#### **LAST GAME:**

**Mar. 8 @ New York – Knicks 98, Magic 74:** Jalen Brunson scored 26 points, as New York defeated Orlando, 98-74, at Madison Square Garden. Josh Hart netted 19 points for the Knicks, while Precious Achiuwa tallied 15 points, 14 rebounds and five blocked shots. Paolo Banchero had 23 points, nine rebounds and four blocked shots to lead the Magic. The 74 points by the Magic were the fewest scored in any game in the NBA this season. New York dominated from start to finish, opening the game with an 8-0 run and never trailed in the contest. Orlando shot just 34.2 percent from the floor, including 6-of-26 from three-point range, and only dished out 12 assists. The Knicks finished the first half with a 9-0 run and led comfortably for the remainder of the game.

#### **RECENT GAMES:**

**Mar. 6 @ Washington – Magic 119, Wizards 109:** Franz Wagner poured in 28 points, while Paolo Banchero tallied 25 points and 10 assists, as Orlando overcame a 21-point, first half deficit and defeated Washington, 119-109, at Capital One Arena. Jalen Suggs scored 19 points for the Magic, while Moritz Wagner added 16 points off the bench. Jordan Poole led the Wizards with 26 points, while Kyle Kuzma scored 25 points. Orlando shot 54.3 percent from the floor and was 12-of-26 from three-point range. Washington led 34-23 after the first quarter and then opened the second quarter with an 18-8 run to stretch its lead to as much as 21 points with 7:55 left in the first half. The Magic opened the third quarter with a 12-2 run of their own, then proceeded to dominate the second half, outscoring the Wizards, 66-44. Orlando took the lead for good after a floater by Moritz Wagner with 5:44 remaining in the game and went on another 12-3 spurt after that moment to seize control.

**Mar. 5 @ Charlotte – Magic 101, Hornets 89:** Paolo Banchero led six players in double figures with 22 points, as Orlando defeated Charlotte, 101-89, at Spectrum Center. Cole Anthony scored 14 points off the bench for the Magic, while Wendell Carter Jr. added 12 points and nine rebounds. Vasilije Micic led the Hornets with 21 points. Orlando shot 54.1 percent from the field and outrebounded Charlotte, 41-31. The Magic also forced the Hornets to commit 19 turnovers, which led to 23 points. Leading 80-74 with 9:53 left in the fourth quarter, Orlando went on a 10-0 run to put the game out of reach.

**Mar. 10 vs. Indiana:** Orlando is 54-71 vs. Indiana (31-30 at home, 23-40 at Indiana, 0-1 at Disney) during regular season action, including 2-0 this season (see recaps below)...The Magic were 1-3 against the Pacers last season...Orlando is 5-10 vs. Indiana all-time in the playoffs (1994 First Round, 0-3; 1995 East Finals, 4-3; 2012 First Round, 1-4)...The Magic have lost 10 of the last 15 matchups with the Pacers and 29 of the last 39 overall...Orlando has lost 13 of the last 17 regular season meetings at home and 14 of the last 19 matchups in Indiana...Goga Bitadze was selected by Indiana in the first round (18<sup>th</sup> overall) of the 2019 NBA Draft and played 170 games with the Pacers from 2019-23...Gary Harris went to Hamilton Southeastern High School in Fishers, IN...Two-way player Trevelin Queen played in seven games with Indiana during the 2022-23 campaign...For all-time results vs. Indiana, see p. 347 of the media guide...**Nov. 19 @ Indiana – Magic 128, Pacers 116:** Paolo Banchero led six players in double figures with 24 points, as Orlando defeated Indiana, 128-116, at Gainbridge Fieldhouse. Franz Wagner scored 19 points for the Magic, while Jalen Suggs netted 18 points. Jordan Nwora led the Pacers with 19 points. The Magic shot 49.4 percent from the floor and was 35-of-42 from the free throw line. The Magic also scored 66 points in the paint. Orlando opened the game with an 11-0 run and never trailed in the contest, leading by as many as 40 points during the second half...**Dec. 23 @ Indiana – Magic 117, Pacers 110:** Paolo Banchero poured in 34 points, as Orlando defeated Indiana, 117-110, at Gainbridge Fieldhouse. The win snapped the Magic's four-game losing streak. Franz Wagner scored 24 points for the Magic, while Gary Harris added 15 points. Tyrese Haliburton led the Pacers with 29 points and 15 assists, while Myles Turner netted 24 points and Buddy Hield scored 20 points. Orlando shot 53.4 percent from the floor, while Indiana shot 52.4 percent. The Magic had a decisive edge from the free throw line, making 33-of-41, while the Pacers went 9-of-13. Banchero scored 23 of his points during the first half.

