SPURS WINNING HISTORY: San Antonio currently has a $.596(2,303-1,561)$ historical winning percentage - the second-best in NBA history, only behind the Los Angeles Lakers are second (.591). The Spurs own an all-time winning record against 29-of-30 teams in the NBA. 12/3/19 marked the 3,500th game played in Spurs NBA history since the team joined the league in 1976.

RUNNING IT BACK: Gregg Popovich enters his 28th season as the Spurs head coach. The NBA's other franchises have gone through 307 head coaches. Every team has had at least three head coaches during Coach Popovich's tenure with the Spurs.

RECORD FanDOME: On Jan. 13, 2023, in celebration of the team's $50^{\text {th }}$ anniversary, the Spurs sold out the Alamodome, setting a new NBA all-time attendance record with $\mathbf{6 8 , 3 2 3}$ fans.

- The Spurs started Jan. 13 ranked $28^{\text {th }}$ in average attendance. The game at the Alamodome pushed them to $15^{\text {th }}$ in the NBA.

OPENING NIGHT: After finishing fifth in assists in 2022-24, the Spurs recorded 33

RIGHT AT HOME: The Spurs win vs. the Jazz on 12/26/22 marked San Antonio's 700th total home win in the AT\&T Center. Since moving into the building in 2002, the Spurs have the most home wins (regular season + Playoffs) of any team in the NBA.

HOMECOMING: With a win against Orlando on 10/20, the Spurs now have 34 wins in season-openers since joining the NBA in 1976 - the most of any team in the league since the ABA-NBA merger in 1976.

MILESTONE MARK: Popovich recorded his 1,300 th career win on $3 / 27$ vs. Sacramento (120-106) and is the fastest coach to reach 1,300 wins in NBA history by over four full seasons, 356 games. He posted his 1,250th victory on 11/7 vs. Oklahoma City (121112). Popovich moved into first on the NBA's all-time wins list with the Spurs 104-102 win over Utah on 3/12/22 and was the fastest NBA coach to reach 1,300 career wins. *Denotes active coach

SPURS IN THE HALL: On August 1, 2023, Tony Parker and Gregg Popovich joined 16 former Spur players and coaches in the Naismith Basketball Hall of Fame. Parker spent 17 seasons in San Antonio, helping guide the Silver and Black capture four NBA championships. He was named the 2007 NBA Finals MVP, becoming the first European Finals MVP in history. A four-time All-NBA player and six-time NBA All-Star, Parker played in 1,254 career games in 18 seasons with the Spurs and Charlotte Hornets, averaging 15.5 points, 5.6 assists and 2.7 rebounds in 30.5 minutes. He and fellow Spurs HOFers Tim Duncan and Manu Ginobili recorded 126 postseason victories together, the most wins by any trio in NBA history. His No. 9 was retired on Nov. 10, 2019. Popovich currently stands as the longest tenured active coach in all four U.S. major sports leagues, has led the Silver and Black to five NBA Championships and is just one of five coaches in history with five-or-more NBA

YOUTH MOVEMENT: This Season the Spurs have their youngest roster ever since Gregg Popovich became coach in 1996, with an average age of 23.5 . The roster this season includes 14 -of-18 players 24 -years-old or younger and enters the season as the youngest team in the NBA by age.

- The next youngest Spurs teams: 2022-23 (23.6) and 2021-22 (25.0)

YOUNG CORE: In a win vs. Portland, Victor Wembanyama and Jeremy Sochan both recorded 20+ points and $10+$ rebounds. It was just the second time in NBA history that two teammates both under the age of 21 had 20/10 double-doubles in the same game (2003, Eddy Curry and Tyson Chandler for Chicago).

- Victor Wembanyama and Devin Vassell have scored 20+ points in the same game 12 times this season, second-most among teammate duos aged 23 and younger (per Elias).

OUT OF THE GATE: In the second game of his career, Victor Wembanyama finished with 21 points, 12 rebounds, 3 blocks and 2 steals in an overtime win vs. Houston on 10/28, becoming the first Spurs rookie with 20 points, 10 rebounds and 3 blocks since Tim Duncan in 1998.

- He became just the second Spurs player in franchise history to have a 20 -point, 10 -rebound game within his first two career games (David Robinson).
- Victor Wembanyama is one of four players to reach 45 points, 20 rebounds, 5 assists, 5 blocks and 5 steals through their first three career games since 1983-84 (Evan Mobley, 2021; Lamar Odom, 1999; David Robinson, 1989). Wembanyama is the only one who has done it in less than 100 minutes played ( 80 MP ).

