against the New York Knicks). The Lakers shot 67.4 percent (29-43 FG) from the field in the first half and 55 percent (11-20 3FG) from beyond the arc to fuel the historic performance.

AND THE GRAMMY GOES TO....: The Lakers went 4-2 on their annual "Grammy Trip" to close out January and start the month of February. The purple and gold began the stretch with a double-OT thriller against the Golden State Warriors that saw L.A. come out victorious, 145-144. LeBron James set a career high in rebounds as he grabbed 20 boards (previous high was 19 against the Charlotte Bobcats on Jan. 11, 2008) to go along with 36 points. The Lakers' next victory came on Feb. 1 against the Boston Celtics, 114-105. Missing James and Anthony Davis, Austin Reaves put up a season-high 32 points (10-18 FG, 7-10 3FG, 5-7 FT) and five other Lakers scored in double figures to take down their rival on the road. James and Davis both returned to the lineup on Feb. 3 against the New York Knicks, helping L.A. snap the Knicks' nine-game win streak. James dropped 24 points (10-19 FG, 2-5 3FG, 2-2 FT) while Davis grabbed 18 rebounds and swatted four blocks to propel the Lakers to a 113-105 victory in Madison Square Garden. To finish the trip, the Lakers took down the Charlotte Hornets, 124-118, thanks to a historic night from Davis; he recorded 26 points (12-16 FG, 2-2 FT), 15 rebounds, 11 assists and three blocks in 37 minutes, marking his second triple-double of the season and third of his career. Davis became the first Laker ever to record 25+ points, 15+ rebounds, 10+ assists and shoot 75 percent or better from the field in a game.



KOBE STATUE: The Lakers added another statue to Star Plaza on Feb. 8 as Kobe Bryant was immortalized amongst some of the best in franchise history. The Hall-of-Famer spent his entire 20-year career in Los Angeles with the purple and gold, winning five NBA titles (2000, 2001, 2002, 2009, 2010). Bryant was the 2008 NBA Most Valuable Player as he averaged 26.8 points, 5.2 rebounds, 4.9 assists and 1.5 steals in 82 games. He was awarded NBA Finals MVP in 2009 where he averaged 32.4 points, 7.4 rebounds, 5.6 rebounds, 1.4 steals and 1.4 blocks in the series that saw the Lakers take down the Orlando Magic in five games. Bryant was awarded NBA Finals MVP in back-to-back years as he posted averages of 28.6 points, 8.0 rebounds, 3.9 assists and 2.1 steals in 41.3 minutes in the seven-game duel against the Boston Celtics in 2010 that resulted in the Lakers' 16th championship banner. The franchise icon was an 18-time NBA All-Star that racked up 15-time All-NBA Team selections, including 11 First-Team selections, 12-time All-Defensive Team selections, including nine First Team nods, four NBA All-Star Game MVPs, two scoring titles, NBA All-Rookie Team selection and the 1997 NBA Slam Dunk Contest champion. Bryant was the first player in NBA history to have two numbers retired by the same team as his No. 8 and No. 24 were lifted to the rafters of Staples Center on Dec. 18, 2017.

SHOOTERS SHOOT: The Lakers set multiple season highs in their home victory over the Bulls on Thursday, Jan. 25. Los Angeles shot a season-high 60.9 percent from the field (53-87 FG) and a season-high 64.5 percent from 3-point range (20-31 3FG) to fuel the team to a then-season-high 141 points. The purple and gold made 53 field goals on the night, which was the most made by the team in any game this season, and the performance marked the third time in Lakers franchise history that the team reached 20 3-pointers. Los Angeles' best quarter was the second frame, where the team shot a season-high for any quarter - 83.3 percent from the field (15-18 FG). The victory came together with D'Angelo Russell's season-high eight 3-pointers with 29 points (10-18 FG, 8-13 3FG), four assists, one steal and one block. LeBron James followed suit with 25 points (10-19 FG, 3-4 3FG 2-2 FT), four rebounds, 12 assists and two steals, while Anthony Davis secured his 36th double-double of the season with 22 points (10-18 FG, 2-5 FT), 11 rebounds, six assists and one block. Jarred Vanderbilt carried the bench unit and set his Lakers career-high of 17 points (8-11 FG, 1-1 3FG) to go with five rebounds and three steals.