Mikal Bridges scored 21 points for the Nets, while Cameron Johnson netted 20 points. Franz Wagner led seven Magic players in double figures with 21 points and eight rebounds, while Paolo Banchero added 19 points. Brooklyn shot 54.1 percent from the floor and forced Orlando into 16 turnovers, which led to 27 Nets points. Brooklyn led 88-86 after the third quarter, then seized control of the game during the final stanza, outscoring Orlando, 36-18. The Nets opened the fourth quarter with a 15-3 run and never looked back...**Dec. 2 @ Brooklyn – Nets 129, Magic 101:** Mikal Bridges scored 42 points, including 26 points during the first quarter alone, as Brooklyn defeated Orlando, 129-101, at Barclays Center. The loss snapped Orlando's franchise record-tying nine-game winning streak. Spencer Dinwiddie netted 22 points for the Nets, while Cam Thomas added 20 points. Franz Wagner and Cole Anthony led the Magic with 20 points each, while Paolo Banchero

tallied 19 points, 10 rebounds and eight assists. Brooklyn shot 50.5 percent from the floor, was 14-of-34 from three-point range and outrebounded Orlando, 57-36. The Nets jumped out to a 43-22 lead after the first quarter and 73-51 at halftime. The Magic battled back during the third quarter, trimming the deficit to 87-78 after a three-pointer by Anthony with 3:09 left in the third quarter. However, Brooklyn answered with a 9-2 spurt and led comfortably the rest of the way...**Feb. 27 vs. Brooklyn – Magic 108, Nets 81:** Franz Wagner scored 21 points, as Orlando routed Brooklyn, 108-81, at Kia Center. Five Magic players scored in double figures. Moritz Wagner had 16 points for the Magic, while Markelle Fultz and Cole Anthony each added 12 points. Dennis Schroder led the Nets with 15 points. Orlando shot 52.7 percent from the field, while holding Brooklyn to just 39.2 percent. The Magic also forced the Nets to commit 22 turnovers, which led to 29 points. ##### **MAGIC TOGETHER...**

The Orlando Magic have advanced to the playoffs 16 times during their relatively short 34-year history...The Magic have won six division championships (1995, 1996, 2008, 2009, 2010, 2019) and made two NBA Finals appearances after capturing Eastern Conference titles in 1995 and 2009...During their first trip in 1995, Orlando became the second-fastest team in NBA history to reach the Finals in just its sixth year of existence.

##### **THIS DATE IN MAGIC HISTORY – MARCH 10...**

March 10, 2020 – Terrence Ross scored 18 of his 24 points during the fourth quarter, as Orlando overcame a 17-point deficit and defeated Memphis, 120-115, at FedEx Forum. Michael Carter-Williams scored a season-high 20 points for the Magic, while Nikola Vučević tallied 19 points, 11 rebounds and seven assists. This would be the last game Orlando played before the NBA temporarily suspended the 2019-20 regular season due to the Covid pandemic.

March 10, 2013 – Jameer Nelson passed Hedo Turkoglu (7,198 points) for fifth on the Magic's all-time scoring list, while scoring 24 points. Orlando defeated Philadelphia at home, 99-91.

