OKLAHOMA CITY THUNDER NOTES

Postseason Powerhouse: Oklahoma City has now made the playoffs in nine of the last 10 seasons (second most in the NBA during that time, San Antonio). Since the 2010 postseason, the Thunder ranks first in playoff blocks (679), third in points (10,814), rebounds (4,671) and steals (827), and fifth in assists (1,977).

Triple-Double Dip: On 1/14 at Portland, Russell Westbrook notched his ninth playoff triple-double, passing Oscar Robertson and tying Wilt Chamberlain for the sixth-most in NBA playoff history with 24 points, 10 rebounds and 10 assists.

Three-Dimensional Shooting: In the win over Portland on 4/19, the Thunder had five players with multiple three-point makes, marking just the second time in Thunder playoff history the team has done so (5/26/16 at Golden State).

(R)hustle Westbrook: On 4/21 vs. Portland, Russell Westbrook grabbed his 667th-career postseason rebound, passing Tony Parker for the 10th most among guards in NBA history (first among active players).

Final Countdown: The Thunder wrapped up the 2018-19 season in Milwaukee, beating the Bucks on the second night of a back-to-back to end the year on a five-game win streak. The No. 6 seed Thunder produced its 10th straight season with a .500 or better record, one of just three teams (Houston and San Antonio) to maintain such a record in each of the last 10 seasons. The Thunder recorded the fourth-best defensive rating in the league (106.4) and scored the most second chance points (15.5), the second-most points off opponent turnovers (19.2), the fifth-most fast break points (18.2) and the sixth-most points in the paint (51.8).

The Rest is History: Since New Year's Eve the Thunder's first season in OKC (12/31/08), the Thunder has earned a 62.6 win percentage, good for second-best in the league during that time.

Beating the Best: During the 2018-19 regular season, Oklahoma City posted the best record in the NBA against the other seven Western Conference Playoff teams by going 15-11 in those games.

Sustaining Success: In the past ten seasons, OKC has compiled the second-best record in the NBA (behind San Antonio). After the 2008-09 season in which Oklahoma City won 20 games after a 3-29 start, the Thunder found ways to improve the club each year and with a 60-22 record during the 2012-13 season, Oklahoma City became just the second team in NBA history (Boston, 1955-1960) to increase its winning percentage for five consecutive seasons (while maintaining a winning percentage of .700 or better in two of those seasons). Oklahoma City has now finished with a winning percentage of .610 (equivalent to 50 wins) six times dating back to the 2009-10 season. Only San Antonio (eight seasons with .610 or better winning percentage) has reached that benchmark more during this period. After finishing the 2018-19 season with a record of 49-33, OKC is now one of three teams (Houston and San Antonio) to maintain a .500 or better record in each of the last 10 seasons.

Stealing the Show: Oklahoma City led the league for both the most steals per contest (9.34) and the most turnovers forced per game (16.7). This marks the second-straight season that OKC has led the league in each of these categories as last season the team averaged 9.06 steals per game and 16.0 opponent turnovers per game. Prior to the 2017-18 campaign, the Thunder had never finished within the Top 5 in the NBA in these categories. Additionally, the Thunder ranked second on the leaderboards for points off opponent turnovers (19.2). Paul George ranked first in the NBA with 2.21 steals per contest, just ahead of Russell Westbrook with 1.95 (fourth).

Taking Offense: Over the month of February, the Thunder recorded the best offensive month in Thunder history, averaging 121.4 points per game, beating their previous record of 120.6 points per game from January. Oklahoma City's bests in these areas prior to this season were 115.2 points per game in April of 2018 and 42.9 field goals made per game in January of 2018. Additionally, from 1/10-29, OKC has averaged 125.6 points and 45.7 field goals per contest, good for the best offensive 10-game stretch in Oklahoma City history. The Thunder also generated a stretch of 20 games from 1/8 to 2/23 in which the team has scored at least 115 points, marking the second-longest streak of this kind in NBA history (Denver Nuggets, 22 in 1982).

OKLAHOMA CITY THUNDER NOTES

Getting Defensive: Oklahoma City finished the season with the fourth-best defensive rating in the league (106.4), ranked first in deflections per game (15.5) and in loose balls recovered (9.4). The Thunder also allowed opponents to score the seventh-fewest fast break points (12.3).

Everyone Deserves a Second Chance: As a team that created the most second chances for themselves, OKC ranked first in the league in offensive rebounding (12.6) and in second chance points (15.5), giving themselves 5.3 more shots per game than opponents, good for best in the NBA. The Thunder also won the game in transition, ranking first in preventing opponent shots in transition (18.1 percent) while taking the most shots in transition as a team (28.2 percent).

