TEAM NOTES

- The Toronto Raptors are home to play their first 2024-25 preseason game at Scotiabank Arena against the Boston Celtics on Tuesday evening. The Raptors lost to the Celtics on Sunday to complete their short two-game road trip (Oct. 11-13) falling to 1-2 over the first three games. Toronto will play their fifth and final preseason game against the Nets in Brooklyn on Friday evening before hosting the Cleveland Cavaliers in the season opener on Oct. 23.
- Under then first-year head coach Darko Rajaković, Toronto set a franchise record in assists last season (2335), surpassing the previous best of 2085 (set during the 2018-19 NBA championship campaign). The Raptors finished tied for fifth in the NBA in assists (28.5), an improvement from 2022-23 where they finished 23rd (23.9).
- Scottie Barnes** signed a multi-year extension this summer. He had a stellar 2023-24 campaign for Toronto before his year was cut short due to an injury to the third metacarpal on his left hand. Prior to that, Barnes was named an NBA All-Star for the first time in his career, becoming the ninth player in franchise history to earn the honour (youngest since Chris Bosh in 2006). Barnes averaged 19.9 points, 8.2 rebounds and 6.1 assists through 60 games this year, the only Raptor in team history to sport those averages through 60 games in a single season.
- Toronto re-signed guard **Immanuel Quickley** to a multi-year contract this offseason. Quickley was acquired from New York on Dec. 30, 2023 alongside RJ Barrett and a 2024 second round draft pick (used to select Jonathan Mogbo), in exchange for OG Anunoby, Precious Achiuwa and Malachi Flynn. Quickley averaged career highs in points (18.6), assists (6.8) and rebounds (4.8) in 38 games (all starts) last season with Toronto.
- RJ Barrett** and **Kelly Olynyk** represented the Canadian Senior Men's National Team at the Paris 2024 Olympic Games this summer. The pair was part of the first Canadian Men's Team to qualify since 2000. Barrett averaged 19.8 points (fourth highest in tournament), 3.8 rebounds and 3.5 assists in four games (all starts).
- Toronto selected guard **Ja'Kobe Walter** 19th overall in the 2024 NBA Draft. Walter averaged a team-high 14.5 points, 4.4 rebounds, 1.4 assists, 1.1 steals and 32.3 minutes in 35 games as a freshman at Baylor. Walter led all Big 12 freshman in scoring and recorded the second-most points (508) by a Baylor freshman in school history. For his efforts, he earned Big 12 Freshman of the Year and was an All-Big 12 Third Team selection.

- Averaged 6.7 points, 3.3 rebounds, 1.3 assists and 23.6 minutes in 27 games (18 starts) with Toronto last year.
- Scored in double figures eight times in 27 games as a member of Raptors last season.
- Acquired Feb. 8 from Utah alongside Kelly Olynyk for K. Lewis Jr., O. Porter Jr., and 2024 first round pick.

F - SCOTTIE BARNES #4 MIN: 34.9 REB: 8.2 AST: 6.1 STL: 1.3 TO: 2.8 BLK: 1.47 PTS: 19.9

- Named a reserve for 2024 All-Star Game; Youngest Raptor since Chris Bosh (2006) to earn the honour.
- Set single-season career highs in 20-point performances (34) and in double-doubles (25) in 2023-24.
- Missed final 22 games of the season (Mar. 3 - Apr. 14) due to fracture of third metacarpal on left hand.

C - JAKOB POELTL #19 MIN: 26.4 REB: 8.6 AST: 2.5 STL: 0.70 TO: 1.5 BLK: 1.52 PTS: 11.1

- Missed final 21 games of the season (Mar. 5 - Apr. 14) due to a torn ligament on the fifth finger of his left hand.
- Shot team-high .656 (248-378) from the field this year; Ranked second in NBA in FG% at the time of his injury.
- Posted 20 double-doubles on the season, second most on team trailing only Scottie Barnes (25).

G - GRADEV DICK #1 MIN: 21.1 REB: 2.2 AST: 1.1 STL: 0.57 TO: 0.8 BLK: 0.03 PTS: 8.5

- Averaged 12.5 points post All-Star break (ranked eighth among rookies in that span).
- Led all rookies with a .371 (53-143) three-point percentage post All-Star (min. 100 three-point attempts).
- Made NBA debut Oct. 25, 2023, becoming the fourth youngest Raptor to play in a regular season game.