SHARING IS CARING: The Lakers won four of six games stretching from Jan. 7-17 with victories over Dallas, Oklahoma City, Toronto and LA Clippers in large part due to an uptick in assists. In those six games, the purple and gold averaged 30.5 assists, up from their season average at the time of 27.8. The Lakers dished out 30+ assists in five of six games, and LeBron James shared the ball more than anyone during that stretch; he averaged 8.4 assists in five of the six games he played in during that span, including 12 assists on Jan. 9 vs. Toronto. The Lakers' 33 assists on Jan. 17 against the Mavericks served as a catalyst for L.A.'s 32 fastbreak points, the most put up by the team all season at the time

50 DAYS OF CHRISTMAS: The Lakers played on Christmas Day for the 25th straight year and the 50th time overall. They hold a 24-26 record on the holiday, most recently falling to the Boston Celtics, 115-126, in LA. The Lakers' 24 victories are the most all-time by any team on Christmas Day. The Celtics and Lakers met this year on Christmas Day for the first time since 2008 and the third time since 1960 (when the Lakers moved to Los Angeles from Minneapolis). That Boston-Los Angeles game 15 years ago was a rematch of the previous season's NBA Finals, with the Lakers snapping the defending NBA champion Celtics' 19-game winning streak and Phil Jackson recording his 1,000th victory as a head coach.

HONORED: LeBron James and Anthony Davis were both named to the 2023 All-Tournament Team for their performances in Group Play and the Knockout Rounds of the inaugural NBA In-Season Tournament. James was voted as the In-Season Tournament Most Valuable Player with averages of 26.4 points, 8.0 rebounds, 7.6 assists and 1.6 steals in 30.7 minutes in seven games. James made more field goals (67) than any other player in the tournament and led the league with a +116 plus/minus. Davis helped guide the purple and gold to an undefeated tournament record, averaging 23.3 points, 14.6 rebounds, 3.7 assists, 1.0 steals and 2.9 blocks in 33.9 minutes. No performance was bigger in the tournament than Davis' 41-point, 20-rebound showing in the IST Finals. L.A. honored James, Davis, and the rest of the team for their accomplishments on Dec. 18 with a unique, add-a-year In-Season Tournament banner and ceremony.

GOAT THINGS: LeBron James had a career performance in the In-Season Tournament Quarterfinals matchup vs. Phoenix on Dec. 5 at Crypto.com Arena. James finished with 31 points, eight rebounds, 11 assists and five steals as the Lakers defeated the Suns, 106-103. Per ESPN Stats & Info, James is the second Lakers player with 30 points, 10 assists, five rebounds and five steals in a game since steals became official in 1973-74, joining Magic Johnson. This was the first time James had 30 points, 10 assists and five steals in a game since 2008 vs. Boston, and it was also the third time he did that in a game in his career. Still going strong at the age of 38, James became the oldest player to record 30 points, 10 assists and five steals in a game in NBA history by more than six years. Allen Iverson is the next oldest player to accomplish the feat at 32 years, 182 days old.

MINUTES ON MINUTES: LeBron James has now logged the most combined regular season and playoffs minutes of any player in NBA history. On Thursday, Nov. 30, the Lakers took on the Oklahoma City Thunder; at the time of the game, James had played more career regular season minutes (54,693) than the entire 18-man Thunder roster combined (53,853).