March 10, 2010 – More than 300 volunteers, including Dwight Howard and Brandon Bass, from the Orlando Magic, the City of Kissimmee and Community Vision, organizers from KaBOOM! and residents of the Kissimmee community joined forces to build a new, safe playground at the Oak Street Community Center. The new playground's design was based on drawings created by children who participated in a Design Day event in January.

March 10, 2006 – The Magic set the franchise record for best field goal percentage in a quarter, shooting 84.2 percent (16-19) in the second quarter. Orlando outscored Cleveland 32-16 and took a 53-44 lead heading into halftime. The Magic went on to win the game, 102-73, snapping a six-game losing streak. Carlos Arroyo led a balanced Magic attack with 17 points.

March 10, 2004 – Tracy McGrady poured in a franchise record 62 points, as Orlando defeated Washington, 108-99, at TD Waterhouse Centre. McGrady was 20-of-37 from the floor, including 5-of-14 from three-point range, and 17-of-26 from the free throw line. McGrady broke the old franchise record of 53 points, a record that had been held by Shaquille O'Neal, when he hit a pair of free throws with 8:21 remaining in the game. The 62 points scored by McGrady were the most in the NBA since David Robinson poured in 71 on April 24, 1994.

March 10, 2003 – Tracy McGrady was named the NBA's Eastern Conference Player of the Week for games played March 3-9. McGrady set two franchise scoring records in a 111-98 victory against Denver on March 9, with the most points scored in a half with 37 and most points in a quarter with 25 before finishing with a game-high 43 points.



March 10, 1996 – Orlando won its 39th straight home game, a new NBA record, with a 122-106 victory over Phoenix before an NBC national television audience and 17,248 at the Orlando Arena. The Magic eclipsed the Boston Celtics mark of 38 consecutive home wins between Dec. 10, 1985 and Nov. 28, 1986. The Magic use a balanced attack, as Shaquille O'Neal scored 25 points, Nick Anderson added 24 points, Anfernee Hardaway had 20 points and 14 assists, and Horace Grant scored 20 points and grabbed 11 rebounds. The win also marked Orlando's seventh straight victory.

March 10, 1995 – Orlando became the first team to clinch a playoff spot with a 97-85 victory over Portland. The victory assured Orlando of its second straight playoff berth.

March 10, 1991 – Dennis Scott became the first Magic player to win NBA Player of the Week honors in the week ending March 10.

#### YOUTH GONE WILD...

The Orlando Magic entered the 2023-24 season with an average age of 24.79 years old...Orlando began the season with 11 players on its roster with three-or-less years of NBA experience and nine players age 24-and-under...The Magic roster's average number of seasons of NBA experience is 3.44...Last season, Orlando had the fourth-youngest roster in the NBA at 23.94, according to the league's annual survey.

#### MAKING STRIDES...

With a record of 34-48 in 2022-23, Orlando recorded 12 more victories than the previous season...It was the largest win improvement in the Eastern Conference and third-largest in the NBA (Sacramento +18, 30 to 48; Oklahoma City +16, 24 to 40)...It was tied for the fifth-largest win improvement in team history...The largest is a 20-game improvement from 1991-92 (21 wins) to 1992-93 (41 wins)...Here are the biggest improvements from one season to another in Magic history:

It marked the ninth time in team history that Orlando has 14+ wins during its first 20 games of the season and was the Magic's best record through 20 games since the 2010-11 campaign...The best record all-time through 20 outings is 16-4, which they did four times, most recently in 2009-10.

It also stands as only the seventh time in franchise history that Orlando has 20+ wins during its first 35 games of the season and was the Magic's best record through 35 games since the 2011-12 campaign...The best record all-time through 35 outings is 27-8, which they did in 2008-09.

### **CALLING ALL-STAR...**

Orlando Magic forward Paolo Banchero was named to the 2024 NBA All-Star team...Banchero tallied six points, a game-high nine rebounds and five assists in 18:55 played, as the East defeated the West, 211-186 in the 73<sup>rd</sup> NBA All-Star Game on Feb. 18 at Gainbridge Fieldhouse in Indianapolis...This marked the first time that Banchero has been named an NBA All-Star...He became the ninth player in Orlando Magic history to be named an NBA All-Star, joining Shaquille O'Neal (1993-96), Anfernee Hardaway (1995-98), Tracy McGrady (2001-04), Grant Hill (2001, 2005), Dwight Howard (2007-12), Rashard Lewis (2009), Jameer Nelson (2009) and Nikola Vučević (2019, 2021).