BRINGING DESERT HEAT: During a two-game trip to Phoenix, Devin Vassell knocked down his $300^{\text {th }}$ career three-pointer and scored his $2,000^{\text {th }}$ career point. Vassell is now the second player in Spurs history with 2,000 points and $300+$ three-pointers in his first 200 games, joining teammate Keldon Johnson.

- Since blocks were tracked in 1973-74, only three teenagers have recorded $35+$ points, $10+$ rebounds and $2+$ blocks in a game: LeBron James, 2004; Kevin Durant, 2008; Victor Wembanyama, 2023.

- On $1 / 10$, Wembanyama recorded his first career triple-double with 16 points, 12 rebounds, 10 assists and 0 turnovers in 21:02 minutes. The only player to play fewer minutes in a game where they posted a triple-double is Russell Westbrook, March 4, 2014-20 minutes in 2014.
- He is the second Spurs rookie to ever accomplish the feat (David Robinson, three in 1989-90), and the first to do it with points, rebounds and assists.
- Wembanyama is the second rookie seven-footer in NBA history to record a triple- double with points, rebounds and assists (Brad Daugherty in 1986-87).
- With 26 points, 11 rebounds and 2 blocks in 19:41, Wembanyama becomes the first player with 25/10/2 in a game where he played fewer than 20 minutes since blocks became an official stat in 1973-74, per ESPN. 19:41 is also the third-fewest minutes played for someone with 25+ points and 10+ rebounds since minutes became an official stat in 1951-52.
- Kevin Love: 32 points, 15 rebounds (14:41 in 2022)
- John Drew: 29 points, 13 rebounds (19:00 in 1981)
- Victor Wembanyama 26 points, 11 rebounds (19:45 in 2023)
- With 27 points and 5 blocks on $1 / 4$ vs. the Bucks, Wembanyama registered his fourth game with $20+$ points and $4+$ blocks in 28 minutes or less. That's tied for the most such games in the NBA for a player's career. The rookie did it in his first 30 games.
- Wembanyama had 30 points, 6 rebounds, 6 assists and 7 blocks in only 24 minutes of play. The only player in NBA history to have 30/5/5/5 in less than 25 minutes.
- With 30 points, 13 rebounds and 6 blocks vs. the Lakers on 12/13, Wembanyama became the sixth rookie with $30+$ points, $10+$ boards and $6+$ blocks in a game since blocks became official in 1973-74. He joins David Robinson (3x), Tim Duncan, Shaqille O'Neal (3x), Hakeem Olajuwon and Chris Webber.
- Wembanyama crossed the 500-point plateau by scoring 30 on $12 / 17$ in his 27th NBA game. The only active players to reach that mark faster were Zion Williamson (23), Paolo Banchero (24), Joel Embiid (26) and Kevin Durant (26).
- In his 20th career game on 12/8, Wembanyama posted only the second $20 / 20$ game by a teenager in NBA history. Only other teen to have 20+ points and $20+$ rebounds in a single game is Dwight Howard.

BLOCK PARTY: Prior to turning 20 years old, Wembanyama blocked 91 shots as a teenager. Only 10 other players in NBA history have blocked $90+$ shots as a teenager. Wembanyama did it in 29 games. The second-fewest number of games on the list is 60 (Andrew Drummond)

- On 1/4, Wembanyama registered his fourth game of $20+$ points and $4+$ blocks in 26 minutes or fewer. That is tied for the most such games in NBA history for a CAREER. He did it in his first 30 games.
- Wembanyama has 103 blocks and 101 assists after 34 career games. No player in the last 40 years has reached both 100 blocks and 100 assists in fewer than 42 career games (Dikembe Mutombo in 1991-92).
- Only three players in NBA history since blocks were recorded to have 1,000+ points and 150+ blocks in their first 50 career games: David Robinson (1989-90), Shaquille O'Neal (1992-93), Victor Wembanyama (2023-24)

TAKE FIVE: With 27 points, 10 rebounds, 8 assists, 5 blocks and 5 steals against the Lakers on 2/24, Victor Wembanyama became the youngest player in NBA history to post a $5 \times 5$ game. This is the first $5 \times 5$ game in Spurs history, only the second recorded by a rookie in the NBA and just the $15^{\text {th }}$ player in NBA history. His game is the first in the league since Jusuf Nurkić in 2019.

ON THE BOARD: With the 500th rebound of his career at Sacramento on 2/22, Victor Wembanyama became the third-fastest player to total $1 \mathrm{~K}+$ points, $500+$ rebounds, and $150+$ blocks in their career.