Don't Call it a Comeback: Following an 0-4 start to the season, the Thunder generated a seven-game win streak from Oct. 28 to Nov. 8, winning each game by an average of 12.1 points. This streak made OKC just the second team in NBA history to win seven straight after starting 0-4 (Dallas, 2006-07). Oklahoma City then went 37-16, tied for the most wins from Oct. 28 to the All-Star break. During that timeframe, the Thunder held the most steals per game defensive rating. Individually, rating (10.0), grabbed the most Russell Westbrook (108, third), per game in the league (29.0) while Steven Adams held the best shooting percentage on the team (61.2) with Nerlens Noel (56.1) and Jerami Grant (53.5) right behind.

Comeback Kids: On 2/9 at Houston, Oklahoma City overcame a 26-point deficit to earn a 117-112 win over the Rockets, marking the largest comeback victory in Thunder history. This comes after setting a new record earlier in the season on 12/5 at Brooklyn when OKC came back from 23 points down to beat the nets 114-112. This year, the Thunder won 17 games after being down at the half, most both across the league and in OKC history. The Thunder also earned 17 10-point comeback wins and five 15-point come-from-behind victories, each good for the most in a single season in OKC history. The 17 double-digit comebacks tied with Milwaukee for most in the NBA.

Give Me Three: The Thunder increased its three-point percentage each month this season from October (.275, 30th in the NBA) to November (.330, 25th) to December (.333, 26th) to January (.404, 4th).

Home Cooking: Since arriving in Oklahoma City, the Thunder has always taken pride in defending its home court. Dating back to the start of the 2009-10 season, OKC has gone 294-108 (.734) at home, which stands as the second-best home record in the NBA during this span. Since the 2013-14 season, Oklahoma City has earned 177 wins on home court, which stands as the third-most home wins in that timeframe (Golden State, San Antonio). In the 124-109 victory over the Hawks on Nov. 30, OKC extended its home sellout streak to 355 games, which currently stands as the third-longest active streak in the NBA (Dallas, Miami), passing Sacramento for the 10th-longest streak in league history.

OKC is Fan Friendly: Heading into the 2019 postseason, the Thunder has recorded 384 consecutive sellouts inside Chesapeake Energy Arena (including both regular season and playoffs). In each of the past two years, the Thunder has been ranked number one in the NBA when it comes to the fan and game experience. The team's TV broadcasts on FOX Sports Oklahoma finished last season third in local TV ratings across the league, and the Thunder ranks fifth in the NBA in mobile app downloads and sixth in total social media engagements. On 2/7 vs. Memphis, Oklahoma City celebrated the team's 500th game inside Chesapeake Energy Arena.

Just for the Record: On 12/31 vs. Dallas, the Thunder set a franchise record for turnovers forced with 29. On 11/2 at Washington, Oklahoma City had a historic first half, tying the team's record for points in a half (79) and tying the second-best scoring quarter (44). Additionally, the +29-point margin that the Thunder took into halftime tied OKC's third-best heading into halftime. On 11/1 at Charlotte, Oklahoma City earned a 111-107 victory marking the fifth time the Thunder has made a 19-point comeback or better. On 10/30 vs. LA Clippers, the Thunder outscored the visitors 39-10 in the third quarter, the largest scoring margin for a single quarter in franchise history. On 10/28 vs. Phoenix, the Thunder set new Oklahoma City records in the first half with 12 steals and 17 forced turnovers.

We Go Together Like PG & (M)J: This season, Paul George averaged career highs in career highs in points, rebounds, assists, steals and threes (3.8). The only other player to average at least 28 points, eight rebounds and two steals in a season was Michael Jordan in 1988-89.

No Access Granted: On 4/9 vs. Houston, Jerami Grant swatted his 100th block this season, making him just the third player to block as many shots in a season (Ibaka, Durant). He was also just one of three players in the league this season with more than 100 threes and 100 blocks (Karl-Anthony Towns, Brook Lopez). Additionally, Grant tied for the third-most clutch-time blocks in the league with his 10 (Gobert, 12).

Winning BasketPaul: On 4/9 vs. Houston, hit his fourth game-winner of the season, most in the NBA this year and tied for the most in Thunder history (Westbrook, 2016-17). Prior to this season, George had never made a game-winning shot.