### **\*\*MAGIC TRICKS – 2024 RISING STARS\*\***

## ON THE ROAD AGAIN...

Orlando is 16-19 this season on the road...Last season, the Magic were 14-27 on the road.

### **\*\*MAGIC TRICKS – WESTWARD BOUND\*\***

After opening the 2023-24 regular season at home on Oct. 25 vs. Houston, the Orlando Magic hit the road for a four-game, west coast trip Oct. 27-Nov. 2...It marked the earliest west coast trip in franchise history and the only west coast trip that has ever started in October for Orlando...The earliest previous trip out west occurred during the 2017-18 campaign, when the Magic traveled to Denver, Golden State and Portland from Nov. 10-15 (Orlando went 1-3)...Orlando went 2-2 on the road trip, winning on Oct. 27 @ Portland, falling on both Oct. 30 @ L.A. Lakers and Oct. 31 @ L.A. Clippers, then winning again on Nov. 2 @ Utah...It was the Magic's first win at Utah since Dec. 3, 2015, snapping a seven-game road losing skid to the Jazz.

Orlando also headed to the west coast during mid-November for four consecutive seasons from 2000-01 to 2003-04.

During their second trip the west coast this season, Orlando defeated Denver on Jan. 5, 122-120, marking the first win at Denver since Dec. 8, 2015, snapping a seven-game road losing streak to the Nuggets...It also marked the first time the Magic have swept a season series against Denver since the 2015-16 campaign.

## CLOSE CALLS...

Orlando is 9-9 this season in games decided by five points-or-less...In fact, Orlando is 4-3 this season in games decided by two points or less...The Magic have seven losses by three points-or-less, which is tied for the third-most in the NBA (as of Mar. 10)...Last season, the Magic were 9-13 in games decided by five points-or-less.

## OFFENSIVE BEHAVIOR...

Orlando is averaging 110.9 ppg. (7,095 points) this season...The Magic have scored 100+ points 54 times (35-19 record), 110+ points 35 times (27-8 record), 120+ points 13 times (11-2 record) and 130+ points four times (3-1 record), including a season-high 139 points on Nov. 29 vs. Washington...Last season, the Magic averaged 111.4 ppg. Orlando is shooting .477 (2,596-5,446) this season and shot 50 percent-or-better 20 times (19-1 record), including a season-high .632 (48-76) on Feb. 14 vs. New York...Last season, the Magic shot .470 (3,323-7,074) from the floor and shot 50 percent-or-better 26 times (18-8 record), including a season-high .592 (42-71) on Dec. 9 vs. Toronto.

Orlando is shooting .353 (696-1,971) from three-point range this season and made 10+ three-pointers 41 times (24-17 record), including an NBA-season-high-tying and franchise-record 25 three-pointers on Jan. 3 @ Sacramento...Last season, the Magic shot .346 (883-2,551) from three-point range and made 10+ three-pointers 53 times (26-27 record), including a season-high 17 three-pointers three times, the last on Apr. 9 @ Miami.

After making seven three-pointers on Jan. 5, Jalen Suggs then connected on six three-pointers on Jan. 7 vs. Atlanta...Suggs became only the third player in franchise history to make 6+ three-pointers in consecutive games, joining Dennis Scott (Feb. 20-21, 1996; Feb. 28-29, 1996) and Evan Fournier (Dec. 1-3, 2019) as the only Magic players ever to accomplish the feat...No Orlando player has ever had 6+ three-pointers in three straight outings.