- 1. Shaquille O'Neal - 43 games; 2. David Robinson - 47 games; Victor Wembanyama - 50 games; 4. Alonzo Mourning - 53 games

LESS MINUTES, NO PROBLEM: Victor Wembanyama has scored 164 points in 166 minutes in seven games from 12/28 to 1/12. That 0.99 points per minute is the best by a rookie over any seven-game span in the shot-clock era (min. 150 minutes), Per Elias Sports

- There are only two players in the NBA this season that have put up 300+ rebounds and 90+ assists in less than 1,000 minutes this season: Victor Wembanyama and Joel Embiid.

RISING STAR: Spurs forwards Victor Wembanyama and Jeremy Sochan were selected as 2024 Rising Stars. Jeremy Sochan and Team Jalen took the crown and the 2024 NBA Rising Stars Champions.

- Wembanyama became the second Spurs rookie to be named to the team since Keldon Johnson in 2021 and becomes the $11^{\text {th }}$ player in franchise history to be selected to the Rising Stars since the inception in 1994. This is Sochan's second consecutive Rising Stars selection. The last Spurs player to compete in back-to-back years as a Rising Star was DeJuan Blair (2010, 2011).

ROOKIE OF THE MONTH: On March 3, Victor Wembanyama was named NBA Rookie of the Month for February. Wembanyama appeared in all 12 games (all starts) for the Spurs in February, averaging 21.3 points, 10.7 rebounds, 4.5 assists, a league-leading 3.92 blocks and 2.00 steals in 28.9 minutes to lead all rookies in scoring, rebounding, blocks and steals while ranking seventh in minutes.

- This is the second straight month Wembanyama has won the award, making it the first time since Tim Duncan received the award in March and April 1998 that a Spurs player has captured Rookie of the Month honors in back-to-back months.
- One day after being named a 2024 Rising Star, Victor Wembanyama earned the January Western Conference Rookie of the Month after averaging 24.0 points, 9.6 rebounds and a league-leading 3.36 blocks in 26.7 minutes while shooting $50.6 \%$ from the field. He recorded a triple-double with zero turnovers and scored 20-plus points in 13-of-14 games, including 10 straight to close out the month.
- They are the first teammates in franchise history who are both in their first two seasons to average at least 10 points, 5 rebounds and 3 assists. Sochan and Wembanyama are the first rookie/sophomore duo for the Spurs to average 10+ points and 5+ rebounds per game since David Robinson and Sean Elliott (1990-91).

A [TRIP]LE-DOUBLE UP NORTH: In a win at Toronto on Feb. 2, Rookie forward Victor Wembanyama recorded 27 points, 14 rebounds, 10 blocks and 5 assists.

- Wembanyama is the fifth player in NBA history to have a game with 25+ points, 10+ rebounds, 5+ assists and 10+ blocks, joining Kareem AbdulJabbar, Hakeem Olajuwon, Ralph Sampson and David Robinson.
- He is now the fourth rookie in NBA history to record a triple-double with blocks and the first since David Robinson in 1990: Mark Eaton (1983), Raplph Sampson (1983).

MORE VIEWS FROM THE SIX: In the same game at Toronto, Tre Jones recorded 10 assists to reach 1,000 assists for his career. There are only two Spurs in team history to be drafted in the second round and reach 1 K career assists: Manu Ginobili and Tre Jones.

- Keldon Johnson reached 200 career steals. He's now one of nine players in Spurs history to have 200+ steals and 400+ three-pointers, joining Tony Parker, Sean Elliott, Kawhi Leonard, Manu Ginobili, Bruce Bowen, Danny Green, Patty Mills, Devin Vassell and Keldon Johnson.

PASS THE ROCK: The Spurs are averaging 29.6 assists this season, second in the NBA.

- With 38 assists on 1/20, the Spurs recorded 20+ assists in 100 consecutive games. San Antonio became the second team to do it in 100+ consecutive games and their current 120-game streak is tied or the longest streak in NBA history. (*Active Streak)

## SPURS TEAM NOTES

- In a win vs. the Wizards on $1 / 20 / 24$, the Spurs recorded a season-high 38 assists. Since the NBA merger in 1976-77, San Antonio has recoded 733 games with $30+$ for the fourth-most in the NBA history: PHX (888), LAL (843), DEN (790).
- The Spurs had 13 assists in the first quarter on $10 / 24$ at Minnesota, the most San Antonio has had in any quarter of any game in the last 20 years is 14 .