G - DAVION MITCHELL #45 MIN: 15.3 REB: 1.3 AST: 1.9 STL: 0.24 TO: 0.6 BLK: 0.04 PTS: 5.3

- Acquired June 28 with Sasha Vezenkov, draft rights to Jamal Shead and 2025 2nd rd. pick for J. McDaniels.
- Shot .452 (146-323) from the field career-best .361 (57-158) from 3PT range last season with Sacramento.
- Scored in double figures 12 times, including a season-high 18 points Mar. 25 vs. Philadelphia in 2023-24.

BOSTON — After splitting two pre-season games with the lowly Washington Wizards, the Toronto Raptors were schooled by the higher class Boston Celtics on Sunday at the TD Garden ... The Celtics jumped out to a 41-20 first-quarter lead, and increased it to 69-37 at halftime en route to a comfortable 115-111 victory over the visiting Raptors. Drew Peterson led the Celtics with a game-high 23 points, while Lonnie Walker the Fourth chipped in with 20 and Payton Pritchard had 19 points and nine assists ... Gradey Dick led the Raptors with 18 points, while Jamal Shead and Jakob Poeltl each had 14 points ... Poeltl chipped in with 13 rebounds ... The Celtics outrebounded the Raptors 50-45, and led in blocks 5-2, steals 7-6 and turnovers 13-11 ... Boston was 18-for-53 from three-point range, while the Raptors went 10-for-25.

TORONTO — Jayson Tatum had 19 points and 14 rebounds, Jrue Holiday scored eight of his season-high 22 points in the fourth quarter, and the Boston Celtics won their eighth straight meeting with Toronto, beating the Raptors 105-96 on Monday night ... Derrick White also scored 22 points, Kristaps Porzingis had 15 and Al Horford had 10 points and 11 rebounds as the Celtics completed a second straight four-game season sweep of their Atlantic Division rivals ... White scored 10 points in the fourth quarter, making a key 3 from the corner with just over a minute remaining ... RJ Barrett scored 24 points and Immanuel Quickley had 21 in the Raptors' fourth straight loss ... Pascal Siakam scored 17 points and Scottie Barnes had 10 points and 13 rebounds ... The Raptors were without guard Gary Trent Jr., who sat out because of flu-like symptoms. Toronto's Jontay Porter made his first career start in place of injured center Jakob Poeltl, who missed his fourth straight game because of a sprained left ankle ... Toronto shot 4 for 32 from 3-point range, its worst mark of the season, and missed all 13 attempts from distance in the second half ... Toronto finished with 25 assists, extending its franchise-record streak of games with 25 or more to 23.

NEW YORK — Cam Thomas had 23 points, Dennis Schröder scored 15 of his 21 points in the fourth quarter and the Brooklyn Nets rallied to beat the Toronto Raptors 106-102 ... Nic Claxton added 14 points, 11 rebounds and five blocked shots, and Noah Clowney had 10 points and a career-high seven blocks for the Nets in their final home game of the season ... Immanuel Quickley scored 32 points for Toronto ... Gradey Dick added a career-high 24 ... Toronto led 76-67 with 3:45 left in the third quarter after Jordan Nwora's three-point play ... Schröder then fueled a 12-6 run with seven points, capping the spurt with a nifty layup that put the Nets up 95-94 with 4:46 remaining ... Quickley briefly gave the Raptors a 97-95 advantage on a three-point play before a pair of dunks by Clowney and Claxton gave the Nets a 99-97 lead with 1:49 to play ... Quickley's 3-pointer put Toronto back on top and Schröder followed with a three-point play to put Brooklyn up 102-100 ... Garrett Temple had a chance to tie, but was met at the rim by Clowney for his seventh block of the night ... Schröder followed by hitting a pair of free throws and Quickley's layup cut the deficit to 104-102 with 5.2 seconds ... Schröder then hit two free throws to seal the victory.

ADDITIONAL TEAM NOTES ...