DEFENDING HOME COURT: The Lakers started the season off strong on their home court, posting a 7-2 record at Crypto.com Arena in the months of October and November with a combined point differential of +61. The purple and gold opened up their season at home with a five-point win against the Phoenix Suns, 100-95, and then hosted two In-Season Tournament Group Play games; they took down the Memphis Grizzlies, 134-107, and dominated the Utah Jazz, 131-99. In eight games in DTLA in October and November, LeBron James averaged 24.9 points per game, including a season-high 37-point performance against the Houston Rockets on Nov. 19. James also recorded his first triple-double of the season on Nov. 15 against Sacramento, totaling 28 points, 10 rebounds and 12 assists. Anthony Davis recorded eight double-doubles in the opening stretch at home, highlighted by a 26-point, 19-rebound performance against Orlando on Oct. 30. The Lakers earned themselves an additional home game in the In-Season Tournament as they clinched West Group A with a perfect 4-0 record.

BATTLE OF LA: The Lakers ended their cold streak against their cross-town rivals LA Clippers with a dramatic overtime victory, 130-125, on Nov. 1. The win marked the purple and gold's first win over the Clippers since July 30, 2020, with 11 consecutive losses coming prior to their most recent matchup on Nov. 1, 2023 at Crypto.com Arena. The Lakers won consecutive games against the Clippers for the first time since 2020 with another victory on Jan. 7, 2024, taking them down in a close finish, 106-103.

TWO DECADES: The Lakers vs. Kings matchup on Oct. 29 marked 20 years to the day since LeBron James played his first regular season NBA game. James made his long-anticipated NBA debut on Oct. 29, 2003 against the Sacramento Kings. The 18-year-old ended the night with 25 points, six rebounds, nine assists and four steals, good for his first of many 25-point games in his career. On the day that was 20 years since his debut, James recorded 27 points (11-19 FG, 3-8 3FG), 15 rebounds and eight assists in 39 minutes. James has scored 25+ points more times than any player in NBA history.

LOCKED DOWN THE BROW: On Aug. 6, the Lakers and eight-time NBA All-Star Anthony Davis agreed to a contract extension, keeping the 2020 NBA Champion with the purple and gold. Davis, who was originally acquired by Los Angeles on July 6, 2019, as part of a three-team trade before re-signing with the team on Dec. 3, 2020, has appeared in 194 regular season games (192 starts) across four seasons with the Lakers, averaging 24.6 points (52.4 FG%), 10.1 rebounds, 3.0 assists, 1.3 steals and 2.1 blocks in 34.0 minutes. During the recent 2022-23 season, Davis appeared in 56 games (54 starts) for the Lakers, averaging 25.9 points on a career-best 56.3 percent shooting from the floor, a career-high 12.5 rebounds, 2.6 assists, 1.1 steals and 2.0 blocks in 34.0 minutes per game. The 30-year-old became the first Lakers player since Shaquille O'Neal in 2000-01 to average at least 25.0 points, 12.0 rebounds and 2.0 blocks in a campaign.

RUN IT BACK: The Lakers finished the 2022-23 season on a high note as they advanced to the Western Conference Finals as the seventh seed in the conference. Building on that momentum, Los Angeles retained key members of their core during the offseason. Rui Hachimura, Austin Reaves and D'Angelo Russell all re-signed with the purple and gold during free agency. After joining Los Angeles via trade from Washington on Jan. 23, Hachimura appeared in 33 games (nine starts) and averaged 9.6 points (.485 FG%) and 4.7 rebounds in 22.4 minutes per contest to end the 2022-23 regular season. In the 2022-23 campaign, Reaves appeared in 64 games (22 starts) for the Lakers, averaging 13.0 points (.529 FG%, .398 3P%), 3.0 rebounds and 3.4 assists in 28.8 minutes. Reaves joined Kevin Durant and Kawhi Leonard as the only players in the league to shoot at least 50.0 percent from the field, 39.0 percent from 3-point range and 85.0 percent from the free-throw line (min. 200 FTM). After joining Los Angeles via trade from Minnesota on Feb. 9, Russell appeared in 17 games (all starts), posting averages of 17.4 points (.484 FG%, .414 3P%), 2.9 rebounds and 6.1 assists in 30.9 minutes per game.