Setting the Bar: Russell Westbrook led the league in assists (10.7), ranked second in fast break points (5.2) and led all guards in rebounding (11.1) while ranking fourth in steals (1.95). He holds two scoring titles and led the league in assists last year, making him the first player in NBA history to lead the league in scoring and in assists in multiple seasons.

OKLAHOMA CITY THUNDER NOTES

Triple-Double Titans: On 4/5 vs. Detroit, Russell Westbrook dished out his 730th assist to ensure a third-straight season with a triple-double average. He is the only player in NBA history to hold such an average in consecutive seasons. In the win over Brooklyn on 12/5, notched his 108th-career triple-double, passing Jason Kidd for the third-most in NBA history. On 2/11 vs. Portland, logged his 10th-straight triple-double with 21 points, 14 rebounds and 11 assists, passing Wilt Chamberlain (1968) for the longest such streak in NBA history. On 2/28 vs. Philadelphia, tallied his 25th triple-double this season, with 23 points, 11 rebounds and 11 assists. This is his third season to have as many, tying Oscar Robertson for the most such seasons in NBA history. On 2/5 vs. Orlando, logged his seventh consecutive triple-double with 16 points, 15 rebounds and 16 assists to tie his longest such streak, making him the first player since Michael Jordan during the 1988-89 season to do so. This past season, on 3/13 at Atlanta, recorded his 100th triple-double of his career with a game-leading 32 points, game-high 12 rebounds and game-best 12 assists, making him the third-fastest player to 100 total (736 games) behind Robertson (277 games) and Magic Johnson (656 games). Of the other 29 NBA franchises, 24 have fewer triple-doubles in their entire team history than the 138 that Westbrook has logged in his career and since he entered the league in 2008, he holds more than twice as many as any other NBA franchise during that timeframe (Cavaliers have 48). Oklahoma City went 24-10 this season when Westbrook registered a triple-double and holds a 110-28 (.797) record over the course of his career.

Paul the Way from Three: From 2/1 to 2/11, Paul George tallied six straight games with at least five made three-pointers, making him just the fourth player in NBA history and the first Thunder player to produce such a streak (George McCloud, Stephen Curry, James Harden). From 11/30 to 3/5 George recorded 40-straight games with at least two shots from beyond the arc, good for the third-longest streak in NBA history (Stephen Curry, 50, 53). He also made the third most total threes this season (292) with the fifth-best accuracy (38.6) (min. 500 attempts), the most he has ever made in a season.

Dennis the Menace: Off the bench this season, Dennis Schröder averaged 14.7 points (tied for sixth in the NBA), 3.8 assists (fifth), 2.3 points off turnovers (tied for third) and 2.1 fast break points (fifth). The only Thunder reserve to ever hold a higher scoring average was James Harden in 2011-12 with 16.9 points per contest.

Roaring 20's: In the 119-103 win over the Los Angeles Lakers, Russell Westbrook recorded just the second 20/20/20 game in NBA history (Wilt Chamberlain 2/2/68) with his 20 points, 20 rebounds and 21 assists while grabbing three steals. There were 52,768 NBA games played between these two milestones. This also marked his eighth career game with 15/15/15, tying Chamberlain for the second-most such games in NBA history (Oscar Robertson, 14) and makes him just the fifth guard with multiple 20-rebound games.

Hot Schröder: On 4/10 at Milwaukee, Dennis Schröder went a career-best 8-for-15 from the three-point line to post a game-leading and season-high-tying 32 points. In the second quarter on 2/1 at Miami, he went a perfect 9-for-9 to log the best shooting in a quarter ever by a Thunder player (Anthony Morrow 8-8 FG on 11/12/14). Additionally, he went 4-for-4 from beyond the arc. The last NBA player to shoot as well in a quarter was Klay Thompson in 2015.

Owning the Month: Paul George earned his fourth career Player of the Month honors and first as a member of the Thunder for games played in the month of February. George led Oklahoma City to a 6-5 record behind averages of 35.0 points (second in NBA), 8.4 rebounds and 5.4 assists. He led the league in three-point makes (5.4) and deflections (3.8) and ranked second in points off opponent turnovers (5.2).

