NETS QUICK HITS

IF THE NETS WIN

- It would give Brooklyn consecutive road wins for the second time this season (three straight road wins – 10/30 – 11/3).
- It would secure the Nets a **3-1** season series victory over the Magic.
- It would give the Nets their fourth win in the last five meetings and their 11th victory in the last 15 matchups with the Magic dating back to the NBA Bubble in 2020.
- It would improve Brooklyn's record to **11-7** this season against the Southeast Division.

INDIVIDUAL LEAGUE LEADERS

- **CLUTCH:** Mikal Bridges is tied for sixth in the NBA in 'clutch' points with De'Aaron Fox (102), trailing only Stephen Curry (165), DeMar DeRozan (147), Damian Lillard (115), Trae Young (107) and Nikola Jokic (107).
- **MINUTES:** Bridges ranks third in the league in total minutes played (2,300), trailing only Coby White (2,388) and DeMar DeRozan (2,372). He led this category in each of the last two seasons.
- **SCORING:** Bridges is third in the league in corner 3FGM (64-of-162 - .395).
 - Thomas is 13th in the league and sixth in the East in ppg on drives (9.4) – *min. 30 games played.*
 - Nic Claxton is sixth in the league in FG % (.628). He led the league in this category and set a franchise record last season (.705).
 - Lonnie Walker IV is third in the league in ppg among all players averaging fewer than 20.0 mpg – *min. 10 games played.* ----- >
 - Day'Ron Sharpe is third in the league in second chance points off the bench (127).
- **USG %:** Thomas is 13th in the league and sixth in the East in usage rate (.296) – *min. 30 games played.*
- **3FG %:** Walker ranks 15th in the league and fifth in the East in 3FG % (94-of-223 - .422).
 - He is also eighth in the league 3FGM/gm off the bench (2.1) – *min. 30 games played.*
 - Thomas is sixth in the East in catch-and-shoot 3FG % (.441) among 101 players in the conference with at least 100 such attempts. Cam Johnson ranks 14th (.430).
- **BOARDS:** Sharpe is tied for second in the league in rebound % (.199) with Jusuf Nurkic and is tied second in offensive rebound % (.160) with Clint Capela.
 - Claxton ranks 13th in rpg (9.8) and ranks 19th in orpg (2.7).
 - Sharpe is second in offensive rebounds off the bench (124), trailing only Andre Drummond (153), and is fourth in total rebounds off the bench (311).
- **BLOCKS:** Claxton is seventh in the league in bpg (2.1) and is eighth in total blocks (117).
- **STEALS:** Dennis Smith Jr. ranks tied for third in the league in steals off the bench (53) with Cole Anthony.
- **ASSISTS:** Dennis Schröder ranks 14th in the league and seventh in the East in total assists (395).
- **AST/TO:** Schröder ranks 14th in the league in assist-to-turnover ratio (3.38).
- **DEF:** Claxton is sixth in the league in DFG % at the rim (.526) among 37 players that have defended 5.0+ FGA at the rim/game – *min. 10 games played.*

- **CORNER 3s:** The Nets are tied for fourth in corner 3FG % (.416) and are **first** in corner 3FGM (4.3/game).
 - Brooklyn ranked 13th (.394) and 12th (3.4/game) in those categories, respectively, last season.
- **BOARDS:** The Nets have outrebounded opponents 30 of 65 games after doing so just 22 times last season.