- The Raptors had a franchise record 30 different players suit up last season, topping the previous team high of 24 set during the 1997-98 campaign. Toronto's 30 different players in a season is third most in NBA history. The quartet of **Scottie Barnes**, **RJ Barrett**, **Jakob Poeltl** and **Immanuel Quickley** played just 234 minutes together across 14 games. Toronto was +65 in those minutes (Raptors' best +/- by any four-man unit) and finished 7-7 in those games.
- The Raptors led the league in fast break points last season (18.7). It was the sixth time in franchise history where Toronto finished the season atop that category (others: 2019-20, 2000-01, 1998-99, 1997-98, 1996-97).
- The Raptors selected forward **Jonathan Mogbo** 31st overall in the 2024 NBA Draft. Mogbo spent his senior season at the University of San Francisco, where he averaged 14.2 points, 10.1 rebounds, 3.6 assists, 1.6 steals and 28.9 minutes in 34 games. He led the West Coast Conference in field goal percentage (.636) while also pacing the conference in both rebounds and steals per game. For his efforts, Mogbo was named the 2023-24 WCC Newcomer of the Year and earned All-WCC First Team honours.
- Toronto acquired **Davion Mitchell**, the draft rights to **Jamal Shead** and a 2025 second round pick (via Portland) from the Sacramento Kings in exchange for forward Jalen McDaniels in June. Toronto also acquired Sasha Vezenkov in the trade who was later waived.
- **Davion Mitchell** holds career averages of 7.4 points, 2.8 assists, 1.6 rebounds and 20.4 minutes in 227 games (32 starts) with Sacramento. He was selected ninth overall by the Kings in the 2021 NBA Draft.
- **Jamal Shead** enters his rookie season following four years at Houston. As a senior, he was named Naismith Defensive Player of the Year and became the first player in Big 12 history to earn Player of the Year and Defensive Player of the Year honours in same season.

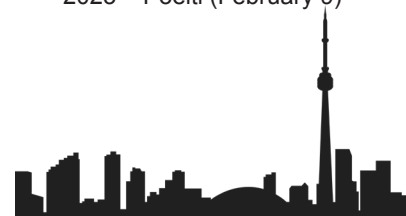

DARKO RAJAKOVIĆ

HEAD COACH

The passion Darko Rajaković (rye-AHK-oe-vich) has for the game of basketball has led him around the world. From Madrid, Spain to Tulsa, Oklahoma, each of these experiences have added to Rajaković's beliefs and philosophies, shaping him into the coach, father, and leader he is today.

Raised in Serbia during a civil war, Rajaković fell in love with basketball during a time of unrest in his homeland. The basketball court became his safe haven, a place where he and his friends could gather and play until the wee hours of the morning.

It was fitting Rajaković started his coaching career in his hometown of Cacak, Serbia. At just 16 years of age, he embarked on a life-long journey of teaching others a game that brought him such joy. This started with the local Borac Cacak Youth Team in 1996. After three seasons with the club, he was named the head coach of the U20 and U18 teams of Red Star Belgrade, leading Red Star to two Serbian Youth championships during his eight-year tenure (1999-2007).

Rajaković then ventured to Spain where he coached Espacio Torrelozones for three successful seasons (2009-12). In his first year with the franchise, he led the team to the championship of the Primera Division de Baloncesto in Madrid.

From 2004-11, Rajaković held his first formal job with an NBA team, serving as a European scouting consultant and NBA Summer League assistant coach for the San Antonio Spurs.

His time in Serbia, Spain and San Antonio ultimately led Rajaković to the Oklahoma City Thunder, where he spent seven seasons (2012-19). Rajaković joined the organization in 2012 as the head coach of the Tulsa 66ers – the franchise's then NBA G League affiliate, and became the first head coach born outside of North America in league history. Under his guidance, the team went 51-49 (.510) over two seasons and reached the 2013 G League semifinals. In 2014, Rajaković was honoured as one of Oklahoma City's assistant coaches at the NBA All-Star game in New Orleans.

Rajaković transitioned from the G League to the NBA at the start of the 2014-15 campaign, in what would be his first of five seasons as an assistant coach with the Thunder (2014-19). Oklahoma City averaged 49 wins during his time on the coaching staff and earned four playoff appearances - including a trip to the 2016 Western Conference Finals.

Rajaković also spent time in the NBA as an assistant coach with the Phoenix Suns (2019-20) and Memphis Grizzlies (2020-23), before being named the 10th head coach in Toronto Raptors history in June of 2023.

On the international stage, Rajaković was as an assistant coach for Serbia at the 2019 FIBA

World Cup in China, helping his country to a fifth place finish at the tournament, which included a win over the United States in the classification round.

Rajaković prides himself on being a life-long learner. He earned a basketball coaching degree from the Belgrade Basketball Academy in 2004 and a degree in sports management from Alfa BK University in Belgrade in 2006.

He and his wife, Gaga, reside in Toronto with their son, Luka.