Dynamic Duo: On 2/22 vs. Utah, Paul George registered a game-best 45 points and Russell Westbrook notched his second-straight game with at least 40 points with his 43 to become the fifth pair of teammates in the last 20 years to score 40-plus in a game. Four of those five such games belong to the Thunder (Durant and Westbrook on 10/30/15, 3/23/12, 2/19/12) and the other was with the Timberwolves on 4/19/17 (Townsend and Wiggins). This ranks as the third-highest scoring of those five occurrences (91 twice). They are also the first duo since 1983 and the fourth all-time to each have at least 40 points, five rebounds and five assists (Isiah Thomas and John Long in 1983, Alex English and Kiki Vandeweghe in 1983, Pete Maravich and Nate Williams in 1977).

Jeramazing Improvement: Jerami Grant averaged career highs in points (13.6), rebounds (5.2) and three-pointers (1.4) and improved each of his stats from last season by 5.2 points, 1.3 rebounds, 0.3 assists, 0.38 steals, 0.30 blocks and 1.0 three per game. On 4/7 at Minnesota, he went 5-of-7 from the floor and 2-of-3 from three to record 15 points, five rebounds and two blocks, giving him his 23rd game this season with multiple blocks and a three, tying Ibaka for the second most such games in a single season in Thunder history (Durant, 24). Over the first 45 games of the season, Jerami Grant shot 33.6 percent from three-point range, good for fifth-best on the team. From 1/21 to 2/26, he improved to 56.1 percent from beyond the arc, good for best in the league during that timeframe (min. 40 attempts).

History in the Making: In the win over Portland on 2/11, Russell Westbrook logged his 10th-straight triple-double with 21 points, 14 rebounds and 11 assists, passing Wilt Chamberlain (1968) for the longest such streak in NBA history. That streak was extended to 11 after the 2/14 game at New Orleans. Also on 2/11, Paul George registered his third-career triple-double of 47 points, 12 rebounds and 10 assists, marking his first pair of back-to-back games with 45 points or more. George also extended his streak of games with five or more threes to six contests, tying George McCloud for the third-longest streak (Harden, Curry) in league history. George and Westbrook became the ninth duo in league history to record a triple-double in the same game and the first pair to each score at least 20 points in the feat.

20/20 Vision: In the 12/19 win at Sacramento, Steven Adams registered 20 points and a career-best 23 rebounds, marking just the third time a Thunder player had recorded a 20/20 points/rebounds game (Kanter 4/6/16, Ibaka 2/19/15).

OKLAHOMA CITY THUNDER NOTES

By George, He's Doing It: In the win over Miami on 2/1, Paul George drained 10 shots from long range to set a new OKC record. On 12/10 vs. Utah, he went 8-for-10 from the field and 5-for-6 from long range to score a game-high 31 points, making him the first player in Thunder history to score at least 30 points on 10 attempts or less and one of two players to do so in the last 10 years (Khris Middleton).

Not Taken for Grant(ed): On 2/22 vs. Utah, Jerami Grant scored his 3,000th-career point, making him just the seventh forward since he entered the league in 2014 with as many points and 400-plus blocks and four of those other six guys are All-Stars. 1/8 vs. Minnesota, Grant blocked his 400th-career shot, making him one of seven players since he entered the league in 2014 with as many blocks and at least 200 threes.

ThundeRuss Paul-Stars: Paul George and Russell Westbrook were once again named 2019 NBA All-Stars. Named a starter for this year's game, George made his sixth-career All-Star appearance and third start. Westbrook made his eighth-career All-Star appearance. This marks the 10th-consecutive season that the Thunder has had at least one All-Star selection, a streak that ranks second only to the San Antonio Spurs (21). Additionally, Hamidou Diallo was named the 2019 All-Star Dunk Contest Champion.

One Ferg the Record Books: On 1/8 vs. Minnesota, Terrance Ferguson went a perfect 4-for-4 from beyond the arc to tally 14 points, making him the eighth player in Thunder history to go 4-of-4 or better from three-point range (Butler, Durant, Fisher, Ibaka, Martin, Telfair, Westbrook). From 1/8 to 2/1, he went 32-for-62 (.516) from long range, good for best in the NBA in that timeframe (min. 50 attempts).

No Comeback without a Trece: On 12/5 at Brooklyn, the Thunder were down by as many as 23 in the third frame until Paul George went off with 25 of his 47 points coming in the final quarter. This marks the most by any player in a single quarter in Oklahoma City history, giving OKC the largest comeback victory in Thunder history to that date while George drained his first career game-winning shot in the process. In the same game, Russell Westbrook became the first player since Magic in 1988-89 with 15/15/15 in a game and earned his sixth game with 15+ rebounds and 15+ assists, passing Magic for the third-most in league history as only Oscar (14) and Wilt (9) have more.