Suggs also became just the fifth player in Magic history to make 4+ three-pointers in four-or-more consecutive games, joining Dennis Scott, Jameer Nelson, Terrence Ross and Nick Anderson...The longest streak with 4+ three-pointers made in Orlando history is six games, done by Scott from Feb. 28-Mar. 8, 1996...Jameer Nelson made 4+ trifectas in five straight contests from Dec. 23, 2012-Jan. 5, 2013.

#### **\*\*MAGIC TRICKS – PERFECTION\*\***

On Oct. 30 @ L.A. The Orlando Magic are averaging 25.1 free throw attempts per game (1,604 FTA), which is tied for second in the NBA (as of Mar. 10)...Orlando is also averaging 18.9 free throws made per game (1,207 FTM), which ranks sixth in the league.

#### **\*\*MAGIC TRICKS – COLE CASHED IN\*\***

Cole Anthony made 31 straight free throws from Nov. 9-22, before missing during the third quarter vs. Denver...The most consecutive free throws made in franchise history is 47, set by Darrell Armstrong from Nov. 13-Dec. 11, 1999.

#### **BALANCING ACT...**

Orlando has had five-or-more players score in double figures 45 times (30-15 record) this season, had six-or-more players score in double figures 22 times (14-8 record), seven-or-more players score in double figures four times (2-2 record) and eight players score in double figures once (1-0 record) – Feb. 24 @ Detroit, which ties the franchise record...Last season, Orlando had five-or-more players score in double figures 58 times (31-27 record), six-or-more players score in double figures 29 times (14-15 record), seven-or-more players score in double figures 11 times (10-1 record) and a franchise-record-tying eight players score in double figures four times (4-0 record).

Orlando's reserves are averaging 41.5 ppg. (2,653 points), which ranks fourth in the NBA (as of Mar. 10)...The Magic bench has scored 40+ points 36 times (20-16 record), 50+ points 15 times (10-5 record) and 60+ points three times (2-1 record), including a season-high 69 points on Jan. 19 vs. Philadelphia...Orlando's bench has outscored (or tied) the opposition 52 times (32-20 record)...Last season, the Magic reserves averaged 37.0 ppg. (3,037 points), scored 40+ points 31 times (13-18 record) and 50+ points 11 times (6-5 record), including a season-high 72 points on Feb. 3 @ Minnesota...The Magic bench outscored (or tied) the opponents 45 times (23-22 record)...The most points scored off the bench in team history is 85, done on Mar. 26, 1995 vs. Golden State.

#### EVERYONE DESERVES A SECOND CHANCE...

Orlando is averaging 15.06 second chance points per game (964 points), which ranks seventh in the NBA (as of Mar. 10)...The Magic have scored 20+ second chance points 12 times (8-4 record) and 30+ points once (1-0 record), including a season-high 36 second chance points on Nov. 4 vs. L.A. Lakers, which tied for the most the Magic have ever scored since the stat began being tracked in 1996-97...Orlando also had 36 second chance points on Oct. 29, 2013 @ Indiana...Last season, the Magic averaged 14.20 second chance points per game (1,164 points), which ranked 12<sup>th</sup> in the NBA...The Magic scored 20+ second chance points 16 times (6-10 record) and 30+ points twice (0-2 record), including a season-high 34 points on Nov. 14 vs. Charlotte.

On the other hand, Orlando has allowed 12.27 second chance points per game (785 points), which ranks third in the league...Last season, the Magic allowed 13.48 second chance points per game (1,105 points).

Orlando is allowing 109.4 ppg. (6,999 points), which ranks third in the NBA (as of Mar. 10)...The Magic have held opponents to less than 100 points 18 times (16-2 record), which is tied for the most in the league, including a season-low 81 points on Feb. 27 vs. Brooklyn...Last season, Orlando allowed 114.0 ppg. (9,346 points) and less than 100 points eight times (8-0 record), including a season-low 87 points on Nov. 9 vs. Dallas.