NEW KIDS ON THE BLOCK: In addition to re-signing key members of last season's squad, the Lakers added to their core during free agency by signing Jaxson Hayes, Taurean Prince, Cam Reddish, Gabe Vincent and Christian Wood. Vincent returns to California after spending four seasons with the Miami Heat, most recently as their starting point guard en route to the NBA Finals. Prince will add another sharp-shooter to the roster as he has shot 37.2 percent from beyond the arc across seven seasons in the NBA. Hayes (8th overall) and Reddish (10th overall) were both selected in the lottery of the 2019 NBA Draft and will provide youth and depth to the Lakers roster. Wood is coming off a season with the Dallas Mavericks in which he averaged 16.6 points, 7.3 rebounds, 1.8 assists and 1.1 blocks per game while shooting 37.6 percent from 3-point range.

SUMMER STAR: Second-year guard Max Christie started his sophomore campaign during the 2023 Summer Leagues in Sacramento and Las Vegas and was named to the NBA 2K24 All-Summer League Second Team. Christie appeared in three games for the Lakers at NBA 2K24 Summer League in Las Vegas, averaging 19.0 points (45.7 FG%, 50.0 3P%, 100.0 FT%), 6.3 rebounds, 3.7 assists and 2.3 blocks in 32.2 minutes per game. Prior to Las Vegas, Christie appeared in two games for the Lakers at the 2023 California Classic in Sacramento, averaging 21.0 points (54.2 FG%, 62.5 3P%, 91.7 FT%), 5.0 rebounds, 4.0 assists and 1.0 steals in 31.2 minutes.

LEBRON LATEST

40K: On Saturday, March 2, LeBron James became the first player in NBA history to reach 40,000 career points. He came into the game needing to score nine points to reach the milestone, and he did so with 10:39 remaining in the second quarter with a driving left-handed layup. He finished the game with 26 points (12-20 FG, 2-5 3FG), nine assists, four rebounds and three steals in 37 minutes. James became the NBA's all-time leading scorer last season against the Oklahoma City Thunder on Feb. 7, 2023, at Crypto.com Arena, passing Kareem Abdul-Jabbar (38,387 points).

PLENTY OF TWENTY: LeBron James achieved yet another milestone in his 20th season as he became the NBA's all-time leader in games with 20+ points. James recorded the 1,135th 20-point performance of his career on Oct. 28, 2022, at Minnesota, passing Karl Malone for the most such games in NBA history. James tallied a 37-game streak of 20-point games (11/6/22-2/15/23), good for the third longest streak of his career and longest since he had 38 straight 20-point games from April 15, 2012 through Jan. 8, 2013.

OH 3-0 MY: In addition to climbing the ranks of 20-point games, LeBron James is also approaching the all-time leaders in 30-point games. James passed Wilt Chamberlain for the second-most 30-point games in NBA history with a 33-point performance on 12/13 vs. Boston. Michael Jordan is now the only player in league history to have more 30-point outings than James.

DAILY DOUBLE DIGITS: LeBron James opened his 21st season in the NBA with two consecutive 21-point performances, ensuring that his double-digit scoring streak would continue.

- With a 26-point performance on his 36th birthday on Dec. 30, 2020, James extended his double-digit scoring streak to 1,000 consecutive games, becoming the first player in league history to reach that mark.
- James' double-digit scoring streak – which began on Jan. 6, 2007 – has far eclipsed Michael Jordan's previous NBA record of 866 consecutive 10-point performances from 1986-2001.
- James has finished with 10+ points in all but eight regular season contests in his career.
- In league history, there have only been seven streaks in which a player has finished in double figures in 500+ consecutive contests.

LEBRON IN THE NBA'S TOP-10 REGULAR SEASON WINS LIST: With a 133-129 in Milwaukee on Dec. 2, Lakers forward LeBron James tallied his 900th career regular season win, ranking seventh on the NBA's all-time victories list. James passed Dirk Nowitzki on Feb. 23, 2023 for sixth place on the list. The Akron, Ohio, native sits 37 wins away from moving past NBA legend for second all-time. The active leader in wins, James is one of seven players in NBA history to achieve the 900 career wins milestone.