K3LDON JOHNSON: Only two players in Spurs history have 200+ points and 30+ three-pointers through the first 10 games of a season: Sean Elliott (1995-96) and Keldon Johnson (2022-23).

- From $3 / 5 / 22$ to $11 / 20 / 22$, Johnson made at least one 3 -pointer in 33 consecutive games, the longest streak in Spurs history.
- On Jan. 17 vs. the Nets, Johnson became the second player in Spurs history with $35+$ points and $10+$ rebounds with $3+$ three-pointers in a single game (Sean Elliot).
- Keldon Johnson posted 30 points on Dec. 29 vs. Knicks and Dec. 31 vs. Mavericks to become the first Spur player in the first four years of his career to have back-to-back 30+point games since Manu Ginobili had two in 2005.

KEEPING UP WITH THE JONESES: Over the last two seasons, only two players have recorded 650+ assists while logging less than 3,500 minutes: Tre Jones and his brother, Washington Wizards guard, Tyus Jones.

- On $1 / 13$ vs. Chicago, Tre Jones scored a career-high 30 points, scoring 22 of them in the first half of the game.

DEVON[TREY] GRAHAM: With 300 games now under his belt, Devonte' Graham has shown a unique blend of playmaking and long-distance shooting in his career. He became one of seven players with 700+ 3PM and 700+ AST through 300 career games all-time.

KJ 4,000: Keldon Johnson just reached 4,000 career points in Minnesota on 12/6. There are only three Spurs with 4,000 points and 1,300 rebounds in their first 250 career games: David Robinson, Tim Duncan and Keldon Johnson.

- Johnson accomplished this in 243 career games. Only FIVE players in NBA history with 4,000 points, 1,300 rebounds, 500 assists and 400 three-pointers in their first 250 career games: Paul Pierce, Jayson Tatum, Luka Doncic, RJ Barrett, Keldon Johnson

STEADY GROWTH: Keldon Johnson's scoring has improved every season he has been in the NBA. He joins Kawhi Leonard, Vinny Del Negro and George Gervin as Spurs who improved by $2.0+$ PPG in each of their first four seasons with the Spurs.

- Johnson and Leonard are the only two to improve by 3.0+ PPG each season.

TRIPLE-DOUBLE TRE: Tre Jones became the $15^{\text {th }}$ player in Spurs history to record a triple on $4 / 2 / 23$ posting 17 points, 11 assists and 10 rebounds in a win at Sacramento. This is Jones' first career triple-double and team's $61^{\text {st }}$ in franchise history.

- Only six players have posted a triple-double for the Spurs in the last 26 years under Gregg Popovich: Tim Duncan, Tony Parker, Pau Gasol, DeMar DeRozan, Dejounte Murray and TRE JONES.

GUARDS ON THE GLASS: Keldon Johnson remains one of top rebounding guards in the NBA. Here are the top 5 guards in Spurs history for games with 10-or-more rebounds: No. 1 Dejounte Murray (54), No. 2 Alvin Robertson (37), No. 3 Keldon Johnson (32), No. 4 George Gervin (31), TNo. 5 DeMar DeRozan and Manu Ginobili (10).

- 7-of-8 double-doubles Johnson has recorded this season has come with $20+$ points. He has 17 total $20 / 10$ games in his career. This is the thirdmost among Spurs guards all-time.

CLASS OF 2022: Jeremy Sochan scored in double-figures in 35 games last season. This is the most games in a season with 10+ points by any Spurs rookie since Gary Neal's 40 in 2010-11.

- Malaki Branham had 20 points on 12.26 vs. Utah, just four days after Sochan scored 23 points at New Orleans. This is the first season the Spurs have had multiple games with multiple rookies scoring 20+ points since 2016-17 (Dejounte Murray, Bryn Forbes and Davis Bertans).
- Also, in the game at New Orleans, Sochan recorded 23 points to go with 9 rebounds and 6 assists. The only other two rookies in Spurs history to have at least 23/9/6 are David Robinson (1989-90) and Tim Duncan (1997-98).
- Branham scored a combined 48 points in two games against the Sixers ( $2 / 3 / 23$ ) and Kings ( $2 / 1 / 23$ ) for the most points by a Spurs rookie in a two-game span since Tim Duncan had 56 in 1998.
- Branham also became the first rookie to have back-to-back games with 20+ points since Keldon Johnson in the Bubble in 2020.
- There are only two rookies in the NBA that have at least 400 points, 200 rebounds and 100 assists: Jeremy Sochan and Paolo Banchero.