NETS QUICK HITS

NETS RECENT NOTABLES – NETS KNOCK OFF CAVS IN CLEVELAND

- **3/10 at CLE:** On the second half of an away/away back-to-back in Cleveland, Brooklyn's offense exploded for 44 third-quarter points while shooting a season-best .514 3 FG % from deep, en route to a 120-101 victory over the Cavaliers.
- **BIG QUARTER:** Brooklyn's 44 points in the third match its most points scored in a quarter this season (other: second quarter vs. Chicago on 11/26) and are its most in a quarter on the road since scoring 47 in the first quarter at Detroit on 4/5/23 last season).
- **50/50/90:** The Nets shot 42-of-79 (.532) from the field, 18-of-35 (season-high .514) from deep and 18-of-20 (.900) from the free-throw line on Sunday, marking their first game this season with team 50/50/90 shooting splits (last time: 12/18/22 at Detroit).
 - Brooklyn is **12-3** this season when shooting .500 FG % or better.
- **DIMES:** Brooklyn dished out 33 assists on Sunday, marking its 15th game with 30+ dimes this season and improving to **10-5** when doing so.
- **BACK-TO-BACK:** The Nets earned their second win on the second night of a back-to-back in less than a week, topping Cleveland on Sunday after defeating Philadelphia at home, 112-107, the previous Tuesday.
 - Sunday was the Nets first road victory on the second night of a back-to-back in five tries.
 - See the chart for the Nets' most lopsided road wins this season. ----- >
- **FROM DEEP:** **Dennis Schröder** swished a 40-foot 3-pointer as the shot clock expired with 3:22 left in the third and **Cam Thomas** drilled a pull-up, 37-foot triple with just tenths of a second left in the same quarter.
 - *These two shots, which occurred just minutes apart, are the two longest made shots by Brooklyn this season by five feet (Royce O'Neale made two from 32 ft in games back in November).*
 - *Schröder's 40-foot heave is the Nets' farthest made basket in six seasons (Spencer Dinwiddie made from 48 ft on 11/9/18 at DEN).*
- **FOUR POINT PLAYS:** The Nets have converted six four-point plays this season, including one from **Cam Thomas** at Cleveland on Sunday night.
 - Brooklyn has converted four four-point plays this month (four in the last six games) after converting two prior to March (59 games).
- **Nic Claxton** posted his team-leading 25th double-double with 16 points (7-of-10 FG, 2-of-2 FT), 10 rebounds and three assists in 28 minutes.
 - Clax has notched a double-double in each of his last four games and in five of Brooklyn's six games this month. Over these six games, he's averaging 15.8 ppg (.691 FG %, .679 FT %), 9.8 rpg, 2.8 apg and 2.0 bpg in 32.7 mpg.
 - *His streak of four-straight double-doubles matches a career-long (done twice, most recently 1/3 – 1/11/24).*
 - Claxton has notched five double-doubles this month. He's one of just four players to record five or more double-doubles this month, joining **Luka Dončić** (six), **Anthony Davis** (five) and **Domantas Sabonis** (five).
 - Claxton joins **Kris Humphries** (two seasons, 2010-12), **Derrick Coleman** (five seasons, 1990-95), **Buck Williams** (eight seasons, 1981-89) and **Bernard King** (two seasons, 1977-79) as the only players in Nets history to record 25+ points/rebounds double-doubles in consecutive seasons. The rest of the Nets combined have 24 double-doubles this season (next-most– six, **Day'Ron Sharpe**).
 - *Over the last five games, Claxton is shooting 19-of-26 (.731 FT %) from the free-throw line, which marks his best five-game stretch of free throw shooting in his career (min. 20 attempts in a five-game stretch).*
- **Cam Thomas** had a game-high 29 points (9-of-19 FG, 5-of-7 3FG), seven boards, five dimes (one turnover) in 31 minutes (season-best +27).
 - This marked the second 25/5/5 game of Thomas' career (44 points, five rebounds and five assists on 2/4/23 vs. Washington).
 - Thomas contributed 20 points (7-of-12 FG, 5-of-6 3FG) in 14 minutes in the second half.
 - In two games since returning from a six-game absence (right ankle/midfoot sprain), Thomas has averaged 30.0 ppg (.488 FG), 4.0 rpg and 3.5 apg in 30.6 mpg (+31), shooting 10-of-17 (.588) from 3-point range.
 - Thomas has knocked down five or more 3-pointers in consecutive games (5-of-10 on Saturday at Charlotte) for the second time in his career (12/16 – 12/18/23). He's never done it in three-straight.
 - Thomas has made five or more 3-pointers seven times this season, averaging 34.7 ppg in those seven games.
- **Mikal Bridges** registered 25 points (9-of-14 FG, 5-of-8 3FG, 2-of-2 FT), five rebounds, five assists, three steals and just one turnover in 35 minutes.
 - *Thomas and Bridges became the first pair of Nets in franchise history to record 25+ points, five or more rebounds, five or more assists and make five-plus 3-pointers in the same game.*
 - Prior to the Cleveland game, just two Nets had recorded a 25/5/5 game with five or more 3-pointers this season: Bridges on 1/23 vs. New York and **Spencer Dinwiddie** on 11/14 vs. Orlando.
 - See the chart for the only duos in NBA history to record a 25/5/5 game with five or more 3-pointers and one or fewer turnovers. --- >
 - The only other duos to accomplish that this season are Golden State's **Stephen Curry** and **Klay Thompson** (1/12 at Chicago) and Dallas' **Luka Dončić** and **Kyrie Irving** (1/7 vs. Minnesota).
- **Dennis Schröder** posted 17 points (7-of-11 FG, 3-of-5 3FG), two boards, eight assists and two steals in 34 minutes.
 - He has shot .493 (37-of-75) from 3-point range across his last 15 games, including 34-of-69 (.493) in his first 14 games as a Net.
 - *The .493 3FG % is the highest in any 15-game stretch in his career.*
 - The highest 3FG % for a player in their first 15 games as a Net all-time is .485 3FG % for **Seth Curry** in the 2021-22 (2/14 – 3/27/22).
 - In his last nine games, Schröder has averaged 18.1 ppg (.539 FG, .563 3FG), 2.9 rpg and 6.9 apg in 32.8 mpg.
 - He's tallied at least seven assists in a career-long seven-straight games. See the chart for the longest active such streaks in the league. ----- >
- Over the last seven games (since 2/29), **Dorian Finney-Smith** is +67, ranking sixth in the NBA in that time, trailing four Celtics and **Trey Murphy III**.