Win the Week: Paul George and Russell Westbrook each earned Player of the Week honors this season. George earned his sixth, seventh and eighth such award for games played Dec. 17-23, Jan. 21-27 and Feb. 4-10 while Westbrook earned his 18th and 19th for games played Oct. 29-Nov. 4 and April 1-7. On the week of Feb. 4, George used averages of 37.0 points (second in NBA), 8.0 rebounds, 3.3 assists and 2.67 (tied for second in NBA) steals to power Oklahoma City to a 3-0 record. On the week of Dec. 17, George helped OKC to a 3-1 record behind averages of 35.3 points (second in the NBA), 11.3 rebounds, 5.0 assists and 2.50 steals, notching back-to-back 40-point games for the first time in his career. During this time, George also earned the best net rating in the league (19.5), scored the most points off opponent turnovers (7.5) and the second-most points on a fast break (7.8). On the week of Jan. 21, George averaged 31.5 points, 9.0 rebounds, 4.5 assists and 2.50 steals while shooting 56.8 percent from three, leading OKC to a 4-0 week. For his first week, Westbrook guided OKC to a 3-0 record behind averages of 28.0 points (fifth in the NBA), 10.0 assists (third in the NBA) and 3.33 steals (third in the NBA) while shooting 53.8 percent from the field. During this time, Westbrook also scored the second-most points in the paint (17.3) and the third-most points off turnovers (7.3). On the week of April 1, he led Oklahoma City to a 3-0 week behind averages of 22.0 points, 17.0 assists and 12.7 rebounds.

Helping Hands: On 1/10 at San Antonio, Russell Westbrook registered 24 points, a career-best 24 assists, a game-leading 13 rebounds and two steals, falling six dimes shy of the NBA record and just the third player in NBA history to log a triple-double with as many assists (Isiah Thomas, Rajon Rondo). In the last 20 years, there have only been three 20-point/20-assist triple-doubles and Westbrook owns all of them.

Hip, Hip Jorge: On 1/19 at Philadelphia, Paul George grabbed his 1,000th-career steal, making him one of 18 players in NBA history and the only one since he entered the league in 2010 with as many steals while shooting 37.5 percent or better from beyond the arc.

Darth Nader: On 1/12 vs. San Antonio, Abdel Nader went a perfect 6-for-6 from the field and drained his only three-point attempt to tally 15 points, making him just the sixth reserve in Thunder history to shoot as well in a game (Ibaka, Jackson, Kanter, Livingston, Telfair).

Night to Remember: On 12/19 at Sacramento, the Thunder became the first NBA team since 1995 to have a player with over 40 points (Paul George), a different player with over 20 rebounds (Steven Adams) and a different player with a triple-double (Russell Westbrook) (Mavericks, 4/11/95: Jamal Mashburn, Popeye Jones, Jason Kidd).

Bolstering the Bench: On 11/21 at Golden State, Dennis Schröder became just the third player in Thunder history to produce at least 30 points off the bench as he went 12-of-19 from the floor to finish with a season and game-best 32 points, four rebounds and four assists, also draining five of his six three-point attempts to set a new career-high.

Don't Get Mad, Get Steven: On 11/5 vs. New Orleans, Steven Adams scored his 3,500th career point, making him one of five players in NBA history with as many points and 2,700+ rebounds in his first 400 games while shooting 58 percent or better (Charles Barkley, Artis Gilmore, Cedric Maxwell, Shaquille O'Neal).

Paul in a Day's Work: On 11/2 at Washington, with 11:11 to go in the third quarter, Paul George knocked down a free throw to notch his 10,000th career point. That made him one of four active players with as many points and 900+ steals while shooting 37.5 percent or better from three-point range (Dirk Nowitzki, Stephen Curry, Mike Conley).

Blue Review: The Thunder's G League affiliate, the Midwest Division Champion Oklahoma City Blue recorded a 34-16 record this year after downing the Austin Spurs (San Antonio Spurs affiliate) 138-107 on 3/23 to finish the regular season. Oklahoma City was tied for the best win percentage on the season (68.0) and ranked first in margin of victory (5.2) while making the fourth-most field goals per game (42.3) with the second-best shooting percentage (47.8 percent). The Blue also earned the second-most points in the paint, averaging 58.4 points per game. Additionally, Scotty Hopson and Richard Solomon earned the 29th and 30th GATORADE Call-Ups this season and the 13th and 14th call-ups all-time between the Blue and the Thunder when they signed 10-day contracts with the Thunder on Feb. 14.