VERY VASSELL: On 11/10/21, Vassell became one of five Spurs in history with multiple outings of $5+$ three-pointers in his first 100 career games (Neal, Bertans, Green, Forbes).

- In 20-21, Vassell posted a streak of 11 games with $1+$ steals and 0 turnovers, marking the longest streak all-time in NBA history.
- In his rookie year, Vassell tallied 43 steals for the seventh-most among Spurs rookies since 1990: No. 4 Tim Duncan (55), No. 5 DeJuan Blair (50), No. 6 George Hill (45), No. 7 Devin Vassell (44). Only the second Spur in history to record 30+ three-pointers and 30+ steals in their first 30 career games, joining Tony Parker

JU CHAMPAGNIE: In 2022-23, Spurs two-way rookie Julian Champagnie scored 26 points in a win over the Kings on 4/2/23. His 26 points are the second-most ever for a rookie on a two-way contract. (Brandon Williams: 27 points 3/7/22)

## SPURS TEAM NOTES

BRAN[HIM1: On 12/15, Malaki Branham knocked down his 100th 3-pointer of his career in his 90th game. Only one player in Spurs history has had more than 100 threes in his first 90 games: Gary Neal

- Last February, Branham led all rookies averaging 16.8 points for the month. His 185 total points for the month were also the most among all rookies. Last Spurs rookie with 185+ points in a month: Gary Neal, 2011 (189 points).
- Among rookies with 150+ total points in the same month, he tied first with the highest FG\% (.500), made 75 total field goals, most among rookies, and recorded 22 three-pointers, second-most among rookies.
- Branham registered five 20-point games in February, including a season high 27 points at Detroit on 2/10, giving him six total games this season. He is the first Spurs rookie to have six-or-more games with 20-plus points since Tim Duncan in 1997-98.
- The last Spurs Rookie with at least five 20-point games in a month: Tim Duncan, April 1998.

30 BALL: On $1 / 28$ vs. the Suns, both Jeremy Sochan and Keldon scored 30+ points for the Spurs. This marks Sochan's first 30-point game of his career. He also registered 8 rebounds and 5 assists.

- There are only FIVE teenagers in NBA history to have 30+ points, 8+ rebounds and 5+ assists in a single game: LeBron James (6) Kevin Durant
(2) Luka Doncic (3) Zion Williamson (1) and JEREMY SOCHAN (1)
- Sochan became the first and only teenager in San Antonio history to score 30+ points in a single game.
- There have only been four rookies in Spurs history to score 30+ points in a game: Tim Duncan, David Robinson, Willie Anderson, Greg Anderson and Jeremy Sochan

PROGraham: In his debut with the Spurs, Devonte' Graham scored 31 points in Detroit on 2/10, the most for any player's debut ever in Spurs history.

- During this game, Graham shot 15 three-pointers, which is also the most by any player in NBA history in his first game with a team.

SPREAD THE WEALTH: On $1 / 23 / 23$ at Portland, the Spurs had eight players who scored in double figures for the second time in the month of January. It is the sixth time since the beginning of 2021-22 that they have had a game with eight players scoring 10+ points. This is more than any other team in the NBA in the past two seasons.

- In 2021-22, the Spurs finished the season with 10 players posting at least one double-double. The last time San Antonio had more players with a double-double in a single season was 11 in 1996-97.

ELITE TALENT: On $11 / 2 / 22$ vs. the Toronto Raptors, Spurs two-way player Dom Barlow became the first NBA player in history to come out of the Overtime Elite League.

- On $4 / 2 / 23$, Barlow recorded the first double-double of his career after posting 12 points, 10 rebounds and 5 assists in a win at Sacramento.
- There have only been six Spurs rookies ever to post games with 10/10/5: Tim Duncan (8), David Robinson (4), Gene Banks (1), Alvin Robertson (1), Tony Parker (1) and DOM BARLOW (1).
- Barlow is now one of 22 teenagers EVER in the NBA with $10 / 10 / 5$ in a game.

GOING BACK-TO-BACK: The Spurs Won back-to-back road games against the Indiana Pacers (10/21) and Philadelphia 76ers (10/22). San Antonio coach Greg Popovich has now led the Spurs to 144 road win streaks - the most in NBA history.

