# OKLAHOMA CITY THUNDER NOTES

**Play-in Clinched:** The Oklahoma City Thunder finished the regular season with a 40-42 record, securing the 10th seed and final play-in position. This marked the first play-in appearance for the organization and the 11<sup>th</sup> postseason appearance in 15 seasons. The Thunder defeated the New Orleans Pelicans on Wednesday night and now take on the Minnesota Timberwolves on Friday night at Target Center.

**Consistency Through the Years:** The Oklahoma City Thunder is .500 or better against 21 of its 29 opponents in Thunder history. Since 2008 Oklahoma City is tied for 6th out of 30 teams for the least percent of seasons missing the playoffs at just 28.6 percent (4-of-14 seasons).

**40-win Seasons:** Oklahoma City secured its 12th 40-win season since the 09-10 season, which ranks tied for first with the Clippers and Heat during that span.

**Young Core:** Oklahoma City had the youngest roster in the NBA on opening night of the 2022-23 season. The Thunder's roster featured four rookies, six sophomores, and two players in their third season.

**SGA's Spectacular Season:** In 68 appearances, Gilgeous-Alexander averaged 31.4 points (4th in the NBA), 5.5 assists, 4.8 rebounds, 1.6 steals (4th in the NBA), and just shy of 1.0 block. SGA was named an All-Star on February 2nd, marking the first such honor for Gilgeous-Alexander and becoming the fifth Thunder player to be named an NBA All-Star.

- Shai averaged over 30 points on 50 percent shooting from the field, four rebounds, four assists, one steal and just shy of one block. The only players to ever accomplish this stat line for an entire season includes Michael Jordan (2x), LeBron James, and Kareem Abdul-Jabbar. Shai also joined Stephen Curry (15-16) as the only players to ever average 30 points on 50 percent shooting from the field and 90 percent from the free throw line in a single season.
- Shai became the **youngest player ever** to average 30 points per game on 50 percent shooting in a season.
- SGA scored 30 points in 45 games this season, **the most in the league**.
- SGA **led the league in** third quarter scoring, averaging a total of 10.2 points in the frame this season.
- Shai finished **first** among all guards in blocked shots per game. On 3/23 against the Clippers, SGA recorded his 18th game of the season with multiple blocks, totaling three in the loss.
- Shai ranked **4th in the league** in steals, averaging 1.6 per contest.
- SGA tied Russell Westbrook for the quickest Thunder player in **history** to score 1,000 points in a season (32 games).
- Shai made 669 free throws this season, leading the league despite being 3rd in the NBA in total free throw attempts. He finished **5th in the league** in free throw percentage at 90.5 percent.
- SGA scored a **career-high** 44 points (17-29 FGs) on 12/23/22 in a 128-125 OT loss versus the New Orleans Pelicans. 17 made FGs was also a career-best for Gilgeous-Alexander. Shai tied his career-high again on 2/10 in a win over Portland where he knocked down 13-of-16 FG attempts. Shai became the **first player in Thunder history** to score 40+ points on 80% shooting or better.
- In his first seven appearances this season, Shai totaled 226 points. This represents the highest point total in **Thunder history** by a player through his first seven games of a season.
- SGA got off to a blistering start versus the Rockets on 2/4, scoring 20 points in the first quarter, a **career-high** for points in the first quarter for him.
- Shai scored 21 points in the third quarter in a win over the Knicks (11/13/22), tying his **career-high** for points in a quarter (2/24/21).
- Shai Gilgeous-Alexander matched the fourth-most points scored in a season-opener in Thunder history with 32 points and he finished with six rebounds, five assists, three blocks and two steals at Minnesota on 10/19. He became the **third player in Oklahoma City history** to record a 30/5/5/3/2 stat line, along with Russell Westbrook and Kevin Durant.

## OKLAHOMA CITY THUNDER NOTES

**Among Elite Company:** Gilgeous-Alexander became just the **second player** in NBA history to record 10 games of 30 points and 50 percent FG in his first 14 games of a season. The only other player to accomplish this is Wilt Chamberlain (1962-63). SGA also owns the **Thunder record** for most points scored in a player's first 14 games of a season, totaling 452 points.

**Giddey's Growth:** Giddey took his play to another level this season and the numbers show it. Josh's FG percentage jumped from 41.9 to 48.2 from last season to this season. His three-point percentage was up over six percent, from 26.3 to 32.5. Lastly, his free throw percentage increased from 70.9 to 73.1.

**All-Around Game:** Giddey secured his 8th career triple-double on 3/14/23 in a win over Brooklyn, posting 15 points, 13 rebounds, and 10 assists. Giddey now has the 2nd most triple-doubles at age 20 or younger with eight (Doncic – 21).