Orlando is allowing opponents to shoot .474 (2,566-5,409) from the floor...The Magic have held opponents to less than 50 percent shooting 41 times (28-13 record) and less than 40 percent seven times (7-0 record), including a season-low .353 (30-85) on Dec. 11 vs. Cleveland...Last season, Orlando allowed opponents to shoot .476 (3,389-7,127) from the floor, held the opposition to less than 50 percent shooting 54 times (30-24 record), and less than 40 percent six times (5-1 record), including a season-low .348 (31-89) on Dec. 18 @ Boston.

Orlando is averaging 8.13 stlpg. (520 steals), which ranks fourth in the NBA (as of Mar. 10)...The Magic have had 10+ steals 20 times (13-7 record), including a season-high 16 steals on Nov. 2 @ Utah and Jan. 17 @ Atlanta...Last season, the Magic averaged 7.35 stlpg. (603 steals), which ranked 12<sup>th</sup> in the NBA and had 10+ steals 17 times, including a season-high 14 steals on Mar. 18 @ L.A. Clippers.

The Magic have a steals-to-turnover ratio of 0.55 (520/953).

Orlando is averaging 5.28 blkpg. (338 blocked shots)...The Magic had a season-high 10 blocked shots three times, the last on Mar. 8 @ New York...Last season, the Magic averaged 4.66 blkpg. (382 blocked shots) and had 10+ blocked shots four times, including a season-high 14 blocks on Mar. 31 @ Washington.

### **DON'T CALL IT A COMEBACK...**

Orlando has overcome double digits to win nine times this season, including a season-high 21-point deficit to win on Mar. 6 @ Washington...That tied for the sixth-largest deficit overcome to win in team history...Last season, the Magic overcame double digit deficits to win 11 times, including a season-best 21-point deficit on Jan. 30 @ Philadelphia...The largest overall comeback ever in Orlando Magic history is 25 points, set back on Nov. 8, 1989 @ Cleveland...Here's a look at the biggest comebacks in Orlando Magic history:

## HUEVOS BANCHEROS...

Paolo Banchero has led (or tied) the team in scoring 35 times, in rebounding 20 times and in assists 30 times...He has scored in double figures 60 times, 20+ points 42 times, 30+ points nine times and 40+ points twice, including a career-high 43 points on Jan. 3 @ Sacramento...Banchero has recorded a team-high 13 double-doubles and one triple-double...Banchero dished out 10+ assists four times, including a career-high 11 assists on Jan. 5 @ Denver.

During his brief NBA career, Banchero has now scored 20+ points 82 times (42 times this season), 30+ points 15 times (nine times this season) and 40+ points twice (both this season), including a career-high 43 points on Jan. 3 @ Sacramento and 42 points on Dec. 6 @ Cleveland.

Banchero was named the 2022-23 Kia NBA Rookie of the Year, earning the Wilt Chamberlain Trophy by the league...He joins Shaquille O'Neal (1992-93) and Mike Miller (2000-01) as the only Orlando Magic players ever to be named NBA Rookie of the Year...Banchero received 494 points (98 first place votes) from a panel of 100 sportswriters and broadcasters.

Banchero was also named the Kia NBA's Eastern Conference Rookie of the Month four consecutive times from December 2022-March/April 2023, joining Shaquille O'Neal (1992-93) as the only players in franchise history to win the honor four straight times.

## \*\*MAGIC TRICKS – NBA EAST PLAYER OF THE WEEK\*\*

Paolo Banchero named the NBA's Eastern Conference Player of the Week for the period ending Nov. 26, 2023...It marked the first time that Banchero has won the league's top weekly honor in his career...Banchero becomes the 13<sup>th</sup> player in Orlando Magic history to be named NBA's Eastern Conference Player of the Week and the first since Nikola Vučević on Nov. 17, 2019...During four games, Banchero averaged 23.5 ppg., 5.5 rpg., 5.0 apg. and 1.00 blkpg. in 34.5 minpg., while shooting .544 (37-68) from the floor and .526 (10-19) from three-point range...He led (or tied) the Magic in scoring once, in rebounding once and in assists once...Banchero scored 20+ points in all four games, as Orlando went a perfect 4-0 with wins over Toronto, Denver, Boston and Charlotte, and is currently riding a seven-game winning streak, tied for the longest active win streak in the NBA.