- BASSEY ON THE BOARDS: On Nov. 11 vs. the Bucks, Charles Bassey became the first Spurs player to have 14+ rebounds and 4+ blocks in a game off the bench since Dave Greenwood in 1986.
- Bassey is the second player in NBA history to have 14 rebounds, 4 blocks and 4 assists in less than 20 minutes played, joining Herb Williams who did it in 1983.
- Bassey is the first player in league history to do it off the bench.

BY THE NUMBERS: The Spurs recorded 33 assists in their 2023-24 season opener vs. Dallas on 10/26 and are 199-48 under Gregg Popovich when they dish out 30+ assists as a team. San Antonio is now 34-1 under Popovich when they record 35+ assists.

- In the first 10 games of the season, four different Spurs players recorded $40+$ total assists to start the season, the most of any team in the NBA: Keldon Johnson (43), Zach Collins (40), Jeremy Sochan (45), Tre Jones (54).
- As a team, the Spurs recorded 299 assists through 10 games. The most of any Spurs team through 10. The Spurs are averaging 24.9 assists per game, ranked second in the NBA. 29.4 is currently the highest APG average in Spurs team history.
- Through 10 games the Spurs have knocked down 125 total three-pointers to start the season. The is only the third time a Spurs team has recorded $100+$ treys within the first 10 games of the season and is the second-most all-time through 10 .

THREES PLEASE: The Spurs are averaging 12.4 three-point field goals for the highest single-season average in Spurs History.

- San Antonio set a new franchise record, knocking down 22 three-pointers vs. Orlando on 3/14/23.
- In 2021-22, the Spurs set an all-time franchise record with for most threes in a season as a team with 925 made three-pointers.
- Devin Vassell is one of five Spurs in history with multiple outings of 5+ three-pointers in his first 100 career games (Neal, Bertans, Green, Forbes).
- Amongst all sophomores, Devin Vassell knocked down the seventh-most three-pointers last season with 93 and shot .343 from deep last season.
- During the 2019-20 season, the Spurs recorded a franchise single-season record with 9 games of 15+ made three-points. In 2020-21 they recorded 8 such games, with the most recent coming on $5 / 10 / 21$ when the Spurs hit 17 in a dominating 145-125 win vs. Milwaukee.

PROTECT THE BALL: In 2020-21, the Spurs recorded 2,289 assists and 1,043 turnovers. Only four other teams in NBA history have posted more than 2,200 assists while turning the ball over less than 1,100 times in a single season. Phoenix and Charlotte also did it in 2021-22, and Cleveland and Chicago did it in 1991-92. San Antonio has the second most assists and the least number of turnovers among the teams.

- Tre Jones recorded a 5.07 assist-to-turnover ratio in 2021-22, which is the best single season assist/turnover ratio in Spurs history. He posted seven games with 6+ assists with 0 turnovers. His seven games ties for the fourth most games in a single season in Spurs history.

DEV FROM DEEP: In his third season, Devin Vassell has 292 career 3-pointers. The record for a Spur through his first three seasons in 308.

BIG BODY: Of every $29^{\text {th }}$ pick since being moved to the first round of the NBA Draft, Keldon Johnson is first in points, second in rebounds and seventh in assists. The only other players to also crack the top 10 in all three major categories: Derrick White (fourth, sixth, second); Dejounte Murray (third, first, first); Corey Joseph (sixth, tenth and third)... all of which the Spurs Drafted.

- On 12/8/22, Johnson posted 32 points, 7 rebounds, making 14-of-21 from the field. Only

- Dating back to 2022-21 and the beginning of the 2022-23 season, Keldon Johnson recorded 20+ points in 12 straight games. His streak of 12 consecutive games with 20+ points and at least 1 three-pointer sets a Spurs franchise record (Prev. Kawhi Leonard - 9 in 2017).
- Johnson reached 2,000 career points on 3/12/22, becoming the second-youngest Spur to reach 2 K career points (Tony Parker, 21-179d).
- On 3/14, Johnson knocked down five three-pointers. He now has five games this season with $5+$ three-pointers and $5+$ rebounds. Only four Spurs with more in their entire career: Person (7), Elliot (10), Ginobili (13) and Green (15).
- Keldon Jonson made his 150 th career three-pointer on $1 / 26 / 22$. Only three Spurs reached 150 threes quicker than Johnson's 131 games: Gary Neal, Danny Green and Davis Bertans.
- Keldon Johnson scored 23 points and grabbed 21 rebounds, including 11 offensive boards on 3/19/21 in the Spurs 116-110 win at Cleveland. Johnson is the first Spur with a game of 20+ points and 20+ rebounds with 10+ offensive boards since Tim Duncan in 2010.
- There have only been 6 games (by 3 players) in NBA history where a player $6^{\prime} 5$ " or shorter has had $20+$ points and $20+$ rebounds. Johnson posts the 7th game and becomes the 4th player ever (Fat Lever (4), Russell Westbrook, Shai Gilgeous-Alexander) to accomplish the feat.
- He is the first Spurs to record 21 rebounds since Tim Duncan (12/2/13) and is the second-youngest Spurs to grab 21 boards ( 21 years, 159 days) since DeJuan Blair did so twice in 2010 (20 years, 266 days). Johnson is the 14th Spurs player in franchise history to grab 20+ rebounds and is tied with five players for one-career game.