SEASON SERIES – NETS TAKE FIRST TWO AGAINST MAGIC BY 20+

- **ACQUIRED:** The Nets acquired guard **Dennis Schröder** from the Toronto Raptors on trade deadline day (2/8).
- Schröder put together a memorable Brooklyn debut, recording his seventh double-double of the season with 15 points (6-of-13 FG, 3-of-5 3FG), three rebounds, a season-high-tying 12 assists and just two turnovers in 27 minutes off the bench.

 - Schröder and **Kelvin Ransey** are the only players in Nets history to accomplish that feat off the bench.
 - Schröder's 12 assists tied **Deron Williams** for the third-most in a Nets debut all-time, trailing only **James Harden's** 14 assists and **Kevin Porter's** 13 assists on 11/9/77 at Philadelphia (off the bench).
- **DBL-DBLS:** Schröder has notched seven double-doubles this season, including one in his first appearance with the Nets (15 points and 12 assists vs. San Antonio on 2/10/24). He's registered more than seven double-doubles in a season once in his career: 10 double-doubles in 2016-17 with Atlanta.
- **ON O:** Schröder's offensive rating (113.7) is the second-best mark of his career, trailing his number last season with the Lakers (115.0).
 - His effective FG % (.524) and true shooting % (.562) are both close to his single season career bests, done in the 2019-20 season with Oklahoma City: .534 effective FG % and .575 true shooting %.
- **SINCE 2013:** Schröder ranks 15th in total assists (among active players) since entering the league in 2013-14 (3,600 assists).
 - Since he entered the league, Schröder is one of just nine players to register 3,500 assists, 2,000 rebounds and 800 3-pointers, joining **Stephen Curry, James Harden, Jrue Holiday, LeBron James, Damian Lillard, Kyle Lowry, Chris Paul** and **Russell Westbrook**.
- **INTL STAGE:** Schröder helped lead Germany to a gold medal at this past summer's FIBA World Cup, earning MVP honors in the process. He's one of six active German players in the NBA, joining New York's **Isaiah Hartenstein**, Dallas' **Maxi Kleber**, L.A. Clippers' **Daniel Theis** and Orlando's **Franz Wagner** and **Moe Wagner**.
 - Schröder is the first German native to suit up for the Nets.

SIMMONS IN THE BACKCOURT

INTERIM HEAD COACH KEVIN OLLIE

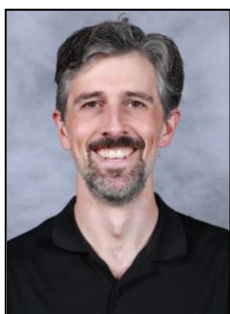


The Brooklyn Nets named Kevin Ollie interim head coach on February 20, 2024.

Kevin Ollie is in his first season as a coach with the Nets organization. Ollie arrives in Brooklyn from Overtime Elite, where he served as head of coaching and basketball development for two seasons (2021-23). Prior to his stint with Overtime Elite, Ollie spent six years (2012-18) as the head coach of the men's basketball program at the University of Connecticut. After leading UConn to a 20-10 record in his first season at the helm in 2012-13 when the program was ineligible to participate in postseason competition, Ollie directed the Huskies to a 32-8 record in his second season in 2013-14. UConn earned a seven seed in the 2014 NCAA Tournament and became the second-lowest seed (and the only seven seed) to win a national championship when he guided the Huskies to their fourth of five titles in program history. Before he became the head coach at UConn, the Los Angeles native was an assistant coach with the Huskies for two years (2010-12), helping lead the team to a

national championship in 2011. Prior to the start of his coaching career, Ollie played in the NBA for 13 seasons (1997-2010) with 11 teams, including a 19-game stint with the Nets during the 1999-2000 season. Ollie played in 662 career games with Orlando, Dallas, Sacramento, Philadelphia, New Jersey, Indiana, Chicago, Seattle/Oklahoma City, Milwaukee, Cleveland and Minnesota, and logged playoff action five times in his career, including a trip to the NBA Finals in 2001 with the 76ers. Ollie went undrafted in 1995 and began his playing career as a member of the Connecticut Pride of the Continental Basketball Association (CBA) for two seasons (1995-97). As a collegian, Ollie played at UConn for four years (1991-95), helping the Huskies advance to the NCAA Tournament three times. As a senior, he earned All-Big East Third Team honors.