- Giddey posted his 44th career double-double on 3/28 versus the Hornets, which ranks **second** among the 2021 draft class (Evan Mobley – 45).
- Josh Giddey posted a double-double with 14 points and 11 rebounds in the season opener on 10/19 and became the sixth player in **Thunder history** to record a double-double in the season opener and owns the **top-two youngest** 10-rebound performances in a season opener by a Thunder player.
- In 76 games played, Giddey averaged 16.6 points, 7.9 rebounds, and 6.2 assists per contest.

**J-Dub's Rookie Rise:** Jalen Williams finished his rookie season averaging 14.1 points (5th among rookies), 4.5 rebounds (10th among rookies), 3.3 assists (5th among rookies), and 1.4 steals (1st among rookies).

- Jalen scored 20-plus points in 17 games this season, second most in Thunder history (Westbrook – 18).
- Post All-Star break, Jalen averaged 18.6 points, 5.4 rebounds, 4.3 assists, and 1.7 steals per contest.
- J-Dub was named to the Rising Stars game and won the Rookie of the Month for October/November games.

**Comeback Kings:** Oklahoma City finished tied with Brooklyn, Cleveland, and Indiana for the most 10+ point comeback wins this season with 17. The Thunder ranked tied for fourth for the most 15+ point comeback wins this season with six (Philadelphia (8), Brooklyn and Sacramento (7)).

**Setting Records:** Oklahoma City set a Thunder record for points scored in a game twice this season. In a 153-121 win over the Rockets on 2/4, the Thunder shot 57.7 percent from the field, including 45.7 percent from long distance, and dished out 39 assists. In a 150-117 win over the Celtics on 1/3, the Thunder connected on 59.2 percent of its shots, including 50 percent from long distance.

**January Jolt:** Oklahoma City started the New Year off with a 9-5 record and owned the second-best net rating in January (7.6). In the month, OKC had the fourth highest points per game (121.1) on 49.5 percent FG, the tenth highest assist rate (26.1), the third highest offensive rating (119.8), and the ninth best defensive rating (112.1).

**Giddey at the Garden:** Josh Giddey joined Wilt Chamberlain (1968) as the only other player in **NBA history** to record triple-doubles in their first two games at Madison Square Garden. Giddey posted 28 points, 11 rebounds and 12 assists on 2/14/22 and 24 points, 10 rebounds, and 12 assists on 11/13/22.

**Halftime Adjustments Paying Off:** The Thunder thrived coming out of halftime this season. Through 82 games, Oklahoma City owned the **number one** 3rd quarter point differential in the NBA (+2.3).

**Joe From Long Distance:** Isaiah Joe finished the season 25th in the league in three-point percentage (40.9) on 5.4 attempts per game.

**Making History:** Less than a minute into the win over the Spurs on 12/27/22, Josh Giddey dished out his 500th career assist. In doing so, Giddey became the **second youngest player ever** to reach 1,000 points, 500 rebounds, and 500 assists. Giddey reached this milestone in just 83 games played.

**Fighting Until the End:** NBA teams were 9,975-1 when leading by 16 or more points in the final four minutes of the fourth quarter in the last 25 years. That record changed when the Thunder came roaring back from a 16-point deficit late to claim an overtime victory against Dallas (10/31).

**Push for Points:** Oklahoma City ranked third in pace in the league (101.94) and 5th in the NBA in points per game (117.5). The Thunder connected on 43.1 field goals per game, 6th most in the league.

**Defensive-minded:** The Thunder finished the season with the 13th best defensive rating in the league at 113.2. Oklahoma City ranked 2nd in the league in allowing the fewest opponents points off turnovers at just 14.8 and ranked 4th in the league in steals, snatching 8.2 per game.

**Block Party:** Two members of the Thunder ranked in the top-40 in blocks per game: Pokuševski (1.3) and Gilgeous-Alexander (1.0).

**Safety First:** Oklahoma City averaged the 5th fewest turnovers per game in the league at just 13.0.

**Defense to Offense:** The Thunder averaged the second most points off turnovers in the league (20.6), trailing only the Toronto Raptors (21.0).

**Getting Good Looks:** Oklahoma City ranked 3rd in the league in points in the paint per game (55.2), trailing only the Memphis Grizzlies (58.4) and San Antonio Spurs (55.6).

**Hustle Plays:** Jaylin Williams led the NBA in charges drawn with 42 in 48 appearances while Kenrich Williams ranked fourth with 26 in 53 appearances. Teammates Shai Gilgeous-Alexander (3rd) and Luguentz Dort (t-13th) were both top-15 in the league in loose balls recovered this season. SGA was also 2nd in the league in total deflections.

**Nine Straight from Deep:** Isaiah Joe set an all-time Thunder record by knocking down nine consecutive attempts from long distance spanning from 11/23 versus Denver (7) to 11/25 versus Chicago (2).