1000+ CLUB: Keldon Johnson reached 1,000 career points on $5 / 13 / 21$, becoming the fifth-fastest Spur to score 1,000 points following David Robinson, Tim Duncan, Walter Berry and Willie Anderson. At 21 years old, he is also the third youngest Spur to reach the threshold: Tony Parker and Mark Olberding.

- Keldon Johnson recorded his first career 1,000-point season on 3/15/22. Only one other player in Spurs history to have 1,000 points with 400 rebounds and $125+$ threes in a single season: Kawhi Leonard.


## SPURS HISTORY

ONCE IN A LIFETIME: Spurs head coach Gregg Popovich is the only NBA coach in history to spend 25 -plus years with one franchise. Popovich enters an elite group as one of only eight coaches in the four major US sports history to have been with one team for 25 years (NBA, NFL, NHL, MLB).

- Popovich coached his 1,900 th game at Minnesota on 01/09/21, becoming the ninth coach in NBA history to reach 1,900 games joining: Lenny Wilkens, Don Nelson, Bill Fitch, Jerry Sloan, Larry Brown, George Karl, Dick Motta and Pat Riley.
- Coach Pop coached his 2,000 th career game at Boston on $1 / 5 / 22$, becoming the sixth coach in NBA history to reach 2,000 . He is the only coach to reach 2,000 games with one team.

CONSISTENT WINNING: With a win on $2 / 13 / 17$ at Indiana, Spurs passed the Utah Jazz to claim the most consecutive winning seasons in NBA history. The Spurs held the second longest active streak of winning seasons across the four major sports behind the New York Yankees (27 since 1993) and finished at 22 after going 32-39 during the 2019-20 season. The Spurs owned the fifth longest winning streak in history entering the season behind the New York Yankees (39 from 1926-64), Montreal Canadiens (32 from 1951-83), Boston Bruins (29 from 1967-96) and Detroit Red Wings (24 from 1991-16). ## SPURS 2023 OFFSEASON OUTLINE

## DRAFTED VICTOR WEMBANYAMA

Wembanyama, 7-3/225, was selected with the first overall pick in the 2023 NBA Draft. Prior to the NBA with French-club Boulogne-Levallois Metropolitans 92 in the LNB Pro A French League, he helped lead the team to the 2023 LNB Pro A Finals and a 23-11 regular season record. In 34 regular season games with Mets 92 , Wembanyama averaged 21.6 points, 10.4 rebounds, 2.4 assists and 3.0 blocks in 32.3 minutes. In 10 postseason games, he averaged 17.3 points, 9.2 rebounds, 2.7 blocks and 2.7 assists per game.

## DRAFTED SIDY CISSOKO

Cissoko, 6-7/225, was drafted by the Spurs with the 44th overall pick in the 2023 NBA Draft. In one season with G League Ignite, he averaged 12.8 points, 3.5 assists and 2.8 rebounds in 29.3 minutes, starting in all 28 regular season games. He recorded eight games with 20-plus points on his way to a 2023 Rising Stars Challenge selection at NBA All-Star weekend and becoming one of 24 players named to the inaugural G League Next Up Game.

## RE-SIGNED TRE JONES

Jones, 6-1/185, appeared in 68 games ( 65 starts) last season, averagin career-highs of 12.9 points, 6.6 assists and 3.6 rebounds in 29.2 minutes per game. Selected by San Antonio in the second round of the 2020 NBA Draft (41st overall), Jones has appeared in 174 total games for the Spurs, averaging 7.9 points, 4.1 assists and 2.4 rebounds, while shooting $46.9 \%$ from the floor. In his second NBA season (2021-22), the former Duke Blue Devil posted a 5.07 assist-to-turnover ratio, which set a record for the best single-season assist/turnover ratio in Spurs franchise history.