## \*\*MAGIC TRICKS – 30-PIECE FOR PAOLO\*\*

On Nov. 2 @ Utah, Paolo Banchero scored 30 points...It was the second-most 30+ point games by a player less than 21 years of age in franchise history, trailing only Shaquille O'Neal, who had eight.

Banchero recorded three straight 30+ point games from Jan. 3-7...He also had back-to-back games with 30+ points and 10+ rebounds on Jan. 5-7...The last time an Orlando player had consecutive 30+ point/10+ rebound games was Feb. 19-21, 2021, when Nikola Vučević did it...The longest 30+ point/10+ rebound streak in franchise history is four games, done by Shaquille O'Neal (Jan. 15-21, 1994 and Feb. 9-20, 1994) and Dwight Howard (Feb. 13-25, 2011).

At 21 years-56 days old, Banchero became the seventh-youngest player in the NBA since 1980-81 and the 10<sup>th</sup>-youngest since 1975-76 to record consecutive 30+ point/10+ rebound games.

## \*\*MAGIC TRICKS – PAOLO'S 40-TIME\*\*

On Nov. 6 @ Cleveland, Paolo Banchero scored 40+ points for the first time in his career, netting 42 points...At 21 years-24 days old, Banchero became the second-youngest player in franchise history to score 40+ points in a game, trailing only Shaquille O'Neal, who at 20 years-347 days old, scored 46 points on Feb. 16, 1993 @ Detroit...He was the first Orlando player to have a 40+ point game since Nikola Vučević had 42 points on Feb. 12, 2021 @ Sacramento.

On Jan. 3 @ Sacramento, Banchero poured in a career-high 43 points...He became only the seventh player in franchise history to record multiple 40+ point games in a single season, joining Tracy McGrady, Shaquille O'Neal, Nick Anderson, Dwight Howard, Aaron Gordon and Nikola Vučević...It was the first since 2020-21, when Vučević recorded two 40+ point outings...The last time a Magic player had three-or-more 40+ point games during a season was 2003-04, when Tracy McGrady had eight...The team record for most 40+ point games in a season is 11, set by McGrady in 2002-03:

Banchero recorded the 35<sup>th</sup> triple-double in franchise history and the first since Feb. 19, 2021, when Nikola Vučević had 30 points, 16 rebounds and 10 assists vs. Golden State...He became the youngest in team history to record a 30/10/10 triple-double and the third-youngest player in team history to have a triple-double overall...Elfrid Payton had back-to-back triple-doubles on Mar. 18-20, 2015 when he was 21 years-24 days and 21 years-26 days old.

#### **\*\*MAGIC TRICKS – THE POWER OF P\*\***

Franz Wagner has led (or tied) the team in scoring 20 times, in rebounding nine times and in assists 15 times...He has scored in double figures 53 times, 20+ points 27 times and 30+ points seven times, including a career-high-tying 38 points on Feb. 4 @ Detroit.

During his brief NBA career, Wagner has now scored 20+ points 79 times (27 this season) and 30+ points 11 times (seven this season), including a career-high 38 points on Dec. 28, 2021 vs. Milwaukee and Feb. 4, 2024 @ Detroit.

### \*\*MAGIC TRICKS – DREIßIG-FOR-DREIßIG BY FRANZ\*\*

Franz Wagner scored 30+ points in three consecutive games from Nov. 26-Dec. 1 (30, Nov. 26 vs. Charlotte; 31, Nov. 29 vs. Washington; 31, Dec. 1 vs. Washington)...It is the first time an Orlando player has scored 30+ points in three consecutive outings since Feb. 13-25, 2011, when Dwight Howard did it in four straight games...The franchise record is 14 straight games, set by Tracy McGrady from Mar. 5-Apr. 1, 2003.

On Feb. 4 @ Detroit, Wagner tied his career-high with 38 points...He was 17-of-25 from the floor, including 4-of-7 from three-point range...Amazingly, Wagner did not have a single free throw made or attempted in the game...The 38 points were the second-most in a game without a free throw made in franchise history...Dennis Scott scored 41 points on Apr. 13, 1993 vs. Milwaukee without going to the charity stripe (16-31 FG, 9-19 3FG).