**Perfect Start:** Shai Gilgeous-Alexander started a perfect 34-of-34 from the free throw line to begin the season, a Thunder all-time record for consecutive free throws made to open a season. Danilo Gallinari previously held the Thunder record with 23 to begin the 2019-20 season (10/23/2019-11/2/2019).

**Thunder First:** Oklahoma City scored 150 points for the first time in Thunder history in a 150-117 victory over the Boston Celtics on 1/3/23. The Thunder connected on 59.5 percent of its attempts from the field. OKC scored 48 points in the third quarter alone, marking a franchise best for any quarter. Five Thunder players scored 20+ points, marking the second time in franchise history that has ever occurred.

**Balanced Attack:** For the second time in team history, the Oklahoma City Thunder had eight players score in double-figures on 11/11/22 versus the Toronto Raptors at Paycom Center in a 19-point victory. The previous record was seven players in double-figures done six times, most recently on 5/2/21 against the Phoenix Suns.

**Draft Class:** The Oklahoma City Thunder selected forward Chet Holmgren (second overall), guard Jalen Williams (12th overall) and forward Jaylin Williams (34th overall) in the 2022 NBA Draft. The Thunder also acquired the rights to forward Ousmane Dieng, the 11th overall pick, from the New York Knicks. The Thunder has 15 potential first-round picks and 14 potential second-round picks through the 2029 NBA draft.

**Season Kickoff:** Oklahoma City's longest home stand of the season featured seven games over 14 days from Dec. 14 – Dec. 27. The 2022-23 slate includes 13 back-to-back series and three matchups versus Conference opponents, including Dallas, the LA Lakers, Sacramento and San Antonio.

**SGA Earns All-Star Nod:** Oklahoma City Thunder guard Shai Gilgeous-Alexander has been named a 2023 NBA All-Star, it was announced on February 2nd by the NBA. This marks the first such honor for Gilgeous-Alexander, as he becomes the fifth Thunder player to be named an NBA All-Star. Gilgeous-Alexander has appeared in 57 games (all starts) this season and averaged 31.2 points (5th in NBA), 5.6 assists, 4.8 rebounds, 1.7 steals (3rd in NBA) and 1.10 blocks in 35.6 minutes per game. His blocks lead all guards and he is shooting 50.9% from the field and 90.8% from the free throw line, which ranks fifth in the NBA.

**Rising Stars:** Oklahoma City Thunder guards Josh Giddey and Jalen Williams were selected as 2023 Rising Stars, it was announced on January 31st by the NBA. This marked the second Rising Stars honor for Giddey, as he and Williams are the 12th and 13th players in Thunder history to be named to a Rising Stars team.

**Rookie of the Month:** Jalen Williams was named **Western Conference Rookie of the Month** for games played in October and November. Williams had appeared in 18 games (seven starts) for the Thunder and averaged 10.7 points (5th among rookies) on 52.4 percent shooting to go along with 3.2 rebounds and 2.6 assists (4th among rookies) in 25.1 minutes per game. After Josh Giddey won four Rookie of the Month awards during the 2021-22 season, Thunder rookies captured the award in five of the past six months. Williams became the third Thunder rookie to win Rookie of the Month honors.

**Player of the Week Honors:** Shai Gilgeous-Alexander was named the **Western Conference Player of the Week** on 10/31 for games played from 10/24-10/30. During this stretch Shai led the Thunder to a perfect 3-0 record, with two of the wins coming against the Clippers and the third versus the Mavericks. In the three wins, Gilgeous-Alexander averaged 31.7 points, 7.7 assists, and 5.3 rebounds per contest.

**Player of the Week Honors:** Shai Gilgeous-Alexander was named the **Western Conference Player of the Week** on 2/13 for games played from 2/6-2/12. During this stretch Shai led the Thunder to a 2-1 record, with wins coming against the Lakers and the Trail Blazers. In the three games, Gilgeous-Alexander averaged 31.3 points on 57.1 percent shooting, 6.3 assists, and 1.33 steals per contest. He tied his career-high with 44 points in the win over Portland, becoming the first player in Thunder history to score 40 points on 80 percent shooting or better.

**New Faces:** The Thunder signed guard Isaiah Joe on 10/16/22 and Lindy Waters III to an NBA contract on 2/27/23. Joe was selected 49th overall by the Philadelphia 76ers in the 2020 NBA Draft. Lindy Waters was originally signed to a two-way contract on 2/10/22. Jared Butler was signed to a two-way contract on 3/3/23.

**Giddey & Daniels Reunion:** Former NBA Global Academy teammates Dyson Daniels and Josh Giddey faced off for the first time in the NBA when the Oklahoma City Thunder visited the New Orleans Pelicans on Monday, Nov. 28.

- Monday's game marked the first time that two players from the same NBA Academy were featured in the same NBA game.