## EXTENDED DEVIN VASSELL

Entering his fourth season with the Spurs, Vassell is coming off of averaging a career-high 18.5 points, 3.9 rebounds and 3.4 assists in year three where he scored double figures in 36 -of- 38 games, including 18 outings with 20 -plus points. In 171 career games, he averages 11.2 points and 3.7 rebounds in 24.4 minutes and connected on 292 career three-pointers, which is the third-most in franchise history for a Spur through his first three years. Originally from Suwanee, Georgia, Vassell was selected by San Antonio in the first round of the 2020 NBA Draft (11th overall) after playing two seasons at Florida State University where he was named All-ACC Second Team and led the Seminoles to its first ACC regular season championship in school history in his second year.

## SIGNED CHARLES BEDIAKO

Spent two seasons with Alabama. In 2022-23, was one of three players to appear and start in all 37 games, averaging 6.4 points, 6.0 rebounds and 1.8 blocks per game. He also ranked No. 22 in the country in total blocks (67) and No. 36 in blocks per game on his way to being named to 2023 SEC all-Defensive Team and SEC AllTournament Team. His 1.70 bpg for his career ranks No. 7 for most in Alabama Basketball program history. While at Alabama, Bediako earned 2022 SEC All-Freshman Team, 2023 All-Defensive Team and 2023 SEC All-Tournament Team accolades. As a freshman, he led the team in field goal percentage at $69.2 \%$, ranked fourth in rebounds (4.3) and total steals (21) ... ended that year with four games of 5-or-more blocks to include a career-best 6 blocks in a game. Origionally from Canada, he competed for Team Canada at the FIBA U19 Basketball World Cup where he averaged 8.2 points and 5.2 rebounds per game.

## ACQUIRED CEDI OSMAN

In a three-team trade, the Spurs acquired Cedi Osman from the Cleveland Cavaliers. Osman, 6-7/230, is entering his seventh NBA season after being selected by the Minnesota Timberwolves in the second round (31st overall) of the 2015 NBA Draft. Appearing in 404 total games, he holds career averages of 9.7 points, 3.0 rebounds and 2.0 assists in 23.6 minutes. In 2022-23 with Cleveland, Osman saw action in 77 games (two starts), averaging 8.7 points, 2.3 rebounds and 2.0 assists in 20.1 minutes, where he recorded 10-plus points 29 times off the bench, which ranked 10th in the Eastern Conference. Originally from Turkey/Macedonia, Osman began his professional career overseas, appearing in 70 total games ( 62 starts) between the Turkish Basketbol Süper Ligi and the Euroleague's Anadolu Efes from 2011-17. In 2017-18, the forward signed as a free agent with the Cleveland Cavaliers where he spent the first six years of his career.

## RE-SIGNED JULIAN CHAMPAGNIE

Champagnie, 6-8/220, joined the Silver and Black midway through the 2022-23 season on a two-way contract. In 15 games (three starts) with San Antonio, he averaged 11.0 points and 4.0 rebounds in 20.9 minutes. Prior to joining the Spurs, Champagnie was on a two-way contract with the Philadelphia 76 ers . He appeared in two games with the 76ers and 18 G League games with the Delaware Blue Coats, averaging 14.3 points, 5.7 rebounds and 1.8 assists in 28.5 minutes. Champagnie went undrafted in the 2022 NBA Draft after spending three years (2019-22) at St. John's University, where he garnered All-Big East First Team honors as a sophomore and junior. The former Red Storm forward averaged 16.0 points, 6.8 rebounds, 1.4 assists and 1.6 steals in 30.7 minutes in 88 games.

## RE-SIGNED SANDRO MAMUKELASHVILI

Mamukelashvili, 6-10/240, appeared in 19 games for the Silver and Black, averaging 10.8 points, 6.8 rebounds and 2.4 assists in 23.3 minutes. Prior to joining the Spurs, Mamukelashvili was on a two-way contract with the Milwaukee Bucks. He appeared in 24 games with the Bucks and averaged 2.4 points and 2.3 rebounds in 9.0 minutes. In 11 games with the Bucks G League affiliate, the Wisconsin Herd, he averaged 19.5 points, 9.1 rebounds and 3.6 assists in 30.6 minutes. He was selected in the second round of the 2021 NBA Draft (54th overall) by the Indiana Pacers before being traded to Milwaukee on draft night. Prior to the NBA, Mamukelashvili spent four seasons at Seton Hall and in a total of 104 games ( 68 starts), the 2021 Big East Player of the Year averaged 9.5 points, 5.4 rebounds and 1.6 assists in 23.7 minutes.