### DYNAMIC DUO...

Paolo Banchero and Franz Wagner have scored 20+ points each in the same game 18 times this season (14-4 record) and 38 times during their careers (20-18 record).

### AND THIS IS MY OTHER BROTHER, DARRYL...I MEAN MOE...

Moritz Wagner has led (or tied) the team in scoring three times and in rebounding seven times...He has scored in double figures 41 times and 20+ points four times this season, including a season-high 27 points on Nov. 24 vs. Boston...Wagner has scored 676 points off the bench (11.1 ppg., 61 games), which ranks 10<sup>th</sup> in the NBA (as of Mar. 10).

### COLE WORLD...

Cole Anthony has led (or tied) the team in scoring four times, in rebounding three times and in assists 12 times...He has scored in double figures 41 times, 20+ points seven times and 30+ points once, including a season-high 30 points on Nov. 26 vs. Charlotte.

During his brief NBA career, Anthony has now scored 20+ points 38 times (seven times this season) and 30+ points five times (once this season), including a career-high 37 points on May 16, 2021 @ Philadelphia.

Anthony had 15 points and dished out a season-high 10 assists on Nov. 21 vs. Toronto...He has now dished out 10+ assists five times during his NBA career and tallied 13 career double-doubles (three this season).

Anthony has scored 734 points off the bench (11.7 ppg., 63 games), which ranks seventh in the NBA (as of Mar. 10)...Last season, his eight 20+ point games as a reserve ranked third in the Eastern Conference and he scored 730 points off the bench (13.0 ppg., 56 games), which ranked fourth in the Eastern Conference and eighth in the NBA.

On April 11, 2023, the Orlando Magic announced that it relocated its NBA G League affiliate to Kissimmee, Fla., and it was rebranded as the Osceola Magic...The Magic finished the 2022-23 regular season with a record of 18-14...However, after a four-way tie-breaker, they finished eighth in the Eastern Conference and failed to reach the playoffs.

The Orlando Magic's G League affiliate captured the 2021 NBA G League championship, defeating Delaware in the title game on Mar. 11, 2021, 97-78...All games were played at a single-site location at the ESPN Wide World of Sports Complex at Walt Disney World Resort near Orlando, Fla.

### **DeVOS FAMILY CONTINUES TO GIVE BACK...**

More than 30 years ago, shortly after acquiring the Orlando Magic franchise, Rich DeVos had one request – please don't call him the owner...“The real stake in the team is the community and people who are the fans who come to the games,” DeVos said at the time...“We're just the caretakers of your team and we'll try to do a good job for you”...On Aug. 14, as part of the Orlando Magic's continuing commitment to the Central Florida community, the team announced \$1,000,000 in grants to be distributed through the Orlando Magic Youth Foundation (OMYF) in three ways – a summer grant cycle, a winter grant cycle and microgrants...The first set of grants (summer grant cycle) totaling \$370,000 were distributed in surprise visits on Aug. 10 nonprofit organizations in Orange and Seminole counties assisting at-risk youth in Central Florida...Magic Community Ambassadors Nick Anderson and Bo Outlaw presented the 10 organizations an OMYF novelty check with the amount they will be granted at each of the visits...The second set of grant recipients (winter grant cycle) will be announced in February 2024 through surprise visits as well...In addition, the Magic will award microgrants to smaller, up-and-coming local nonprofits to assist them in growing their organizations...Approximately \$530,000 will be distributed to the second set of grantees (to be determined) in February along with \$100,000 in microgrants for a total of \$1 million to assist at-risk youth in Orange, Seminole, Brevard, Lake, Polk, Volusia, and Osceola counties...This marks the 16<sup>th</sup> time the team has distributed at least \$1 million to the community with the Magic granting more than \$29 million over the past 34 years to local nonprofit community organizations through the OMYF.
